Good afternoon and welcome to you all for today's visit of Plymouth Argyle. On behalf of the Board of Directors can I offer a warm welcome also to the Directors, Management, Players and Supporters from Plymouth Argyle.

It may be three weeks since England won the Rugby World Cup but I would like to add the congratulations of everyone at Swindon Town FC to Clive Woodward and his players on their magnificent achievement. Whatever sport you are into, it is wonderful when a National side becomes world champions at their particular sport. It give us all a sense of pride and, importantly, it brings into focus the short comings of other sports, prompting the inevitable questions about facilities (or lack of them), levels of investment and Central Governments commitment to sport in the UK. For me two things stand out about our rugby success. Firstly, the way in which the Premiership clubs fully supported Clive Woodward in releasing players from their domestic duties so that England could set up a lengthy training camp and prepare professionally for the competition. I guess this is easier to achieve in Rugby as it is a sport where the emphasis has been on Country rather than Club. Secondly, and very importantly, is that Clive Woodward has been in charge for seven years building to this success. There have been several occasions where failure to win key matches has been followed by a media campaign to change manager. Funnily enough the same newspapers appear to backing a campaign for his knighthood now. It goes to show that success can be gained through a long-term plan, even if things don't always go according to the script. Patience is indeed a virtue.

You may by now be aware that our AGM will be held on Sunday 28 December 2003 at 11am, prior to the festive fixture with Brighton & Hove Albion. We will be presenting three sets of accounts for years 1998/99, 1999/00 and 2000/01. Most of us will know that they will not make pleasant reading, but is important that we learn from the mistakes and excesses of the past as we build the future of this club. It gets suggested from time to time that the board do not want or are frightened of success as promotion brings additional costs. Nothing could be further from the truth. We all want to see this club playing at as high a level as possible, but we must create a financially sound foundation from which to build. It is no good gambling on plan A if there is no way of paying for it if the gamble fails. I am pleased to say that our hard work in increasing season ticket numbers, junior supporter numbers and revenues across the club are beginning to bear fruit. We have made great progress in redeveloping our relationship with local businesses, and we have a squad that can challenge for a promotion place. I believe these are signs of a football club gearing itself up for life at a higher level, not one that is frightened of the challenge.

To the 358 hardy souls who followed the team to Hartlepool, you have the thanks of Andy King, Myself and all of the players. You gave the team tremendous support. We are acutely aware of the cost of following your team to the other end of the country, especially in the run up to Christmas and the New Year.

On behalf of everyone at the club may I wish you all a very happy and peaceful Christmas. I hope to see as many of you as possible back here on the 28th for the Brighton match.





TOWN CLAIMED A WELL-**EARNED POINT FROM A 1-1** DRAW WITH LEAGUE LEADERS **QPR IN AN ACTION PACKED** GAME WRITES STFC SPORTS REPORTER SIMON COY.

Swindon took a deserved first half lead through Sam Parkin before Rangers claimed an equaliser in the second half from Martin Rowland following wave after wave of pressure from the team at the top of the table.

QPR began well and in the second minute Kevin Gallen tried a speculative effort from 30 yards having spotted Rhys Evans off his line, but the Town keeper watched it drop over his bar.

A minute later Stefani Miglioranzi played a good through ball into the path of Super Sam Parkin. The Town number nine raced in on goal, but

Rangers keeper Day saved his weak shot. Mooney following in could only fire into the keeper's arms.

Just before the quarter of an hour, the lively Hewlett sent David Duke clear down the inside left channel. The Scotsman surged forward before firing a fierce shot narrowly over the bar from 20 yards.

Town were awarded a free-kick in the 21st minute after good work down the right by Steve Robinson. As he skipped past the first tackle he was scythed down by Gino Padula earning a booking from referee Knight. Howard fired in the kick, which was headed behind by the Rangers defence. The corner was again headed behind for a second Town corner. As Howard sent in the corner number two Day tried to claim under pressure and as the ball bobbled loose Mooney hooked his effort over the bar.

After 26 minutes Rhys Evans made an excellent save to deny Thorpe as the striker made space to shoot from the edge of the Town box. The England U21 keeper raced off his line to smother the shot.


In the 30th minute Robinson crossed to the far post where the superb Mooney headed goal-wards, but was unlucky to see his effort rebound off the crossbar, Miglioranzi following up could only scuff the loose ball wide of the left-hand upright.

Two minutes later Robinson found Parkin in the left side of the box but as the big striker tried to turn sharply he lost his footing for a moment and the Rangers defence pounced to clear for a corner. Howard fired a superb ball across the face of the six-vard box just in front of Miglioranzi but he couldn't reach the ball when any sort of touch would have steered it home.

After 38 minutes Mooney hit the woodwork again as the ball dropped from Parkin's flick.

In the 39th minute Town took the lead. Skipper Gurney made an excellent run down the right before curling a pinpoint cross into the centre which was met perfectly by the head of Sam Parkin beating Day to bury the ball into the back of the net.

Right on half-time Duke made another mazy run down the left flank and fired a shot, which was tipped over by the Rangers keeper.

Early in the second period Howard swung in a Town free-kick from the right, but Mooney was beaten to the ball by the Rangers defence and the danger was cleared.

Two minutes later a long ball forward almost reached Tony Thorpe, but the QPR striker overstretched and could only help the ball back to the advancing Evans.

In the 54th minute Gurney lost possession in midfield and the ball was slipped through the centre. Evans raced off his line but Thorpe skipped past before cutting the ball back from the byeline and the follow-up shot was cleared off the line before being scrambled clear.

Soon after a bad clearance by Evans was collected by Gallen but his shot rebounded back off the post before the follow up effort from Ainsworth was brilliantly saved by Evans who had raced back to recover his position.

Just after the hour Mooney was fouled by Bircham who was booked, and Town were awarded a free-kick on the left of the Rangers box.
Gurney's weak effort rebounded back to him and his second effort curled just beyond the far post.



Andy King made his first change after 73 minutes as Andy Nicholas replaced the injured Robinson who was stretchered round the edge of the pitch.

In the 79th minute Rangers equalised through Martin Rowlands after a period of sustained pressure. The ball fell to the QPR midfielder following a defensive mix-up and he surged through to fire a low shot past Evans.

With a minute left new signing Rory Fallon made his Town home debut replacing the hard working Tommy Mooney.

In injury time Rangers had a free-kick which Forbes fired in towards substitute Shittu, but the big defender's header flew over the crossbar. Almost immediately referee Knight blew to bring an end to a pulsating game as the points were shared...





TOWN LOST 2-0 IN THE VICTORIA PARK GALES AFTER DOMINATING THE SECOND HALF BUT COULDN'T FIND THE **FINISHING TOUCH, WRITES** STFC SPORTS REPORTER SIMON COY.

A goal in each half through Strachan's penalty and sub Jack Wilkinson gave Hartlepool all three points as Town tried desperately to score, pegging United back for long periods.

After 10 minutes a ball across the Swindon box found Joel Porter whose first touch was a little heavy and his hurried shot was cleared by Andy Gurney for a corner which came to nothing. Both teams traded long balls during the early period of the game with the wind playing a big part in proceedings. After 15 minutes Pool were awarded a free kick 25 yards from goal when Jerel Ifil

brought down Porter but the effort by Robson flew high and wide.

Immediately after Town had their first real effort on goal following excellent work by Nicholas down the left flank. His accurate cross found Parkin who laid the ball into the path of Hewlett whose effort from 20 yards whistled just over the bar.

In the 16th minute Hartlepool were awarded a penalty when Rhys Evans raced out and brought down the lively Porter, Swindon fans hearts were in their mouths as the referee reached for a yellow card. Gavin Strachan stepped up and confidently slotted home to Evans right for his fifth goal of the season and Pool were ahead.


The pace of Ifil took him into the Hartlepool half in the 27th minute before sending a good ball to the feet of Parkin on the edge of the box. Sam laid the ball off to skipper Gurney but

as he turned and shot the ball deflected off a home boot taking all the sting out of the effort and Provett gathered easily.

Just after the half hour Chris Westwood fouled Parkin 20 yards from goal. Tommy Mooney stepped up and struck an unstoppable curling drive which crashed against the United crossbar, however the assistant had already waved for an offside


In the 36th minute Miglioranzi made a confident run to the edge of the box before playing a neat one two with Gurney but his final through ball to Mooney was overhit and went straight to Provett.

Shortly after Tinkler went in late on Gurney who reacted angrily to the challenge. As the two squared up the referee was quickly on the scene to book the Pool midfielder for the foul.

The resulting free kick was sent long and behind by Miglioranzi.

In first half stoppage time a sustained bout of Town pressure ended when a good ball in by Duke from the left evaded everyone before coming out to Ifil. However, his sidefooted shot went well over from the edge of the box. Straight after the referee blew for the end of the half and Town went in behind.

Swindon began the second half on the attack with the wind behind playing towards the 358 hardy Town fans who had travelled north.

In the 49th minute a Duke cross was caught well by Provett under pressure. Shortly after a Gurney corner fell to Nicholas in the crowded box but he could only succeed in poking the ball wide of the far post. A Mooney free kick on the right flew high and wide after 54 minutes with

the wind gusting behind.

Duke played a hopeful ball forward in the 72nd minute towards Mooney but with his back to goal the big number 8 could only loop his header up and over the bar. Immediately after Miglioranzi laid the ball out to Parkin on the right. His cross was met at the near post by the lunging Mooney but his touch could only guide the ball into the keeper's arms.

Swindon, with the wind assistance continued to dominate the game as they pushed forward looking for the equaliser in a one sided display of possession.

However, Hartlepool should have gone further ahead in the 79th minute following a quick break. A swift run down the left flank saw the ball played into the centre to Porter who suddenly found himself free in acres of space but after bringing the ball



under control his shot on the run was brilliantly saved to his left by Evans.

In the 86th minute disaster struck as Hartlepool scored their second against the run of play after a surging run by Wilkinson and Strachan. The Pool sub played the ball wide left to Strachan who returned the ball back to Wilkinson. Evans came, hesitated and then stopped as Jack Wilkinson put Town to the sword, chipping over the Town keeper from just outside the box.

Town strived to come back onto the attack but the home side had their tails up and as Swindon pushed forward gaps were opening at the back. After three minutes of stoppage time the referee brought the action to an end with Town unlucky to lose after battering the Pool defence in gale force conditions. Hartlepool extended their unbeaten home run to 27 games and amazingly Town went home empty handed.



taking up his club position in May 1996
at the same time as his co-officer Jon
Holloway, an ex-Town pro who still
plays for Worcester City. The third
member of the team is Black & Ethnic
Community Officer Luke Sharps.

Married to Tracey with one daughter, Aimee, Clive dons the boots for a veteran's team in Newbury, coaches at Shrivenham, Highworth and Purton and is also Chairman of Stratton Juniors.

The Community Officers go to around 3 schools per week offering free coaching as well as running after schools clubs. At half term the team run 3-day soccer courses entertaining over 200 kids in Swindon and at other centres such as Chippenham. They also hold special one-day goalkeeping clinics with the

help of Fraser Digby.

Clive is especially proud of the Club's work helping children with special needs in a project called Ability Counts that takes place all over Wiltshire. The team held a very successful festival in Devizes for over 100 children in conjunction with Sport England.

The valuable work carried out by Clive, Jon and Luke cannot be understated. These unsung heroes take Swindon Town out to the future fans ensuring that hundreds of children without prejudice get first class opportunities to learn the game they love.

3.45pm -


At half time we make sure that they are all ok and enjoying the day.






THE FIRST STRIKING FEATURE **ABOUT THE SWINDON PROGRAMMES FOR THE 1977-78** SEASON WAS THEIR SIZE. **COSTING 15P THERE WERE ONLY 12 PAGES BUT THEY** WERE A4 SIZE PROBABLY THE **BIGGEST THE CLUB HAS EVER** PRODUCED. INSIDE THE PROGRAMME FOR THE ARGYLE MATCH WAS A BITS AND PIECES SECTION FEATURING PICTURES OF CLIFF JACKSON AND DAVE CORBETT WHO **BOTH MADE THEIR DEBUTS** FOR SWINDON IN THE 1958-59 SEASON BEFORE EVENTUALLY JOINING PLYMOUTH.

Fact Finder gave a survey of Argyle's last five seasons in which the name of Paul Mariner the club's leading scorer in the 73/74 and 75/76 season's stuck out. The excellent coverage of the away side in this programme was completed by a team photo surrounded by pen pictures of the players in Mike Kelly's team and two columns by Tony Pullein devoted to a survey of Plymouth Argyle's history. On the Swindon side there

was an interview by John Ward with David Moss and a focus on the career record of Maurice Owen. Finally much of Chairman, Cecil Green's column was devoted to arrangements for the Third Round F A Cup trip to Nottingham Forest which Town were to lose 4-1.

A crowd of 9,723 turned up to see the match played on the 27th December just one day after Swindon had recovered from being three down at half-time to earn a point at Oxford. Plymouth looked the better side for much of the first half and it was against the run of play that Swindon took the lead in the 12th minute when a miss hit shot by David Moss following a cross by John McLaughlin found the net. Free-scoring Fred Binney who had averaged a goal every other game in a league career of 178 matches with Exeter City levelled the scores when he shot home a looping cross by Gary Megson. Chris Guthrie twice went close towards the interval but the sides remained level at the break.


The second half looked to be heading towards a draw that would have been


a fair reflection of the overall run of play when Swindon struck in the 82nd minute. McLaughlin hit a free kick across field to Moss who lobbed the ball back into the area Where Guthrie climbed highest to head home. With Argyle pressing forward for an equaliser Swindon hit them on the break in the 85th minute with Moss sending Chris Kamara away to score.

Swindon completed the double at Home Park later in the season when goals from Dave Cunningham and Chris Guthrie earned them a 2-0 victory. Swindon finished a respectable mid table tenth at the end of the season but for Argyle the season was a struggle. They lay in a relegation position for much of March and April but home wins over two already relegated sides Port Vale (3-2) and Bradford City (6-0) lifted them to safety and 19th position. One way they had attempted to improve their side according to their Chairman was to make a bid of £85,000 for David Moss and Chris Guthrie who ended the season as Town's leading scorers with 16 and 12 League goals respectively.

THE GAFFER PAUL STURROCK

Paul Whitehead Sturrock, in charge at Home Park since October 2000 is a former Scottish international striker, who played for Grandtully Vale FC, Vale of Atholl, Pitlochry, Bankfoot Juniors and Dundee United. He also managed the latter club as well as St Johnstone. Born in Aberdeenshire in 1956, slight of build but quick and decisive in

front of goal, he was capped 20 times by his country and was twice a League Cup winner with Dundee United (in 1980 and 1981), while also gaining a runners-up medal in the same competition, as well as finishing runners-up in the Scottish Cup. He was one of Scotland's most entertaining players during the 1980s and is now proving his worth as a manager.

DANGERMAN MICKEY EVANS




MICKEY EVANS is an experienced Irish international striker, who is in his second spell with Argyle, having served also with Southampton, West Brom and Bristol Rovers. Born in Plymouth on New Year's Day 1973, he signed professional forms at Home Park in 1991 and scored 43 goals in 194 appearances before moving to Southampton for £300,000 in 1997. Spells with West Bromwich Albion (with whom he won his only Eire cap) and Bristol Royers preceded his return to Plymouth for £30,000 two years ago. He has now added a further 20 goals and 115 appearances to his tally and last season scored four goals in 42 League games to help Argyle win the Third Division championship. Strong and mobile, he always poses a threat to defenders, especially from dead-ball situations.

DID YOU KNOW?

Twenty years ago, Argyle's goalkeeper Geoff Crudgington (who is still associated with the club) suffered second degree burns saving his home from fire. After hospital treatment he turned out for the Pilgrims and played his part in a 3-1 win over Bradford City.

LAST MEETING

Last season the two league games between the Pilgrims and the Robins resulted in a 1-1 draw at Home Park and a 2-0 victory for Swindon here at The County Ground when Danny Invincible and Sam Parkin scored either side of half-time in front of 5,057 fans.



LUKE McCORMICK

20 year-old goalkeeper who has been at Home Park three years and is now first choice between the posts following an injury to the Frenchman Romain Larrieu who has been sidelined for three months or so.

PAUL CONNELLY

A 21 year-old Liverpudlian defender, signed in 1999 and a professional since 2001, he is now first-choice at right-back having made his senior debut last season.

HASNEY ALJOFREE

Signed from Dundee United last year, having previously played for Bolton Wanderers, the 25 year-old Manchester-born defender has now made over 100 league appearances during his career.

GRAHAM COUGHLAN

An experienced 29 year-old defender with over 160 League appearances under his belt, he has been at Argyle since 2001 having previously assisted Blackburn Rovers, Swindon (on loan), and Livingston.

PAUL WOTTON

Aged 26 with more than 260 League outings behind him, he joined Argyle as a trainee in the early 1990s and has been a regular in their side for the last six seasons, performing superbly well in defence.

LEE HODGES

A 30 year-old midfielder, previously with Tottenham, Wycombe Wanderers, Barnet and Reading, he joined Argyle in 2001 and has now made well over 300 League appearances.

DAVID NORRIS

A 22 year-old midfielder, formerly with Bolton Wanderers, he joined Argyle last year and has now made over 50 appearances in League football.

TONY CAPALDI

Signed from Birmingham City towards the end of season, he failed to make the first team at St Andrew's but has settled well into a defensive role with the Pilgrims.

STEVE ADAMS

A 23 year-old midfielder who signed for Argyle in 1997 and turned professional two years later, he's now made over 120 appearances for his home town club.

MARINO KEITH

In-form 28 year-old Scottish-born striker, ex-Fraserburgh Dundee United, Falkirk and Livingston who has now scored 60 goals in 175 League games

BLAIR STURROCK

The manager's son, 22 years of age, ex- Dundee United and Brechin City, he joined Argyle two years ago and plays as a forward.

IAN STONEBRIDGE

A 22 year-old six-foot striker from Lewisham, he joined Argyle in 1997 and as a teenager won England Youth honours. He's scored 40 goals for the Pilgrims.


And whilst Eric Sabin may not have been the best import since the influx of French footballers to Blighty began (which appears to be around 1992 following the arrival of Eric Cantona to Leeds), our divisions have literally been littered with French talent to the extent that you could probably send two English based teams to confront Sven's men next summer in Portugal.

The Euro 2004 draw (which pitched England and France in the same group) will have been the catalyst for scenes of friendly banter on training grounds all over the country between players of both nations. No doubt Swindon's Sebastian Ruster will be fighting France's corner against a tirade of abuse from his many English team mates! Yet Ruster is not the first French player to play in Swindon's red and white, which got us thinking just how many French players have left French soil to come and ply their trade at the County Ground. And perhaps more importantly, where are they now? Nick Judd donned his beret and with phrase book in hand, went in search of Phillipe Cuervo and co before meeting Town's latest new signing...

Former Townies Ossie Ardiles (Paris St Germain) Glenn Hoddle (AS Monaco) and Chris Jones (Le Havre - who scored the goal to clinch Town's promotion in 1969) made the switch across the channel long before players started coming the other way in order to play for Town. You can't blame then either, I mean, Mansfield on a Tuesday night? Marseille more like, and it appears as though no players appear Frederic Darras was the first Frenchman to join the club in 1996. 1996 was a crazy time in English football. Money spent on players was growing at an exponential rate and as a result many lower-league managers were being forced to shop around Europe for some bargains. Frederic Darras was a result of such a search by Steve McMahon ahead of the 1996/97 season and despite coming with a glittering CV including UEFA Cup experience with Bastia (as well as over 220 games played in the French First Division), Darras was a relatively unknown quantity. Town fans would have been forgiven that Macca had gone soft in his old age, adding some continental flair to what was essentially a hard-working team made up of British based players. Yet Darras was, in fact, another Luc Nijholt and wasn't afraid to get stuck in. However, the lad could also pass the ball and despite his free transfer, Darras would turn out to be a useful commodity for STFC. Accompanying Ian Culverhouse in defence, Town's faithful were treated to an impressive array of skills and long passing from the back during the 29 games in which he played for Town before signing for Paris's Red Star 93.



THE FRENCH CONNECTION




Darras has since retired from playing but helps coach St. Anne de Reims in the French National Division (that's the equivalent Division Two to me and you). Unfortunately Darras' career in England was curtailed because he couldn't settle during his second season and after just 14 appearances in season 1997/98 he left for pastures new. However, just as Darras was leaving, Town took on a far enigmatic Frenchman who, like many wingers before him at Swindon, would go on to frustrate the County Ground faithful. Born just five months after Town's League Cup triumph against Arsenal in 1969, Phillipe Cuervo started his footballing career with St Etienne and Sochaux before joining Town in '97. Again he was relatively unknown, yet Cuervo threatened to become on of Town's most entertaining players with his gun-ho attacking mentality and array of tricks and skills. Unfortunately, having settled at the club (and after dying his hair blonde a la David James), a glut of injuries (and a poor attitude according to many) hampered his progress. Still the County Ground loved him during his three-year stint in Wiltshire and when he played, he would often dazzle the South Stand with his silky skills and tumultuous trickery. Unfortunately he broke his leg twice in two seasons and when his contract ran out at the end of the 1999/00 season, he was released. Cuervo returned to France and word has it, he's still playing for Stade Lavallois...

Next came Eric Sabin, one of Andy King's first proper signings as manager and the third player to make the switch from France. Unlike Darras and Cuervo, Eric

Sabinho' hadn't played in the top division in France, yet he came highly recommended by King and while his goalscoring record was nothing to write home about, his speed and attacking dimensions led Town's boss to compare his style of play to that of Thierry Henry. Eric's first club was Nimes who he represented in the 1995 French cup final against Auxerre. Unfortunately the then third division side couldn't make French football history (and lost the game 3-1), but Auxerre's qualification into the Champions League meant that Nimes did enough to earn a spot in the UEFA Cup Winner's Cup the following season. Sabin then joined Wasquehall, which is where he was picked up by King and in his first five games for Town, he earned four penalties in his first five games. Town fans had to wait a lot longer for his first goal, however, when he bagged in Town's 1-1 draw with Brighton on November 24 2001, and while his accuracy in front of goal would lead many to expect the worst, the site of him in full flow, running at opposing defenders was a joy to behold.

Shortly before his contract expired at the end of the 2002/03 season Eric was offered a reduced deal and, after Queens Park Rangers had surprisingly expressed an interest in him on transfer deadline day, he played for them in a reserve game. He returned to Swindon to feature in the final game of the season - before confirming that he would leave when his deal ran out. More recently, Sabin featured in the Hoops' starting line-up when the two clubs clashed in the 1-1 draw November. Someone that didn't feature in that game,



however, despite signing for Town in the last two months, was new boy Sebastian Ruster.

Ruster, unheard of by many, has shown signs of promise in Town's reserve team so far this season, not surprising when you consider that he scored 10 goals in 25 games for Cannes last year. "My agent knows Peter Reid and he recommended me to Leeds, so I went across for a trial," Ruster explains, with superb English for someone who's only been learning the language for a matter of weeks. "I went over at the start of pre-season and it was a great experience. There are so many quality players there such as Alan Smith and Mark Viduka." Whilst at Elland Road Ruster also got acquainted with a player many Town fans would grow to love as the season developed, Jamie Milner. "Milner stood out as having great skill and I think he could go on and play for England. He's young now, but he has the talent to succeed."

As for Ruster himself, we're still getting to know our latest French fancy. He's settling well into the squad and has performed well for the reserves - one feels that it won't be too long before we see him in first team action. "There is not a big difference in the pace of the game," Ruster explains, having watched his new team mates from the stands on a number of occasions. "Both the English and French leagues are quick, but England is much more physical than I am used to! I enjoy the training and relish each chance I get on the pitch. My English is not so good but I am having lessons at the moment. Before I play in the first team regularly I


need to learn the language fully and I am trying my best to do that now."

Ruster's grasp of the language is admirable; after all, it can't be easy learning from the gaffer such is his use of expletives (!). But with the European Championships draw still fresh in the memory, we asked Sebastian what he thought about his country's hopes, and who inspired him as he was growing up as a player. 'I watched the France '98 World Cup Final at home with friends. It was a tremendous day and something I will remember for a long time. The French winning team included many great players -Zinedine Zidane was my player of the tournament and he has everything; skill, pace and awareness. Now, my favourite player is Arsenal's Thierry Henry. I have seen him play on TV and he is tremendous. When he dribbles at defenders he is frightening. My all-time footballing hero has to be Eric Cantona though. He grew up about ten minutes from my parents house in Marseille and played for the same youth team as me, Caillol F.C."

If Ruster's game contains any of the traits of those mentioned above then Town's faithful could be in for some entertainment as soon as the youngster makes his first team debut. Yet no matter how long it takes him to make his way into Town's starting XI, Ruster knows that should he help Town achieve their aim and make it into the play-offs, he will have ventured where no Frenchman has done so before, into good times with the good ship Swindon Town.

However, an exception may be made for players to return to local football to gain further game time, if they have not been featuring regularly in our games programme, although they continue to be coached by ourselves at STFC. It is very important that we sustain a good relationship with the local leagues and we feel that we are doing so this season and are looking forward to various games with our U9's to U12's against the North Wiltshire representative teams next Monday and Tuesday, to be held here at The County Ground. We look forward to welcoming them to The County Ground and we hope that both sides enjoy the experience of playing here.

Our U16's were due to face Scottish giants Celtic at the training ground in a pre-arranged friendly on Thursday. Due to their winter break they are staying in Bath and have requested to play us during their time down south. I would like to thank Celtic FC for taking part in the game and I am sure the experience will have benefited both sides.

WE MEET AGAIN...

DAVE WALLIS DELVES INTO HIS ARCHIVES TO PROVIDE US WITH TWO PLAYERS WHO HAVE BEEN INVOLVED WITH BOTH CLUBS.

Nicky Hammond

Nicky Hammond is now more at home in the suit of the boardroom than the cap and gloves of the goalkeeper, but back in the summer of 1987 he joined Town from Arsenal as understudy to Fraser Digby.

A product of Arsenal's apprenticeship scheme,
Hornchurch born Nicky never made the first team at
Highbury and was loaned out to Bristol Rovers in August
1986 where he made his League debut. After three
appearances at Bath based Rovers and further,
appearance-free loan spells at Peterborough and
Aberdeen, Nicky travelled to pastures new in Wiltshire.

Kenny Allen had left Swindon and after using future England keeper Tim Flowers as loan cover, Lou Macari needed someone to permanently pressurise Digby's position as Swindon established themselves in the old Division Two. Hammond was to stay eight years but shifting 'Diggers' from between the posts was never going to be easy.

Hammond was to steal the first team shirt on just 18% of the League opportunities during which he made 67 League appearances for Town, including 13 outings in the Premiership.

A £40,000 move to today's visitors Plymouth in August 1995 produced just four outings before the same fee brought a curtain call at Reading and a further 25. His contract was terminated at the end of 1999/2000.

After coaching the schoolboy keepers at the club, when manager Alan Pardew left Reading to take the reins at West Ham, chairman John Madejski's respect for Hammond was such that Nicky was promoted to the boardroom as Director of Football.

It seems a waste that Hammond made one less than a hundred League appearances in his entire playing career. In mitigation, challenging John Lukic and Fraser Digby, for their places was a tough task.

Craig Taylor

When central defender Craig Taylor joined Swindon in April 1997 he was stepping into the boots of a legend and it was natural for comparisons to be drawn between him and another member of his family.

Big brother Shaun had scored for Town at Wembley three years previously and had departed to Bristol City in August 1996. Craig's West Country grounding at Dorchester bore similarities with Shaun's route into the senior ranks and the potential was there for a seamless transition between the two Taylors in the centre of Town's defence. The theory of relativity however was proved to be flawed.

1997/98 started with Mark Seagraves at number five and after loan signing Chris Casper filled in for four matches, October brought Craig's debut with a career starting goal in a 4-2 home win against Port Vale. Another strike followed a month later against QPR as he made 32 appearances in Division One.

Injury hampered the start of 1998/99 with Taylor not starting a Town match until November. In order to regain fitness Craig had spent a six match spell at our visitors today Plymouth, where he scored in a 3-0 Division Three win against Brentford. Back in Swindon, he completed 21 games to the end of the season.

Two more Swindon appearances at the beginning of 1999/2000 preceded a permanent move to Home Park where Craig settled in to become almost ever present to the end of the season. When 2000/01 produced another 39 League outings, he must have felt happy with the way he had established himself in the Devon side's team. What a contrast then when injury led to the disappointment of just two more outings over the next two seasons.

2002/03 saw a five-match loan spell at nearest neighbours Torquay United and when Craig was released by Plymouth at the end of last season it was to Plainmoor that fate took him. A permanent move now sees Craig installed as captain where he can be found with other ex-Town players in Jo Kuffour and keeper Kevin Dearden.

Alan's team is chosen only from players that he can remember seeing play.


- FRASER DIGBY: Fantastic goalkeeper. More than capable of dealing with whatever is thrown at him especially with this defence in front.

Who can ever forget that great game at Wembley and all its nail biting drama? The game of the season? Well actually, no. That honour must surely go to an incredible display of attacking flair at St.Andrews, Birmingham when a mere 4-1 down with 25 minutes left Swindon turned on the style and ran out 6-4 winners. The hat-trick hero that day was a big Glaswegian long since departed these shores for his adopted Oz.

Dave Mitchell made 68 appearances for Town and with his physical no nonsense approach notched up 16 goals including the three mentioned above and one in the play-off semi-final against Tranmere at the County Ground.

Now living in Sydney, Australia, Dave took time out to tell us about his days at the Town together with how close he came to taking charge of the Socceroos. He began by bringing us up to date.

When I left the Club I was at Millwall for a couple of years and from there went over to Malaysia on the way back to Australia. I wanted to bring my kids up in Australia as I had grown up there. My family had emigrated when I was six years old and my wife was Australian.


When I got back the manager of the Club I was playing for, Sydney Olympic, got the sack and I took over for the last 10 games. At the end of the season they had an experienced coach lined up so I left and went to manage Sydney United. They were in financial difficulties but I took them over and we went on to finish 3rd the next season. This was in 1997.

'The following year the Club went into administration but we won the league which was a fantastic achievement and I got Coach Of The Year for Australia. A new Club was then formed out of the ashes of an old Rugby League side called Parramatta and so I went to manage them and 13 players came with me.

"I was with them for three seasons during which time we came 10th, 9th and 7th although the youth team won the championship in the first two years and came runners up in the third year. That takes us up to the end of 2001/02 and after that I began scouting for Feyenoord which I have been doing for about a year and am still doing now."

Continuing our stroll down memory lane, Dave went on to recall the promotion season at the County Ground and the final at Wembley.

"It was remarkable really. I remember Channel 4 doing a documentary and it was said right at the beginning of the season that the last time someone did a documentary the team got promoted. No one believed that we could do it. We did ourselves as we played good football and on our day we could beat anyone. A lot of people outside the Club were sceptical from what I recall. Leicester were quite a big side and no-one really fancied our chances.



We came out onto the pitch and there was a fantastic crowd. My dad came over from Australia and it was a special day for him as people always dream of playing at Wembley and having moved his family out to Australia he never expected it.

"We really didn't want to let the Club down, the players felt it was a real responsibility that we got the Club up for all the fans that had supported us that year.

"When it was 3-0 I thought 'how good is this, we're playing at Wembley and we're three up.' And then all of a sudden, bang, bang, bang, they scored three goals. I can remember having a one on one, it was 3-3 with about 5 minutes to go and I could have been the hero but as I shot the ball I scuffed it. I thought it was going to go under the keeper but he actually sat on the thing. I felt like kicking him and the ball into the net. I thought that this was going to be the defining moment for Swindon not getting into the Premier League and it was all my fault. But luckily enough we got a penalty soon afterwards through Steve White and Paul Bodin tucked it away."

Some fans criticised Dave when he left the Club during the summer of 93 but he reveals that he wanted to come back but an FA rule prevented him doing so.

"I came back after going over to Turkey in a move that didn't work out and I actually trained with Swindon. John Gorman wanted to sign me back but they had this ridiculous rule that once you've left a Club you couldn't go back within a year. John had said to me 'come back Mitch we need you' and I would have come back to Swindon gladly but there was that silly rule."

Finally, having tasted success with both Swindon and club management in Oz Dave so nearly made an impact on the world stage. The Aussie/Scot with a Liverpudlian Dad explains how he just missed out on the big one.

"After I won coach of the year I went for the Australian job and was told I was the favourite to get it because I'd done well and what happened was Frank Farina got it. He pipped me for it which is still gut wrenching today."





This week to celebrate the end of the 10 year anniversary promotion year The Hack had a chat with the man who won the most famous penalty in Town history, Steve "Chalkie" White, as well as the man who buried it, Paul 'Zippy" Bodin.

Firstly, thanks to Mike Lewis and Simon Bayliss for your emails. The Hack is on the trail although one or two of the players you wanted me to find seem to have gone into hiding. However, I'm getting warmer and hope to bring you some news in a future edition.

Three weeks ago Chippenham Town, bottom of the Dr.Martens Premier League appointed a new man to try and revive the teams flagging fortunes. The man chosen is a very familiar face to Swindon fans. Steve White pulled on a Town shirt 244 times scoring 83 goals as part of a long and successful league career that had already seen him play for Bristol Rovers, Luton Town and Charlton Athletic before his arrival at the County Ground in the mid 1980's.

After leaving Swindon at the end of the Premiership season "Chalkie" moved to Hereford where his prolific goalscoring continued as he netted 44 times in 76 appearances between 1994 and 96. His playing career finished at Cardiff City where he spent two further years up to 1998.


Steve made his first move into management between 1998 and 2001 when he worked as assistant to Paul Bodin at Bath City. He left the club but stayed in the city when he became Director Of Coaching for the Southampton FC Bath Academy. He enjoyed his role where he coached 7 to 16 year olds on behalf of the south coast club. He is proud to say that three of his young prospects look like they will go far. Keep your

eyes and ears open for Martin Crainie, Nathan Dyer and Lloyd James.

Steve decided to take his chance to become 'the gaffer' by signing a 2 and a half year contract at Chippenham.

"It's a great opportunity for me. Although it was good to be working for a Premiership club I missed the day to day involvement. It was too good to miss."

White's old boss at Twerton Park, Paul Bodin, left Swindon for Reading in 1996 before taking the reins at Bath City in 1998. He left half way through his third year at the club and returned to the County Ground where he had previously made 239 appearances and scored 37 goals including 'that goal' under the shadow of the twin towers.

The day will mark the end of manager Mark McGhee's first two months in charge of the Seagulls since he took over from Reading-bound Steve Coppell. Albion had a rude awakening when relegation to Division Two on the last day of last season followed promotion 12 months earlier.

This season a good start gave way to a drop in form but with a recovery under way they are once more justifying the pre-season odds of 8/1 for the top spot, even though Brighton's away record shows that the are not unbeatable
