C heffield Wednesday Preached Wembley in 1993 when they finished as FA Cup runners-up to current Premiership champions Arsenal. It goes without saying that the gulf between these two great clubs has opened a little since that day over 10 years ago.

However, Owls fans will be hoping that, like Millwall last season, this could be their year again. Wednesday boast a good record in the competition with 6 appearances in the final and 3 victories although the last of these was 69 years ago.

Wednesday began last season's competition with a 4-0 win over our Wiltshire neighbours Salisbury City before losing over two games to Scunthorpe. Late goals by N'Dumbu-Nsungu and Holt rescued the game for the Owls at Glanford Park but in the replay at Hillsborough Scunthorpe came out surprise winners 3-1 on penalties.

The Cup may prove to be a useful distraction for Paul Sturrock and his side who only recently ended their 5-game run without a win. The defeats to Bradford and Town were followed by a home draw with Chesterfield and a 3-0 away win at lowly Stockport. This leaves the Owls in 12th place in League One.

choice for Wednesday.


He is a frontman who is adept at getting on the end of chances in and around the penalty area.

sk a football supporter how many games his club needs to win to become FA Cup winners and his answer will vary considerably dependent on the club he favours. Today is officially FA Cup first round day, but for some the road to the final began anything up to six rounds ago.

The extra preliminary round is followed by the preliminary and then four qualifying rounds before today, and it's a measure of a club's seniority whether they join at the very start or not until the third round next January.

The last quarter of a century has seen Swindon play at all of the top four levels but have competed in round one in 13 of the last 25 years, and there have




been some notable results, both favorable and negative.

The widest margin of victory took place at Kettering in 1983. Then six Town scorers. including Charlie Henry, Andy Rowland and two from Jim Quinn gave Town a 7-0 win against the Alliance Premier League side, now known as the Conference.

There have been fours recorded against Brentford in 1979, at Farnborough in 1986, at home to Cambridge in 1995 and at the County Ground against Ilkeston in 2000.

But there have been low moment too. After a 0-0 draw here in 1985 against Bristol City, the Ashton Gate Robins were lucky enough to win the replay 4-2. Goals from Chris Ramsev and Lee Barnard were not sufficient to take Town to the second round.

Then there was the disaster that was Swindon's FA Cup 'campaign' of 1984. Claiming a 0-0 draw at Dagenham, Town were confident for the replay and an Alan Mayes first half goal

set Lou Macari's men on their way. Then an equaliser took the tie to extra time, a period that resulted in elimination by the Gola League team (yes, that's the Conference again) by 2-1.

In 1981, Town recorded a 2-1 win in an away tie with Taunton without leaving Wiltshire. The Somerset side switched their home draw to the County Ground to claim higher gate receipts, but perhaps regretted the move by the end of that November day.

All told Town have registered 37 goals in Round One of the FA Cup in the 13 matches over the last 25 years and only three of the 13 have ended in early elimination. Impressive stuff.

But most recently Town capitulated by 4-1 to Wycombe Wanderers at this stage last season in Tony Adams' first game in charge, and sadly this was the widest margin of defeat that we've suffered.

The proportion of the crowd that's cheering on Swindon today will be hoping that results like that are not a newly developing trend.

Swindon Town were somewhat fortunate to not go a goal down in the first five minutes when a slip by Scott Doe let Yeovil in for their first chance of the game.

Dale Williams profited on the mistake and drilled the ball towards the bottom left hand corner, but the outstretched hand of Town keeper James Morse kept the ball from going in. The goalmouth scramble that followed saw a rebounded effort strike a glut of Town defenders on the goal line and thankfully the ball was cleared to safety.

The home sides first chance fell to Lance Lewis who produced a nice turn and shot on seven minutes but his curling effort towards the right hand post was well saved by Danny Barker in goal for the visitors.

The front pairing for Yeovil started brightly and could have snatched an early lead when a

quick curling free kick from Dale Williams forced Jamie Morse to scramble across his goal line. Fortunately for Town, Morse did enough to reach the shot and turn it behind for a corner.

In the twenty-eighth minute Justyn McKay was unfortunate to see his deflected drive squirm past the post at the last moment. Lance Lewis had used his pace to burst past the Yeovil defence and set up McKay but his edge of area shot took a wicked deflection on the way to goal and veered away to relative safety.

Just before the break Ashan Holgate did well to cause panic in the





he picked up the loose ball in the area. Whilst battling for the ball in a melee of players, Holgate managed to turn the ball back to Chris Allen whose fierce drive was well parried by Danny Barker to keep the scores level at the break.

The second half began with some promising attacks from the Town forwards and Holgate should have probably opened the scoring when he was put clean through by a deep long ball. Skipper Leigh Henry dropped the ball behind the Yeovil defence for Holgate to run onto and faced with a tight angle the resulting shot was only straight at the goalkeeper.




oday, for the first time, I've employed the services of a ghost writer. Well, employ is an overstatement, because no money is changing hands!

Since I've already written notes for a match between these two teams this season, enjoy a different perspective from my 16-year-old nephew Richard Adams (pictured in the new STFC shirt, his reward for excellent GCSE results in the summer):

The first time I ever watched a football match was Swindon v. Sheffield Wednesday at the County Ground. It was an evening kickoff on Easter Monday 1994 and Swindon were sitting firmly at the foot of the Premiership, six points adrift of Oldham Athletic and Sheffield United. We had just played the four best teams in the League in a row, Newcastle. Manchester United. Blackburn and Arsenal and although Swindon managed to pick up a point against both Man. Utd. and the Gunners (at Highbury), it seemed that only a miracle would keep us in the top flight. We went down 1-0 thanks to a late Sheffield Wednesday strike, which virtually sealed our fate - sadly, we didn't get that miracle we so desperately needed.

The next time I saw Swindon v. Sheffield Wednesday, more than nine years later, the mood of the Town had changed. It was August 9th and there was hope and optimism in the air. It was one of the hottest days in the history of Britain, just under 40 degrees Celsius, and the fans were entering the stadium eagerly anticipating the start of the new second division season. It was a self-out crowd for Swindon against the newly-relegated Sheffield Wednesday. The buoyant mood of the day once more turned sour, this time not because of the prospect of relegation, but under completely different circumstances. as news of the tradic death of on-loan star Jimmy Davis in the early hours of that morning filtered through. Chants of "There's only one Jimmy Davis" rang out from the Town End and the fact we lost 3-2 with a very disappointing first-half didn't seem so important. Maybe the players had




other things on their minds. That match saw the introduction of Sammy Igoe who scored on his debut.

The last away match between the two sides was at Hillsborough at the start of the year. which saw a certain Mr. T. Mooney, also in his first (and last) season at the County Ground. score the Town's only goal in a 1-1 draw during the great 11-match unbeaten run.

The Swindon v. Sheffield Wednesday midweek

kick-off on 27th October 2004 saw the rain beating down on to the floodlit County Ground pitch and at half-time the performance, weather and scoreline were all depressing. After the break, there was worse to come as the visitors doubled the lead. However, two inspiring substitutions by Andy King saw an amazing revival as the Town put three past the 'keeper in 11 minutes in front of the wet Wednesday fans on the Stratton Bank to make the final score 3-2.



Alan Reeves







Town's longest serving member of the playing staff on his career and the FA Cup...

t's Wednesday night and all hell appears to be breaking loose in the Reeves household, "The kids have been keeping me on my toes this evening," laughs our Alan as he tries to talk football over his screaming siblings. As well as his new coaching duties, it seems as though the 37-year old has his hands full at home too...

It's been a welcome day on the golf course for our Reevesy. Ever since switching to the other side of the white line having joined the Gaffer's coaching staff the former Wimbledon defender has been busy adapting to life behind the scenes. Longer hours and an increasing number of off-field

duties - it's been a steep learning curve for the one the masses like to call 'Reeeeeeeeeeeee'.

Still, the Birkenheadborn defender has never been afraid of hard work and his career has been encapsulated by overcoming obstacles. Ever since he was disregarded as a brighteyed apprentice at Norwich, Reeves was hell bent on clawing his way back to the top. An extremely successful spell at Rochdale (via Chester and a loan spell at Gillingham) saw him do just that and in the year Town were relegated from the Premiership he signed for Wimbledon. After four years of proving the critics wrong by help keeping the unfashionable Dons in

the Premiership Reeves signed for the Town.

Reeves' spell at the County Ground has probably seen him overcome his greatest battles. Unfavoured by Colin Todd in the summer of 2000, Reeves worked hard to keep his place in the side and in the 2001/02 he enjoyed his best season in the club's colours, finishing runners up to the impressive Steve Mildenhall in the Player of the Year Competition. Then, having won the fans over with a series of combative and committed performances - he embarked on his latest challenge, coaching. And in typical Reevesy fashion, he appears to be taking it all in his stride...

A year later Chelsea knocked us out at home, but the annoying thing was, despite only having a squad of 18, I didn't even make the bench!



We haven't seen much of you on the playing side this season, are you enjoying your coaching responsibilities?

I'm getting more and more used to it. There are difficult elements to it and to be honest, the most awkward thing is having to distance myself from the players. I used to have a laugh and be the life and soul of the dressing room, but now I have to be less of a mate and more of a coach!

Has the transition from player to coach been difficult?

It's hard. Yet if you ask any manager, any coach in the country - they'd all still play if they could. The Gaffer's no different - he's 48 but he'd love to still be out there. I still think I can do a job but I'm under no illusions; I'm here to step in if required because the younger lads playing at the moment are capable of doing the best job. My role now is to do as much coaching as possible and develop that side of my game.

A lot of former Town players are doing well in management. Does that inspire you to follow that route in your own career?

I never played with the likes of Martin Ling or Colin Calderwood, but I see them out and about, I speak to David Kerslake a lot; he's at Northampton as Colin's number two and a few years ago we did a UEFA coaching badge together. I often see Lingy about scouting or at other games. I bumped into Ian Culverhouse with Lingy not so long ago, I used to play with him as an apprentice at Norwich - it's amazing whom you bump into in the football circle!

Has your daily routine changed, and how has the Gaffer helped you since you've started coaching?

It's been an eye opener, especially when you see what happens behind the scenes. When I was a player, and the lads are the same now, you're whole day is mapped out for you. You turn up, play football and have


a laugh before you go home and enjoy the rest of the day. Now I get in early, but the Gaffer never stops. Dealing with finances, the Board, and transfers - players don't get to see that side of his work. Andy's been great with me, what you see is what you get with him. He's very passionate and wants to win every game. But he also likes people like himself around him he doesn't like false people and I think that's why we get on - he knows he can trust me.

Two of your former Swindon team-mates have also returned to the club, lan Woan and Iffy Onoura - it must be a close team behind the scenes now?

Iffy's come back from Walsall as Youth Development Officer. He's a very intelligent guy and very experienced - he's got six months of coaching Walsall's first team behind him and so will be a good addition to the club. Ian's still learning, but he couldn't wish for a better mentor than Iffy. I've known Woany for 30 years,







we used to play for the same boys club together in Birkenhead and so we get on very well. We're all mates together and it's a very close backroom team. Even Walshy - I played under him when Steve McMahon and Jimmy Quinn were here. He also tried to sign me for Bury when I was at Rochdale; like I said, it's funny who you meet again in the football circle!

Are there many young players coming through at reserve level?

Last year Michael Pook and Luke Garrard played for the first team in the LDV Trophy - and they're both at the stage now where they really need to kick on and become more involved with the first team because they're at that age. They both have great ability and a good attitude. Andy Caton is

the sort of player we've not had at this club in my time here. He was playing (and scoring) for the first team without even having played for the reserves! He has a good footballing background and a tunnel vision; he only wants to succeed - nothing phases him. It's difficult for the younger players because there aren't as many reserve games these days - but they'll get their chance in the LDV and if they do

well then the Gaffer will play them, he's proved that already.

Today's first team is a tough one for the first round - what would it mean to go on a good cup run this year, it's been a while?!

A good cup run provides a club like ours with crucial revenue and if you get to the third or fourth round the sky's the limit.

What are your fondest memories of playing in the FA Cup?

I remember playing against Liverpool for Wimbledon in a replay - we did the hard part and drew the first leg at Anfield and then lost 2-0 at home. John Barnes and Ian Rush scored the goals that day. A year later Chelsea knocked us out at home, but the annoying thing was, despite only having a squad of 18, I didn't even make the bench! I was really annoved - it would have been a great chance to play against Zola and co.

We seem to have played well for the last 20 minutes against Wednesday in the recent league win? Is

it frustrating not being able to play like we can consistently?

If I could tell you why we can't I'd be the Gaffer's best mate for ages! I think there are many young players in the league this year and that could be behind a lot of teams' inconsistency. A young player will play well for two or three games and then go off the boil whereas a more experienced player will be more consistent. Because of that a lot of teams are having a frustrating campaign.

We've conceded a few goals in recent weeks too...

It's easy for everyone to blame the defence - everyone does it. But we're an attacking team and defending starts in attack - the whole team is responsible for leaking goals.

Wednesday are another team that probably feel it belongs in the Championship, But what do you make of MK Dons' fall from grace?

Once you go down it's difficult to stop - it's hard to get out of that losing mentality. That's often why you see teams that have come up, go up again because winning is their habit. Everyone expected us to go straight back up when we came down in 2000, but it's not an easy league to fight your way out of. To be honest I don't recognise the Wimbledon team from the one I used to be a part of. I went to watch AFC Wimbledon with some old lads a few weeks ago; Robbie Farle, Peter Fear and Marcus Gayle, and we all pledged our support to them because they're showing the Wimbledon spirit. They're building up from the bottom, much like Wimbledon did in the 80's and I feel that whatever happens to MK Dons, the franchise or whatever, will be what they deserve.

Norwich City, the club you started life as an apprentice - they're on the rise - but can they stay in the top flight?

I played golf with Efan Ekoku this week and he does a lot of work for BBC interactive with Norwich. He seems to think they play some nice stuff but they're not that strong - they'll find it tough.

Reeves - used to be young once!

Goals from Leon Constantine and Martin Gritton gave Torquay a much-needed win over Oldham.


Port Vale came from behind to secure an impressive 2-1 win at Barnsley.



Rob Hartley On The Run

Imost exactly ten years ago today, November 15th 1994, came one of the most defining moments in an amazing record.

Italian side Ascoli played host to Swindon Town in the Anglo-Italian Cup with Chris Hamon scoring for the Robins in a 3-1 defeat. 30 hardy souls made the trip from Wiltshire to support their team that night, and the journey to Italy helped ensure that a decade later one of the clubs most loval supporters would have the opportunity to attend his 1000th consecutive first team game.

Rob Hartley, Swindon born and bred celebrated his remarkable achievement at the LDV Vans Trophy victory over Exeter City less than a fortnight ago, carrying on an amazing sequence of games that began way back in 1986.

"The run began at the end of the 1985/86 season, the old Fourth Division championship season," Rob explains. "The last game I missed was the second to last game of that season which was away to Halifax. So the first game in the run was the final game which was the 1-0 win against Crewe that got us the 102 points and the record".

Before his current incredible run of games, today being number 1002 on the bounce, Rob, 35, had already been watching Town since the age of six.


"I used to watch with my Dad who is the one responsible for all this. My cousin Geoff Chalklin was a squad member in the late 70's who made two or three appearances and that was how my Dad got me interested initially. We had season tickets for the home games for many years until I got to college when I thought it was time to branch out a little bit. A few of my mates went to some away games and I said I would join them which was the start of the run really."

So, with the notorious British motorway system, how close has he come to missing a game during the last 18 years?

"We always try and get to the game between 12.30pm and 1.00pm so there shouldn't be a problem but we've had them in the past. Early in the run we had a home game with Shrewsbury on a Tuesday night and I was in Manchester for the day. I got a train to Gloucester for a connection that would have got me into Swindon for 7pm. However there was a tree on the line leaving no trains back to Swindon so I did the only thing possible and got a taxi."

Rob has a host of similar stories highlighting just how well he's done to avoid missing a single game over nearly two decades.





to be a terminal end to the run as they were re-developing the ground at the time and out of a 33,000 capacity they had 32,500 season ticket holders. There were certainly no tickets for away fans. We got to find out that they were putting 250 tickets on general sale on Monday morning and as soon as I heard that, that was it. Four of us went up to St. James Park on the Sunday night to camp out and make sure we got a ticket. That was a cold old night blowing through the streets of Newcastle on a Sunday evening."

Amazing dedication to the cause ensured Rob got his ticket and made it back to Tyneside the following weekend to witness the Robins 7-1 thrashing by a rampant Toon.

During the 1000 games Rob has seen many

with Scunthorpe, Yeovil and Macclesfield yet to be added. He has been lucky enough to witness the most eventful period in the club's history with 5 promotions, 3 relegations, 3 play-off finals and one forced demotion.

4-1 down with 30 minutes left and then Hoddle totally changes the course of the game by making two substitutions and changing his formation. And we blitzed them 6-4 with Mitchell's hat-trick.

Its not always the wins that stick in the memory as Rob also recalls a few defeats that left a lasting impression.


"You always remember the real good ones, but vou also remember the real bad ones as

always stay in the memory as well as the 6-0 at Middlesbrough on a Tuesday evening because that was a very, very long way home that night."



For a man who simply loves watching Town play he is proud to have reached the magic figure but sees no reason to stop now.

"For the last few seasons the target has been to get to 1000 because that in itself has got its own personal sense of pride about it, but we'll just keep going and see how far we can go."





After a look around the Spurs Megastore we boarded the coach







Ground:






Saturday 20th November KickOff 3.00pm

fter a break from Athe league this afternoon with the FA Cup, the next game at the County Ground is against Hull City next Saturday 20th November.

Hull made the step up from what was then Division Three last season, finishing runners-up to Doncaster Rovers, Manager Peter Taylor has been at the club since October 2002 and he used last summer to prepare his squad for League One with a major overhaul.

Out went half a dozen players, amongst them, Jamie Forrester who joined Bristol Rovers and goalkeeper Alan Fettis, unusually the



scorer of two League goals, who moved on to Macclesfield.

In came even more. including Nicky Barmby from Leeds United and Aaron Wilbraham who cost £100,000 from Stockport County, One man who knows the County Ground well is Junior Lewis (pictured above) who arrived on a free transfer from Leicester City. He made around 15 Ioan appearances at Swindon from two spells over the last two seasons.

With average crowds of around 16,000 City are the second best supported club in the division and enjoy the financial benefits that come with such large attendances. That brings high expectations, and there are many who believe City are finally on their way to realising their potential.

The last time the

clubs met in League competition at the County Ground was at this level in 1995/96. Town won 3-0 and finished top while Hull finished bottom. Before that, still in Division Two but when that was just a division below the top flight, Town won 3-1 in 1990/91 and Hull finished bottom again.

Hull City supporters will be hoping that's a trend that can be reversed.


