

I thought the performance at Hull was a great boost for us. We were solid at the back, we created a couple of good chances and their 'keeper pulled off two areat saves.

It was also pleasing to see little Le Fondre get a goal. He's a really bright player and, with a little luck, he might have marked his debut with a hat trick. He missed a decent chance after coming off the bench and then hit the bar late in the game.

SUSPENSION

Jim Goodwin will be missing today through suspension, which is a blow because he did really well last Saturday, but the lads who were unavailable on Tuesday should be okay and I'm fairly confident that I'll have a virtual full squad to pick from today. We had a cracking game against Swindon last season. We found ourselves 3-0 down after 18 minutes or so when it could have easily been 3-3. We then pulled a couple back and looked like winning the game until they scored a late goal. It will be nice to get a little bit of revenge today because I didn't think we deserved to lose last season. Finally, I'd like to welcome Joe Corrigan, our new goalkeeping coach, to Edgeley Park. Big Joe is a personal friend of mine who I've known over the years and played against him. He's a fantastic lad and a great presence. He was with Liverpool for near enough ten years and I'm sure that wealth of experience and knowledge will rub off on my lads.

He will be with us twice a week and also on match days as well and, to be honest, I can see a difference already.

With a move imminent to occupy their new state of the art ground there may be better times around the corner for a club that has desperately struggled this last couple of years.

It was a shock to the system to find out last week that old County favourite Mike Flynn had signed for Accrington Stanley. You do tend sometimes to think that certain players will go on forever. Mike was here so long, he was part of the furniture. He played with Blackpool for a couple of seasons but the old legs don't last forever and he has moved into the Conference. Stanley are now full time and Flynny got off to a flying start on Wednesday night when he scored a goal in his team's sensational 2-1 win at Bradford City in the LDV Vans Trophy.

Giuliano Grazioli is a name that has been around a bit. He hit the headlines at Stevenage when he topped the goalscoring charts and scored against Newcastle in the FA Cup. He went into the League with several clubs before ending up at Bristol Rovers. He didn't guite make it and dropped back into the Conference with Barnet, Now he is top of the goalscoring charts again and starting to enjoy his football. Some players can only do it at certain levels and maybe the Conference is as far as he can go. Carlisle are starting to show a bit of form now and look to be big contenders for a return into the Football League. The 5-0 demolition

of Aldershot last week on their own patch certainly proves the point. That's in stark contrast to York City who hover somewhere near the bottom and are struggling desperately to show a bit of form. Stevenage chairman Phil Wallace has stated: "We are in a hurry, we've got to be in the top five at the end of the season." There's nothing like putting a bit of pressure on your manager!

This afternoon Ian Lancashire takes us back to 1962 when England Schoolboys staged a special trail game at Edgelev Park.

> As a twelve-year-old boy I was really excited about the prospect of England playing at Edgeley Park.

Although it was not the full England squad, I still could not wait for the visit of England Boys. They were due to play a select side on Saturday March 3, 1962, and great interest in the game had been generated throughout the town because three of our own Stockport Boys players had been selected for the 'The Rest.' The pick of them, Johnny Clay of Hall Street, was thought to be on the verge of a full England Boys cap after some sterling displays over the previous twelve months at schoolboy level.

A huge posse of League scouts had flocked to Edgeley Park to watch him play for Stockport Boys on more than one occasion, and this was a great opportunity for him to shine in front of the England selectors, in this final International trial.

As I went home after the game, I looked far into the future to the year of 1966 and wondered if any of the players I had seen today would go on to represent England when the World Cup would be played in our country. Here are the teams on the day ... do you recognise anyone?

England Barnett, Harrop, Brindley, Farrar, Pack, Adams, Bullock, Gordon, Hurst, Pearson, Morton. The Rest Parker, Rooney, Hignett, Whittington, Barlow, Cathermole, Rearden, Clay, Hall, McCulloch, Maher.

Although none of the boys went on to play for the full England side, John Hurst won nine Under-23 caps during his distinguished spell at Everton where he helped the Toffees win the FA Cup in 1966 and the League title four years later. He completed his career at Oldham Athletic where he added 170 games to his 347 League appearances with Everton. In goal for England was Geoff Barnett, who also joined the Goodison giants. After two years on

Merseyside the Northwich-born shot-stopper joined Arsenal where he played in the 1968 League Cup Final.

Others to enjoy fine careers were John Brindley (Notts County) and robust striker Mickey Bullock who served Birmingham, Oxford, Orient and

John Pearson and Ken Morton both joined Manchester United and, later, both moved to

For the 'Rest' Alan Hignett made a solitary appearance for his hometown club, Liverpool, before moving to Chester.

Frank Barlow did much better. The Sheffieldborn defender made 121 appearances for the Blades before adding another 141 following his switch to Chesterfield.




LeagueOneReview

Luton Town extended their lead at the top of Coca-Cola League One after defeating Peterborough United 2-1 at Kenilworth Road last Saturday. Rowan Vine opened the scoring for Mike Newell's side after 31 minutes only for Curtis Woodhouse to equalise for the Posh three minutes into the second period. However, Paul Underwood grabbed the winner for the other Hatters after 57 minutes with a close-range finish. The win increased Luton's lead at the top to nine points as a result of County's battling point at Hull City. Hull's failure to win enabled Tranmere Rovers to climb

to second in their place following a dramatic late win at Torquay United, lain Hume scored after two minutes for Rovers but the Gulls struck back through Alex Russell just after half-time, as the former Rochdale man returned from injury in the best possible style.

WINNER

With the points looking likely to be shared, Hume hit his second and the winner with three minutes remaining. Sheffield Wednesday started life under new manager Paul Sturrock with a 3-0 victory at Wrexham. Steve MacLean opened the scoring for the Owls after 25 minutes and goals from Chris Brunt (55th) and Adam Proudlock (62nd) secured all three points. Chesterfield lost ground on the leaders after going down to a late goal from Barnsley's Anthony Kay. The midfielder scored the winner with just three minutes remaining to secure the three points at Oakwell. Blackpool finally recorded their first win of the season with a 3-0 triumph at Port Vale. Colin Hendry's side moved off the bottom of the table (at our expense) after two goals from Scott Vernon and another from Scott Taylor gave the Seasiders the points.

GIANT-KILLING

Bournemouth followed their midweek giant-killing exploits at Blackburn Rovers by thrashing Doncaster Rovers 5-0 at Dean Court. Portuguese trialist Dani Rodrigues scored the first after three minutes and James Hayter added a second two minutes later. Eddie Howe, the penalty hero in the Carling Cup win the previous Wednesday, scored the third and Garreth O'Connor sent the Cherries into the break with a 4-0 lead. Hayter wrapped up the win with his second and his side's fifth 20 minutes from time.

John Salako scored the only goal of the game as Brentford recorded their first away win of the season at Walsall. The former England winger scored from the penalty spot after 30 minutes to keep up the pressure on the other promotion hopefuls.

SwindonTown

Swindon Town picked up three important points at home to Bradford City last Saturday although they left it extremely late as Sammy Igoe scored the only goal of the game with just three minutes remaining.

IN GOAL

Rhys Evans, a one-time County target, started his career as a trainee at Chelsea but never made a first team appearance at Stamford Bridge. Loan spells with Bristol Rovers, QPR and Leyton Orient followed before Swindon signed him on a free transfer in July 2003.

IN DEFENCE

Paul Mitchell is currently on loan at the County Ground from League Championship side Wigan Athletic. The defender, who has made 80 appearances for the Latics, has played four times for Swindon so far this season.

Jerel Ifil is a London-born defender who started his career at Watford. He made a number of loan spells during his time at Vicarage Road before a £70,000 switch to Swindon prior to this season.

Sean O'Hanlon is a former Everton trainee who originally joined Swindon on loan last season before the Robins captured his services on a permanent basis on transfer deadline day by paying £150,000 to the Toffees.

David Duke is a Scottish midfielder who arrived at the County Ground in July 2000 on a free transfer from Sunderland having failed to break into the Black Cats' first team. He should make his 200th appearance for the club in the next couple of weeks.

IN MIDFIELD

Sammy Igoe, the creative spark in Swindon's midfield, started his career at Portsmouth before joining Reading for £100,000. A loan spell with Luton preceded a free transfer move to Swindon in the summer of 2003. Steve Robinson is a tough-tackling and energetic midfielder who started his career with Birmingham. Loan spells with Kidderminster and Peterborough

followed before Swindon paid £50,000 to take him to the County Ground in February 2001.

Brian Howard is a left-sided midfielder who started his career at Southampton although he failed to make a first team appearance for the Saints. He left in the summer of 2003 to join Swindon and has since made over 50 appearances for the club.

Stefani Miglioranzi hails from Brazil and started his English career with Portsmouth back in March 1999. He scored 2 goals in 42 appearances before Swindon picked him up on a free transfer in August 2002.

IN ATTACK

Rory Fallon is a big striker who started his career at Barnsley, scoring 11 goals in 58 appearances. He has also been on loan at Shrewsbury before Swindon decided to take him to the County Ground in November 2003.

Sam Parkin is a young and promising forward who started his career as a trainee at Chelsea. During his time at Stamford Bridge he was loaned out to Millwall, Wycombe, Oldham and Northampton before he left the London club for good in August 2002 to join the Robins.

IN CONTENTION

Matthew Hewlett is a Bristol-born midfielder who started his career with hometown club City making over 150 appearances for the club. He later joined Burnley on loan before Swindon signed him on a free transfer prior to the 2000-01 season.

Jamle McMaster completed a loan move from Leeds United on Tuesday. The Australian, who can play in midfield or up front, enjoyed a similar spell with Chesterfield last season

It is quite ironic that County's best performance in weeks at Hull City last Saturday should result in the Hatters dropping to the bottom of the League One table.



There were plenty of positives to take out of that game, though, but it will only represent a corner being turned if it is the pre-cursor to a change in fortunes here at Edgeley Park.

One thing's for certain, though, the opposition net will need to be found far more frequently. Just two goals scored in our last seven league fixtures clearly shows room for improvement whilst the Cheadle Enders, in particular, have been short changed big style this season - the only County goals to nestle in their net being the two scored in our unfortunate 3-2 opening-day defeat at the hands of Huddersfield Town way back on August

But, with your continued vocal support, we can finally register that first important home league win this afternoon as we welcome Swindon Town to Edgeley Park.

Last year the two sides registered one win each, County picking up a creditable 2-1 victory at the County Ground but the Robins gained revenge with a 4-2 win here at Edgeley Park. Tommy Mooney thankfully now at Oxford - plundered three goals in the two games whilst County's Stuart Barlow also scored in both games.

FIRST HURDLE

Last season the Robins occupied a top-six from

the turn of the year but fell at the first hurdle in the Play-Offs. A 1-0 home defeat in the first leg at the hands of Brighton & Hove Albion was not the ideal platform to take to the Withdean Stadium but Sam-Parkin levelled the tie and Fallon's 97th minute goal looked to have put Swindon through. Virgo, however, hit an extra time stoppage time equaliser for the Seagulls and Gurney's penalty miss saw the Robins crash out 4-3 in the lottery of penalties. The current season has seen Town displaying somewhat patchy form although they still visit Edgeley Park handily placed in 7th position. On home soil Swindon have picked up nine points from the fifteen available, having won three games and lost two. The first of their home defeats came when they entertained Luton Town. An entertaining encounter saw the plastic Hatters just shade things 3-2. The men on target for Town being Parkin and Reeves but, ultimately, their efforts were in vain as a penalty from Nicholls, one from Steve Howard and an own goal from Fallon ensured that Swindon's start on Wiltshire soil was unsuccessful. Home win number one was registered at the second attempt when Franchise FC, aka Milton Keynes Dons, made their first ever visit to the County Ground. Sam Parkin gave Swindon the lead but by half time Milton Keynes had levelled matters thanks to a goal from Allan Smart. Brian Howard added what turned out to be the winner for Swindon midway through the second half.

RUTHLESS

Hartlepool United were next up at the County Ground and a ruthless first half performance by Andy King's men soon saw Swindon establish a 3-O interval lead thanks to goals from Henderson, Parkin and an opposition own goal. The match was effectively over as a contest and, as so often happens, there was no further addition to the scoreline during the second 45 minutes. Peterborough United were the next team to visit the County Ground and the Posh registered a surprise victory courtesy of a solitary first half goal from much travelled Steve Jenkins. However, last Saturday the Robins returned to winning ways, Sammy Igoe the hero as his late goal earned all three points against Bradford City. Chances had been at a premium although Parkin and Matt Hewlett both fired wide for the Robins when well placed. The introduction of Dean Windass in place of Dele Adebola looked to have given the impetus to the side from West Yorkshire and they appeared to hold all the aces when Parkin was red carded following a difference of opinion with City keeper Paul Henderson but Igoe came up trumps powering home his first goal of the season from an 85th minute free kick. On their travels the Swindon faithful have seen their side pick up seven points from a won two, drawn

one and lost two record. The opening day of the

season saw Town venturing into North Wales to take on Wrexham. The trip was in vain, though, as the Red Dragons claimed all three points thanks to goals from the giant Dennis Lawrence and a Chris Armstrong penalty. Caton pulled one back late on for Swindon but it proved to be merely a consolation goal.


Their second away trip was more successful as they fared slightly better than County did at Ashton Gate! Darius Henderson helped himself to a goal in each half to engineer a 2-1 victory for Swindon, Tom Doherty scoring the Bristol City goal. August ended with a trip to the Bescot Stadium where a frenetic first half saw the sides sharing four goals, Howard and Henderson netting for Swindon with Jorge Leitao scoring twice for Walsall. The match looked to be heading towards a draw until Gary Birch's 87th minute goal ensured that Walsall took all three points.

Two away games played in September have seen Swindon unbeaten. They picked up three points at Layer Road against Colchester United, Parkin's early goal proving to be the winner, whilst at Blackpool they drew 1-1 but required a second half equaliser from Henderson after the Seasiders had taken a first half lead through former County striker Scott Taylor.

In the Carling Cup 1st Round Swindon left it very late away at Rushden & Diamonds, Matt Hewlett scoring the games' only goal in stoppage time. Their reward was a trip to Elland Road and, whilst they lost the match 1-0 to a 9th minute Michael Ricketts goal, some consolation could be taken from their share of a sizeable attendance.


FRASER DIGBY

England U-21 goalkeeper who was a key figure in Swindon Town's 1992-93 First Division play-off final triumph. Signing professional for Manchester United in April 1985, he moved to Swindon in September 1986 and featured in that season's promotion success. He was ever-present in 1988-89, starring as they qualified for the play-offs in successive seasons and were Coca-Cola Cup semi-finalists in 1994-95. Also featuring in the 1995-96 Second Division title triumph, he had a testimonial in July 1997 and played 417 League games before joining Crystal Palace in August 1998, then played for Barry Town.

ROD THOMAS

Welsh international right-back who was capped 30 times while at Swindon Town, Initially with Gloucester City, he moved to the County Ground in July 1964 and was a key figure in Swindon's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' success. He also starred in their 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph and netted five goals in 296 League games prior to joining Derby County in November 1973. Featuring in their 1974-75 League Championship

campaign, he moved to Cardiff City in November 1977 and subsequently had spells with Newport County and Gloucester again before becoming a publican.

JOHN TROLLOPE

Long-serving left-back who holds Swindon Town's appearance record. Signing professional at the County Ground in July 1960, he made his League debut in Swindon's 1-1 draw at home to Halifax Town a month later and was ever-present in seven consecutive seasons including the 1962-63promotion success. He featured in Swindon's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' campaign as well as their 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph. Scoring 21 goals in 770 League games for Swindon, he was coach before managing them between November 1980 and March 1983, then their youthteam boss.

GLENN HODDLE

Former England international midfielder who was player-manager as Swindon Town reached the Premiership in 1992-93. Signing professional for Tottenham Hotspur in April 1975, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, then won the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons and the UEFA Cup in 1984. He moved to Monaco in July 1987 and helped win the French title in 1987-88, becoming Swindon's player-boss in August 1991, Scoring once in 64 League games, he left to take charge of Chelsea after the 1992-93 First Division play-off final triumph and has since managed England, Southampton and Spurs.

COLIN CALDERWOOD

Commanding central defender who was capped 36 times by Scotland after leaving Swindon Town. Signing professional for Mansfield Town in March 1982, he moved to the County Ground in July 1985 and starred as Swindon won the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He also helped to win promotion in 1986-87, then featured in two further play-off finals including the 1993 Wembley triumph. Scoring 20 times in 330 League games for Swindon, he moved to Tottenham Hotspur in July 1993 and subsequently played for Aston Villa and Nottingham Forest. He is now managing Northampton Town.

SHAUN TAYLOR

Influential central defender who was ever-present alongside Colin Calderwood as Swindon Town reached the Premiership in 1992-93. He impressed with Bideford before moving to Exeter City in December 1986 and starred in their 1989-90 Fourth Division title triumph. Joining Swindon in July 1991, he was the sole ever-present player in their 1993-94 Premiership campaign and also featured in the 1995-96 Second Division title triumph. He netted 30



goals in 212 League games while at the County Ground before moving to Bristol City in September 1996 where he has become development coach.

MIKE SUMMERBEE

Brilliant winger who was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Subsequently with Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, he is a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town.

ERNIE HUNT

England U-23 International striker who was Swindon Town's leading marksman in four successive seasons including their 1962-63 promotion triumph. Born locally, he signed professional at the County Ground in March 1960 and netted 82 goals in 214 League games for Swindon prior to joining Wolverhampton Wanderers in September 1965. He was top scorer as they regained top-flight status in 1966-67 and subsequently played for Everton, Coventry City, Doncaster Rovers and Bristol City, featuring in their 1973-74 FA Cup run. He ran the Full Pitcher pub in Ledbury and then became a window cleaner.

PAUL RIDEOUT

England U-21 international striker who was Swindon Town's leading goalscorer in two consecutive seasons. He was Swindon's youngest League player at 16 years 107 days against Hull City in November

1980 and netted 38 goals in 95 League games while at the County Ground before joining Aston Villa in June 1983. Moving via Italian club Bari to Southampton in July 1988, he rejoined Swindon on loan in March 1991. He had spells with Notts County and Glasgow Rangers prior to joining Everton in August 1992 and was an FA Cup winner in 1995, then played for several clubs in China and Tranmere Rovers.


PETER NOBLE

Versatile favourite who was ever-present in Swindon Town's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' triumph. Initially with Consett, he joined Newcastle United in November 1964 and played top-flight football before moving to Swindon in January 1968. He scored twice in their 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final success and netted 62 goals in 216 League outings prior to joining Burnley in June 1973. An FA Cup semi-finalist in 1973-74, he was twice ever-present for the Clarets and leading marksman in 1978-79. He subsequently played for Blackpool and has since run a sportswear business in Burnley.

DON ROGERS

England U-23 international winger who scored twice in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final success. Signing professional at the County Ground in October 1962, he featured in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion campaign and was ever-present in four successive seasons. He starred as Swindon won promotion again in 1968-69 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. Moving to QPR in September 1974, he rejoined Swindon in March 1976 and netted 148 goals in 412 League games overall for the Robins. He has since run his own sports shop in Swindon.

Former County playermanager Mike Summerbee made more than 200 appearances for the Robin






Do you know of anyone who thinks that Brian Clough should not have been given the chance to manage England in the late 70s or early 80s?

> I don't know if England would have won a World Cup under Cloughie, but it certainly would have been more interesting watching them try. Instead of going for the best manager around, of course, the FA suits opted for the entirely gentlemanly and safe option of Ron Greenwood. Greenwood was a studious coach with an above-average track record who would not rock the boat down at Lancaster Gate. Clough was a self-taught, tough manager with a sensational track record who had a mouth as big as the River Trent and who knew his own mind and didn't suffer fools at all. In short, he was trouble.

The debate about whether Old Big 'Ead should have got the chance to manage the national team re-emerged last week after this genuine legend died at the age of 69. Of course, everyone remembers how Clough got the very best out of journeymen players to achieve success first at Derby and then Nottingham Forest, but it wasn't all plain sailing. For example, in his 44 day stint in charge at Leeds United he managed to lose the dressing room when he told his new players - one of the most successful teams of their day, don't forget - to throw away all their medals because they had won them all by cheating. Perhaps this demonstrated an aversion to "star" players that may have gone against him if he had taken charge of England. Leeds' loss was Forest's gain, however, as this deeply

unfashionable club was dragged kicking and screaming from Second Division obscurity (ie. the old, old Second Division, when the First Division was the Premiership, if you see what I mean) to Champions of England and then twice Champions of Europe. All

within five years. I can't see anybody doing that again in our

But Mr Clough will be remembered as much for his -ahemforthright opinions, as for the brilliant football produced by his teams. By his own admission he was a bigmouth but a provincial club like Forest needed someone to bang their drum for them. Everyone has a story to tell about Brian Clough, and the newspapers at the weekend were full of cartoons alluding to his legendary status. In one, Cloughie had just told off St Peter for slouching. In another, God was asking Mr C if he could please have his seat back. In a similar vein, there was the tale that Clough himself used to tell of when he climbed into bed after arriving home late one night. His wife said to him "God, your feet are cold," to which he replied "sorry about that, Barbara...and by the way, you can call me Brian."

I met the great man once, at a book signing after he had retired from management. Everyone in the room knew that they had to say "please" and "thank you" and address him as "Mr Clough" or else they wouldn't get their book signed. True to form, he ticked off one young lad for walking with his hands in his pockets. Before the event, there was a real atmosphere of respect tempered by a little bit of fear as this larger-than-life character entered the room. You could see why the young apprentices would scatter when they heard him approach. Of course, when it came down to it, he was charming and had everyone in the room straining to hear his every word. He would probably have hated being given a knighthood, as a Socialist all his life, but he certainly deserved to be offered one for his services to sport. As I have already mentioned, not everything in his managerial career went his way. His final year in charge of Forest was, of course, the low-point of his career as he led them to relegation, a blow from which they have never really recovered. But it is a measure of the man, and the esteem in which he was held, that on his final day in charge - having just been relegated - he was given a standing ovation and treated like he had just secured the championship again. He said that he never forgave himself for getting Forest relegated, but the fans forgave him on the spot because of all the incredible memories he had given them. What a manager, what a man. You will be sadly missed, Mr Clough.

PS. I couldn't let today pass without recording the end of an era here at Edgeley Park as Steve Bellis leaves his position to pursue a career in sports consultancy. It was Mr Bellis who gave me my first break as a jobbing photographer, and for many years was also my programme editor. As I like my articles to be absolutely current and fresh (ie. submitted 10 minutes before deadline, and occasionally several days after it) he had to endure many a close call, but amazingly never lost his temper. He is known and trusted by everyone at the club - players, directors, sponsors, fans - and his departure will leave a gaping hole, which will be extremely difficult to fill. 


Those supporters who opted to stay away for Tuesday night's LDV win over Bury missed an unusual evening's entertainment.

Friday 24th September saw the newly named 'Edgeley Park Study Centre' play host to a number of Secondary School Head Teachers.



The Heads, from Stockport, were visiting the Centre to see a presentation on the new 'Stay On Side' project.

The aim of the project is threefold, firstly to offer secondary schools the opportunity to work with professional coaching staff from both Stockport County and Sale Sharks in an 'innovative' project linking 'education and sport'.

'Stay On Side' aims to offer students a parallel program of coaching tied in with an individually tailored program of multi media 'video editing'

Secondly, through a 'multi agency' approach aimed at tackling the everincreasing problem of drugs in society, players from both sports will be used as positive role models to inform and educate youngsters about the dangers of drugs and their consequences.

Students will then be able to use the Study Centre's 'video editing' library to create promotional anti drugs DVD's. These can be used back in schools to promote an anti drugs message. Thirdly, through a 'Healthy Eating' project aimed at educating students about the importance of a healthy balanced diet and the need for exercise, players and nutritionists from both Stockport County and Sale Sharks will offer youngsters expert help and advice and this will also tie in with a course of expert 'video editing' tuition.

The above programs are by no means definitive and are just examples. The Edgelev Park Study Centre can tailor individual programs to the needs of individual schools maximising the enormous potential professional sportsmen can offer to inspire and motivate youngsters.

Steve Southart's off the wall TV review

I'm glad to see that the Athens Paralympic games have been receiving such excellent coverage from the BBC over the past couple of weeks. What a tremendous event it has been, and what a humbling one as well. The competitors who are involved in the Games are all people that we might normally referred to as "disabled" but what an inappropriate label that is when you see the level of ability, dedication, commitment and determination on show here.

Ability - rather than disability - is certainly the key to these games. I don't know how quickly I could run 100 metres. although I suspect that you would need a calendar rather than a stopwatch to measure my effort. What I do know is that I wouldn't be able to run it inside 12 seconds if I had four legs. whereas the first three runners in the Paralympic 100m final all did so with at least one leg missing. The bronze medallist from South Africa is a double amputee. If you look at any of these athletes they have the same physique and smooth running style as any "able-bodied" athlete. (I hate the phrase but I can't think of a better one.) These guys and girls certainly put in the hours, the training is just as strenuous and the achievement in just

getting as far as competing is huge.

Make no mistake about it, the Parelympics is a huge event in its own right now, not just a sideshow to the main Olympic Games. Any future bids for the Olympics are going to have to make sure that their provisions for the Paralympic games are spot-on as well, or else they won't get the gig, which is a tremendous breakthrough for the way in which disabled people, and disabled athletes in particular, are perceived. There is talk at the moment that New York's chances of hosting the games in 2012 has been badly damaged by the fact that the Paralympics have received no television coverage at all in the US. Sorry, went off on a bit of a rant there. Anyway, yes the TV coverage by the BBC has been absolutely excellent, the punditry of Clare Balding and Colin Jackson has been professional, measured and relaxed, and the games have produced many, many special moments. By far the best moment for me was when Sophia Christiansen, a 16-year-old competing in the horse riding events, was told that she had just won a bronze medal in her first Paralympics. The unrestrained joy on her face had me beaming from ear to ear. What a moment!

Don't forget that next year, Manchester hosts the first ever Para World Cup event, which hopefully will be the first step towards establishing a series of grand prix events for disabled athletes (at the moment, the Paralympics are the only such event, so that disabled athletes only get the chance to compete against one another every four years.) Don't miss your chance in May next year to see these incredible athletes in action.

PS how sad that Barry Davies has retired from Match of the Day. The beeb have certainly under-used this consummator professional, in favour of John Motson's breathy anorakism and Jonathan Pearce's ear-bashing yodelling. Davies was perhaps considered too cerebral for the masses, a measured and intelligent commentator who never shied away from telling it as he saw it. Luckily, we have not heard the last of him as he will still be commentating on other sports for the BBC, but Match of the Day has certainly lost one of its finest observers.







Following the 5-0 mauling at Bristol City the previous week changes, particularly in defence, were inevitable but, even so, the inclusion of Danny Griffin was a real shock.

The Northern Ireland international had not kicked a ball in anger since tearing his Achilles at Blackpool back in March.


"It shows that we have a good youth set up at Edgeley Park, though, and it's good that the Gaffer is not afraid to chuck the kids in."

Former county youth starlet Zhang Xiaobin has returned to China.

The 19-year-old, who is due on trial at PSV Eindhoven, has decided to return to his native land to det some match practice before returning for trials in Europe. Xiaobin burst onto the Edgeley Park scene in October 2001 when he arrived as part of a group of underprivileged youngsters from China. Former County player Paul Jones was the first to spot his talent and before long he was training with the centre of excellence where Nigel Deeley confirmed the boy's

As he was already officially on the books of then Chinese First division club Shaanxi Guoli County had to seek permission for Xiaobin to return to the UK on a two-year youth development programme. This was agreed and the Chinese youngster soon became a popular member of the youth team ranks at County. During his time at the club he soon picked up the language thanks to support and excellent teaching from Ridge Danyers College and, in August of 2003, he returned to the Far East with the youth team for a two-game tour of Urumqi in North Western China.

HERO'S WELCOME

Xiaobin received a hero's welcome in Urumoi and has become extremely well known throughout China, as have the club. During the two games Xiaobin scored a great goal and also created one or two for his team mates to the delight of the watching scouts. Whilst the players were in Beijing waiting to return home, Xiaobin received the news that he had been selected to train with the 2004 Chinese Olympic squad.

As a result of his call up Xiaobin couldn't return to England with his team mates, instead he flew south in China to join up with the squad.

Although too young for the 2004 squad, which operates at Under-23 level, Xiaobin was told that he would be monitored with a view to him joining the 2008 squad in Beijing.

FOUR-MATCH TOUR

In May of this year Xiaobin joined the County first team for their four-match tour of China. He achieved one of his dreams by playing with the senior team in the opening three games, but then emotion got the better of him. Xiaobin couldn't face travelling to Urumqi for the last leg of the tour knowing he would then have to say his goodbyes as his time at County had come to an end





275 days into 2004, 90 days until 2005, 84 days until Christmas Day

And exactly eight years since Dave Jones' men marched into the east end of London and beat Millwall in their own back yard.

The 1996-97 season had started poorly and, after six games, the Hatters were languishing in 23rd place with just two points on the board. Rumours were rife that if County failed to beat Plymouth Argyle in their seventh game Jones would be sacked.

The Pilgrims were beaten. Jones stayed. County were on the march.

The following game County beat Sheffield United in the Coca-Cola Cup then beat York City at Bootham Crescent thanks to a couple of Brett

A wonderful 5-2 victory at Bramall Lane in the Coca-Cola second leg and a 2-1 EP victory over Gillingham then made it five wins on the bounce for resurgent County.

Jones had a full-strength squad to chose from when his side travelled to face promotion-chasing Millwall on Tuesday, October 2nd, 1996. And the 223 County fans that made the long midweek journey will all tell you that the performance was, arguably, the Hatters best ever

away from Edgeley Park in living memory. Okay, the scoreline suggests a close game. Don't you believe it. The Lions were simply outclassed by a County side oozed confidence and quality. Kieron Durkan grabbed his first Hatters goal when he prodded home Brett Angell's left-wing cross at the far post on 24 minutes.

And although Anton Rogan equalised with a 25yard bolt-out-of-the-blue four minutes later two goals from Alun Armstrong and Jim Gannon after the break underlined County's superiority. Chris Marsden provided the cross for Armstrong to head County back in front on the hour with Gannon grabbing his 50th Hatters goal, from close range after Tim Carter had falled to hold Tom Bennett's shot, three minutes later. Millwall were now chasing shadows and the visitors, wearing their black and white strip, almost grabbed a fourth goal but Durkan's piledriver bounced to safety off the underside of the bar with Carter in the home goal hopelessly beaten.

Had that shot gone in there was a feeling that County could have gone on to beat their record away win - 7-1 at Bradford City in 1965. As it happened, though, Millwall, amazingly, restored parity with two goals in three minutes. Rogan added his second on 71 minutes, a header from Bobby Bowry's well-flighted free kick, with substitute Paul Hartley volleying past Paul Jones from the left side of the penalty area for the equaliser.


With the home fans creating a quite superb atmosphere lesser sides would have buckled. Not the class of 1996-97, though. They weathered the storm and got their slick passing football going again.

And they were rewarded in the final minute when Armstrong side-footed the winner after man-ofthe-match Bennett had carved open the Lions' defence with a superb run down the right. After the game Dave Jones said: "Rodger [Wylde] turned to me after 20 minutes and said that we'd put about 17 quality crosses into the box and that's something we keep working on. "We are doing alright but we've won nothing yet. We need another 70 or 80 points.

"Alun's second goal was a great time to score!" Jones' assessment was spot on. Over the next 36 games County amassed 72 points to take their tally to 82, which secured promotion to the second tier of English football for the first time in

On the same night County were winning in London this afternoon's opponents, Swindon Town, lost 2-1 at Bradford City to leave them in 16th place in the First Division after winning promotion the previous season.

Going further back to 1937, October 2nd, was also the date of a quite fantastic victory over Tottenham Hotspur.

County had started their campaign in the old Second Division in fine style and, in their previous home game, had beaten Manchester United 1-0. Hopes of sending Spurs home empty handed, though, soon receded when the visitors opened up a 2-0 lead.

But the Hatters hit back, and how. Goals from Fred Jenkinson - the only one he scored in 295 County games - and Joe Taylor levelled the

UpClose&Personal

Following the departure of Aaron Wilbraham to Hull City, Andy Welsh is now one of our longest-serving players.

We caught up with the Scottish Under-19 international earlier this week to talk to him about all things Stockport County. Here's what he had to say.

Now Alby's gone are you the longest serving player at the club?

I think Jon Daly and Fraser McLachlan have been here a bit longer than I have. I think Jon Daly is the longest serving player at the club now.

Talk us through that memorable FA Youth Cup run in 2001?

I've got some great memories. I scored against Spurs from a free kick and I really enjoyed the game, there was a great atmosphere at Edgeley Park on the night. Then we went to Anfield and got beat 3-1 but we had some good chances and we could have won. I think we took around 2,000 fans and you could hear them chanting from the Kop – it was unbelievable.

Who was the best player you've played with at youth level?

To be honest everyone I've played in the youth team with and the ones here now are here for a reason, and that's obviously because they've got a bit of talent. It's difficult to say who is the best. Obviously Rob Clare will stand out because he's been in the England Under-21 set-up, Jon Daiy as well because he's been involved with Ireland. I rate Fraser McLachlan highly, though; he did a great job for the youth team.

Who's been the biggest influence for you at youth level?

I think at youth level it has to be Nigel Deeley when he was the youth team manager. I have to give Craig Madden a mention as well because he was the reserve team manager at the time and they both worked really well together. It's unfortunate that Nige had to go, I was really disappointed when he went because as a coach for me he was different class.

Does talk of you moving to Blackburn or Sunderland make it unsettling for you or does it work the other way?

It has been unsettling for me because I haven't been playing and sometimes you get thinking am I not playing because of what's going on or is it because the manager wants to go with something different.

People have criticised your final ball. What are your thoughts?

It's something I'm working on because I can definitely improve it.

Are you aware that you give the fans a lift when you're on the ball?

I think attacking players are always going to get the crowd going. The County fans have always given me a lift as well because they've been right behind me ever since I made my debut.

Should you score more goals?

Overall I'm disappointed with what I've produced in the first team here. If I look at the teams I've been playing in they've always been fighting relegation so I've had to hold back a little more and help the team rather than think of myself. I used to score a lot of goals but they seem to have dried up. I got two in four pre-season in four games so I know I can still do it.

Who was your toughest opponent in Division One? When we played at West Brom on New Year's Day 2002 I was up against a right wing-back, Igor Balis, and at that moment in time I wasn't strong enough to compete against him.

How do you assess the first-team managers you've played under?

I think it would be hard to disregard Andy Kilner because he gave me my first chance. Carlton Palmer definitely wasn't good for me, though, because I never really got a chance.

The new Gaffer told me at Brighton last season that he was going to give me a long run in the side which, to be fair to him, he did. I was grateful for that because it's difficult to build confidence if you're taken out of the team after one or two games. Giving me a block of games made me more than confident and I was pleased with the number of games I played last season. I thought I did well at Hull last Saturday but I need to kick on now.

What was your loan spell at Macclesfield like? I enjoyed it at Macclesfield because I played on the right and that gave me the opportunity to cut in and I managed to score a couple of goals. Dave Moss also played a defender behind me so I could attack a lot more, and that helped.

Who's your best mate at County? Michael Byrne.

Does he have any bad habits? Too many to mention!

Are you still the best runner at the club? Well it's debatable, Fraser's still hanging in there.

Who is the worst dresser?

To be fair there's only one, Luke Beckett. He's got these jeans and he thinks he's amazing in them.

second on 16 and, just two minutes later, Williams was picking the ball out of the net again after Andy Nicholas had looped a header into the top corner.





Can you spot them in the following team chosen by Geoff Thomas and Ian Watts.

JAMES KENNEDY Made 18 County appearances during the 1909-10 season in the old Second Division scoring one goal - our first-ever against Manchester City. Joined the Robins in 1912 but didn't figure at first-team level.

WILIAM COCKBURN Played twice in 1921-22 when we were crowned the very first champions of Division Three (North). Became a regular over the next two seasons before joining Swindon.

ROLAND CODLING A reserve player at Swindon, Codling joined County in 1903-04 - the season we failed to win reelection to Division Two. He then became a key figure the following season when we won the Lancashire Combination to reclaim our Football League place.

JOHN THOMAS Thomas started his career with Everton before joining Swindon. Spells with Chester and Headington United preceded his move to Edgeley Park in 1954. Jack Connor scored twice on Thomas' Hatters debut - a 5-2

MIKE SUMMERBEE Buzzer - a Swindon legend - is featured on Page 23 of today's programme. He joined County from Blackpool in August 1977 and later, following the sacking of Alan Thompson, took over as player-manager. He resigned after a 6-1 defeat at Bradford - his 716th, and final, League appearance in a highly-distinguished career. MARK ROBERTSON Robbo joined Swindon from Burnley in August 2000 but his spell in Wiltshire was a short one - just seven months later he headed north of the border to for Dundee. He scored one goal for the Robins, a 90th-minute penalty in a 3-1 home defeat by Bristol Rovers. Strangely, his one County goal came last February... against Swindon

victory over Carlisle United.

TOMMY HENDERSON After spells with St Mirren, Leeds and Bury Tommy joined Swindon in January 1966. Five months later, though, he moved to Edgeley Park and made 19 appearances as the Hatters swept all before them to win the Fourth Division championship. One of the best strikers of a ball ever seen at EP

BILL ATKINS The legend! Signed for County minutes before transfer deadline in March 1967 in a swap deal involving David Shawcross. Scored his first goal in front of 7,000 ecstatic travelling fans at Crewe and nodded the equalising goal at Notts County that secured promotion three weeks later - with SEVEN games still to play! With Jim Fryatt he formed what many County fans consider the club's greatest strike partnership.

KEITH EAST A month after Frank Lord left County for Blackburn Rovers - November 1966 - the Hatters swooped for East, Swindon's top marksman, as a direct replacement. Five months later he was picking up a Fourth Division title medal. He later served Bournemouth, Northampton and Crewe

ANDY MUTCH Andy joined Swindon in August 1993 after earning legendry status at Wolves alongside Steve Bull. He never really produced that form in Wiltshire and, after a loan spell at Wigan, Dave Jones brought him to EP in March 1996. Scored a hat-trick in his fourth County game - a 4-2 victory over Oxford. Scored 5 vital goals the following season, many after coming off the bench, to help the Hatters win promotion to Division One.


