

Next came the visit of Tranmere Rovers on Easter Monday. Sadly the first 45 minutes decided the outcome. We were shocking! Two glaring mistakes resulted in goals for Eugene Dadi to see Rovers lead 2-0 at the break. In the second half we did much better especially when Roger Johnson was moved up front. He caused a lot of problems and eventually his persistence was rewarded with a goal two minutes from time. But it was all too little too late.

This afternoon we face in form Swindon Town who will certainly be contesting the play off semi-finals attempting to reach the Play Off Final in Cardiff at the end of May.

CONGRATULATIONS to Millwall on reaching the FA Cup Final.

They are the first team from outside the top flight to reach the showpiece event for 12 years.

The last team to do it was Sunderland in 1992 when they went on to lose to Liverpool in the final at Wembley.

Ironically it was Sunderland that Millwall beat to earn themselves a place in the final at Cardiff.

Millwall have certainly had the luck of the draw on their way.

The Lions have reached the final and booked themselves a place in next season's UEFA Cup without having to play a side from the Premier Division.

Take it from me as an Exeter City fan, who has suffered more than my fair share of relegations, you the ups in life an awful lot more, when you've experienced the downs as well.

Our match against league leaders Plymouth Argyle filled me with pride. We competed well in the game and at times played some excellent football and gave them a run for their money. The reason they are top is because they have a strong well organised team but we showed we could be better than them for good periods of the match.

Two days later we faced
Tranmere Rovers and started well
in the opening ten minutes and we
looked as if the game was ours
for the taking. Then in their first
attack we gave the ball away and
they scored. After gifting them a
second goal on the stroke of half
time it was uphill all the way from
then on. It is the story of our
season, defensively as a team we
have made too many mistakes in

too many matches all over the pitch. Most successful teams are built on a defensive platform that will give the side confidence from not conceding sloppy goals. This is my task for next season to become much better defensively. The plusses so far have been Nathan Tyson, a forward who will score goals and Stuart Nethercott who has been great defensively. and who knows, we may have found a centre forward in Roger Johnson. Making a good defender does mean you have to be calm and calculating under pressure. you must not panic. When I watch Roger defending he tends to be all arms and legs, a reactor, which is fine playing as a striker but he is not very calm when defending.

The turnout by ours fans at Plymouth was excellent once more, I was very proud of the team and the manner in which the fans reacted and supported them throughout. I was disappointed with the first half to some extent, we were slow starting again, we need to show more pride at times it is so important for building potential. By the time next season is with us I hope this will be all part of our game.

With the injury to Steve Williams at Plymouth we were able to apply for dispensation to sign another keeper as all three of our own are injured. Lee Worgan is a young keeper who has appeared for our reserve side and so it was the easiest option to bring him in. Lee had played well in the four games for us and with a 12 noon deadline on Sunday it left very little time to bring a keeper in for








the Tranmere game on Easter Monday. Lee had a tough introduction to playing in the Football League and should not



Swindon Town are flying! This will be the second time we have met them here this season, the first was for a First Round F.A. Cup tie that finished 4-1 in our favour. Since then the Robins have powered their way into the top four and certainly look set to take part in the play off matches. The strike duo of Sam Parkin and Tommy Mooney has been a huge plus for them this season. Both players have notched 20 goals a-piece so far. It is five seasons since the Robins were in Division One and no doubt they would love to make a return at the start of next season.

Three weeks ago the club announced plans to build a 23,000-seater stadium incorporating a hotel, gymnasium and conference facilities at Shaw Tip to the West of Swindon. It is hoped the new arena will be open by season 2007-08 and what better way to celebrate than by bringing back top flight football to Wiltshire.


Town opened the season with a home defeat to Sheffield Wednesday before going on a run of ten unbeaten games in both league and cup. It was the best start the club had made since 1995-96, which included taking Premiership Leeds United to a penalty shoot out in the Carling Cup.

Swindon were involved in the comeback of the season recently when they trailed by 3-0 at half time to another play-off chasing side Port Vale at Vale Park. But three goals in a 20 minute spell



in the second half gave them a 3-3 draw and a valuable point to keep the dream bubbling. They followed that with a surprising defeat at lowly Peterborough who hit them with a 4-2 scoreline. Swindon manager Andy King was not a happy man after seeing his play off contenders humbled by a struggling Posh side. His aftermatch quote summed the whole afternoon up, "We were a disgrace, we looked more like the relegation side not Peterborough". On Easter Saturday they were involved in a thrilling encounter with near rivals and promotion candidates Bristol City. City took the lead just before half time but a wonder goal from Rory Fallon secured a point for Town. The Robins faced a trip to Luton Town on Easter Monday, another side who have hit the wall just recently. The excellent 3-0 victory by Swindon have put paid to any hopes Luton had of reaching the play off places while Town have cemented their position in the top four.

The Manager Andy King



Andy King made his first managerial appearance at Mansfield Town in 1993. They were relegated at the end of that season but King steered them to mid-table safety the following season.

In 1995-96 he lost his job with Mansfield but continued in the game working with good friend Peter Reid at Sunderland. Andy then joined Swindon Town when Colin Todd appointed him as his assistant

in the summer of 2000.

The Robins struggled to get free of the relegation zone but they did manage to survive in Division Two for another season. The great escape was not enough to save his job and Andy was replaced at the County Ground by the former Liverpool manager Roy Evans. A year later King was back when Roy Evans left the club - King had taken legal action against Swindon in regard to unfair dismissal and was reinstated as manager in December 2001. He guided the Robins to tenth place last season and they are currently fourth and sitting pretty for a play-off place.

As a player Andy made 150 appearances for Everton scoring 38 goals in four seasons at Goodison.

'Tommy Mooney - one half of Swindon's formidable striking partnership'

Town boss Andy King has often hailed the partnership of Mooney with Sam Parkin as the best in the Division. Indeed their combined tally of 37 league goals between them has been a crucial factor in Town's play-off position. King's hopes when signing Mooney on a 'free' from Birmingham City last July have indeed come true - "He was top of my list and to get my first choice is unbelievable. He has pace, power and great goal scoring ability. It means that the burden is taken away from Parkin - together I am hoping they can forge a lethal partnership."

For 32-year old Mooney it has been a relief to be playing - and scoring - regularly after a miserable 2002-03 campaign. Under Steve Bruce, he made just one Premiership appearance for the Blues - spending the season on loan at Stoke, Sheffield United, and Derby County. He soon made his mark at the County Ground, his six goals during August seeing him named as the division's 'player-of-the-month.'

During his career Mooney has appeared in all four main English divisions. Born in Billingham, near Middlesbrough, he started with Aston Villa. Mooney played alongside Dwight Yorke in the youth side but became homesick - in addition Graham Taylor told him he would never make the first team. In 1990 Mooney joined Division 4 side Scarborough where he was a regular scorer notching 30 league goals in three seasons. In 1993 Barry Fry, then manager at Division 1 side Southend United, signed him for £100,000. For a time all was well but Fry moved to Birmingham and Mooney didn't fit in under new boss Peter Taylor. It was a low point in Mooney's career.


Mooney was loaned to Watford and netted his first goal for the Hornets against Southend. He moved permanently to Vicarage Road in July 1994 and met up once more with Graham Taylor who became Watford boss in 1996. Mooney played an important role in the Watford side that won successive promotions from Division 2 to the Premiership. For some of the time Taylor used Mooney as a centre half but reverted him to his original position when goals became scarce - Mooney replied by netting in six consecutive league games in the run-up to the Div 1 play-offs.

Watford's season in the Premiership was a nightmare for Mooney who was out for seven

months with a knee injury. His goal against Liverpool at Anfield was little consolation as Watford were relegated. At the end of the 2000-01 campaign newly installed Watford boss Vialli did not offer him a new contract and Mooney reflected -"After seven years it's not easy to walk away. But there's a new regime and maybe the time is right for me to move."

and Sheffield United were interested. but Mooney chose Birmingham - "I wanted to join the club I felt had the best chance of promotion. Trevor Francis had a very strong will to win and I knew the Blues had a squad good enough to reach the play-offs at least."

Mooney proved to be right - he netted 13 league goals and the Blues overcame Norwich in the play-off final to reach the Premiership. Frozen out however last season by the likes of Clinton Morrison, Stern John and Geoff Horsfield, Mooney is now delighted to be heading for another play-off challenge - this time with Swindon Town.





There has been a change to the goalkeeping position this season for the Robins as the rise of Rhys Evans has come to the fore.

Rhys Evans (top left) has grabbed his chance to become the number one keeper at the club. This Swindon born keeper has had experience out on loan as part of his preparation for first team football. He has come into the side this season and has looked very competent. Bart Griemink arrived at Swindon on a free transfer in the summer of 2000. The Dutch keeper was originally on loan as cover for Frank Talia before signing permanently for the club. Has been a regular in the side for the previous three seasons but has given way to the rise of Rhys Evans. Appeared against Peterborough United at London Road in the 4-2 defeat three weeks ago.

Swindon have some very experienced defenders, some have been at the County Ground a while.

Alan Reeves began his career with Swindon before joining Walsall in 1997. He was captain of the Saddlers side that won promotion to Division One 1998-99. He then joined Reading in July 2000 on a Bosman free before returning to the County Ground in the summer of 2003. Matt Heywood has been an ever present in the Robins side since he was snapped up by Andy King from Burnley in 2001. Strong in the tackle and good in the air he is a very important cog in the Town defence. Andy Gurney (top right) is the captain of the side and he can either play at full back or wing back. Signed on a Bosman free from Reading in the summer of 2001 and he has been a regular in the side since. Adrian Viveash began his career with Swindon before joining Walsall in 1997. Captain of the Saddlers side that won promotion to

Division One in 1998-99. Moved to Reading in July 2000 before rejoining Swindon in the summer of 2003. **Sean O'Hanlon** is a recent arrival on loan from Everton, at 6'1" he is a strong defender who has come straight into the team and performed well.


The midfield has some very good attacking players who link the play well from the centre of the field.

Stefan Miglioranzi (bottom left) is a product of American College football where the most talented players are drafted into Major League Soccer. He was taken from MLS. Chicago Fire and joined Everton on trial. Then came a move to Portsmouth before joining Swindon two seasons ago. David Duke is a left sided player who arrived on a free transfer from Sunderland. Now in his third season at the County Ground the Scotsman could be a real find by Andy King. Matthew Hewlett is an attacking central midfielder. He joined Swindon in the summer of 2000 from Bristol City. Has suffered with a number of injuries in the past and will be hoping to get a regular run in the side this season. Andrew Nicholas is a skilful, right footed player with a versatility that enables him to play in midfield or up front. He has appeared at left back for the Robins. possesses a Richard Harris style long throw. David Duke is a left sided player that arrived at the County Ground on a free transfer from Sunderland. Now in his third season with the Robins Andy King has high hopes for this young Scot. Grant Smith joined Swindon from Sheffield United in the summer of 2003. He is strong in the air and dangerous from set pieces. Steve Robinson is a right sided midfielder. A tough tackling player with bags of energy who signed from


Birmingham City for £50,000 in February 2001. **Brian Howard** is a youngster who joined from Southampton in 2003. This left sided midfielder has proved to be a revelation on the flanks this season Has proved to be a dead ball specialist, especially from corners.

The attack is possibly the best in the Second Division this season with Sam Parkin and Tommy Mooney rattling in the goals.

Sam Parkin (bottom right) is a name very familiar to Wanderers fans as Sam was on loan here from Chelsea in 2000. A bright and intelligent striker with natural goalscoring ability, was the clubs leading scorer last season and is currently on 20 this season. Tommy Mooney arrived from Birmingham City during the summer of 2003. He is a very experienced striker who has played in all four divisions of English football. His pairing with Sam Parkin has been very exciting for the Robins fans this season. currently the leading scorer with 21 goals so far. Sammy Igoe began his career with Portsmouth as a trainee. He was transferred to Reading for £100,000 but found it hard to break into the first team. Andy King. stepped in to sign him for Swindon during the summer of 2003 and has settled well at the County Ground. Rory Fallon is a recent signing from Barnsley where he moved through the youth scheme and into the first team. With Parkin and Mooney in such good form he found it difficult to break into the side but is admired by Andy King. Jon Stevenson is another who has very little chance to show in the first team. He joined in the summer of 2003 from Leicester City and was recommended to Andy King by Dave Bassett, the Foxes Director of Football.

Successful Easter for Robins

This afternoon's visitors Swindon Town enjoyed a successful Easter to keep their bid

for a play-off finish firmly on track. Last Saturday they drew 1-1 at home to promotion rivals Bristol City in front of the County Ground's best attendance of the season, 14,540. Boss Andy King commented on Rory Fallon's equaliser - "That is about as good a goal as I have ever seen. If someone in Europe had scored a goal like that, then it would have everybody talking. It was a magnificent effort and I was very proud of my players' performance in the second half." Last Monday Fallon netted twice in Town's excellent 3-0 win at Luton - Matt Hewlett netting the Robins third goal. Other recent news from Swindon is that Bath rugby union club have rubbished reports linking them to a possible ground sharing arrangement. 
Stockport revival



Justice - is it natural? by Brian Lee

Each and every season brings new headaches, particularly in the discipline area. The conflicting problems in playing discipline involve the showing of yellow and red cards to players and the subsequent suspensions. Sadly, the Football authorities continue to ignore the use of the "sinbin" – so successful in other sports.

There is a dichotomy in the discipline of the game. The Referee administers immediate "justice" by blowing his whistle for a trip, offence spotted, dealt with, let's get on with the game. For a particularly severe challenge an additional punishment is the awarding of a yellow card, which may eventually benefit other Clubs in the future but is of no immediate benefit to those the player has just offended against. Would the sinbin be better? Totting up cards over a season does nothing for the offended parties.

For a second serious offence and another yellow card, an automatic red card is shown and the player dismissed from the field of play. Instant justice — nearly! The maximum benefit could, I guess, be 89 minutes! With the automatic suspension that follows then one or more teams will have total benefit with the absence of a player who did not commit an offence against them. Incidentally I am also of the view that people pay good money to see 11 players against 11, not 11 v 9 or 10.

At present the match suspension starts "sometime" in the future, when it would be more logical for it to start immediately but we must remember the present appeal procedure – a cumbersome exercise to say the least. It is therefore good news that the procedures are to be speeded up next season, as follows:

When a player is dismissed from the field of play he will automatically be suspended for whatever period from the next first team fixture.

If the Club lodge an appeal for wrongful dismissal by midday the next day following the match the FA will establish a hearing to provide a decision within four working days.

Players who are charged with offences unseen by the match Officials will be dealt with as if the match Officials had seen the offence. In other words within the Laws of the Game.

Players who accumulate 10 or 15 cautions in a season will be banned for seven days following the 10 or 15 offences. For incidents off the field of play, personal hearings will be held on the following Tuesday or Thursday after a match. More complex cases involving Disciplinary Commissions will be dealt with within 28 days of the reported case.

From next season The Football Conference will join The Premiership and The Football League and be required under FA regulations to video all matches and provide, immediately following a match, a copy of the match video to both clubs and match Referee.

Whilst the above changes are striving for consistency and speedy justice for the whole range of misconduct charges connected with matches, it is still very important to support the match Officials. We accept the Referee and his assistants before the match and we should support their decisions during the match. Yes, they will continue to make mistakes just like players but trial by camera has to be controlled.

In the recent match against QPR the Referee dealt with an explosive reaction most sensibly by giving yellow cards to two players but the cameras could have called for red cards. I applauded his action and I believe the match was better for it.

It is hoped that speedy justice will be seen in other areas of the game. The infamous Rio Ferdinand drug case took far too long to be settled by the authorities, the decisions were far too long after the hearings. You could almost say that the delay was bringing the game into disrepute. Crowd problems, after-match interviews, press articles, etc, often produce belated charges – why? Nothing changes from the first understanding of the so-called offence – why the delay?

The proposals are good changes and I think we will be happier when the new regulations enables speedier justice to be done as well as being seen to be done and at last it all seems more natural.



Good Friday 9th April

10-20am Arrived in office, with it being Good Friday today is a Bank Holiday and I am the only one in apart from the players who were training, the main purpose of my attendance being to get Danny Senda's signature on his new contract.

Easter Saturday 10th April

7-50am Only one Director and I going to Plymouth today, even The Chairman missing on a well deserved holiday in Portugal, so arrive at Graham Peart's house ready for what promises to be a nightmare journey. As always I am early, bad habit, Graham still having to finish his habitual egg, which he feels, is his away day good luck charm despite recently having gone over twelve months without an away win.

8-10am Depart for the West Country, picking up Graham's grandson Ben from Swindon en-route.

12-10pm Park the car on The Barbican at Plymouth, going for a stroll and having a little lunch before making our way to the ground.

4-38pm Despite a brave rearguard action Plymouth finally break our resistance and score what is to be the winning goal, ten minutes from time, with our goalkeeper Steve Williams getting injured in the process.

4-43pm Knowing Steve is our only fit goalkeeper rush down to the dressing room to see how bad the injury is, my worst fears are realised he has a badly dislocated finger and looks set to be out for some time.

4-52pm Lie in wait at the top of the player's tunnel, grabbed the Manager as he trooped back to the dressing room to ask if he wanted me to pursue the possibility of special dispensation of a loan goalkeeper for Monday. With Frank Talia, Tom Gott and now Steve Williams now all long term injuries we had two choices, Brownie on loan, with no disrespect to Steve Brown there was only one option.

5-24pm Rang our Chairman in Portugal to ask if he could get Andy Williamson's mobile number for me, knowing he had more contacts than I, being a League Board Member.

5-40pm Departed for home, mobile in hand, needing to tie up special dispensation. First calls were to the Manager on the team coach to ascertain he had someone he could call upon at short notice, he did and started to try to contact Stuart Murdoch at Wimbledon. Wimbledon's Lee Worgan had been trailing in the last few reserve games and having impressed seemed the ideal man, but of course being Easter weekend time was not on our side.

6-24pm Received call back from The Chairman who

gave me Andy Williamson's mobile number, he was on holiday in Spain but at least I had found a trail I could follow.

6-50pm Having got no reply from my calls to Andy I rang his home again to leave a message and got his son, who in turn took the message that I was after him and he too tried to contact Spain.

7-20pm Call received from the Manager on the coach telling me Stuart Murdoch had agreed, so all we now needed was Andy Williamson.

7-35pm Graham Peart ploughing up the motorway, Ben in the back dispensing sweets, with me constantly ringing Andy in Spain finally getting a reply. It was his wife who informed me that he was in the gym and that he would telephone me immediately he returned.





FRUSTRATING AFTERNOON FOR BLUES

The Blues rediscovered a rich vein of form going into this match as they put on a fine display against a Scunthorpe side completely outplayed. Wanderers were left totally frustrated by match referee John Brandwood after two very dubious decisions led to Scunthorpe's goals.

It was one of those matches where the Blues came back to lead 2-1 and created enough chances to have won, despite the invention of the match referee. But after the game Wycombe manager Martin O'Neill felt aggrieved, "They have got out of jail and the referee had a lot to do with it. It may sound like sour grapes but he made some mind boggling decisions".

Gut-busting goals from Jason Cousins and Glyn Creaser overcame the visitors advantage against the run of play. Wanderers went behind on 49 minutes when Mr. Brandwood decided the hand that was involved in the move leading up to Mark Smith's goal was not deliberate. The visitors continued to play and Damien Henderson gave Blues defence the slip, Smith stole in and slotted home in the bottom corner.



Wycombe hardly wavered after Smith's goal. Cousins continued to push on down the right and started the move which he finished superbly on 57 minutes. His pass to Keith Ryan was crossed into the box, Steve Thompson, seeing Cousins steaming in, laid the ball off for him to smash into the stanchion for 1-1.

Scunthorpe remained a real threat on the break, but Wycombe worked hard to drive themselves on. Two good chances came and went, first Keith Ryan was woefully off target from Dave Carroll's centre on 69 minutes, then Simon Stapleton's long range shot struck a post a minute later. It was Glyn Creaser who threw in his head, amid the close attentions of two defenders, to loop a



header over Heath and send the Blues in front at 2-1.

Then with six minutes remaining Mr. Brandwood intervened again. The players were stunned when he pointed to the spot after Matt Crossley's 84th minute challenge on Sammy Goodacre as the substitute fought to get a cross in from the by-line. The video pictures showed Goodacre did not go down and there were no protests from his teammates. Wanderers keeper Paul Hyde was booked for taking too long to walk to his goal line before Wayne Bullimore scored from the spot. It was a kick in the teeth for the team and supporters after watching the Blues put on a first class show ruined by the match official Wanderers midfield had dominated the match for long periods, but Mick Heath had one of those afternoon's in the Scunthorpe goal as he repelled most things thrown at him.



CREWE CRUSH AUTOMATIC HOPES

There were 1,700 Blues fans packed into a very tight Gresty Road ground for this vital encounter as the Blues pressed on in their quest for promotion from Division Three at the first attempt. Wanderers fans had clocked up almost 7,000 miles in their support of a side making history in their first season as a Football League club. It was just like some kind of magical mystery tour that they had to keep rolling up for. This match had the hopes of it being the last away fixture that would see them gain at least one automatic promotion place. Crewe Alexandra had been pushing the whole season and were regarded as one of the teams most likely to gain promotion under the astute leadership of Dario Gradi.



The match kicked off amid a cacophony of noise accompanied by a blizzard of light blue and dark blue balloons. As Wycombe keeper had just cleared his goalmouth of a collection of floating objects a minute later it was a spherical shape he was retrieving from the corner of this net. Crewe burst out of the blocks with neat slick passing moves. Richard Annan found Ashley Ward unmarked after 59 seconds and the latter slotted the ball beyond Paul Hyde's despairing dive.

Wycombe regained their composure with a little help from Darren Rowbottom and the gusting wind. The striker mishit a clearance which was caught by the swirling wind. Both Crewe keeper Mark Gayle and Blues Tony Hemmings went for the ball which bounced before making slow progress into the net. It was certainly a piece of good fortune for the Wycombe side to allow them to get down to the serious business in hand. The visitors had to work hard to break up the home team's excellent passing game. But Crewe midfielder Neil Lennon (this was the performance that left a lasting memory with Martin O'Neill), provided an inexhaustible supply of passes to keep his team on top.

In the second half some very good pressure by the Blues gave hope to the committed followers as they learned Preston were trailing 2-0 at Carlisle. But as the minutes ticked by the Wanderers pressure failed to tell. Nerves became fraved as both team's began looking at the clock and it seemed a mistake would settle the issue. So it proved. Paul Hyde flapped at a cross from Martyn Booty which Keith Ryan and Crewe's Steve Macauley went for, the ball fell nicely for Ashley Ward who picked his spot for his second of the day. This win for Crewe meant they would go up with Chester City leaving the Blues to fight it out in the play offs.





THE BEST



This was a first class result at the County Ground that saw the Blues leapfrog Swindon in the Division Two table. Wycombe began in very positive fashion and it was Keith Ryan who opened the scoring on 24 minutes when he followed up a Steve Brown header that thundered against

the crossbar when he met a fine cross from Dannie Bulman. Swindon worked hard to get back on level terms before half time but a resolute defensive barrier prevented any



breach of the Blues goal.

On 57 minutes Wycombe virtually sealed all three points when they hit the Robins with a fine breakaway goal. Dannie Bulman began the move when he sent Stuart Roberts away down the right hand side where the wee man delivered a great ball into the feet of the running Bulman who drilled the ball into the corner of the

net with his right foot. Manager Lawrie Sanchez introduced Jermaine McSporran for his first taste of football for a year following surgery for a cruciate ligament injury. For the home side Danny Invincibile saw his 30 yard screamer smash against the Blues crossbar, a goal for them at that stage may have seen a different outcome. But Wycombe surged on and looked strong in the later stages The final clincher came when Craig Faulconbridge headed home a Steve Brown corner to register his first goal since he scored against Swindon at Adams Park in November. This was the first ever Football League victory over Swindon Town and a real boost for the likes of Faulconbridge. McSporran and Gavin Holligan who also returned from a lengthy injury spell.



Faulconbridge headed in at the far
post following a Michael Simpson
corner.

Swindon had most of the pressure at the start of the second half but it was the Blues who took the lead. It was Michael Simpson who made a run down the down the right hand byeline before crossing for Andy Rammell to side foot home on 73 minutes. At this stage it did look as if Wanderers would hold on take take the match. However, the visitors responded with Danny Invicibile sending in a powerful cross that Sam Parkin crashed in off the under side of Frank Talia's crossbar to level at 2-2. Wanderers should have won it in the 89th minute with a well timed flicked header from Craig Faulconbrdige but Bart Griemink in the Swindon goal pulled off an outstanding save to deny him. But four minutes into added on time Frank Talia made an equally



spectacular save but Sam Parkin was on hand to covert the rebound and put one over his

former team mates to win the game for the Robins. It was a major blow for the Blues who had always struggled at home to Swindon and this one turned out to be no different.

The late winner from ex Chelsea striker Sam Parkin left the Blues fans shaking their heads in disbelief while Swindon fans showed their delight by singing in the rain.



Matt Lawrence

Having played in all six games on route to the Millennium Stadium, former Blue Matt Lawrence is currently looking forward to a FA Cup final showdown against Manchester United with the side he signed for from Wycombe back in March 2000, Millwall.

Born in Northampton, he went over to study in the United States on a Football Scholarship. After completing his degree early he returned to the U.K in the hope of turning professional. He started off playing for Grays Athletic in the Diadora Premier Division but did not have to wait long for his chance and was offered a





trial at Wycombe. Within two
weeks then Wanderers
manager Alan Smith offered
the defender a six month
contract, beginning the first
of two spells with
Wanderers. He made 22
appearances the first time
around, scoring once.
However, after the departure
of Smith he did not figure in
new manager John
Gregory's plans and
departed to Fulham for a
small fee.

He spent a successful 18 months at Craven Cottage, making over 60 appearances and winning their 'Young Player of the Season' award for 1997/98. But again a change at the helm, this time the arrival of Kevin Keegan, paved a way for his exit back to Wycombe in October 1998 who by then were playing under Neill

Smillie.

The fee of £85,000 to bring him back was justified by some excellent performances. When Lawrie Sanchez arrived as manager in January 1999 he must have feared the worst but this time the change proved a good one for Lawrence and Wycombe as they survived in Division Two with a dramatic win at Lincoln on the final day of the season.

After adding a further 37 appearances the following year to take his Wycombe tally up to 98, including 5 goals, he was snapped up for £250,000 by Millwall in March 2000.

He settled well at the New Den and missed just one game throughout the 2000/01 campaign as Millwall claimed the Second Division title. He also proved popular with the fans, and was voted their 'Player of the season' that same year.

Since then Lawrence has remained a pretty permanent fixture in the Lions starting line up. Something he no doubts hopes will continue, at least until Saturday May 22nd and the Lions first FA Cup final appearance in their 119 year history.


THE MATCH

This was an extraordinary County Cup semi-final held at Chesham United, the Blues were 5-1 down at half time, went on to draw 6-6 with Aylesbury United after extra time.

The recovery was remarkable to say the least, helped by two penalties and an 'own goal' the Wanderers lived to light another day.

The match opened with the Delphian League side looking very sharp, this was fully emphasised when the Aylesbury United centre forward Harrison scored in the eighth and ninth minutes. Ten minutes later their Polish inside-left Wegrzyk grabbed another two. Paul Bates retrieved the situation with the first of his two penalties following a challenge on him in the area. But on the stroke of half time Harper broke away and added a fifth to give Aylesbury a comfortable 5-1 lead at the interval.

It was a different story in the second half as Wycombe played a long ball through the middle of the Aylesbury



defence for wing halves Truett and Fryer to press forward onto. Wycombe monopolised the play for the first time and Rockell soon made it 5-2. That was followed by the Aylesbury defender Hart putting through his own goal for Wanderers third. The fourth came when the dashing Rockell was felled in the area and Bates stepped up to convert his second penalty, with seven minutes remaining Bates dived headlong to send home a Worley cross and tie the scores at 5-5.

In the first period of extra time Aylesbury hit back when Harper restored their lead but it was that man Rockell again who equalised for Wycombe at the end of the first period.

THE PROGRAMME

The Berks & Bucks F.A. produced a programme with the aid of Chesham United, very much in the style of Chesham programmes for that period. This was an eight page issue with a small editorial telling everyone how Chesham United were doing. There is a brief mention of the two semifinalists but it is very much in passing. As always, local advertising can be found scattered throughout the issue with the centre pages devoted to the two teams surrounded by small box ads. The cover has been printed in a light blue, the inside pages are white with black type and the cover price is three old pence.

HISTORICAL COMMENT

This was the season that Wanderers early Isthmian League form was exceptional. They won the first six games scoring 34 goals and then extended that to 10 wins and 2 draws from the first twelve games. However, in the end the formidable Wimbledon took the title with 47 points, Dulwich Hamlet were six behind on 41 and the Blues finished third on 40 points. In the cups Wycombe went out of the F.A. Cup at Northampton Town having dominated the game they fell to late goals and lost 2-0. In the F.A. Amateur Cup they had two terrific games with old rivals Barnet in the Third Round. Having done the hard work at Underhill and drawn 2-2 they lost the replay at Loakes Park in front of an 11,000 crowd 1-0. In the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup they lost the replay to Aylesbury United, our featured game above, 2-1 after Mick Rockell had been carried off with a broken leg. Other items of note that season saw Dennis Edwards sign for Charlton Athletic at the end of February 1959, a big loss to the team. Paul Bates scored 40 goals, the first time any Blues player had achieved that since Tim Hinton back in season 1925-26.

When we beat Port Vale here recently, it was our sixth successive game

unbeaten by them. In fact, our only defeat in eight games against them was here during our F.A. Cup run in the latter half of the 2000/01 season. Whilst they have scored one goal on all of their visits to Adams Park, we have done likewise at Vale Park. The attendance is the lowest for a game between the two sides here. 250 UP


Today is our 250th home Football League match. Of the previous 249 we have won 109, drew 69 and lost 71, scoring 363 goals and conceding 272 in the process. This gives a total of 396 points. Our biggest win is 5-0 over Burnley in the 1996/97 season, while our biggest losing margin is 4-0. This has happened twice with Stoke (1999/00) and Cardiff (2002/03) being the victors. We have conceded five goals twice, against Colchester in our first season and Oldham this season, but we lost 5-2 on both occasions. The most common scoreline is 1-1. There has been 37 of those. Next week at Brentford we will play our 500th Football League match and I will write on that in our next programme, which will be the last of the season (how time flies!).






