

JIM GANNON

During his ten-year playing career with County he helped the club win two promotions and reach four Wembley Finals. His 478 senior appearances for the Hatters have only been bettered by two players, Andy Thorpe and Bobby Murray. The number of games he's played in the League Cup, 37, and Divisional Competitions, 39, are both club records.

Although he played much of his career in central defence, Gannon was also a prolific goalscorer. Nicknamed 'The Ghost' for his ability to arrive at the far post unnoticed only eight players have scored more than his 64 County goals - a club record for a defender/ midfielder. In recognition of his outstanding service to Stockport County, Jim Gannon became one of the first players to enter the club's Hall of Fame on its inception in 2002.

After retiring Gannon took the managerial reins at Dundalk in his native Ireland in May 2003. He was appointed Stockport manager in January 2006 after Chris Turner resigned.





STOCKPORT

t's been a couple of seasons since we faced this afternoon's visitors, but a warm welcome to players, officials and supporters of Stockport County for today's League Two fixture.

Jim Gannon's team have had a tough start to the season, collecting two points from the opening four fixtures. Last weekend's 1-1 home draw with Accrington Stanley left the club near the bottom of the embryonic table, but no-one will be fooled into thinking that will be an indicator of how today's game will pan out.

Gannon's arrival in January of this year resulted in County hoisting themselves off the bottom of the League Two table to the brink of safety, and Oxford United's failure in the last League match at the Kassam Stadium for a while. completed County's escape route.

Last weekend, loan signing Glenn Murray scored County's goal

Defender

Raynes showed further improvement last season and is turning into a more-thanreliable, centre half who attracted interest from Liverpool during the campaign. In April he scored his first goal for the club, which proved to be the winner in a vital 2-1 victory over Wrexham. Salford-born midfielder who has now made just over 100 senior appearances as a professional. He began his career with Oldham Athletic and spent four years at Boundary Park, which also included Ioan stints at Chester, Oxford United and Stockport at the end of last season - before he made the move permanent in the summer.

ADAM PROUDLOCK Striker



Experienced and inventive striker who has higher-level experience with Sheffield Wednesday and Wolves. Once linked with a move to Swindon, Proudlock has scored 28 goals from 97 league starts and spent five years with the Midlands club before a £150,000 move to The Owls in September 2003. Made his debut for County in the home game with Accrington Stanley last Friday.

++ Other players include former Southend United striker Tes Bramble, who joined the club in the summer of 2005. Striker Liam Dickinson signed for County in December 2005 from local side Woodley Sports and adds height to the frontline when involved. Midfielder Greg Tansey is so highly thought of at Edgeley Park that he was given a two-year contract during the summer.

hat have David Beckham, Michael Jordan, Nicky Hammond and Curtis Weston got in common? No dirty gags about Posh Spice please... no, all of the above wear (or have worn) the number 23 shirt – and all have become legends in their own right.

Granted, Curtis is still relatively unproven and at just 19 years of age he's a mere whippersnapper, while Beckham and Jordan are global institutions (they tell me Hammond is a legend down the road at the Mad Stad), but the reaction to Weston's penalty miss on Tuesday night against Brentford proves how highly thought of he is with The County Ground faithful following his switch from Millwall in the summer. That, and he holds the world record for being the youngest player to have played in an FA Cup final after his cameo appearance against Manchester United in 2004 broke the 125-year record set by James Prinsep...

Weston was given the opportunity to kick-start his career this summer by Wise after our supremo decided to raid his old club for the promising youngster. Weston grasped it with both hands. Wise was obviously suitably impressed by what he had seen from Weston during his tenure at the New Den and subsequently offered him the chance to show what he could do at 5Nl after some dynamic displays in pre-season pen was put to paper.

And while history is exactly where Weston will be looking to put his penalty miss, the future looks rosy for the combative midfielder...



To be honest the fans were great all night and have been all season – they're working as hard off the pitch as we are on it – we're working hard for each other at the moment

Shame to go out on Tuesday night... but the performance showed that this team is confident, resilient and able to mix it with a side from a higher league?

I thought we played really well – they were a good team, and it was a strong side they put out as well – we had several players missing and a number of new players come in to the side.

The six non-regulars started and did well — it must be a nice situation for the team to have such competition for places?

Yeah it will be good for all of us to have that: to keep us all going and on our toes. But I think it's great for the Gaffer as well, to know that when required he can bring other players in — it's a good situation for all of us.

We looked extremely fit towards the end of the Brentford game – could our fitness could be the difference this year?

It is all due to the pre-season work, which was one of the hardest I've done but we're getting a lot out of it now. I have had pre-seasons like that before when I was at Millwall – and while it's hard it's worth it in the long run.

The Brentford lads couldn't keep up...

Yeah, even some of the Brentford lads were going down with cramp towards the end of the match and we were still hassling them, closing them down.

You switched to the right hand side of midfield – how did you find it?

I enjoyed it to be honest... it was different, although I have played there before at Millwall.

Do you prefer playing in the middle?

I do, but I have shown that I can do a job at the right hand side of midfield and if the Gaffer needs me to do it again, I will quite happily.

Paul Evans has hit a purple patch of form – do you feel as though he is a player you can learn from?

Definitely. He has a lot of experience and a lot of quality on the ball — he talks a lot to. helping me with advice all the time — it's like having another captain on the field. Paul, Ady, Jamie and Jerel — they all talk to the younger players and it's a big help.

Shame about your penalty miss the other night...

Yeah I'm disappointed about it but it happens. The Gaffer just said that

he'd missed them before as well, and to move on.

The fans applauded you when you ran back to the centre circle – that was a nice touch...




The performance should be enough to give the players a lot of confidence, was that the thoughts of the manager afterwards?

Pretty much – it proved we can play and show tremendous spirit. We'll be looking to continue it against Stockport.

At least we can concentrate on the league... last week's win at Darlington was arguably the best of the season so far — they're no mugs...

It was a good game for us. We played well against a strong side and at the start of the game we just stuck to our job. When they got their goal they grew in confidence but we did well to keep them out.

We seem to be getting stronger with each game, the football more fluent – is that down to confidence or things that are being worked on in training?

I think it's a bit of both, but with winning games comes an increase in confidence – and with that you give yourself more time on the ball, you relax when passing.

Paul Evans is probably the best example of that...

He is – Evo's great at getting the ball, giving it and calming play down; keeping possession.

Have you been happy with your form so far this season?

I'm fairly happy – I'm working hard and I just want to keep going, do my best and see if I can do better.

You played extremely well in pre-season, causing many fans to wonder why Millwall had let you go? What happened there?

After the Gaffer left [Wise] I didn't really get a look in under the other managers — I just don't think they fancied me and that happens in football. As soon as the Gaffer came in for me I knew that coming here was what I wanted to do. He's been

an excellent manager for me and him joining Swindon was a big part in my decision to come here.

Does it help that he played in your position?

Well if you consider that I've got Dennis, Gus and Evo to learn from... for me it doesn't really get any better...

You've had two yellow cards in the first five games — his influence must be rubbing off on you!

[Laughs] I don't know – I think that's just part of my own game – I like to get stuck in, but I'll try to keep it under control in future!

What did he say to you when he came off for you in the FA Cup final against Manchester United in 2004?

Just to go out there and enjoy myself, and I did!

That must have been a great moment? Were you aware that you were breaking the record?

Not at all. I didn't even know I was on the bench until the day. I knew I was in the squad, and it wasn't until someone read through the programme after the game that they pointed it out to me. That was an extra bonus!

Did you manage to swap shirts with anyone at the end?

I was only on the pitch for a few minutes, but I managed to get Mikael Silvestre's shirt – I keep his shirt together with the one I wore.

How different have you found League Two in comparison to the Championship and Millwall's reserves?


If anything it's easier to get involved because I'm starting games. I didn't play too many at Millwall and when you come on as a sub it's hard. But I'm loving, really loving it at the moment!

There seems to be a good team spirit here – who do you get on with most?

To be honest everyone gets on with everyone - they really do. Obviously living with Fola and Monky [Andy Monkhouse] before that. I'm probably a bit closer to them, but we all get on well.

Andy Monkhouse suggested in our first interview that living in the club house was "interesting" — is it any tidier now he's moved out?!

windon Town's Reserves drew 2-2 in their Sopening fixture of the season, a game that took place at Hunts Copse, the home of Swindon Supermarine.

A double from Fola Onibuje earned Town a share of the spoils but a late comeback from the Glovers, with a brace from Daniel Webb. meant a point for both sides.

The game started brightly for Swindon with Fola Onibuje causing problems in the Yeovil backline. Onibuje motored past his marker on the right hand side and cut the ball back for Lukas Jutkiewicz who had the ball in the back of the net from six yards only to be ruled out as the ball had run out of play.

Jutkiewicz then hit a shot just wide from 20-yards after brushing past three Yeovil defenders before seeing his overhead kick fly over on 19 minutes.

Swindon took the lead on 22 minutes. An attempted clearance from the Yeovil defence found the head of Ashan Holgate 30-yards out who looped his header back into the path of Onibuje who beat the offside trap and slid the ball home from 12-yards.

Phil Smith produced a good reaction save to deny substitute Stephen Maher on the half hour mark before Aaron Brown dragged a shot wide at the other end. Jutkiewicz was then denied twice in the space of three minutes from close range before Swindon conjured their second goal of the evening.

A corner from the left, taken by Aaron Brown, found the head of Royce Brownlie who brought a smart save from Darren Behcet in

the Glovers goal, but the ball was only parried and Fola Onibuje was on hand to drive the ball into the roof of the net to make it 2-0 on the stroke of half-time.

Just seven minutes into the second period the visitors got a goal back. Substitute Daniel Webb hit a volley from inside the box which took a deflection off Swindon substitute Alex Rigley and looped past Smith into the net.


Moments after scoring his first of the night, Webb wasted no time in adding the equaliser. Webb advanced into the area and slotted the ball under the advancing Phil Smith to make it 2-2.

Swindon Boss David Lee then made a double substitution with Mustapha Carayol and Chris Allen replacing Royce Brownlie and David Stroud. Onibuje then saw a right foot shot go narrowly wide from 25 yards on 75 minutes before Daniel Webb prevented a Swindon winner with minutes to go. intercepting a Wells cross.

Onibuje's performance drew some praise from former Chelsea defender and reserve manager Lee, but he was quick to emphasize the opportunities that are in place for members of the Robins second string.

"Fola scored a double and did ok at times. He has done well in the reserves on a few occasions, but as I said to all the lads after the game, they have to keep their standards high if they want to get a first team opportunity.

"The reserve games offer the players the chance to knock on the first team door. They are useful to as a fitness exercise, the lads have to know that they have to treat the reserve team games as first team games. They cannot afford to go through the motions, they have to give their all in these fixtures and that's what we will be asking of them," said Lee.





CHALKIE WHITE

A Lou Macari signing who proved to be one of the best amongst many bargains the Scotsman found for Town, Arrived from Bristol Rovers on a free transfer in July 1986 Chalkie already had a wealth of experience and a good pedigree. With more than 30 goals in less than 70 League and Cup appearances for Luton and a spell at Charlton Athletic. he had already justified transfer fees of almost £400,000. Just why Steve found it necessary to scrap around the lower divisions was difficult to fathom then and now.

Managed to annoy opposing defenders by being all elbows, and often frustrating supporters with his inability to beat an offside trap, Chalkie still managed to knock in over 100 goals in little more than 300 games for Town. Will be most affectionately remembered in Swindon for charging into the penalty area at Wembley with minutes to go of the 1993 Division One play-off final, and drawing the foul that gave Paul Bodin the chance to secure Premiership football from

Went on to finish his playing career at Hereford, and teamed up with 'Bodes' again in a managerial team at Bath City before spending time as manager of Chippenham Town.

the penalty spot.

CAPTAINS

It's considered an honour to be nominated as your club's captain, and summer signing Ady Williams had the title bestowed on him by Dennis Wise as this season kicked off. Christian Roberts deputises in his absence.

Ady is the latest in a list that includes some silver-lofting personalities, amongst them Colin Calderwood, Shaun Taylor and Stan Harland all of whom wore Town shirts as they hoisted trophies. Obviously centre back skippers bring success. Start practicing your handshakes Adv.

CARLISLE



Town have now got a reputation for a team that has risen from the bottom division to the top, only to find ourselves back at the foot again. Carlisle United have done the same, and actually left the Football League bound for the Conference in 2004. Now upwardly mobile once more and back in the Championship, United are setting the trend for us to follow again.

Before they reached their nadir, Carlisle had one particular reason to thank Swindon, Keeper Jimmy Glass, on loan from Town for the last game of 1998/99, scored the goal deep into injury time against Plymouth Argyle which (temporarily) retained their League place.

CARRICK. MICHAEL



Signed for Man U for £18.6m from Tottenham after the World Cup. he immediately got himself injured. Played

six times and scored two goals for Town in November/December 1999 whilst on loan from West Ham. It wasn't a good time. We finished bottom of Division One.

Despite Carrick's goal at home to Charlton we lost 2-1, and his second strike for Town came in a 1-1 draw at Walsall. Six games, two draws and four defeats. The only other goals scored over his time here were a brace by Iffy Onuora.

Carrick's double made him fourth top scorer over the campaign, that's how poor we were in front of goal that season.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

Town have won two Championship trophies whilst in the League, both in living memory of most supporters here today. 1986 saw us storm Division Four with a record 102 points, and ten years later we pipped Oxford United by a satisfying nine points to take the Division Two title.

Also took the Southern League Championship in 1911 and 1914, in the days when that League was considered a serious challenger to the Football League's reputation as the senior competition.

COUNTY GROUND

Home of the Red and White dynamite for over a century. The County Ground has seen some changes over the years. The Town End was seated in 1990, and at £40,000 it cost ten times as much to do so as it cost to roof it in 1938.

You don't have to be too old to remember the old corrugated iron

Shrivvy Road stand, which arrived from the Aldershot tattoo in 1958. The wooden seated area was shut after the Bradford fire in 1985 and the whole thing was replaced in 14 weeks by the current Nationwide stand in the summer of 1994 at a cost of £1.8m.

In between (chronologically, if not geographically), came the current Arkells' stand which cost £264,000 to build and was opened in 1971.

After several curtailed plans to relocate, STFC are looking to gain council backing to redevelop The County Ground...

The old Shrivvy Road stand had a matching partner which left Aldershot for Accrington Stanley, while the present Arkells' stand had a twin sister built at Chester City's Sealand Road. Both clubs left the Football League for a while, and neither ground survives. Hope that's not an omen.



After taking the Southern League title in 1911, Town qualified to play the winners of the Football League for the honour of raising the Charity Shield (I told you the Southern League was well respected, didn't I?). Some team from Old Trafford, Manchester were the opposition, and we stuck four past them! Problem was, they managed eight. They were probably a bit lucky.

CHELSEA



Another one of those London teams who seem to have supporters around the country. Well since 2003 anyway.

Before that, when Ken Bates bought the club for £1 and gates were miniscule, Chelsea were most noted for having a stand that was three times bigger than it needed to be. And corrugated iron sheds on the other three sides. And not winning the Championship (when that was a title, not a Division) for fifty years.

In December 1980, Town man Alan

Mayes left for Stamford Bridge in return for a cheque for £175,000. Back he came in July 1983 after 18 goals in 66 appearances when Lou Macari re-signed the striker. In January 1988, the Blues (the Pensioners as those with longer memories will recall) visited The County Ground in the nattily named Simod Cup. Goals from Tim Parkin, Jim Quinn and two from Steve White gave Town a 4-0 win, Two of Chelsea's players that day, Mickey Hazard and Roy Wegerle were to pull on Town's colours in the future.

Took our manager when we reached the Premiership, but supplied us Sam Parkin in 2002.

Now of course, there are millions of 'life-long' supporters who have never been to Stamford Bridge, but who have a replica shirt and cheer when their result comes in on Grandstand. Huh! Moan, moan, moan.

CHELTENHAN

One of those local 'footballing' towns that it seems difficult to harbour a grudge against. Only in

the League since 1999, Cheltenham Town have already been up and down like Cristiano Ronaldo on a particularly trippy-over day.

We can be annoyed with them for calling themselves the Robins (since when did a robin have white stripes?), as well as Town (even Bristol City didn't have the temerity to do BOTH), but we can be mightily irritated by the damage they did to our Division Two season of 2002/03.

At Whaddon Road in September they inflicted our sixth successive League defeat on us, before sticking three past us for no reply in March at The County Ground. And they were still so bad they got relegated. Humiliating.

And compounded by their start to their League One campaign this season, perhaps we can be more upset with them than I first thought.

CHIEF. THE



Wavne Allison, a Yorkshire-born striker. used to play for City but was alright as soon as he left. It

took £475,000 to prise him from Ashton Gate in the summer of 1995 where he'd notched almost a goal every fourth match over nearly 200 appearances. Both Town and City had suffered relegation from Division One the previous term.

The move was inspired. Not only did his 17 goals for Town help us claim the Division Two Championship in his first season, the loss of those strikes in Bristol consigned City to a mid-table finish. A double-whammy.

After more than 30 goals in over 100 League appearances for Town, he moved on to Huddersfield for £800,000 in November 1997 and later teamed up with another Town old boy Iffy Onuora at Sheffield United.

Knocked in 11 goals for Chesterfield last term and popped in a brace in a 5-1 win over Millwall just ten days ago. This guy just won't lie down.

The Milk Cup was of course not the first trophy won in recent seasons. The Football League Youth Alliance trophy. won last season, contained many team members who had been scholars and members of the centre of excellence for many seasons.

By design, our Pounds for Points fund raising scheme, is specifically earmarked for use by the Centre of Excellence. Fans, groups of fans, businesses or organizations can pledge upwards of 50p for each point won by the first team in league matches and participate. What has been your favourite game in a Swindon shirt?


Alex Kerr, e-mail


I'm running a new competition

AWAY SUPPORTERS

Away fans are housed in the upper tier of the Roberts Builders Stand, holding just over 2,000. If demand requires it a further 1.000 can be accommodated in the lower tier. There are a couple of small supporting pillars in the upper tier of this stand, however the acoustics are good.

GETTING THERE

From the South: Take the M54 from the M6 (Junction 10A Northbound). Follow the M54 to the end of the motorway and join the A5 towards Shrewsbury. Continue on the A5 past Shrewsbury and Oswestry and then join the A483 towards Wrexham, Stav. on the A483 as you reach Wrexham (this is the Wrexham by-pass). Leave the A483 with at the junction of the A541 Mold road. The ground is 300 yards from this junction (on the A541) towards Wrexham town centre.

By Rail: Wrexham General train station is located next to the ground.

Parking: If you arrive early there is some street parking to be had, on the other side of the road from the car showroom by the Turf Pub. There are also a couple of private car parks, charging in the region of £2.

AROUND THE GROUND

There is one pub right on the corner of the ground at the Kop End called 'The Turf'. It is a Marstons pub which does allow in away supporters, but only in small numbers. It can get extremely busy, so arrive early.


Otherwise the town centre is about a ten

minute walk away, where there are plenty of good pubs to be found. A favourite haunt of away supporters is the Wetherspoons pub in the town centre, called the Elihu Yale. To find it, walk along the road from the ground towards the town centre. After about half a mile go through the double set of traffic lights. After the next road junction it is in the row of buildings on your left, in Regent Street.

MATCH TRIVIA

Strikes from Trinidad & Tobago star Dennis Lawrence and former Spurs striker Chris Armstrong put the Dragons 2-0 up, before Andy Caton came off the bench for Town to score a late consolation on his senior debut.

For Swindon's last win at Wrexham you have to go all the way back to January 1986, when Colin Gordon's third minute penalty secured a 1-0 win in North Wales as Town romped to the Fourth Division title


