





ood afternoon and welcome to this afternoon's game with Boston United here at The County Ground.

Last weekend we travelled to Notts County and came back with a creditable point, although we had the chances to have emerged with a win. Lee Peacock hit the bar with a close-range effort and he swears it crossed the line. I didn't think

The players showed me a better performance than the one which they had put on in the last home game with Peterborough United, where we were weren't at the races. In simple terms, the way we played against 'The Posh' was unacceptable. We deserved nothing from the game despite a lot of huffing and puffing.

after coming on against Peterborough. The goal he scored was a good one and his pace meant that he got into the position to find the scoring opportunity. He got in between the defender and the goalkeeper and managed to flick the ball on into the net. I have told him, with the pace he has, he could be a matchwinner for us with the correct application over 90 minutes.

The goal that we gave away was disappointing and I spoke to Fola about it after the game. He got on the wrong



side of their player and suddenly it was 1-1. The margins between winning and losing are very tight and Fola, as do all the players, have to realise that the minor details really make a difference. We lost our concentration from a corner and gave away a goal but apart from setplays, Notts County rarely troubled us in my opinion.

Tuesday night saw us put in another mixed performance with a much better second half showing so nearly resulting in all three points. I don't think we played as well as we could have in the first half. We looked a bit littery but we made a change at half-time and Curtis livened things up a little. He got a lot closer to the midfield and closed things down which brought us more into the game.

I thought Royce did very well and he has adjusted to playing on the right of the midfield. It's a position that I felt he could play for us and so it has proved so far. He is always a goal threat and he got himself into some good positions on Tuesday night. His goal, which came from a flick on from Robbo, was welltaken and having hit the target we were all delighted to see the ball find the back of the net.

I was disappointed after the game though. There were some discussions after the game in the dressing room and it was good to let the boys get their thoughts out in the open. It's healthy that they can talk in the way they do - but having conceded so late on in the game, we were disappointed as a squad. I thought we were denied a good penalty appeal right at the end but at least we took something from the game.

From our point of view it's two points dropped - possibly even four after the Notts County game. Your support was absolutely fantastic on Tuesday night and with more of the same today back at The County Ground - I'm sure we can put on a good display worthy of three points.

Enjoy the game and keep up the tremendous backing.



MASCOT GRAND NATIONAL



Rockin' commented that he won't be persuing the matter this year as he admits it was his own silly fault for running in to the charging bull, but has high hopes for 2007!




HOLT RESIGNS FROM TOWN POST








RIPTINI'S COLUMN


decent and a lot of positives to come out of the game.



STEVE EVANS

Steve Evans was the man who led Boston United to promotion to the Football League in April 2002, although he left the club at the end of the much-publicised FA investigation.

However, Evans returned to Boston in March 2004 and worked his magic again as the Pilgrims reached their highest-ever league standing of 11th position. Evans was originally appointed manager of Boston United in October 1998, following the resignation of Greg Fee. Evans' previous managerial experience saw him guide Stamford AFC into the Dr Martens League after clinching the United Counties League title in 1996/97 and then again in 1997/98.





BOSTON UNITED

oday sees another piece of history, with the first ever League fixture between Town and Boston United.

The Pilgrims entered Football League in 2002 coming up from Conference as champions. Manager Steve Evans has led the club since March 2004 and last season an 11th place finish left the club just five points off a play-off place.

A summer full of squad changes was intended to make the difference and push the club closer to the top, but this season hasn't started as well as Pilgrim's supporters will have hoped. After nine games, United were fourth from bottom of the League Two table having collected just seven points.

While we may not have met in the League, there has been some cup competition between Town and our visitors, and to be frank it doesn't augur well for us. In November of last year the Pilgrims came to town in the first round of the FA Cup and twice took the


lead. A Charlie Comyn-Platt goal in the 87th minute forced a draw and looked like saving our goose.

But back at York Street 11 days later, a Rory Fallon penalty was all we could manage as Town went down 4-1.

Two years before that, an LDV Vans tie at York Street ended 2-1 to the home team, a result which also eliminated us at the first round stage.

Julian Joachim was amongst the scorers for the Pilgrims in that FA Cup tie, but he moved on to Darlington earlier this season in return for £100,000. Having scored twice in a 4-1 demolition of Darlington, United then lost three league games on the trot and went out of the Carling Cup to Brighton.

So, history might be thin on the ground between the two clubs but there's everything to play for today.









BOSTON UNITED

ANDY MARRIOTT Goalkeeper

Former Welsh international goalkeeper Andy Marriott joined Boston United in June 2006 after leaving Coca-Cola League Two rivals Torquay United. He began his career with Premiership giants Arsenal before the late Brian Clough paid £50,000 to take him to Nottingham Forest in 1989. He has also had spells with Wrexham, Sunderland, Barnsley, Birmingham City, Coventry City, Colchester and Bury, before signing for the Gulls at the beginning of March 2005.

TIM RYAN Defender

Left-back Tim Ryan joined Boston United in the summer of 2006 and was unveiled as the Pilgrims' second close season signing following Anthony Elding's arrival at the Staffsmart Stadium. A former England semi-professional international defender, Ryan joined the Pilgrims from Peterborough United, where he had spent the end of the 2005-2006 season.

PAUL ELLENDER Defender



Paul Ellender is Boston United's club captain and joined the club on the eve of the 2001-2002

season from Conference side Scarborough. The powerful central defender is United's record signing, after joining the Pilgrims for an undisclosed five-figure fee. He has also played for Scunthorpe United, Gainsborough Trinity and a loan spell with Chester City.

MARK GREAVES Defender

Mark Greaves became one of Neil Thompson's first signings when he joined Boston United from Hull City in August 2002, and instantly became a fans' favourite with his commanding displays. He is more accustomed to a central defensive role, although Greaves has also figured as a right-back and as a defensive midfielder. He signed a new contract with the Pilgrims in the summer of 2006.

MARK ALBRIGHTON Defender

Commanding central defender who signed for Boston United in May 2006. He had spent a spell on loan at Chester City towards the end of the 2005-2006 campaign after enjoying four successful seasons with Doncaster Rovers. He had joined Rovers in the summer of 2002 when his then-club, Telford United, were forced to go parttime due to financial problems.

ANTHONY ELDING Striker


Striker rejoined his hometown club in the summer of 2006 on a two-year contract. Elding spent the end of the 2005-2006 season with Kettering Town, following a hugely successful spell with Conference outfit Stevenage Borough where he scored over 50 goals which included a debut strike after just 32 seconds.

FRANCIS GREEN Striker

Former Peterborough United striker Francis Green joined the Pilgrims on loan in November 2005. The pacy frontman agreed a loan switch from United's county neighbours Lincoln City, following two years with the Sincil Bankbased club. He joined the Imps for £75,000 in September 2003 from Peterborough, after originally starting out with Ilkeston Town.

DAVID GALBRAITH Midfielder

Left-sided midfield player who joined Boston United from Northampton Town on the final day of the loans transfer window in November 2005. The former Tottenham Hotspur trainee switched from Sixfields in his quest





for first team football, Galbraith played 25 times for Northampton in 2004-2005 and signed permanently in January 2006.

DAVID FARRELL Midfielder

The 34-year-old wasted no time in fixing himself up after being freed by the Posh in the summer following nine successful seasons at London Road. Farrell joined the Posh in 1997 from Aston Villa and went on to make 395 appearances for the club and scored an impressive tally of 52 goals in the process. Has also enjoyed spells with Wycombe Wanderers and Scunthorpe United.

JAMIE CLARKE Midfielder

Sunderland-born Jamie Clarke signed an 18-month contract with the Pilgrims in January 2006. The versatile 23-year-old moved to York Street after falling out of favour at Rochdale and is a player capable of playing at right-back or in midfield. Clarke joined Mansfield Town's youth set-up in 2001 and went on to play 40 first team games for the Stags.

STEWART TALBOT Midfielder

Experienced midfielder Stewart Talbot joined the Pilgrims from Brentford in June 2005. The veteran penned a three-year contract at York Street after requesting his release from the League One side

in his attempts to move closer to his family. Talbot was Brentford's captain during the 2004-2005 season and played 49 games in the process. He joined the Bees from Rotherham United in February 2004 on a free transfer and started out at non-league Moor Green.

PAUL TAIT Striker

Experienced striker Paul Tait joined Boston United as their seventh summer signing of 2006. The former Everton trainee made the Pilgrims the tenth club of his career when he joined United on their second day of pre-season training. On the nonleague circuit, Tait played for both Runcorn and Northwich Victoria and league spells with Wigan Atheltic, Crewe Alexandra, Rochdale and Chester City.

RICHIE RYAN Midfielder

Irish midfielder who joined Boston United in the summer of 2006, after leaving League One outfit Scunthorpe United. The 21-year-old put pen-to-paper on a two-year contract after impressing Boston boss Steve Evans. He originally started his career at Sunderland and made two brief appearances in the Premiership, against the superstars of Arsenal and Newcastle United.

Malso in contention today are Rangers pair Bob Davidson (striker) and Dany N'Guessan (midfielder). Both have joined the Pilgrims on loan from Ibrox until January 2007.

Town pieced together a flowing move on 41 minutes involving Chris Allen and Ashan Holgate which saw Mustapha Carayol force a corner after a save from Howard in the Cardiff goal. There was some bad news for Swindon just before the break when Charlie Comyn-Platt fell awkwardly on his shoulder and was forced off the field.

Town made two changes at the break with David Stroud and Rodrigo Turnes coming on to replace Comyn-Platt and Monkhouse.

Swindon did equalize on 56 minutes with Lukas Jutkiewicz on the scoresheet. After some good work from Ashan Holgate, he jinked on to his right foot and crossed into the box with Jutkiewicz beating Howard to the ball to head in the equalizer.

After an excellent run from Willo Flood which included a return pass from Kevin Campbell, Flood threaded an excellent ball through to Kevin Cooper who smashed the ball into the net off the underside of the bar to make it 2-1 on 67 minutes.

Luigi Glombard got his name on the scoresheet to make it 3-1 on 75 minutes. After a spell of good pressure, Flood played an excellent ball down the channel to Glombard who cut inside his marker into the box before firing home.

David Lee's reserve side piled forward inside the last quarter of an hour with Holgate, Jutkiewicz and Ahmed all working hard to reduce the arrears.

Substitute Jake Hyde pulled a goal back on 86 minutes. Town continued the pressure and after an excellent piece of play involving eight passes, the ball ran to Hyde at the back post and he made no mistake to make it 3-2.

It was a nervous last few minutes for the home side with Swindon doing their best to force a point from the game. David Stroud earned a free-kick on the edge of the box inside the last minute of normal time. Holgate's delivery ran straight into the wall but Town were then awarded a second free-kick in a more direct position. Holgate stepped up and bent the ball into the box for Turnes to glance the ball into the net to seal a 3-3 draw.

erel Ifil plucks the ball from Wycombe's Jermaine Easter with as much ease as a red-hot thief. He clears his lines, much to the delight of the appreciative throng of Reds behind him. Not for the first time either, for Ifil has had League Two's leading striker in his pocket all evening and Easter would later leave with an injury picked up following another hefty Ifil challenge.

The 1,500 or so Town fans behind him chant his name: "Jerel Ifil, BEAST!". Suffice to say it's been a good season for Jerel, his best yet some would add, but judging by his reaction to Tuesday night's draw at Wycombe after the game... you wouldn't think it.

Interviewing a player immediately after a game is always a hazardous task. It's an unpredictable occupation — win and the player is ready to talk, lose and it's like getting blood out of a stone. As fans we think the world's about to end simply because the team doesn't win but for the players themselves, this is what they're paid to do... this hurts more and wrangles for days. And despite Town securing a valuable point away at fellow pace-setters Wycombe — Jerel's body language suggests I may have my work cut out: it just goes to show how high the bar has been raised by Dennis Wise this season. Tommy Mooney's last-gasp equaliser was a body blow, especially for a player that had spent the previous 93 minutes keeping the ball away from Petr Brezovan's net with such aplomb...

was another in his burgeoning portfolio. Singled out time and time again after forging a solid partnership alongside skipper Ady Williams this season, Jerel's game has come a long way already in the first 11 games of the season. Man of the match against Stockport, Jerel has added a new consistency to his game. Even when things don't go his way. like with the sending off against Chester, for example - Jerel is witnessing a new level of support from his boss... something that perhaps wasn't always the case

a whole don't add three points to the equation every game.

"Our job is to be strong," explains the Beast of the defence's task. "We have to do the business whoever we play against. Jermaine Easter went off with an injury and we're happy with the way we worked against their front line but it is the result that matters. I'm happy with my form, but I need to do it over the course of the rest of the season, not just the first 11 games."

Being strong is one of the main requirements of playing in League Two. Jerel is often entrusted with marking some of the league's most brutal players... and they don't come much tougher than Tommy Mooney.

"I'm not bothered by the fact that Tommy Mooney scored their goal," he admits. "But the fact that we conceded a sloppy goal so late – we've got to win that game in my opinion and we all feel as though we should have done so."

It's refreshing to hear how things have changed — especially from Jerel, one of the last-remaining bastions of the old regimes. Last year the lads would have snapped your hand off for an away point but now, and against one of the best sides in the division, it means nothing. This team is hungry for victory and Jerel is as eager to wrack up as many points in an effort to get out of this division. And if that means having words with your team-mates in the dressing room after the game, then so be it!

FRIDGE, THE

Up again in 1987, skipper CC was leading by example.

FREIGHT ROVER TROPHY

Another letter, so another name for the knock-out competition exclusively for lower league teams. The Freight Rover Trophy was the name in 1987, when Town faced Aldershot in the southern area semi-final in March. The Shots were then not only a League team, but were pushing hard for a Division Four play-off spot in the first year of the end-of-season deciders. Town were en route to the same. but a division higher.

Marching into a two-goal lead, Town looked home and dry for the area final. Goals from Steve White and Jim Ouinn provided a comfortable cushion. Or so it seemed.

Then referee Alan Gunn influenced things by sending off keeper Fraser Digby. Quinn was forced between the posts and three goals for the visitors turned the match round. Town had been shot down by the Shots, by means of a Gunn.

Bristol City beat Aldershot in the Southern final, and Gunn was in charge of Town's play-off semi-final at Wigan at the end of the season. This time, Town went two goals behind before running out 3-2 winners.

FANS

What would a club be without them? There were 8,304 of us at The County Ground for this

month's match with MK Dons. the biggest gate in League Two thus far this season. And Town's average gate means were the bestsupported club at this level overall.

Pat yourselves on the back for being here today.

FLEMING. HAROLD



The legendary Town centre forward who played 12 times for England, scoring nine goals. Harold

made almost 300 appearances for Swindon during the first quarter of the 1900's, with his name appearing on the score sheet on over 200 occasions. With the Great War interrupting his career, the one-club man could have been expected to have reached even greater heights without king and country intervention.

FA CUP FINAL

Despite two semi-final appearances Town have never made the FA Cup final, so as the 1980's became the 1990's, we made a concerted effort to highjack someone else's.

In 1987, Coventry City had broken their own FA Cup duck with a 3-2 final win over Tottenham. Dave Bennett scored for City and Brian Kilcline netted an own goal for a Spurs team who included Paul Allen, Glenn Hoddle and Ossie Ardiles in their number. So, come

FJORTOFT. JAN AAGE

Jan the Man will feature in many Town fans' dream team. Joining in the summer of 1993, newly installed manager John Gorman spent £500,000 to prise him from Rapid Vienna as Swindon faced their one (and so far only) season in the Premiership.

At 6'3", striker Fjortoft was expected to be a handful for defenders but incredibly it took until 22nd January for him to register his first League strike, in a win over Spurs. There had been talk of Fjortoft returning to Norway on loan to sharpen his shooting, but all such consideration was placed on hold as he set about making up for lost time. Two penalties contributed to his hat trick against Coventry in the following game and a further brace produced a point at Norwich.

With four goals in the next five games, Town supporters were left wondering what could have been if Jan had only started his season earlier. In truth we were already resigned to the drop back to the First Division.

Back in the lower division, Fjortoft continued where he'd left off with 16 League goals, before new manager Steve McMahon accepted a £1.3m bid from Middlesbrough

on transfer deadline day 1995. Scoring three goals in the last four matches of 1994/95, Middlesbrough clinched the First Division Championship and Fjortoft was back in the Premiership. A year later Sheffield United parted with £700,000 and Fjortoft as a Blade, and in January 1998 a short trip further north took him on to Barnsley where he signed for Danny Wilson for £800,000.

Wilson gave way to John Hendrie who gave way to Dave Bassett as

from Premiership to Division One, but by the arrival of Bassett and after 13 goals in 21 appearances, Fjortoft had left English football for Eintracht Frankfurt in exchange for £450.000.

With 72 Norwegian caps to his name and a World Cup finals trip under his belt. Jan will always be remembered for his aeroplane goal celebrations.

the mid-nineties, and the lot had been snapped up in the name of Swindon Town. Even Spurs' goal scorer Clive Allen was the son of ex-Town manager Les.

We'd tried it before, with remarkable similarities. In 1981, Bennett was on the wing for Manchester City when they also faced Tottenham. Team mate Tommy Caton was the father of present Town striker Andy. Again Spurs featured Hoddle and Ardiles, and Tony Galvin supplemented the number of future Townies.

Then the following year when the London team once more made the final, Mickey Hazard had been added to the Tottenham number. Facing QPR, Rangers' side included Terry Fenwick, Gary Waddock and again, Clive Allen.

Of course there was the famous occasion in 1988 when Lawrie Sanchez scored the only goal for Wimbledon, (who included Dennis Wise) against Liverpool (who had Steve McMahon out there). They all pulled on Town shirts.

That's not a complete list of Swindon players who have appeared in FA Cup finals. but one day perhaps we'll have our own team there.

FLOWERS. TIM



He might have been better known for his time at Blackburn Rovers, or for an England cap total

running into double figures, but backing in 1987 Tim made seven appearances in a Town shirt over two loan periods. Temporarily in from Southampton at the time, it meant that along with the injured Fraser Digby we had two England U-21 keepers at the County Ground at the same time.

FULHAM

In January 1976 the third round of FA Cup saw Town drawn away at Craven Cottage, to face the previous year's beaten finalists, Fulham. Town were in the third division of the Football League, which was called Division Three at the time. How quaintly logical.

Fulham meanwhile were one division above, and with both teams in midtable, that looked a sturdy test. What captured Town fans' imagination was that amongst Fulham's number were World Cup winning captain Bobby Moore, crowd-pleaser Rodney Marsh, and a Belfast-born chap called George Best.

The Cottagers (no, don't snigger), might not have had the financial backing that they have today. but they were doing a good job pretending they had.

Moore didn't make the field but Best and Marsh did, and Town goals from Trevor Anderson, David Moss and Ray McHale meant a 3-3 draw in London was surely respectable.

It's been said many times, that in cup competition you only get one chance at turning over higher League opposition. No matter how well you perform in a draw, the odds still favour the senior side in a replay. The County Ground hosted a crowd of almost 24,000 the following Tuesday, as Town looked to defy that reasoning.

No problem then. Goals from Trevor Anderson and a couple of braces from David's Moss and Syrett gave Town a 5-0 victory over their highly-regarded visitors.



Roger Bunce, Chairman of the STFC Supporters Club, has put in hours of work tracing these former players and has provided details below of those former Robins returning to SN1 today.

Unfortunately not all of those invited could attend, but here are details of some of our former players.

BILL ATKINS

Bill scored 30 goals in 79 appearances for the Town and went on to score more than 150 goals in his career. After finishing football he bought a bakers and confectioners and has been there for 34 years. He doesn't close until 12.30pm on a Saturday so can't be here this afternoon!

SAM BURTON

Legendary goalkeeper who made 509 appearances between 1946 and 1961, Sam then ran a transport café in Lyneham before moving to Gwent where he still lives. Soon to celebrate his 80th birthday Sam is unable to be here today having just left hospital but we look forward to welcoming him back soon.

DENNIS BROWN

Dennis netted 45 goals in 106 appearances after joining the Town from Chelsea in 1964. Scored a hattrick in a 3 - 0 away win at Orient, and then went one better in a 4-1 win at Bournemouth. Arguably played his best ever game for the Town in that epic 3 - 3 draw at West Ham. Later played for Northampton and Aldershot, scoring a further 66 goals, Dennis has worked as a rep since finishing football.

PETER CHAMBERLAIN

Peter made 82 appearances between 1957 and 1962 scoring 7 goals, now 70, he still lives in Swindon and was involved in a painting and decorating business with former team mate Arnold Darcy. Another


who went on to play for 'The Shots'.

ARNOLD DARCY

The senior member here today at 73 years old, Arnold was a flying winger back in the day scoring 33 goals in 238 appearances. Arnold now lives near Abingdon.

KEITH EAST

Signed from Portsmouth in 1964 and scored 28 goals in 50 matches including 9 in two weeks. This included a four goal haul against Merthyr Tydfil and five the following week in a league match against Mansfield - both at the County Ground. Keith hit over 50 more goals in his career with various clubs before moving to South Africa where he played in the same team as former Town defender Owen Dawson. Now living in Surrey, Keith has just retired from the motor industry where he worked for Volkswagen.



ERNIE BUNT

Swindon-born Ernie made 237 appearances for Town, scoring 88 goals. Ernie then graced some of the top grounds in the country with spells at Wolves, Everton and Coventry City. His jobs since leaving football would fill this page but rest assured, he will no doubt be the life and soul of this afternoon's gathering in the executive areas.

DAVID LAYNE

'Bronco' (as he was known after the cowboy character of that era), scored an amazing 35 goals in just 46 games. He went onto to score another 100 goals for Bradford City and Sheffield Wednesday and has been the licensee of the Crown Inn, at Meadowhall in Sheffield for a number of years now.

KEITH MORGAN

Keith is a one club man - making over 360 league and cup appearances netting nine times and is a former club captain.

He still lives locally and works as a builder and decorator. A very consistent performer throughout his career.

DON ROGERS

Possibly the most exciting player to ever wear a Town shirt, scoring over 170 goals for the Town in almost 500 games. Don still lives in the Town where he runs a sports shop and is a regular visitor to The County Ground. He also does a lot of work to promote youth football in the area.

JOHN TROLLOPE

Another Swindon Town legend who racked up 889 appearances for the club. Will this record ever be broken in the changing days of football? John also served the club as coach. youth manager, assistant manager and first team manager between 1980 & 1996. He also spent time with Bristol Rovers and as a Football League Youth development regional officer and is now the Assistant Academy

manager at Coca-Cola Championship side Wolves. His team are playing Liverpool today which prevents John from being here.

MIKE TURNER

Mike was the goalkeeper in Town's first ever promotion season and made a total of 81 appearances between 1961 & 1964, before signing for Torquay United. Mike now lives in Dorset where he worked for Plessy's for over 20 years until he retired.

BOBBY WOODBUFF

A stylish wing-half along with Keith Morgan, they both used the long throw to good effect. Between 1958 & 1964 made 205 appearaces for Swindon netting 20 times before transferring to Wolves and later playing for Palace, Cardiff & Newport County, Bobby was later Reserve and Youth Team coach at Cardiff, and has also been a Sports Company Representative and Social worker and still lives in Cardiff.







AWAY SUPPORTERS

Away fans are mainly housed in the Coppice Terrace at one end of the ground. A number of seats are also made available in the Main Stand.

GETTING THERE

By Road: Leave the M6 at Junction 29 and take the M65 towards Blackburn. Continue past Blackburn towards Accrington and leave the M65 at Junction 7. Then take the left hand exit at the roundabout onto the A6185 towards Clitheroe (this is in the opposite direction to Accrington). At the first set of traffic lights turn right onto the A678, towards Padiham, and then at the next traffic lights, turn right onto the A680 towards Accrington. After about half a mile along the A680 you will pass the Crown pub on your left. Take the next left into Livingstone Road and then an immediate left for the Club car park.

By Rail: The nearest British Rail station is Accrington and this is approximately a 20 minute walk from the ground.

Parking: There is ample parking behind both goals at the ground and parking is free, there is on street parking around the ground but the club try to discourage this as the residents complain to the police if their drives are blocked.

AROUND THE GROUND

The main away fan's pub which is a few minutes away from the ground is called The Whitakers Arms it is situated just 200 yards away from the old Peel Park ground form the 1960's era of Stanley so you football historians out there may want to take a peek at that. They do a selection of home cooked meals in the pub or restaurant and have great facilities including pool table, beer garden, sky sports, darts and lots more besides. The pub can cater for supporters clubs travelling to the ground on a matchday too as they have lots of room for coach parties. If you wish to book in please ring 01254 392999 and speak to Paul or Sarah. Walking distance from ground is about 20 minutes, in a car about 5 minutes.

The Stanley on Stanley Street also caters for away fans with butties etc laid on on match days (distance from ground walking - 20 minutes, 5 minutes in a car). The Crown Inn on Whalley Road which virtually overlooks the ground offers a warm welcome to all supporters for banter, swapping stories and a good chat before and after the game, in the pool room a collection of memorabilia has been started to celebrate Stanley's promotion to the Conference league and the travelling Accrington fans always try to bring back something for the wall so any scarves badges etc from your club are welcome for the display. The pubs closest to the ground are The Grey Horse, (5 mins walk away) and The Greyhound (5 mins walk away).


