



DEBACLE

A lot of media interest has also surrounded the postponement of our League match against Bristol Rovers last Saturday.

I was not only disappointed but also disgusted to arrive at the Memorial Ground just after 1.20pm and find a perfectly playable pitch.

The circumstances surrounding the postponement and the conduct of the individuals involved was questionable, if not extremely erroneous.

The Football League regulation 28.1 is very clear - a club is guilty of misconduct if it does not take reasonable precautions to protect a pitch, prepare a pitch and remedy a pitch to fulfil a fixture.

It is clear that neither Bristol Rovern nor the referee did everything in their power to ensure that the game was played.

We have made the necessary formal complaint to the Football League requesting a full investigation into the misconduct of the club and officials involved.

This situation has not only stirred my anger and disdain for those involved but also my strong determination to ensure that the truth of this matter is fully revealed and this type of conduct is not allowed to go unnoticed or unpunished.

INEVITABLE

Every run comes to an inevitable end, so at some point our current

great run of form will end and we will come to reflect on an incredible period of the season if not the club's history.

The players have shown great form throughout the last months but I believe the players are not playing above themselves. They say 'form is temporary but class is permanent'. We are seeing the growth of individuals whose consistent high level of performance and their dedication to the game leads me to believe that they have genuine professional class.

ts been a hectic few weeks off the pitch as we continue the work to create the structures we've promised.

We held a workshop the day after the Walsall game, where we spent a whole day planning the strategy for next season and indeed for the next five years.

We have in place a detailed fiveyear business plan, every eventuality in terms of finance has been accounted for, regardless of the division we are in we have a plan and it gives us the opportunity to become more strategic, along with Jim and Wardy, and just as importantly the managers of the Commercial and Media areas, we can all identify the area where the is most opportunity for improvement and growth.

It is quite possibly the first time in the history of the club that such planning has taken place, and certainly the first time that people like Des Hinks and Martin Booker have been involved in the decision making, which is pretty ridiculous when you come to think of it.

After a recent meeting with a long established sponsor of the club, who frankly have been treated pretty badly by County over the years, the gentlemen concerned commented that he'd been associated with the club for 50 years, and that is the first time that anybody had spoken in a business like fashion to him.

The workshop was incredibly productive, we came up with a season ticket initiative, which

will be launched shortly, and which will potentially see discounts for Season Ticket Holders next year compared to this, even if we get promoted, there will also be the chance to pay over a few months.

In addition we worked on how we can grow the whole experience of coming to Edgeley Park, so far its been down to the fans but the club will be carrying out various initiatives to make sure that the reputation of our fans and of EP continues to grow.

We agreed how we are going to deliver better value to our sponsors and work with them going forward.

Financially we have committed ourselves to publishing a full financial revue on an annual basis which will be available to anybody who wants it, and will demonstrate everything financially - the only thing we won't publish will be (understandably) individuals wages, this will underline the complete transparency of how we operate.

We've addressed the merchandising side of the business and next season will see a full colour catalogue with a fantastic range of products available directly or by mail order.

There's so much more I could cram in, but I can tell you there are likely to be some major announcements over the coming weeks with regard to kit, tickets and the profile of the club will continue to grow.

We are not content with just being a trust run club, we are determined to create a new model for trust run clubs and the professionalism and progress demonstrated by Jim and Wardy will be matched by an entrepreneurial spirit off the pitch.

This is a very special football club, and the job is to put in place structures which will ensure it fulfils its potential!







im Gannon clearly feels a genuine sense of injustice over the events at Bristol Rovers last weekend. For the Memorial Ground to the only place in the country that fell victim to bad weather certainly warrants further investigation.

Des and I, along with Brian Clarke from Radio Manchester, got as far as Worcester when we received a call from County's ever-reliable kit man Richard Landon to tell us that the game had been postponed. Sadly, many Hatters fans were already there.

The ramifications of Jim's protest to the Football League will no doubt rumble on, although the chances of any action being taken lie somewhere on the scale between 'slim' and 'non-existent'.

However, what it has done is take a lot of pressure off the players this week. Without the Bristol debacle, Jim Gannon knows that the spotlight would have fallen squarely on his young players as they prepared for one of County's biggest games since the turn of the century.

Jim is well aware that his squad is standing on the verge of history, but by lodging his complaint with the Football League, he has cleverly drawn attention away from the players themselves, allowing them to prepare thoroughly for today's game. There have been a number of occasions this season when Chelsea boss Jose Mourinho has done exactly the same, drawing the spotlight away from his players and allowing them to focus fully on the job in hand.

Another pleasant consequence of the Bristol postponement is that County now have the opportunity to set a new Football League record in front of the Blue & White Army here at Edgeley Park, which will probably have a good number of neutrals around the place this afternoon, following Jim's call for the people of Stockport to come along and hopefully see history in the making.

But the players, no doubt aided by Jim's meticulous eye for detail, are refusing to get carried away. It was great to hear Gareth Owen in midweek when he declared: "The gaffer has talked about various records, but we'll be just as happy with another three points even if it comes through a 2-1 victory."

Yes, the record books are important and we can all celebrate at 4.45pm this afternoon if the players manage to rewrite history once more, but there is a much greater prize at stake and be under no illusions that this current squad has a steely-eyed determination not to allow promotion to slip through their fingers this season.

THE BIG NIERVIEW

KEITH EAST WAS A CENTRE FORWARD WHO, DURING A CAREER WHICH BROUGHT HIM AROUND 100 GOALS, PLAYED FOR BOTH THIS AFTERNOON'S CLUBS.

TRUE BLUE RECENTLY HAD THE PLEASURE OF TALKING TO A MAN WHO ONCE NETTED FIVE GOALS IN ONE MATCH WHILE AT SWINDON TOWN, NINE IN SUCCESSIVE WEEKS, BEFORE HIS ARRIVAL AT EDGELEY PARK IN DECEMBER 1966, AND PLAYED HIS PART IN COUNTY'S WINNING OF THE FOURTH DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP.

"I think we won the title with five or six weeks to spare," said Keith. "It was hard work and, especially in away matches, we often played with one up front. Jimmy Meadows was the manager and he used to tell me not to come back over the halfway line.

"I have many fond memories of my time at County - Chairman Victor Bernard and his supporters' train. I've been lucky enough to play with so many top men during my career, such as Lenny Allchurch, Albert Quixall, Matt Woods, Eddie Stuart and Ken Mulhearn in goal while I was at Edgeley Park.

"I returned to Stockport on the occasion of the club's centenary. It was a fantastic evening and I had the pleasure of meeting so many of County's former players."

We had been tipped off that Keith once dated Miss United Kingdom and he confirmed: "Yes, I met her while I was at Stockport. Her name was Jennifer Lowe and she was both Miss UK and Miss England. I think she came from the Wigan area."

Keith was born in Southampton in October 1944 and attended Oak Park School in Havant, near Portsmouth. He played for and captained Hampshire Boys two years running and, in the English Schools Shield, represented South East Counties.

"We reached, I think, the quarter final before losing to Brierley Hill."

Straight from school, Keith joined Portsmouth as an apprentice, but never made the first team.

He joined Swindon in May 1964, and scored on his debut in a 4-1 Second Division defeat at Middlesbrough. It was while at the County Ground that Keith scored his nine goals in eight days, a pretty unique achievement.

Although he had the two feats mixed up, we can confirm that on the 13th and 20th of November 1965, he first scored four times in a 5-1 FA Cup win over Merthyr Tydfil and followed that up by going "nap" in a 6-2 league victory over Mansfield Town.

"There were some great players at Swindon - Ernie



Hunt, Mike Summerbee and Don Rogers. It was a pleasure to be in the same team as them."

Keith had scored 21 goals in 45 League games for the Robins prior to his move to County - to replace the outgoing Frank Lord - for a big fee of £7,000,

And he made an instant return on that investment by scoring on his debut in the 1-1 draw at Aldershot on December 10th, 1966.

He took his County tally to eight in 28 appearances before leaving for Bournemouth in November, 1967.

Asked about his main memory from his time at Dean Court, Keith replied: "I remember a cup tie against Liverpool, when we led 1-0 and I had a goal disallowed. Then Ian St John equalised.

"In the replay at Anfield we lost 4-1, but we had them on the wrack until Douglas Bader came on as a substitute and scored two goals."

(Douglas Bader was the nickname of Tony Hateley. We won't repeat how he got his name).

34 goals in 94 league games was Keith's record at Bournemouth before moving to Northampton Town under manager Dave Bowen.

"We were unlucky not to get promotion while I was there. We had a squad of only 14 or 15 and when three or four good players were out injured, we missed out. We really should have gone up. "Dennis Viollet took me to Crewe in 1971 and, while there, I played in the same team as Stan Bowles, but I did not have such a successful time there."

Keith did, though, score a hattrick as Crewe beat County 3-1 at Gresty Road on the opening day of the 1972-73 season!

"I then spent five years playing in South Africa. Since then I have worked for Volkswagen and have just retired full time, although I spend two days a week delivering cars to customers. It keeps me out of trouble."


How does Keith now spend the rest of his time? "When I retired, they bought me a superb set of golf clubs (shortly

after talking to us, he would be on the course playing a round).

"I also play the guitar and like watching football on TV. It's great that County, Swindon and Portsmouth are doing well.

"I now live on Epsom Downs, two or three minutes from the racecourse. I never go to the Derby, it's bedlam that day, but there are one or two good other meetings I quite enjoy. It's nice in summer."

Married to Liz for 20 years, Keith had this message to both sets of fans at this afternoon's game: "It's good to see both teams doing so well. I hope you all enjoy the game and may the best team win."

WHER ARE THEY NOW?

ince last week's notes some of the players mentioned have signed on for new clubs.

Goalkeeper Alan Blayney must have impressed in his training sessions at Oldham Athletic as he was given a contract until the summer. He missed his first chance to make his debut when Les Pogliacomi was sent off on Tuesday night last week as Oldham had already used three substitutes. With Pogliacomi suspended Blayney was in goals for the League One promotion chasers when they went down to a surprise home defeat by AFC Bournemouth last Saturday.

We mentioned two other players' contracts were cancelled in the January transfer window and both now have new clubs. Andrew Smith has been taken on by Bristol City after a week on trial. The Northern Ireland striker has signed on for two-months.

Danny Adams failed to earn a contract at Bradford City, where he was training, but the fullback has now signed for Conference side Morecambe. This will make the third club where has played under the charge of former County manager Sammy McIlroy.

Meanwhile Aidan Collins shortterm contract at Cambridge United has been extended to the end of the season by manager Jimmy Quinn.

Following their defeat at Edgeley Park 11 days ago Walsall moved quickly to strengthen their side by bringing two players in on loan.

One was winger Kevin Cooper


who was of course part of County's promotion side back in 1997. Coops is on a second loan spell of the season from Dave Jones' Cardiff City side having earlier turned out for another League 1 side in Yeovil Town. Also in the news was another player from County's 1997promotion season. Keeper Paul lones has been out of the firstteam picture since October and Queen's Park Rangers have told him he can leave on a free transfer. Presumably this means the Welsh International's contract will be cancelled if he can find himself another club before deadline day next month.

Three other former County goalkeepers have made their own minor headlines since True Blue was last published.
Andy Dibble had moved from his position as Goalkeeper Coach with Accrington Stanley to a similar role at Coventry City last November.

This month he was out of work as Coventry cleared out their backroom staff following the appointment of lain Dowie as manager. Dibble has been replaced by another keeper who had a less than impressive County career. Tim Flowers is now in charge of the Midland side's 'keepers

and will also act as Assistant
Manager to Dowie.
Until his move just under a
fortnight ago Tim was coaching
the Manchester City keepers.
The third man in the news is
Carlo Nash who returned to the
Premier League with a loan
move from Preston North End to
Wigan Athletic. This came a
couple of weeks after a
proposed permanent move to
Fulham fell through.

Damien Allen is of course still a County player but is out on loan at present to Belgian second tier side Royal Antwerp. Damien made his debut for them a fortnight ago playing at KVK Tienen. The match report on the Antwerp site describes it as a promising debut, but with no reward. By the end of the game former County coach Warren Joyce, the Antwerp manager, was left unhappy with a 2-3 defeat.




n 1963, Simon Myers, a 15-year-old schoolboy, began an exhaustive project to compile the very first extensive history of Stockport County.

Three years later, in May 1966, all his hard work came to fruition with the publication of a 163-page book that is still a major reference point for many County historians to this day.

Now 58, Offerton-based Simon, a lifelong Hatters fan has donaled his marvellous collection of historical photographs to the club.

And, in each issue of this season's True**Blue**, we aim to take a trip down Memory Lane and reproduce a selection of Simon's pictures in this brand-new feature, County Memory Vault. We hope you enjoy the journey.





This afternoon we take a look at three County strikers from the 1980s.

The description journeyman footballer could have been invented for Steve Taylor.

When Eric Webster brought him to Edgeley Park in March 1984 the Hatters were his 8th club!

The 28-year-old had an immediate impact in County Blue, though. He scored on his debut - a 2-0 victory over Chesterfield at EP - and then netted another in his next game, a 2-1 win at Wrexham.

By the end of the campaign he'd increased his tally to an impressive six in just 12 starts.

However, the 1984-85 season wasn't as productive and, following a 4-1 defeat at Blackpool in the November, he packed his boots and headed for Rochdale where he enjoyed the best spell of his career, scoring 42 times in 84 appearances for Dale.

Soon after Taylor's departure Webster secured the services of Mark Leonard on a free transfer from Cheshire neighbours Crewe Alexandra.

After a fairly undistinguished spell at Gresty Road the Blue & White Army weren't too impressed with his early performances for his new club either.

It took him six games to get off the mark, ironically against the Alex, and by the season's end he had notched just four times in 23 games.

The following year, though, his career took off under Les Chapman who had replaced Webster in the October.

Thanks largely to Leonard's 19 goals the Hatters mounted a serious promotion push but, although they were in fourth spot at Easter, they eventually fell away to finish 11th.

Chappy's reward for County's best season in 12 years was the sack ... and to rub salt in the wound for the Edgeley faithful, he was replaced by Jimmy Melia! Six games into Melia's disastrous reign Leonard was sold to Bradford City for £52,000.



With County cut adrift at the bottom of Division Four, Melia's reign ended with the inevitable bullet in November 1986, which heralded the return of 'The Messiah' Colin Murphy.

From a seemingly impossible position he masterminded the greatest of all escapes in the first season of automatic relegation to the Conference,

And one of the key figures in that survival bid was a certain Ernest Moss who arrived at Edgeley Park just before Christmas at the grand old age of 37!

The battering ram of a centre-forward had made no fewer than 688 League appearances for six clubs, including three

stints at his hometown Chesterfield, when he answered Murphy's SOS.

But in just 26 games for the Hatters Ernie earned a place in County folklore with seven priceless goals.

Those present will never forget his overhead kick in the 2-1 win at Hereford or the 25 yard volley that screamed into the Swansea net to secure the 3-1 victory that all but secured our League

After County he played on for another season, adding another 32 games to his fabulous career total first at Scarborough and then a loan spell at Rochdale, his final club.




He's got everything - hustle, bustle, a neat touch, and he's been banging the goals in, which is what he's been brought here to do.

NEW BOYS CAN'T HALT SHAKERS SLUMP


Bury have signed Walsall winger Tony Bedeau and Crewe defender Darran Kempson on one-month loan deals.


Following Roberts' resignation earlier last week Richardson will take over as Gulls chairman.







FROM THE HOME DRESSING ROOM

DINDO TELLS TRUE BLUE THAT THE LADS LOVE KICKING TOWARDS THE CHEADLE END AND IT REALLY DOES MAKE A DIFFERENCE WHEN THE FANS ARE IN FULL VOICE

Are you frustrated being on the bench at the moment?

I am on a personal basis but it's great that the lads have been unbeaten. Obviously it's hard to get back to fitness sitting on the bench because I want to get back playing. But for the team it's brilliant to be fair, the lads have been fantastic.

Are you still able to play a part in the dressing room even though you're not out on the pitch?

I'd like to think so. I'm still encouraging people to do the right things in training. I just try and use my experience to help everyone out, and help myself out at the same time actually. I'm learning a lot off the Gaffer to be fair and I feel as good as ever to be honest. I feel strong, I feel fit and I feel a better player than two or three years ago.

You've been promoted with County before. Can you bring that experience to the table?

Yes, because I've been involved with Stoke and Wigan as well when Division Two storm a few years ago. After a difficult couple of months people were asking me why I'd gone back to County but I said we weren't a million miles away. It's no coincidence that we're now in the top seven. We're now looking to get in the top three because we've cut out the individual errors. I was a big part of that, all players have given a goal away at some part in their life but we've stopped doing that now and everyone's believing in themselves. We've took on board everything the Gaffer's said in training and taking it out onto the pitch. And it's no coincidence that we've started to win games.

Only three teams have ever gone eight games without conceding. You were in the Wigan team that achieved it in 2002-03 so you're now the only player to do it twice?

That's right. John Filan was the keeper at Wigan and we went eight games without conceding and I think in the ninth game we were a minute away from winning and keeping another clean sheet. It didn't stop us going on a run because we won eleven games on the trot and that was on the way to us winning the league. Once you get on a good run it breeds confidence and we feel like we can win every game at the moment. Over the last eight games that's been the case.

It will be nice to break the record at home in front of our own fans won't it?

If we were given the choice of where we wanted to break the league record we'd definitely want to do it at home. It would be nice for Wayne if he can do it on a personal level and for the club as well to get back in the record books. Given the chance I'm sure everyone would choose to do it at Edgeley Park where we've been in fantastic form recently. We've been going at teams right from the off and teams have found it very difficult to come here.

You were around in 96-97 and the vocal support is even better these days isn't it?

It really does make a difference when that Cheadle End is in full voice and the lads love kicking towards there. We seem to play better attacking the Cheadle End. I'm sure Saturday will be big crowd and we couldn't have a bigger test than Swindon, one of the best teams in the league, but the lads will be looking to make it nine wins on the trot. Not just for Wayne and the back four but everybody really.

This week's youngster in the spotlight is first year striker Martin Smeaton.


Martin is from Liverpool and was born on October 12, 1989.





THEY PLAYED AT THE PARK

This afternoon we feature Bob Paisley MBE, the former Liverpool player who succeeded the legendary Bill Shankly in the Anfield hot seat to emerge as, arguably, the most successful manager in football history.

Yes, it's that game again, and while our previous focus highlighted the career of one of football's great players in the Liverpool team which somehow triumphed that day in Scottish international left winger, Billy Liddell, this week we throw the spotlight on a man better remembered for his exceptional managerial career.

Bob Paisley, as a player, was once on schoolboy forms with Wolves, had an unsuccessful trial with his first love, Sunderland, and then helped Bishop Auckland beat Willington 3-0 after extra time in the FA Amateur Cup Final at Roker Park in 1939.

In May of that year, Bob signed for Liverpool. But his career was then interrupted by World War II, during which he had a distinguished record serving under General Montgomery in the desert.

Back in Civvy Street, Bob played 33 times all at left half in helping Liverpool win the First Division championship in the 1946-47 season. Between 1946 and '53, he played in 253 League games for the Anfield giants and scored 10 goals.

The biggest disappointment must have been in 1950 when, having played in the County game and, in fact, scored a vital goal in the semi final success over Everton at Maine Road, Bob was omitted from the FA Cup Final team.

Bob joined the coaching staff in 1954 and was a key member of Bill Shankly's "Boot Room" during the Scotsman's inspirational tenure of the managerial chain.

After 20 years behind the scenes, Bob took over from Shanks in July 1974. A difficult act to follow? Undoubtedly, but can anybody even suggest he did not make a success of it?

A record most bosses can only dream about!

Bob may have come across as a quiet man, some said uncommunicative and unexcitable, but his teams did the talking for him on the field.

He insisted that the short, swift passing game, the search for space and the application of intelligence were the route to victory. Who could argue with that?

Graeme Souness, himself a strict disciplinarian, said of his time on Merseyside: "Let me tell you, Bob ruled Anfield with a rod of iron. He was a commanding man and there were few who dared mess around with him."

There were tales of his love of carpet slippers, morning tea at a local garage and picking horses from the paper to have a flutter, but one could not doubt a keen footballing brain which never missed a trick.

Attention to detail and accumulation of information all contributed to Bob's successful reign in the hot seat at a time when only the champions of one's country qualified for the European Cup and Liverpool's absence was a rarity indeed.

Bob retired as manager in May 1983 and sadly died in February 1996 at the age of 77.





IN GOAL

Phil Smith has spent the last two seasons playing for Crawley Town in the Conference, while his understudy, Jon Stewart, is still the youth team keeper at the County Ground.

IN DEFENCE

Jack Smith, whose ninth-minute penalty accounted for Chester City seven days ago, and Jerel Ifil both were juniors at Watford and are now in their second and third seasons respectively at Swindon. Ifil's partner in central defence is likely to be Jamie Vincent, a summer arrival from Yeovil Town and a former Crystal Palace trainee who has over 300 senior games behind him for a number of clubs including Portsmouth and Derby County. Left back Andy Nicholas was a Liverpool trainee, now in his fourth season with the club. January signing Patrick Noubissie is a French right back who joined from Crewe Alexandra, but a definite absentee this afternoon will be Adrian Williams, who played over 300 games for Reading and last season with former manager Dennis Wise at Coventry City. He was due to undergo knee surgery this week.

IN MIDFIELD

Swindon played a 4-3-3 formation last Saturday and their midfield trio was **Michael Timlin**, on loan from Fulham, local boy Michael Pook and Sofiene Zaaboub, a second Frenchman signed from FC Brussels. On the bench were Aaron Brown, who once played over 150 games for Bristol City and joined in 2005 from QPR, along with Curtis Weston, who became the youngest player at 17 years 119 days to appear in an FA Cup Final when he came on as a substitute for Millwall in 2004. Right winger Ricky Shakes, capped by Trinidad & Tobago and in his second season at Swindon after joining from Bolton Wanderers, is expected to recover from an ankle injury in time for today's game.

IN ATTACK

Welshman Christian Roberts was a trainee with Cardiff City, his hometown club, and has been capped at under-21 level. Manager's son Blair Sturrock made his first Swindon start last week, while the front three was completed by Lucas Jutkiewicz, a Southampton born teenager who made his League debut at the end of last season. Experienced Scots striker Lee Peacock, with over 100 goals to his credit, will be remembered from his short spell at Manchester City, while just setting out on his career is Luke Hopper, whose appearance on the bench last week was his initial first team involvement.

A PEEP INTO THE AWAY DRESSING ROOM

SWINDON THIS SEASON IN WORDS

This afternoon County return to action following last weekend's scandalous postponement and entertain Paul Sturrock's Swindon Town side who got back to winning ways by ending a sequence of four games without a win which had damaged their automatic promotion hopes and had led the manager to issue a get tough clarion call vowing to clear out any players not fully committed to the club's promotion push.

The Robins' promotion push has been based on an excellent home record which has seen 36 points picked up from the 54 competed for and this has helped to attract additional spectators through the gates, the Swindon board will be pleased that gates are up just under 1,000 on last season. They boast the division's only five-figure gate to date. 10,010 in attendance when they entertained our good friends from Bristol Rovers – good job it wasn't away as there was a heavy dew in the Bristol area!

County will be looking to avenge our 2-0 defeat in Wiltshire back in late August, when goals from Aaron Brown and Christian Roberts did the damage. They are not the most free scoring of sides but have built their success on a solid defence which kept its 10th clean sheet in their 1-0 win against Chester on Saturday, Jack Smith's 9th minute penalty proving to be the

AT THE START

Historians will associate the name of William Pitt with that of a conservative Prime Minister from way back at the turn of the 18th and 19th centuries. But it was his namesake many years later, and a Reverend at that, who had much to do with the formation of Swindon Town Football Club, probably in 1881. It was then that the Spartans (an offshoot of a cricket club), captained by the Rev. Pitt, amalgamated with St Mark's Young Men's Friendly Society.

Wiltshire Cup success was taken for granted, so much so that one season the final was contested between Town's first and second teams. They were founder members of the Southern League Division One in 1894, along with the likes of Millwall and Southampton, and in 1920 all three

were original members of the Football League's Division Three (South).

Town made a sensational start when winning their opening fixture at the County Ground, their home since 1896, by 9-1 against Luton Town, nine times capped by England inside forward Harold Fleming scoring four of the goals. They finished fourth in the table.

Before that, Swindon had twice reached the FA Cup semi finals, in 1909-10 having Spurs and Manchester City among their victims before losing 2-0 to eventual winners Newcastle United and two years later accounting for West Ham United and Everton before missing out by the only goal in a replay when facing Barnsley. They remain Town's best FA Cup performances.

TEENAGE DEBUTANT

Grenville Morris was a teenage debutant for the fledgling Town in 1897. Top scorer in successive seasons, he was one of many players sold to Nottingham Forest by necessity and there the inside forward enjoyed a lengthy career and won 21 international caps for Wales, which saw him score nine goals.

LONDON BOY

Winger Bertie Denyer was the first London boy to win schoolboy international honours against Wales in 1907. After serving in the Sportsmen's Battalion in World War I, he spent nine years with Swindon.

GOAL RECORDS

Harry Morris holds both the seasonal and career league goalscoring records for Town - 47



Blyision Three (South) in 1926-27 and 216 overall between 1926 and 17.33. He also scored five times in a match on two occasions, with former munty striker Keith East doing so me, against Mansfield Town in Movember 1965. Morris also netted in an auccessive FA Cup matches over

CUP FINALIST

Leorge Mansell was a 1931 FA Cup finalist with Birmingham, for whom he made 250 League and cup sppearances at centre half. He joined builden in August 1936 and was outstanding in their 2-1 FA Cup replay win over Grimsby Town in January

FOUR FIGURE TRANSFER

The first player signed by Town for a ton figure fee was Ben Morton, who enrived from Torquay United on October 30 1937 in a £1,000 move. The following season, he was top sorer for them with 28 League goals.

DRAMATIC IMPACT

Maurice Owen made a dramatic Impact with Swindon in 1946-47. The nortime ex-Chindit scored on his Colts nebut, hit four goals in one reserve same against Cardiff City, one against Leyton Orient and a hat-trick on his Langue debut against Watford on lanuary 11. He netted 150 League goals during his 16 years with the club.

12TH MAN SIGNED

In August 1952 Town manager Louis Page signed wing half Ralph Prouton from Arsenal, the transfer forms being completed when the player was acting 12th man for Hampshire against **Bussex** in a County Cricket championship match.

HIGH AVERAGE

In their successful 1968-69 season, when they finished as Division Three numers-up for the second time in newen years, this time only behind champions Watford on goal difference, Town enjoyed an average League attendance of 17,856. Seven times the crowd exceeded 20,000. They were particularly strong at home and goalkeeper Peter Downsborough and his defence conceded only seven goals there.

BEAT MIGHTY ARSENAL

Swindon beat mighty Arsenal 3-1 after extra time in the 1969 League Cup Final at Wembley (see page 65). They also won the Anglo Italian Cup a year

Seven days before their epic Wembley victory the Robins travelled to Edgeley Park for a Third Division game. County won 2-1 thanks to goals from Danny Campbell and Johnny Price in front of 6,647.

RAPID RISE

Starting with the 1985-86 season, when Town were crowned Fourth Division champions with a record 102 points, right through to 1992-93 when Glenn Hoddle guided the Robins into the Premiership via the play-offs, they had jumped through the four divisions in the space of eight seasons.

TEETOTALLER

Man of the Match award for Swindon's Lou Macari during the 1986-87 promotion season brought him five gallons of Bell's whisky - but this teetotaller did not drink one drop of it (allegedly!).

TWO IN A DAY

On September 25 1996 Peter Thorne, a 78th minute substitute for Town, scored an extra time Coca Cola Cup goal at QPR in a 2-1 win. Earlier that afternoon, he had scored for the reserves.

BEAT LEADERS

On March 11, 2000, bottom club Swindon defeated First Division leaders Charlton Athletic 1-0 at The Valley at a time when 54 points separated the two clubs in the table. Steve Cowe scored the goal.

TERRACE HEROES

TrueBlue takes a look at some Swindon greats.

he stories of Swindon
Town's No.1 Cult Hero
of all time and one of
the two greatest days
in the Robins' history
go hand in hand.

Coupled with Town's promotion to the Premiership via the play-offs in 1993 must be that day at Wembley 24 years earlier when, against all odds, the then Third Division side beat the mighty Arsenal 3-1 after extra time to lift the League Cup.

And the name that stands out as a Swindon hero, and a man with an assured presence in club folklore, is left winger Don Rogers.

The Gunners, complaining about flu in the camp and the poor state of the pitch following the Horse of the Year Show the previous week, went 1-0 down to a Roger Smart goal, but equalised in the second half through Bobby Gould. And that's the way the score remained after 90 minutes.

Then Don took over. Towards the end of the first period of extra time, Swindon got a corner. The ball floated through to their skilful No.11 and, in a flash of brilliance, he brought it down with his right foot and cracked it past Arsenal keeper Bob Wilson with his left.

The fans celebrated and their day was made complete when, in the closing seconds, Don burst out of his own half, ran virtually the length of the pitch and then cunningly swerved past Wilson to clinch one of the greatest footballing shocks of all time.

Is he the finest player ever to pull on a Swindon shirt?

No doubt Don would get a few votes.

The teams on that unforgettable day in North London were:

SWINDON: Downsborough, Thomas, Trollope, Butler, Burrows, Harland, Heath, Smart, Smith, Noble (Penman), Rogers.

ARSENAL: Wilson, Storey, McNab, McLintock, Ure, Simpson (Graham), Radford, Sammels, Court, Gould, Armstrong.

George Armstrong, of course, later played for County.

Don, who progressed to the Swindon first team, via the apprentice ranks, played 400 League games for the Robins, in which he scored 146 goals, before later going to Crystal Palace, QPR and returning to Town in March 1976 when he played a further 12 games with two goals.

Representative honours came his way when he was capped by England at youth and under-23 level, in addition to representing the Football League at Coventry on March 18, 1970, when he and Jeff Astle (2) scored in a 3-2 win over the Scottish League.

Shaun Taylor and Steve White completed the nominated trio conducted among the Swindon fans to find top club legends.


Shaun was a central defender who joined the Robins in July 1991 from Exeter City. He played his part in their elevation to the Premiership and, as during his time with the Devon club, had over 200 appearances to his name before his move to Bristol City in

September 1996. He also chipped in with 30 League goals.

If Shaun's main role was defending, Steve's was hitting the back of the net at the other end. And he proved a more than useful marksman during his eight years at the County Ground.

Steve had already chalked up 91 League goals for Bristol Rovers, Luton Town and Charlton Athletic before arriving at Swindon in July 1986, and in 244 League games while with the Wiltshire club he scored a further 83 times, including seven in their promotion to the Premiership season when Craig Maskell's 19 topped the charts.

Steve later played for Hereford United and Cardiff City and in all scored 223 career goals in 646 League games.




