





Transfer News

Andy King has confirmed that midfielder Steve Robinson will not be leaving the club just yet. after a proposed move to Kidderminster Harriers could not be agreed.

Robbo, the subject of much speculation with Notts County reportedly in the hunt for his signature, travelled

to Aggborough last week to check out the surroundings.

After much discussion it was decided that Robinson would not be departing the County Ground, confirmed by King last week:

"They didn't feel that they wanted him at this point in the season. I thought Robbo would

have been the perfect player they needed to help them out, given the situation there are in.

"Robbo will stay with us for the time being but it is no secret that he looking at other options, but until that time comes he remains an important player for me in the squad."

In other news, Leeds United attacking midfielder Jamie McMaster has joined Barry Fry's Peterborough United on a month's loan.

It is the 22-year-old's fourth loan spell away from Elland Road, with his most recent stint coming back in September at Swindon Town.

The attacker, who can play as a striker or on either side of midfield. has failed to start a match for The Whites this season.

On Suspension

Jerel Ifil misses out on this afternoon's encounter with Stockport County after picking up his fifth booking of the season at Brentford.

The yellow card he received against The Bees went largely unnoticed, but a further look into his disciplinary record shows that the centre back has now amassed five yellow cards.

The main area of doubt was the sending off against Huddersfield Town on Wednesday 8th December at the County Ground.

Ifil was in fact booked before his eventual sending off following an altercation with Terriers striker Pavel Abbot - which saw him receive a straight red. He has been booked in four other games: the games at Colchester, Stockport, Chesterfield, and last weekend at Griffin Park.

The 34 year old played more than 250 games as a professional but he is now turning out for







The match originally scheduled for Saturday 26th March has been switched to Bank Holiday Friday afternoon with a 3pm kick off after both clubs came to an agreement.


England face Northern Ireland on the Saturday and Town face local rivals Bristol City the following Monday, so it was decided to bring the game forward by 24 hours.



BoardroomTalk

Director Bob Holt talks about recent behind the scenes activity and gives us his thoughts ahead of today's game...



Disappointing as it was to lose to Southend United last Tuesday night we must remember we are only eight points off the 'Play-Offs' and must now focus on the League. We still have 16 games to go of which 8 are at the County Ground. With at total of 48 points to play for we are very much in the hunt.

Off the pitch we have, over the last ten days, experienced considerable financial difficulty, the details of which has been well chronicled in the local media. As I explained at the AGM last year, the Club with the current liabilities has a trading deficit of around 750K per annum. The Board has examined every possible area in an attempt to make additional savings but short of cutting Andy King's playing budget there is precious little else can be done to reduce the overheads any further.

However, for the moment, the current crisis has been averted and by the time you read these notes the money outstanding to both the Inland Revenue and The Customs & Excise will have been

paid. The Will's Family, with our development partner St Modwen, has brokered a deal that, for this season, will ensure the Club meets its financial obligations as they fall due.

The Board recognise that, without a New Stadium, and the additional revenue that this will generate, the Club would struggle financially to balance its books. Basically the solution is simple, having reduced expenditure to a minimum, more income is the only solution.



t's been a tough season for Stockport County. After narrowly avoiding the drop last term the Edgeley Park club have found this campaign even more of a slog.

Four wins and 3 managers tells its own story, but recently appointed boss Chris Turner will be hoping to rally his troops for a late run over the coming months that will lift County away from the bottom of the table.

Five defeats in the first six games saw County begin the season in the worst possible fashion, Ex-Northern Ireland boss Sammy McIlroy was unable to improve on this form as a further eight defeats before the end of November cost him his job.

Assistant Manager Mark Lillis stepped up into the role of Caretaker-Manager whilst the search was on for a new permanent boss and just before Christmas ex-Sheffield Wednesday and Hartlepool manager Chris Turner was appointed. Shortly after Lillis parted company with the club as part of a re-structure.

Turner has been in charge for six games now and has witnessed a solitary victory over Torquay at Plainmoor emphasising that a lot of work has to be done by the coaching staff to maintain County's current status as a League One side.


Born in Belfast striker Feeney began his career as a trainee at Leeds United in the summer of 1998 at the age of 17. Unfortunately with a large squad, the chances of breaking into the first team were virtually impossible and Feeney was loaned to Bournemouth to gain experience.

Cherries manager Sean O'Driscoll was impressed by what he saw in the two month loan spell as Feeney scored 4 times in 10 appearances, prompting the

Bournemouth boss to sign the frontman on a free in June 2001.

Over the next three vears Feeney really made his name on the south coast as he notched up 33 goals in 115 appearances for the Cherries becoming a firm fans favourite in the process. His performances also earned him a call up for his native Northern Ireland under the management of Sammy McIlrov and it was his national boss who then signed him for Stockport County in his role as manager at Edgeley Park during last summer.

Feeney has made 27 appearances for County




this season in league and cup and is currently top scorer with 10 vital goals as the Hatters battle to avoid the drop.

Chris Turner

Chris Turner arrived at Edgeley Park in December aware he faces an uphill task to rescue County from relegation. However he is a man used to the weight of expectation after managing Sheffield Wednesday for almost two years before making way for Paul Sturrock in September. Previously Turner had spent three and a half years at Hartlepool where he transformed the club into contenders for promotion into League One.

As a player Turner kept goal for 6 different clubs including almost 100 league appearances for Manchester United. He also had long spells at Sunderland and Sheffield Wednesday, with whom he appeared against the Old Trafford giants at Wembley in the 1991 Rumbelows Cup Final.

Reeves' Review

Town's young gun on cleaning the gaffer's boots, dodgy stomachs and future success...

t's rather fitting that I find myself speaking to Luke Garrard on the phone immediately after Eastenders, 19-year old Luke, Town's latest youth sensation and already a fans' favourite in the rightback slot, is as cockney as they come.

It's an enjoyable conversation too, the driven youngster wise beyond his years and affable to boot - this boy could go far, y'know.

It wasn't so long ago, however, that young Garrard thought about giving up the game altogether. A few years ago a letter in the post from Tottenham Hotspur arrived on Luke's doormat stating (in just one sentence) that he was surplus to their requirements. Thankfully Garrard senior persuaded the dejected defender not to give up and instead, to pursue his football career elsewhere instead. It seems we have Luke's dad to thank for his recent

rise to prominence at the County Ground...

Despite his Tottenham setback, Luke has recently had the last laugh. First, a rousing performance against his former club in Ianuary 2003 in the FA Youth Cup showed them exactly what they were missing, while his recent run in the first team has been solid and dependable. He's even amassed more appearances than Tottenham loanees, Jamie Slabber and Mark Yeates put together.

The Gaffer stole my Moet after the game, I'd won some bottles of champagne for being man of the match - but it was his way of bringing me down to earth.



You've not had a bad few weeks have you?!

It has been really enjoyable; it's all I've wanted to do since I joined Swindon. I just hope that I can continue playing in the first team now for as long as possible.

Regular readers of this magazine will be familiar with your progress at the club, but for everyone else. tell us a little bit about your footballing journey so far. How did you end up at the County Ground from Arsenal, for example?

I joined Arsenal when I was 10 and played for them for four years before I moved to Spurs (just before the YTS stage), I was released from Spurs and played in an exit trial at Bisham Abbey, basically a game for young players that have been released. It was there that Viv (Busby) and Clive (Maguire) saw me and after the game, I received a list of the clubs that were interested in me. Swindon were one of the clubs. along with Famborough, Everton and Aston Villa. Villa and Everton didn't make contact with me so I signed for Swindon straight away.

Were you disappointed when you left Spurs? Did you think at any stage that you wouldn't make it?

It was quite sour leaving Spurs. They let me know that they didn't want me anymore with a letter containing one sentence - I thought it was a bit harsh! I didn't really want to play anymore after that, it really put me off. My Dad encouraged me to pursue my career and give Swindon a go - thankfully I got a lucky break and here I am

The first time I saw you play was away at Tottenham Hotspur in the FA Youth Cup in January 2003, You played against loan players Mark Yeates and Jamie Slabber - it must be nice to be starting games when they've been on the bench here at Swindon!

It was a good game that one, playing against your former club and doing well. The Youth Cup is a great competition for young players; it's an opportunity to put yourself in the shop window.

You've mentioned in a previous interview that Micky Hazard and

Paul Davis have had huge influences on your career...

They were both legends as players. I'm a big Arsenal fan and Paul Davis is a hero at Highbury. But Paul was also good with young players, as was Micky. They could teach you so much, things that you wouldn't believe and I'll always remember the way they encouraged the young lads.


How have the youth lads reacted to your inclusion in the first team? Have they been supportive?

They've been proper decent with me. It's nice to get feedback from the lads; it gives you confidence. It can be difficult when one player makes it through and others don't because there is such competition - but they still chat with me and banter with me, which is cool.

Do you think your inclusion in the first team will act as a spur for some of the other young lads?

I hope so. It's so tough, Ian Herring's the only lad to have come through in recent years and he was





released. If I keep playing then perhaps the lads will think they have a chance. The thing is the Gaffer will use more youngsters this season, his loan deals are running out and so if they prove themselves, he'll use them.

You're still cleaning the Gaffer's boots - things can't have changed that much?!

He doesn't undo his laces after training either, which makes them harder to clean! It's a good thing, though, I'm still doing the same things as I was last year and I don't feel as though I've changed.

Is he happy with your cleaning skills?

He complains and knocks

me down; it keeps me on my toes!

How hard has it been for you and the other younger players to come through at Swindon, taking into account the change in personnel (Woan and Onoura replacing Jim Fraser and Viv Busby) and the lack of reserve games this season?



The change in personnel hasn't made much of a difference. Iffy and Woany are nice and have a lot of experience between them. It was a shame to see Viv and Jim (Fraser) leave, though. Both were nice lads and Viv was an excellent manager, he made us play great football - it's good to see him back in the game at York. The lack of reserve games is a big problem. We used to play up to three games a week, now

it's six in four months! It's not good; players need games to prove they have what it takes.

As well as playing in the first team, how has life changed as a young pro. You're not living in digs anymore are you?

I travel in with Jerel now [Luke lives in London]. It's better; I get to spend more time with the missus, with friends and family. Digs were

awesome though, big up to Steve and Joy! They were a lovely family, but it's nice to be home.

How difficult is it living in digs as a youngster growing up?

It's difficult, but it's your dream as well and so you have to sacrifice things in life. It's paid off now; it's a great reward.

How did it feel to finally get your first team

start against Bristol City? You'd been training with the first time for some time?

It was brilliant, an excellent game to be involved in. It was raw and the adrenalin I was feeling - and to win!

You actually made your debut in a 4-0 defeat against next week's opponents (Oldham) in 2003 - it's been a while since then - has it been frustrating waiting for another game?

Not really, I made my debut in my first season at 17 - we were 3-0 down and the Gaffer said to just go out and enjoy myself. I was on the bench five times that season. My second season didn't quite go as well, but this year's been great.

How difficult is it training with full-time pros compared to the vounger lads?

It's difficult when you're drafted in during the last few moments at training. But to start with the first team lads, to wear the same kit - it's a lot better. I think I've adapted well.

Is it true you also tend

to get a bit nervous during games?

I've been sick at half-time once or twice! There's a lot more pressure at this level, not only to prove myself, but also to do well for the fans, the players and the Gaffer. And then there are points at stake too. It's a good pressure though - I like it. The players have been good to me, just telling me to keep doing what I'm doing.

Was it hard, following the City game, to keep your emotions in check? What did the Gaffer say - he's doing his best to keep your feet on the around isn't he?

The Gaffer stole my Moet after the game; I'd won some bottles of champagne for being man of the match - but it was his way of bringing me down to earth.

Your new teammates have been very supportive, many of the first team squad singing your praises...

It's very nice - fellow players give me the confidence I need. Steve Robinson has been particularly supportive and I really appreciate it. Everyone's been great.

Was the Notts County defeat a bit of a reality check - Town's form had been good up until that point?

Very much so, especially as we were buzzing from our league form. It wasn't nice to lose in that manner - it was my first major defeat and the fact that it was on Sky... I don't like to lose so easily...


What next, then? Is it a case of keeping your first team place - earning a professional contract?

If I keep playing well I'll have more of a chance of getting a professional contract - that's the plan.

What does the future hold for Swindon Town?

We're seven points off the play-offs places and so we need a big run of eight games or so to get us back up there. For me the LDV has become even more important. We can win that competition and the fans deserve a good day out. It must be a priority to reach that final now - from there hopefully we can push on in the league.






ood afternoon Gand welcome to today's game. It goes without saying that today is a big game for everyone at the club and after Tuesday's disappointment it is up to us all to put things right.


Wrexham's Juan Ugarte had a day to remember at Saltergate by scoring all four goals in a desperate 4-2 win



Stefani: Cutting It Fine

tefani Miglioranzi is fast approaching his 100th appearance for Swindon Town and having recently returned to action after an enforced layoff, he spoke to STFC Magazine about his time at The County Ground so far and the inspiration behind his new look.

The Brazilian-born midfielder made his first start for Town in the 3-1 home victory over Barnsley in August 2002, with Miglioranzi relishing the chance to impress his new Manager and the Town supporters.

"I remember being without a club and looking around for somewhere. I had a call from Andy King who offered me the chance to get a fresh new start," he said speaking after training earlier this week.

"At the time I was living at my sisters apartment in London and filled my car before driving over to Swindon, I then trained for about a week with the squad before Andy King offered me a month-tomonth deal.

"It was really tough at first because I had just

come out of a 3 or 4 year contract at Portsmouth where I had security. At the start of my time at Swindon I didn't know where I was going to go with my life or whether I still had the football in me because of the injuries that I had had previously. It was frustrating in some senses but it was also a breath of fresh air for me

"We have had strong sides in the past few years, but maybe those players didn't have the experience to get the team up. The Manager then brought in a few

"Rory has been living with me for the past few months and is good company. He is a little bit untidy, and is yet to pick up the vacuum cleaner!"

just to be able to play football," he commented.





Puhs:




