

Unfortunately we have a couple of injury doubts ahead of the game. Jamie Vincent missed training on Thursday with a hamstring injury – but hopefully by the time you read these notes he will have made progress with that. Lee Peacock has struggled this week with a virus and has been suffering from severe headaches. At this stage the FA Cup game could come too soon for him because he will have been weakened somewhat and hasn't trained. We have big plans for him though and he will have a big part to play this season I am sure of that.

There is a game on Tuesday in the Wiltshire Premier Shield against Salisbury City. Players who do not play today will be playing next week because it is vital that the coaching staff and I get the opportunity to see everyone in competitive action. It gives the players the chance to impress and we can learn about them.

We have made a few small changes to the build-up ahead of today's game.

We have chosen to train here at The County Ground the day before a game. I have spoken to Marcus the groundsman and despite a bit of moaning, he has agreed to let us on the pitch. As long as the weather is ok we will be using the ground on a Friday to train because I feel that will benefit us.

Carlisle United are a very good League One side and we had them watched last weekend. They have some very exciting players going forward but we have to be offensively positive too. We have worked this week on getting crosses into the box and we need to make a good start. It's a cup tie and clearly the first ten minutes will be vital. A cup run would be excellent for this football club that's for sure. Hopefully a few of the boys can hit the net and we can go through without a replay.






NEIL MCDONALD

CARLISLE UTD

Awarm welcome to our visitors today who have made the long trip to the West Country from Carlisle with a place in the second round of the FA Cup at stake.

Today sees the start of a new era at The County Ground. After a couple of home defeats, a break from League action offers the chance to kick start our season and once more we face a team whom we haven't met for a while.

Carlisle United are having a good campaign in League One, sitting eighth in the table and challenging for a play-off place. Taking the League Two Championship last year, the Cumbrians had charged straight through the division in their first season back in the football league after a season's sojourn in the Conference.

Back in 1995/96, we were on our way to the championship of Division One. A single Eddie Murray goal gave us a win at Brunton Park, and in February we successfully completed the task of collecting the six points on offer that season, when Peter Thorne and Wayne Allison grabbed a goal apiece. Rory Delap scored for the visitors that day, but United fell through the trap door of relegation as the season closed.

For the third week in succession we face a team who have been forced to play at a level outside the Football League relatively recently. United are an example of how success can come from adversity.



It's a while since Town have had much luck in cup competition. It would be nice to start turning that around today.

Swindon Town have the chance to forget about successive home League defeats with yet another match at the County ground on Saturday. The visitors for the afternoon will be League One outfit Carlisle United, who make the long trip down from Cumbria to contest the first round of the FA Cup.

United's season so far has taken them to the verge of the play-off places where they currently lie eighth, but their league position has been achieved mostly on the back of home results.

Away from Brunton Park, Carlisle have scored just four times. That's a record that, with the exception of Championship outfit Southend United and Wolves, is the worst in the Football League. Unsurprisingly, that leaves United still looking for their first win on their travels.

The match of course will be the first under new boss Paul Sturrock, who was confirmed as Dennis Wise's long-term successor on Tuesday. Let's get right behind the new management team and hope for a winning start this afternoon.



CARLISLE UNITED

01 ANTHONY WILLIAMS Goalkeeper

Welsh goalkeeper who has featured in three first team games for Carlisle this season and provides back-up to regular number one Kieron Westwood. Williams has featured for thirteen clubs with nine loan spells amongst them since starting his career with three years at Blackburn Rovers as a trainee.

02 DAVID RAVEN Defender

A former trainee with Liverpool, Raven came up through the ranks at Anfield and spent an loan spell with neighbours Tranmere Rovers last season before making the summer switch to Brunton Park. Yet to register on the scoresheet this season, Raven has picked up three bookings in 12 outings this term.

03 PETER MURPHY Defender

Irishman who started his career with Premiership Blackburn Rovers before a move to Carlisle in the summer of 2001 after impressing during an 18 game loan spell at Halifax. Now has plenty of Football League experience with just over 200 league starts and the majority of those have been in Carlisle colours.

04 CHRIS BILLY Midfielder

33-year old midfielder who has a mass of league experience with the likes of Huddersfield Town, Plymouth Argyle, Notts County and Bury. His most successful spell came with The Shakers for whom accumulated 165 league starts from September 1998 through to May 2003 when he made a permanent move to The Cumbrians.

05 DANNY LIVESY Defender

10 KARL HAWLEY Striker



Impressive and much coveted striker who has banged in 41 goals in just 95 starts for United since joining on a free transfer from Walsall two years ago. Hawley came up through the ranks with The Saddlers before loan spells at Raith Rovers (twice) and Hereford United. Six goals so far this season.

14 SIMON GRAND Defender

22-year old defender who began his career with Rochdale in 2001 and having come up through the ranks made 40 league first team appearances for Dale before a transfer to Carlisle in August 2004. He has now made 25 starts, although he has featured just three times this term.



18 SIMON HACKNEY

20 KIEREN WESTWOOD


Goalkeeper

There were cheaper and easier options available, letting Ady Williams continue until the end of the season was one. But credit to the club for resisting easier and cheaper options - let's face it for a club with the financial constraints of Swindon Town it would have been very easy to just bank the compensation money received for Dennis Wise and Gus Poyet. Fortunately that has not been the case and today we all look forward to a new and successful era under Paul Sturrock.

The key now though is stability. Sturrock has agreed a four-year deal and how refreshing would it be for him to at least see

that contract out? The board and fans have a part to play also. They've got their man and need to stick by him through thick and thin. Promotion is still very much the target but it shouldn't be the be all and end all - not this season anyway. It may happen, it may not and if it doesn't there's no point turning on the manager.

Alex Ferguson was on the brink of the sack almost 20 years ago but the Manchester United board kept faith with him and look at them now. Alan Curbishley is another example at Charlton, he took The Addicks from the lower echelons of league football right through to the Premiership while Dario Grady is yet another example of stability breathing success.

Up for the Cup

We don't expect to be playing in Cardiff come May (unless it's the play-offs), but a decent cup run would be nice... 11 years ago was the last time we made the fifth round and the furthest we've ever reached is the semi finals. No, really. Here, we recall nine of the best FA Cup runs STFC has ever seen, as well as a remarkable run by Town's youngsters in 1964...



1911/12

KNOCKED OUT: SEMI-FINALS
CUP RUN RATING: 8/10

Losing finalists in 1910, Barnsley would face Town two years later in the semi finals. This was Town's third successive season in the final eight, their second in three years at the semis and after losing in the Charity Shield 8-4 to Manchester United, they kicked off their enthralling ride to the semis against Sutton Junction in January 1912. A 5-0 win saw Notts County the next visitors to the County Ground and a 2-0 win pitched Town with West Ham. Town defied the odds to secure a 1-1 draw at Upton Park and in the replay at a packed County Ground, Town ran out 4-0 winners. Merseyside giants Everton were dispatched of in round four (imagine this run now!?) before Town finally met their match in the Tykes. Town held the Northerners to a 1-1 draw before going out 1-0 in the replay.

1909/10

KNOCKED OUT: SEMI-FINALS
CUP RUN RATING: 9/10

There's no harm in losing to the eventual winners of the tournament, especially at the semi-final stage – and at the sixth time of asking Town made great strides in the FA Cup. Knocking out Crystal Palace and Spurs en

route to facing Manchester City in the quarter finals, Town were dispatching of some big names. City were tough opponents but a 2-0 win saw the Reds face Newcastle at White Hart Lane in the semis. The Barcodes proved too strong, however, and they eventually saw off Barnsley at the second attempt in the final. This was Newcastle's fourth final in six years.



1928/29 ▲

KNOCKED OUT: 5TH ROUND
CUP RUN RATING: 7/10

Entering the competition in round three Town faced a stiff task at home to Newcastle United. However a 2-0 win soon put the Reds on their way and a tough away tie at Burnley's Turf Moor was negotiated and a subsequent replay at fortress County Ground gained. Town won 3-2 and a lucrative tie against Arsenal awaited. Town drew the first game 0-0 and looked to have squandered their chance of progression to the quarter finals – and sure enough a 1-0 for the Gunners at Highbury ended the dream for another year.



1947/48 ▲

KNOCKED OUT: 5TH ROUND
CUP RUN RATING: 8/10

Town were back in round one and the dream seemed further away than ever. However, Ipswich were dispatched of in November before Aldershot were seen off after two attempts a month later. The worst bit was out of the way and Town entered the

hat for the third round looking to pull a big name. Burnley, the team Town had edged out in 1929, were beaten in an impressive 2-0 away win and Robins fans started dreaming of another lucrative run. The dream, however, came to the detriment of the league form and while the Reds stalled with their 'bread and butter', Notts County were edged out to set up a fifth round tie against Southampton. Unfortunately Town's run came to an end on the coast, Saints running out 3-0 winners.

1951/52

KNOCKED OUT: 5TH ROUND
CUP RUN RATING: 7/10

Round One and Town were gifted with a handy tie against lowly Bedford Town. A 2-0 win saw the Reds earn another home tie, this time against Torquay. A 3-3 draw saw Town having to have to make the long trek southwest and 120 minutes of football couldn't separate the two sides. A third replay (there were no penalties in those days) finally saw Town fend off the visitors 3-1. Next up were Cardiff City and a 1-1 at Ninian Park saw another replay come the County Ground's way. Town won 1-0, a win that would see them improve their league form and win two of the next three games. Town needed another 180 minutes to qualify for the fifth round, this time Stoke the hapless opponents as Town won 1-0. Unfortunately Luton Town proved too strong in

the last 16 with a 3-1 win.

1963/64

KNOCKED OUT: 5TH ROUND
CUP RUN RATING: 6/10


52 years after Town knocked them out of the cup, West Ham returned to the County Ground to enact their revenge with a 3-1 victory. Still, losing to the eventual winners (they beat Preston 3-2 in the final) is nothing to be ashamed of and en route to the fifth round Town knocked out some decent opposition. Manchester City were the first team to be swept aside by the red tide before Aldershot were beaten by the same score.



1963/64 ▲

KNOCKED OUT: FINAL
CUP RUN RATING: 9/10

Winning the FA Cup isn't something you expect as a Town fan. Yet Town's Youth team of 1964 almost pulled off the shock of the club's history when they nearly, very nearly claimed the scalp of Manchester United, nine times winners of the competition, in the final. This was a side containing a young George Best, and Barry Fry, among others – but Town held the Red Devils to a 1-1 draw in the first leg at the County Ground. Best was on the score sheet, scoring past Tony Hicks on 70 minutes to






lift the European Cup in 1968
– Town won the league
cup five years later.

1966/67 ▶

cancel out Don Rogers' opener...
"We were just thrilled to be in
the final," said Rogers. "But for a
while we thought we could win
it. Then Best turned on the skill.
He had everything: ball control,
courage and intelligence. He
was the complete player even at
eighteen." Town lost 4-1 in the
second leg, but seven members
of United's team went on to win
the League in 1965 and 1967, and



Nottingham Forest stopped
the red army from progressing
any further. It took them three
attempts, though, Town drawing
0-0 at the City Ground and 1-1
at the County Ground before
Forest won convincingly 3-0 at
the third time of asking. Forest
were knocked out in the next
round by eventual winners
Tottenham Hotspur.

consecutive relegations Town at last gave the fans something to shout about. Under Steve McMahon's controversial tenure Town won the old Division Two at the first time of asking, romping to the top of the league and staying there for much of the season. The only time they relinquished top spot? Around about the same time they mounted the club's most recent major assault on the FA Cup. Cambridge were again on the receiving end of a heavy beating, this time a 4-1 mauling thanks to a Kevin Horlock brace. Cardiff and Woking were beaten 2-0 before a 1-0 win at home to Oldham gifted Town earned a lucrative local match up with Southampton. Horlock again found the score sheet, but unfortunately a Gordon Watson equaliser took the tie back to the Dell. Matt Oakley and Neil Shipperley soon saw to Town's cup hopes.





THE FA CUP

A FIRST ROUND PREVIEW

League One and Two sides rub shoulders with some new names from the world of Non-League in forty fascinating ties.

As always, there are clashes between league rivals, and BRENTFORD vs DONCASTER ROVERS is likely to be keenly fought bearing in mind the excellent results in the cups seen last season, whilst BRADFORD CITY will look to have the edge over their League One rivals CREWE ALEXANDRA given the Railwaysmen's poor away form at present. Elsewhere in West Yorkshire, HUDDERSFIELD TOWN versus BLACKPOOL looks harder to call given the inconsistent start of both sides to this campaign. However, it may well go to league form as promotion chasing SCUNTHORPE UNITED go to struggling CHELTENHAM TOWN, and with the Iron in excellent form, an away win seems likely.

Town's fellow strugglers AFC BOURNEMOUTH should have the edge over a BOSTON UNITED side who are struggling to avoid relegation from the Football League, and NORTHAMPTON TOWN, although struggling for results at home, will hope the gap in division proves decisive as they take on United's Lincolnshire rivals GRIMSBY

TOWN. League Two title challengers LINCOLN CITY, averaging two goals per away game, travel to a PORT VALE in the division above, who have faded after a bright start, and may be ripe for an upset. It's a similar verdict for LEYTON ORIENT, who have struggled since promotion, and face an experienced NOTTS COUNTY side pushing for promotion and boasting some excellent Carling Cup results. An inconsistent PETERBOROUGH UNITED side host a ROTHERHAM UNITED side who have put together some good results despite their points deduction, whilst SWINDON

in Giuseppe Sole, whilst BRIGHTON & HOVE ALBION are at home to a NORTHWICH VICTORIA side with the unwanted tag of being the most inconsistent team in the Conference top-flight. YEADING, the Nationwide South side who came to prominence two seasons ago in a run to the Third Round, have another glamour tie at League One leaders NOTTINGHAM FOREST. CHESTERFIELD will hope to avoid being a victim themselves, after their Carling Cup heroics, when they face Nationwide South BASINGSTOKE TOWN, whilst GILLINGHAM face an intriguing Kent derby with Ryman



TOWN will hope to add to their promotion challenge with a win over a CARLISLE UNITED side who have not yet won away in the league.


A number of ties pair League One sides with Non-League teams. TRANMERE ROVERS host Conference National WOKING, who boast one of the Conference's most prolific strikers

League leaders BROMLEY. YEOVIL TOWN return to the side who beat them to the Conference title in 2001, RUSHDEN & DIAMONDS, and should progress given the two division gap.

Diamonds' Conference rivals YORK CITY have a tough test at home to League One promotion chasers BRISTOL CITY, and an upset would

seem unlikely, but it's not as clear cut in the South Wales derby between Nationwide South NEWPORT COUNTY and SWANSEA CITY, whose form has picked up markedly in recent weeks. Town's fellow South side, HAVANT & WATERLOOVILLE, have been asked to move their home tie against MILLWALL to PORTSMOUTH's Fratton Park, but may still sense a shock given the Lions' poor return to League One life, whilst Nationwide North KETTERING TOWN will be similarly optimistic, but face a stiff challenge against a League One OLDHAM ATHLETIC side who are tight away from home.

Moving onto League Two involvement, there's an intriguing derby between SHREWSBURY TOWN and HEREFORD UNITED, whilst ROCHDALE, struggling for results and goals at home, might be edged out by visiting colleagues HARTLEPOOL UNITED. In contrast, home advantage may prove key as MANSFIELD TOWN take on ACCRINGTON STANLEY, but that would be a brave verdict in the last of the quartet of all-League Two games, as bottom faces top in a game between Paul Ince's MACCLESFIELD TOWN and WALSALL, who returned to the top of the table last week. A fascinating local encounter pairs WYCOMBE

WANDERERS with the Conference National leaders OXFORD UNITED, and with the attacking options available to both sides, a high-scoring game seems distinctly possible. WREXHAM have the unenviable task of facing renowned Cup fighters STEVENAGE BOROUGH, who have returned to form following a difficult start and could well force a shock win, but that's a taller order for Ryman One LEATHERHEAD, one of the lowest ranked sides left, as they travel to TORQUAY UNITED, who are nevertheless suffering from a recent slump. WEYMOUTH, of the Conference National, are now managed by Garry Hill, who inspired DAGENHAM's Cup forays in previous seasons, and he could add the scalp of mid-table BURY to his list.

However, like the Shakers, STOCKPORT COUNTY's form has improved ahead of their game at EXETER CITY, only beaten once at home in the Conference all season. BARNET, meanwhile, face a trip into the unknown as they go to Nationwide North GAINSBOROUGH TRINITY, as do BRISTOL ROVERS who make the long journey to a BARROW side near the foot of the North table, and MILTON KEYNES who visit FARSLY CELTIC, also of the North division, following recent

heavy defeats in the League Cup and Football League Trophy competitions. DARLINGTON visit Nationwide South LEWES, hoping to avoid a repeat of their HORNCHURCH embarrassment of a few seasons ago, and CHESTER CITY complete the League involvement with a trip to the North Somerset coast to play Southern Premier CLEVEDON TOWN, but City's defence is strong enough to prevent any slip-up.

There are six all Non League ties. Two of the sides of last season's competition, BURTON ALBION and TAMWORTH meet in a local derby between Conference rivals, whilst two more sides from Non-League's top flight clash as MORECAMBE host KIDDERMINSTER HARRIERS. STAFFORD RANGERS will be optimistic against mid-table Southern Premier side MAIDENHEAD UNITED, but ALDERSHOT TOWN travel to CHELMSFORD CITY of the Ryman Premier, featuring several players and manager Jeff King from the well-known CANVEY ISLAND side. Nationwide South BISHOPS STORTFORD have home advantage against Southern League leaders KINGS LYNN, whilst South title hopefuls SALISBURY CITY welcome Unibond Premier side FLEETWOOD TOWN to Wiltshire.





GROUND DESCRIPTION

During the past couple of years and at a cost of £6.5m, Field Mill has been transformed into a modern stadium, with the building of three new stands. Both ends, the North Stand & Quarry Lane End plus the West Stand on one side of the pitch have been re-developed. The ends are almost identical single tiered stands, each accommodating just under 2,000 supporters.

The latest addition to the ground is the West Stand, opened in February 2001. This is a cantilevered two-tiered stand, with a capacity of 5,500. On the other side of the ground is the rather small Bishop Street Stand, a covered seated stand that only runs half the length of the pitch. This now looks rather dowdy alongside its new shiny neighbours.

AWAY SUPPORTERS

Away fans are now housed in the North Stand (the opposite end from last season), a move that has been unpopular with a number of home fans, as the North End of the ground has been the traditional home end for many years.

As you would expect from a relatively new stand the views of the playing action and facilities are pretty good. Around 1,800 supporters can be accommodated.

GETTING THERE

By Road: From The South: Leave the M1 at Junction 28, take the A38 to Mansfield and after 6.5 miles turn right at the crossroads into Belvedere Street, then turn right into Quarry Lane.


Parking is available at the ground for £2 and

there is street parking also available..

By Rail: The ground can be seen from Mansfield railway station which is no more than ten minutes walk away. The station is on a local line and is served with trains from Nottingham. To get to the ground from the station; Leave the station and turn left along the dual carriageway, away from the town centre, you should see a retail park on the right. Go straight ahead at the first set of traffic lights, along Portland Street and then right at the next lights and into Quarry Lane. The ground is a short distance down this road on the right hand side.

AROUND THE GROUND

The Early Doors pub next to the ground is popular with both home and away supporters, although it can get rather crowded. It does quite good food and has an outside seating area. The Talbot on the A60 near to the Sainsburys Supermarket is also a good bet and the Sir John Cockle pub is on the A38 going into Mansfield from the M1 and again serves good food.




