

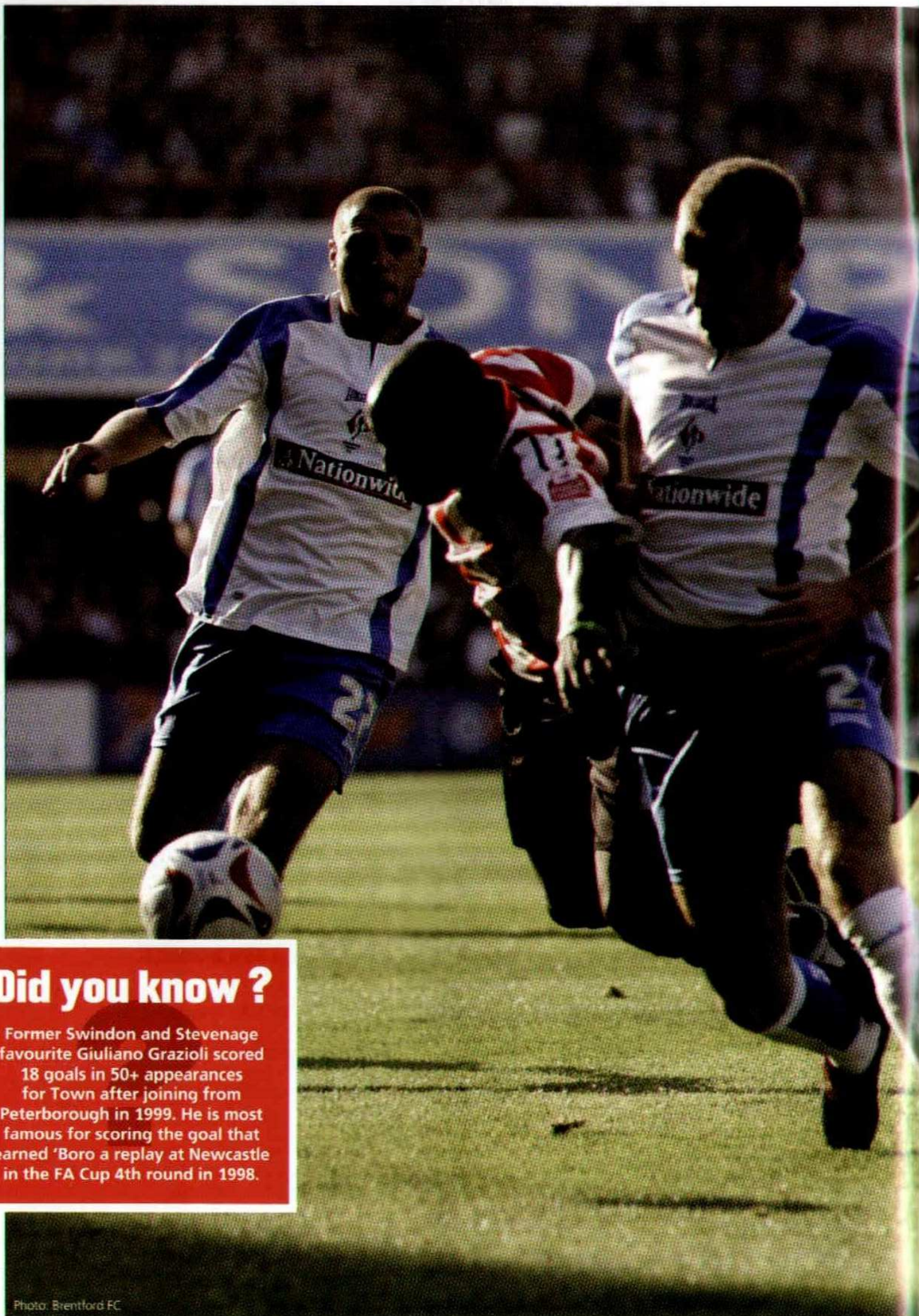
Good evening and welcome to The County Ground for this evening's LDV Vans Trophy First Round tie.

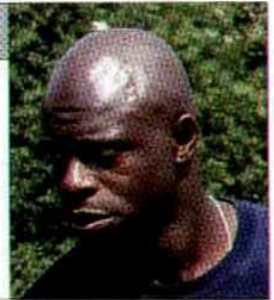

Good evening and welcome to our visitors Stevenage Borough who are here tonight for the LDV Vans Trophy First Round...

It was a well-deserved point at Griffin Park, ending the run of defeats. I am sure Brentford will look at the game and feel they could have taken all three points but thankfully Tom Heaton has pulled off some great saves once again to keep us in the game. Andy Nicholas also performed well and blocked a shot off the line late on, but that is what defending is all about and he put his body on the line for the cause. If we can take clean sheets like that week in week out then I will be happy.

On the injury front we were forced to make a few changes during the game.

First Round ■ Preview

THE FIRST ROUND OF THE LDV TROPHY SEES ALL BUT FOUR OF THE LEAGUE ONE AND TWO JOINED BY A HALF-DOZEN CONFERENCE NATIONAL CLUBS IN EACH OF THE NORTH AND SOUTH SECTIONS...

In the Southern section, the side top of League One, and last year's beaten finalists, Southend United must travel to Rushden & Diamonds, and they will be confident of getting off to a winning start. United's fellow promotion hopefuls Swansea City visit another side currently near the bottom of the Football League, Torquay United, meaning a return to Plainmoor for former Gulls striker Adebayo Akinfenwa. Fellow West Country side Yeovil Town must travel to a Leyton Orient team who have returned to their early League Two pace, whilst Bristol Rovers go to Peterborough United in an all League Two affair. Bristol City go to the side who have already knocked them out of the Carling Cup this season, last season's Conference champions Barnet who now list Giuliano Grazioli in their squad, whilst two sides with a recent Conference

history, Shrewsbury Town and Cheltenham Town, meet at Gay Meadow. Brentford host Oxford United, with both sides pushing for promotion from their respective divisions, and Northampton Town host fellow League Two play-off hopefuls Notts County.

Exeter City have been drawn away to Milton Keynes, who have climbed off the bottom of the League One table, following an upturn in form. Four of the other five Conference sides are drawn away from home, but the exception, Woking, have pulled what would be seen by many as the plum tie, a home date with Nottingham Forest, the only side to win the European Cup and participate in the LDV Trophy. A shock seems unlikely, now that Forest have rallied following a poor start, but the Cards are on an upward curve as well. Stevenage Borough travel to

Swindon Town, scene of their fantastic 2-1 1998 Third Round FA Cup win, and Town will be hoping lightning doesn't strike twice here tonight. Dagenham & Redbridge, after a couple of seasons of transition, look primed to recapture their cup fighting tag of old; still unbeaten in the league Wycombe Wanderers could just be their victims. The surprise struggling pair of Aldershot Town and Crawley Town complete the picture. The Shots have been handed a trip to AFC Bournemouth, who will hope to gain the upper hand. The Kent vs Sussex encounter between Gillingham and Crawley is harder to call; having beaten Portsmouth in the Carling Cup, the Gills may find the tables turned.

Turning to the Northern section, the outstanding tie brings together the 2004 and 2005 LDV Trophy winners as League One Blackpool host a Wrexham side in the division below, whilst the beaten Northern Area Finalists from last year, Oldham Athletic are at home to a Carlisle United team who did really well in this competition in the late 1990s. The draw has thrown up some intriguing local derbies,



in Greater Manchester, as Rochdale welcome League Two colleagues Stockport County, and in South Yorkshire, as Doncaster Rovers, hoping for more cup success after victory against Manchester City in the Carling Cup, travel to divisional rivals Barnsley with Brian Howard now back in for The Tykes. Elsewhere, struggling League Two Macclesfield Town welcome Chesterfield, from League One, across the peaks, and a similar combination sees Boston United play Huddersfield Town, surely one of the favourites for the competition. Tranmere Rovers entertain Lincoln City, hoping to avoid an upset, and Scunthorpe United have home advantage against Hartlepool United in what should be an intriguing sub-text to the League One promotion race.

Three of the Conference sides are at home, the other trio away. Accrington Stanley travel to League One Rotherham United with the bang in form Stanley no stranger to league scalps in recent seasons. Hereford United will probably be in equally good spirits, as, defensively solid, they travel to a Mansfield Town side near

the bottom of League Two. The Bulls have impressive pedigree in this competition, reaching the last eight in the area semi-final before losing to eventual winners Wrexham last season. Fellow strugglers Bury have been handed a tough cross-Pennine journey to Halifax Town, who are always strong at the Shay. Kidderminster Harriers have striker Iyeden Christie, who is proven against League defences, so the game with mid table League Two Darlington should intrigue. The final two ties involving Conference sides in this section look decidedly tougher, as Cambridge United, who have been in mixed form must play host to a Chester City outfit firmly in League Two promotion contention. Morecambe's task is even tougher, as they look to "giant-kill the giantkillers" in a trip to League Two leaders, and Carling Cup conquerors of Tottenham Hotspur, Grimsby Town.

Bradford City, Colchester United, Port Vale and Walsall were given byes to the next round.

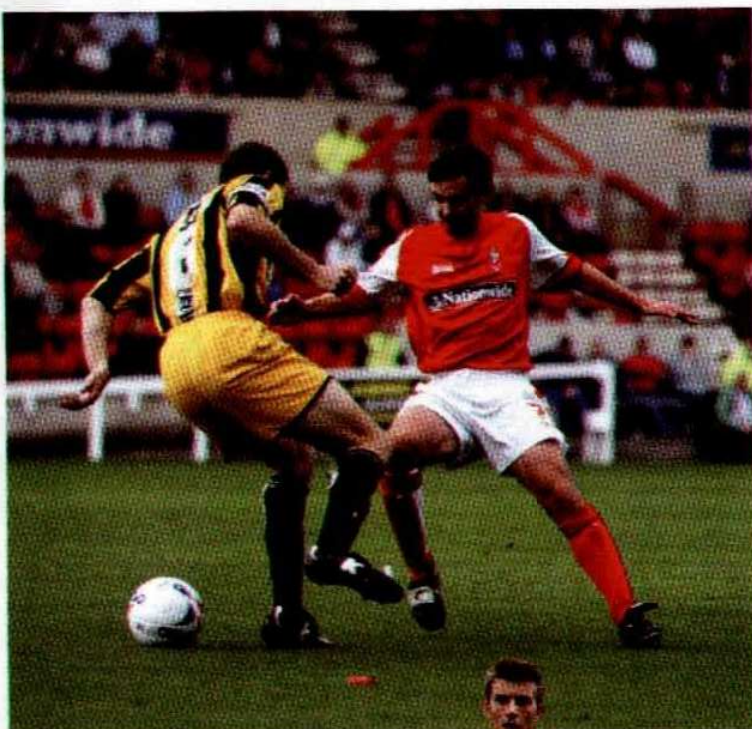
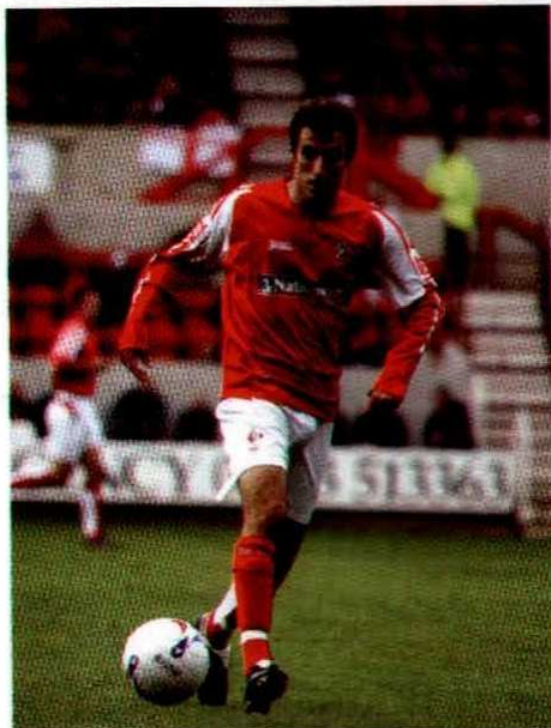
The match started with high expectations as Town kicked off playing towards the Town End. There four changes to the Town line-up with returns for Steve Jenkins, Gareth Whalley and Jerel Ifil while new loan signing Hameur Bouazza also started.

Town started brightly and continued to pressurize the Vale defence before taking a deserved lead in the 25th minute. Michael Pook darted down the middle of the pitch and sent a pass to McDermott who was overlapping on the wing. His precise pass along the floor to Rory Fallon was flicked home in style from eight yards, for the New Zealanders seventh goal in just eleven starts. The goal brought an enormous roar from the County Ground faithful and Fallon's goal celebrations were obviously based on the paintballing which the team had taken part in earlier in the week!

However, Town could not take the lead into the break as Vale scored a lucky equalizer one minute before the end of the half. A free-kick some 25 yards from goal was taken by Mickey Bell and the ball took a massive deflection off the defensive wall which wrong-footed keeper Tom Heaton and he was unable to prevent score visitors from drawing level.

The visitors started the second half in a more determined manner than the hosts and they went further ahead in the 53rd minute. A long ball forward by Pilkington over the Town defence saw Heaton dash off his line but the ball took a wicked bounce and Heaton was marooned outside his area which left Chris Cornes with the relatively simple task of tapping the ball into an empty net.

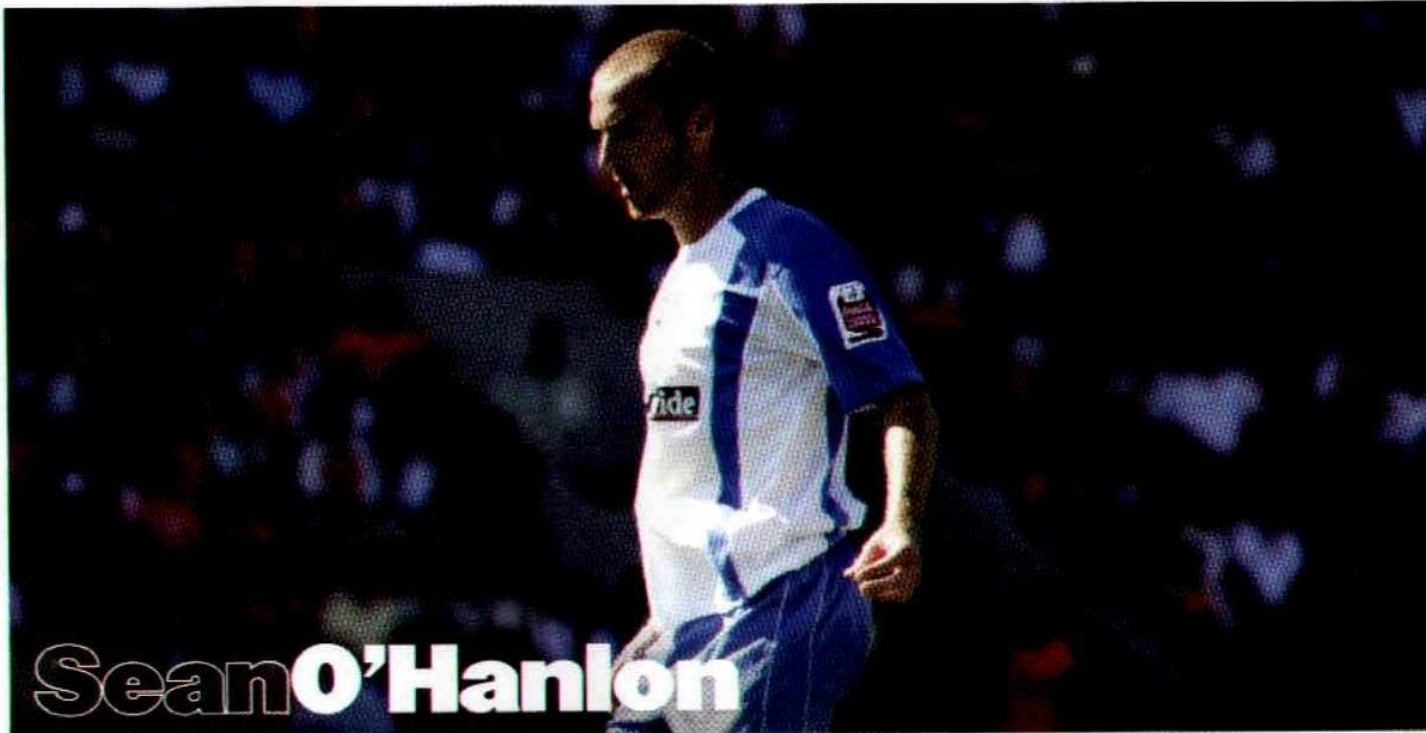

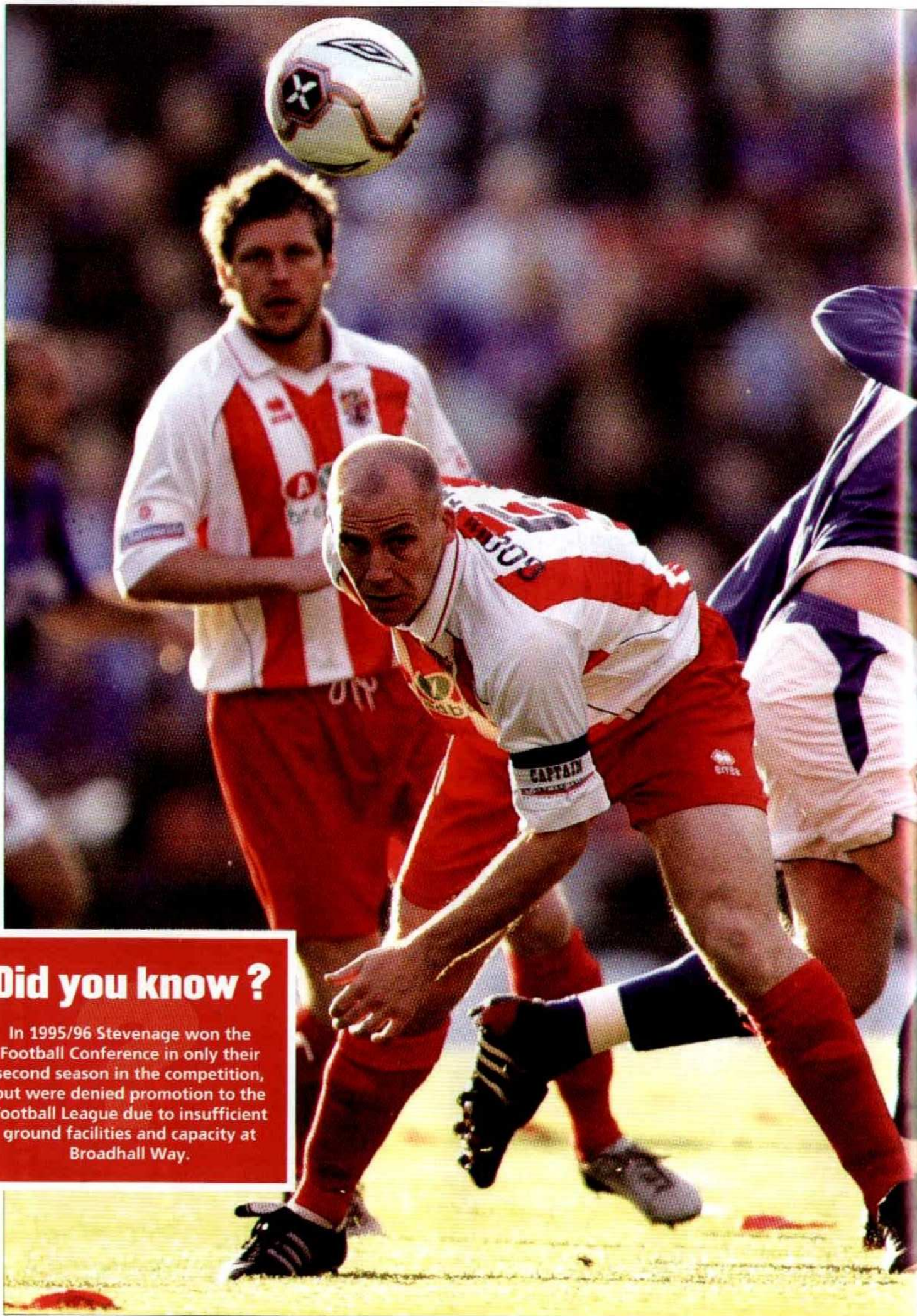

It's a big welcome tonight to our visitors from the Conference who make only their second trip to the County Ground...

Founded in 1976, Stevenage Borough have made huge strides through the football ladder and reached sixth in the Conference table on 21 point after 13 matches as they attempted to claim the prize of League football for the very first time.

Manager Graham Westley will be hoping to improve on last season's fifth place finish and eventual play-off disappointment to Carlisle. Automatic promotion would eliminate that potential this time round.

Anthony Elding is the man to watch up front. He was top scorer last year on 19 and has continued where he left off last term. Already on six for the season as October entered it's second week, he was followed by George Boyd and Darryn Stamp, on five and three respectively. Then seven players followed up on one goal each.

Boro's away form is not brilliant. Defeated 3-1 in the most recent away trip when Burton Albion put paid to their hopes

the weekend before last, Elding was the man to register for the visitors.

Just one win in seven attempts shows vulnerability, but a run to the Conference Cup southern semi-final last season shows their cup credentials, if we needed any reminder after that FA Cup match back in 1998.

Our season can't be accused of making the brightest of starts. A cup run might be just what we need to lift the gloom and generate some income.

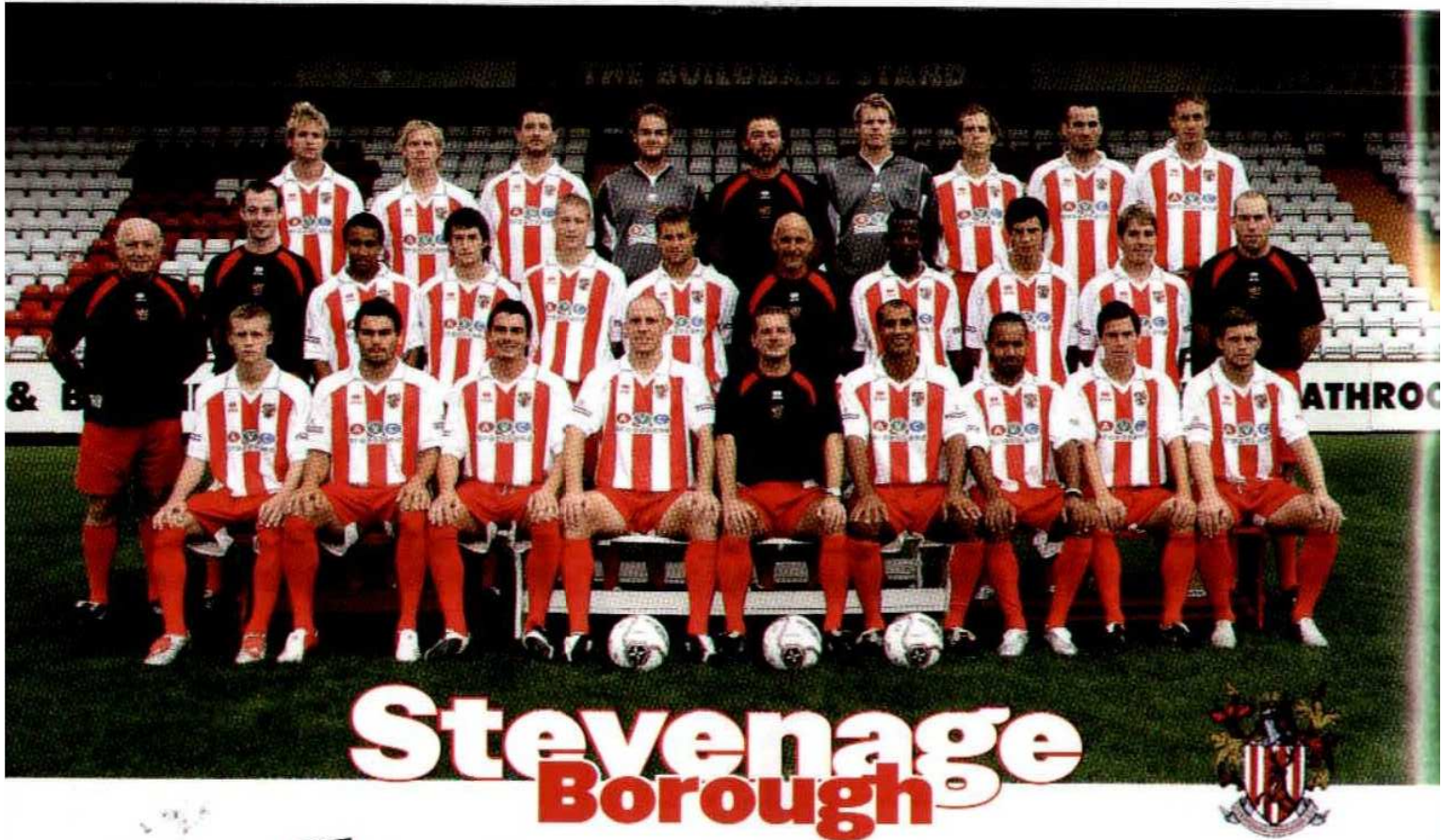
ONE TO WATCH: ANTHONY ELDING

Anthony signed from Boston in February 2003, and made an impressive debut in the draw at Hereford. Highly regarded, he spent trial periods at both Tottenham and Bolton whilst with the Pilgrims.

Scored several important goals in his first season at Stevenage, and continued that form into last season, scoring at more than a

goal in 2, and providing some of the most spectacular firepower seen at Broadhall Way. Made an appearance for Paul Fairclough's Non-League England side last season against Belgium at Darlington.

The Squad

Keeper **Alan Julian** joined Stevenage in February from Brentford to replace Andy Woodman after excelling in a reserve game at MK Dons. The 22-year old made 16 appearances for the West London club in his five years at Griffin Park, but was deemed surplus to requirements by new manager Martin Allen. Julian was outstanding in his 17 appearances last season and in that short space of time he has already become a firm favourite with the fans. Competition for the number one shirt comes

from **Shane Gore** who joined Borough during the close season from Hertfordshire rivals Barnet. 24-year old Gore made seven appearances for Barnet during their Conference winning campaign last season.

Hemel Hempstead born centre back **Ronnie Henry** was a Spurs trainee for two years, and during that time played three times for Southend United while on loan before joining Stevenage in January 2005. **Barry Laker** joined in January 2003 from Farnborough Town where he spent two years after joining the Hampshire club from Sutton United. He was club Player of the

Year at the Hampshire club for his last two seasons, and joined Borough with the reputation of being a solid defender. A strong, physical defender, **Matt Hocking** has strengthened the Borough defence since joining from Boston last year, but is more than capable of passing the ball, and scores his fair share of goals. Former clubs include Sheffield Utd, Hull City and York City. Now in his second spell at Broadhall Way, **Justin Gregory** originally followed Westley from Farnborough Town, helping Borough to climb out of trouble and away from relegation. His season was ended prematurely when he broke his jaw in a collision with Lionel Perez, and he returned to former club Crawley Town, helping them to promotion to the Conference. He returned to Broadhall Way in the summer of 2004.

Ollie Berquez joined Stevenage in the close season from Canvey Island, where he scored 12 times from his midfield berth in the Essex club's first season in the Conference. Has previously played for Braintree Town, Dagenham & Redbridge, Billericay Town and Chelmsford City. A most impressive capture in the summer of 2004, **Dannie Bulman** came from Wycombe Wanderers with some reputation. Strong and commanding in midfield, he brings energy and

played over 200 games for the Chairboys after joining from non-league Ashford Town. A product of the EFCO scheme, **George Boyd** forced his way into first team contention after performing well at Youth and Reserve team level. Was an important member of Borough's FA Youth Cup side that made it to the 4th round for the first time in the club's history. **Robert Quinn** joined Borough from Bristol Rovers, where he made 67 appearances in two seasons, in the summer of 2004. A steady performer who brings maturity to the Borough midfield, or defence when required. Former clubs include Crystal Palace, Brentford and Oxford United. Rob has played over 200 games in the Football League.

Jon Nurse signed from Sutton United in the summer of 2004, and set about putting the other strikers in the squad under pressure for their place. Scored 24 goals in the Ryman Premier League, and hopes are high that he can make a successful step up to the Conference. In his second spell at Stevenage, **Dino Maamria** joined in September 2003 from Charleston Battery in the States. His first spell saw him make a considerable impact, scoring goals that contributed to the club's climb out of relegation trouble, and he has continued in much the same vein since, causing panic in many defences. Tunisian born, his former clubs include Doncaster Rovers, Southport and Leigh RMI.

Graham Westley

Graham Westley joined Stevenage Borough from Farnborough Town in January 2003.

He began his playing career as an apprentice professional at QPR earning England Youth International honours along the way. He moved to Gillingham making his Football League debut aged only 18. Westley averaged a goal every two games whilst playing for Barnet, Wycombe Wanderers, Enfield, Aylesbury and Kingstonian.

A Management career began at the age of 28 when he took charge of Kingstonian, with further spells at Enfield, Farnborough Town. He took Stevenage from the 21st position they occupied when he joined in January to 12th in the last 3 months of his first season at Broadhall Way, with continued improvement the following season seeing Borough finish in eighth place.



Interesting Facts...

formed in 1976 following the demise of former town club Stevenage Athletic. After Athletic's bankruptcy the Broadhall Way pitch was dug up to ensure it never saw football again. The ground has since been rebuilt and now holds 7,100.

Inconsistent Season sees Ardiles move on



Only two teams were relegated from Division Two in 1991 due to the restructuring of the Football League. The authorities being what they are/were, had spent the tail end of the eighties reducing the top division to 20, but no one was surprised when they decided to put it back to 22.

That meant that Town's brush with relegation danger that year was slightly less fraught than it could have been.

A 2-1 away win at Charlton was a good start and the feel-good

factor continued with victory over Ipswich at the County Ground. But the season was to be notable for the inconsistency that Ossie Ardiles' men would exhibit.

Two points came from the next nine, then seven followed from the following three matches. When October came and went without a win, it was plain it was going to be a bumpy ride.

As 1991 began, Town celebrated the New Year with a 4-0 win at Ashton Gate where Bristol City were put in their place, and when this was followed by a home victory over

Hull City, we found ourselves in the lofty position of 10th.

Time for it to go wrong then.

One win in the next nine attempts dropped us to 18th and left us looking over our shoulders.

Old boy Paul Rideout was brought in on loan to help supplement the goals from Duncan Shearer, and with three games to go Town faced Leicester City at the County Ground, a team also struggling at the wrong end of the table.

A hat-trick from Steve Foley, a Mickey Hazard penalty and an own-goal were responsible for a flattering 5-2 score line, and the three points were to prove most welcome. By then Ardiles had left to manage Newcastle and Glenn Hoddle was at the helm.

At the final reckoning, Town finished fourth from bottom on 50 points. Leicester were level on points but below on goal difference, while West Brom and Hull City faced the drop on 48 and 45 points respectively.

The season was perhaps most notable for that thrashing of Bristol City, and a 4-2 win at Oxford in September. Each took just one point off us

all season, but both finished above us in the table.

Shearer top-scored with his traditional 22, Steve White followed up with nine and Mickey Hazard included all Town's three successful penalties in his haul of eight. Paul Rideout made a solitary contribution in his nine games with a goal against West Brom.

Of the others to appear that season, David Kerlake, Paul Bodin, Adi Viveash and Nick Summerbee all liked it so much they returned after a spell away.

It wasn't a bad season for Stevenage though. A haul of 107 points gave them the championship of Division Two North of the Vauxhall League by a massive 25-point margin over Vauxhall Motors. All 21 home games resulting in victory. 122 goals were scored and a goal difference of plus 93 recorded. That's some season.

The trophy lifted Borough into the Diadora League and they promptly took the Division One championship the following season. Stevenage Borough were upwardly mobile and none of their peers of that era have been able to keep pace.

On Saturday we are again due at the County Ground for the visit of Scunthorpe United in a League One encounter.

The Irons have made a useful start to the season after finishing runners-up to Yeovil Town last year in the race to the Division Two title. 20 points from 13 games leaves them 6th in League One and handily placed to press for automatic promotion to the Championship, a level they haven't graced since 1964.

Last year's top man in front of goal was Paul Hayes on 18, with Steve Torpey finishing on 12 in his sixth season since joining from Bristol City. He has now completed his 200th League match since moving north in 1999.

The man with perhaps the most easily identified name is Peter Beagrie (pictured). Keogh. Perhaps Iffy and the boys can take some inspiration from that.

Current top scorer Billy Sharp got the second with his eighth of the season and remains the man to watch out for up front. Another six players have one goal to their names, with Peter Beagrie amongst them.

Keep loud, keep proud and visit the County Ground again in four days time.
