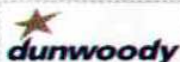

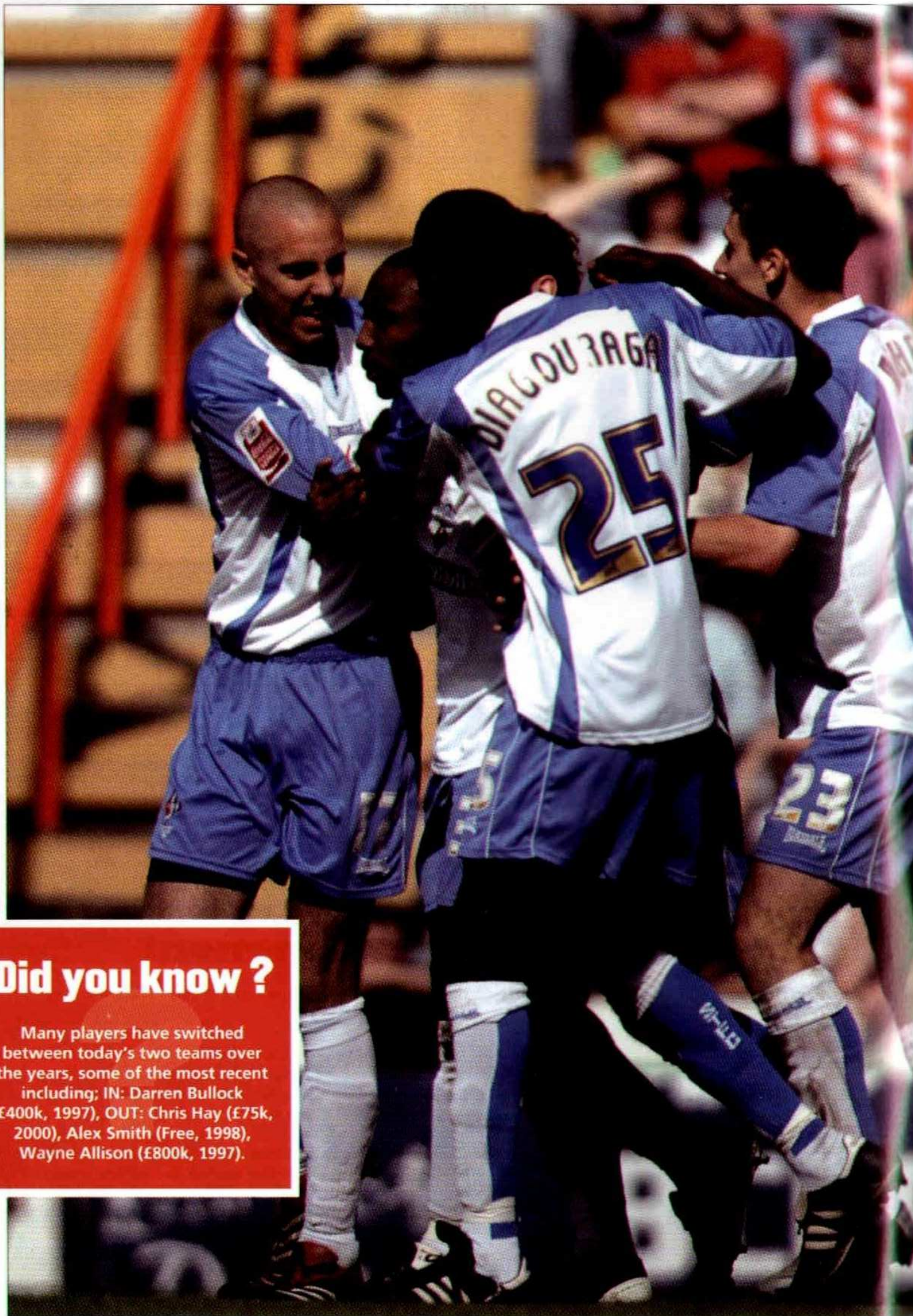
Good afternoon and welcome today's season's finale with Huddersfield Town.

# Boardroom Talk



**G**ood afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground for the last fixture of the season. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I would like to offer our customary welcome to our visitors today and wish them well in the play-offs.

Firstly, I would like to welcome Bill Power to the Board, when he joins on May 15th. On a personal level, having worked with Bill for just over a year at QPR, I am delighted that Bill has decided to get involved at Swindon, and join us in the challenges that lay ahead. Bill has a genuine love of the game, and his passion and knowledge will be of great assistance to the board.

Following the outcome of this weeks local elections, we will be looking to urgently meet with the council and supporters to develop acceptable plans which will allow the club to seek outline planning permission for the redevelopment of The County Ground as soon as possible. The redevelopment is still crucial to our plans to take the club forward, both on and off the pitch, and Bill's arrival will allow other directors time to focus on the redevelopment, in the knowledge that there is added focus on the football side of the business. I certainly believe that Bill's arrival will see a new chapter, an exciting chapter, in the club's history begin, and I for one am really looking forward to it.

Clearly, it has been a difficult, and ultimately, unsatisfactory season endured by us all. I know how hurt our supporters will be, and whilst you may not always feel it, Iffy and the players will be hurting too. As a professional on and off the field, you don't want to suffer



relegation, and I am looking for the right response from everybody at the club. Of course, we will take a period of time to reflect and analyze what went wrong this season, and I am determined that we will all learn from it. Then we must move on and build for next season. Nothing but a sustained challenge for an immediate return to League One will be expected, and during the Summer we will all work together to develop a squad and a club that can meet that challenge head on. I understand the frustrations our supporters have felt, and I would like to thank each and every one of you for your brilliant support. I know it has not been easy, but please stick with us and we will all do everything we can to achieve our aims next season.

I would like to thank every member of the administrative staff, firstly for welcoming me back last October and also for their unstinting support and hard work, yes even Mike Sullivan (who ran the London Marathon recently in just under a day). To all of our matchday staff and contractors, thank you for your help - it would be impossible to operate the games without you.

As you will have seen we have reduced our season ticket and matchday prices as much as we

could afford and I would ask, if you are able to, please renew your season ticket for next season and, if I may be a little greedy, try to introduce someone new to the club, it will help us enormously.

Following the Bryan Adams concert on June 8, the pitch will be undergoing some extensive remedial work. Therefore most of our pre-season friendlies will be away from home. However, we hope to arrange a home pre-season friendly a week before the new season starts and information will be released as soon as we have confirmation. In the meantime, enjoy the Summer. Let's hope England, metatarsals and all, bring home the World Cup and I look forward to seeing you in Ibiza and then back for the start of a new campaign on August 5.

Finally, enjoy the game and please keep off the pitch at the end to allow the players back out so they can show their appreciation of your support this season.

## £350,000 Shared with Win a Player 2

**F**ootballing dreams came true seven days ago for three of the country's Football League fans as Southampton supporter Chantelle Legg, Brentford fan Steven Hearn and Andy Perrin, an Oxford United fan, each won a share of £350k in the unique 'Coca-Cola' Win A Player promotion.

All three winners were announced live on air on Sky TV's Soccer AM last weekend by presenters Tim Lovejoy and Helen Chamberlain.

Between 11th January and 25th April 2006 a staggering 2,178,025 entries were received in the 'Coca-Cola' Win A Player promotion. This

phenomenal interest came from fans from all over the UK, including fans from the 'Coca-Cola' Football League and The Scottish Premier League, doubling the 1.1 million entries that were received in last year's Win A Player.

## Physio Update with Dick Mackey

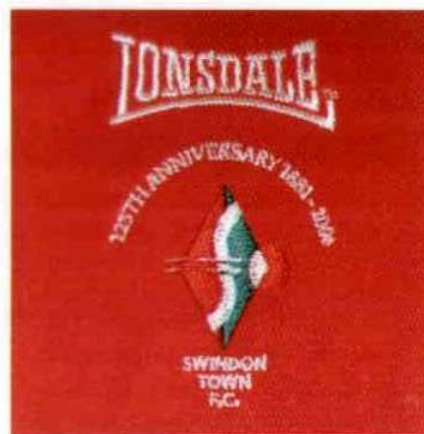

**Our visitor's surprise 2-1 home defeat to Yeovil Town last weekend scuppered their chances of an automatic promotion place, but Huddersfield are already guaranteed a play-off spot whatever the outcome of today's game.**

Fourth in the League One table, the Terriers already know that their season is extended past the usual 46 matches, and manager Peter Jackson can relax and formulate his plans for the rest of the month.

Iffy too has the chance to run the rule over his charges, and today's game will take place with future fixtures very much uppermost in the minds of both managers.

Iffy of course began his career as a Terrier and also made his last playing appearance for them in the Division Three play-offs in 2004, scoring after five minutes against Lincoln City in the semi-final.

An Andy Gurney penalty back in October gave Town the lead at the Galpharm Stadium, before a Chris Brandon second half equaliser resulted in

a 1-1 draw.

Today's game will be our last at this level for a little while, but next season will arrive in August with a whole new set of challenges. It's never too early to plan for the future and this afternoon could give a fascinating insight on the shape of the squad for 2006/07.

## ONE TO WATCH: GARY TAYLOR-FLETCHER

**Currently second in the scoring charts at The Galpharm Stadium behind Andy Booth, Gary Taylor-Fletcher has been in good form front of goal with 14 league strikes to his name.**

He started out with Northwich Victoria with 11 goals in 32 league games enough to attract the attentions of Leyton Orient who shelled out £50,000 for his services.

After loan spells with Hull City, Grays Athletic and Dagenham & Redbridge (twice) he was on the move again with Lincoln City the destination in August 2003. Two seasons at Sincil Bank produced 26 goals in 77 league encounters before joining the Galpharm ranks just under a year ago.

Former Manchester United keeper **Paul Rachubka** finally became a Town player in November 2004, joining from Charlton Athletic after two previous loan spells with The Terriers. His excellent agility and shot stopping, combined with excellent distribution, makes him a valued addition to Town's squad. He has also had temporary spells with Royal Atwerp, Burnley, MK Dons and Northampton. **Phillip Senior** has come up through the ranks at Huddersfield and has now made over 50 appearances, the

last of which came at home to Barnsley at the start of April.

Regarded as one of the most talented players in the team, **David Mirfin** graduated from the Academy in the 2003/04 campaign and made an immediate impression. Drafted in as cover for Nathan Clarke, 'Mirfs' performed magnificently and quickly made the right-back position his own. A utility player who can play anywhere across a back four and has even been known to grab a goal as a striker. The experienced **Martin McIntosh** has over 400 league starts to his name during spells with a host of Scottish clubs

as well as Stockport County and Rotherham United, before joining Huddersfield last June.

**Nathan Clarke** signed professional forms in September 2001 after impressing in the Academy ranks. He was plunged into first team action in the 2001/2002 season and made an instant impact and established himself in the first team. Earned the Player of the Year in the 2004/05 season and is a key member of the defence. After falling out of favour at Stockport, experienced defender **Danny Adams** played the remaining handful of games for the Terriers after coming on loan in the spring of 2005 and has been in consistent form this term, but is yet to find the net.

After starting life at Middlesbrough, **Mark Hudson** spent loan spells with Chesterfield and Carlisle before a permanent move to Saltergate in March 2003. After 72 league starts, Huddersfield came calling in June 2005 where a permanent deal was struck. A goalscorer the last time the two clubs met at The Galpharm, **Chris Brandon** began his footballing career with Bradford PA in August 1997 before a move to Torquay two seasons later. He joined Huddersfield in the summer of 2004 after signing from Chesterfield. **Danny Schofield** was plucked

from non-league Brodsworth for just £2,000 in August 1998 and has not looked back. He now has over 200 appearances to his name in the league and has contributed an impressive ten goals from the middle this season. **David Graham** is currently on loan from Championship side Sheffield Wednesday. Former clubs include Torquay United and Wigan Athletic, whom he joined for £215,000 in June 2004.

Now something of a hero at Huddersfield, **Andy Booth** has now scored over 100 goals for The Terriers in two separate spells. After leaving his hometown club in July 1996 for a record £2.7million, bound for Sheffield Wednesday, he enjoyed four productive seasons at Hillsborough. However, the striker returned to Huddersfield in March 2001 and since his return, he has hit 56 goals in 163 appearances, with 15 this term. **Pawel Abbott** is yet another member of the impressive striking brigade at The Galpharm and has also banged in 14 goals this season. The York-born Polish Under 21 international has had previous spells with LKS Lodz, Bury and Preston North End before signing on a free in March 2004. **John McAliskey** joined Huddersfield as a trainee and has scored 6 goals to date in 36 league appearances. He has spent time this season on loan at Torquay United.

## Peter Jackson

**Peter Jackson is a manager with a growing reputation.**

Currently in his second spell as Terriers boss, Jackson first took over from Brian Horton in October 1997 bringing his current assistant Terry Yorath in with him. However, in May 1999 he was replaced by Steve Bruce.

In June 2003 Town decided it was time to replace Mick Wadsworth and the door re-opened for Jackson who, along with Yorath as assistant, returned as manager.

As a player Jackson made well over 300 appearances for neighbours Bradford as well as playing 60 times for Newcastle United amongst a number of clubs. A solid defender he finally hung up his boots in April 1998 to concentrate on management.



- Huddersfield Town FC was **formed in 1908** and began playing their games at Leeds Road. The club's beginnings here were modest enough - there were no turnstiles or covered areas, and no dressing rooms, so players changed in an old tramcar, a tent or a nearby pub.

## Interesting Facts...

- Conversely, during the 1950's Town were one of the first clubs to install an **electronic scoreboard** at their ground, a gift from Dutch company Philips, who had a factory near the town.

- On 30th April 1994 The Terriers played their **last game** at Leeds Road

before moving to the newly built Alfred McAlpine (now Galpharm) Stadium. They christened their new home with a 0-1 defeat against Wycombe Wanderers.

- Huddersfield's **record signing** is Marcus Stewart, who signed from Bristol Rovers for £1.2million in July 1996.

# We Meet Again



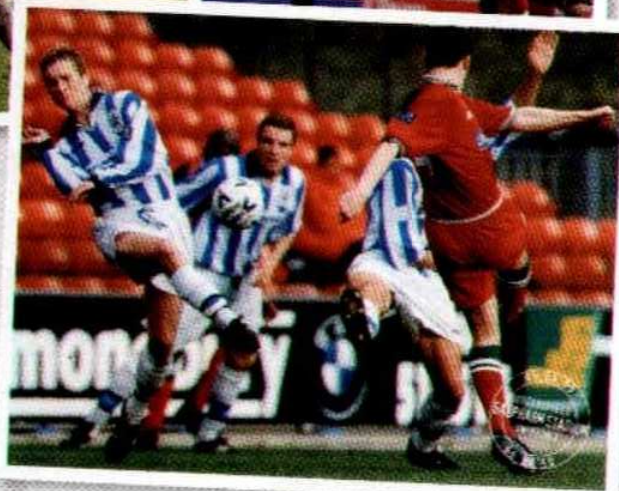
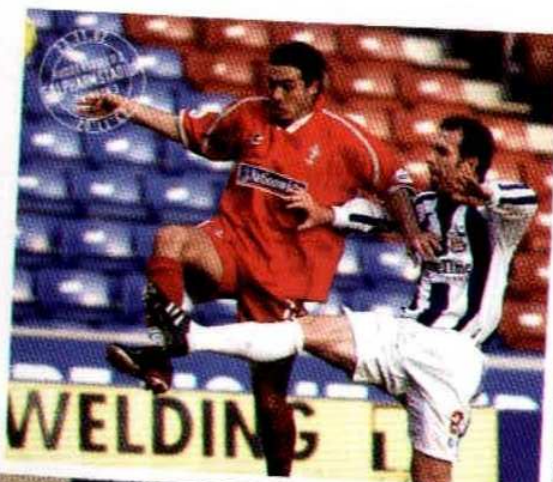
**W**hat Town would give for a first minute goal against Huddersfield Town this afternoon.

**S**windon Town were relegated after a pulsating West Country derby in which their hopes were lifted by a superb 49th minute goal by Aaron Brown.

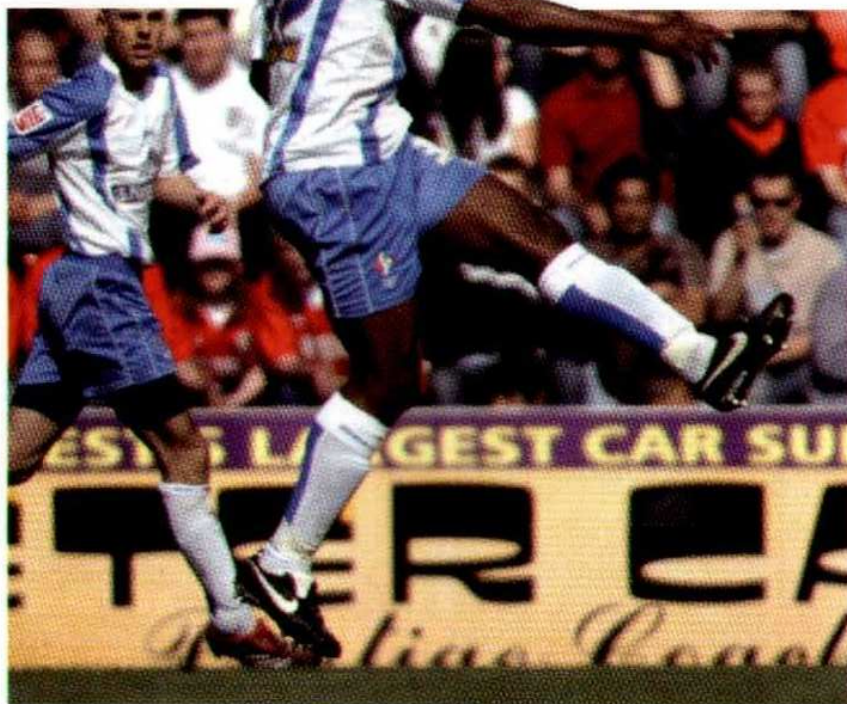

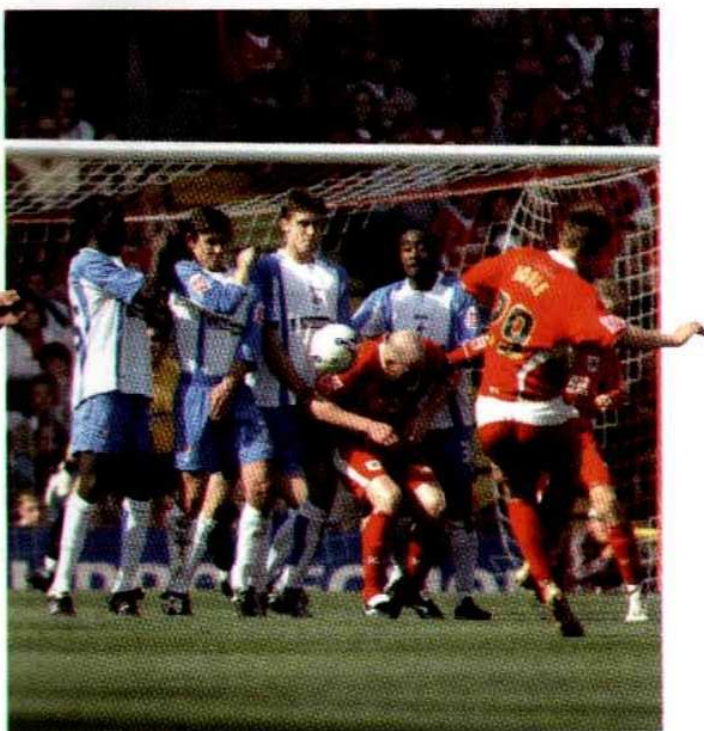
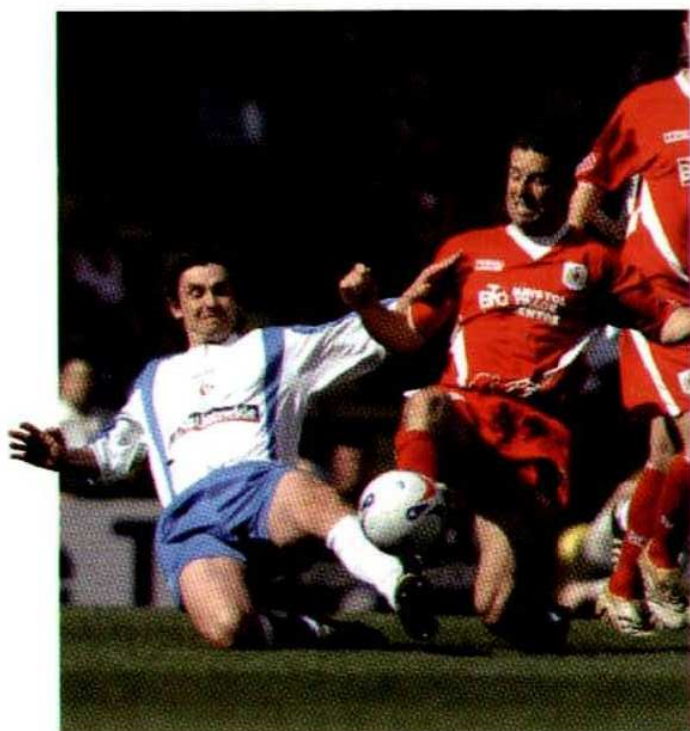
Steve Jenkins was forced off after a collision inside the area with Andy Gurney coming on to replace him.

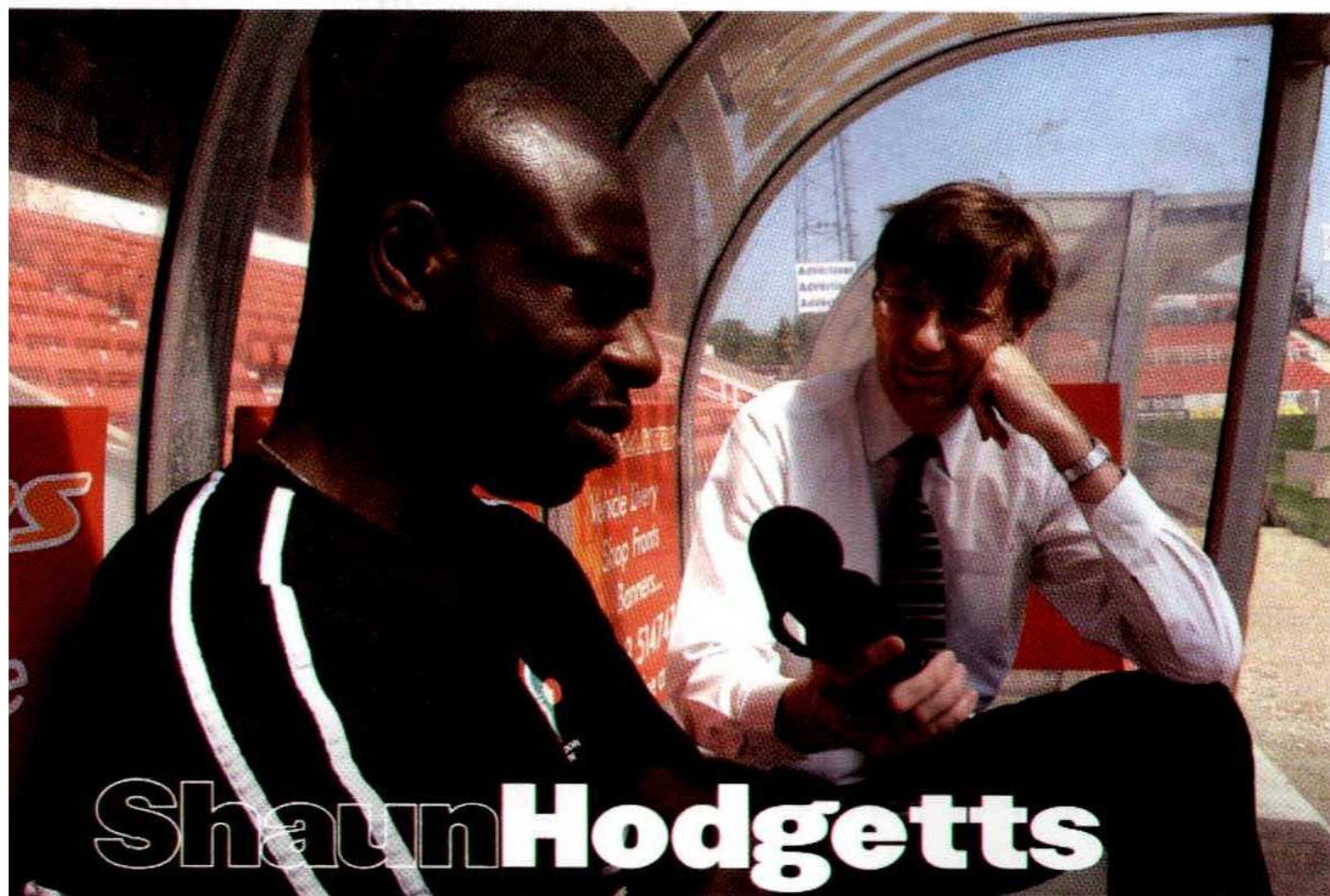

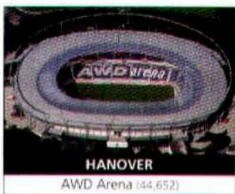

# World Cup Robins



WITH THE WORLD CUP JUST WEEKS AWAY, IT MIGHT COME AS A SURPRISE JUST HOW MANY PLAYERS HAVE FEATURED IN THE TOURNAMENT SINCE 1978 WHO HAVE ALSO PULLED ON THE RED AND WHITE OF SWINDON TOWN. DAVE WALLIS TAKES A LOOK AT YEARS GONE BY...

Appearing for England in the tournaments of 1982 and 1986, it is surely a loss to the world that England's failure to qualify for 1978 denied **Glenn Hoddle** the opportunity to show his skills in Argentina. Coming on as a substitute for Bryan Robson in the 2-0 win against Czechoslovakia on 20th June 1982, he completed

wins from three games. Current world champions France were a distant second after succumbing 3-1 to England, Bryan Robson scoring after 27 seconds. 0-0 draws against West Germany and Spain prevented further England progress past the second group stage, and Hoddle was denied an appearance in either game.

England competed in and the disappointing opening 1-0 defeat by Portugal, followed by the hand wringing, head holding 0-0 draw with Morocco made progression for England look unlikely. However, three goals by Gary Lineker against Poland put England through from the group stages and Hoddle was again a participant when Lineker and Beardsley repeated the score line against Paraguay. Ultimately, Diego Maradona broke England's spirit and hearts with one goal of impudence and one goal of inspiration in an unforgettable 2-1 win for the Argentinians.

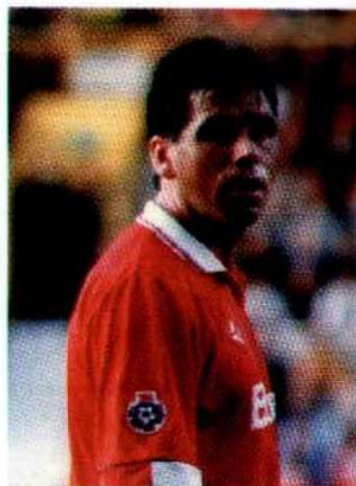
In the same game, one player left trailing in Maradona's wake on his unstoppable route to his second goal was Hoddle's Spurs team mate **Terry Fenwick**. Fenwick made 28 league appearances for Swindon and featured in four of England's five England World Cup final games in Mexico '86. Making a total of 20 England appearances, Terry moved on to Portsmouth from Swindon after just two games of the 1994/95 season, following an



the full 90 minutes five days later against Kuwait in a functional but uninspiring 1-0 win to leave England top of their group with three

By 1986 Hoddle was a more established figure in the England camp. Bobby Robson chose Glenn for all five of the games that

unseemly on pitch altercation with fellow Town player Luc Nijholt. Fenwick later became manager at Fratton Park.

Mexico '86 turned out to be a breeding ground for future Swindon centre backs, as another was to win three international caps then.

**Alan McDonald**, then of QPR, played in all three of Northern Ireland's World Cup matches, playing against Algeria, Spain and Brazil but failed to finish on the winning side in any of them.

Finally for 1986, a player who was to take to the field in seven games for Swindon Town in the Premiership won two caps.

**Frank MacAvennie** came on as substitute in 0-1 and 2-1 defeats by Denmark and West Germany respectively whilst collecting his Scotland caps. Picking his appearances well, Frank managed to select Manchester United and Arsenal amongst the opponents in those seven matches in a Town shirt after joining on a short-term contract from Celtic. He was consistent as well.

Town failed to win any of the seven!

On to 1990 and to Italy. **Steve McMahon** was a regular member of Bobby Robson's squad for Robson's second World Cup finals competition. Coming on a substitute for Peter Beardsley after 69 minutes, McMahon first appeared in the foremost international tournament against Republic of Ireland. The outcome was a 1-1 draw, a game in which Town Wembley goal scorer **Alan McLoughlin** was to make an appearance for the Republic, coming on as a 64th minute replacement for John Aldridge.

Ten days later McMahon was a member of the side that beat Egypt by a goal to nil, and which brought

progression to the knockout stages. After 71 minutes of the game against Belgium, McMahon was the man who gave way for the arrival of David Platt and the stage was set for Platt to swivel on to Paul Gascoigne's free kick to dramatically win the game one minute from the end of extra time.

For his part, Alan McLoughlin had added to his caps in a 0-0 draw between Republic of Ireland and Egypt.

McMahon's fourth and last appearance in the World Cup finals was in the 3rd/4th place play-off game against Italy. Again, substitution followed but this time he was replaced by another man to feature in a Town side. **Neil Webb's** 20 minutes were to be his only in the World

Cup finals, and he went on to appear in six Division One matches for Town in 1994 as we unsuccessfully fought relegation to the Second. Ironically, John Gorman who had signed Webb on loan and for whom Webb made all his appearances at Swindon, was to be replaced by McMahon just weeks after Webb returned to Nottingham Forest.

**Roy Wegerle** made seven appearances for Swindon under Lou Macari in 1988 whilst on loan from Chelsea, and he made a total of six World Cup finals appearances spanning the 1994 and 1998 tournaments. Roy's appearances all involved substitution. Five times he was brought on in the last half an hour, whilst on the sixth

occasion he was the man to come off. Only two games brought a win, one by 1-0 against Iran in France 1998 and the other a 2-1 victory against Colombia in USA '94. This game was marred by being the one in which Escobar scored the goal which gifted the States the match and which was generally believed to be the reason for Escobar's assassination on his return to Colombia.

1994 was also the year that a real Town favourite adopted son was to perform on the greatest stage. **Jan Aage Fjortoft** made appearances for Norway in a 1-0 win against Mexico and a 1-0 defeat by Italy. He had been signed by John Gorman the previous summer as Town embarked on their first season

in the Premiership, and after an uncertain start, he established himself firmly in the attack of many a Swindon Town supporter's (this one included) greatest eleven.

Another man to figure in a Swindon Town all time greatest team would surely be **Colin Calderwood**, maker of 330 League appearances for Swindon and contributor to many of the best occasions that Town supporters have ever had the good fortune to witness. His two Scottish World Cup finals caps came in 1998 against Brazil and Norway. Unable to point to a victory amongst them, it can't be a bad thing to be able to tell the grandchildren that you played against Brazil. I for one was delighted to see

Colin make the grade all the way to the World Cup finals, and alongside Alan McLoughlin they are the only two ex-Swindon players to graduate to this level after their Town careers had set them on the path.

Back in 1978 the only home nation to qualify for Argentina was Scotland and **Lou Macari**, still six years away from taking over as boss at Swindon, won caps against Peru and Iran. Sadly for Lou, having played in the two games that epitomised the over optimistic Ally MacLeod reign, he was denied the opportunity to claw back some glory in the Archie Gemmill fuelled, face saving 3-2 win against Holland.

As recently as 2002, keeper **Shay Given** played all four matches for the Republic of Ireland, facing Cameroon, Germany, and Saudi Arabia before finally going out to Spain on penalties in the second round. Seven years earlier he had made five appearances for Town while on loan from Blackburn Rovers.

The ex-Town players named so far are responsible for

winning 37 World Cup final caps since 1978, but there are still two names, who between them can point to the highest accolades that international football can bestow.

One is **Ossie Ardiles**. In 1978 Ossie was part of the influential Argentinian midfield that won the World Cup for the home country. Playing in six of the seven Argentina games, Ossie came to Swindon via Spurs and Blackburn and is the only player to have pulled on the red shirt of Swindon (albeit only twice) and to also hold a World Cup winner medal.

By now there might be some head-scratching going on to determine who could possibly be bracketed together with such a star as Ossie Ardiles in the Swindon Town World Cup Hall of Fame. He didn't quite reach the heights of a winners medal, but he played in the World Cup final against West Germany in 1990, emerging with a losers

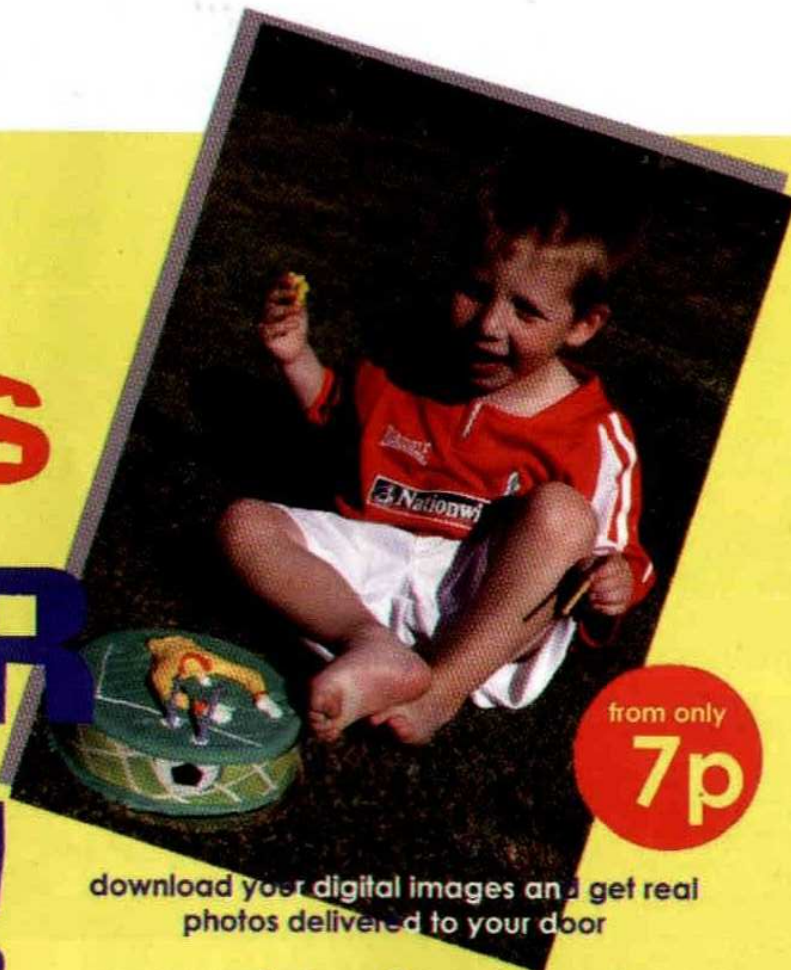
medal in the 1-0 defeat. Ossie was instrumental in bringing him to Swindon in December 1990, just six months after he first placed that World Cup medal on his mantelpiece. Contradictory figures of £160,000 and 'around' £400,000 were supposed to have been paid to Italian club Bari for his signature, and the money, which bought him, was part of the £1m that Town received for the sale of Alan McLoughlin to Southampton.

**Nestor Lorenzo** deserved greater recognition for his status as a World Cup final medal holder while he was with Swindon. This was a man who had played for Argentina in the World Cup final the same year that he chose to sign for Swindon Town. Making just 26 appearances for Town, he departed for pastures new in the summer of 1992.

Town should have made more mileage out of his presence, not to say his ability.

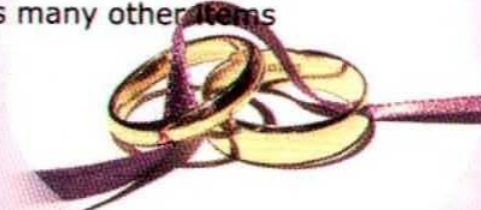

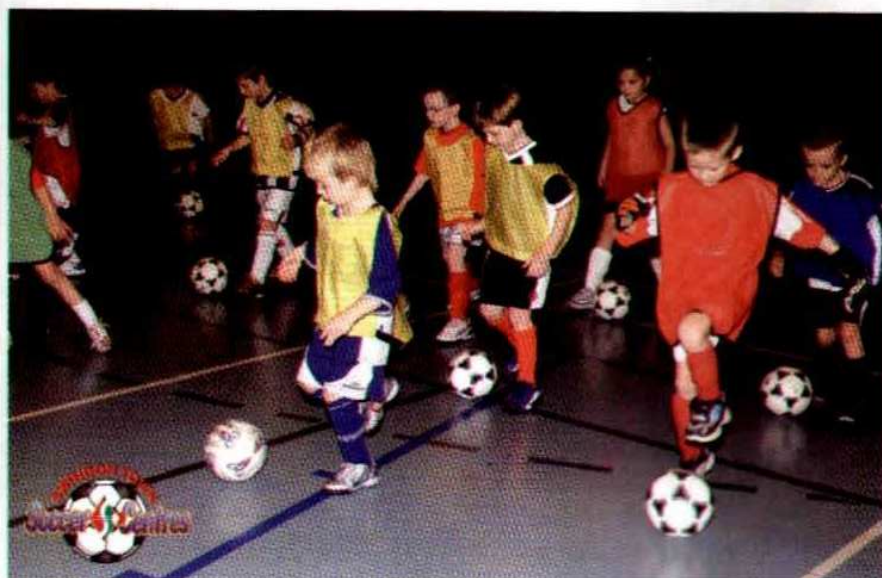

## Midtable finish after bright start

**A**fter consecutive promotions, season 1987/88 saw Swindon playing Division Two football for the first time in 14 years.

Led by Lou Macari, we needed a season of consolidation, and the campaign pitted the two Towns of Swindon and Huddersfield together in the fight for League points.

If there were those who thought our rapid rise might prove to be too far, too quickly, no one on the playing staff appeared to share their reservations. As

early as 10th October, a 2-0 home win over Oldham saw us sit fourth in the table, but mid November saw us 12th and our position never wavered by more than two places from then on.

Spookily, it was Halloween before today's visitors won their first match. If Swindon were to be consistent, Huddersfield would be likewise, but sadly for the Terriers that would be their downfall.

The first away match of Huddersfield's season perhaps set the tone. A 6-1 defeat at Plymouth was a bad start,





and the October 2-1 home win over Millwall had been preceded by six straight defeats. Another two followed immediately afterwards.

On 1st December 1987, the Terriers came to the County Ground and returned north on the end of a 4-1 hiding. Goals from Bobby Barnes, Jimmy Quinn and a brace from Steve Foley did the damage, with Graham Cooper grabbing Huddersfield's consolation.

In February, the return match ended in another three-goal margin in Swindon's favour. A strike from Kieran O'Regan and two goals from Dave Bamber gave us the advantage, with the home team unable to reply.

Never higher than 20th, 10 of the last 12 Huddersfield games were lost and the season closed with the Leeds Road-based club a huge 14 points adrift at the bottom of the table.

In a division that contained 23 clubs due to a reduction in the division above, the Terriers took the drop to Division Three alongside Reading and Sheffield United. How that contrasts with all their fortunes this season.

The Blades were relegated

after losing in the play-offs, in the days when bottom-placed teams were also involved in the end of season lottery.

Top scorer for Swindon was Jimmy Quinn, who included six penalties in his 21-goal haul, and another eight strikes in cup competition. Dave Bamber grabbed 13 and Steve White hit 11.

It perhaps says a lot about the standard of the division, that after a win on 15th March

left us 12th in the table, we won just twice more in the last 12 games and still finished 12th.

As for Huddersfield, their top scorer was to become a familiar name in Wiltshire.

Having scored 16 goals, the summer saw Duncan Shearer move between the two Towns in exchange for £230,000. He had hit a creditable six cup goals, but surprisingly his team were still eliminated from both League and FA Cups at the first hurdle.

Apart from the switch of Shearer, Kieran O'Regan moved to Huddersfield in the summer of 1988 and Lou Macari also had a stint at the helm of both clubs.

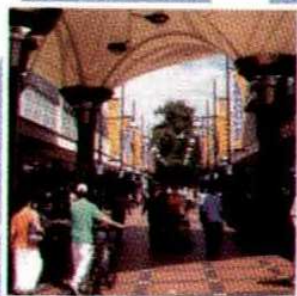

# We've got the Power

DOWN BUT NOT OUT - NEW  
DIRECTOR BILL POWER ON AN  
EXCITING FUTURE FOR STFC...

**S**o last week it finally happened. The draw at Bristol City condemned us to the basement division for the first time in 20 years. Relegation hurts. A lot.

But life goes on – and for those that didn't attend the City game last week to see the fans' display, one gets the feeling that this adversity will only bring the club closer together. In short, the supporters were magnificent – loud and proud indeed.

And with a bit of luck next season will be one to remember for all of us...one that will see us beat Oxford, Rovers and Cheltenham and return to League One and beyond. And if new director Bill Power has got anything to with it – it'll be the start of

another incredible 125 years of rich history and tradition.

Just days after the Brentford defeat the club was boosted by the arrival of Bill Power, a former colleague of Mark Devlin, a lifelong QPR fan who has been chairman of the West London club, and a man who wants to invest in our beloved Robins.

STFC found Power to be immediately likeable as we caught up with him in his car in between meetings – a busy man is our Bill, but he's always got time to talk football – and his enthusiasm is infectious. His vision for the club will excite and enthrall... and he'd love to tell you all about it over a pint. A small price to pay for the money he's looking to invest, I think you'll find...



## Welcome to Swindon Town Bill... despite the relegation – how's life at SN1 so far?!

I'm obviously sad we've been relegated, but in all honesty it wasn't as though it was unexpected, was it? I notice people have been saying that I was waiting to see what happened with the club before I invested – my investment was never in doubt, I was always going to invest here – my only regret is that it didn't happen sooner. It might not have mattered anyway, but you never know – unfortunately I was so busy in my own business life that I couldn't. I'm just looking forward to getting stuck into next season.

They're all lovely people here and very enthusiastic about Swindon Town, I'm really looking forward to working with them.

## We know you're a keen football man – how did you get involved with the game?

I was born overlooking QPR and my family were all keen football fans. My dad, brothers, sister and mother – we all loved football and while we'd go to watch QPR, we'd also go and watch Chelsea and Fulham, who were both down the road.

## Tell us a bit about your business background...

I became a business partner by accident, really. I started life as an electrician about 20 years ago, but a friend of mine started talking about setting up a satellite-communications company. I thought he was mad, he might as well have been talking nonsense! Still, he asked me to help him out

and we've never looked back. We've worked hard down the years, putting in 16/17 hour days – but now, for example, we look after communications for numerous British embassies.

## You've been in contact with the club for several months haven't you – did you get many games in?

I've seen a few, but the one that sticks out for me and gives me real hope for next season is the Colchester win. We looked so good, we played them off the park – even in the second half when they started strongly, at times looking like they had extra men, we got it back and played well.

Football's a confidence thing. I remember watching QPR vs Darlington once in a cup game; both sides were dreadful! But at half-time their subs looked like Brazilians, I was pleased they weren't playing! But when they did come on – the pressure of the game was too much for them, and that's what I'm talking about – confidence.

I know our players are good and are capable of better – there is no reason why we shouldn't go up next year.

## Some people on the message boards have asked why someone would invest £1 million in a club going down to League Two...

That's a slightly spurious question, because it was all about a matter of timing. There was always a chance relegation could happen and it is disappointing. My team has gone through it and it's hard, but you have to look forward – and so far everyone I have spoken to has been

great, really positive.

## Were you not wary of getting involved with a football club again after your experiences at QPR?

I was, yes! I said to my business partner never again. QPR are dear to my heart and I wasn't happy with the way things went, but that's life – if we all stopped coming to work because of a bad experience we might as well all stay at home. I'm positive, I don't want to put any pressure on people to succeed – but we have to move forward.

## You seem keen to communicate with the fans via message boards and other avenues. How will you do that?

I'm looking forward to that side of things, but I'll wait until the end of the season. But I love it; it's what football is all about. Listen, if we all wanted success we'd all go and support Chelsea. We're here because we have an affinity with this club and people will have opinions on it.

## How much will relegation hurt us financially?

Obviously it will have an impact, but Mark worked out a budget with relegation in mind. That's not to say we expected it, but we planned for it in case it happened. Hopefully the ticket prices will keep fans interested and attract new ones – we will survive, we will be ok. We'll be here next year, the year after that and the year after that – hopefully for another 125 years.

Despite Sir Seton Wills helping this club, you can't keep putting money in year after year – it has to work on an even keel. Our budget will allow for that...







**Will there be money available for new players?**

First and foremost the club has to survive, but if players are out there...Iffy has already brought one player to my attention and we put an offer in for him – and he was at a higher level. It didn't come off, but that's how it will work. We're not going to bankroll a load of new signings – but if players become available that will make a difference to our team then money will be made available. We won't be gambling on one big player.

**How will the club look to build on the existing fan base?**

I haven't sat down and spoken to Mark about it yet – but the under 7s ticket price, in which they come free with a parent or guardian, is a good start. I can only compare this club to other clubs I know and it does a lot of community work, more than a lot of others – but there is always

room for improvement. I like to tell people the truth, not what they want to hear and I hope that this improved communication will help bring us all together – we can't treat people like mugs.

**How do you assess the manager's situation – will Iffy be here next season?**

I have a great respect for Iffy. He is articulate, he knows what he's talking about. He has big plans for new players and he should be given the chance to finish what he's started. Remember he came in during difficult circumstances – a tough experience for his first managerial role. We need to support him.

**What about stadium developments – can we expect any in the next few months/years?**

To be honest that's one thing I haven't been involved with – I'm here to help with the playing side of things and the communication.

With that said, from what I have heard – Swindon Council are being very helpful. At QPR the local council were no help – and from what people are saying here there seems to be a huge improvement in that area.

**Finally, where do you see Swindon Town in five years time?**

Without doubt Swindon Town has every chance of being a Championship club. It's a friendly club with good history and with a good run who knows where we can end up? Reality says that we can't compete at the top of the Premiership – but we might get there so let's have fun trying.

I'm not trying to endear myself to fans, I am genuinely looking forward to it and in Mark Devlin, Mike Sullivan, Willie Carson, everybody here – we have great people. Together we will do everything we can to take it back to the top.

In the second half Town had two penalty appeals waved away, the first an apparent handball, before Cureton was felled by Nelson with no spot-kick forthcoming.

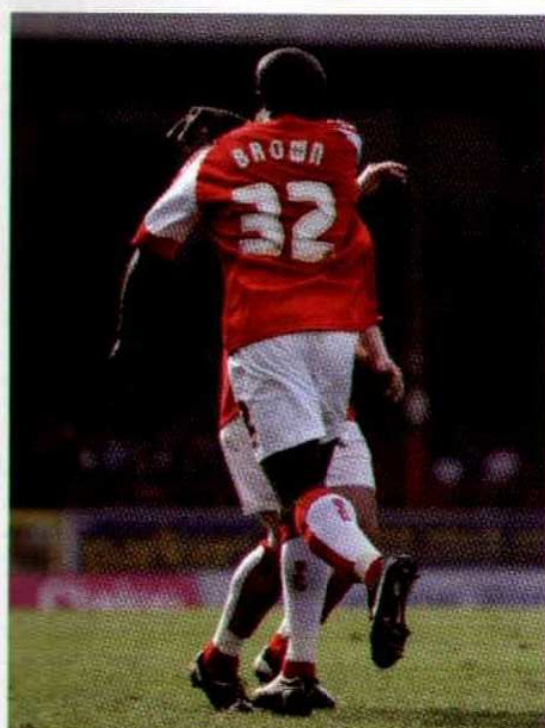
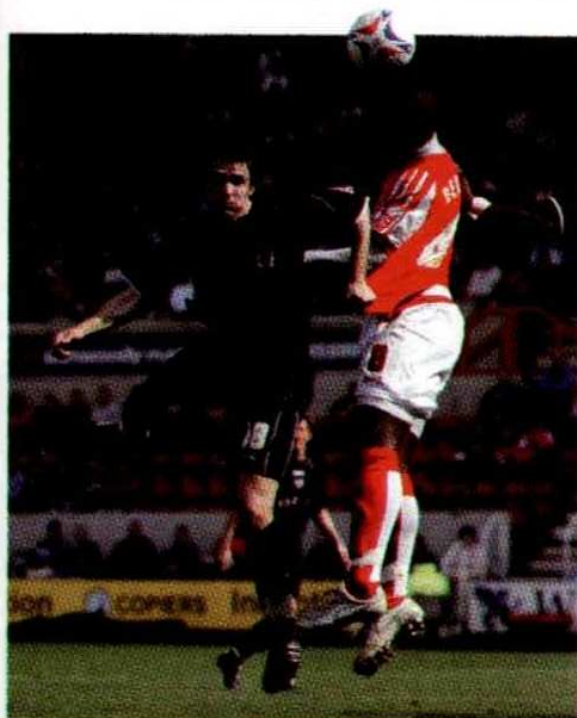
