Signed a one-year deal after arriving on a free transfer from Crystal Palace in August 2004. Started his career as a trainee with Wolves before moving to the Eagles in 1997. Appointed as Robins' captain in 2005



Mickey Bell

Snapped up from Wycombe Wanderers for a tribunal fee of £150,000 in the summer of 1997. he is a free kick and penalty specialist. Signed a new one deal in the summer of 2004.



Tommy Doherty

Capped nine times by Northern ireland, for whom he qualifies through his grandfather, Doherty was was voted the City Supporters Club Player Of The Year in 2003/04. A product of the club's Academy system.



ita sets the pace, with his 27 strikes making the England U-21 international joint top scorer in the division as April commenced. He came off the bench 30 times last season but has made himself un-droppable this term.

Strike partner Steve Brooker is no slouch with his 17 goals, five of those for former club Port Vale. Luke Wiltshire has nine and ex-Notts County front-man Paul Heffernan, is on seven.

Last season's player of the year, Northern Ireland's midfielder Tommy Doherty was one of those whose selection for his country forced the postponement of the original fixture back over Easter.

Striker Dave Cotterill was another, the 17 year-old making his debut as a substitute for the Welsh U-21 side against Austria.

At the other end of the spectrum, manager Brian Tinnion has announced that he's keeping his boots within reach. He's 20 years older than Cotterill but is prepared to continue to pick himself if needs be. Over the vears he's been instrumental for City in games against Town. City's last six away games have produce three wins, a draw and a couple of defeats. Just like Andy King, Tinnion still believes a play-off place is up for grabs and tonight's match is vitally important for both clubs if those hopes are to continue.

Australian international midfielder who signed for City from Middlesbrough in July 2003 for £250,000. Capped four time by Australia, whom he also represented in the 2004 Olympics



ClaytonFortune

Ultility player signed in March 2001 after being released by Tottenham. Has played in central defence, at left-back, in central midfield and even up front. Turned down a move to Preston last summer.



BradleyOrr

A former Town larget, he signed on a free transfer from Newcastle United in the summer of 2004. Began his career with Everton before moving to St James Park where he skippered the club's reserve side.



Joe**Keith**

Left-wingback who is currently on loan from Colchester United, in a swan deal involving Marc Goodfellow Started his career as a trainee for West Ham before moving to Layer Road in July 1999 on a free transfer



DaveCotterill

Capped twice by Wales U-21's, he made his City debut in the home game against Colchester in October aged just 16 years old. Signed a pro contract in December, keeping him at Ashton Gate until the summer of 2007.



ScottBrown

Started his career as a trainee with Everton whom he represented at youth and reserve level before being released at the end of the 2003/04 season. Following a succesful trial joined City on a short-term contract.




quiet by the Brentford defence on Saturday, Lita will no doubt be ready to find the net again this evening.










Are You Ready?



y now you will all be aware that Elton John is to play at The County Ground, but what work was involved to bring him here?

'Reginald Kenneth Dwight' started taking piano lessons at the age of four and has since become a superstar on the international music scene.

His concerts in America were legendary as he donned ridiculous outfits and outrageous spectacles. At one stage between 1972 and 1975 he had seven consecutive number 1 albums, his hits including "Rocket Man", "Daniel", "Saturday Night's Alright For Fighting", "Goodbye Yellow Brick Road", "Candle In The Wind" and the powerful wouldbe suicide note, "Someone Saved My Life Tonight".

So, as the excitement builds ahead of 19th June, we tracked down Sales & Marketing Manager Mike Sullivan in the offices at The County Ground to get the low-down on the arrival of 'Rocket Man' to SN1.

Firstly, what a great coup for STFC!

"Certainly, in all honesty it is the product of around ten months of hard work, since last September when we entered negotiations with the promoter Marshall Arts."

Can you tell us a little about the work involved Management company and left our details, after which they confirmed that Elton was looking to do a tour of a number of football grounds. We received an agreement just after the Luton Town away game that it was going to go ahead."

It must have been

to sign up such a wellknown artist?

"It was confirmed very early in March, but the initial idea actually stemmed from one of our Executive Club members, John Cullum, who is the Father of Jamie Cullum the well-known Jazz artist. John suggested holding a concert here so I then spoke to Jamie's agents, but they said that he wasn't ready for this type of concert and to come back in a year or two.

"From there I contacted Elton John's

quite a relief to finally announce it...

"It was. There was a lot of hard work which went on behind the scenes in order for it to go ahead but it was a case of keeping it quiet for a time before we were able to finally release the exciting news."

Could this be the first of many concerts to be held at Swindon Town Football Club?

"We hope so. What we are looking to do is have Elton here in the summer for what will be the first

major concert to be held here at STFC and then follow that up with a series of annual events."

Didn't you know Sir Elton from your time at Watford?

"I worked at Watford FC for ten years during the early eighties, during which time Elton John was Chairman. Every year each member of staff was encouraged to visit his home with their families for a day out. He is a very shy man but he can be very funny as well."

What type of performance can the Swindon public expect on the night?

"I have seen him live on around ten occasions and you will get a five star performance. He will be on stage for around just over two hours and is absolutely brilliant live."

How are the ticket sales going?

"You have to remember that we are the venue and not the promoter. Marshall Arts, who are promoting the event.

want to keep the ticket sales very close to their chest although they have highlighted that we did sell 10,000 tickets within the first two days."

We understand corporate sales have gone well...

"They have gone well ves. We have done very well and have sold 300 platinum packages upstairs in the executive areas and our gold packages are threequarters full now. It has even got to the point that we are looking at local hotels to extend our corporate areas."

And what are the arrangements for car parking on the night?

"The demand for car parking is no doubt going to be very, very high so we are looking to pre-sell our car parking spaces.

"We are in negotiations with Tesco, St. Josephs School and the local cricket club and the idea is to operate four main car parks. Entry to the official car parks will be by ticket only."

How big is this event for Swindon Town FC?

"The good thing about this event is that the club can't lose. The deal has been done on a ground rent, commission on all ticket sales, a percentage of the bar sales, corporate hospitality as well as income generated from the car parking.

"It should be profitable for the club but we will

be spending a little bit of money to make sure this is a memorable event. We want people to come away from the event having seen a magnificent performance and had a great time."

How will the stadium be transformed?

"Three days before the event Marshall Arts will come in and effectively takeover the ground. A protective flooring will be laid down to cover the pitch and the pitch seating installed. The technical team will then get to work installing the lighting and sound equipment.

"Elton's stage will be situated at the Stratton Bank end of the ground with two big screens either side, to enable everyone inside the stadium an excellent view. As far as accommodating Elton and his team, we are expecting the area behind the Stratton Bank to house all his staff in what will become 'Elton's village'.

"He probably won't arrive in Swindon until around 6pm and he is expected on stage at 8.20pm. The event should all be over by approximately 11pm after which the clear up operation will get underway. The pitch covering will be removed which will then enable the ground staff to continue their preparation work to get the playing surface ready for the start of the new 2005/6 Coca-Cola League One season."






We go one-on-one with our column-writing goalscoring Scotsman...

nd Smith must score...' Those were the words on the lips of the commentators as Smith had the goalkeeper to beat late on. Score and he becomes a legend, the travelling army of fans swelling around him in a last-minute goalscoring frenzy...

No, not Gordon Smith, who famously broke through for Brighton & Hove Albion against Manchester United in the dying embers of the 1985 FA Cup final, but son Grant as he stands over the penalty spot for the Reds away at MK dons last month.

Unfortunately Smith saw his last-minute spot kick saved expertly by Matt Baker (who, incidentally, saved another a few days later), but his earlier strike, his eighth of the season, ensured a crucial point away from home - not bad for a player not even on the bench in 2004. 2005 has seen Smithy on a mission and with five games to go, it's not over vet...

The Scot is one of nine players out of contract this summer and in recent months he's been doing his best to make sure he'll be one of those reporting back at Wanborough in July. Not only that, but there's the small matter of reaching his third playoffs in as many years.

We travelled to Smith's hometown of Cheltenham where the Scot told STFC Magazine that it's not over yet...

Saturday's result has done little to boost our play-off chances, how much of a blow was the Hartlepool result defeat a week earlier?

The two games have been massive setbacks. We were very confident going up to Hartlepool. That was the game that could have got us back up there because we would have stolen three points off them. They'd lost a few games leading up to that game too and we were very confident. Saturday's game against Walsall was just one of those horrible, horrible games when it didn't happen for us. They're fighting for their lives and while we still an outside chance we'll be looking to put things right and hang in there.

Was it decided before the game that Sam would take any penalties?

Yeah.

Even though you won a penalty competition in training on the Friday...

[laughs] I think it was more the Gaffer's decision really. It's good for Sam to get his goal ratio up and I don't mind, as long as he scores them! I didn't even see

the decision to be honest, Sam got there before me. It seemed a bit harsh...

You must have been tempted to erase the memory of MK Dons, though?

In a way, but Sam got their first and he scored so I've got no complaints.

Still, eight goals from midfield, that's not a bad return for someone that's only played half the season?

It should be nine as well! My aim is to get double figures now, although earlier in the season my aim was just to play games - I had no goalscoring targets! I'm happy with the goals I've scored in the last 20 games or so; hopefully I can grab a few more.

Your run coincided with a certain pre-match ritual, what was the secret, and what has replaced it now?


[laughs] I can't tell you that! No, it all happened because I hadn't been picked for the squad the week before the Bradford game, I wasn't even on the bench. Then, before the Bradford match (as I wasn't expecting to start)

I watched a late film and ate late the night before, not the best preparation... but it worked for me and I scored a couple, so I did it until I had a bad game. I need to think of some more superstitions now, although I'm wearing these wristbands at the moment, the ones you see loads of people wearing, cancer and racism etc. I had one on until Walsall, and one of the ball boys has given me the black and white racism one so I'll give that a go this week.

You've also played in a number of positions... what do you think is your best role and our best formation? Would you agree that we've seen the best of Grant Smith in midfield?

Midfield is my position, or up front. I like it when we play with Sam on his own up front as a lone striker because I can get on the end of flick-ons and get into goalscoring positions from midfield. I prefer the middle of the park, although I don't mind playing on the left. It depends on the personnel and who were playing in terms of a formation or system, but I think we're better with four at the back.





We haven't seen enough goals this year, you and Sam apart. Has that been our main problem, do you think?


Christian's been out for a long time and I think he would have scored more, he's capable of scoring goals. We lost Tommy Mooney in

the summer and we've missed a second striker getting 15 goals. But Rory can hit a streak at some stage - if we could just get another player on 15 we'd be up there I think.

A win tonight will do wonders for morale, though...

It's a big game for us, the perfect opportunity to put things right after Saturday's defeat. It would be great for the fans to win this one and City, like us, have had a stop-start season - it'll be a close game.

It's the start of a tough run of games...



Yeah, but then I always feel we do better against better sides. It's harder to play the Wrexham's and the Walsall's because we're suited to playing football against the better teams. If we win tonight then go to Hull and get a result, you never know. We can't wait to play in front of 20,000 at Hull...

Is it a case of finishing as high as we can if we don't make it into the top six?

This year's league has been strange, so inconsistent and we haven't capitalised at all. Last year there were teams that you'd know would put a run together. This year it's been a free for all and we haven't taken advantage. Next year, if we can find that consistency, we'll have every chance, so we need to finish the season as strongly as possible.

Will it be a frustrating summer, looking back on where it went wrong, or will you forget about it and look ahead?

You have to take the positives and analyse the negatives. Where did we drop points? Why?

If we can keep certain players we'll be up there again next year, and the Gaffer has only ever strengthened the team so he could bring in a few players. Sometimes a team struggles the season after they get knocked out of the play-offs and then come good the year after that. We're getting more experience all the time so it's all positive.

What does the future hold for Grant Smith, you're one of the nine players out of contract this summer?

I hope I've done enough

recently to give myself a chance. I can't afford to drop my standards now, though, and I can only keep trying to play well and scoring goals if I'm to stay here. I want to stay at Swindon because it's a great club...

Do you still keep in touch with the Sheffield lads?


All the time. I see them when I'm free and vice versa, I get up there as much as I can. Their league's totally different to ours in that the top teams keep winning. They're still in with a shout and although they have some tough games coming up, I think they'll make it. They're experienced lads and have done it all before.

He is a bit mental, but I really like him. He liked me and was always straight with me. He's a funny guy, gets the best out of players. He doesn't get the credit he deserves really, his record speaks for itself.

Oh What Fun it is to see Swindon win Away...

... at Hull City, Saturday 16th April, K.C. Stadium

Like most of you, this will be my first trip to the KC Stadium so once again I have to thank www. footballgroundguide.co.uk for the info provided. Here's what it says:

Getting there:

By car: Leave the M62 at Junction 38 and join the A63, towards Hull. Stay on the A63 and the stadium is clearly signposted (KC Stadium) as you approach Hull. About one mile from the centre of Hull leave the A63 (also signposted for the Hull Royal Infirmary) and take the 2nd exit at the roundabout. Turn left at the lights and then over the flyover, right at the next lights and the ground is down on the right.

Puhs'

There are a number of pubs within a few minutes walk of the stadium, but these are all designated as being for home supporters only. Most local fans still seem to be heading for pubs situated around Boothferry Park, These are best avoided by away fans particularly the Silver Cod and 'Admiral of the Humber' pubs. Alcohol is served within the ground (£2.50 a pint), otherwise you can head for the nearby City Centre, where there are plenty of pubs to be found. David Jenkin a visiting Exeter fan recommends; the Sandringham pub, near to Hull main station, in the City Centre.

Ground:

The stadium is totally enclosed, with the West Stand being around twice the size of the

other three sides. The roof rises up and curves around the West Stand. giving the stadium an interesting look, Inside the curves continue as each of the stands slightly bow around the playing area, drawing the eye to sweep panoramically around them. Each stand is single tiered, apart from the two tiered West Stand, This stand also has a row of executive boxes running across its middle. There is an electric scoreboard at the North End of the stadium, where the Police Control Box is also situated. The pitch looked in excellent condition on my visit in January, plus it has had under soil heating installed. The p.a. system within the stadium is also excellent. All told this a stadium that would not look out of place in the Premiership.

Fave Game:

This would have to be the one at Boothferry Park on the first day of the 95-96 Championship season when we won 1-0 thanks to a Steve Finney diving header right in front of the away fans. I knew then that we would have a good season and that's just how it turned out.

without loss. Town have a tough battle on their hands.




