Good afternoon and a very warm welcome back to the County Ground for the visit of Brentford. On behalf of the board of Directors I would like to offer our customary welcome to the visiting Directors, Players and Supporters.

It promises to be another nailbiting, stomach churning afternoon for both sets of supporters. Brentford are desperate to avoid being involved in the play-offs, and we of course are trying to complete our very own great escape. With our visitors likely to bring a good number of fans with them down the M4, there promises to be another decent attendance. Again I would ask all Robins fans to get behind the team from the first to the last minute. Nerves can play a big part at this stage of the season, and your full and unswerving support, even through the mistakes that are bound to be made is what is required, and asked for.

At the end of the season, we can have a full post-mortem over what has been, undoubtedly, a disappointing season. We plan to hold a fans forum a week or so after the season has finished. But for now, all I ask is that you give your full support to a group of players who are giving their all in the fight against the drop.

I see this close season as a watershed for the club. We need to rebuild harmony between the club and our supporters. The need to build on our loyal core of support has never been greater, and I am determined that supporters have a greater say in the running of their club. I happen to believe that there is not too much wrong at the club. There is a tremendous



set of dedicated staff at the club. However, years of disappointment, false dawns, public disagreements with fans and broken promises, have taken their toll and given many fans, I believe, a much worse sense of where we are as a club. Yes, money is tight. Yes, cashflow is tight. But then I read some fans saying that we are bankrupt, skint and lacking ambition. We do not owe the bank a penny, we are up to date with our rent. We are in a stronger position financially than many clubs. Gillingham for instance owe their bankers £9.5M. The new owners of Rotherham claim they were within 48 hours of going out of business. Things have been tough at The County Ground but we should not lose our sense of perspective. Sir Seton Wills has continued to support the club, and we continue to look for new investors to share the burden.

We have reduced many prices, adult and kids, both on a seasonal basis and on matchdays. The muchcriticized £23 price point has been smashed. We are going to have a major push to get more kids back into the stadium, supporting their local team. Under 7's can continue to go free. Kids ST prices start from as little as £69, just £3 per game. However we need to get more people coming to games if we are going to generate the revenues which will allow us to invest further in the squad, Rather than find reasons not to get support back, I would ask you to do all you can to encourage new fans to the club. This is a proud club and one that can compete again at a higher level, but only if the constant sniping stops and positive action takes over. Look at the success of the recent ST holders ' bring a friend' initiative. We plan to repeat this next season. Lastly, look at how the hard work of our supporters has helped get discussions over the stadium redevelopment back on track. We may not always agree, it would be boring if we did, but now is the time for us all to pull together and build for the future.

Enjoy the game and please keep up your wonderful support.

ormer Swindon Town midfielder Scott Leitch has been confirmed as the new manager at Ross County.



The 36-year-old, whose contract at Motherwell was due to expire this summer, was unveiled in Dingwall on Tuesday.

Leitch, who made over 130 appearances for Town from 1996-2000, admitted to being "surprised and delighted".

> "I'm thrilled to get the chance to manage in my own right, particularly somewhere with as good a set-up as County have," he said.

Former Inverness Caledonian Thistle and Aberdeen boss Steve Paterson had also been strongly linked with the vacancy.

But the First Division club instead handed Leitch, who had been with Motherwell since 2000, his first managerial job.

Swindon Town emerged victorious from their first ever encounter at Glanford Park, thanks to goals from Trevor Benjamin and Ricky Shakes.

There were three changes to the Town line-up with Trevor Benjamin, Paul Smith and Lukas Jutkiewicz all starting with Jamie Cureton amongst the substitutes.

The home side went ahead through top scorer Billy Sharp on just 9 minutes. After Town failed to clear a corner, Sharp made no mistake from close range to add to his tally.

On 25 minutes Town equalized thanks to a successful penalty. Trevor Benjamin was tripped in the Scunthorpe area by Andy Crosby and referee Miller had no hesitation in pointing to the spot with Benjamin rifling the ball down the middle to draw his side level.

Swindon extended the lead just six minutes before the break. From a corner, Benjamin flicked the ball on which found Shakes, who got the faintest of touches, to register his second goal in the space of a week.

Having gone in 2-1 up at the break Town continued with gritty determination, sensing three points in the offing. Charlie Comyn-Platt and Steve Jenkins replaced Paul Smith and Chris McPhee as the half went on.

Sean O'Hanlon then headed Sharp's header off the line before Comyn-Platt's audacious lob from 40 yards fell just the wrong side of the bar.

Lee Peacock was then brought on for Lucas Jutkiewicz at the start of the injury time period, as Swindon hung-on for three valuable points thanks to some brave defending and a great injury time save from Rhys Evans to deny Hinds.

Welcome to our visitors Brentford today, who visit the County Ground for our penultimate home match of the season.

A 2-2 draw at Rotherham last Saturday was followed by a 1-1 tie at home to Blackpool on Easter Monday when a Lloyd Owusu penalty was equalised by the Seasiders' Peter Clarke in the last minute.

That left the Bees third in the League One table after the Easter fixtures. Pushing for an automatic promotion spot for the whole season, Martin Allen's men are not likely to let the chance slip through their fingers without a fight, but they are currently one point behind second placed Colchester United.

Owusu's spot kick on

Monday was his 14th League strike of the season. DJ Campbell recorded 12 before his January departure to Birmingham City, and Isaiah Rankin has ten.

Midfielder Junior Lewis played 13 times for Town over two loan periods whilst on Leicester City's books.

Away from home, the Bees have won nine times and lost just five. That's the magnitude of the task we face today, but most recently they have won two, drawn two and lost two of the last six away matches. That might offer greater hope as we continue to claw out the points to take us out of the bottom four.

All of Brentford's last four games have resulted in draws, and that was the outcome when we visited Griffin Park back in October, when a goalless stalemate ensued.

A similar outcome today though won't be a great help for either club. Both teams will be fighting for the points for very different reasons this afternoon.

Play your part and offer Iffy's men all the support you can muster.



ONE TO WATCH: LLOYD OWUSU

Having started his professional career at Griffin Park, Lloyd Owusu made a return to Brentford last summer.

Owusu signed for The Bees from Slough in 1998 for just £25,000 before becoming an instant success. He hit 64 goals in 148 appearances before attracting the attentions of Sheffield Wednesday. He joined The Owls on a free transfer in the summer of 2002, where he found the target on 9 occasions in 24 appearances. A loan spell to Reading then followed, which transpired into a permanent move.

A return to Brentford came about last summer and he has since been a regular fixture in Martin Allen's side, scoring 12 goals in 39 league starts this term.

The Squad

Brentford signed **Stuart Nelson** from Unibond Premier side Hucknall Town in February 2004 for an eventual fee of £10,000. The former Cirencester Town goalkeeper completed an excellent first full season last season which included 21 clean sheets. Nigerian born **Ademole Bankole**, or George as he is known, joined Brentford in February 2005. He has made six appearances for The Bees to date and is also the club's goalkeeping coach.

Young left-sided defender

Sam Tillen was released by Chelsea during the summer of 2005 and was Martin Allen's first signing of the last closed season campaign. He has gone on to impress, making 19 starts so far this term although he is yet to find the net. Sam Sodje signed in the summer of 2004 from Conference side Margate. In his first full season as a professional he proved to be a very consistent player and a goalscorer, scoring eight goals. The Supporters "Player of the Year" last season.

Centre-back **Michael Turner** joined the Club from Charlton Athletic in November 2004



having proved his value in a loan spell. A mainstay in the heart of a defence, he has since made 72 league starts. A former Crystal Palace player, **Andy Frampton** joined the Bees in October 2002. Last season he made the left back position his own in what was an excellent season for the versatile player.

Jay Tabb is a product of the Bees youth set up and he has made several appearances for the Republic of Ireland Under-21's. One of the Club's youngest ever players to receive the "Player of the Year" award in 2004, he is a lively player who can cause problems in the visitors defence. Brentford's Captain is former Crystal Palace junior Ricky Newman joined the Bees in June 2005. He brings with him a wealth of experience with approaching 400 appearances for Palace, Millwall and most recently Reading.

Wembley-born **Junior Lewis** is a player Town fans will have seen a lot of, as the player made 13 league starts during two separate loan spells in 2003. Lewis has great experience with Gillingham, Leicester City, Brighton & Hove Albion and Hull City. He joined Brentford last summer and has since made 15 appearances for The Bees.



 Brentford Football Club was founded in 1889 by members of the Brentford Rowing Club, who wanted an alternative sport to play during the winter months. It was decided the club should wear the same colours as the rowing club - salmon, claret and light blue.

Former Fulham trainee **Paul Brooker** is another player with experience and has clocked up over 250 league appearances including two consecutive championship medals during his time with Brighton. Midfielder **Darren Pratley** is on loan from Fulham until the end of the current campaign. He played 16 games for The Bees at the end of the 2004/05 season, including both play-off semi-final matches against Sheffield Wednesday.

Signed by Brentford from Newmarket Town in November 2003 for just £7,500, Alex Rhodes has returned to the first team picture this season after a spell out with injury. Isaiah Rankin is a former Arsenal striker who joined the Bees from Grimsby Town in May 2004. He has now scored 15 goals in 63 starts for Brentford.

Marcus Gayle returned to the Club from which he started towards the end of last season. Since leaving to join Wimbledon for £250,000 in 1994, he gained international status playing for Jamaica in the 1998 World Cup and has also enjoyed spells with Watford and Rangers, Calum Willock signed for Brentford from Peterborough United in January but has made just four starts since then. However, a strike-rate of 23 goals in 67 league starts should be ignored at Town's peril.

Martin Allen

Martin Allen begun his playing career when signing with QPR in 1983 at the age of 18 and spent six years there before crossing London to join West Ham for £670,000 in 1989.

Martin stayed with The Hammers until 1996 when Portsmouth paid £500,000 for his services. He remained there for three years, which included a loan spell with Southend, before hanging up his boots and moving into coaching.

His first appointment was as Reserve Team Manager at Fratton Park before moving to Underhill where he was First Team Coach. He was then appointed First Team Coach at Reading before being promoted to Assistant Manager under Alan Pardew.

He returned to Barnet and upon his appointment as Manager he rebuilt the side

taking them to the verge of promotion to the Football League before joining Brentford in March 2004.

Yet while his pace and penalty-winning ways entertained us during his two-year stay at SN1, we somehow felt cheated by our former Gaffer's proclamation, the Sarcelles-born striker quick but short on firepower.

And so when loan -signing Toumani Diagouraga was hailed by many as the next Patrick Vieira it was with trepidation that we watched him take to the centre of Town's midheld for his debut against Chesterfield

OK, so Juve's midfield engine room might not need worry just yet – but the loan player's touch, composure and ballwinning tenacity has been a welcome addition to our squad – so much so that he's been the one player on everybody's lips. Well, those that can pronounce his name, anyway!

Searching through the various Watford messageboards on information for Tounami and one thing is clear – this boy has a fan club and from that they say - he is set for big things – his success should come as no surprise.

"Reports from youth and reserve games were almost invariably glowing - so glowing, in fact, that the man with the sheen to end all sheens was rumoured to be looking at taking him to Chelsea," said one site. circumstances to see what he's got to offer – the awkward midfielder dominating Town's midfield since his switch from Vicarage Road.

"In all seriousness – he was fantastic," was midfield maestro Paul Smith's assessment of Tournani's performance last Monday at Scunthorpe, the latest player to sing the youngster's praises – the latest compliments a huge distinction from a player that could himself hold the key to Town's survival this season.

You only have to look at what he's achieved in such a short space of time and in difficult "I was spotted playing for my local side and I came over with a number of scholars," he says. "I was invited to a trial game at Watford and after that it was a month's trial – I did well enough to stay."

Such was Toumani's route into England that comparisons with fellow Frenchmen are inevitable, our man is keen to avoid any such associations. And despite his quiet demeanor – he is confident in his own ability to suggest he is his own player.

"I'm doing my own thing. It's nice to be compared to such players, but I don't try to be like him, I am my own player."

Once at Watford Toumani quickly went about making a name for himself in the academy, followed quickly by the reserves. He starred in the club's FA Youth Cup run with a memorable performance against Newcastle United under the watchful eve of Iffy Onuora, creating the only goal of the night, and has featured over 20 times for the reserve team this season. scoring a number of goals. In fact he impressed so much that he was signed on a professional contract shortly after his 17th birthday.

Yet for all his early success, Toumani remains extremely modest. "I hope that I can get a first team spot – especially when Watford win the play-offs!"

Leaving behind Watford's reserves was hard for the Frenchman, even more so given the situation his new club finds itself in. Fortunately help was at hand in the form of Jerel Ifil and Jack Smith. "They've both been very good to me," he admits. "I played with both of them for Watford's reserves, so not only do I know them, but also how they like to play. I also get on very well with the manager. Like the manager at Watford he is young - but he is very good and I get on very well with him."

Judging by Toumani's appearances so far – it looks as though he's taken to League One like a duck to water. Dominating the

"I try not to think about it away from the pitch – I like to concentrate and focus on a matchday. But I think seven points from these last three games will be enough," he says confidently. "The dressing room has been confident this week, we all know we can play and I think it is better to play a side at the top of the league, like Brentford, than those at the bottom. We definitely seem to do better against the sides nearer the top.

"I don't know too much about Brentford," he adds, "but I am confident. I am due a goal as well, so we'll see what happens this weekend!"

Toumani is still getting to know many of the teams in this division – but one man who does know more about today's visitors, is Paul Smith - likely to be featuring alongside him in midfield.

"He is an excellent player," he says. "I really enjoyed playing with him – he talked to me a lot and helped me through the game. He has the experience I lack and I think it's a good balance."

The midfield pairing seemed to

Blackburn manager Kenny Dalglish had pulled a master stroke. Depriving Town of their main goal scorer, Rovers outpaced Town for a play-off place and ultimately gained entry to the top division. Almost immediately,

his purposed served, Shearer was traded again to Aberdeen and replaced by his namesake Alan.

So, big Duncan still finished top scorer for Town on 22 League strikes and an enormous ten

in cup competition. Steve White followed on 13 all told, and Mickey Hazard included three penalties amongst his seven.

Those cup goals contributed to a run to the fourth round of the League Cup, then sponsored by Rumbelows, when we went out at the hands of Crystal Palace. Aston Villa put paid to us in front of the TV cameras at The County Ground in round five of the FA Cup.

Despite the Division Three trophy, the end of the season saw Brentford elevated not for Division Two, but Division One. The formation of the Premiership meant the entire Football League moved up a level, as a somewhat pointless renumbering exercise took place.

That final Division Three table is worth another glance, just to see who Brentford finished above. Amongst those competing in the nation's

> third tier were Preston, Stoke City and Hull City, today all doing in the Championship.

But that's not all. Today they might all be in the Premiership, but back in 1991/92 West Bromwich

Albion, Fulham, Wigan, Bolton and Birmingham City were all scrapping for Division Three points, while Reading, the team who clinched this season's first confirmed promotion place and entered next year's top level, finished 12th.

Now is a good time for us Town supporters to remember that a team's fortunes can go up as well as down.
