





# PHIL PARKINSON

Good afternoon and welcome back here to Layer Road for our latest league game against Swindon Town.

The positive side of Tuesday's game against Swansea was certainly the first half performance. The way that we played during that first spell was close to being back to how we have played for much of the season.

Alongside that deal, Blackpool boss Simon Grayson and myself agreed to do a swap deal with strikers Gareth Williams and Scott Vernon. Scott is a player of huge potential, who has scored goals at a very young age for Oldham and had a very successful loan spell with Blackpool.

Since joining them on a permanent basis, he will perhaps feel that things haven't gone so well for him, but I feel that he can come here and make an impact for us in the last eleven games of the season.

Congratulations to the youth team for winning their League Cup Southern Final on Wednesday. It was a strong, committed performance and they thoroughly deserved their victory.

I appreciated the support on Tuesday night and I think the supporters remained as positive as possible and if you can do that between now and the end of the season you know you will have done your part.



In this afternoon's matchday magazine, we reflect on the events of the last week or so...

### 21.03.06

Having helped their sides to victories in midweek. Robbie King and Mark Cousins help their loan clubs to positive results again.

Whilst the senior side are in action up at Oldham, Robbie helps Hereford United come from two goals down against Conference leaders Accrington Stanley to earn a 2-2 draw at Edgar Street.

And Mark guides Enfield Town to a victory over the U's local neighbours Wivenhoe Town. Although he is unable to keep a clean sheet on this occasion, the young U's goalkeeper is beaten only once – by an own goal – as Town record a 2-1 win and maintain their promotion push.

### 14.03.06

Despite two bookings in his last two games, U's midfielder Neil Danns will not have to serve a suspension.

The yellow card at Oldham on Saturday took Dannsy to five for the season and he made it six when he also got carded in the LDV Vans game against Swansea on Tuesday night.

However, due to the FA rulings, he will not be banned.

Players are only suspended for five bookings if those cards accrue between the first day of the season and the final day of February.

After that time, players are warned as to their future conduct and Dannsy has received that letter this week.

Should the U's midfielder, or any other player, tally up ten bookings between now and the end of the season, then they will serve a suspension.


Greg Halford is left with his head in his hands as a cross from the left is nodded towards goal by the U's man, only for it to pop back off the post.





# OUR VISITORS ... SWINDON TOWN



Gareth Whalley - confident of survival

With ten games remaining of the current campaign, most teams know what their goals are as the 2005/6 season comes to a close.

And, whether it be dreams of earning promotion to the Championship, consolidation in mid-table or escaping relegation, the pressure begins to step up a level as the final quarter of the campaign gets underway.

All of a sudden, games begin to run out and there are fewer opportunities to collect much needed points to achieve the required

For this afternoon's visitors Swindon, the hope for the remainder of the season is to finally haul themselves clear of the bottom four and retain their League One status for another season.

Although they rose as high as sixteenth in February, the Robins have nine games left to jump above that much feared dotted line, having slipped back into the bottom four once again at the start of March.

That drop down the table came on the back of a losing streak that included a 7-1 thumping at Nottingham Forest and a 3-2 defeat at the hands of fellow strugglers Rotherham United, but Iffy Onuora's side steadied the ship last Saturday as they

travelled to Yeovil and picked up a point in a 0-0 draw at Huish Park.

"I felt we did enough to win the game," he insisted, after Jamie Cureton had hit the nost late on

"We were the better side except at the start of each half, when Yeovil had some good spells.

But I was relieved to keen a clean sheet after three successive defeats - this can put us in good heart."

### Productive

Curo has enjoyed a more positive time at the County Ground having returned back to his parent club following a productive loan spell with the U's.

He has scored five in his last nine games, but on the last three occasions in which he has struck, those goals have garnered just three points as the ball has hit the back of the net too frequently for Onuora's liking.

That said, Swindon still have plenty to play for. Although coming into today's game in 22nd place in the table, there are six teams within three points of the Wiltshire based side and the picture can change very quickly with one or two crucial victories.

And midfielder Gareth Whalley, who made his first appearance since before Christmas

in the game against Yeovil last weekend, believes his side can still haul themselves clear of the drop.

He told the Swindon Advertiser: "After a performance like that there's belief and we needed that to help us kick on for the remaining games.

"If we play like we did here and keep that self belief we can go and get a result

"Having seen most teams in this division. don't think there's a great deal of difference between the top and the bottom still. We have nothing to fear going to any club in the division."







# ROBINS' LAST XI

RHYS EVANS Having started out at Chelsea – representing England U21s during his time at Stamford Bridge – Rhys joined Swindon in 2003 to give first choice keeper Bart Griemink more competition for the number one shirt. Since then Evans has been a regular between the posts for Town and has turned in many match saving performances.

SEAN O'HANLON After impressing during an eight-game loan spell last season, Liverpool-born Sean signed in March 2004 on a permanent basis from Everton. He was a rock in the centre of defence towards the end of the 2003-04 season and is surely one of Town's brightest prospects. A composed customer, O'Hanlon has captained the side on a number of occasions.

ANDY GURNEY 'Gurns' rejoined Swindon on a permanent basis in January 2005 after failing to pin down a regular place in the Swansea's starting line-up. A versatile player, he can operate anywhere along the backline or in centre of midfield and likes a shot on goal and is not afraid to have a go from any distance. Andy lists his other clubs as Torquay United, Bristol Rovers and Reading.

**STEVE JENKINS** Capped by Wales on 16 occasions, Steve was signed at the end of November 2004 and has provided added

experience to the Town backline. After beginning his career at Swansea, he has also been with Huddersfield, Birmingham, Cardiff, Notts County and Peterborough.

JACK SMITH Signed from Watford in the summer of 2005, Due to the departure of Paul Robinson to West Bromwich Albion he was thrust into the first-team spotlight at Watford and coped admirably, registering two goals, but eventually found his first team opportunities limited and opted to make the switch to the County Ground.

GARETH WHALLEY Originally a trainee at Crewe, Gareth made over 200 first-team appearances for them before signing for Bradford City in July 1998 for £600,000. Gareth was a regular during their two-season spell in the top flight, before joining Cardiff. He left the Bluebirds in September 2004 and joined Wigan, where he made nine appearances for The Latics in the march to promotion to the Premiership. Signed for Swindon Town in July 2005 from the Latics on a free transfer.

MICHAEL POOK An energetic 'box-tobox' midfielder, Michael signed a professional contract ahead of the 2005/6 season and was a consistent performer for the youth team and reserves last term. He has been a common face in the first team starting eleven so far this season.

AARON BROWN Former Bristol City winger who has done the tour of West

Country clubs, having also played for Exeter City, Torquay United and Cheltenham Town before signing for Town this season. He will hope that his move to Swindon – for whom he has played 19 times this season – will give him regular action.

ANDY NICHOLAS 'Nicho' joined Town in the close season of 2003 following his decision to leave Liverpool. He was a regular in the U19s side at Anfield and won many plaudits with his performances at left back, which prompted Andy King to snap up the youngster.

LEE PEACOCK Lee is a familiar face for the U's defenders, having also faced them during his time with Bristol City and Sheffield Wednesday. He joined Swindon during the January transfer window after falling out of favour with the Owls and made an immediate impression as he scored on his debut. He has gone for over £1m in transfer fees during his career. including big moves to Manchester City and Bristol.

JAMIE CURETON A player who needs no introduction to Colchester United fans, following his highly successful loan spell with the U's earlier in the campaign. Having joined Town from QPR, things got off to a shaky start for the nippy forward but his season was rejuvenated by a temporary move to Layer Road, where he scored seven goals. Since returning to the County Ground, he has scored a further five times.

# FROM THE OTHER SIDE

### What do you think Swindon's chances are of avoiding the drop?

After watching our game on Saturday at Yeovil, I would say that we have a good chance of staying up particularly if Gareth Whalley stays in midfield following his superb display after being out of the team for a long time.

### What have been the main problems that have put Town in this predicament?

We struggled to find any momentum at the start of the season after losing Sam Parkin at the end of the previous campaign and seem to have been on the back foot since.

The other problem is a lack of goals from our midfield with far too much reliance on Rory Fallon scoring - before Christmas, it seemed that if he didn't score, then no one would score for us. Jamie Cureton's return eased some of those concerns although Fallon ultimately left us to join Swansea.

### Which players have shone despite the disappointment so far?

No surprise for Col U fans - Jamie Cureton has shone as has Lee Peacock who has worked fantastically hard with little return. Charlie Comyn-Platt also made a real impact before his injury, as did Paul Smith who added much needed strength and aggression in midfield before he too got

injured. Incidentally Smith and Comyn-Platt's injuries coincided with the start of our recent three match losing spell but we hope that one or both will be back for the visit to Layer Road.

### How much have Swindon benefited from Jamie Cureton's spell with Colchester?

Swindon benefited massively from Jamie's spell at Colchester because he looked low on confidence before his loan spell at Layer Road. However Jamie's goals playing for Colchester definitely helped his confidence

and he returned looking much keener to get on the scoresheet for Swindon - so thank you, Phil Parkinson!

### What do you expect from the U's and what do you think Saturday's result will be?

I am predicting a 3-1 win for Swindon with Jamie Cureton scoring two and Lee Peacock getting just reward for his hard work with a goal for us as well.

# OPPOSING VIEW

With seven goals in ten games for the U's in a two-month loan period at the end of last year, Jamie Cureton made himself a firm favourite with the Layer Road crowd and hopes were high that the nippy forward may turn his temporary spell into a permanent one.

However, with his side ensconced in a relegation battle, Swindon boss Iffy Onuora understandably took Jamie back to the County Ground at the end of that loan spell to see if his prolific run could continue for the West Country side.

Five goals in twelve outings since his return suggests that the former Reading hitman has kept his good form and he will be one to watch as Swindon visit Layer Road for today's match.

Jamie spoke to U's Review and revealed that he is happy that he is hitting the net and told us about Swindon's fortunes since he returned.

He said: "Of course it is pleasing that I have managed to keep a good scoring run going and I hope that I have a decent total come the end of the season. There was pressure on me to score when I came back because I hadn't scored many before I went out on loan.


### Good results

"The first six to eight weeks I was back, we picked up some good results with some good performances but we have slipped back a bit over the last few games. I can't put my finger on why, but we haven't really played as well as we can do. In some of the games though, it was a case of us just getting beaten by a better team on the day."

Jamie was on loan but was not allowed to play when the two teams met in December and admitted that he thinks it will be strange coming to Layer Road to play against his former teammates.

Having enjoyed his time with the U's, the prolific forward is eager for Phil Parkinson's side to go on and get promoted, but he stressed he will be doing all he can to help Swindon get a result to pull them out of the relegation places.

"It will be strange coming back to Layer Road to play Colchester so soon after playing for them but I have to be professional and have a job to do for Swindon," he insisted.



Jamie Cureton - looking forward to Layer Road return


"It will be great to meet up with all the lads again because I had a good couple of months there. It kick started my season and after Saturday I hope they go on a good run and get the promotion Phil and the lads deserve."

As for Swindon's situation near the bottom of the table, Jamie realises they need a run of their own to escape relegation but knows it is well within their grasp, with only three points separating eight teams.

He pointed out: "It is very tight at the bottom and it is important that we don't let the teams above us get away from us. We need to go on a good run of games now where we pick up wins and draws if we are to stay in this League. This will be our second away game in a row and if we can get a result, it will give us confidence going into our home games.

"I won't even think about my future until the end of the season because I am concentrating on the games we have left. I am sure I won't be the only player discussing things with the manager at the end of the season. The manager will also be assessing things and will want to see which players he wants at the club next season, whichever league we are in."

# STATS ANALYSIS

U's Media Manager Matt Hudson takes a look at the statistics for this afternoon's game against Swindon Town...

That the U's opened the scoring against Swansea at the time they did on Tuesday night should not have come as a surprise to those of you who take a close look at the statistics.

In turn, the fact that the U's conceded the double blow from the two Leons, Knight and Britton, when they did should perhaps have been more of an eyebrow raiser.

During the course of the season, the fifteen minutes after half time has certainly been one of the U's more productive periods and, in the league is the second best fifteen minutes as far as scoring goals is concerned.

Conversely, in their 35 league games so far this season, the U's have conceded just twice in the immediate quarter of an hour after the interval, so the timing of Swansea's goals was a little unusual.

Despite the defeat, Parky's men have at least lifted one weight off their shoulders in the LDV Vans game in midweek. Neil Danns' goal may have had a little bit of fortune in how it hit the back of the net, but it was the U's first goal by one of our own players in twelve hours and one minute of play.

### Costly

That doesn't necessarily tell the whole story – in that lengthy goal free spell, the U's had three goals disallowed (including what proved to be a costly one against Swansea in the first leg at the Liberty Stadium for Chris Iwelumo) and hit the woodwork an amazing four times in five games.

They will be hoping to notch their first win in nine games this afternoon when they take on Swindon, who currently find themselves in the division's bottom four.

Parky's side will be hoping for a reversal of fortunes from the game at the County Ground back in December. Amidst a flurry of wins, there was a disappointing defeat down in Wiltshire, so hopefully this time around there will be a warmly welcomed win after the run of reverses over the past few weeks.

Swindon had looked like they were about


to pull clear of the bottom four, but only one win in their last six games has put them back into the danger zone. They arrested that slide with a 0-0 draw at Yeovil next week, but the U's will be hoping that they can find similar paths to goal as Nottingham Forst and Rotherham who hit ten past Swindon in their two games.

Having earlier mentioned the U's security in defence either side of half time, they will have to be aware of Swindon's threat in that particular half hour. The Robins have

enjoyed their best periods goal wise during that time.

And they will have to beware of a man who is very familiar to them. Jamie Cureton, despite spending three months with the U's, comes to Layer Road as their current top scorer and the Colchester back line will be well aware of what Curo has to offer.

Three points this afternoon will go a long way to getting the U's back on track – fingers crossed!

# SIX OF THE BEST

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS selects six Swindon Town 'Classic Campaigns' from 60 post-war seasons.

### 1962/63

Swindon Town won promotion to the Second Division for the first time in 1962/63. Bert Head's young side won just one of their first six games, then top scorer Ernie Hunt netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 victory over Brighton. Cliff Jackson scored three times in a 4-3 win at Millwall and Jack Smith did likewise in a 5-0 victory over QPR as Swindon overcame the 'Big Freeze' to maintain their promotion challenge. They hammered Colchester 6-1 and clinched promotion with a 1-0 win at home to Shrewsbury. Keith Morgan and John Trollope were ever-present, while other stars included Mike Summerbee and Bobby Woodruff.

### 1968/69

Don Rogers starred as Swindon Town achieved an epic League Cup and promotion 'double' in 1968/69. Early pace-setters in the Third Division, they lost 1-0 at home to Watford in the title 'decider' watched by 28,898 and finished runners-up on goal average. Swindon defeated Torquay 2-1, Bradford City 4-3, Blackburn 1-0, Coventry 3-0, Derby 1-0 and Burnley 3-2 in the League Cup before beating Arsenal 3-1 after extra-time in the Wembley final: Peter Downsborough, Rod Thomas, John Trollope, Joe Butler, Frank Burrows, Stan Harland, Don Heath, Roger Smart, John Smith (Willie Penman), Peter Noble, Don Rogers.

### 1985/86

Swindon Town stormed to the Fourth Division title with a record 102 points in 1985/86. Lou Macari's side made a poor start in the League but defeated Sunderland and Sheffield Wednesday en route to the Milk Cup fourth round. Kenny Allen arrived from Torquay and Dave Bamber from Portsmouth as Swindon soared to the top of the table with 14 wins in 16 matches. They set a club record of 13 consecutive home victories with a 3-1 win over Burnley and clinched the title with a 1-1 draw at Mansfield. Charlie Henry and Colin Gordon scored 35 goals between them, while skipper Colin Calderwood was ever-present.

#### 1989/90

Swindon Town won the 1989/90 Second Division play-off final but were denied topflight status after an illegal payments scandal. Swindon had qualified for the playoffs the previous season and Ossie Ardiles replaced Lou Macari as manager. They soared into the promotion frame with seven wins in nine games including a 6-0 victory over Stoke and signed David Kerslake from OPR in November. Alan McLoughlin, Duncan Shearer and Steve White starred as Swindon maintained their challenge with just one defeat in 13 matches and finished in fourth position. They defeated Sunderland 1-0 in the play-off final at Wembley.


### 1992/93

Player-manager Glenn Hoddle was a key figure in Swindon Town's 1992/93 First Division play-off final success. Swindon were early pace-setters and new signing Craig Maskell grabbed a hat-trick in a 4-1 win over Cambridge United. They went second after a 5-1 demolition of Notts

County, then overcame a lean spell with Ross MacLaren's return inspiring a run of seven victories in nine games. Dave Mitchell netted three times in a 6-4 win at Birmingham and Swindon qualified for the play-offs in fifth position. They defeated Tranmere 5-4 on aggregate, then gained a thrilling 4-3 win over Leicester in the Wembley final.

### 1995/96

Swindon Town stormed to the Second Division title under player-boss Steve McMahon in 1995/96. They had plummeted from the Premiership to Second Division and newcomers included Wayne Allison, Steve Finney and Mark Seagraves. Swindon were early leaders, winning seven of their first nine games, and Kevin Horlock netted a hat-trick in a 4-1 victory at Bristol Rovers. They remained in pole position and took Southampton to an FA Cup fifth round replay. Ian Culverhouse and Mark Robinson were ever-present, while leading scorer Wayne Allison and Shaun Taylor also starred as they won the title by nine points.



> an uphill challenge, and we weren't good enough to break them down. "Once we had the goal,

expect to kick on but we've made errors along the way for them to score their goals and it was a kick in the teeth. I can't remember too much about how the goals came about, but you shouldn't be conceding two at home.

"From that point, it was pretty much over then and as much as we huffed and puffed and had some chances, it was going to take a hell of a lot to get back into the game."

Despite the missed opportunity of a final against Carlisle, there were some positives to take out of the game. Neil Danns looked back to his sparkling best in his new found position on the wing, whilst the overall pattern of play in the first half was one of a Colchester side beginning to find their feet after the recent dip in form.

Indeed, the direction of play was pretty much solely towards Willy Gueret's goal during the first forty five minutes and, although disappointed to have exited the competition at this late stage, Kevin was determined to pick up on those positive

He added: "The first half was as good as we've been for a long, long time and it seemed like we were back to where we were when we were on our good run earlier on in the year.

"Hopefully, the result isn't going to take too much out of us. It was a hard game, and we put a lot into it, but we weren't good enough on the

"Most importantly, we've got to make sure we don't get too downhearted as there is still a hell of a long way to go."

Kevin comes up against one of his former sides this afternoon in Swindon and knows that the match against the relegation threatened Robins in some ways presents an opportunity to begin again and take on a new part to the season.

There remain 33 points available for the U's to claim and a win today will go a long way to kick starting a campaign which still promises plenty.

He stressed: "It is an eleven game season for us now and we have to try and pick up as many points as we can and see where that takes us. We're still in a great position other teams have got to play each other and several are having a wobble. As much as it pains me to say it, only Southend have been picking up results consistently.

"We've been on a poor run, no two ways about it, but we're still in a fantastic position. Although you'd rather have the points in the bag, we've got two games in hand and it's down to us. We've only got ourselves to blame now if we throw it away, it's as simple as that.

"I said to someone last week that we needed a goal to go in off someone's backside and we got that against Swansea. Now we have to take that as a positive step and kick on against Swindon."

### 1 EMERGENCE OF YOUNG TALENT

As far back as the Bristol City game in August, the signs were that a promising crop of youngsters were emerging from the Layer Road youth ranks.

Dean Gerken and Greg Halford were already first team regulars ahead of 2005/6, but John White, George Elokobi and Garry Richards have all matured into genuine contenders for first team places. White in particular has had an exceptional season and is a very strong bet for Young Player of the Year when the awards are handed out in two months time.

Best of all, the likes of Mark Cousins, Robbie King and Jamie Guy have all done well during loan spells in mens' football and will be pushing for places before the end of 2006

### **2 LAST MINUTE WINNERS**

Whilst Oldham may have walked away with the points after Richard Butcher lashed home a 93rd minute winner last Saturday, the U's fans have enjoyed their fair share of dramatic and excitement-inducing victories over the course of the past six months.

Rotherham, Blackpool and Yeovil have all suffered from Colchester sucker punches late in the game but the best of the bunch was the home match against Nottingham Forest, which will live long in the memory.

Two points appeared to have been dropped when Nathan Tyson stole in for an equaliser on 90 minutes, but the resilient U's went straight down the other end to score two more and send the home fans into raptures.

### **3 ON CLOUD NINE AGAINST LEAMINGTON**

In some ways, it was the result that sparked off the U's surge into the upper reaches of the table, but the Leamington result will live on beyond 2005/6 thanks to the U's equalling the club record victory.

When it took 30-odd minutes for the home side to break the deadlock, there was little to indicate the goal fest to come. Yet, with the visitors' resistance broken, the U's opened the floodgates and matched that result against Bradford all those years ago.

### 4 WIN, WIN AND WIN AGAIN!

Although it has been a little while since the U's last victory, we of course have enjoyed some memorable triumphs along the way since the start of the season.

As well as equalling the club's record victory, Phil Parkinson's players not only equalled the record winning streak once. but did it a second time before eventually beating it with ten in a row.

In the 69 years since the club had been formed, the U's had only ever won eight in a row once and when they drew at Swansea to miss out on nine in a row, it seemed like that record would continue to stand.

However, the U's went again and won ten matches on the bounce, including two excellent FA Cup victories. The sequence of 20 wins in 22 games is one that will probably never be beaten.

### 5 BIG CHRIS AND DANNSY'S GOALS

It has been some 25 years since a Colchester United player broke 20 goals for a season and, although he has endured a frustrating time of late, Chris Iwelumo still stands a real chance of joining Tony Adcock in the Twenty Goals club before the end of the current campaign.

Chris has been the big striker that the U's have been crying out for over the years and his efforts in leading the line will go down as a big part of the current campaign.

Presently on 16 goals, the big man needs just four more to reach that much vaunted total.

He has been ably supported from midfield by Neil Danns, who has now struck a personal best fourteen this season, including a streak of seven in six games at the turn of the year.

### 6 BEATING TWO CHAMPIONSHIP CLUBS

With promotion still a possibility, the U's would go into a first season in the top two divisions full of confidence, given their experiences against Championship opposition this season.

Having lost to Sheffield United in the FA Cup two years ago, the revenge mission this time around went exactly to plan as they bounced back from falling behind to go on and record a memorable 2-1 win over Neil Warnock's Premiership bound Blades.

However, it got even better in the next round as Derby County were put to the sword at Layer Road. An electric atmosphere saw the U's see off the Rams with a feisty display and put Colchester United well and truly on the map.

### 7 STICKING TOGETHER

With the team doing so well in the FA Cup as well as the league, it was no surprise that the players started to gain some attention from elsewhere.

The January transfer window was always going to be one that had the U's fans

chewing their nails nervously with the young talent we have in our squad, but when those highly rated individuals entered the first month of 2006 in such red hot form, then the worries grew still further.

The four weeks were an arduous process as rumour followed rumour, but, when midnight passed on January 31st, the squad had been kept together for our promotion chase.

### 8 STADIUM PROGRESS

It has been a lengthy process, but things seem to be starting to fall into place on the town's Community Stadium.

The progress on the pitch has no doubt helped affairs, but the efforts off it – both by the Council, the club and the Sports Trust, as well as the Stadium Action Group – have pushed it closer to fruition than ever before.

Undoubtedly, there is still much to do, but the chances are that 2006 could be a momentous year off the pitch for Colchester United and the town itself.

### 9 CHELSE

Ultimately the result didn't go the U's way, but for nine glorious minutes Parky's troops were in the lead against the Premiership champions and one of Europe's top sides.

Even more remarkably, for all bar eleven minutes of the game, the U's were level with Jose Mourinho's star studded squad and looking likely to bring Lampard and co back to Layer Road.

What made the day, though, was the sensational backing of the fans. 6,292 U's fans made it an afternoon to remember as the whole club did themselves proud in front of an international audience.

### 10 PROMOTION?

Still possible and still do-able.

Eleven games, starting this afternoon, stand between Colchester United and the chance of football in the top two divisions for the first time in their history.

Despite the recent dip in form, the U's remain very much in touch with the top two spots and the home game against Brentford could well turn out to be a promotion decider.

With heart, spirit and determination, elevation into the Championship remains on the cards and it promises to be an exciting conclusion to the season.

Promotion, above all else, would prove to be the best of all of these memorable moments!

### 5 YEARS AGO.

Joe Keith produced another man of the match display as the U's bounced back from a goal down to beat visiting Brentford 3-1 on Friday night, March 16, 2001.

The towering Lloyd Owusu headed the Bees in front after only nine minutes, but Brentford were simply over-run during the final hour.

Keith netted the equaliser before the break. The former West Ham trainee is relishing his new role on the left wing, rather than his previous more defensive job at left-back. Keith is still on the transfer list at his own request.

Colchester took complete control in the second-half, and goals from Mick Stockwell and Karl Duguid completed the comeback. It was Duguid's first goal of the year.

Steve Whitton's men are in lower mid-table in Division Two, as are Brentford. Rotherham are setting the pace at the top.

### 10 YEARS AGO.

U's midfielder Steve Ball was not happy to be told that he would be released at the end of March, 1996, especially as it gives him little time or desire to find a new club.

Ball, who had been on a month-to-month contract at Layer Road since last summer, felt let down by the management and the board.

He said: "I feel very bitter about the whole thing. I am angry and very disappointed. Colchester is my home club and I have been here for four years now."

Meanwhile. Steve Wignall's men secured a goalless draw at old Division Three strugglers Scarborough on Saturday, March 16, 1996. The U's extended their unbeaten run to five games, but they are still two points adrift of the play-off zone.



### 20 YEARS AGO ..

The U's lean spell in March, 1986, continued with a couple of other indifferent performances and results in the Fourth Division.

United were beaten 2-1 at home by Crewe, despite a goal by Tony English, on March 25. Just three days later and the U's were held to a 1-1 draw by Swindon, again at Layer Road. Once again. English was the lone marksman.

That made it just one victory in 11 games for the U's.


Now, we couldn't hit the proverbial cow's backside from two paces.



### My first team...


### My first penalty save...

First of all, an update on Richard Garcia. He had a scan on his knee yesterday, of which we are awaiting the results.


He will be going up to see a specialist in Cambridge on Monday with the results of the scan.

Also, it is important that we get the players' nutrition and hydration strategy right – as a club, we believe that this is very important and try to address the complete needs and requirements of every individual regarding these important factors.

This covers everything from nutritional supplements before training to correct food after training and nutritional support before and after matches.

With everything we do, we don't like to take chances and we feel that as a management team we like to cover every base to give ourselves the best possible chance of getting the results we need to finish the season successfully.



"Martin has had a lot of problems to deal with over the last two years and I think he has learned a lot.

For example we had injuries this season, which meant we were down to a sixteen man squad after three games this season.

"He has done a good job and if we can get those extra six points we will be happy with survival in this league this

They make it really difficult for you and we haven't got the option of just throwing the ball in with no height in the side so we have to manipulate the ball and be clever and. credit to them, they did that in the second half. We created one or two openings but their goalkeeper did what he's paid to do and kept us out."

"He is often in the wider areas when the ball comes into the box so it was a good goal from his point of view. His second goal was a great strike.

"Sam has done very well for us in the last week. It's been very important to have players from different positions in the team scoring some goals.





We travelled to QPR last Saturday but I will start by talking about the home game against Rushden and Diamonds a couple of weeks ago now.

We began the match with four triallists that had either been with us for a few weeks or had impressed Joe at a recent exit trial. Two of them were from Millwall, one from Ipswich and the other lad was from Charlton. All of them had their strengths and weaknesses but there was one of them, Fabian Quinten that impressed Joe the most.

He is a forward in the mould of Darius Vassell, he loves to run at defenders and is blessed with a great deal of natural pace. We have offered him a youth team contract for the next two seasons and are waiting for him to come back to us. We obviously hope that he will join us here at Layer Road because we feel he will be a very useful addition to the squad.

Against Rushden I was very pleased with the performance considering we had those triallists that hadn't played together before and we had also been without a game for three weeks prior to this one. The break actually seemed to do us more good than harm.

Last Saturday we travelled to QPR and put in one of our best performances of the season, gaining a well-deserved 2-1 win.

What made the performance, and the subsequent result, even more satisfying was the fact that we only had one substitute at the beginning of the game. On top of us missing players through illness and injury, Jimmy Pirie pulled out during the warm-up before the match.

Paddy Brothers and Ryan Amass got injured in the game but battled on, Paddy being replaced late on and Ryan seeing out the match. Our solitary sub, Arthur Collins is an U14s and did well in the short time he was on the pitch.

A lad that I must mention, for his attitude the whole season not just his performance against QPR, is our defender Danny Scott. He hasn't played every match this season, being behind Nathan Speed in the packing order at times, but has shown 100% commitment and application. He had an extremely good game against a strong QPR side.

One of the hardest jobs I have as a coach is telling boys that they won't be taken on at the club for the next season.

That was what I had to tell our U16s keeper Tom Ross last week. He has been involved in all our games this season but Joe and I feel that he isn't quite up to the standard required for league level youth football. He has done extremely well coming from Sunday League football with no specialist keeper training and we wish him all the best for the future.

Two players that we have given youth team contracts to recently must be congratulated for the work that has got them to where they are at now. Nathan Speed and Jamie Wright will be joining Joe Dunne's youth team next season and both of them have already shown that they can compete at that level in the games they have been involved in.

Nathan has been with us for four seasons now and is an attacking full back who has good pace and delivery. Jamie is the only Colchester boy to be offered a contract and his name might be familiar to some of our older supporters. Jamie's father, Steve was a defender for the U's and Jamie's grandfather was the U's legend, Peter Wright.

I wish both these lads, and all the others that have earned their youth team

contracts, the best of luck but warn them that they are still a long way from being professional footballers. Congratulations to them for getting on the first rung of the ladder but there must be no slacking off now if they are to progress in football and fulfil their dreams.

The final whistle goes and it is joy for Joe Dunne's boys as they make the national final of the Youth Alliance Cup.



A lost cause chased, nearly got the visitors an equaliser. Frannie Collin strong running reached the ball out on the right touchline to rescue it, a great deep cross in, was met by the head of Charlie Glyde, but he was denied by a superb save from Mark Cousins, and the home side scrambled it away.

A home free kick then saw the Gills keeper make a horrendous mistake charging out to catch, he totally misjudged it, merely knocking the ball skywards, setting up the chance for Craig Hughes, who half volleyed wide.

As the half time break approached there was a concerted spell of home play in and around the Gills box. However with the seconds ticking away, the visitors had two more chances of their own, a cross to the far post, saw the player coming in, but he failed to connect with the head, and then a deep ball in, was headed back across goal, but the effort was cleared from the danger area by the Colchester defence.

## PLANNING FRUSTRATION

Contrary to a statement released in February, it was revealed in midweek that the North Essex Mental Health Partnership NHS Trust had not signed off the Land Owners' Agreement and that, without that signature, the outline planning permission for the 10,000 all-seater facility could not be granted

U's chairman Peter Heard admitted his frustration at the latest delay to the planning process, but it is hoped that the problem will be resolved this week once further discussions have been concluded.

Colchester United are dismayed that yet again there is a further delay due to the Land Owners' Agreement, which still appears not to have been agreed between the parties, something over which the football club has no control

In consequence, Colchester Borough Council are unable to issue the outline planning consent at this time - the Trust now say they will sign next week, but the latest delay continues to put pressure on the August 2007 deadline

The football club directors are most disappointed of this continuing delay


The problem came to light at the latest meeting of the Colchester 2020 Partnership, where lead partner Dave Murthwaite questioned why the signature had not yet been received from the Mental Health Partnership.

He told a packed audience at the town's Mercury Theatre: "The North Essex Mental Health Partnership NHS Trust has still not signed the agreement and we feel that is a real issue for us.

Every day that goes on without being signed, that jeopardises the two million, if we don't get that two million, I don't think we have got a project.

He said he believed the trust would still sign, but said it was vital it was done now.

Speaking to the EADT after the 2020 briefing he said there were still land issues that had not been resolved.



■ Peter Heard - frustrated by latest delay

Every day we have been contacting people to try to get it moving, but it is dragging on and the longer it does, the more in jeopardy the £2 million from the Football Foundation is.

I think the issue is around the amount of land they are going to put into the deal. I don't think they have decided and agreed whether that is going to be what the existing agreement says or whether it will be expanded.

"As far as I am concerned, however, every other partner involved in this has done all that they need to do to get outline planning permission sorted which will give the Football Foundation enough to properly allocate the money.

"It is frustrating, they are really keen to do it, but it may be that they are not fully aware of how critical timing is around this sort of funding.

A spokesman for the North Essex Mental Health Partnership NHS Trust stressed they wanted to sign sooner rather than later

"We understand Mr Murthwaite's desire to see the development of the Severalls site begin and we are fully committed to ensuring the process is completed promptly

The site is owned by three organisations. We are working with Colchester Borough Council, English Partnerships and all of the parties' solicitors to finalise legal details.

"We are expecting to join all of the parties in signing the legal agreement on Monday 20 March.

John Jowers, leader of the borough am disappointed not to have heard from them before now

"I am reassured that they are now saying the 20th March, I can live with that, but I will believe it when I see it

Without this we cannot go-ahead and there would be massive implications as it is much more than just the stadium that depends on it, this is one of the biggest projects in East Anglia at the moment."





## FREE-KICK TRICKED SWINDON COLCHESTER UNITED 5 SWINDON TOWN 0

A SURPRISE free-kick move, which Benny Fenton used at times when he captained Charlton, on Saturday produced one of the smartest goals seen at Layer Road this season.

No sooner had he slipped the ball forward into the penalty area than Bob Dale came racing from behind him at full speed to slam it into the net.

This piece of strategy worked like a charm. Fenton's pass was beautifully judged and the Swindon defence were taken completely by surprise as Dale ran on to it. Fast, open football, with Fenton and Dale exploiting to the full the speed of Grice and Wright on the wings and Plant giving his third three-goal display of the season, enabled the U's to register their biggest win this League campaign.

They also put their 'goals for' total ahead of those scored against them. Plant has now boosted his personal bag of goals for the League side to 15, although he was playing for the reserves in the early part of the season.

McCurley, who heads the United's goalscorers with 22, did not have a good match against Hudson, Swindon's big centre-half. No player, however, can be on top form all the time and the United centre-forward has led the attack in dashing style this season.

Dale's goal - his second in successive matches - came in the 20th minute and was only one of three that resulted from free-kicks. The first was in the 12th minute and on this occasion Plant scored with a hook shot after Fenton had slipped the ball forward.

Left-back Fisher is not likely to forget his first goal for the Colchester club - or the crowd his reaction to it. Taking a free-kick from about 35 yards range just before half-time, he obviously had no thoughts of putting himself on the scoresheet. But goalkeeper Sam Burton lost sight of the ball for a split second as Plant went down to try to head it.

The inside-left missed and when Burton dived he was nowhere near enough to prevent the ball entering the net. Fisher was so amazed that he turned his back on the goal, got down on his knees and paid homage to the soccer gods.

Although Swindon were well and truly licked in this match - sweet revenge for the 3-1 defeat at the County Ground earlier in the season – they showed some neat approach play. The Town also tried hard to beat a United defence which forced them to shoot from outside the penalty area and Percy Ames made two saves which rank with the best seen at Layer Road this season.

In the 40th minute he leapt across the goal to bring off a great one-handed save from Andy Micklewright. And in the 50th minute he clutched cleanly, in the middle of a dive, a fast shot from Bob Edwards.

But the hardest shot of the match came in the 33rd minute when Fenton hit the ball on the half-volley and it crashed against the near post. This was a full blooded effort which Burton never saw and which made the spectators shout with surprise at its speed and power.

Miss of the match arrived in the 24th minute when Edwards, Swindon's inside-left, was clean through with only Ames to beat. The goalkeeper advanced to try and narrow the angle and Edwards drove the ball just wide of the far post.

Grice and Fox were injured in a collision in the first half and had to go off with facial injuries. Both resumed, Grice with stitches in a gashed cheek. But his play certainly did not suffer and time and again he left Fox floundering hopelessly by speed and feinting.

Goals just had to come from the right-winger's pulled back crosses. Right-back George Hunt made the mistake of delaying clearing in front of goal in the 84th minute and Plant pounced on the ball to score. Two minutes from the end he added number five from a Dale through pass.

Both Fenton and Dale were outstanding in this match. Not only were they strong in defence, but they were quick to back up their colleagues in front with a good service of the ball. This wing-half strength, plus the speed of Grice and Wright on the wings, opened up the Swindon defence.

The United's attack plan worked to perfection with Plant increasingly in the goal-getting picture and he is seizing his chances smartly.





## JOURNO'S JURY

Over the course of the season, we will be talking to journalists from around the country as Colchester United begin their assault on League One and the 8,000-odd miles that lay ahead in 2005/6.

So, having seen the U's in action, what did they make of our own favourite team? How did we compare to the other teams that they had faced in the season so far? Were the U's unstoppable or did they catch the opposition on a bad day?

We'll be doing our best to talk to as many journalists as possible for their views on Phil Parkinson's side – and of course be giving OUR perspective throughout the rest of U's Review.

In this afternoon's edition, we talk to Tony Bugby of the Oldham Chronicle who gives us his views on the U's performance against Oldham Athletic...

## What did you make of the U's performance on the day?

They were very compact, well organised and, to be honest, very unlucky to come away with a defeat. In the first half, they were on top and should have had a couple of goals but it was one of those days where things just didn't go for them. They could have easily been two up at the break – Danns' miss in particular was a good chance – and then it would have been a very different game.

## Was that a typical Oldham performance of late?

Yes, definitely. They are not playing particularly well, but have a habit of scrapping it out and picking up 1-0 victories. They played Tranmere in their previous home game and it was a similar story to last Saturday, with a late goal sealing a 1-0 win. The ability to grind out wins is the thing that will get you up into the top spots.

Improving their defence has been the key – they have kept five clean sheets in a row and they had previously been giving goals away for fun. Injured players have come back from injury and Lee Grant, the keeper on loan from Derby, has been excellent since he has been here, only letting in one goal in the six games that he has played.

## Did the game pan out as you had expected it to?

Yes, it was always going to be a very tight match. Ronnie Moore said before the game that, with so much at stake, it was going to be a cagey game and so it proved with a lot riding on it. With two good defences, chances were always going to be at a premium and he was thankful for a late goal that boosted their play-off hopes.

#### Which Colchester player impressed you the most?

In the first half, I would say
Neil Danns. He was
particularly lively and put
himself about with good
effect. Overall, though, I
would say Liam Chilvers
impressed me the most, he
was commanding at the back
and formed a very good
partnership at centre half with
Wayne Brown.

## As things stand, do you think the two teams will be turning out in the play-offs?

There is a very good chance of that with the way things are going. Latics are seventh and closing the gap and we have a chance, because it looks like a few of the teams – including Swansea and Huddersfield – are having a bit of a wobble at the moment. It will be six from seven I think now and it is a question of who holds their nerve in the coming weeks.


Had Dannsy found the back of the net rather than the crossbar, then I suspect that it would have been a different story.



#### WHAT IS THE GROUND LIKEP

The club left the Old Show Ground and moved to the new Glanford Park in August 1988. It is somewhat box like in appearance with all four stands being an equal height. The ground is totally enclosed with all four corners having been filled (with advertising heardings).

The home end is terracing, whilst the other three sides of the ground are all seated. The main downside is the many supporting pillars to impede your view.

#### WHERE WILL THE US FANS BE SITTING?

Away fans are housed in the Caparo Merchant Bar Stand (aka the South Stand) at one end. This is all seated and can house 1.650 supporters. If demand requires it, then extra seats can be made available in the south corner of the West Stand.

#### FANCY A PRE-MATCH PINTP

There is one pub right at the entrance to the ground called The Old Farmhouse. This pub welcomes all fans but no colours are allowed. There is another pub near the ground called the Berkeley, a favourite haunt for away supporters.

To find this pub, go past the ground (or park there first) and follow the main road towards Scunthorpe and it is on the left hand corner of the first roundabout you reach


#### HOW TO GET THERE BY CAR:

The ground is on the outskirts of Scunthorpe, making it easy to find from the motorway. Leave the M180 at Junction 3 and take the M181 for Scunthorpe. At the end of this motorway, you will see the ground on your right.

Turn right at the first roundabout onto the A18 and right again into the large car park at the ground.

#### HOW TO GET THERE BY TRAIN:

Scunthorpe station is over two miles away from the ground. Therefore a taxi is



probably the easiest way to reach the stadium.

However, if you have time on your hands and are feeling fit. Turn left out of the station and head towards the crossroads (facing a church) and turn right into Oswald Road, going past a set of traffic lights and the Honest Lawyer and Blue Bell pubs. At the next traffic lights turn left into Doncaster Road (where there a number of fast food outlets).

Then just go straight down this road and you will eventually reach Glanford Park on your left.

Otherwise catch the number 341 bus from the bottom of Doncaster Road (outside the Atlantis Chippy) down to the ground (fare £1).

## NEXT UP - BRENTFORD

After this afternoon's game against a side attempting to scramble clear of the drop zone, the U's next home match comes against a team harbouring the same hopes of promotion as Phil Parkinson's side.

Currently occupying one of the two automatic promotion spots that the sides currently in the top six are all chasing, Brentford come to town for a fixture which could go a long way to deciding who finishes in the top two spots come the final game of the season in May.



Allen was chuffed for his striker: "I am pleased for Lloyd. He has been making a fantastic contribution to the whole team throughout the season. He hasn't got the goals he may have liked, but that finish when he went through on goal and chipped it past the keeper was the quality of Ruud Van Nistelrooy.

"It was brilliant – it was a great finish. The first half was as good as I have seen him. He was a real handful. He has been like that away from home nearly all the time. Today he was more selfish. He and Isaiah in the first half were superb.

"It was a good performance and another good day at Griffin Park on and off the field. The supporters were brilliant and they loved it. The players loved it as well."



Martin Allen - cautious

Despite their good run of form, Allen is suitably cautious about his side's chances of staying in the key positions in the league over the next few weeks.

He told the club's official website: "There are still eleven games to go. A lot can happen in eleven games so it's no good getting carried away."

#### Important

"The important issues are to keep working hard on the training pitch and improving the performances as we go along. There is no time to rest either and sitting back in your armchair dreaming."

And Allen remained true to his word on Tuesday, as he bolstered his squad ahead of Thursday's upcoming deadline for loan signings. With Kevin O'Connor out injured, he swooped for Bristol City's Jamie Smith to shore up the right hand side of the Bees' defence.

The Bees boss will be hoping that his side can continue their momentum in the coming weeks and will have no doubt taken interest in the U's game in midweek, with both

Swansea and Phil Parkinson's side on the agenda in Brentford's run in to the end of the season.
