

Good afternoon, and welcome back to The County Ground for the traditional Boxing Day fixture.

I hope you all enjoyed your Christmas Day, and Santa delivered what you were hoping for. On behalf of the Board of Directors I would like to welcome the visiting Directors, Players and Supporters and wish them well for the rest of the season, with the obvious couple of exceptions.

I would like to start by thanking the fans for their excellent support recently, both at games, and in the backing you have given to the club in our efforts to stay and redevelop The County Ground. Firstly, the attendance of 5,766 for the Blackpool game on December 17, with not a great number of visiting supporters, was a real step in the right direction, numbers wise. At a time of year when attendances understandably dip, we were able to buck the trend, utilising the reduced adults prices and kid-a-guid scheme.

In addition we have received a tremendous number of 'Save Our Home' petition leaflets back into the club, which will be duly passed on to the relevant people. If you haven't signed the petition or written to your local councillor, MP or to the Swindon Advertiser, supporting our campaign to redevelop The County Ground, please do so as soon as you possibly can. Without the support of our fanbase, our attempts to stay and redevelop will be weakened, and we really need your support. Your local councillors details can be found at www.swindon.gov.uk, or alternatively you can support the fans' campaign at



www.keeptowninswindon.org.uk.

In addition to the future of the club, we are talking about £45million of investment into The County Ground area, and thousands of pounds of lost money in the local economy each season if the club has to move from its present site. The new stadium/hotel complex will also provide around 120 jobs for local people, and this must be taken into consideration.

We cannot rest on our laurels under the protection of the Goddard Convenant either. It has been made clear to the club that one option open to the council is to let the lease run out and then buy the convenant out. We can only guess as to what the council will utilise the site for then. Footballing clichés always include how crucial the Christmas period is. In our case it has never been truer. We have three real tests before the end of 2005, and I know we have a squad capable of beating anyone on their day- they just need to believe they can. Your positive, vocal support is vital and the players do respond to your backing. So please make some noise, shout your heads off and together we can aim to be out of the bottom four, come 5pm on New Years Eve.




Keigan Parker again came close for Pool as he stole possession and sidestepped the Town defence, before sending a curling shot from the edge of the area marginally wide.

Jamie Cureton won't be available to play against us today, but his form since joining our visitors Colchester United a couple of months ago has been a revelation.

Without a strike to his name since joining Town from OPR in the summer, Jamie claimed seven in seven outings for the Laver Road outfit, a major contribution to helping the U's to fourth in the League One table.

But that's not the whole story. Chris Iwelumo has hit 11 in all and leads the scoring chart for the Essex club, while Greg Halford also has more than Jamie with eight.

All told, that makes today's visitors the form team of the moment. With five wins and a draw in the last six matches, United are racing up the table with their eyes on an automatic promotion spot. Today's game looks like being a stiff challenge.

One of the few results that went our way last weekend was Colchester's 2-0 win over MK Dons, but while we're still bottom of League One, the form table is kinder to us than our League position suggests.

With nine points from the last half dozen games and all five teams immediately above us three points ahead, what a Christmas present three points today would be.

ONE TO WATCH: GREG HALFORD


Greg Halford's 2004/05 season can only be described as 'fantasy football'.

Having started the season at right back, he made the move forward in the Tranmere game and went on to score six in nine up front, including a hat-trick against Rushden & Diamonds.

He then went on to play in both central and right midfield, hitting

high standards in both positions. In his Colchester career Greg has played over 100 games scoring 26 goals and in recent months has attracted scouts from Championship and Premiership clubs with some impressive displays.







The Squad

Vastly experienced goalkeeper Aiden Davison made his Football League debut back in the 1991/92 season whilst with Millwall, and he joined the U's after the summer departures of Simon Brown and Richard McKinney. Aiden played in the top flight for Bolton Wanderers and Bradford City. In 2004/05, during his first season at Colchester United, Aiden made 39 appearances. He has also taken on a coaching capacity to develop the career of Dean Gerken a highly-rated young goalkeeper who provides

back-up and joined The U's as a trainee three years ago.

Defender Wayne Brown joined the U's on a permanent basis from Watford in the summer of 2004, having impressed in a loan spell at the end of 2003/04. Wayne is a combative defender who is prepared to get stuck in where it hurts, he has done well in his displays to date and has formed a formidable partnership with Liam Chilvers, who is an important member of the defensive core in the U's team and he has been one of the star performers in 2005/06. John White broke into the first team



after impressing in the reserves. A defender born and brought up in the Colchester area, the 19-year-old has shared left back duties with George Elokobi, with both players providing a strong physical presence.

Sam Stockley made the most appearances out of any of the Colchester United squad in 2003/04, the hard working fullback hardly missed a game, despite the 61-game strong fixture list. Sam had another consistent season in 2004/05, scoring on the opening day away at Sheffield Wednesday. Another virtual ever-present last season, missing only two games is former Town player Kevin Watson, a hard working midfielder with an eve for the killer pass. The Liverpoolborn Midfielder Neil Danns initially signed on loan in September 2004 to cover the U's injury worries in that part of the team, but returned in December to sign permanently. Neil helped his team win 2-0 in their last league game against MK Dons, scoring the first goal of the game. Former County Ground Loanee Mark Yeates was Phil Parkinson's third and final summer signing as the U's boss once again dipped into the Premiership loan market to bolster his squad. Currently Contracted at Tottenham

· Colchester are planning to build a new 10,000 seater 'community stadium' at Cuckoo Farm in time for the start of the 2007/08 season. They have been at the 7,556 capacity Layer Road (pictured) since 1909 and have been looking to move home since the early 1980's.

Hotspur, the midfielder scored his first senior goal in the FA Cup win over Leamington. Colchester United's longest serving player Karl Duguid, now in his tenth year with the U's having made more than 250 appearances. Karl is a true crowd favorite, however Karl is still looking for his first goal of the season. Twice named Young Player of the Year, Kem Izzet is playing in his fourth full season with Colchester United having originally signed from Charlton Athletic at the end of the 2000/01 campaign.


Australian forward Richard Garcia turned 23 on the day of his Colchester debut against Swindon Town last season. He has already shown in his appearances to date that he possesses speed, strength and quile and will offer The U's another option going forward. Competition in the frontline has been fierce so far, with Town striker Jamie Cureton having scored seven goals so far, but he cannot participate in today's game due to a clause in the loan deal between the two clubs. Giant striker Chris. Iwelumo became the U's first summer signing in 2005, when boss Phil Parkinson finally captured a player that he had been chasing for well over a year. He was part of the Brighton side that defeated Town in the 2003/04 Play-Offs.

Phil Parkinson

Phil Parkinson took charge at Layer Road in February of 2003 after finishing his 11-year playing career at Reading.

Whilst with the Royals, Phil was renowned for being a fearsome tackler who led by example. After a trailblazing start to his managerial career. Parkinson had a more difficult season in 2004/05, with his plans and ambitions largely hindered by the loss of key players to injury.

'Parky' has guided the U's to plenty of cup success reaching the fourth round of the FA Cup and third round of the League Cup, knocking out Premiership strugglers West Brom along the way. Last year, the U's joined Chelsea in being one of two clubs not to concede three goals in any league fixture.



Interesting Facts...

- · When The U's beat Leamington 9-1 in the FA Cup first round recently it equalled their club record victory, which was originally set against Bradford City in 1961.
- The clubs most famous victory however, came in 1971 when they

beat Don Revie's notorious Leeds United side 3-2 in an FA Cup 5th round tie.

> The biggest transfer fee ever received by Colchester is £2.25million, paid by Newcastle United for Lomana Tresor Lua Lua in September 2000.

Enjoy the game and I hope you enjoy the festive break.




There is no doubt that one of the major reason's for their success on and off the field has been down to their move to the magnificent Madejski Stadium, which is now the envy of all who travel along the M4 past Reading.

"It doesn't seem that long ago that the stadium was just a dream for myself and the supporters of the Club. The journey to Madejski Stadium was long and complicated, and many people worked extremely hard on what was a massive project," said Madejski.

"For 102 years, Elm Park was the home to Reading Football Club and whilst it served us well, there was no question that the old ground was out-dated, with no room for expansion and with facilities which fell well short of the standard required by the Taylor Report. In order to achieve all our aims and ambitions for the club and its supporters, we had to move to a new home. The final go-ahead for the stadium was given in April 1997. The Club's dream had become a reality.

"Since that day the club has experienced heartbreak and triumph both on and off the pitch, but with teamwork and co-operation between all parties involved, we can now enjoy watching the Royals play in a stadium which compares with those of football's elite.

"It was important to me to spearhead a project that puts the Club at the very heart of the local community and provides a facility both useful and available to everyone in the Thames Valley. The Madejski Stadium proves that sport, business and local government can all work together in harmony to give the community as a whole, facilities of which they can be very proud," said Madejski.





Will Christian have


Great Western Hospital on Tuesday to visit some of the patients there, how was that?


Was there a feeling after last week's draw against Blackpool that we'd missed the boat on three crucial points?

But they like him down there at Millwall - he's played well and I've heard good things from his spell there. He's enjoyed playing first team football and has grown in confidence.


Do you analyse his game when you watch him - did you ever do that when you were growing up?

And does it help in terms of your mutual understanding having Jack Smith alongside you - having played together before?


Certainly. It's one of the hardest things in football, getting teams and new players to gel and we know each other's game well. We talk a lot during the game and try and guide each other.

I just want to improve so my career improves. Firstly I want to escape this situation and build on this team next year. We have the basis of a good squad and if we can avoid the drop this year I think it will be a one-off. We need to stick together and hopefully do a lot better next year.

he summer of 1990 was the most traumatic that Town supporters have ever faced. A successful season had culminated in a victory at Wembley, but the celebrations were cruelly cut short.

The Division Two campaign started with a 2-0 home defeat to Sunderland, an irony that would become clear nine months later.

Eight games into the season, Town beat Plymouth 3-0 at the County Ground. It was only our second win and we'd

plummeted to the relegation zone. That started a run of seven wins in nine matches. followed by just two points in the next five games.

By Boxing Day though we were seventh and it was a case of grabbing a play-off place and holding on. From then on Town were never lower than fifth, and had a brief flirtation with second.

Leeds United were crowned champions on 85 points, beating Sheffield United to top spot on goal difference. Town finished fourth on 74, sandwiched between

Newcastle United and Blackburn Rovers, in the days when that didn't seem unusual.

Consecutive 2-1 play-off victories over Blackburn saw Town face Sunderland in the final where a deflected goal from Alan McLoughlin gave Town a hugely one-sided 1-0 win, and ostensibly promotion to the top flight

Then the Football League stepped in to relegate us to Division Three, before an appeal to the FA saw us returned to the Second.

The term 'financial irregularities' will still give Town fans sleepless nights and those that campaigned and marched

in protest can today take credit for perhaps the only occasion when supporters were actually responsible for their club's

promotion. The key to on-field success

had been a settled side. Colin Calderwood, Ross MacLaren and Alan McLoughlin were all ever present, while Fraser Digby, Duncan Shearer, Steve White, Jon Gittens and Tom Jones all made 40 league appearances or more.

Rather less omnipresent, manager Ossie Ardiles made his last two appearances on a pitch, coming on as substitute in the first two games of the season.

We had the usual, undefeated season against Oxford United, with a 3-0 home win and a 2-2 away draw, and November saw Stoke City despatched 6-0, with ex-Town man Dave Bamber helpfully scoring an own goal.

Duncan Shearer scored 20 League goals, Steve White 18 and Alan McLoughlin 12.

Colchester United meanwhile faced relegation by more traditional methods, finishing bottom of Division Four and condemned to a spell in the Conference.

With six draws in their first

seven games, a 4-1 win at home to Maidstone was followed by seven straight losses. Never out of the bottom two after October, United hit the foot of the table in March

and staved there to the end, eventually ending up six points adrift of Halifax Town.

Trevor Morgan, a man with both Bristol City and Rovers on his CV finished top scorer on just 12, and as that total included six from the penalty spot, it's not difficult to see why the U's struggled so.


At the time of writing these notes we were still days away from the Junior Robins Christmas disco so



The long haul through 2005 will be just about over when our next match takes place at the County Ground in five days time. New Year's Eve sees the arrival of Swansea City, who will perhaps offer us our stiffest challenge as we look to move away from the bottom of the table.

City have had a great first half of the season after promotion to League One last May. Top of the table they have lost just four times in the opening 22 games.

Perhaps the best indication of the Swans' strength come for the goal difference statistics. With a massive 21 goals to the good, you don't get such a wide margin without both consistent goals scoring and defending.

So last weekend's 2-1 defeat at Doncaster Rovers may have been seen as a bit of a shock. Defender Sam Ricketts equalised Michael McIndoe's penalty, but the Swans succumbed to an 84th minute winner from ex-Bristol City striker Paul Heffernan which sealed the points for the home team. City had played all bar eleven minutes with ten men after Kevin Austin was shown a red card.

Lee Trundle (pictured) is League One's top scorer with 17 goals and speculation surrounds his future as the January transfer window is set to open. The Swans have been reported ready to pay him £1m a year to keep the lethal marksman at the Liberty Stadium, but both Southampton and Sheffield United have expressed their interest in the striker.

At the time of writing, 31st December was due to be Andy Gurney's last day as a Swindon Town player as his temporary move from the Welsh club comes to an end.

Out with the old and in with the new. 2006 will need new resolve to drag us away from the wrong end of the table.


