



might not attract large crowds, but I hope our fans come to London Road and give us the support in this competition. On paper it is a cup that we could win and we will do everything we can to progress as far as we can,' Wright said.

Southend United have appeared in the last two LDV Vans Trophy finals at the Millennium Stadium, losing on both occasions and Wrexham are the current holders of the competition after a 2-0 win last season.

Over 35,000 supporters watched that win for the Welshman and the trophy is certainly popular with the lower league club's who see it as a great opportunity to play for a large crowd in front of the television cameras at the Millennium Stadium.

An extra-time winner from Richard Logan earned Posh this second round meeting with Coca-Cola League One outfit Swindon Town. Logan pounced two minutes into extra-time to earn Posh a hard-fought 2-1 victory over Bristol Rovers who had earlier opened the scoring through Richard Walker's close range strike.

Wright said after that win: 'For the 90 minutes of normal time I was very pleased. We played some good passing football, we squeezed the play and got our wingers into the game and it should have been over before extra-time because I felt we dominated.

'In the first period of extra-time we were OK, but in the second period we were poor and that gives myself and my assistant something to work on in training. I thought there were some good performances and I am pleased to be in the next round', Wright concluded.



## Getting To Know The



#### Tom Heaton

England Under 20 goalkeeper Tom Heaton played in 12 Pontin's reserve team games last season for Manchester United and joined Town on a six month loan in August. Has good potential and has immediately settled into life at the County Ground.

#### Jack Smith (top)

Signed from Watford in the summer of 2005, Smith adds youthful experience to the Town side and arrives with a point to prove. He was thrust into the first-team spotlight at Watford and coped admirably with the challenge of regular senior side football.

#### Kyle Lapham

A tough-tackling former Centre of Excellence player, local-based Kyle progressed the ranks through has made a number of appearances for the reserve team last season before signing a professional oneyear deal in the summer. Sustained a knee injury at Cirencester Town in preseason but is now back to fitness and eager for first team action.

#### Sean O'Hanlon (middle)

After impressing during an eight-game loan spell last season, Liverpool-born Sean O'Hanlon signed for Swindon Town in March 2004 on a permanent basis from Everton. Can play anywhere across the back four, showing his versatility.

#### Jerel Ifil

Powerful defender Jerel Ifil joined Town in the summer of 2004 after enjoying three loan spells with Town previously. Jerel became a fan's favourite during his brief stays in Wiltshire and signed on a permanent basis in June last year. A former Watford defender who has great pace.

#### **Andrew Nicholas**

He was a regular in the Under 19's side at Anfield and won many plaudits with his performances at left back, which prompted Andy King to snap up the youngster. Is fast approaching his 50th Swindon appearance.

#### Steve Jenkins (bottom)

Capped by Wales on 16 occasions, he was signed at the end of November 2004 and has provided added experience to the Town back-line. After beginning his career at Swansea, he spent a period at Peterborough United. Can operate at centre back or at right back and has shown his versatility by playing on the right hand side of midfield.

#### Neale McDermott

An energetic midfielder who signed for Town in August 2005 at the close of the transfer window from Fulham. McDermott, son of former England midfielder Terry, will be hoping for a regular starting berth at Town this season after the move from the Cottagers.

## Swindon Town Squad

#### Andrew Gurney

A versatile player, he can operate anywhere along the back-line or in centre of midfield, likes a shot on goal and is not afraid to have a go from any distance. A hardworking player who always gives 100%.

#### Stefani Miglioranzi (top)

Miglioranzi is the product of the American College football system in which the most promising players are drafted into Major League Soccer. A talented midfielder, who brings some Italian flair to the Town midfield. Operates in central midfield.

#### Hameur Bouazza

Pacy Frenchman who joined Town as Iffy Onuora's first signing since taking over as manager at The County Ground on a one month loan. Bouazza made his first start for Swindon against Port Vale and has been playing as a central striker in recent weeks.

#### Michael Pook

Third year scholar who has seen first team action on a number of occasions including the LDV Vans Trophy game at Boston United in 2003. An energetic 'box-to-box' midfielder who likes to get stuck in.

#### Ricky Shakes

A tricky winger with plenty of pace, Shakes signed from Bolton Wanderers in a deal which also saw Charlie Comyn-Platt join the club. Will be aiming to make a big impact in League One after dropping down two divisions. Tony Thorpe

Striker Tony Thorpe made the switch from Loftus Road in the summer of 2005, signing a one-year deal. The long serving Luton Town striker moved to Loftus Road for a nominal fee in the first few weeks of the 2003-2004 season. A former Bristol City striker.

forward.

Signed from Barnsley, the big striker made quite an impression against Town in the past, scoring on many occasions and catching the eye of former Town boss Andy King in doing so. Is a powerful front man, he holds the ball up and brings others into play. He will be relied upon for goals this term following several departures from the County Ground.

#### Colin Heath

Colin Heath can operate up front or out wide on the right and played in Manchester United's reserve team last season. Joined Town in August on a six month loan deal and made his debut for the club at Blackpool on 20th August.
