The inclusion of David Stroud should illustrate to the other younger players here that they will get their chance if they work hard and put on consistent performances. It is not a question of how you get your chance, it's when and what you make of it.

I have said before that defensively I feel we are strong. At Huddersfield we managed to keep out probably one of the best front pairings in the division

in Abbott and Booth and we have been making progress on that front. Jack Smith is also nearing full fitness and Charlie Comyn-Platt has come in and done well. Alan

Reeves has been spending time with the back four and that is coming through now so all credit to them and the efforts that have been put in there. Ian Woan has also been working with the midfield and that is another area where I feel where we are showing signs of improvement. I maybe looking to bring in a midfielder of a certain type, or another striker, to add competition but we will see how things go.

Boston United are an experienced side and bring the likes of Julian Joachim, Lawrie Dudfield and Jason Lee to The County Ground today. I am aware of several of their players and we have had them watched. They have spent a little bit of money in the summer and brought in some marquee names so we will certainly not underestimate them at all.

Boardroom Talk



A warm Wiltshire welcome to The County ground this afternoon to Players, Officials and Supporters of Boston United.

I would like to thank all the fans who travelled all the way to Huddersfield last week where we got another excellent point. I know it was a long way to travel and I know the team really appreciate your vocal backing away from home. We now have an unbeaten run of four games and hopefully we can make it five with a win today to put us into the hat for the next round.

I have just returned from a holiday in New York where I went to Madison Square Gardens for a concert. In America they have multi-uses for their stadiums. Not only do they have concerts but these stadiums also play host to boxing, basketball, baseball and other sporting events. Obviously in this country there has been a tendency to have separate stadiums for sporting events which isn't cost effective, as they are not used effectively. We have started to do this with new modern stadia – The Millennium Stadium and Madejski Stadium being examples of this. At The County Ground we have already started that process by having the Elton John concert last year. We are hopeful of building on that good work with another such event next summer.

Today we are playing the first round in the FA Cup against Boston. We only budget for the first round of any cup and if we are successful today this will be a real bonus to the club financially. Obviously in later rounds we may be fortunate to meet a Premiership club and the cash rewards are greater as obviously the gates are a lot larger as are the respective prize funds on offer.

This week Mark Devlin and Iffy Onuora launched the 'Football 4 Free' campaign. Hopefully many school children and parents will take advantage of this. This is just the start of several initiatives we will be running so keep an eye out on the website and in the local media for more news soon.

The 30-year-old, who is 10 days into his month-long spell at Layer Road, notched his first goal for the U's - and his first goal of the season - to put Phil Parkinson's side back on level terms before Chris Iwelumo won it right at the end.

"It's only a matter of time. If I keep doing well then I'm sure I'll get called back," Cureton told the Evening Gazette & Echo.

"At the moment though, all I'm focused on is performing well for the lads and fans here at Colchester."

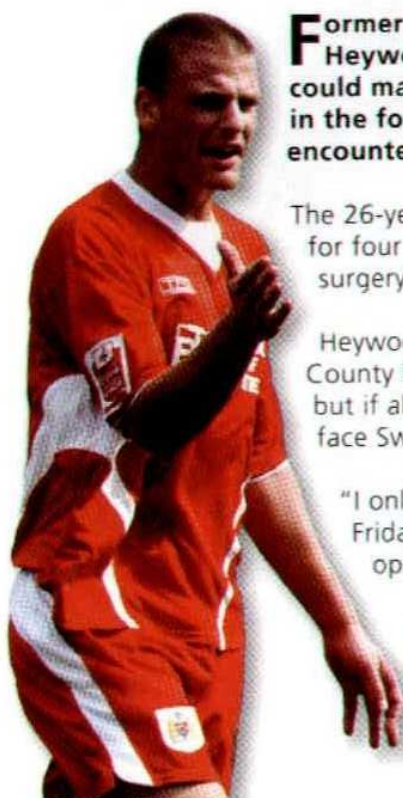

Heywood set for return?



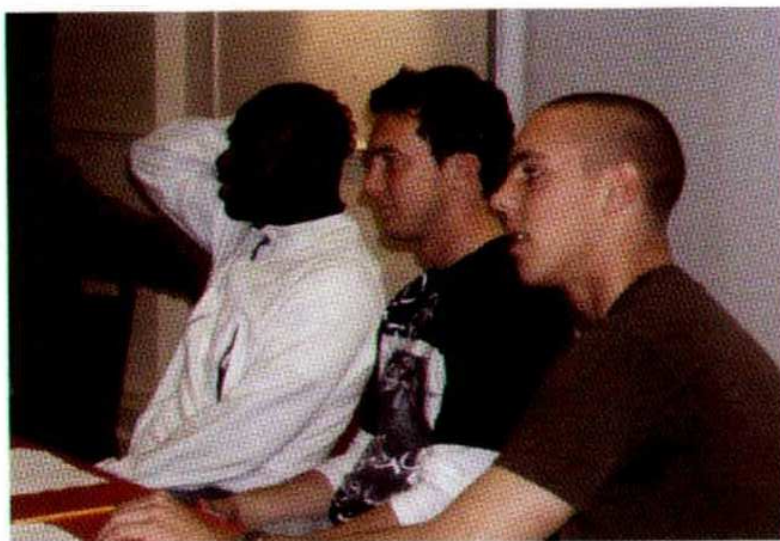
Former Town defender Matt Heywood, now with Bristol City, could make his return from injury in the forthcoming local derby encounter at The County Ground.

An Andy Gurney penalty after 39 minutes earned Swindon Town a point at The Galpharm Stadium and extended his side's unbeaten run to four games.

Swindon Town Manager Iffy Onuora named youngster David Stroud in his line-up at The Galpharm Stadium for his full first team debut, with Stefani Miglioranzi and Ricky Shakes also included in the starting eleven.

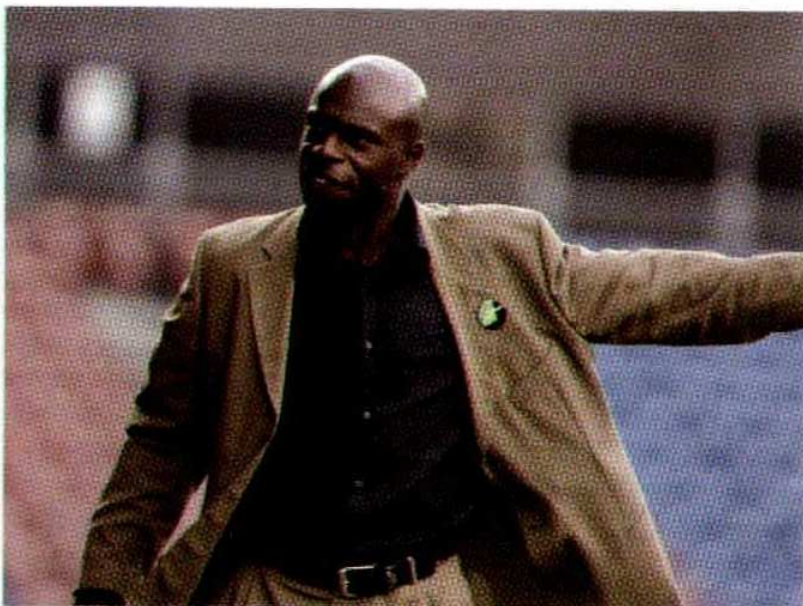
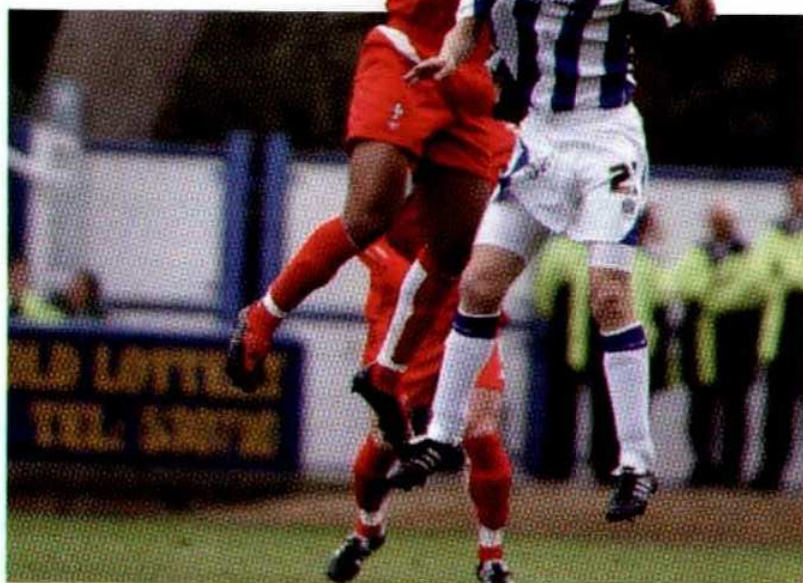
It was an attack minded line-up with David Stroud and Ricky Shakes starting on the left and right flanks respectively. Stefani Miglioranzi and Michael Pook filled the central midfield berths with Andy Gurney starting just in front of the back four providing extra defensive protection.

Inside the opening exchanges there were chances for Shakes, O'Hanlon and Bouazza before the deadlock was broken. Nathan Clarke handled the ball inside the area and the referee had no hesitation in pointing to the spot on 39 minutes. Andy Gurney stepping up to fire the ball confidently past Rachubka in the home goal to put his side 1-0 up.

Swindon survived a scare on 50 minutes when Pawel Abbott found himself unmarked inside the box. A cross from the right from found Abbott, but Tom Heaton was equal to the challenge and denied Abbott an equaliser - which unfortunately for Swindon was soon to follow.

Unfortunately for Town the lead did not last and The Terriers equalised on 54 minutes. A cross from the right from Danny Schofield was met by Chris Brandon whose left foot shot from 6-yards out found the corner of the net to make it 1-1.

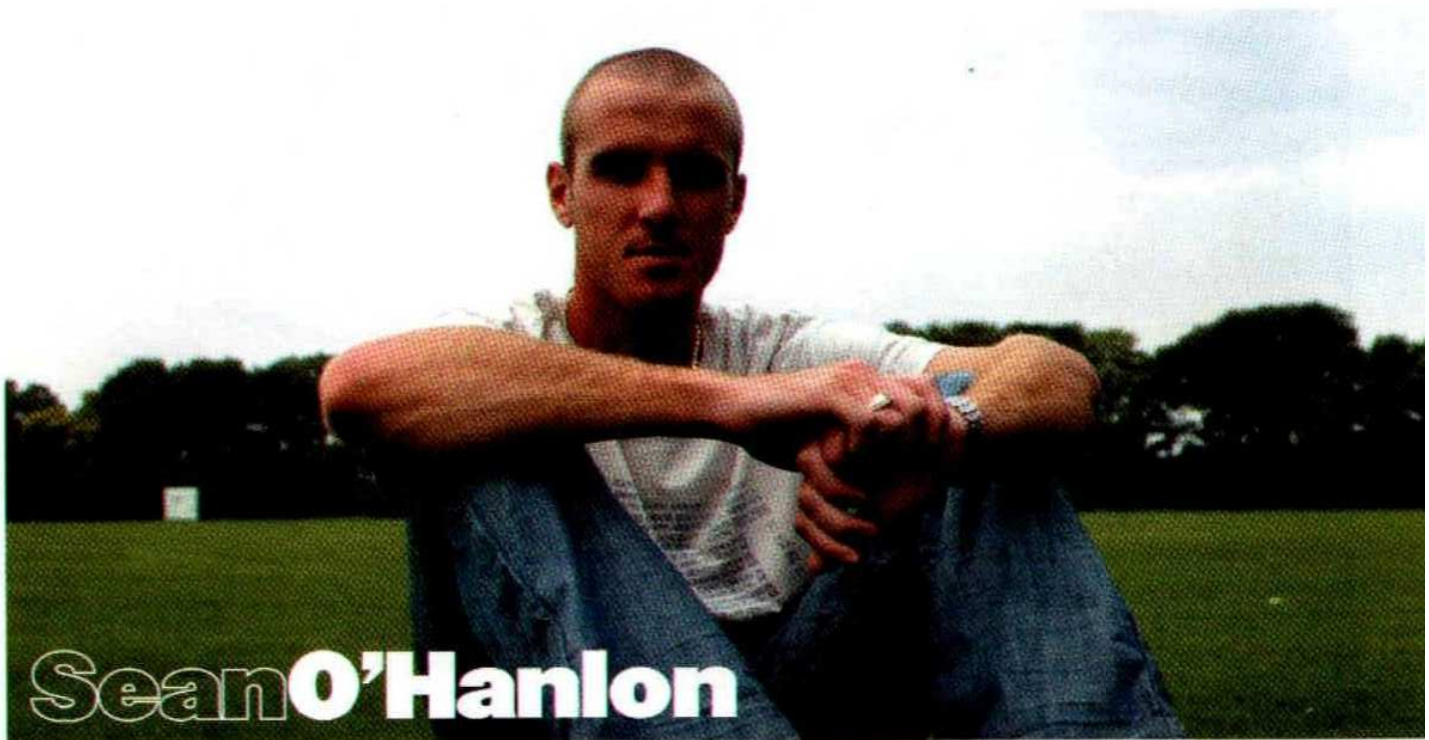

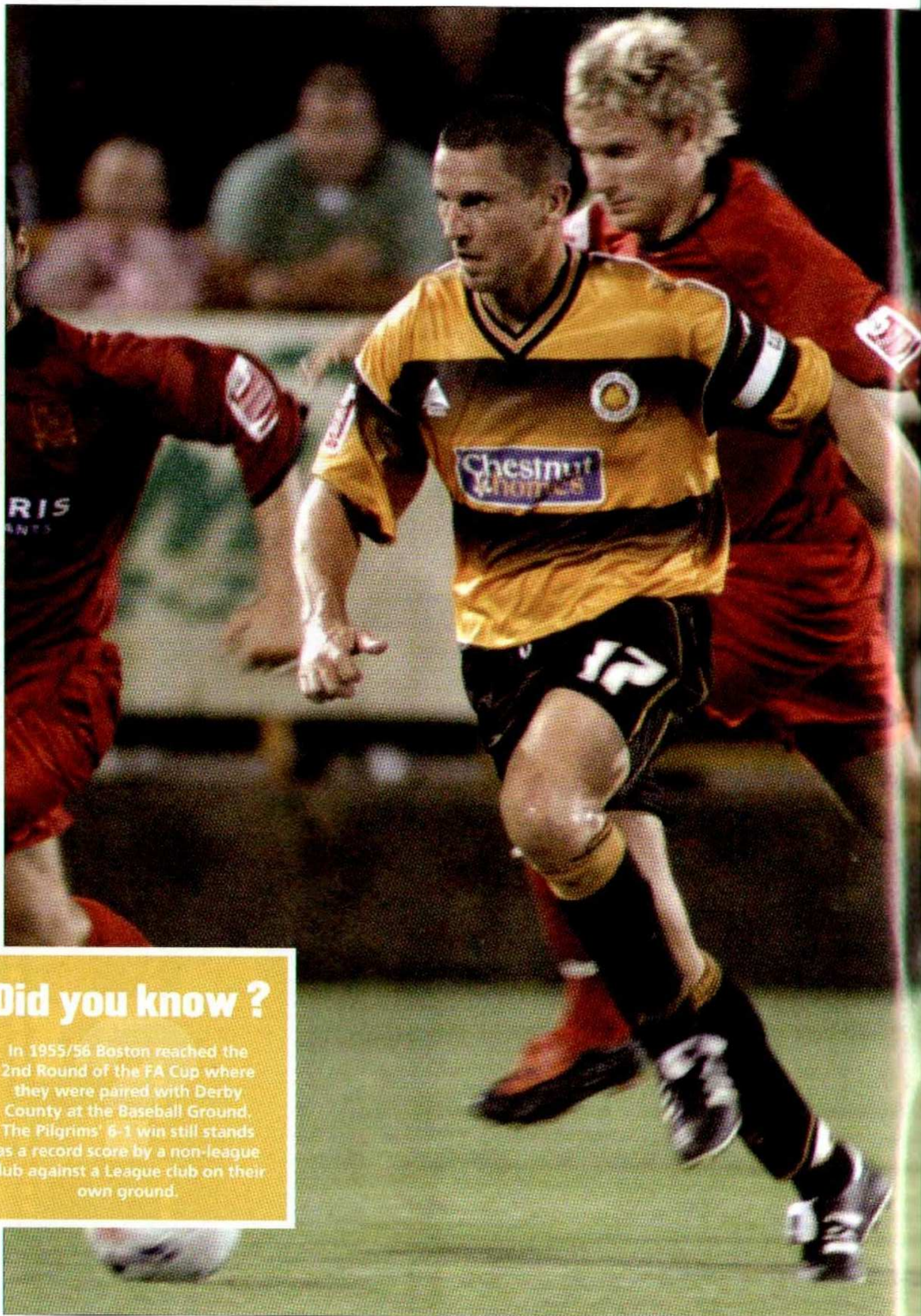

Today sees a rare meeting between Town and Boston United, the team who took the Conference Championship in 2002 to earn League Football for the first time...

Manager Steve Evans' team have made the sort of start to their League Two campaign that suggests even better times ahead. After three seasons finding their League feet, United were in ninth place at the start of this week.

14 points from the last 18 put our visitors at the top of the form table and having already defeated Huddersfield Town in the LDV Vans Trophy they are developing a taste for cup victories as well.

Julian Joachim leads the Pilgrims' goalscoring with

six all told. He might remember his fruitless strike against Town at Wembley in 1994 while with Leicester City.

Ian Ross is on loan from Sheffield United and he's hit four, along with Alan White on the same number.

People to look out for include ex-Nottingham Forest midfielder Jason Lee and ex-Coventry City and Leeds United man Noel Whelan who joined in the summer of 2004. Names perhaps more familiar for their famous relatives include Stewart

Talbot and Ben Futcher.

Back in 2003, Town travelled to Boston where we were dumped out of the LDV Vans Trophy by the Pilgrims.

We have a score to settle and Iffys' boys are showing signs of a turn around. With the challenge of cup football on the agenda the pressure of collecting League points will be lifted from their shoulders.

What a boost we could all get from a cup run. Keep being Load and Proud and cheer Town on to round two.

ONE TO WATCH: JULIAN JOACHIM

Striker Julian Joachim made a spectacular homecoming in July 2005 when he agreed a two-year deal with the Pilgrims, after leaving Championship side Leeds United. Joachim grew up in Boston and attended the town's Kitwood Boys School. He joined Leicester City as a youngster and made his debut in 1992. He went on to join Aston Villa and subsequently Coventry

City, before moving to Leeds in the summer of 2004. His appearances at Elland Road were restricted and Joachim was eventually loaned out to League One side Walsall, where he netted six goals in eight appearances, including a hat-trick against promoted Hull City.

The Squad

Goalkeeper **Nathan Abbey** joined Boston in July 2004 after a successful trial period. The talented shot-stopper was recruited on a two-year contract after enduring a nomadic spell at the end of the 2003-2004 campaign, which saw him sign for Stevenage, Macclesfield, Ipswich and Burnley in the space of just a few months.

Mark Greaves became one of Neil Thompson's first signings when he joined Boston United from Hull City in August 2002, and instantly became a fans'

favourite with his commanding displays. He is more accustomed to a central defensive role, although Greaves has also figured as a right-back and as a defensive midfielder. Boston United completed the signing of defender **Alan White** from League Two rivals Leyton Orient in March 2005. The former Middlesbrough trainee joined the Pilgrims after making 29 appearances for Orient, following a summer move from Colchester United, where he had been club captain. Giant defender **Ben Futch** moved across Lincolnshire to sign for the Pilgrims in June 2005, after rejecting a new contract with

neighbours Lincoln City. The 6'7" stopper was recruited on a two-year deal by Boston, following three successful seasons with the Imps. Futchler helped Lincoln reach the play-offs in each of his three seasons with the club, including two appearances at the Millennium Stadium. Ealing-born defender **Lee Canoville** joined the Pilgrims on a two-year contract in June 2005. The 24-year-old moved to York Street after leaving Torquay United, who were relegated from League One. He was part of the Torquay side that had won promotion a year earlier and in total made 121 appearances for the Plainmoor club.

Right winger **Brad Maylett** joined Boston United on a month's loan in March 2005 from League Two rivals Swansea City. The temporary switch to York Street became permanent and Maylett has now signed on until the end of the 2006-2007 season. Midfielder **Chris Holland** became a part of the Boston United set-up when he arrived at York Street from Huddersfield Town prior to transfer deadline day 2004. The Clitheroe-born player began his career at Preston North End, but also lists Newcastle United and Birmingham City amongst his former clubs. Experienced midfielder **Stewart Talbot**

joined the Pilgrims from Brentford in June 2005. The 32-year-old penned a three-year contract at York Street after requesting his release from the League One side in his attempts to move closer to his family. Talbot was Brentford's captain during the 2004-2005 season and played 49 games in the process. **Simon Rusk** is Boston United's longest-serving player, having joined the Pilgrims in March 2001 from Peterborough United. He was released from the Peterborough Academy, and Steve Evans moved quickly to snap up the highly-rated youngster.

Striker **Lawrie Dudfield** joined Boston United on transfer deadline day in August 2005. The 25-year-old striker was recruited following a short spell with Northampton Town. His final appearance for the Cobblers incidentally came against the Pilgrims on August Bank Holiday Monday at Sixfields Stadium. Dudfield was in his second spell with Northampton, following a stint with Southend United. Much-travelled frontman **Jason Lee** signed a one-year contract with Boston United in July 2004. The tall striker joined Boston from Scottish football, after spending a season in Division One with Falkirk. Lee is a well-known face around football, having previously appeared in Lincoln City colours during his younger days. However, it was at Nottingham Forest where Lee really made a mark.

Steve Evans

Steve Evans was the man who led Boston United to promotion to the Football League in April 2002, although he left the club at the end of the much-publicised FA investigation.

However, Evans returned to Boston in March 2004 and worked his magic again as the Pilgrims reached their highest-ever league standing of 11th position. Evans was originally appointed manager of Boston United in October 1998, following the resignation of Greg Fee. Evans' previous managerial experience saw him guide Stamford AFC into the Dr Martens League after clinching the United Counties League title in 1996-97 and then again in 1997-98.



- After winning the Northern Premier League in 1977, Boston were **denied promotion** to the Football League as their ground was deemed inadequate. Second placed Wigan were promoted in their place.
- Boston did gain **promotion to**

the Football League in 2001/02 after becoming a fully professional club. Celebrations were short lived however, as the club were docked 4 points for breaking FA rules over player's contracts. They finished 15th in their first season in Division 3.

- Arguably the most famous person to play for

United was **Paul Gascoigne**, who had a stint as player-coach in 2004. 'Gazza' made just five appearances for the club before quitting.

- Boston's longest serving manager was ex-England international **Freddy Tunstall**, who managed the club for nearly nine seasons in the late 1930's.

Heath Makes It All White for Town

Swindon Town beat Salisbury City by one goal to nil at the County Ground in the Wiltshire Shield Semi-final first leg...

Town began the game with three first teamers, Patrick Collins, Colin Heath and Tony Thorpe in the starting eleven and quickly set about taking on the visitors.

Colin Heath, on loan at The County Ground from Manchester United, provided a much-needed spark on 13 minutes as he ghosted through the Whites defence and hit a left foot shot from 20-yards which flew narrowly wide. Heath was once again at the heart of the action four minutes later, collecting a lay-off from Thorpe on the edge of the box, but his shot found the arms of visiting keeper Simon Arthur.

left foot effort into the top corner of the net.

Ashan Holgate was next to try his luck but after cutting inside the box, could only find the sidenetting before Town introduced Lukas Jutkiewicz into the action, replacing Tony Thorpe on 77 minutes. Minutes later Jimmy Walker then made an appearance in place of Heath, with Wells moving to centre midfield to accommodate Walker on the right.

Following Iffy Onuora's elevation to First Team Manager, Martin Allen has now been named as Youth Development Officer.

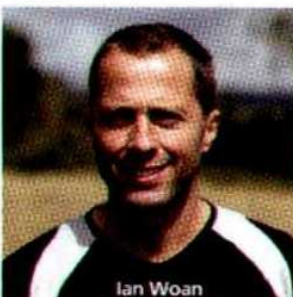
"Martin has come in and he is learning all the time. I have known him since I came back to the club and we have a good relationship – as is the case with all the coaching staff here," said Woan.

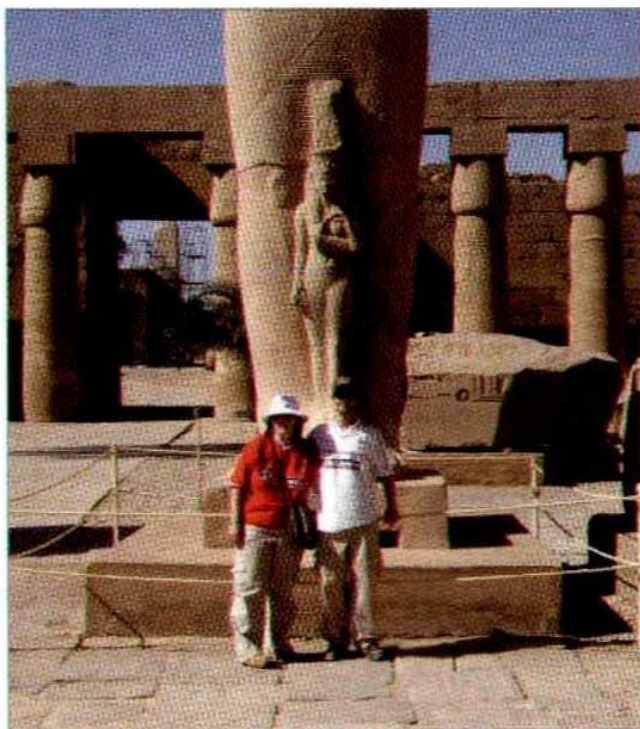

Another ball fizzes over the crossbar and I thank my lucky stars Colin Heath has not forced me to dive as I attempt to keep out his penalties at Town's Wanborough training ground.

Well, I wouldn't want to get my trousers dirty, would I? His miss from 12-yards prompts a laugh from Swindon and United team-mate and close friend, Tom Heaton, who's posing for a photographer (much to the derision of his new team-mates. "Playboy is it?" one of the other lads shouts, followed by a wolf-whistle).

"Get in goal and then we'll see who's laughing," Heath jokes, as I make way for the impressive custodian. And as I throw ball after ball to the youngster ('it's all about the service,' I tell him), Heaton is forced to concede that his mate's not that bad after all as he picks the ball out of the net again and again...beaten by a series of impressive overhead kicks.

STFC Magazine is enjoying a kick-a-bout while checking up on two young loan stars looking to gain first team experience in League One before heading back to the Theatre of Dreams. Experience seems to be the operative word too, for as well as the two United hopefuls making great strides in Swindon's first team, they've had to endure

a season so far that leaves us at the foot of the table, not to mention a change of Manager after Andy King departed following five consecutive defeats. "It's Colin's fault," laughs Heaton as we soak up the Autumnal sun. "He's bad luck wherever he goes!"

"Yeah, it's not the first time for me," admits Heath. "But you'll have to look up my record, I'm not going to tell you!" It's Cambridge, by the way, and the fact that they're now playing their football in the Conference tells you how they got on last season.

Sir Alex's decision to allow former Town boss Andy King to take both Heaton and Heath on loan in August strengthened the belief of many Town fans that this could be a promising season.

sharp and very focused in everything he does." Even the fans have heaped praise on both players, with Heaton receiving songs of 'Tommy Heaton' from the Town End in particular. Heath's goal in the Wiltshire Premier Shield was an indication that he too would like a share of the action from the supporters. "Tom has done fantastic, he deserves his place and the credit he's getting," he said after his goal. "That's what I'm looking for now. I want people talking about me."

Talking about Colin Heath is something the staff at Manchester United will have done since the duo moved to Swindon in August. And while neither player will learn how well they've done until they return, they seem happy with the way things are going at the moment. "It's

fight for my place," he admits. "But I've got my chance and it's been good fun, I feel as though I've learned a lot on and off the field." As well as fine goalkeeping skills, Heaton also has an underlying maturity that belies his age. Numerous goalkeepers would have retreated into the background following the mistake he made against Port Vale, in which the ball bounced over him allowing Chris Cornes to bag the winner. But a week later, against Brentford, he was magnificent.

The duo's debut against Yeovil also yielded a stunning first strike for Heath, his first goal in English league football, while Heaton played his part with a vital penalty save from Lee Johnson, although both Tom and Colin are taking credit for the save. "I told him which way to go," exclaims Heath. "That's rubbish!" laughs Heaton. Heath explains, "Last year I played for Cambridge against Yeovil and this lad had two penalties against us and he went the same way both times. I told Tom this information and whether he listened to me or not, he saved it! But it was a good match for us both, I scored and Tom made his debut." "And won man of the match!" adds Heaton.

The duo's good work hasn't



gone unnoticed back in Manchester. And while Heaton continues to train with United three days a week, sampling the benefits of working with Edwin van der Sar and Tim Howard, the coaching staff are keen to follow his every move for the rest of his working week. "Since my league debut I've had people down watching most weeks to see how I'm getting on, as well as phone calls to see how I am off the pitch," explains Tom. "The likes of Tony Coton are keen to find out about issues on and off the field, as well as offer me advice - so it's been good."

"I think when people come and watch Tom, they're probably giving a report back on me as well, even if it's one of the goalkeeping coaches," adds Colin. "Tony Coton came and grabbed me after our game against Walsall! The thing at United is you're always being watched and when

The thought of representing Manchester United at a professional level is what drives both players on to succeed here at Swindon. Tom and Colin are being put up in digs by their loan club along with fellow youngsters Neale McDermott and Patrick Collins. "It's a good crack," admits Tom.

The FA  CUP

First Round ■ Preview

40 TIES SEE THE 48 LEAGUE ONE AND TWO CLUBS RUB SHOULDERS WITH 32 NON-LEAGUE REPRESENTATIVES, SOME OF WHOM HAVE BEEN IN THE COMPETITION SINCE AUGUST, ON THE ROAD TO WEMBLEY...

There isn't a stand-out tie of the round, though two of the biggest matches involve League One sides going head to head, as Bradford City host struggling Tranmere Rovers. Doncaster Rovers, who host Blackpool, will be hoping successes of a more recent nature, in the Carling Cup this season, transfer into the FA Cup. Other League One sides have home advantage against League Two sides, as Port Vale play Wrexham in what is more or less a local derby, always a great leveller. Local is not an appropriate term for strugglers Bristol City, who face Notts County. Barnsley should be confident against an inconsistent Darlington side though, as should Rotherham United against local rivals Mansfield Town, struggling at the foot of the table.

The tables are turned for some other League One sides who find themselves travelling to sides from the league below, notably play-

off hopefuls Brentford, who are at Rochdale, and with the Bees being thumped 5-0 at Cheltenham in the League Cup, the Dale will be confident. Also in Greater Manchester, the League's youngest Manager, Chris Casper (a former loanee here at SNT), faces his first FA Cup tie as Bury face Scunthorpe United, and the trio of away games for One promotion candidates is neatly completed by Swansea City's match at Stockport County, who have won one of their home league games, and drawn the other six. It may be another stalemate here. Current leaders Southend United appear to have a straightforward game at Barnet, but with two victories against Bristol City in the Carling and LDV knock-outs, plus the elimination of Plymouth Argyle to earn that game at Old Trafford, the Bees seem a far tougher task in Cup action. Macclesfield Town are yet another side to have a difficult league start, something

which now seems a long time ago for Yeovil Town, who have joined the play-off chasers, and look likely to add a second round FA Cup berth as well. Lincoln City have been in modest form too, and like their opponents, Milton Keynes, have been hindered by too many draws; it will probably be tough to split them here. League Two leaders Leyton Orient host Chesterfield, though the O's best form has come on the road thus far.

Nottingham Forest have home comfort in their game against ambitious Weymouth, of the Conference South. Dagenham have been handed a tough trip to Hartlepool United, the sort of game they relished in the past. Huddersfield Town are sure to be hot favourites against an admittedly strong Welling United, who are runners up in Weymouth's division, whilst, AFC Bournemouth, too, will be confident of progress against Conference National strugglers Tamworth, who include former Swindon youngster Dave Bampton in their ranks. Colchester United play Leamington, a well-supported reformed club in the Midland Alliance, from six levels below them. Remarkably, they are not the

only Midland Alliance club to feature, as Chasetown, from Staffordshire, headline the home games with a televised Sunday game against Oldham Athletic, in what is a real venture into the unknown for the Latics. Walsall were upset last year at Ryman League Slough, and a live TV audience will see whether they succumb again at Southern Premier promotion chasers Merthyr Tydfil, whose habit of scoring late goals could be decisive. Wrapping up some fascinating ties is Gillingham's long trip to Burscough, near Southport, where the Unibond Premier mid table outfit await, in their first appearance at this stage of the FA Cup for 25 years. The Linnets have proved their stomach for the big occasion by winning the Non-League FA Trophy in 2003.

Still undefeated in the league, Wycombe Wanderers face Northampton Town, in an intriguing sub-text to their promotion aspirations, Grimsby Town have another home tie, their fourth of the season in all competitions, against Bristol Rovers, whilst Cheltenham Town is the destination Carlisle United face. There's a sprinkling of Non-League opposition for the Two sides, as well, as

Peterborough United are at home to Nigel Clough's Burton Albion, who are currently at the foot of the Conference National, but there will be more than a little trepidation at the Two basement side, Torquay United, as they have been handed a match with the experienced line-up of Conference North Harrogate Town. Shrewsbury Town have home advantage too, as they play Ryman Premier promotion chasers Braintree Town, managed by George Borg, who has inspired FA Cup runs at then Ryman sides Aldershot Town and Hornchurch in recent seasons. Chester City play another side from the same division; as mid table outfit Folkestone Invicta make a long journey north, but with City in decent form, apart from last week's loss at Shrewsbury, they should be OK. Rushden & Diamonds and Oxford United are the odd pair, as they travel to Conference National Halifax Town, and Conference South strugglers Eastbourne Borough. Whilst Rushden look ripe for an upset against a side challenging for a return to the league, a solid Oxford side should have little problem with a Boro side making their first ever appearance at this level.

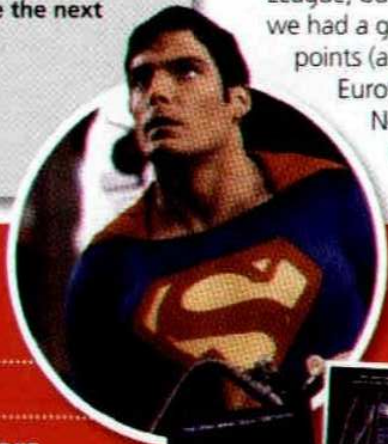

Trollope Saves Town from the drop

There are often lessons to be learnt from a glance at the history books and sometimes there's solace that can encourage hope for the future.

After five games of this season, Town lay in mid table with two wins, two defeats and a draw before we plummeted to the bottom of League One. In 1980/81 we were playing at the same level of the Football League, but after five games we had a grand total of nil points (as they say in the Eurovision Song Contest). Not surprisingly that left us bottom.

Defeats at the hands of Portsmouth, Fulham, Reading and Sheffield United would not be considered a humiliation today, but in 1980/81 we were all at the same level. The losing run cost manager Bob Smith his job and an internal appointment was made when John Trollope took over the role.

Luckily, after breaking the duck with a home victory over Rotherham, we faced Oxford United at the County Ground. So a guaranteed win there then. The fixture computer had decided that just three matches later we should go to

the Manor Ground. That gave us another point against the Oxfordshire side but it was a false dawn.

On 29th November, Town beat Hull City (who had taken the mantle of bottom of the table) in a 3-1 home victory, but the statistics didn't look good. Just five wins in 22 attempts had been claimed, all but one having taken place at the County Ground.

Then in December the corner was finally turned. Three wins and a draw hoisted us clear of danger and although Town lost just six more games, eight draws in the last ten of the season left us constantly looking over our shoulders.

The usually prolific partnership of Andy Rowland and Alan Mayes were up front, but it was in front of goal where we exhibited the greatest weakness.

By December, Rowland had hit five and trailed Mayes who had struck eight times. Then cash constraints forced Town to accept an offer of £175,000 from Chelsea and Mayes was a Blue. Roy Greenwood shared the burden up front until the burgeoning talent of Paul Rideout (above) claimed a regular place for the



last nine games of the season.

Seven of the last 13 matches saw us unable to score, but when the curtain came down on the season, Town has scraped a 17th place finish and survival.

In the League Cup, Town made a trip to Anfield where Liverpool stuck five goals past keeper Jimmy Allan for no reply. The money came in handy, although a gate of less than 17,000 disappointed.

As for Boston United, an eighth place finish in the Alliance Premier didn't make it a season to remember for the Pilgrims and defeat at the second stage of both the Alliance Premier League Cup and the FA Trophy didn't help matters either.

So, for Town, a horrendous run of defeats left us bottom, the manager sacked and an internal appointment made from the youth set up replaced him. Youngsters came through to become regulars, and after appearing dead and buried, Town survived the drop to the basement division.

All sounds familiar doesn't it? Let's hope for the same outcome this time around.

Always keenly awaited, our next League match at the County Ground is against our old rivals Bristol City.

Both teams have undergone managerial upheaval already this season. Brian Tinnion was relieved of his position at Ashton Gate earlier in the season and replaced by Gary Johnson, who had already brought his Yeovil Town side to Wiltshire.

Tinnion had been given little over a year to make an impression in Bristol in his first managerial appointment, but Johnson moved north through Somerset with international experience under his belt through a spell leading Latvia.

He had an immediate impact in Bristol when City inflicted Brentford's only home defeat so far in his first match in charge.

That though has been an all-to-rare bright spot in City's season so far. Below Town in League One for much of the start, City are still too close to the bottom for comfort.

A 65th minute Luke Wilshire goal gave City a 1-0 win over Tranmere last weekend at Ashton Gate, a win that lifted Johnson's new team two points above the relegation zone.

Last season was a good one for the Wiltshire Robins, with Town taking four points from six and recording a victory in the LDV Vans Trophy over their similarly feathered opposition.

This year's contest could bring head-to-head meetings between Grant Smith and Matt Heywood for City, and Christian Roberts for Town, all of whom have worn the red of both Robins.

A home draw in the FA Cup might still pop up before we face Bristol City, but currently our next match takes place on Friday 11th November 2005 with a 7.45 kick-off.

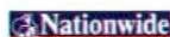

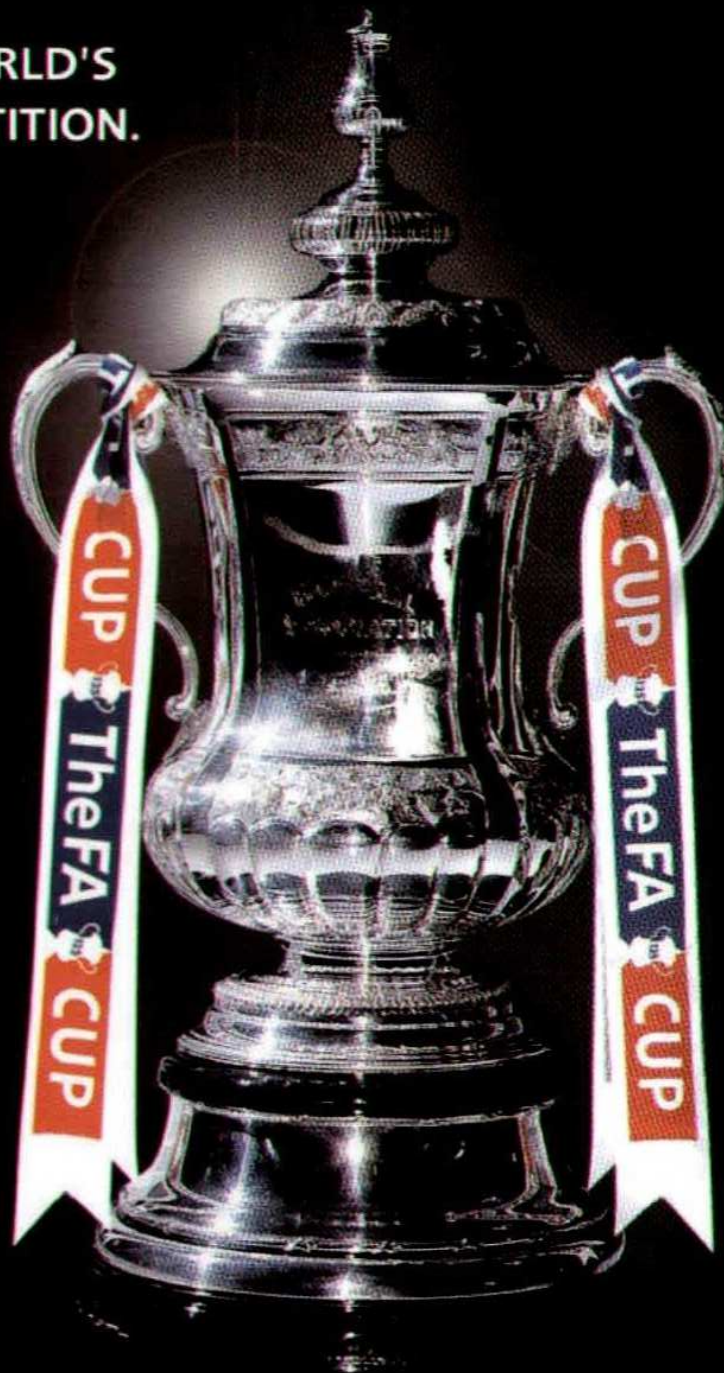
