
WELCOME BACK TO THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME AGAINST COLCHESTER.

GOOD AFTERNOON AND WELCOME TO EVERYONE FOR TODAY'S MATCH UP WITH COLCHESTER UNITED.

On behalf of the Board of Directors at the County Ground can I also offer a warm welcome to the Directors, Mangement, Players and Supporters of Colchester. The hospitality afforded to us at Layer Road last August was very warm and I hope you enjoy your day, although I would like the three points to stay in Wiltshire.

At long last I am able to give you my thoughts on the AGM. All in all it was a positive meeting. The three sets of accounts presented (1998/99,1999/2000,2000/01) did not make for pleasant reading. However given the two periods of administration the club has suffered over the past few years, that was always going to be the case. The important thing is that the club is structured in such a way that it can stand on its own two feet, with the objective of breaking even over the course of the financial year. I believe we are well on the way to achieving this. Clearly, we need to keep improving incoming revenue into the club. That means several things. Firstly, we must work with our fan base to improve attendances at the County Ground. We need to capture data more proficiently and use that data for a co-odinated push to develop attendence and expenditure at the Stadium. This effort must be replicated in the corporate market. Businesses are returning to the County Ground. We have some of the most professional and friendly corporate matchday offerings anywhere in the League and, I believe, that the efforts of Mike Sullivan and his commercial team are being noticed. But we are still striving to re-establish our credibility with our fans - both corporate and individuals after a very difficult few seasons where, as a club, we alienated many local people.

The clubshop has improved dramatically, in customer service, revenues and bottom line delivery, and needs to improve further. Non-matchday conference and banqueting revenue is also improved. But, as the Winners Lounge is one of Wiltshire's biggest conferencing facilities, I know there is still room for further improvement.

Costs need to be monitored very closely. In line with the new ruling from the Football League, the total cost of salaries for our playing squad cannot exceed 60% of our turnover next season. Other costs too need to be minimised. With an ageing stadium, suffering from a lack of investment, this is not always easy but we just have to manage the situation as well as possible. Both Sandy Gray and I were delighted to receive shareholder support for us to continue as Directors of Swindon Town Football Company Limited. The company has become a subsidary of Swindon Town FC Limited, a company controlled by James Wills. The holding company is now the vehicle for the club to obtain any additional cash requirements, should it be necessary to do so.

A couple of things to note from our trip to Hillsborough. Firstly, the wonderfully noisy support. Apart from their famous band, you outsang the Wednesday fans from start to finish. Please keep up the noise levels at home, which I know is more difficult as our support is split between three stands. Secondly, when the match referee was taken ill midway through the first half, the PA system appealed for any class one referees in attendance to make themselves known, our very own Sales & Marketing Manager, Mike 'Pierluigi Collina' Sullivan offered his services. I would have paid the admission fee alone to see Mike, trying to contain Andy King within the technical area. Maybe one day we'll get the chance.





THERE WAS NO FESTIVE CHEER FOR TEN MEN TOWN FOLLOWING A 2-0 BOXING DAY **DEFEAT AT RUSHDEN &** DIAMONDS WRITES STFC SPORTS REPORTER SIMON COY.

A brace of goals from big striker Lowe, one in each half, ended Swindon's resistance in another evenly matched contest which saw the home team make the most of very few chances after Swindon had been reduced to ten man following the sending off of Rory Fallon.

The game began with a strong wind behind the home team. An early attack saw a good through ball find big striker Onandi Lowe running through on goal. Rhys Evans raced off his line to clear well with his feet. Rodney Jack fired back towards the empty net from 30 yards but only struck Gurney guarding the open goal.

In the 12th minute a long Nicholas throw was met by Parkin in the box but the striker couldn't make a good contact and nodded wide of the right hand upright. Shortly after at the other end a heavy back pass from Gurney put Evans under pressure but the keeper cleared well.

Swindon went close five minutes later when Howard played a pass towards Igoe making a run in behind Parkin who laid the ball into his path. The little midfielder took a touch before letting fly from the edge of the box forcing keeper Ashdown into a good save to turn the ball just wide of the right post.


However in the 23rd minute Rushden took the lead. Rodney Jack tested Evans with a long range shot, which the keeper did well to tip over the bar for a corner. The ball in was initially cleared before falling for Jack on the edge of the area. He skipped round Gurney before floating the ball into

the box. Hunter flicked on towards the giant Lowe who powered in a header from 6 yards.


A minute later skipper Gurney picked up another booking for dissent after voicing his opinion to referee Warren. Just on the half hour mark disaster. struck when Rory Fallon was shown a straight red card for an off the ball incident in the Rushden box involving Barry Hunter.


Referee Warren again reached for his book again shortly before half time to give Steve Robinson a yellow card for a challenge on Dempster.

Town began brightly in the second half going straight on the attack as Miglioranzi slipped the ball through to Parkin but the move broke down as Super Sam delayed his cross. At the other end Andy Sambrook made a good run down the right but his ball across was cut out by Evans.

Just before the hour an excellent Howard ball found Parkin on the right. He turned and played the ball across to Robinson who cut inside and fired a shot, which Ashdown saved well down to his right.

Andy King made his first change immediately after bringing on Mooney for Sammy Igoe and the Town fans turned up the volume to chant the name of the big number eight.

In the 62nd minute Swindon went further behind. Alan Reeves collected a booking after hauling down Lowe on the edge of the box. The huge striker dragged himself to his feet before striking a free-kick through the Town wall into the back of the net.

Soon after Howard made another confident run through the centre of midfield but sent his weak shot wide of the right hand upright. Minutes later Gurney fired high and wide from long range as Town tried desperately to pull a goal back. Miglioranzi found space for a shot which was deflected into the path of Parkin but the alert keeper collected before the number nine could react.

Both teams made a change with fifteen minutes left. David Duke came on for Howard in midfield and Rushden brought on Ritchie Hanlon for the hard working Lowe.

With ten minutes left Town were awarded a free kick 25 yards out when Parkin had his shirt pulled. Mooney stepped up but could only fire low into the wall and the ball was scrambled clear.

With a minute left Evans made a superb





save to deny Burgess from an excellent Kitson cross. As the rain lashed down referee Warren brought the contest to an end and the fantastic support from the 1,089 Swindon fans was unable to raise the team enough to take anything from a disappointing game.



TOWN BROUGHT THE HIGH FLYING SEAGULLS DOWN TO **EARTH AS STEFANI** MIGLIORANZI SCORED THE WINNER AFTER LEON KNIGHT HAD EQUALISED FOLLOWING SAM PARKIN'S OPENER WRITES STFC SPORTS REPORTER ADRIAN SMITH.

Town made a bright start through Sammy Igoe's attacking play but had to withstand early Brighton pressure before going close from an elaborate free-kick involving Tommy Mooney, Andy Gurney and Matt Hewlett. The strong wind blowing towards the Town goal led to Rhys Evans struggling with a Nicholas backpass when the ball bounced over his foot and out for a corner which was cleared.

In the 20th minute Mooney and Parkin get in each other's way in front of goal as Igoe crossed and the ball was cleared. Hewlett made a good

interception in midfield and his pass to Parkin resulted in a corner by Howard, which was cleared, and moments later Nicholas had a shot that went just over the bar.

Nicholas made a timely interception from McPhee and at the other end Howard sent Nicholas clear in the 28th minute with Parkin lurking in the 6-yard box but the ball was cleared for a corner. Igoe had a powerful volley which struck Carpenter for another corner and shortly afterwards Miglioranzi's shot from 20 yards flew just over the bar.


Two minutes before half-time Brighton were awarded a free-kick when Igoe handled but Watson's free-kick struck the defensive wall and Carpenter created a good move for Yeates but his shot flew over.

Sam Parkin warmed up the bitterly cold County Ground when he put Town

ahead from close range in the 45th minute after Miglioranzi flicked the ball on from Gurney's free-kick and there was no time for the game to restart


Brighton replaced McPhee with Leon Knight at half-time and he almost equalised for the visitors with a curling shot which went just wide and the substitute was involved moments later with a cross which was intercepted by Evans. At the other end a superb ball by Miglioranzi set up Gurney but his shot was high and wide with the goal at his mercy and the captain managed to repeat the feat after a pass from Howard!

Knight had the ball in the net in the 53rd minute after a cross by Mayo but was ruled offside although two minutes later Knight pounced on a header by Butters to score the equaliser and the goalscorer was also cautioned for over-exuberant celebrations as he took his shirt off.

Matt Hewlett went close in the 57th minute with a powerful volley after a cheeky backheeled effort by Mooney in front of goal was cleared. It looked like Town had taken a deserved lead when Miglioranzi's close range shot struck the crossbar and bounced on the goal line but the ball was cleared. However there was no doubt about Miglioranzi's next effort when he bundled the ball into the net at the backpost in the 66th minute to lift the volume around the County Ground.

Zesh Renham replaced Piercy in the 69th minute just before Evans made a commanding save from a Brighton free-kick and at the other end Mooney had a shot saved. There were cautions for Gurney following a late challenge in the 74th minute and also Benham who was cautioned for dissent after a free-kick had been awarded against Brighton.

Evans made a superb diving save


from a Benham shot in the 79th minute and moments later Knight was lucky not to see a second yellow card for a late challenge on Gurney.

Mooney set up Igoe and his defence splitting ball sent Parkin clear in front of goal but he took one touch too many and his shot was blocked and Parkin was guilty of a glaring miss in the 82nd minute when a superb ball by Igoe reached Super Sam but his first time shot went wide.

Yeates had a long-range effort in the 83rd minute but his shot went wide and moments later Ifil made a last ditch tackle on Knight to concede a corner. Brighton pressed hard for an equaliser but Town counterattacked strongly through Parkin, Igoe and Mooney but were unable to get a clear shot on goal.

A free-kick in the 90th minute led to a scramble in the Town penalty area





but the ball was cleared by Igoe and in the 2nd minute of added time Brighton were reduced to 10 men when Nathan Jones was sent off for violent conduct after a tackle on Hewlett. Seconds later the Referee Mr S Tanner blew up for full-time as Town ended 2003 on a high note to delight the crowd of 9.269.



Food, glorious, food. And lots of it as Head Chef Clive Harper slaves over a hot stove to prepare around 200 three course lunches for the Club's special guests before a match. An evening function as well may mean that Clive, ably assisted by right hand man Nick Pothecary and Caroline Turner, cooks for more than 450 hungry people before the day is over.

Married to Pauline, Clive, 51, lives in Stratton and has one son, Keir. He has worked at the Club for 14 years having begun as a contract caterer. His culinary skills were originally honed in the hotel trade before he moved into catering in the health service.

Away from the County Ground he keenly follows his beloved Bath Rugby Club and has recently returned from The Stade Selery in France where he enjoyed the 32-25 victory over Colomiers in the Parker Pen Cup.

3.45pm - 4.00pm -

The rest of the day is now dependent upon whether there is an evening function. If not we can enjoy some of the game before heading home but if there are more guests due we would then be cooking again and may end up leaving after clearing up at between 10pm and 11pm.



THE ILLUSTRATION ABOVE IS THE CENTRE SPREAD FROM THE PROGRAMME FROM THE SWINDON V COLCHESTER MATCH PLAYED IN APRIL 1963.

The programme was of a pocket size and contained 32 pages of which thirteen besides the centre pages contained advertisements. Coverage of the visiting team was limited to couple of pages listing the previous club and place of birth of the Colchester squad. A remarkable 8 of 21 listed were Colchester born while a further 5 hailed from Scotland. The programme also contained several pages devoted to Club notes and Supporters Club notes. What really caught my eye in these was the information in the Supporters club notes that the gate for Swindon's home game with Millwall had been higher than any other Third Division gate that day and how they hoped to see regular crowds of 20,000 at the County Ground.


My abiding memory of the match is the dreadful muddy conditions it was played in a contrast to the sunshine of the previous day when Swindon had

lost 3-2 at home to Peterborough. Town made a number of team changes. Colin Huxford who had deputised for right back Owen Dawson was replaced by veteran Maurice Owen while injury to Bobby Woodruff meant a first team debut for Willie Harbour. Another switch was on the left wing where Eric Weaver replaced Cliff Jackson. The changes seemed to be working as after eight minutes Owen started a move that ended with Mike Summerbee holding off the challenge of United's John Fowler, a man who was to play over 400 games for the Essex side, to run through and score. Ten minutes later however United were back on terms Martyn King glancing in a free-kick by Mike Grice who was enjoying a second spell with the visitors. As half-time approach there was little between the sides when a hat trick that possibly deserves a place in the Guiness Book of Records occurred. The hat-trick was scored by the Town's centre forward, burly John Stevens. Moments from half time a corner by Weaver led to a goalmouth scramble which R C E the Pink reporter reckoned ended with a final touch by Stevens. The second goal came with

Town's firsatattack of the second half with Summerbee feeding Stevens who defeated the attempts of the mud and two Colchester defenders to drilling a shot into the net. The goal which completed the six minute hat trick came following a Summerbee corner and was a powerful header. Stevens added to United's woes by turning creator when he laid on the pass for Ernie Hunt to score Towns fifth goal. The Essex side battled bravely and put some pressure on Swindon in the closing stages and it was scant reward for their efforts when Hunt added a sixth for Swindon with five minutes remaining. The victory left Town at the top of the table and although by the season's end Northampton Town overhauled them Town completed a double over United. thanks to two Roger Smart goals, and went on to promotion. Colchester had endured a bad start to the season but had battled back into a mid table position. Colchester finished a respectable 12th with 47 points from 46 games. It was a porous defence which conceded 93 goals, more than Brighton and Carlisle who were both relegated, that stopped them launching a promotion challenge.

THE GAFFER

Still registered as a player - he's only 36 years of age - Phil Parkinson took over as manager at Layer Road in February of last year. Born in Chorley, Lancashire, he played his early football with Southampton and then did well with Bury and Reading, amassing 170 appearances for the Shakers

and over 420 for the Royals.

Always playing with fervour and commitment, he was a Second Division championship winner in 1994 with the latter club. He won the Division Two 'Manager of the Month' award after just four weeks in charge at Layer road and duly lifted the Essex club clear of relegation.

DANGERMAN SCOTT FITZGERALD



Defender and team captain Scott Fitzgerald, aged 34, started his career in the top flight with Wimbledon for whom he made 125 appearances between 1989 and 1997. During that time he also assisted, on loan, both Sheffield United and Millwall before signing for the latter club for £50,000. He made 93 appearances for the Lions before his transfer to Laver Road on a 'free' in October 2000. Over the last three years or so he has added a another 125 plus appearances top his tally and is one of the most consistent players in the Second Division. Born in the heart of London (near Westminster Bridge/Abbey) he rarely puts a foot wrong, leads by example and is quick, enthusiastic and has already represented the Republic of Ireland in one 'B' and four Under-21 internationals.

DID YOU KNOW?

Colchester United have been a League club for only 54 years...they lost their status in 1990 but returned two years later as GM Vauxhall Conference champions, the same year they also won the FA Trophy.

LAST MEETING

Last season, the two League games between the clubs ended in a 1-0 win for Colchester at Layer Road and a 2-2 draw here at The County Ground when a crowd of 4,152 saw both Gurney and Sabin score in the space of three second-half minutes, after McGleish and Pinault had put the visitors two up.



BOBBY BOWRY

32 year-old experienced midfielder with almost 300 senior appearances under his belt, achieved with Crystal Palace, Millwall and Colchester, the latter since 2001.

SIMON BROWN

First choice goalkeeper, 6ft 2ins tall, 27 years of age who joined United from Tottenham Hotspur in 1999 after a loan spell with Lincoln City. He has made over 125 appearances for the 'U's'.

JAMIE CADE

Defender, on loan from Middlesbrough, who made his debut for the Premiership club last season as a 'sub' in the League Cup. He's 20 and comes from Durham.

LIAM CHILVERS

22 year-old defender who signed for Colchester from Arsenal, having previously been on loan the club as well as serving with Northampton and Notts county.

KARL DUGUID

25 year-old striker who has been at layer Road ten years and a 'pro' since 1996. He has scored over 40 goals for United in almost 300 senior appearances.

CRAIG FAGAN

On-loan striker from Birmingham City, suspended for three matches over Christmas, is 21 years of age and has also been associated with Bristol City.

GREG HALFORD

A 19 year-old from Chelmsford, at 6ft 4in he is one of the tallest defenders in the professional game. He made his debut last season and is now a valid member of the Colchester squad.

KEM IZZET

A tigerish midfielder, fit after injury worries, he is the brother of Muzzy Izzet, the Leicester City midfielder. Aged 22, born in London, he played initially for Charlton before moving to Layer Road in 2001.

All Soccer Centres are back up and running after the Christmas and New Year break.

In the first couple of weeks in the Soccer Centre courses we will be working on control and passing of the ball.

This afternoon we are looking at the inside foot and lace control. As always it is important you work on control with both feet, a good service from your partner is also essential.

PICTURES 1 + 2

Using the inside of your left and right foot, cushion the ball so that it drops







in front of you, so that you are ready to pass the ball. Make sure before receiving the ball you are on your toes and your standing foot is in line with the ball, ready to receive the pass. Also, remember to use your arms to maintain your balance.

PICTURES 3+4

Control doesn't always have to be with the inside of your foot. Staying on your toes and with your standing foot is in line with the ball, you can control the ball with a light touch this time using the laces of both feet. Again, using your arms for balance.

Sam says: "Like all skills control is something that improves with lots of practice. You can do this with friends or even by throwing a football against a wall and controlling the ball with the inside and laces of both feet."

Next up, for an all ticket affair at the County Ground, were the 'millionaires' of Newcastle, managed by Kevin Keegan, and parading their new 'deadline day' signings of Andy Cole and a certain Mark Robinson. Town on the other hand, had been forced to sell one of their best players, David Kerslake, to Leeds for £500,000 to keep the 'wolf from the door'. 17,574 packed into the County Ground, 3,000 Geordies having made the long trip south, and the atmosphere, to coin a cliché, was electric. The first 45 minutes passed in what felt like five, and the half time whistle sounded with Newcastle holding the narrowest of advantages thanks to a David Kelly strike. The second half was played at an equally frantic pace, with Swindon getting more and more into the game. Eventually, Chalky was sent sprawling in the area. A youthful Graham Poll pointed straight to the spot and Zippy stepped up to smash home the penalty. (This was not the last time the White/Bodin combination would prove vital to Town's success!). Town were not finished there though, and with about 15 minutes to go, Calderwood bundled the ball over the line to send the home fans into ecstasy. There was

still time for Kelly to lob inches over the bar in the dying minutes, but Town held on for one of the all time great victories.

After all of that, a wet Tuesday night in Luton was something of a come down (Then again, a wet Tuesday in Luton is a come down, compared to just about anything!) Nonetheless, a very functional and important point was carved out in a 0-0 draw. The next six games saw Town pick up 10 points, which, whilst being respectable, meant that any lingering hopes of automatic promotion pretty much vanished. One result worthy of special mention during this run was a 0-0 draw at Brentford, which saw Chalky and Dave Mitchell both sent off before half time. We still managed to outplay the home side with nine men and no forwards, and came within inches of an unlikely win when Bodin shaved the crossbar late on.

On April 12th 1993 at 3pm, the only place in the world to be was St Andrews, home of Birmingham City. If you, like me, can say "I was there", you will not forget the events of that afternoon in a hurry. Birmingham were struggling near the bottom at the time, so a fairly straightforward point, at worst, seemed on the cards. It came as a bit of a surprise then, to go a goal down, and when 00H! Shaun Taylor was off the pitch receiving stitches to a head wound, we were even more surprised to go two down. Having been sewn up though, big Shaun came straight back on and pulled a goal back (which just about sums the man up really). 2-1 at half time then. everything to play for.



Ten minutes after the restart though, it looked like it was time to pack up and go home, as Birmingham went 4-1 up, including a 25 yard screamer from Andy Saville. Town were knocking it around quite nicely with Hoddle and Hazard playing particularly well, but there didn't seem to be any way back - How could there be? Suddenly, out of nowhere, Maskell pulled one back, 4-2. I looked at the clock at the far end and realised there were a good 25 minutes to go. Hmmmmm...a draw perhaps? No, don't be silly! A few minutes later and Mitchell pulled it back to 4-3. Come on Town! That draw's looking good now, we look like scoring with every attack! Sure enough, a few minutes later, Mitchell made it 4-4, sparking scenes of delirium in the away end, forget the draw, we can win this! Five minutes later, Maskell nodded in at the far post 5-4! Dream time -This cannot be happening. But as if to confirm that yes, it definitely was happening, Dave Mitchell rounded the keeper with a minute to go to complete his hat-trick and a 6-4 (Yes, 6-4) victory.







WHEN 6'3 DEFENDER ANDY NICHOLAS WALKED THROUGH THE REVOLVING COUNTY GROUND DOORS OVER THE SUMMER, THE FIRST THING HE DID WAS OUTLINE HIS HOPES FOR THE COMING SEASON.

"I just want to get started and do as well as I can by putting some pressure onto the first team players. I have to aim high and do my best."

However, the youngster's route from Liverpool to Swindon was not necessarily an straight one, as he explains.


"I came through the youth system at Liverpool, but I actually spent six months on trial at Everton before that! Everton stalled on any decision whereas Liverpool signed me on after two days training with them.


"I got my YTS after completing my GCSE's and got my first game for the Reserves at left back against Manchester City at the end of that year. I also captained the Under 17 side there as well as playing quite a few games at reserve level."

So despite impressing throughout his career at Anfield, Nicholas was one of the last players to be informed of his release from the Club. Whilst other players in his age were told in January of last year, he was not aware of his transfer availability until May.

"I was released quite late by Liverpool as they weren't sure whether to keep me on, so then went to the exit trials and there were a few teams who enquired about me. In May, Bristol City, Bradford, QPR and Luton showed some interest but I didn't feel comfortable with them. Having come out of the academy at Liverpool, I suddenly realized that it was a harsher world.

"The Gaffer phoned me and after speaking to Steve Heighway (Academy Director at Liverpool), he then invited me to come down and after a meeting, we sorted out a contract."





True to his word upon joining the Club, the 20-year old has not disappointed and has brought a breath of fresh air to the Town back-line. Having made his debut in the LDV Vans at Boston United, he made his first league appearance for Swindon Town at Saltergate against Chesterfield.

"After pre-season I played about ten games in the reserves. I learnt a lot at Liverpool and I knew that if I kept my head down and worked hard then hopefully my chance would come. I made my first league appearance against Chesterfield and that was an unbelievable experience. That was my first 'real' game if you like. Playing in the reserves at Liverpool was competitive but Chesterfield was a totally different level.

"Having had a run of games now, I think I have proved to myself that I can do it. I have become a bit more streetwise as there are some very experienced pro's in this division and I think I have become more ruthless because of that."

So having arrived at The County Ground, how has he adjusted to life as a regular member of the first team squad?

"I have to thank Reevesy and Adi Viveash as they have been a great help to me, they are always talking and that is a great help to a young player such as myself. I always try and take that advice onboard."

Another player who has an association with Merseyside is Dave Challinor, formerly of Tranmere Rovers. The Stockport County defender has perhaps the longest throw throughout the leagues but Nicholas will be looking to contest this when the two come head to head at Edgeley Park on February 14th.

"I have always had a long throw since I was young. I worked on it with the fitness and conditioning coaches there, they used to get me to throw medicine balls which seemed to help. It is just technique rather than strength. Dave Challinor has a massive throw and he used to rocket them in so we will find out who has the longer throw at the Stockport game!"

Thankfully for Town, Nicholas made the move south from Liverpool and he has impressed at both left-back and in the centre of defence so far this season.

"One of the nice things about it is that I now have the chance to prove myself against sides such as Bristol City and Luton, who didn't follow up their initial interest.

"I think these last four games have really pushed us into the thick of it. There are no easy games in this Division but our home form has come on and I would be happy playing anyone at home the way we are performing at the moment."

So as we entertain Colchester United this afternoon, not only is Town's left-back grateful for his chance to be playing at The County Ground, but he is determined to do his utmost to ensure a happy ending to his first season as part of the red army revolution.

"My time so far has been brilliant. It has far exceeded my expectations. I have gained some respect from the players and I have worked hard. When I went on trial at the other clubs, I didn't feel as at home as I do here now."







replacement. Mildenhall has recently forced his way into the first team at the expense of Bart Griemink and Andy was on the lookout for a young keeper to similarly pressurise Bart's place.

Born in May 1979 in Ballymoney, McKinney's age certainly fitted the bill. The Irishman had signed for City on a free transfer from Ballymena in

> August 1999, but the presence of Nicky Weaver and Carlo Nash at Maine Road

was always likely to make it difficult to make the first team pitch. After two years of understudying the pair and without a first team outing to his name, Richard took the decision to move south to Swindon to accept a fresh challenge in July 2001.

At 6ft 3in, Richard may have got used to being the man asked to change the light bulbs, so it may have come as a surprise to him to find that he was no taller than Bart and actually shorter than the departed Mildenhall.

Unfortunately the free transfer move didn't yield the first team opportunities that he surely hoped for. Restricted to just one League outing at Stoke City, it's perhaps unfair to observe that the game took place on April Fools day and resulted in a 2-0 defeat.

McKinney moved eastwards to today's visitors Colchester United in August 2002 to once mote try his hands afresh. For the third time his new club were not required to pay a fee, but the Richard was at last given a more frequent stage to show his talents.

Starting the season as first choice, Richard played the first nine games, producing clean sheets in three, before a 4-1 reversal at Northampton prompted then manager Steve Whitton to shuffle his defence. Simon Brown stepped between the sticks but United lost the next three until a 2-2 draw here at the County Ground produced the first point from 18.

Brown retained his place until March when injury gave McKinney his next chance. Taking over until the end of the season he took his appearance total to 22 for the campaign, making another seven shut-outs which included the 1-0 home win against Town, a game in which he would have been particularly pleased to have been voted man-of-the-match.

This season Simon Brown has again often retained the first team job, but McKinney will be keen to add another man-of-the-match display against his old club if the opportunity arises.

- 1. RHYS EVANS: A local lad. Good shot stopper. Has the potential to be as great a servant as Digby and Downsborough and as good as Flowers and Given.
- 2. JOHN TROLLOPE: If there ever was a Mr Swindon. then Trollope would get our vote. A record number of league appearances for one club (nearly 850) and then went on to be Manager! Great tackler.
- 3. ROD THOMAS: A Welsh International Full Back. And as Peter and his Dad were born in Wales, they enjoyed having Swindon's pride and joy in a winning Welsh team over England!
- 4. MEL NURSE: Another Welsh International, an excellent header of the ball, so strong in the air and the



most wonderful centre half. Was our lynch pin at the back when Mike 1st attended the CG.

- 5. SHAUN TAYLOR: The heart and soul of Swindon. A set piece specialist whose determination ensured the ball and his head always met - as if by radar! An excellent centre half who scored many goals!

- 9. SAM PARKIN: Harry's number 1 Football Super Hero. Superb strike rate in his 1st season at Swindon that's continuing in his second. He came back from injury against Wycombe and immediately the team performed!
- 10. MAURICE OWEN: Peter's 1st Swindon hero, also starting his Swindon career in 1946. Was the prolific goalscorer of that era before ending his career at centre half. Another 'Mr Swindon' who became our coach and then groundsman.
- 11. DON ROGERS: The most skilful Swindon player ever. Fantastic dribbler of the ball, superb crosser and great goalscorer. No one present, will forget his Wembley goal. This was just one of many special goals by a very very special player.



to raise some money. It's the closest you can get to playing for the football club without physically playing."

David went on to describe what he has got for his money and his highlights of the season so far.

There are two season tickets included and at every home game I can go and do the pre-match warm-ups as well as the half time kick around. I can also go into the dressing room before the game up until Andy does his team talk and I get a days training with the squad. I get a home and away kit and have the number 69 in the squad and on the back of the programme. It's undoubtedly the best season ticket in the club as it's the only one where you get onto the pitch. Its incredible!"

"I get to park in the players car-park now and as you walk across to the ground people are shouting "Oi, Marshy". I've got my own little fan club, which is great. The season so far has been absolutely fantastic. It started off against Sheffield Wednesday when I first got to see what goes on during the day of a game. To be able to step out onto the pitch and not be stopped was brilliant and we had a fair crowd there that day of over 10,000. Going out there to warm up with the players and to look up and see Tommy Mooney kicking the ball back to you was amazing. You have to blink twice to know its real."

Now working as Head Of Strategy & Innovation for a leading telecoms company David tasted life as a professional footballer between 1979 and 1981 as a youth player with today's visitors Colchester United before a bad injury robbed him of a longer career in the game.

"I played for the U's for two and half seasons as a youth player whilst I was working in the Royal Navy based in Colchester. I made 40 appearances as a right winger in the Youth First Team during my time at Layer Road. I always wanted to play at every ground and I got to 27 with
Colchester. Unfortunately I got
injured in a Combination game at
age 22 and transferred to Weymouth
who at the time were in the Alliance
League which is now the Conference.
I went from there to Yate Town and
ended my serious playing days at
Solihull Borough.

"Last season an opportunity arose to do a similar thing to this at Colchester. I had been very frustrated at not playing for them properly long term and it was a chance to go back. In theory what we were trying to do was put me on for two minutes so I would become the oldest player to play for them. Unfortunately, the last game was against QPR who needed to win to make the play-offs so I couldn't do it. I'd love to be able to knock on Andy King's door and ask for two minutes as my ambition is to turn out for Swindon"

David's passion for the game also means he is the holder of a unique record that can never be broken.

"My claim to fame is that I'm the last player ever to be sent off at Wembley. I played in the last game held there on the 20th October, 2000. It was a Children In Need charity game and I said to the Ref, do you want to make a bit of history here?', so he sent me off. I've still got the red card which is signed by him and the linesmen."

Travelling from his home in Cannock, David is still getting used to his newfound star status.

"At the Colchester game at Layer

Road I was at one end signing autographs for the U's fans and then down the other end signing for Swindon fans. It was unbelievable. I've got to say that everybody in the club has just been fantastic. The fans can't see behind the scenes to know how dedicated these people are. They've given me this opportunity which is wonderful and the people and the fans have all been brilliant."







THE NEXT HOME GAME IS NOT UNTIL 7TH FEBRUARY WHEN THE FIRST EVER LEAGUE VISIT TO THE COUNTY GROUND OF RUSHDEN AND DIAMONDS TAKES PLACE.

Formed in 1992 with the amalgamation of Irthlingborough Diamonds and Rushden Town, progression has been swift. Young midfielder David Bell looked to be Middlesbrough bound when he spent two weeks training with the Riverside based club last season. Talbot secured his continued service with an improved contract during the summer.

On the day that Town were beating Bournemouth, Rushden and Diamonds suffered a 1-0 loss at QPR, a result which dropped the club to 12th position in the table and tipping the positional superiority in Town's favour. Everyone at the County Ground will be hoping to maintain the status quo and avenge the Christmas defeat.
