windon Town arrive at Victoria Park hoping to improve their fortunes as they head in to the New Year.

Just two seasons ago. Swindon Town were helping Pools to celebrate qualification for the play-offs on a memorable afternoon at The County Ground.

Both sides earned a point and clinched their place inside the top six, with both looking to have bright futures ahead of them.

But The Robins could only managed a 13th place finish at the end of last term and had a disastrous start to the new term from which they have struggled to recover.

Iffy Onoura took the helm in the wake of Andy King's departure from the Wiltshire outfit in September and he is overseeing a battle at The County Ground which looks capable of pulling them out of relegation trouble.

A run of eight straight defeats during late August and Septmber left The Robins rock-bottom of the pile, but they've rallied of late and are starting to show signs of moving up the league.

Glasgow-born Onoura moved to The County Ground in October 2004 to take up a role as Head of Youth Development but his rise up the ranks has been a swift one after instantly making an impression.

A bustling striker during his playing days, Onoura bagged an impressive 116 goals in 351 league outings, most notably for Gillingham but also for Swindon in between two spells with The Gills.

And it seems as if the former front man has taken all his desire and determination in to the Manager's role as he looks to lift the gloom besting the former Premier League outfit.

Games between Pools and Swindon Town have a

habit of producing exciting football. Taking away that dramatic season finale at The County Ground two seasons ago and you are still left with decent helpings and good football and entertaining fare.

A 3-o defeat for Pools in Wiltshire last season was quickly forgotten when the scoreline was reversed as The Robins visited The Vic in early April.

A year earlier and lack Wilkinson was lighting up Victoria Park - the young striker's second goal for the Club in the closing stages of the home game tied up the points at 2-o after Gavin Strachan's first half penalty.

The main threat this season from The Robins has been posed by front man Rory Fallon who has been banging in the goals despite the lowly league position. His presence this afternoon could be crucial if Swindon are to win at The Vic for the first time since March 1984.



RHYS EVANS

GOALKEEPER

Town manager Andy King swooped for the young stopper in 2003 to give first choice keeper Bart Griemink more competition for the number one shirt at Swindon Town. Since then Evans has been a regular between the posts for Town and has turned in many match saving performances. He enjoyed a successful first season back at The County Ground in 2003/4, making 43 first team appearances and has now established himself as number one once again. His preparations for the new 2005-6 campaign were hindered by a knee injury and after a recent operation and spell at Lilleshall, he is back on the road to recovery and made his comeback at Port Vale on 19th November.

SEAN O'HANLON

DEFENDER

After impressing during an

eight-game loan spell last season, Liverpool-born Sean O'Hanlon signed for Swindon Town in March 2004 on a permanent basis from Everton. Having come up through the youth ranks at Goodison Park, O'Hanlon left Mersevside in search of first team football and was a rock in the centre of defence towards the end of the 2003-04 season and is surely one of Town's brightest prospects.

IACK SMITH

DEFENDER/ MIDFIELDER

Signed from Watford in the summer of 2005, Smith adds youthful experience to the Town side and arrives with a point to prove. Due to the departure of Paul Robinson to West Bromwich Albion he was thrust into the first-team spotlight at Watford and coped admirably, registering two goals - the first of which a 'Goal of the Season' contender at Sheffield United

in front of the Sky Sports cameras. Having made his debut towards the end of the 2002/03 campaign, the 21-year-old younger brother of ex-Hornet Tommy made another eight further appearances last term.

NICKY NICOLAU DEFENDER/ MIDFIELDER

Former Arsenal player who is equally at home in defence or in midfield. Signed from Southend United in the summer of 2005. Spent eight years at Highbury after joining the club as a 12-year old. Progressed up through the ranks with the likes of David Bentley and Jermaine Pennant, After two seasons in the reserves at Arsenal, made a loan switch to Southend United in April 2004 before making the switch permanent. After making appearances for Southend United and playing in the League Two Play-Off Final, Nicolau made the switch to

The County Ground as one of Andy King's summer signings in 2005.

JEREL IFIL

DEFENDER

Powerful defender Jerel Ifil joined Town in the summer of 2004 after enjoying three loan spells with Town previously from 02-04.Jerel became a fan's favourite during his brief stays in Wiltshire and signed on a permanent basis in June 2004 and put in some solid performances during the following season. Following Matt Heywood's summer defection to Bristol City, Ifil has now pinned down a regular first team berth in the Town backline.

STEVE JENKINS

DEFENDER

Capped by Wales on 16 occasions, 'Jenks' was signed at the end of November 2004 and has provided added experience

to the Town backline. After beginning his career at Swansea, he has also been with Huddersfield. Birmingham, Cardiff, Notts County and Peterborough. After falling out of favour at London Road under Barry Fry, Town Boss Andy King moved quickly to sign the player after impressing during his four game loan spell. A reliable performer who made the right back slot his own during the latter part of 2004/5 and he has made a solid start to the new campaign.

GARETH WHALLEY MIDFIELDER

Originally a trainee at Crewe, Gareth made over 200 first-team appearances for them before signing for Bradford City in July 1998 for £600,000. Gareth was a regular during their twoseason spell in the top flight and in March 2002 went back to Crewe on loan for a few months. In jury kept him out from early-November 2002 until mid-April 2003 but he returned to play a significant role in the Club's promotion through the Play-Offs. Left Cardiff in September 2004 and joined Wigan Athletic and subsequently made nine appearances for The Latics in the march to promotion to the Premiership.

RORY FALLON

FORWARD

Signed from Barnsley, the big striker made quite an impression against Town in the past, scoring on many occasions and catching the eye of Town boss Andy King in doing so. He joined Barnsley as a professional in 1999 after moving up through their trainee programme. Last season saw him score his first ever league goal against Blackpool and he quickly followed that up the following week in a game

at Stockport. King had become a keen admirer of the striker by that point and Town eventually agreed a disclosed fee with Barnsley to bring him down to Wiltshire. Having waited patiently for his chance, has scored a number of goals including a brilliant overhead kick from the edge of the box to secure a point against Bristol City in early April 2004 - one of the best goals ever seen at The County Ground. Fallon spent a one-month loan spell at Yeovil Town in February, scoring once in six appearances. He returns to Swindon after a strenuous summer spent training in his native New Zealand in preparation for the new season.

TONY THORPE

FORWARD

Striker Tony Thorpe made the switch along the M4 from Loftus Road in the

services in August 2003 and he went on to score 10 goals in 26 league starts for Rangers before making his switch to Wiltshire on Thursday 30th June 2005.31-year old Thorpe's overall goalscoring record stands at 136 strikes in 277 starts and he also scored one goal in five appearances for Rotherham United during a loan period at the end of last season.

STEFANI MIGLIORANZI

MIDFIELDER

Miglioranzi is the product of the American College football system in which the most promising players are drafted into Major League Soccer, A Brazilian born American who holds an Italian passport, As a footballer the genes don't come much better. What's more, Miglioranzi is versatile: he can play in defence or as a central midfielder and since

summer of 2005, signing a 1-year deal. Having started as a junior at his hometown club Leicester City, Thorpe then moved to Kenilworth Road where he established himself as potent finisher, scoring so League goals in 120 appearances, before attracting a £800,000 transfer move to Fulham. A short spell at Craven Cottage was followed by a move to Bristol City. with the 'Thorpedo' now attracting a £1 million for his signature. Again the striker proved a valuable buy, scoring 51 League goals in 128 appearances for the Robins.QPR paid Luton Town £50,000 for his

joining the club in July, has impressed in the middle of Town's midfield.

The last campaign saw the midfielder go from strength to strength at the heart of Town's midfield and after chipping in with his fair share of spectacular goals; he has quickly become the heartbeat of Andy King's team. A classy player who always looks calm and collected he has good body strength, which enables him to shrug off challenges. He also possesses a fine shot, which on regular occasions has forced opposing keepers to pick the ball out of the top corner of the net.

JAMIE CURETON

MIDFIELDER

Jamie Cureton joins up from QPR where he scored 6 goals in 20 league starts and he arrives with an impressive overall goalscoring record of 134 strikes in 274 league starts. A frontman with plenty of pace. Cureton lists his previous clubs as Norwich. Bournemouth, Bristol Rovers and Pusan Icons. Cureton, who has earned a reputation as sharpshooter, after completing his traineeship with Norwich City, returned to his home town of Bristol, to team up with then Rovers manager, Ian Holloway, banging in 78 goals in four seasons. After joining QPR February 2004, Cureton turned out in the majority of the games until the end of the 2003-4 season. He then found himself in favour at the start of this season, partnering Paul Furlong up front. However, after making 46 appearances for Rangers. 29-year old Cureton joined Swindon Town in July 2005 on a two-year deal and he will no doubt become an important player for The Robins.

RICKY SHAKES

MIDFIELDER

A tricky winger with plenty of pace. Shakes signed from Bolton Wanderers in a deal which also saw Charlie Comyn-Platt join the club. Shakes spent time on loan with Bristol Rovers and Bury during the 2004-5 season and impressed Manager Andy King during a reserve game for STFC towards the end of the 2004-5 campaign. He signed on for STFC in July 2005 and will be out to prove what he can do in League One.

ANDY NICHOLAS

MIDFIELDER

'Nicho' joined Town in the close season of 2003 following his decision to leave Liverpool, where he came through the youth system but struggled to break into the first team. After working his way into the manager's starting line up with some hard work in training, Andrew seized his chance to become a regular member of the side throughout the 2003/04 season. Despite making such a positive impression during the 2003-4 season, the 2004-5 campaign saw the defender struggle with injuries and was unable to gain a regular starting berth. However, having arrived refreshed for the new season - 'Nicho' is now back in the squad under new Manager Iffy Onuora and has made a handful of appearances this term as he approaches 50 appearances for Swindon Town.

KYLE LAPHAM

DEFENDER

A tough-tackling former Centre of Excellence player, local-based Kyle progressed through the ranks and has made a number of appearances for the reserve team last season before signing a professional oneyear deal in the summer. Sustained a knee injury at Cirencester Town in preseason but is now back to fitness and eager for first team action.

CHARLIE COMYN-PLATT MIDFIELDER

Charlie Comyn-Platt joined the Bolton Academy in the summer of 2002 after a long association with the club. The assured defender was called into the first team for the first time in September 2003, and he was handed his debut

when replacing Bruno N'Gotty for the final nine minutes of the 3-1 Carling Cup win over Walsall. After being released by Bolton in the summer of 2005 he made the switch to The County Ground on a one-year contract. Having come on as a late substitute against Boston United in the FA Cup, he scored a late equaliser after taking his place as an emergency striker!

CHRISTIAN ROBERTS FORWARD

Cardiff-born striker who joined Town on Thursday 14th October 2004 in a £50,000 switch from local rivals Bristol City. He is an aggressive runner and will add much needed pace to the Swindon frontline. Made a tremendous start to his Town career, scoring the winner on his debut against Oldham Athletic but was then ruled out with a hernia operation.

MICHAEL POOK

MIDFIELDER

Third year scholar who has seen first team action on a number of occasions including the LDV Vans Trophy game at Boston United in 2003. An energetic 'box-tobox' midfielder. 'Pooky' signed a professional contract ahead of the 2005-6 season and was a consistent performer for the youth team and reserves last term, Scored his first senior goal in the home defeat by Wycombe Wanderers and has played in every first team game so far this season.

PATRICK COLLINS DEFENDER


...THE MAYOR'S VIEW

I am writing these notes on the 21st of December due to printing deadlines so, as I write we still have to embark on our busy festive period of games



Our 2-o victory was capped off by a SUPERB lobbed goal from teenage Striker Jack Wilkinson after Gavin Strachan's early penalty.


9) 2003-04 (Away)







The Y5 and Y6 pupils from Hart, Kingsley and St





Similarly James Brown has been out for some time now and has shown a great attitude. James has also started jogging outdoors now and we're working on a programme to strengthen his knee joint.


Micky Barron returned to the Treatment Room briefly after picking up a back injury in the game at Walsall, but he has shown improvement on

systems have recovered as much as possible. It will not have been possible to have fully recovered faced with a schedule such as this, but the other teams have faced similar numbers of fixtures. and therefore we should benefit from the work we have done previously. and the professional way the players approach recovery sessions.

The Reserves have had to work hard as well. Injuries

and suspensions are inevitable at this stage, and therefore it's important that the players on the fringes of the squad are ready to step into the first team if needed. This makes their training a balancing act. It is important that they train hard enough to ensure they are sharp enough to be called upon, but not too hard that they would be fatigued.
