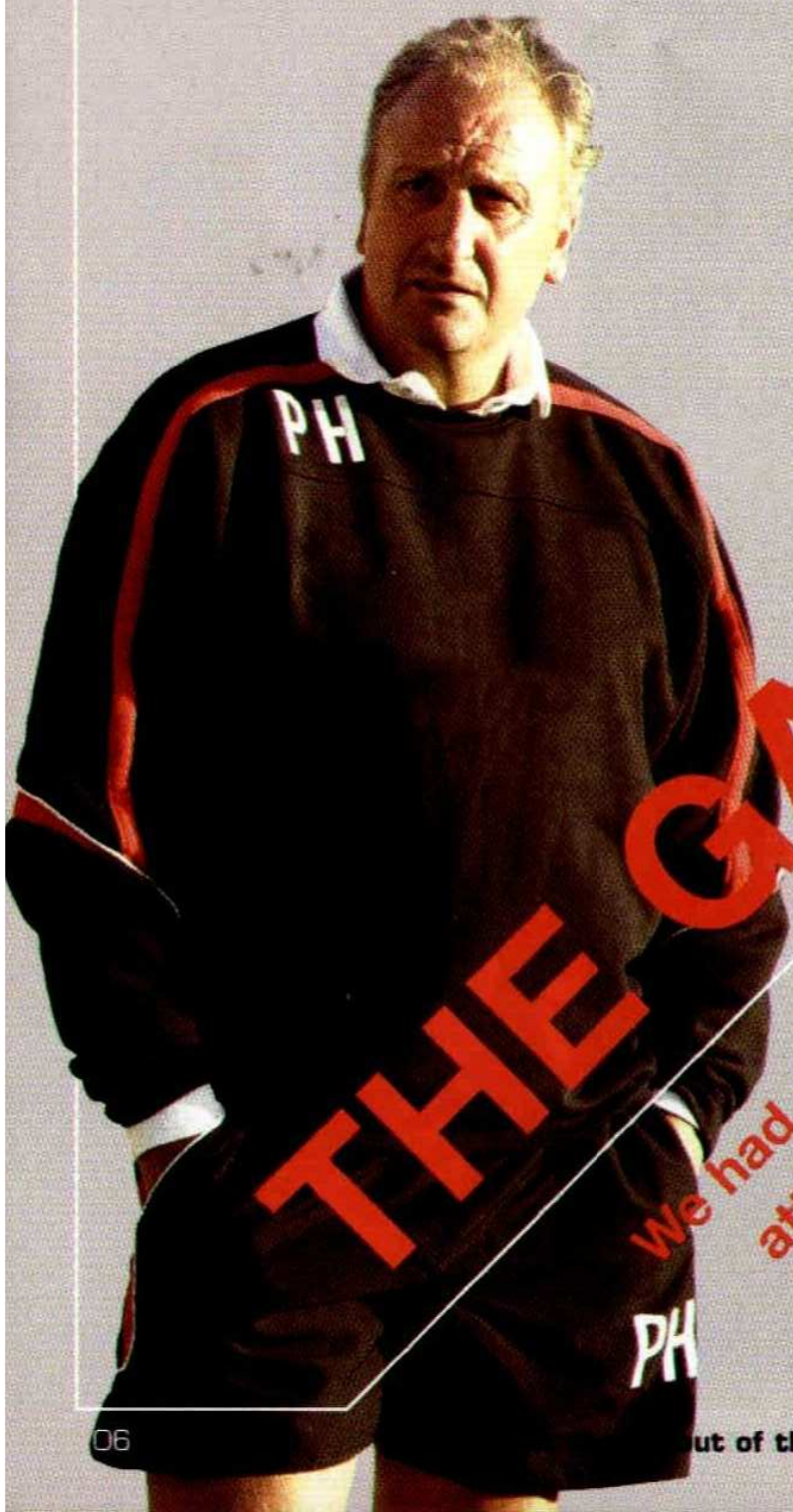

RACISM HAS NO PLACE IN FOOTBALL

JERMAINE Defoe, Sol Campbell, Shaun Wright-Philips, Ashley Cole, Rio Ferdinand, Jermain Jenas, not a bad line up to have in your side.

I have been working voluntary on the National Committee of the Football Supporters Federation for the past 12 months with a special brief to look at anti-racism issues within the game. I am working also on problems and concerns about stewarding and policing at football matches.

It is a fact that racism has decreased dramatically over the last few years at matches but it is still a problem that rears its ugly head from time to time. We have to 'Kick It Out'.

A lot of fans and people do not realise how serious the authorities view any sort of racist abuse at a football match in the modern environment.

If charged and found guilty then you face a fine of up to £5,000 for each offence, will be banned from every football stadium in the county and could even be handed a custodial sentence. That should be a deterrent in itself but it is up to supporters throughout the country to take it upon themselves to report incidents – simply tell a steward or police officer and they should act immediately on the complaint.

If you find yourself in a position where someone is aggressive then take the person's seat number and report it to a steward or the police. There are CCTV cameras in most football stadiums now.

Premiership sides are working on a racial equality standard to put in place measures that tackle under representation and ensure equality of opportunity at clubs. Many Football League clubs will do the same and are working with local communities

to ensure fans from all backgrounds are made welcome and the right stewarding and policing measures are in place.

So remember it's the colour of the shirt that counts.



LEAGUE SIGNS NEW AGREEMENT

THE Football League and The Cloud, the leading wireless broadband network operator, today announced an agreement that could see wireless broadband access installed at every Football League stadium over the next three seasons.

The initial phase will provide wireless broadband access for both the media and club employees, but the agreement will ultimately see the service expanded to a wider audience, including supporters, by making it available in club bars, conference rooms and hotels. Deployment has already begun with Nottingham Forest, Sheffield United, Port Vale and Blackpool.

Due to the growth of Internet-based news and media, speed of reporting has become vital. To date, photographers have relied on traditional runners or very slow dial-up connections to send their images back to photo-desks, both of which are costly and time-consuming processes. Reporters and photographers covering matches at these sites will now benefit from an efficient and almost instantaneous method of dispatching images and reports back to their offices.

The Cloud's service will allow users to access their networks readily at club stadia, irrespective of their chosen service provider. The Cloud's Guest Pass solution will allow clubs to issue electronic vouchers to visiting members of the press who require temporary wireless broadband access. Passes will be available on a daily, monthly or yearly basis to suit all needs. Additionally, The Cloud will facilitate a pay-as-you-go service for those requiring limited one-off access through its Pay-Go system.

Zach Leonard, Chief Operating Officer, The Cloud, said: "Our carrier-neutral model allows us to enter into roaming agreements and partnerships with the world's major service providers. Coupled with this, we have devised a highly flexible WiFi offering, which allows temporary provisioning so that the media and club staff are able to enjoy a seamless and easy-to-use experience, irrespective of whether or not they already have an existing subscription for wireless broadband services."

Chris Eagle, new media manager at The Football League, added: "We are very excited about the roll-out of WiFi at our club stadia. It is a service that will clearly benefit journalists and photographers and help them work more effectively from anywhere in the stadia. Gradually, we will make this service available to supporters and business users as well, who are increasingly interested in gaining Internet access in venues."

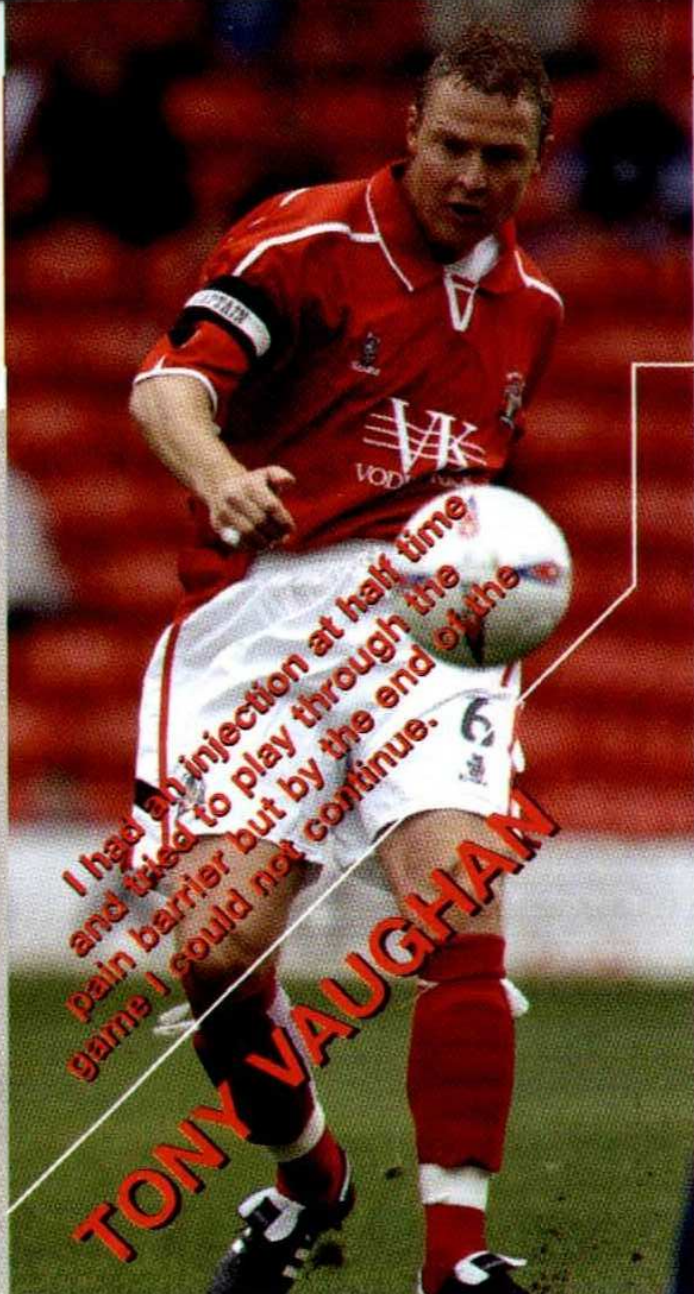

I probably should not have played against Doncaster Rovers in midweek because I picked up a bad hip injury at Sheffield Wednesday. I am struggling now but I am not the kind of person to let the side down by missing games when the team needed me to be out there. Matt Carbon, Antony Kay and Bobby Hassell have all been struggling so I wanted to play and there was not much choice in the matter.

I had an injection at half time and tried to play through the pain barrier but by the end of the game I could not continue. I am struggling for the Swindon game and I have a lot of swelling and bleeding at the moment.

The lads are a bit down after the Doncaster game but our performance going forward was a lot better than it has been. We could have been three or four up and winning comfortably with the number of clear chances we created. To be fair their goalkeeper has made a lot of world class saves to keep them in it.

We had a lot of possession and played the best attacking football we have played for a while. On another night Michael Chopra would be celebrating scoring four or five goals; Barry Conlon had a couple of chances and hit the bar; Chris Shuker could have had a couple and Daniel Nardiello created things when he came on.

I think the tackle on Stephen McPhail was an absolute disgrace. I spoke to the referee after and he said that in his opinion it was just clumsy but personally I thought it was absolutely ridiculous and John Doolan should have been sent off. You could see how appalling it was when Stephen was carried from the field on a stretcher and we all have to keep our fingers crossed that his knee injury is not as bad as it could be.

We can take a lot of positives from the Doncaster game. We have to work hard on keeping a clean sheet against Swindon and hopefully create as many chances going forward as we did on Wednesday night.



ROBBIE WILLIAMS

"I had my chance in the first team at Huddersfield and that is the kind of performance we want to take into every single game."

ACADEMY graduate Robbie Williams returned to the first team fold earlier this month after a hamstring problem and quickly found himself thrust back into the limelight at left-back.

The youngster, who turned 20 at the start of October, is one of the latest in a long line of talented players to come up through the ranks at Oakwell and made his first team debut at Brentford just over two years ago.

Although injuries hampered his early career through the Academy, Robbie is now relishing the chance of establishing himself in Paul Hart's first team plans.

Robbie said: "I had a bit of an injury a couple of weeks ago but I have worked hard to get fit again and was given my chance in the team again the other week. It is now up to me to make sure I play well to keep the shirt and repay the manager for giving me a chance.

"It has been frustrating over the last few years because of my fitness problems but I think getting a full pre-season behind me has really helped. I missed a lot through injury but I feel fitter than I have ever been. I had the chance to work through pre-season for the first time in two years so that has given me a huge boost. Fitness-wise that has made a big difference and I can see that in my game when I am going forward and tracking back to defend. It is a lot easier.

"I had my chance in the first team at Huddersfield and that is the kind of performance we want to take into every single game. We played well as a team and gelled all over the park. The two early goals settled everybody down and we went on to get a great result.

"That is what we should be doing every week. There is not a team in this league that we should fear and no-one is better than us. We have to work hard and we will dominate teams but it is up to the players to do it. If we play how we know we can then no-one should touch us.

"There is a lot of pressure on the players at the moment but we have to stick together and make

sure we get the right result in every game we play. The league is so tight at the moment and we know that with just a couple of victories we will be right in the play off picture. We have to get on a run – picking up wins will see this team go from strength to strength.

"Victories boost morale, confidence and the atmosphere in the dressing room but we just need a little luck out there at the moment. We have created chances in every game but things have not gone our way.

"Things were a bit down at the start of the week because I think every single player wanted to do so well for our supporters at Hillsborough. The performance was not as good as it should have been but we cannot dwell on it and we have to make sure we look forward and put things right.


"It is hard to put your finger on what is missing at the minute but it all boils down to confidence that wins can bring. Picking up three points will lift morale, enthusiasm and put a spring in everybody's step around the place.

"We have not conceded many goals at all over the last month or so in the league so that has to be a plus we can build on. Having said that we have not scored that many but I think we need one to go in and we will go on to get a lot more. Hopefully we can turn that corner now and move up the league.

"We have a lot of talent in the dressing room now and we have the players there to be knocking the goals in every single game but it is not happening at the moment. We are working extremely hard to put that right and hopefully we will see the benefits soon."

He added: "Swindon are next at Oakwell and that should be a great match. They are doing well in the league. We have to get at them from the off and impose our game.

"Rory Fallon was a good lad when he was here. He is a good finisher when you give him a chance so it is up to us to stop him."

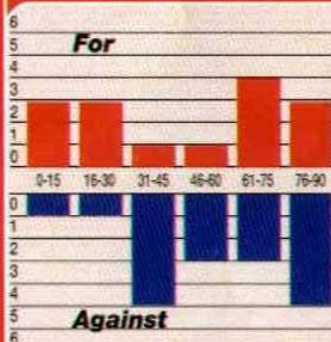

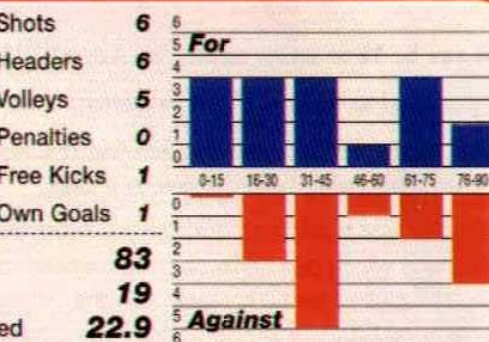

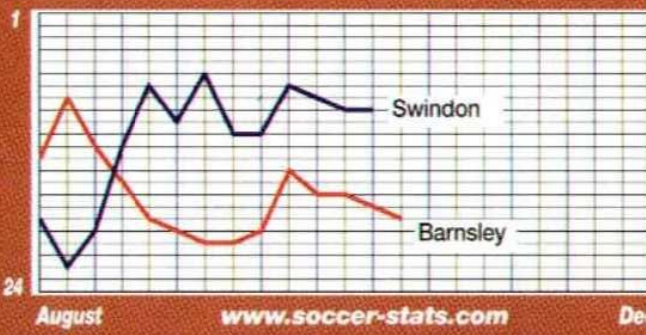

They come to Oakwell this afternoon looking to build on last Saturday's battling 1-0 success over Oldham, but manager King must fear it may be a case of one step forward and two steps back once again.

Sam Parkin's return from suspension should serve as a major boost to the Robins' hopes as he has long been their best route to goal. Sent off against Stockport a couple of weeks back, they have missed him in a position that has

been a worry for the Robins this term.

The prolific Darius Henderson was the key man in front of goal in the first weeks of the season, but after his loan spell from Gillingham came to an end and a permanent deal could not be thrashed out, the hunt for a hit-man was underway. The capture of Christian Roberts from Bristol City seems to have done the trick after his winner against Oldham last Saturday and he will be one to watch here at Oakwell today.

With a blend of youth and experience at his disposal and a team who have proved they can last the course and make the play-offs, Andy King will be hoping for big things in the next few months.

HE is a manager who expects his players to give nothing less than 100-per-cent commitment to the cause and if they allow their standards to drop, Andy King is quick to let the world know about it.

The Swindon boss proved as much with his outburst following the 3-3 draw against Stockport a couple of weeks back and you can be certain that these words were ringing around the dressing room before they were given to the media. "That was one of the worst performances I have seen from a Swindon side," fumed King.

"We need to bring in some new players to freshen things up as we cannot continue to paper over the obvious cracks in this season. Against a good side, we would have got a hammering and to achieve everything we want, there is a need to replace the players who have left recently."

The response of his team was to turn in a solid 1-0 success against Oldham last weekend and while he was not totally satisfied with the performance, he was pleased to see new boy Christian Roberts getting his first goal for the club. "It wasn't a great performance, but we have a clean sheet and three points so we have to be happy with that to an extent," was King's verdict.

"It was good to see Christian getting off the mark. Scoring a goal will give him a bit of confidence and hopefully he can go on from here and enjoy a good career at Swindon. We needed to get another striker in after a difficult few weeks, so hopefully he can solve a few problems for us.

"We have Jamie McMaster here on loan, but I'm not sure he is best employed playing in an attacking position. Christian gives me an extra option and he has that yard of pace we may have been lacking in the front line. We need to make sure we get the best out of him."

While he would prefer to be in a more prominent position at this point in the campaign, King seems content that his charges are within touching distance ahead of this trip to Oakwell. "The three points against Oldham ensured we are in there with a good shout and you cannot win anything unless you are in a position to challenge," he adds.

"We are progressing and when I look at these players on the training ground, I believe they can achieve a lot. The chance is there for them to go out and do something special, but I'm never happy with what I have got. I always want more."

If Andy King's players have a similar level of passion, then Swindon Town will not be far off the pace when the medals are handed out in May.

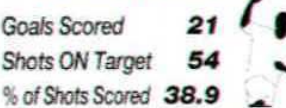

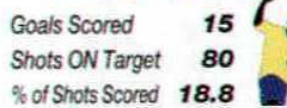

The Match

Expectations were high for a dramatic final given the personalities on opposite sides. Spurs, led by Terry Venables, had England's best, and most controversial, player in Paul Gascoigne, seeking to win his first domestic honour. Against them was the latest in a succession of Nottingham Forest sides to challenge for honours, led by Brian Clough, who was desperate to capture the only trophy that had eluded him in a phenomenal managerial career.

It was to be disappointment for both Clough and Gascoigne, although the latter did receive a winners medal. Following a couple of audacious tackles which would have been punished by a less lenient referee, Gascoigne launched into a reckless challenge on Gary Charles, and was stretchered off with a serious

knee injury after only 15 minutes.

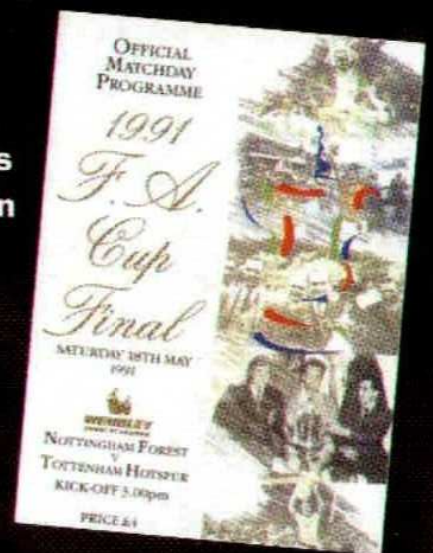
That was bad news for a troubled Tottenham club, desperate to sell him for millions of pounds to an Italian club, and for the team as Stuart Pearce scored from the resulting free kick. Spurs rallied, however, and equalised through Paul Stewart. An own goal by Des Walker in extra time saw Spurs land the cup for the eighth time - and the fifth in a year ending in a 1.

The Programme

Brochure-sized programmes had been in vogue at the Cup Final for a decade before this £4, 116 page full colour production. The card cover was semi-laminated with a cup motif over a montage of previous cup winners.

To help justify the high price, most recent Cup Final programmes come complete with a free gift. In this case, it was a "free commemorative poster" featuring artwork of both club crests and the twin towers. The sheer size of the programme meant that there was no shortage of reading material. Features included the 1941 and 1966 Cup Finals, the history of the trophy and its predecessors and other historical articles.

There was exhaustive coverage of both clubs, including action photographs of recent meetings, previous rounds, double-page team groups, features on the managers and various players. Six pages per team of pen pictures and



photos of individual players rounded off the coverage of the competing sides.

The last seventeen pages of content was a list of all that season's FA Cup results up to the third round, accompanied by photographs of previous winners and old players. Although an interesting statistical compilation, it was better suited to a Yearbook than the Cup Final programme, where it served as little more than an obvious space-filler.

Nevertheless, there could be no denying the value for money in this substantial brochure, and there was plenty to read to while away the pre-match hours, and journey home. This particular Cup Final programme sold out on the day, and has subsequently proved to be difficult to obtain. Copies rarely emerge on the market, and when they do, they sell for more than £25 each.

TWO GAMES FROM THE 1960/61 SEASON

THE 1960/61 season saw Barnsley and Swindon in the Third Division.

Due to cup commitments the first meeting of the clubs did not take place until mid March.

Barnsley had had a successful FA Cup run that had taken them to the sixth round, however, it meant a backlog of league fixtures. They were in mid-table with 36 points from 31 games and had little chance of promotion but no chance of relegation. However, Oakwell was something of a fortress and only one of 14 league games had been lost with 10 wins taking place during those games.

Swindon on the other hand were in need of the points for with only 28 points from 33 games and in the thick of the relegation battle. They must have arrived at Oakwell with some trepidation for as good as Barnsley's home record was their away record was worse. In 17 away games they had only won one.

The strength of the Barnsley team was their ability to score goals and it took them only ten minutes to find the target. It came from a man who was excellent in the air. KEN OLIVER was the man in question but on this occasion it was a simple tap in.

It gave Barnsley the confidence they needed and they

proceeded to dominate the match. What was surprising was that they managed only one more goal in the first half. This time it was local boy FRANK BEAUMONT who netted.

The crowd of seven and a half thousand gave them a huge ovation when they left the field at half time and readied themselves for more of the same. However, Swindon came out fast after the break and within two minutes were back in the match when ERNIE HUNT scored. The game changed totally with Swindon, who had not been seen as an attacking force in the first half, going forward more and more. Both players and fans of Barnsley seemed to become more and more nervous. With passes going astray it was an occasion when skipper DUNCAN SHARP and his fellow defenders stood up to take the plaudits as they hung on to take maximum points.

The first half ended goalless and was highlighted by the battle between Swindon's highly rated young centre-forward MIKE SUMMERBEE and Barnsley's hard man DUNCAN SHARP. After the break Swindon still went forward and were rewarded five minutes into the half when HUNT was again the marksman.

Finally Barnsley were able to get into the match but were unable to find a way through the Swindon defence and Town held on comfortably.

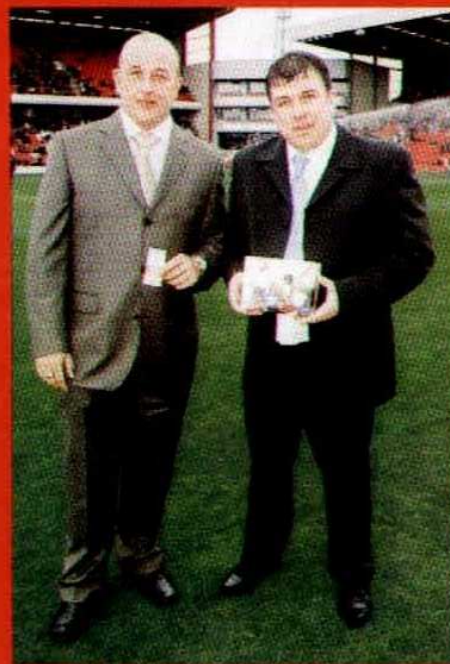

LAW FIVE - THE REFEREE

1. If a referee is struck in the face by the ball, which then enters the goal while he is temporarily incapacitated, should a goal be allowed although he has not seen it scored?

Yes, but only if, in the opinion of the assistant referees, the goal was properly scored.

2. During a match, an object thrown by a spectator hits the referee or one of the assistant referees or a player. Play is stopped for this person to receive medical attention. May the referee continue the match?

Depending on the severity of the incident, the referee may allow the match to continue, suspend play or abandon the match. He must report the incident(s) to the appropriate authorities.

3. Is the referee authorised to stop play if, in his opinion, the floodlights are inadequate?

Yes.

4. Some matches are played under floodlights. When the floodlights fail, does the match have to be replayed in its entirety or only for the remaining time of play if the lighting cannot be repaired?

If, for any reasons mentioned under Law 5, the referee terminates a match before normal time, it must be replayed in its entirety unless the rules of the competition provide for the score to be valid at the time the match was abandoned.

5. Can a captain send off one of his team-mates for serious misconduct?

No. Only the referee can send off a player from the field of play.

6. Does a team captain have the right to question a decision of the referee?

No. Neither the captain nor any other player has the right to show disagreement with a decision taken by the referee.

7. The referee applies advantage but the anticipated advantage does not develop. May he penalise the original offence?

Yes, but only if the anticipated advantage does not ensue immediately (as a guideline within three seconds).

8. A player is guilty of a cautionable or sending off offence, but the referee allows play to continue to give an advantage to the opposing team. When should the player be cautioned or sent off?

He should be cautioned or sent off whenever the ball next goes out of play.

9. A referee allows the match to continue when a player is guilty of a cautionable offence. Play is then stopped to award a free kick in favour of the team against whom the initial offence was committed. A player takes the free kick quickly to gain an advantage. Is this permitted?

No. The referee does not allow the kick to be taken quickly. A caution is administered to the initial offending player before play is restarted.

10. Can the referee show yellow or red cards during the half-time interval?

Yes.

10.1. Can the referee show yellow or red cards after the match is finished?

No. The referee would report the misconduct to the appropriate authorities.

11. What should a referee do if the two captains agree to forego the half-time interval but one of the players insists on his right to take an interval?

Players have a right to an interval and the referee must grant it.

12. Is the referee empowered to order team officials away from the boundary lines of the field of play?

Yes. The referee has the right to take such measures even if the match is being played on public ground.

13. A team official is guilty of irresponsible behaviour. What action does the referee take?

He will send the official from the technical area and its vicinity, behind the boundary fences (where such a fence exists). The referee will report his conduct to the appropriate authorities.

14. An assistant referee signals that the ball has passed over the touch line, but before the referee has declared the ball out of play, a defending player inside the penalty area strikes an attacking player. What action should the referee take?

The defending player is sent off for violent conduct and shown the red card. The referee restarts the match with a throw-in since the ball was out of play when the offence occurred.

15. What action should a referee take against a player who lights a cigarette or uses a mobile phone during the game?

He cautions the player for unsporting behaviour.

16. How should a referee react if, during the course of a match, he realises that one of the teams is deliberately trying to lose? Should he draw the attention of the team in question to the fact that if they continue to play in that way, he will terminate the game in accordance with the provisions of Law 5?

The referee has no right to stop the match in this case.

17. While the ball is in play, two opposing players commit offences at the same time. What action does the referee take?

He stops the play, and depending on the offences, cautions or sends off the players, or takes no disciplinary action. The match will be restarted by a dropped ball, from the place where the ball was when the offences were committed.

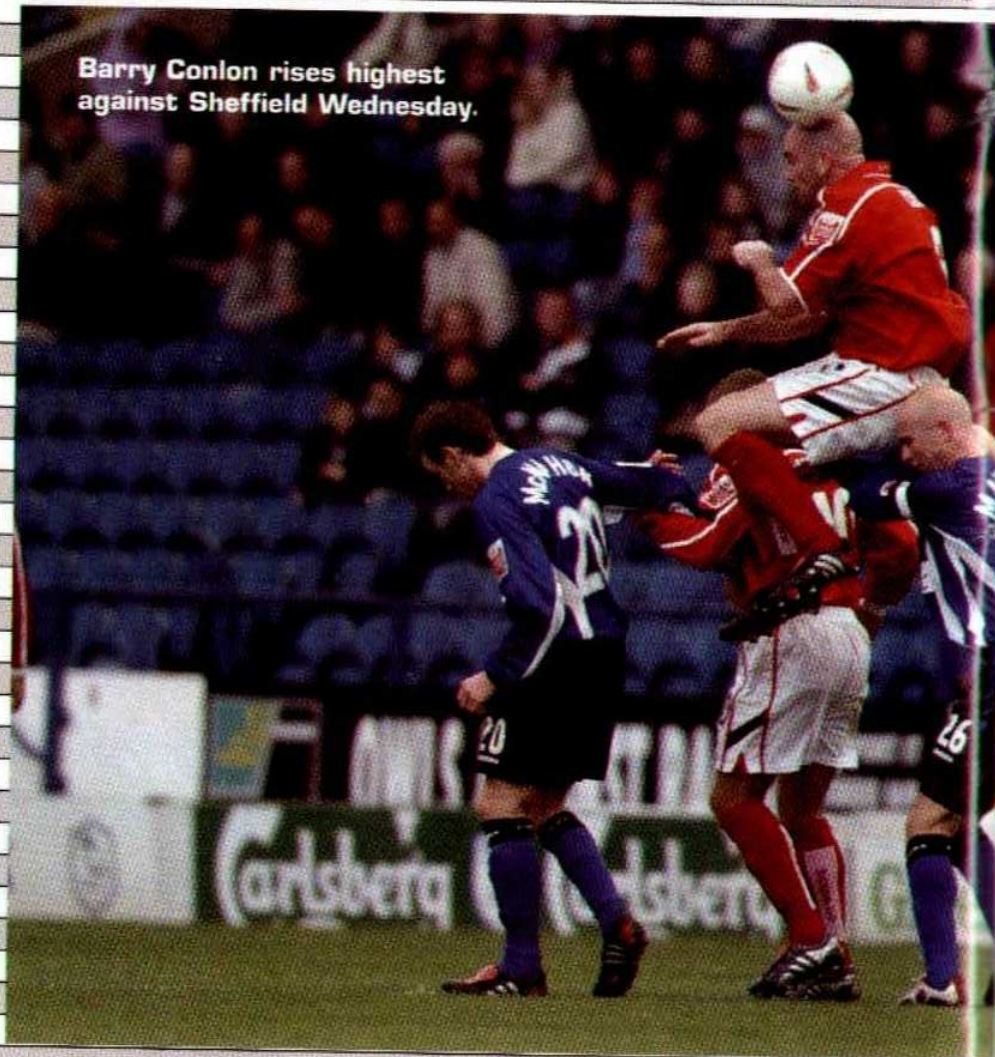

I KNEW the phone would ring eventually. After working with Benny Hill for one season I edited Oakwell Review, I knew sooner or later he would ask me to contribute to the original Stop Press column.

Benny is not a man you turn down, such is his persuasive nature, so I knew when he did call it would be on an occasion when I had no time to prepare something decent and, as predicted, just as I was packing for a holiday - which I am now on as you read this - the phone did ring.

"Can't Parky do it?" I asked, knowing all too well Benny's obsession with finally managing to get Michael Parkinson to write in the programme.

The reply was somewhat muffled, but I think the answer was that Michael was unable to help out for the 4,000th or so consecutive weekend. Keep trying Benny. If Parky can move from the Beeb after umpteen years, I'm sure he can find time during the commercials to pen a few words.

Anyway, having promised to have 400 or so words of "clean, crisp copy" on Benny's doorstep before I boarded the plane, my thoughts turned to what I could write about.

Fortunately, I can say I have first-hand knowledge of what it is like to play for a team that Paul Hart manages.

He was my boss for three seasons at Leeds United. During my time there as a junior and first year professional, my team-mates included Harry Kewell, Ian Harte, Stephen McPhail, Paul Robinson and Ireland international Alan Maybury.

It was a pretty good set up at Leeds, as two FA Youth Cups in Paul's time in charge shows.

We played a style of football that was breathtaking to watch, and equally breathtaking to play. It is common now for numerous footballs to be around the pitch so a ball is readily available to restart play.

We were doing that more than ten years ago. It used to drive the opposition mad at our home matches with the speed we took throw-ins and corners after a defender had hoofed the ball a mile off the pitch.

Paul demanded that we were brave footballers. Not in just putting our head in where it hurts, that's taken for granted, but in playing in areas where we had no right to play; taking people on when most coaches would be screaming at you to pass and never being afraid of showing the ability with which we had been blessed.

It was hard work, but it was fun. Some of the lads made it, and some of them became writers! I hope that today the Reds play without fear, and are brave enough to believe in the ability which has made them footballers.

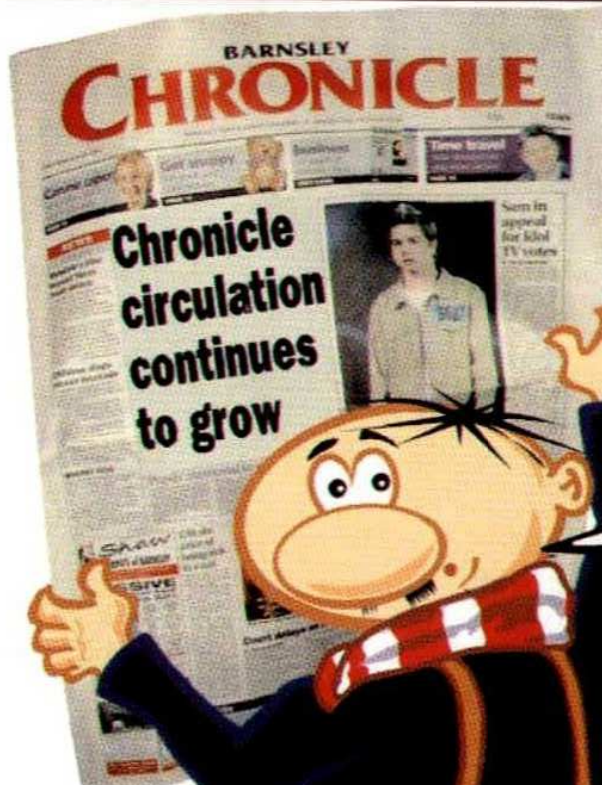
