The lights switch on took place on Sunday evening and is an annual event which is put on by Vince, Lisa, Jan and family at their house in Avonmead.




PAUL TROLLOPE

Paul Trollope was appointed as caretaker manager following Ian Atkins' departure. When Rovers appointed Lennie Lawrence as Director of Football, in November 2005, Paul's achievements as caretaker boss were recognised by the club and he was appointed to the position of first team coach on a permanent basis, with responsibility for team training, selection and tactics.

Swindon-born Paul was an accomplished central midfielder after starting his career with his hometown club as a trainee. He moved to Torquay in March 1992 - a move that was to prove the catalyst for his professional career. After more than 100 league appearances for the Devon outfit he moved to Derby County, for a fee of £100,000, in December 1994. Whilst with the Rams, he made 65 first team appearances as well as spending time on loan at Grimsby and Crystal Palace. A £600,000 transfer to Fulham came about in November 1997 and in over four years at Craven Cottage, he made 78 league appearances.

After a brief spell with Coventry, towards the end of the 2001/02 season, he moved to Northampton in July 2002 and was immediately appointed club captain. A model of consistency, he missed just 4 games in his two years at Sixfields.

Paul also has 9 full international caps for Wales and has successfully completed his UEFA 'B' coaching badge and was studying for his pro-licence during the summer of 2005.







BRISTOL ROVERS

oday's visitors have made the shortest trip of any to come to the County Ground this season. Bristol Rovers are in town for what represents our local derby match of 2006/07.

Led by someone with a very famous name around these parts, it's the first time Paul Trollope has brought a side to The County Ground to face the club where he began as a trainee. The last time a Trollope led a team in this fixture, father John encouraged Town to 5-2 victory in March 1982.

When added to the 4-1 win we gained at Eastville the previous October, it seems incongruous that Rovers stayed in Division Three while we took the drop to the Fourth at the end of the season.

Paul never made an appearance for Town, before moving on a free transfer to Torquay, but the midfielder later performed on the Premiership stage with Derby County and the Swindon-born Englishman played nine times for Wales, most recently in 2003.

Another man to make a return could be Sammy (the Showman) Igoe, who now plies his trade at the Memorial Stadium.


Rovers' away from doesn't make for good reading for the Gas. In ten attempts, Rovers have lost six times and only Boston and Wrexham have to admit to losing more. The seven goals scored on their travels is as bad as in League Two.

Just two weeks after scoring the goal that took Hereford United back into the league, in the Football Conference play-off final against Morecambe, Ryan signed a two year contract for Rovers. After beginning his career at Wolves, he then has spells with Millwall, Cardiff City and Sheffield Wednesday.

ROBBIE RYAN Defender

Robbie Ryan joined the club in the summer of 2004, having spent more than six years with Millwall. He began his professional career with Huddersfield Town. joining them in July 1994 before signing for Millwall four years later for a fee of £10,000. He featured alongside Curtis Weston

in the 2004 FA Cup Final against Manchester United.

SAMMY IGOE Midfielder

Midfielder who will be wellknown to The County Ground faithful after spending two years at SN1, during which he made 79 appearances. 'The Showman' signed for Rovers initially on a three-loan stint last season, but after being released by Millwall he joined the ranks at the Memorial Stadium on a two-year contract.

6 STEVE Defender STEVE ELLIOTT

A central defender who has Two England U-21 caps to his name, having played against France and Argentina in 1998. He moved to the Memorial Stadium in the summer of 2004, after graduating through the ranks at Derby where he made his first team debut in a League Cup Tie at Southend in September 1997.

8 JAMES HUNT Midfielder


Another who joined the club in the summer of 2004, the determined midfielder is the model of consistency who shows a determined attitude, likes to get up and down the pitch and wins


RICHARD WALKER

A promising striker who has chipped in with four goals already this term, Haldane burst onto the scene during the 2003/04 season. After three loan spells away from Rovers, he has now

returned to become a vital cog in Paul Trollope's promotion chasing machine. He has also operated on the left of midfield.

SEAN RIGG Midfielder

Another of the Filton College scholars offered a pro contract in the summer, Sean was wanted by Bristol City two years ago. The Ashton Gate outfit offered him a scholarship at the time, but he opted to join the set up at Rovers as he felt they offered a better chance of playing reserve and, eventually, first team football.

AARON LESCOTT) Midfielder

A speedy right sided midfielder. Lescott initially arrived on loan from Stockport County on deadline day in 2004. He made the move permanent in August 2004 and has since settled in at right back with a number of stern displays. Other former clubs include Aston Villa and Sheffield Wednesday.

++ Also in contention for today's game are former Leicester, Grimsby and Birmingham defender Stuart Campbell (7). Ketteringborn midfielder Chris Carruthers (11) started for Rovers in their FA Cup encounter in midweek and he has now made over 100 league starts. Welsh defender Byron Anthony (15) also featured at Bournemouth on Tuesday and lists Cardiff City and Forest Green (loan) as his former clubs.

PHIL SMITH IS 'CHERISHING EVERY MINUTE' OF HIS PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALL EXPERIENCE AND HAVING SAMPLED THE LIMELIGHT - HE NEVER WANTS TO WORK IN AN OFFICE AGAIN...

Cast your mind back to the trip to Hartlepool United's Victoria Park at the beginning of the season and in particular, the super human efforts of our new summer signing. Peter Brezovan: A number of unbelievable saves not to mention a match-winning penalty stop meant that a new hero was born and the travelling army rejoiced Peter, Peter, Peter Bre-zo-yan'.

Unfortunately it wasn't the best afternoon for everyone involved, for while Phil Smith celebrated his new side's first win of the season, the realisation of the task that faced him in ousting the Czech stopper was all too clear.

"It was one of the best goalkeeping debuts five ever seen and the fans were right, it was an excellent debut," Phil explains. "It was a huge reality check for me to show that I was going to have to be very patient, and perhaps think more of misself and taking any opportunity when it came."



That opportunity would come later, but with Brezovan in fine form Smith admits he was unsure of his County Ground future following his switch from Crawley.

"Over the summer I was on the phone to my old boss asking if anything was coming up," he admits. "I said I'd let him know what would happen at Swindon and he said he'd keep the job open for a while. He had to let it go after a while, but more recently, after he invited me out for the Christmas do, he asked me if I wanted it back. I said 'I'm alright for the minute. thanks!' I enjoyed working there and the people there, but it doesn't beat this. It was a real eye opener for me to see what people do to make a living, and as a result I'm cherishing every minute of full-time football.

Smith's attitude is heart-warming and it's no surprise that the custodian is fast-becoming a crowd favourite. The turning point came not with Peter's unfortunate injury against Grimsby, but with a match-winning performance at Torquay in which Smith contributed a number of saves to help Town to a crucial 1-0 win.

"Torquay was a big game, playing well and winning one nil – it was a nice hoping to build on his success and try and secure himself a safer future. Initially signed on a short contract, it is up to Smith to earn himself a longer deal from Town's new boss.

"I'm over the moon [with the way things are going | - I'm really happy to be playing. To let everybody know I'm here is brilliant. My main aim in the summer was to get a club, a foot in the door and to work from there. It's worked out for me, but I just wanted to get here, work hard and see if I could get another deal at Christmas. I wasn't expecting to play when Peter arrived because he had such a good presence and because he started playing so well - but I thought I might be able to show what I could do if he perhaps picked up a strain or something. It's unfortunate that I have had the recent run and the way it happened, but you have to grab these opportunities with both hands."

And grab them he has – you would never know that Smith's appearances this season are his first in the football league. Yet judging by his influences, we shouldn't be surprised by his shotstopping abilities...

"My biggest influences over the years have been Nigel Spink and Tony Burns:


moment for me," Phil remembers.



The defenders had a little talk after the Gaffer said he had been disappointed with us after the Mansfield defeat. That helped a lot. putting people right in terms of what everyone is supposed to be doing. We

went out and did a whole session on defending and we didn't concede a goal in the whole training session."

"It was a great result for everybody," says Smith. "Everybody also played well — it gives everyone a lot of confidence.

"We didn't get a result at Mansfield but I thought the team played better than we had in last couple of weeks, so we had that to take into the game. The lads were up for it and I had a feeling we would do well on the back of Tuesday's performance — I knew we were capable of another level."

Reaching that level has given Town something to strive for the rest of the campaign and while last week's win might have made a statement to be no different ("Hopefully the home fans will be in for a treat."), but the beginning of 2007 represents a crucial period for Sturrock and his men. For Smith, he's just enjoying every minute, hoping his performances can continue the dream he's living.

"I'd like to hope 2007 can get better, this year has been a rollercoaster. There was a bad start with Crawley, but the last six months have been amazing, I hope it continues on an upwards spiral. The goal is to earn a new deal and a bit more security — but just keep playing games... It will be a nervy time in January with the transfer window opening — I presume we'll get a loan 'keeper in. If I can keep playing well hopefully I can keep any new faces out, then we'll see what happens when Peter comes back."

And hopefully by the time that happens Town will not only be in League One, but will also have two top keepers vying for the number one jersey...





KAMARA. CHRIS

Midfielder Kammy signed for Swindon for £20,000 in August 1977 at the age of 20 when he left Portsmouth. He had been an apprentice at Fratton Park and had already notched up over 60 League appearances.

His career was marked by a series of unusual transfer deals which saw him return to Pompey for just five months, come back to Swindon in 1985 and also make 150 appearances for Brentford. Then, just when it seemed as though he'd spend his entire footballing life in the lower divisions, Leeds 1990 and the Division Two championship trophy followed.

Spells at Luton, Sheffield United and hometown Middlesbrough kept Chris in Division One, then in 1994 he joined Bradford City where he eventually became manager.

Now known afresh by a whole new generation as a TV pundit, Chris' playing career spanned 750 League and Cup appearances 19 years and nine clubs.

Kammy was always respected by his team mates and opponents alike.

KING. ANDY



One of only three men to manage Town twice, Luton-born Andy also had two playing spells at Everton and his

home town club of the Hatters. Two was a magic number for our Andy.

Just to prove it, he won two England U-21 caps, then started on the management trail with Mansfield Town.

He joined The County Ground staff as Colin Todd's assistant in the summer of 2000 and was elevated to the boss' chair when Todd disappeared off to Derby after just months in charge. That seemed quick, but Dennis Wise has recently risen to the challenge and beaten his record.

Last month STFC announced the intention to implement a no-smoking policy throughout The County Ground in January, and on the same day came the news that Andy had been appointed as the new manager of Grays Athletic.

Whether the two pieces of news were connected, the likelihood of cigarsmoking King returning for a third stint as manager were surely reduced.

But can you name the two other men to have spent two spells as Town's boss? The answer is on page 66.

KING. PHIL

Signed from Torquay in 1987, this left back moved on to Sheffield Wednesday little under three years later. The difference between the two fees earned Town £482,500. We could with that again now.

After moving on to Aston Villa he scored from the spot to knock Inter Milan out of the UEFA Cup in 1994/95 and returned to the County Ground in 1997 on a free.



He had already made 145 appearances for Town, but his spell under Steve McMahon was not to be a happy

one. Just five more outings came before he fell out of favour with the boss, and spent two years in the wilderness before leaving for Brighton to finish his professional career.

Phil wasn't the only one to lose McMahon's confidence.

Phil now runs the Dolphin pub in Rodbourne, and you won't know this, but Phil works with BBC Radio Swindon, co-commentating on Town's home matches. You'll be in the dark about that, because you are always here watching the game live, aren't you?

KINGS. WE THREE

It's a disappointment that with the festive season approaching, it's not possible to find three kings to associate with Swindon Town, Bah, humbug!

KEY, RICHARD

Richard Key is not a name likely to spring readily to Town supporters' minds, but he holds a unique position

KERSLAKE. DAVID

Born in Stepney on 19th June 1966, David Kerslake was a cultured defender. An Ardiles' signing, he joined Town for £110,000 in November 1989 as Ossie looked to build upon the foundations laid by the recently departed Lou Macari.

Always looking accomplished when attacking, a wing back role suited David. He struck just one goal in all his time at Swindon but as it came in a 2-1 win over Oxford United in January 1992, we can all forgive his lack of proliferation.

Starting as an apprentice with Queens Park Rangers, he made one appearance for England schoolboys In1982 and turned professional the following year. He later added an U-21 cap against Turkey in 1986 and complete his first 74 games in the Football League for the Loftus Road based club.

After Town's Wembley victory over Sunderland, there was anguished gnashing of teeth amongst supporters when he was allowed to leave for Leeds United in return for £500,000 in March 1993. Then after just eight games at Elland Road he returned to London on 24th Sept 1993 when Spurs parted with £450,000. The move linked him up once more with Colin Calderwood and Mickey Hazard.

> In November 1996 Kerslake made a re-appearance at the County Ground in n eight-match loan spell before joining Charlton on a free transfer in August 1997. If David's spell at Leeds was short, he comfortably beat his own record by signing on another free for Ipswich just two weeks later.

> > By the end of 1997 Wycombe Wanderers were Kerslake's employers in a ten-match loan spell, and a third stint at Swindon came as a result of a free transfer in March 1998 when a further 24 games brought David's professional career to a close.

Over the years, David partnered fellow defender Colin Calderwood at Swindon and at Tottenham Hotspur, and the duo took their experience onto the managerial stage. A successful spell at Northampton Town where Kerslake was second-in-command to Calderwood led to a move to the City Ground where Colin now leads Nottingham Forest with David as his first team coach.

in Swindon Town history. Some of the details read like a TV soap.

Town had started 1985/86 in Division Four with two keepers in Jake Findlay and Scott Endersby. By September Findlay had fallen out with Lou Macari and had played his last match, and by October Kenny Allen had been signed from Torquay. With Town through to the third round of the League Cup a tasty looking home tie against First Division Sheffield Wednesday was scheduled.

Now comes the problem. Allen was cup tied (having played against Town in round one) and Endersby, who had played second fiddle to Findlay, seemed to resent being expected to step in as second choice yet again and announced that he would refuse selection. Just two days to go and Macari had to find a keeper who wasn't cup tied and whose club didn't mind him becoming so.

Enter Richard Key, who was on a noncontract basis with Brentford.

He took to the County Ground pitch having spent just hours getting to know his defence. A 10th minute Peter Coyne goal was desperately protected to the end and Key's performance brought chants of 'Are you watching Endersby' and 'We don't need you anymore'.

The next episode is less of a fairytale. An away tie at Ipswich where Key helped out again saw him pick the ball out his net six times, and his Town career was over.

KILCLINE. BRIAN

'The Killer' joined Town from Newcastle United for £90k as we tried to avoid the drop

from the Premiership in 1994.

Famously lived on a canal boat during his time here, did the refusal to get on the housing ladder in Wiltshire indicate a lack of commitment?

With the arrival of Steve McMahon as manager, Killer's appearances were numbered. Rumours of the proportions of his salary made him a prime candidate for speculation as Town looked to reduce the wage bill after relegation.

He turned out in Macca's first game in charge, a Coca Cola Cup win over Derby, but was then relegated to training with the youth squad no less.

For a while it seemed Brian would refuse to take the hint, but in 1995 and after spending most of the season in the reserves, a trial at Walsall led to a free transfer to Mansfield Town in December.

KETTERING



There are some mixed messages coming from our meetings with Kettering, starting all the way back on 28th December 1901.

Then we faced the club from Northamptonshire in the Southern League and lost by the hugely embarrassing score of 10-1 away! Even the goal we were credited with was an own goal!

> Eighty two years later came the chance to redeem ourselves.

> > On 19th Nov 1983, we faced each other in Round One of the FA Cup, and also away from home, we won 7-0. Future Swindon manager Jim Quinn scored twice.

Revenge would have been sweet for anyone old enough to remember the first encounter. Despite finishing his Swindon playing career at around 40 years of age, Quinn wasn't amongst them.





What were the last three things you bought?


Christmas presents - so I can't say what they were!



Sappleton went close again for the visitors on 40 minutes with a right foot effort which flashed just wide of Stewart's right hand post.



GROUND DESCRIPTION

Even with the recent developments at the ground, it is still on the smallish side, with a bit of a non-league feel about it. One side is predominantly uncovered terracing, with the small seated Silk FM 'Main' Stand sitting in the middle. On the other side is the covered. single tiered Alfred McAlpine Stand, which was opened in March 2001. The Star Lane End is a relatively new covered stand, that is a strange mix of seating and terracing. Strange and unusual in having a terrace area behind the seating area.

AWAY SUPPORTERS

Away fans are primarily located in the open Silkman End, where up to 1,500 fans can be accommodated. Additionally, 403 seats are made available in the new Alfred McAlpine Stand, which sits at one side of the pitch. The seating may well be a better bet, as this stand is covered and the facilities new.

GETTING THERE

By Road: Leave the M6 at Junction 17 and turn onto the A534 towards Congleton. On reaching Congleton town centre follow the signs for A54 Buxton. Stay on the A54 for around 5 miles and then turn left on to the A523 towards Macclesfield. You will see the ground on your left after entering the outskirts of Macclesfield.

Parking: Mostly street parking around and behind the ground and on the A523 itself.

By Rail: Macclesfield railway station is about one and a quarter miles from the Moss Rose ground, about a 20 minute walk away. As you leave the station, at the bottom of the station approach, turn left onto Sunderland Street and follow until the traffic lights at Park Green (War memorial and gardens). Turn left onto Mill Lane (it is probably better to cross onto the opposite side of the road here at the traffic lights) and follow this road which becomes London Road. Just after passing the Catholic Church on the right the ground comes into sight ahead.

AROUND THE GROUND

The ground is located on the outskirts of Macclesfield and therefore there is not a tremendous choice of pubs or even a handy chippy. The Golden Lion is the only close pub, about a ten minute walk from the away turnstiles. To find the Golden Lion, simply head down Moss Lane, which goes behind the away terrace, and then turn left at the corner of the ground and walk down behind the new stand. Keep straight on this road and you will come to the pub on the left.

If you like your real ale then perhaps take the 10 minute walk to The Railway View pub on Byrons Lane.


