

Help save Fleming's medals... National Anti-Racism competition winners in Town... A big Thank you to 'Super' Sam...

Keep Medals in Town

Harold Fleming is arguably one of Swindon's most successful players. Capped 11 times for England he played for Swindon Town between 1907 and 1924. The medals he won in that period are up for auction on 27th April at Bonhams in Chester.

These include 1913/14

season Southern League Division One winners medal and a Charity Shield medal from 1911 when Manchester United defeated the Town 8-4.

They could be lost to the community of Swindon forever when they go under the hammer but a group of Swindon Town supporters are doing all they can to make sure that this piece of

Swindon's heritage can be kept in Swindon.

These medals are not only part of the football clubs history but part of the history of Swindon.

It is hoped that at least £5,000 can be raised to make a realistic bid for all the 14 lots on offer. The medals range in guide prices from £120-£180 to £600 to £800.

The idea is for the supporters organisations the Supporters Club, Trust STFC and the Swindon Away Supporters to jointly hold the medals in trust and arrangements will be made to display the medals.

The initial response has been excellent and a good start has been made towards raising the funds but it is now up to the people of Swindon to show their support.

A bank account is being opened this week to receive donations big and small. The appeal organisers need to know how much has been raised by Monday 25th April.

In the meantime supporters who want to make a donation can send their donations to

any of the supporters organisations: c/o Swindon Town County Ground, Swindon, SN1 2ED.

If £5,000 proves to be too much to raise the funds will be used to purchase as many of the medals as possible. Should more be raised than is needed, the surplus will be held for future purchases of important Swindon Town memorabilia with a view to a permanent display in the future.





"I would like to say thanks to all at Swindon Town for this and especially Sam Parkin, who proved that he really cares for the regular fans as well as being a great player!"





Never lower than eighth, Rovers 2-1 win at Sheffield Wednesday at the beginning of the month lifted the club up to third place on 72 points.

The win followed success at fellow promotion rivals Hartlepool the previous month in another six-pointer. The automatic promotion places have now been secured by Luton and Hull, but-Tranmere have all but secured their play-off place.

Away from home, Rovers' record looks formidable. Currently with eight wins and five defeats, Little's side suffered defeat at Brentford two weeks ago but Town are fully aware of the task in hand.

A cosmopolitan collection of players lead the scoring chart, with Canadian full-cap lain Hume on 16. Jamaican international Paul Hall on 11 while last year's top scorer, Ivory Coast-born Eugene Dadi is on nine. Former Coventry City frontman Hall proved to be the thorn in Town's side in the reverse fixture earlier in the season, scoring both goals for the home side.

Worryingly all three are currently hot in front of goal. Over the ten games leading up to the beginning of April, each had scored four times.

Ex-Liverpool and Republic of Ireland midfielder Jason McAteer can be found running the midfield, and last year's Player of the Year, keeper John Achterberg, almost ever- present last season, has carried on from where he left off.

After signing scholarship forms, he progressed rapidly through Tranmere's youth and reserve team sides and he ended the 1999-00 season as a regular on the substitutes bench.

In 2003-04 lain had to wait until October and incidentally the first game under the new boss to get his first goal of the season but he went on to net 14, including screamers against Swansea and



Little was in charge of Leicester City during the 1993 Play-Off final that saw Swindon Town conquer 4-3 to take their place in the Premiership. He took the Foxes to the Play-Off finals in three consecutive seasons, finishing 4th, 6th and 4th again before they finally won promotion at the third attempt in 1993/94.

He has also managed Darlington, Aston Villa, Stoke, West Brom and Hull City, as well as a caretaker role at Wolves, and joined Rovers in 2003 and looks to have guided his side to the play-offs this time around.

Today's visitors Tranmere Rovers were held to a goalless draw by local rivals Blackpool at Prenton Park last weekend...

Luton, who clinched promotion in midweek, boosted their bid to go up as League One champions after a 1-0 victory over struggling Milton Keynes Dons at Kenilworth Road. An own goal from Ben Chorley just after the half hour mark gave The Hatters all three points to extend the lead at the top to five points.

Bournemouth are back in the play-off places after a thrilling 3-2 victory at Chesterfield.

Wayne Allison gave The Spireites a 1-0 half time lead before Steve Fletcher equalised just after the break for The Cherries, Brian Stock then gave the visitors the lead before the hosts restored parity through Steve Blatherwick. Fletcher scored his second goal to claim the points at Saltergate.

Brentford remain in the play-off positions, despite a 4-1 thrashing at the hands of Bradford City at Valley Parade, Two first half goals each for Dean Windass (6, 37) and Marc Bridge-Wilkinson (23, 45) gave The Bantams an astonishing 4-0 lead at the break. Jay Tabb scored a late consolation for Martin Allen's side. but The Bees were well beaten on the day in West Yorkshire.

Bristol City earned a 1-0 win over LDV Vans Trophy winners Wrexham at Ashton Gate thanks to a goal from Scott Murray with the Dragons continuing in their fight for survival.

Huddersfield Town's chances of making the play-offs suffered a setback after a 2-2 home draw with Colchester United. Neil Danns, who

scored at STFC during the U's visit in January, gave Colchester the lead before Pawel Abbott levelled matters a minute later. The Terriers then took the lead through Danny Schofield on 62 minutes, but The U's snatched a point in injury time when Liam Chilvers made it 2-2 just before the final whistle. Swindon travel to the Galpharm Stadium next weekend.

Doncaster Rovers are also holding onto faint hopes of the play-offs after a 4-2 win at already-relegated Stockport County. Goals from Ricky Ravenhill (2), Paul Green (72), Michael McIndoe (82) and Adam Brown (87) gave Donny the points at Edgeley Park, Damien Allen (28) and Adam Le Fondre (45) found the scoresheet for Chris Turner's side in a losing effort.

A brace from on-loan Simon Johnson gave Barnsley a 2-2 draw with Oldham Athletic at Oakwell, with Chris Killen and Luke Beckett scoring the goals for the struggling Latics.

Torquay United may yet avoid relegation from League

The focus now is on giving all the feedback to the players throughout the various age-groups but unfortunately part of that process is releasing those feel who haven't quite reached the required standard. It is probably the hardest part of the iob and I know that the individual team coaches find it difficult, but it is something that we have to do. We do keep it to a minimum with the majority of the players being moved up to the next age group. However, decisions have to be made and those players who we don't feel have progressed enough we have to let go.

Last weekend we continued our games programme against Cheltenham Town and whilst results aren't crucial, there were wins for the Under 9's, 12's, 13's and 15's. The Under 14's had no game whilst the Under 10's and 11's suffered defeat.

Again we seem to come up against teams who are physically bigger, with Oxford and Cheltenham being recent examples of this. On a technical level we do well but seem to suffer when it comes to the physical side of the game. Younger players who are physically bigger do tend to flourish more than some of the others. Judgements are made at times on the timings of growth spurts and the like, so you almost have to be a physiologist in this job when decisions are made.

The coaches have continued to work very well and the results, such as the Under 18's win last weekend, are the kind of things that tell you that we are moving in the right lines.


It must have come as a shock when Ian Rush left the club so soon after your arrival?







What do you think went wrong for you earlier in the season?

I started very well; the Gaffer pretty much said as much, that I was doing okay. Then we had a bad spell as a team, we were losing games and I was playing poorly. The suspension capped it for me [Howard missing games as a result of picking up a fifth booking against Notts County]. Smithy came in and was on fire, scoring six goals in eight or nine games.

You've been played in the centre of the park and on the left-hand side, which do you prefer?

I feel I'm at my best playing in the centre of the park where I can get hold of the ball and create. When you're on

the wing you're relying on others to get the ball to you.

Someone told us that you text BBC Radio Swindon after the game, pretending to be the Brian Howard fan club and commending vourself. Is this true?

llaughs No, who told you that?! I might actually have my own fan club, you never know!

You've said in a previous interview that you've had to work hard on your fitness, how hard is that when you're not playing first team football?

It's hard when you're not playing week in week out. All you can do is work as hard as you can in training and hope the Gaffer puts you back in.

Your best spell came in November when you scored three goals in four games. We beat Wednesday twice, Hull convincingly - it seems strange that we never really kicked on from there and put together a promotion push?

We really outplayed some of the big teams back then, scored lots of goals

and played very, very well. It's hard to put your finger on why we never really kicked on afterwards - it's been frustrating.


Where do you think we need to strengthen ahead of the new campaign, and will you be staying with us?

Not a clue about my own situation, to be honest I'm out of contract and with three games to go I've got to play at my best, after that I'll sit down with the Gaffer. We all know the wage bill has to be cut, but if we can stick together I think we're one or two players short of an automatic promotion side. If the Gaffer can keep us together and then weave his magic in the summer... We need someone to help Sam on the goal-scoring front. Rory's done well recently and Christian's been injured, but we need goals from elsewhere.

You played as a striker at Southampton towards the beginning of your career and scored a hatful in one pre-season, would you fancy a stint up top?

I'm a decent finisher, but I'm not a centre forward. I've not got the size, power





or pace to be a striker.

As the only current Swindon player to play under Glenn Hoddle - what did you make of him?

He brought some new ideas to the club and got me training with the first team, my first taste

of the action. He was always the best player in training, you'd think you'd have him and he'd do a trick or play a pass that would leave you dumbstruck, then he'd hit a pinpoint 60-yard pass! Matt Le Tissier was the same.

You've played with both

Le Tissier and Zola, who's better?

They're two different players, both gifted. I saw more of Le Tissier at Southampton, I only saw Zola for four weeks at Chelsea. Le Tissier was like Hoddle, he would just do amazing things and score from



anywhere. Zola had a good work rate.

As a winger of sorts, what did you make of Lee Holmes when he arrived here?

He was a different player to me, he was all about pace and beating your man and getting a cross in. He's a good talent, a bit raw but a great lad, everyone here liked him a lot. I wish him all the best; he could be a future England left-winger.

What happened at

Chelsea? You went there for a trial (met Rhys Evans) and looked set to join them in the summer of 2003...

I went there after leaving Southampton. At the time Chelsea had no money and were looking at young English players. I was in Toulon on an England under 21 trip when Abramovich took over. Then they signed everyone and that was that! The thing was I'd had enough of playing reserve team football at Southampton and I didn't fancy sitting

in Chelsea's reserves, which I would have done. So when my agent said Andy was interested I came to have a look and joined soon after.

Didn't you also go out on loan earlier in your career in Oz or New Zealand?

Australia, yeah. I was playing for a team in Perth and I had a great time for two and a half weeks. Unfortunately I had to return to England because of personal problems. It was a

beautiful place and I ended up playing with Rory Fallon's brother - I've had to put up with both of them!

Your 'Showboating' appearance on Soccer AM, the rumour goes that that was down to your agent...

My agent was at our game against Torquay with some of my mates. They said why don't you try and do something in the game because Helen Chamberlain, one of the presenters and a Torquay fan, was bound to see it. I'm always doing tricks in training, but hardly ever in a game. I had just scored and was feeling good, so I tried this trick and it came off. Fenners, also from the show, is a mate of my agent and he said he'd try and get it on, but it was all down to the trick!

Do you get bored of Sammy Igoe; you must see each other every day?

Of course! No, he's a great lad. It's lucky we get on really, the amount of time we spend together. We have some good banter, from small things like shouting 'watch out'

when someone's asleep in the back of our car to make them think we're about to crash - it's all good fun.

What are the latest tunes doing the rounds in the M4 driving club?


Well since you spoke to Sam Parkin we've not seen much of him, now he's an international he's distanced himself from us! I think he's been working in the gym in Swindon a lot after training, where as Sammy and I like to get back and go to the gym closer to home. The anthem at Parkin's birthday a few weeks ago was Mario's Let me love you.

Why does Grant Smith call you the white pearl?

Rory started it. He thought I was like Maradona in that I was short, stocky, left-footed and tried loads of tricks in training. It's stuck ever since.

I almost bought a two-bed apartment in



Southampton. It had a sea view and everything. But with my future unsure at this stage I thought it'd be silly, I'll wait until I know what's going on with my contract.

[laughs] Big sunglasses, they'll be big this summer.

Ground:




outlet and a bar at the back of the stand. Up to 4,000 away fans can be accommodated.





Sadly, hopes that we might extend the campaign into the Play-Offs again have proved unfounded, and two weeks today sees the curtain come down on another season when Chesterfield visit the County Ground for the final match of 2004/05.

Town travelled to Saltergate back in November where the Spireites took the points with a 1-0 win. Last weekend, a 3-2 home defeat by Bournemouth left Chesterfield in 16th place on 53 points from 43 games and needing one more point to make sure of League One football next term.



A familiar name scored the opener that day. Wayne Allison cost Town £475,000 when he signed from Bristol City in the summer of 1995 and the Chief is still knocking the goals in at the age of 36. With six to his name this season, he is level third top scorer for Chesterfield.

Top men in front of goal are Shane Nicholson and the tongue-twisteringly named, Congolese-born Tcham N'Toya who are both on seven. Level with big Wayne is Caleb Forlan.

Roy McFarland has been the man in charge since May 2003 and his team's current league position is the lowest they've occupied all season, but their away form is little worse than Town's. With five wins and six draws, it's Chesterfield's home form that has let them down this season and the last six matches on their travels have seen two wins and two draws.

It's likely that neither team will have anything other than pride to play for, but Andy King and his opposite number will be looking to their players to justify their places for next season,


