



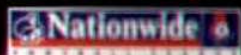

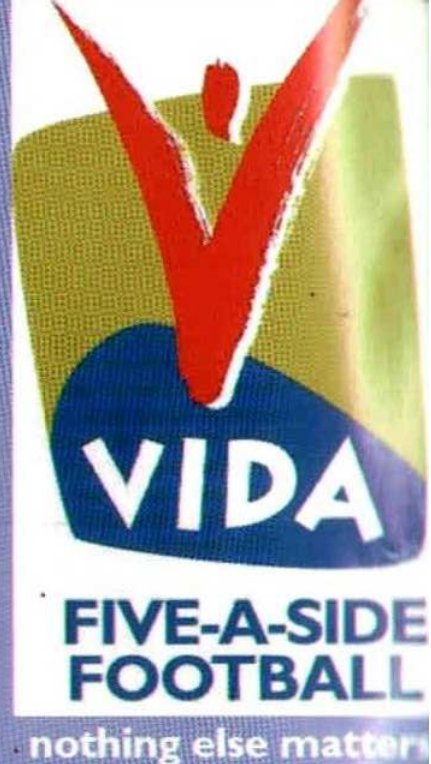

# GAMEPLAN

with Steve McMahon

## **Good afternoon and welcome to Bloomfield Road for this afternoon's game with Swindon Town.**

We come in today's game on the back of a disappointing defeat on Tuesday night at Barnsley. As we have in the majority of games this season, we enjoyed the majority of possession, but it is winning that is most important. Whilst we have played well at times we have still got to win games and that is the top and bottom of it. I am sick to death of managers and people telling me how good we are and what a great team we can be and how we can pass it for fun, but we haven't been getting results and that annoys me, because we should be coming out with results. One thing for certain is that I will never ever change my believes on the way we play football. If people don't like that, then fine, I can't do anything about that.

After the Barnsley defeat we decided to give the players a couple of days off, I think that you can overwork the players and not have enough time to rest. With everything that has gone on, with all the injuries we have, the last thing I wanted to do was get players in on dodgy pitches and with the weather being the way it has been it would have been a recipe for disaster. We could not have afforded to have another

couple of players pick up knocks. I would not have been doing my job properly if by training them hard they picked up more injuries. We have rested and had a good day yesterday and we will see where it takes us today. In general, I am pleased with the players' attitude and the way they have gone about things in difficult circumstances but we need to have a mega run from now until the

end of the season if we are to be in with a shout. I think we are capable of going on a run of games, you have to look at Bristol City they have won their last seven games after struggling early in the season, there is no reason why we can't do the same. It would be nice to start that run this afternoon with three points, a great performance would be a bonus, it is the three points which is crucial. We

are capable but we have to make sure we are up for the fight and the football match as well. Richie Wellens has been magnificent for us this season he has come of age and has excelled, if I was a manager of a First Division club then I would be looking at Richie Wellens, we questioned his work rate in the past but not this season, when he has got the bit between his teeth he is one of the better players

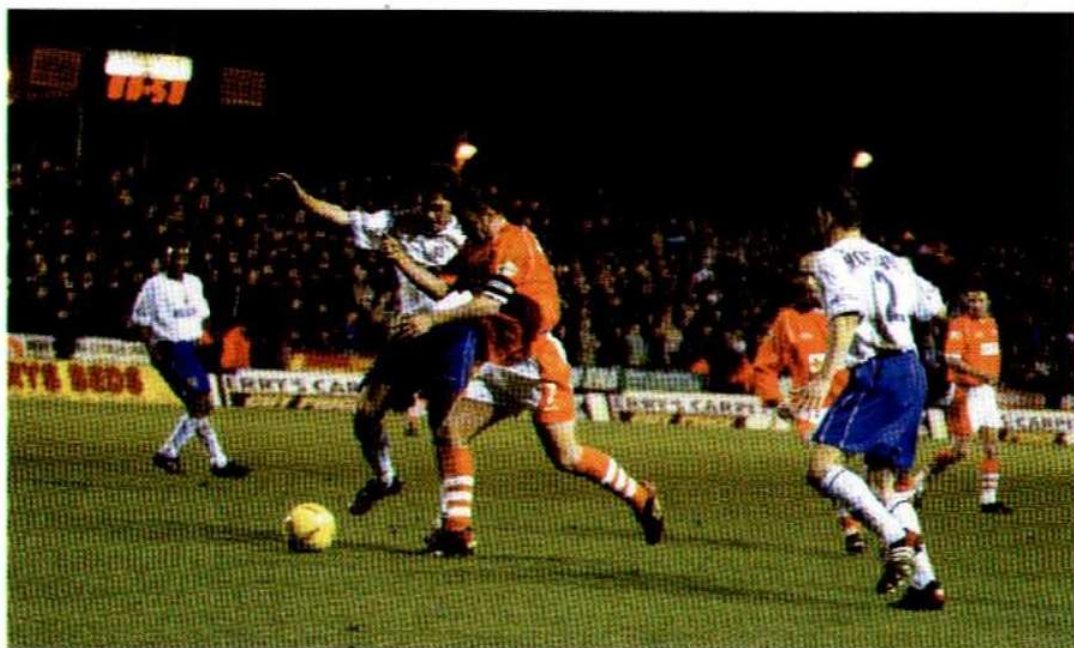
in the Nationwide League.

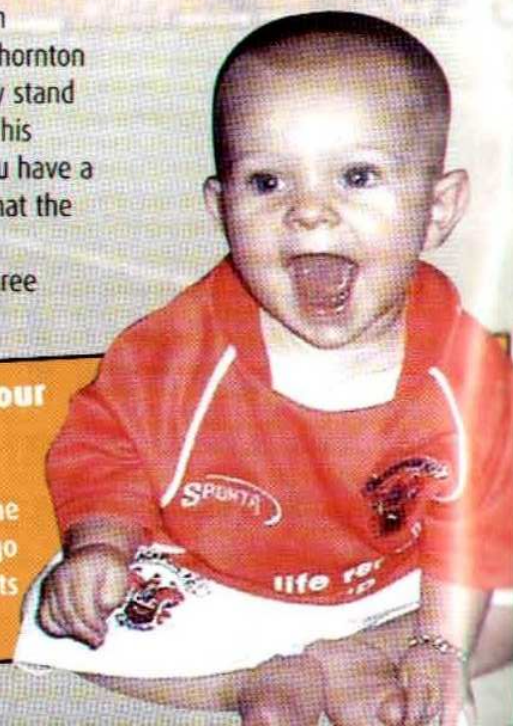
## Squires Gate FC

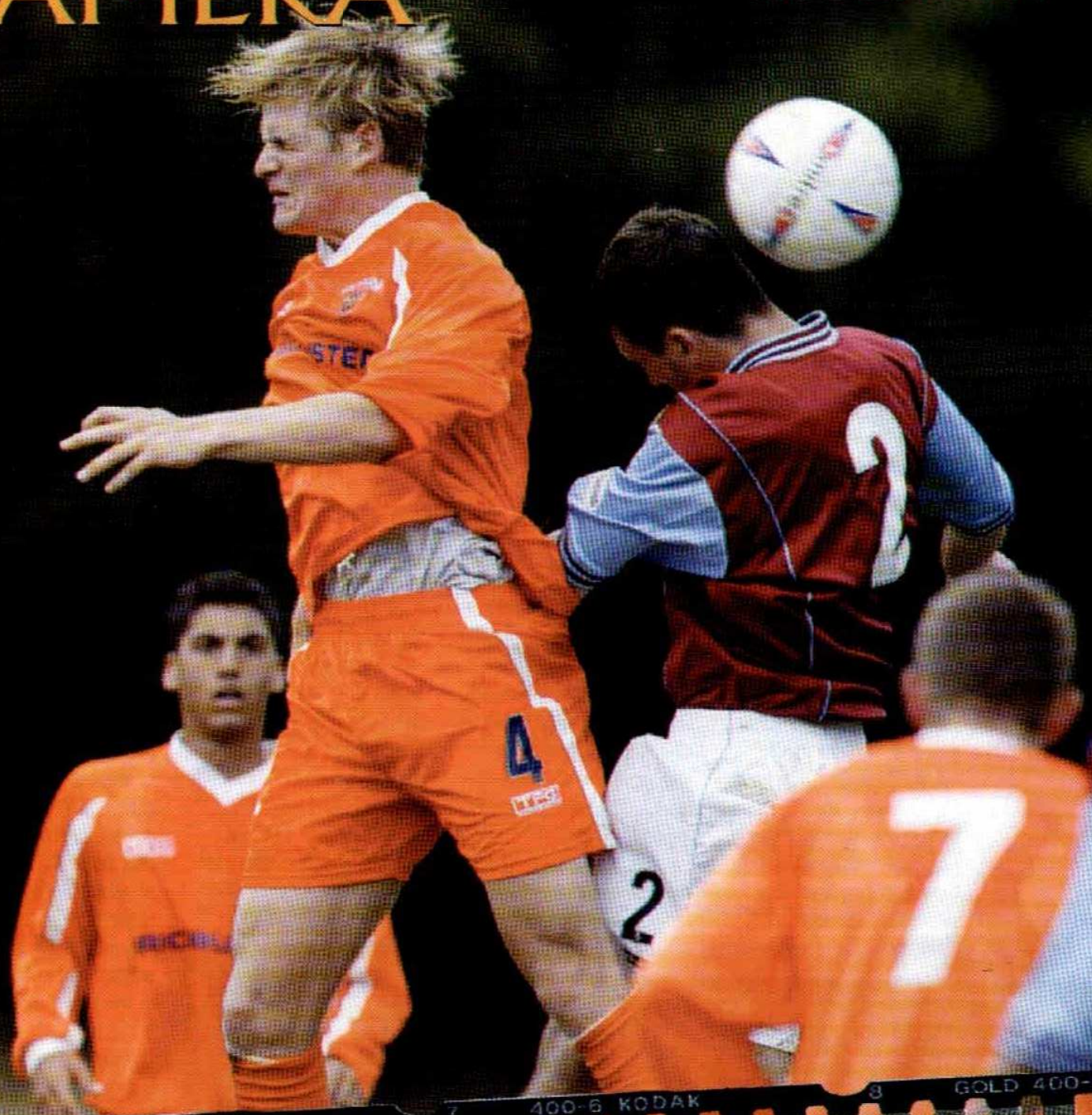

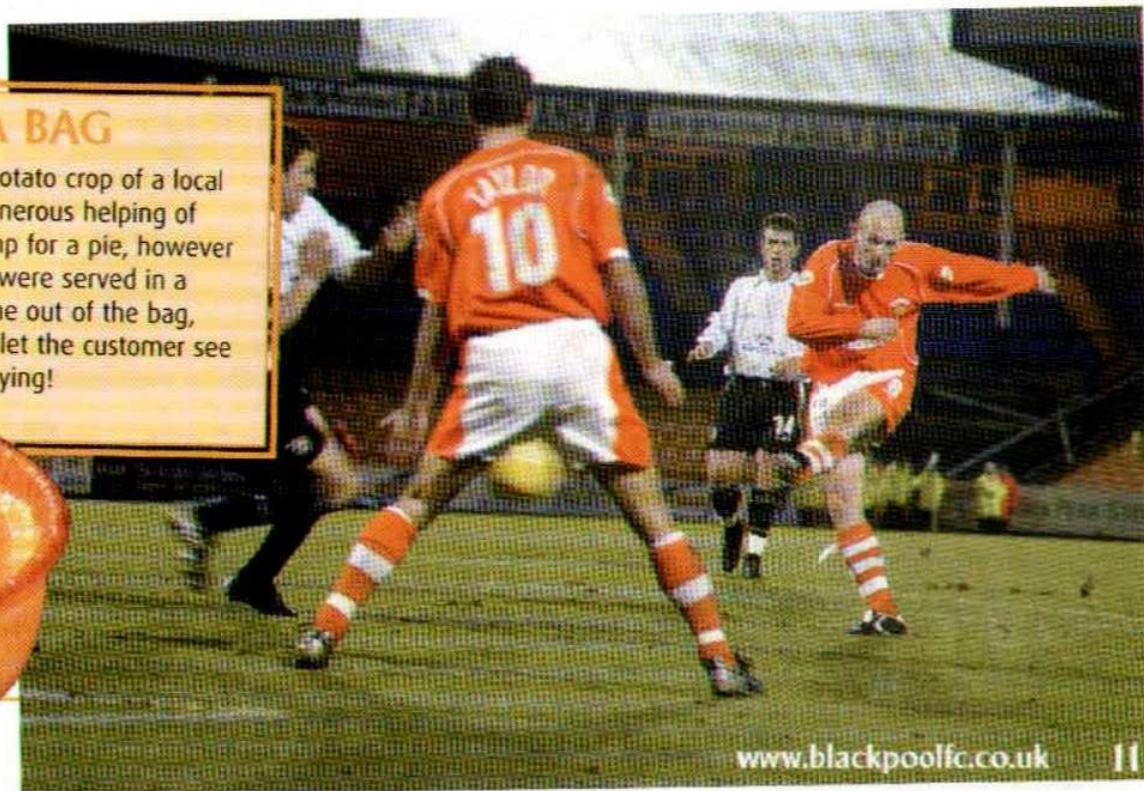

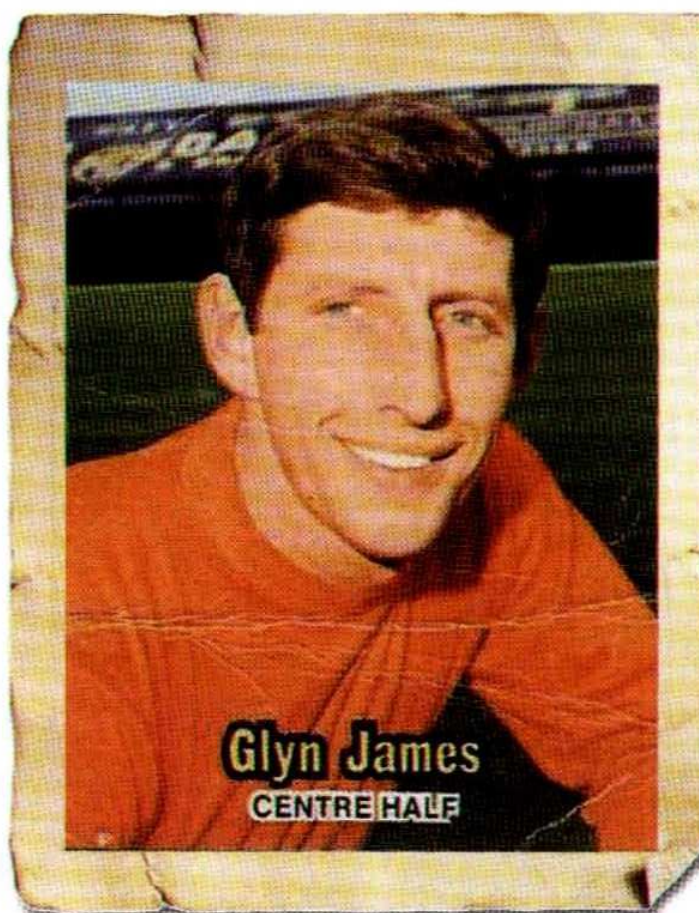

## Today's half time guest is former Pool and Welsh International defender Glyn James

Born in Llangollen, Glyn James served Blackpool as a centre-half and captain, played for 15 seasons and made over 400 appearances. A strong, tall player he made his debut at Preston in October 1960, standing in for the injured Roy Gratrix, whose monopoly of the number five shirt meant that the youngster had to wait nearly four years to succeed him. Once he did, though, he became as effective as his predecessor. James was never spectacular, but his height proved invaluable at the heart of the defence. With the hard John McPhee at the side of him, they formed a fearsome duo, although James preferred the cultured approach. His leadership qualities earned Welsh caps, but his greatest



moment came in the 1972 Anglo-Italian Final against AS Roma when he held the defence together as the Italians threatened to overwhelm Blackpool. Although they lost, it made up for James' disappointment 12 months earlier when he was

forced to miss the Bologna final due to injury. At the start of the 1971-2 campaign manager Bob Stokoe tried him at centre-forward. James replied with six goals in his first five games but after the arrival of Keith Dyson he returned to his familiar role. Towards the end of his career the club arranged a testimonial game, and it was pleasing to see so many fans turn out to salute one of Blackpool's

most loyal players.

Glyn who still lives locally is a regular at Bloomfield Road, and he is always given a warm welcome and today will be no different.

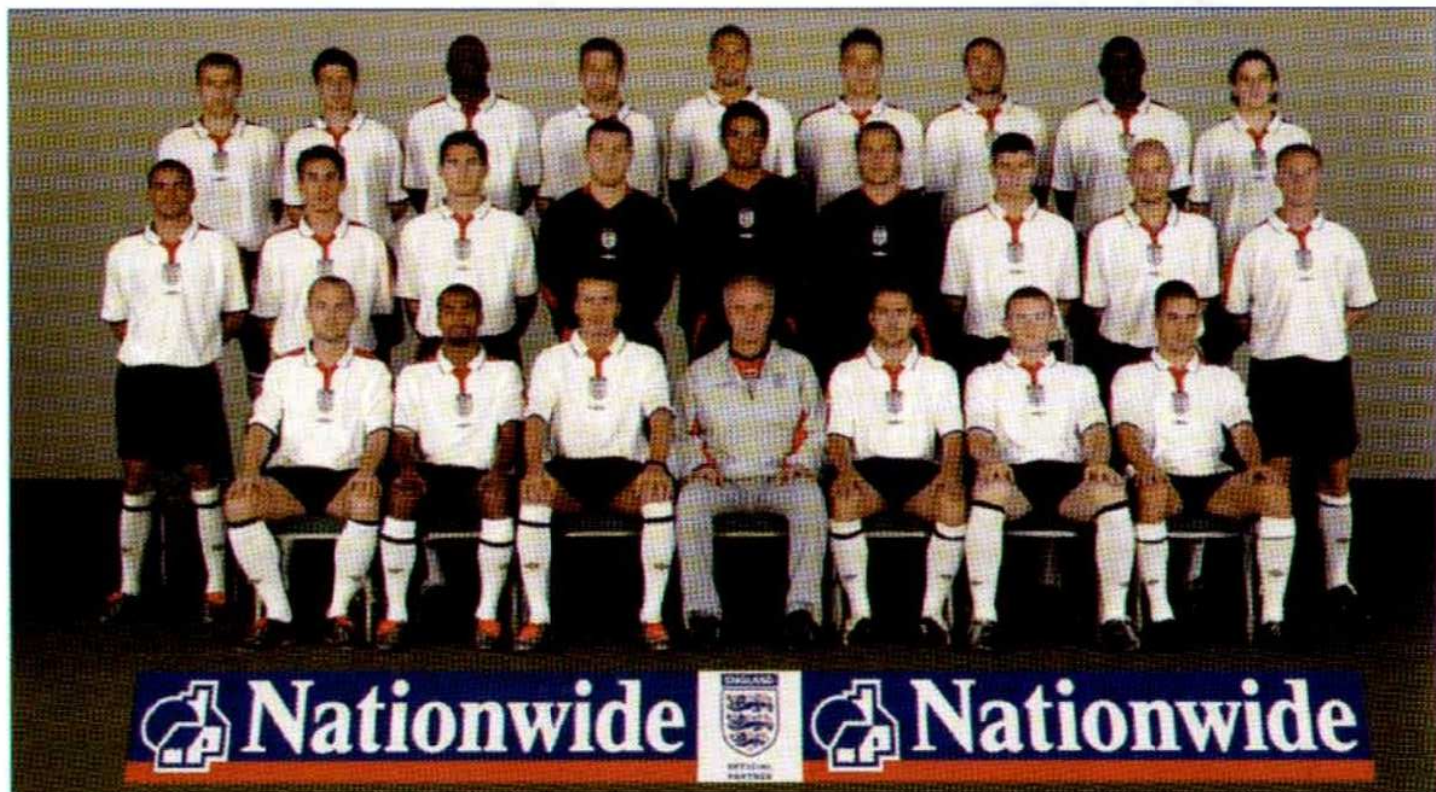

Having suffered more than enough recent seasons of abject dross - both on and off the field of play, most Swindon Town fans are literally pinching themselves at the moment.

Given the club's somewhat infamous past (leaving aside the financial shenanigans of the late 1980's that subsequently saw the club relegated from the topflight without ever kicking a ball, STFC are the only English football league club to have gone into financial administration twice - a record we could do without) to have reached the upper echelons of Nationwide division two at this relatively early stage of the 2003/04 season is, quite frankly, amazing!

The editor of this publication would doubtless find himself in all sorts of legal trouble if he were to print my rather biased thoughts on this particular subject, so I'll save him both the time and trouble by keeping my mouth well and truly firmly shut! Swindon Town's former manager, Steve McMahon was in the news again recently by first resigning his post at Blackpool, then suddenly rescinding his resignation at the last minute - actions that quite rightly raise questions amongst supporters as to what is going on behind the closed doors of the board room.

## Promotion Success

Hard-working midfielder Lee Collins was a promotion winner with both Blackpool and Swindon. Moving to Swindon from Albion Rovers for £15,000 in November 1995, he featured in Swindon's 1995-96 Second Division title campaign and scored twice in 63 League games for the Robins before being reunited with Steve McMahon in July 2000. He helped 'Pool to win promotion in the 2000-01 season, making 28 Third Division appearances.

## Two Spells

Former Blackpool striker Alan Mayes had two spells at Swindon. Having initially moved to the County Ground from Watford for £72,500 in February 1979, he starred as Swindon reached the League Cup semi-finals in 1979-80 and was sold to Chelsea in December 1980. He rejoined Swindon in July 1983 and topped the goalscoring charts in 83-84, netting 65 times in 151 League games overall before moving to Carlisle in July 1985.

Joining Blackpool in September 1986, he scored six goals in 13 Third Division outings before moving to Wycombe Wanderers in August 1987.

## Promotion Play-Offs

One-time Blackpool right-back Dave Hockaday was an influential figure in Swindon's 1986-87 Play-off final triumph.

## Goalscoring Hero

Former Swindon striker Dave Bamber was leading marksman in Blackpool's 1991-92 promotion success. Initially moving to Blackpool from St Helens Town in September 1979. He was top scorer in 1981-82 and joined Coventry City for £50,000 in June 1983. He moved to Swindon from Portsmouth and helped to clinch the Fourth Division title.

## Management Duo

Current Gaffer Steve McMahon achieved managerial success at Swindon. Moving to Swindon as player-manager in November 1994, he guided the Robins to the Second Division title in 1995-96 and made 42 League appearances while at the County Ground before resigning in September 1998. He succeeded Nigel Worthington in the managerial hot seat in January 2000 and plotted the Seasiders play-off final triumph against Leyton Orient. The following season, he guided the Tangerines to LDV success beating Cambridge in Cardiff. His right hand man at the seaside is former Man City, Bolton and Swindon centre back Mark Seagraves. Seagraves made 61 League appearances for the Robins having signed from Bolton for £100,000 in June 1995.

## Played For Both

Other players to have featured for both sides include, Tony Evans, Tom McAlister, Jimmy Thompson, Gary Williams, Harry Bowl, Syd Brookes, Alf Brown, Fred Butcher and Peter Noble.

## PAUL BODIN

**Paul Bodin gave full value for money to Swindon Town when he moved to Wiltshire from Newport County for £3,000 in 1988.**

'Zippy' was an attack minded left-back and always chipped in with his fair share of goals.

Paul left Swindon in 1991 for a half million pond and moved to Palace. Bodin did however return in 1992 for his second spell at the club in which he helped the side gain promotion to the Premiership scoring the winning goal from the penalty spot with only minutes to spare in the play-off final. Paul also deservedly earnt 23 caps for Wales and was unfortunate to miss from the spot for his country against Bulgaria. If Bodin had scored he would have secured passage for Wales to the 94 USA World Cup, but for Swindon fans the play-off penalty was the most important. Paul is still a regular at Swindon and is heavily involved with the youth set-up at the club coaching the Under-17s.

# IN THE DUG OUT

**Born in August 1956, in Luton, King made his name as a lively midfielder having joined his home town club in 1974. His next stop was Everton, the club with which most people associate him, who he signed for in 1976 for £35,000.**

He made 150 appearances for The Toffees, scoring an impressive 38 goals in four seasons at Goodison before joining QPR.

One season with the Superhoops was followed by another at West Bromwich Albion before a return to Everton for the 1982-83 season, where Andy played a further 43 games and added another 11 goals to his tally for the Toffees.

A short period with Dutch side Cambuur followed, before Andy returned to England with Wolves, for whom he played 28 times scoring 10 goals.

A very brief spell back at Luton in 1985 (just three appearances) preceded Andy's final move as a player when he joined Aldershot and notched 11 goals in 36 games for the Surrey side.

Having retired as a player, he turned to coaching, and was given his first managerial appointment at Mansfield Town in 1993 following George Foster's departure.

Having been relegated from Division Two, Mansfield were low on confidence but King managed to steer them to a mid-table finish in his first season at the helm.

The following season saw The Stags in with a chance of promotion back to the Second Division, having finished in 6th

place in the table, but they were beaten in the play-off semi-finals by John Duncan's Chesterfield.

The 1995-96 season saw Mansfield drop down to 19th position in Division Three and Andy was replaced at Field Mill by Steve Parkin.

Andy spent some time out of management but was still involved in the game, and was working with former Everton team-mate Peter Reid at Premiership club Sunderland as a scout when Colin Todd took him to Swindon as his assistant manager in the summer of 2000.

When Todd got the call from Jim Smith to be his assistant at Derby County, King was given the opportunity to impress chairman Terry Brady, and after four games in charge he was given the job full-time, on November 6, 2000.

Swindon struggled to keep themselves out of the relegation zone for most of the season but a win over Peterborough in the penultimate game of their league campaign, coupled with Bristol Rovers loss to Wycombe, ensured their Second Division survival.

The great escape act was not enough to ensure Andy King's survival however. Despite his efforts in keeping The Robins up he was replaced at the County Ground by former Liverpool boss Roy Evans in June 2001.

But he was not gone for long. Evans left the club before the end of the year, after new owners arrived at the County Ground, and Andy King - who had taken legal action against Swindon with regard to his dismissal - was reinstated as manager on December 20 2001.

# ROBINS STARMAN

Young and very promising forward who joined the club from Chelsea in 2002. The transfer followed a mass of speculation, with Andy King, a huge fan of the player, tracking him for several months.

Parkin joined the club from Stamford Bridge where his development was hindered by a glut of international stars. However, whilst at the club he joined several other clubs on loan and it is with them that he built up a reputation as a lethal striker.

He joined Millwall in September 2000 and made his Football League debut for the Lions in a 5-0 demolition of Oxford United. He then went on loan to Wycombe Wanderers in November 2000 after having a trial with Queens Park Rangers. Scored twice in 13 games for the Chairboys, but eventually went on loan once again to Oldham Athletic before joining Northampton, again on loan, in 2001.

'Super Sammy Parkin' more than repaid Andy King's faith in his ability by netting 26 goals during the 2002-03 campaign, including a devastating hat-trick against Barnsley on the opening day of the season. Strong on the ball and devastating in the box, he then went on to finish third in the Division's goal charts.

Understandably he romped away with the majority of trophies when the club's 'Player of the Year' awards were handed out. So far this season, the striker has picked up where he left off last term and in tandem with Tommy Mooney, has begun to terrorise defences and fire Town further up the league.

A true legend already, Town fans will be hoping the club can hang on to their hero before he attracts any major interest.

# ROBINS SQUAD

## 1. Bart Griemink

### GOALKEEPER

Giant keeper signed by Colin Todd on a free transfer in the summer of 2000. Griemink is a former Dutch Under-21 international who spent a successful loan spell with The Robins (as cover for Frank Talia) before eventually joining the club. He came to English football in 1995 with Birmingham and deputised competently for the injured Ian Bennett, playing in the 1995 League Cup semi-final. The arrival of Under 21 goalkeeper Rhys Evans in 2003 has seen Bart with a tougher test than seasons gone by and subsequently has found himself as second choice keeper. However, the Dutchman continues to train hard and push Evans all the way for the number one shirt and is probably the best goalkeeper on the bench in Division Two.

## 20. Rhys Evans

### GOALKEEPER

The promising young keeper joined Leyton Orient on a three-month loan deal last August. He proved to be an excellent shot stopper and showed good command of his area. Rhys was unfortunate to pick up a leg injury, which cut short his period at Brisbane Road and saw him return to Chelsea. Later in that season he made his debut for the England Under 21 side against Serbia, but was eventually released by Chelsea in the summer. Town manager Andy King swooped for the young stopper in 2003 to give first choice keeper Bart Griemink more competition for the number one shirt at Swindon Town. Since then Evans has been a regular between the posts for Town and has turned in many match saving performances.

## 3. Grant Smith

### MIDFIELDER

Grant, joined Swindon Town after being released from the Blades and was strongly recommended by Sheffield United boss, Neil Warnock amongst many others. Since joining in the summer of 2003, 'Smithy' has had little chance to impress with a host of restricted performances in the first team and a blight of niggling injuries. However, the Scot has continued to perform excellently in the reserve side and is now regular skipper of Town's second string eleven. When called upon for first team action he has only ever been sturdy and committed and is an important member of the squad. He has shown good pace, is very good in the air and provides a good set piece delivery with his talented left foot.

## 4. Matthew Hewlett

### MIDFIELDER

All at Ashton Gate once tipped midfielder Matt for the top. The former Bristol City player was called into the England Under 21 squad, but a number of injuries curtailed his flourishing career. In the end Hewlett made over 100 appearances for City, but left them to join Town on a Bosman in the summer of 2000.

He was a regular for Colin Todd until being hit by injury once again and went on to play just 26 league games. Last term he was virtually ever-present (43 games in all competitions) despite never really hitting top gear. Matt captained the side last season in the absence of the suspended regular skipper Andy Gurney and has continued to deputise this season, losing only seven of his eight games with the captain's armband.

He has now made well over a hundred appearances for Swindon Town and continues to be a consistent performer in the centre of midfield.

## 7. Sammy Igoe

### MIDFIELDER

After making his way up through the ranks at

Portsmouth, where he began as a trainee, Igoe went on to secure a first team spot at the south coast club and made his mark with some impressive performances.

He moved to Reading in a £100,000 deal but found it difficult to break into the first team and spent much of his time on the substitutes bench. Last term the diminutive midfielder had something of a disappointing season at the Royals, being restricted to just a handful of starts and rarely featured at all at the turn of the year. Sammy eventually joined Luton on loan on transfer deadline day and went straight into their starting line up. However after just two appearances a training ground accident brought his stay to a premature close and he returned to the Madejski Stadium.

Capable of chipping in with goals, and making decisive contributions in the middle of the park, he is always a threat to the opposition. Scored with a free-kick on his league debut against Sheffield Wednesday on the opening day of the season.

## 8. Tommy Mooney

### STRIKER

Tommy joined Town from Birmingham in July this year. He joined previous club Birmingham from Watford and, over the course of his career, he has spanned the highest and lowest levels of English football. He was born in Middlesbrough but he started out at Aston Villa before a move to Scarborough, who were then a Football League club. After three years there, he moved to Southend United in 1993 for £100,000 but his one season there only saw him make 19 appearances for the Shrimpers and a move to Watford soon materialised. He is one of few current players in the Town squad to have Premiership experience thanks to his time with the Hornets. Over seven seasons at Vicarage Road, Tommy's goal average was an impressive one in every four games with 63 goals in 279 appearances in all competitions.

In the Premiership, he spent much of the relegation season injured but he still scored nine times for the side managed by current Aston Villa manager Graham Taylor. The following season, in the Nationwide League First Division, Tommy netted a total of 22 goals, the first time a Watford player had hit the 20-goal mark in nearly a decade.

In 2001 he moved to Birmingham where a good start saw him score five goals in his first five games for the Blues. Despite an injury against Crewe in October that forced him onto the sidelines for six weeks, he still managed to score 15 goals in 38 games in all competitions.

Gradually his time at Birmingham came to a close as he began to find himself out of favour last season, and after a five minute substitute appearance he spent the remainder of the campaign out on loan at Stoke City.

He joined the Potters for three months. Sheffield United then took Tommy on loan during the transfer

window of January 2003 and then he went to Derby County for a month's loan in March. Faced with an abundance of talent ahead of him in the pecking order at St Andrews he looked to the Nationwide teams in search of first team football. Late on in the summer of 2003 he decided to join Andy King's revolution at Swindon Town and has quickly become a fans favourite in Wiltshire. His grit and determination made him a cult hero, and after a fantastic start to the season he is now well into double figures along with strike partner Sam Parkin. On regular occasions King has referred publicly to the strike pairing as the best in Division Two and with a work rate and character as strong as Mooney's, he looks set to fire the team further up the table and into the play off's.

#### **11. David Duke** **DEFENDER/MIDFIELDER**

'Dukey' will feel slightly aggrieved with the tag of 'Most Improved Player' last season - but he hardly missed a game and rarely put a foot wrong on the left hand side of Town's midfield. The Scotsman arrived on a free transfer from Sunderland in 2000 having never managed a start for the Black Cat's first team. Duke appeared regularly in his first season with the Robins. He combined well with Sol Davis down the Robins' left and is a good crosser of the ball - last year he became more effective beating players and he contributed more to the team with his hard work and endeavour.

#### **14. Jon Stevenson** **FORWARD**

Live-wire young striking prospect signed his first professional forms in February 2001 with Leicester City. He was involved regularly from the bench during that season, scoring in their drubbing at Portman Road, and continues to have the making of a fine future player. Although he looked a fine prospect, he was released by the club in preparation for their return to the Premiership. He then signed for Swindon Town after a recommendation from Foxes Director of Football, Dave Bassett. With bags of pace and skill, he has proved to be a good summer addition to the squad and despite very few first team chances, he continues to develop into a hot prospect for the future.

#### **15. Andrew Nicholas** **DEFENDER**

Andrew was a regular member of Liverpool's under-19 winning team in 2003 and won plaudits with his consistent performances at left back, resulting in a flattering comparison to Anfield legend Sami Hyypia. At the time, his path into the first team at Liverpool seemed blocked and upon his decision to leave, King snapped him up in the summer of 2003. After working his way into the manager's starting line up with some hard work in training, the left sided defender has never looked back and has given a number of solid performances so far. With good height, terrific pace and recovery he has proved to be a valuable asset to the defensive line up this season. He also possesses a Dave Challinor-style long throw, which he claims to be one of the longest in the division.

#### **17. Brian Howard** **MIDFIELDER**

The youngster joined Town from Southampton in 2003 having playing for the Saints reserves for two years. The 20-year old left-sided midfielder even turned down a late move to go to Chelsea, choosing instead to opt for some first team football under Andy King.

He has been a regular member of the England youth set up and was unlucky to not be included in the Under 20's side that went to the FIFA World Youth Championships.

The left sided midfielder has proved to be a revelation on the flanks this season and should regularly be getting a pat on the back from the Town forwards as he continues to put chances in front of them. Capable of scoring his fair share of goals including important away strikes at Brentford and Notts County, he also possesses a superb dead ball piece especially from corners.

#### **19. Matthew Heywood** **DEFENDER**

It has been another consistent year for Town's most effective defender and after a slow start, he returned to the kind of form that saw him clean up in the 2001/02 Player of the Year Awards.

Originally, Heywood failed to break through at Burnley's Turf Moor and, after being alerted as to his availability by former scout Shaun Reid, Andy King snapped him up on a free transfer.

Was an ever-present in the latter half of 2000/01 and has now missed just four games since. The tall defender signed an extension to his contract, much to the delight of the fans and he has shown the same strength and commitment this season. Strong in the tackle and good in the air, Heywood is proving to be a great asset to the club. It is no coincidence that Town's defensive record improved dramatically following his arrival and whilst he may not have scored as many goals as he would have liked, he can prove effective went sent forward as an extra body in the box.

#### **22. Alan Reeves** **DEFENDER**

Before joining Swindon in 1998, he spent four years at Wimbledon, where he had the tough task of replacing John Scales. Reeves has also played for Gillingham, Chester and Rochdale where he is considered to be one of the best players in the club's history.

Town's veteran defender enjoyed another fine season in 2002-03. Although initially not a member of the side, he forced his way into contention as the team hit some poor early season form and his uncompromising and committed displays helped the Robins turn their fortunes around.

His sheer presence and a willingness to throw himself into the thick of the action were evident throughout that season and he thoroughly deserved his runner up spot in the club's 'Player of the Season' award.

He has now made well over 400 league appearances and was rewarded last season with a playing/coaching role that has seen him turn around the fortunes of Town's reserve side. He continues to back up the Swindon defence when called upon and has so far continued with some sterling performances this season.

#### **25. Steve Robinson** **MIDFIELDER**

Tough-tackling and energetic right-footed midfielder signed from Birmingham City for £50,000 in February 2001, he was an automatic choice for the Robins for the remainder of that season and more recently, signed a two-year extension to his contract. A former Birmingham trainee, he broke into the Blues team under Barry Fry but has constantly been dogged by injuries that have limited his first team chances. He made over 50 league starts for the Blues, but almost joined Sheffield United in 1999 only to fail the medical.

He was involved at the start of the 2000-01 season, but was transfer-listed by Trevor Francis in November after failing to hold down a regular place in the first team squad. He duly left for Wiltshire in the hope of first team football and has proved to be a shrewd signing for the club ever since.

His non stop attitude and one hundred per cent work rate for the team has proved to be an outstanding asset and despite never really hitting the net on a regular occasion, his goals have come at important times; including a memorable double against local rivals Oxford United not too long ago in the memory of many a Town fan.

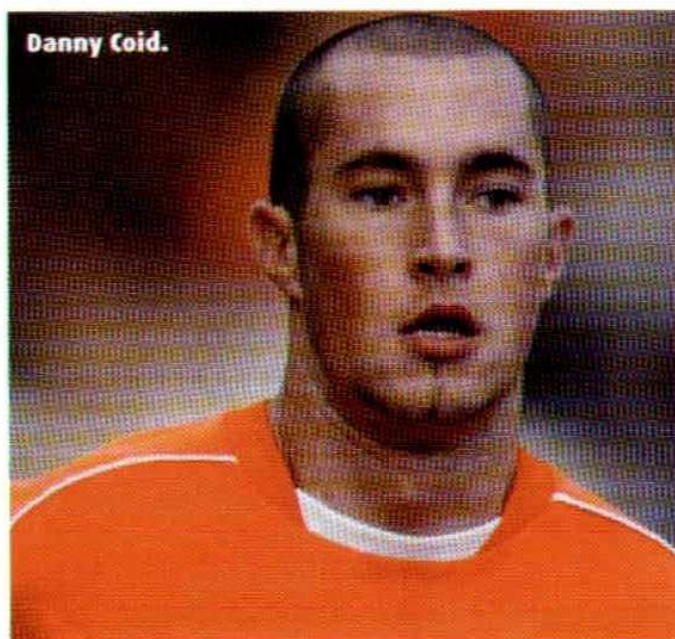



Congratulations to Phil Barnes who was excellent at Oakwell to follow his more than competent return last week.

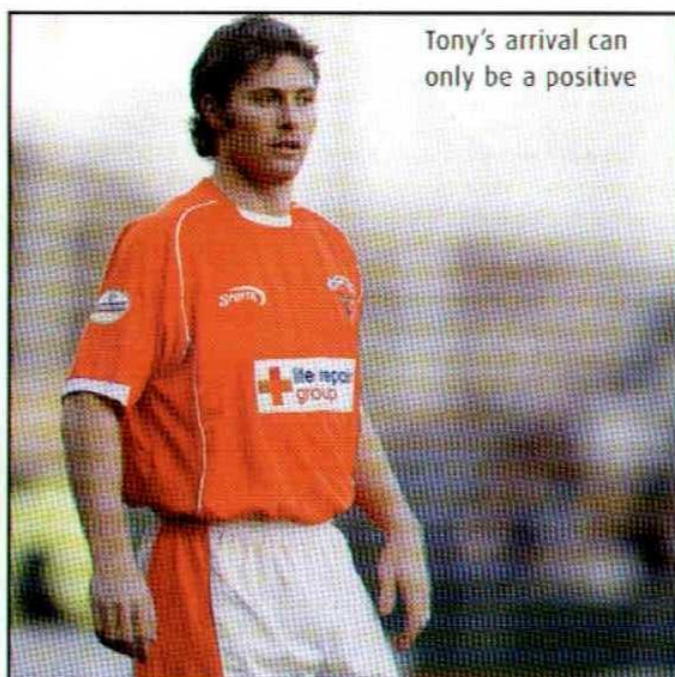
Barnesy's been through it a little this season and with Lee Jones' long standing injury flaring up

again, it's a chance for the big Yorkshireman to re-establish himself.

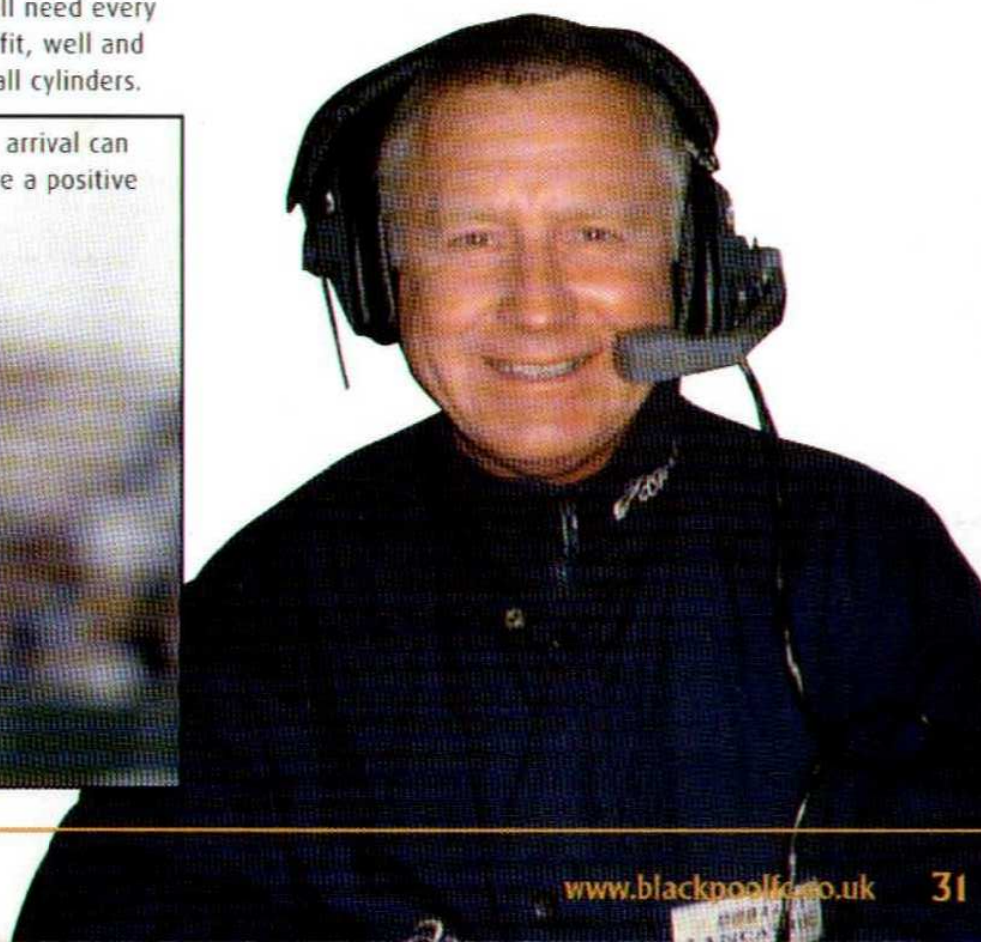

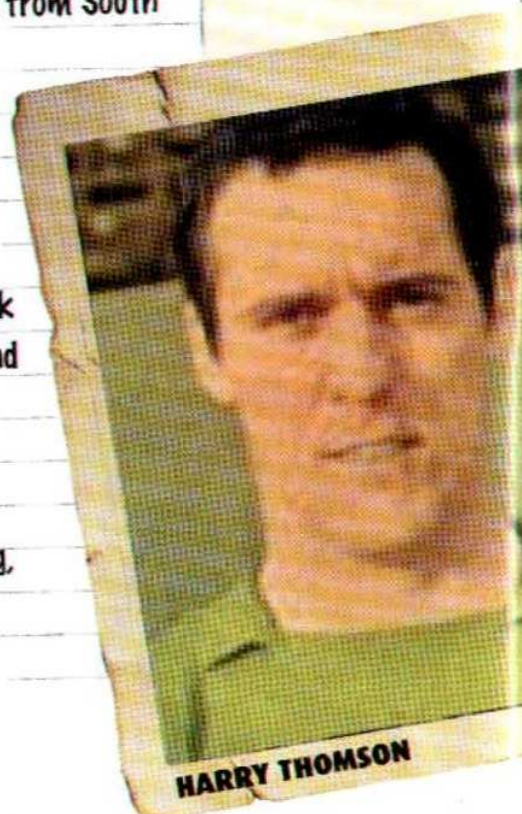
### THAT WAS THE WEEK THAT WAS

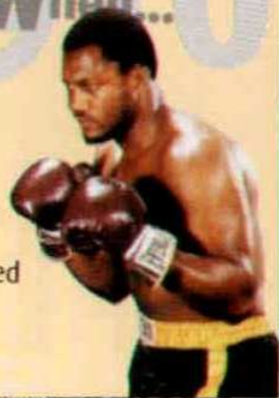

## FOCUS ON... HARRY THOMSON

Between 1968 and 1972, Blackpool had a wealth of goalkeepers. Perhaps the most popular was Harry Thomson, who was bought from Burnley by manager Les Shannon in July 1969 and made his debut on the opening day of the following season, against Portsmouth, immediately displacing Alan Taylor. At 5ft 9in, Thomson was small for a goalkeeper yet he was one of the most spectacular that Bloomfield Road has seen. He loved to play to the crowd and on more than once occasion he was censured by the club for his on-field antics. Like most showmen, though, he was erratic and sometimes fell out with referees, too. But once he had overcome his initial nervousness, he could be quite brilliant. During the disastrous 1970-71 campaign, he sometimes kept the Seasiders in the game single handed. When Bob Stokoe took over, Thomson had just been disciplined but the new manager brought him back to the first team. It did not work though, and after a poor performance against Ipswich, when he let in a bad goal near the end, Stokoe terminated his contract and he ended his career with Barrow.

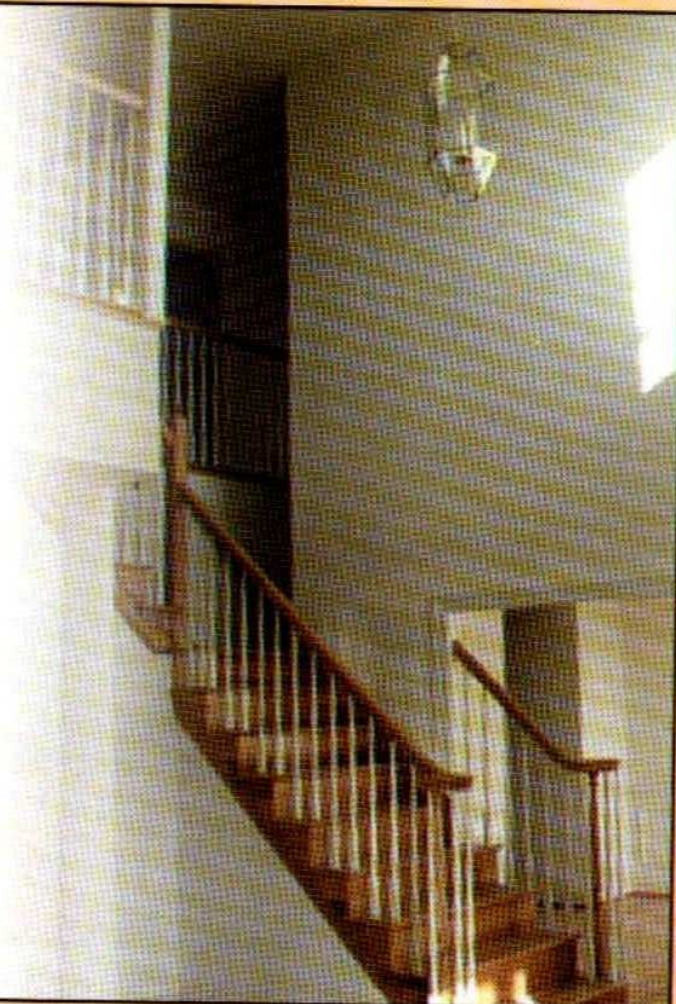

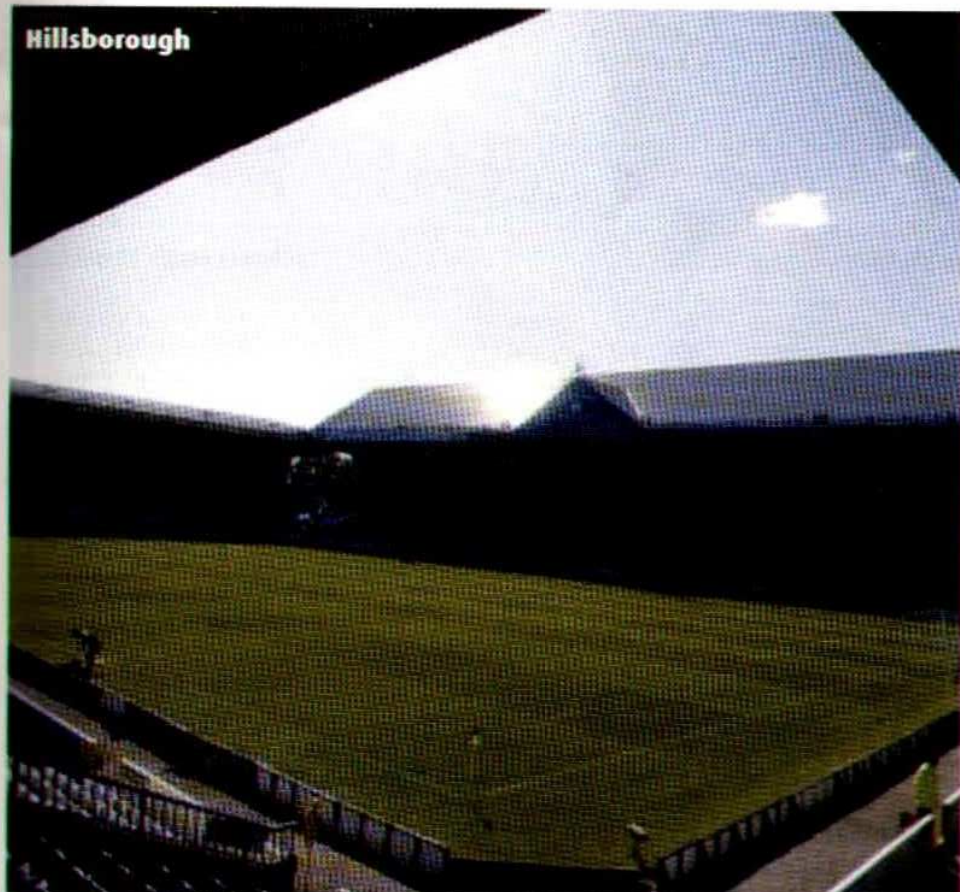
Even if the home leg doesn't go Blackpool's way, the tie will be far from over, but a good win could set up a nailbiter in South Yorkshire.

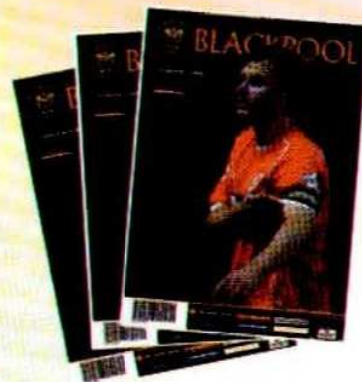

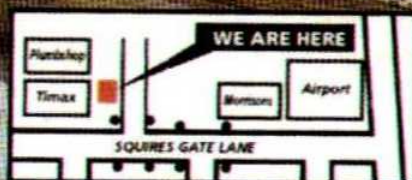

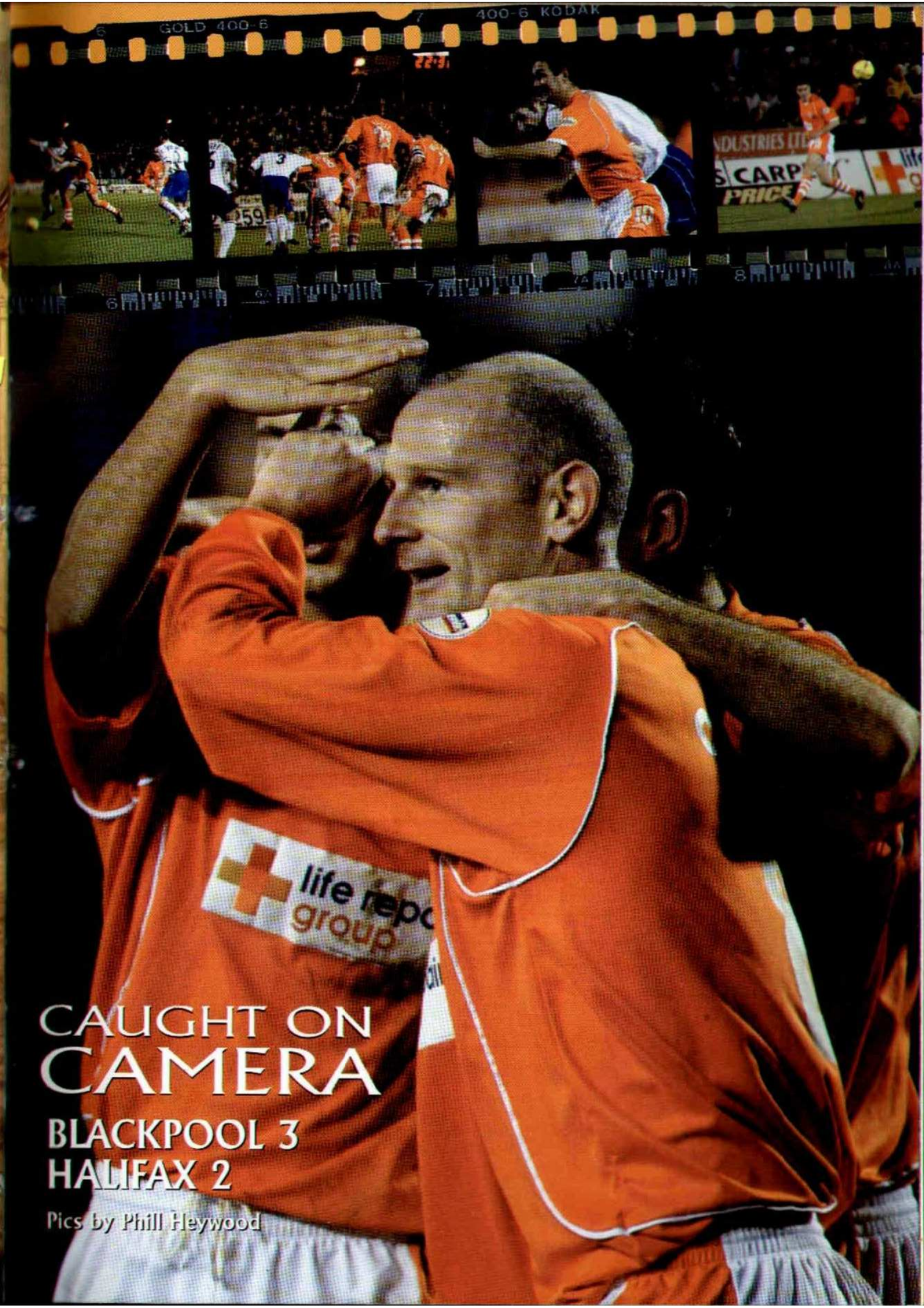

## **The Stadium**

One end has a large newish stand (the Kop Stand) that dwarfs the rest of the ground and replaced a former open terrace. This end used to house both home & away supporters, but has now been changed to home fans only. At the opposite end, away fans are housed in another relatively new stand called the Cowshed. It has an electric scoreboard on its roof, and looks a little strange as one side has more rows than the other, giving a sloping effect. One side of the ground has a large, older Main Stand, while the John King Stand (formerly the Borough Road Stand) opposite is smaller, running the entire length of the pitch.

## **What Will It Be Like For Pool Fans?**

After a long campaign by Tranmere fans, the large Kop End is now purely for home fans. Away fans are housed in the opposite end, the affectionately named Cowshed. However, you will be relieved that the only connection with a real cowshed is the name, as the fairly new covered, all seated stand, has good facilities and unhindered views of the playing action. This end can house up to 2,500 fans.

## **Where To Get A Pre-Match Pint**

The Prenton Park Hotel, which is situated about 20 yards away from the visiting supporters turnstiles, is popular with away fans. Otherwise alcohol is available in the away end.

There are also a number of other pubs in walking distance of the ground. The Mersey Clipper, behind the Main Stand, and The Sportsman's Arms on Prenton Road East are recommended for away fans. A little further away is the Swan Pub on Woodchurch Road, Prenton, which is about a ten minute walk from the ground. Away fans are welcome and it has the added advantage of having 96 car parking spaces available, which are either free or have a small charge levied that can be redeemed

against a drink at the bar. Please note that alcohol is not sold inside the ground.

All fans please note, it is a criminal offence to drink alcohol on the streets of Birkenhead, you may find yourself being arrested if you do.

## **How To Get There And Where To Park**

From M6/M56 join the M53 and exit at Junction 4 and take the B5151 Mount Road from the fourth exit of the roundabout (the ground is signposted from here). After two and a half miles when Mount Road becomes Storeton Road, turn right into Prenton Road West and the ground will be visible on the right hand side. There is a car park at the ground, otherwise, street parking, but beware that there is a strict local residents parking scheme in operation around the ground.
