JOHN COLEMAN

Now in his eighth season at Stanley and is the club's longest serving Manager.

Since his appointment, the club has won three Championships and five cup competitions. John was previously Player-Manager at Ashton United where his side narrowly missed promotion, though they did win the First Division Cup twice.

In his long playing career at Kirby Town, Burscough, Marine, Southport, Runcorn, Macclesfield, Rhyl, Morecambe and Lancaster he fully justified his reputation as one of the most prolific goal scorers in non-league football, scoring well over 500 goals. His many honours include England Semi-Pro caps as well as several Player of the Year awards. He was deservedly voted The Conference Manager of the season after leading Stanley to The Championship.

In 337 games in charge of Stanley to date he has won 146 games, lost 96 and drawn 95.

t's be a long time, but welcome to our visitors this afternoon for the first fixture between the two clubs at The County Ground since 1959.

Those were the days soon after the disbanding of Third Divisions North and South, and it had been geography rather than status that had kept the two teams apart prior to the League restructure. Then, with the well-recorded events of the early sixties at Peel Park, it's been a long haul back to reclaim the relinquished place of Football League members. Those days are surely too painful for Stanley's fans to be constantly reminded, but everyone will have been delighted with the fairy tale that eventually brought Football League founder members Stanley back into the fold.

Boss John Coleman is in his eighth season at the helm and Accrington have experienced a mixed bag of results in League Two. Ten defeats in 18 travelling fixtures isn't the best away form in League Two and a 4-2 reverse at Rochdale last weekend continued the bad news. At home things are slightly better, and a 1-1 draw at the Fraser Eagle Stadium last October saw honours finish even between Stanley and Town, Andy Todd opened the scoring with Lee

Peacock equalising in the second half.

Paul Mullin has 13 goals to his name followed by Andy Todd on eight.

Midfielder Tony Grant had a spell with Town in 1996 on loan from Everton. Andy Todd was a trainee at Nottingham Forest and shouldn't be confused with the Bolton Wanderers defender of the same name who had a temporary stint at The County Ground the year before.

At the beginning of the week Stanley were just two points off a return to the Conference, but with a home date with Bristol Rovers pencilled in for Tuesday, weather permitting there could be more breathing space for our visitors by now.

If Town can emerge victorious the afternoon, it will be our first win in a total of six attempts against our Lancashire opponents. With three defeats and two draws so far, it could be argued we are well overdue a win over Accrington, regardless of the forty-year wait to recommence competition.









ACCRINGTON STANLEY

PETER CAVANAGH Defender

Defender signed by Stanley in August 2001 after being released by Liverpool where he had spent 10 years but a bad injury in 1999 set back his career, though he did play some reserve games. Appointed Stanley's youngest ever captain on joining the club, he collected five trophies in his first two years at the club.

LEAM RICHARDSON Defender

Started his career at Blackburn Rovers, playing one first team game before being transferred to Bolton Wanderers before signing for Blackpool in July 2003. He joined Stanley in the summer of 2005 and soon made the left-back position his own with his displays earning him a new contract.

MICHAEL WELCH Defender

A former Republic of Ireland Youth International, he was signed by Stanley prior to the start of the 2005-06 season after creating a superb impression in pre-season. Born 23 years ago in Crewe, he also had spells with Barnsley and Macclesfield.

ANDY PROCTOR Midfielder

Signed by Stanley in February 2002 from neighbours Great Harwood when only 18 years old, soon adapting to the higher standard of football. Benefited greatly from playing alongside Mike Marsh in midfield as he established himself in the first team and has now made 91 league starts for the club.

SEAN DOHERTY Midfielder

The son of Mick Doherty, himself a top non-league player, who represented England, Sean was the first signing in the summer of 2006. He started his career at Fulham and also spent time on loan at Blackpool. Released by Fulham in May 2005, he was signed by Port Vale where he was a member of the first team squad.

ANDREW MANGAN Striker

Signed from non-league Hyde in pre-season, Mangan began his career as a trainee at Blackpool where he made his first team debut at just 17 years old. Joined Hyde on work experience in 2004 but having been released by Blackpool, opted for a move to Stanley. Four goals to his name so far this season.

PAUL MULLIN Striker

Began his career as a youngster with Stanley but after being released, featured for Darwen, Trafford and Clitheroe before joining Radcliffe, where he was a huge success. Returned to Accrington in August 2000 and since then has finished as top scorer and lifted several Player of the Year trophies.

PHILLIP EDWARDS Defender

Signed for Stanley on a permanent basis from Wigan Athletic in January 2006 after an initial loan stint. He is able to play either full back or in the centre of defence. Made his Stanley debut against Rotherham United in the LDV Trophy, playing at centre back.

ROMAULD BOCO

Benin international striker signed in August 2005. French-born, he spent time with the Youth Academies at Lens, SC Amiens, FC Valenienne and FC Niort before being promoted to the first team squad at Niort. Made his International debut when only 18 and has now got 17 caps. In 2004-05, he also represented Benin in The FIFA Junior World Cup.





ANDY TODD Midfielder

Signed on loan just before deadline last season from Burton Albion and was signed on a permanent basis at the end of the campaign. Has also had spells with Eastwood. Ilkeston Town, Worksop Town and Hucknall Town, for who he played in last season's FA Trophy Final. The midfielder has also had spells as a professional with Nottingham Forest and Scarborough.

JAY HARRIS Midfielder

Made his debut for Stanley against Barnet in August 2006, after being signed in the close season. He started his career at Everton, where he spent seven years and played regularly in the reserve side. During his schooldays, he represented Liverpool Schoolboys for two years.

SHAUN WHALLEY 6 Striker

The son of former Preston North End captain, Neil Whalley, Shaun signed for Stanley from Witton Albion. He started his career with the youth teams at Southport and from there joined Chester City. Last season he joined Runcorn Halton, moving to Witton Albion in March.

ALAN ROGERS Defender

After being released by Nottingham Forest in January, Alan Rogers joined Accrington

Stanley bringing with him a wealth of experience. Began his career with Tranmere Rovers before a £2 million move too him to The City Ground. Has also had spells with Leicester City and Hull City.

38 MAURO ALMEDIDA Defender

Strong centreback who was signed in January 2007 after impressing on trial. Started his career with FC Porto in his native Portugal, then moving first to Amadora. He first moved abroad to Holland to join FC Zwolle and then last season to play for Bulgarian side Vihren Sandanska.

TONY GRANT Midfielder (Player Coach)

Joined Stanley as Player-Coach in January 2007. He started his career at Everton and after playing 79 games and having Ioan spells at Tranmere Rovers and here at The County Ground. Also had spells with Manchester City and Burnley. Yet to open his goalscoring account this term.

PRZEMYSLAW KAZIMIERCZAK Goalkeeper

Young keeper nicknamed 'Shrek', he joined Stanley on loan in January from Bolton Wanderers. Spent six years as a junior with top Polish club LKS Lodz before joining Bolton in October 2004. He has already represented Poland at Under 16 and 17 level and this season was selected for The Under 19 squad.

The gaffer had the squad in for the practice game on Monday - how did the lads react?



Have you been happy with the way things have gone for you? You're fit again and playing games now...





When I first turned up I was working with Dick Mackey [physio] to get fit again - I had a spell when I didn't know what was wrong and I'd done a pre-season and fallen down again. Still not knowing what was wrong, then finding out it was to do with leg length and knowing that it was healing and building up the muscles, it was great and having a place to do it was great. Also, having someone like Dick, who had time to work with me, with his knowledge and to push me - to get me fit and enable me to start playing again - superb. I've had a few games now, even in the reserves... then it builds up, the fitness and the confidence and I'm getting the taste for it. Getting the contract until the end of the season was massive, it's really helped me.

You scored two in three; do you think a regular run will see you find the score sheet more frequently?

I was unlucky not to score on my debut - I knew the 'keeper from a previous club and he pulled out a few stops, which was frustrating - I wanted a goal on my debut! I had a chance last weekend and perhaps I should have done better - maybe I'll get one and then a nice little run will follow.


How important is it that we return to winning ways this week?



TURNAROUND

Anyone at St. Andrews on Easter Monday 12th April 1993 who left the ground with half an hour to go would have done so confident that they knew the outcome of Town's match with Birmingham City. With the home side four goals to one up, there was surely no chance that we could claim anything from the match.

A hat-trick from Dave Mitchell, a brace from Craig Maskell and a single from the battered and bandaged Shaun Taylor outnumbered the mere four goals for the home team and helped us on our way to eventual promotion.

Town came back from nowhere on Easter Monday. It had been done before.

TODD, COLIN

Appointed Town manager on May the 4th 2000, (as Luke Skywalker knows, may the fourth be with you) and left on 24th October the same year, Todd's stay lasted 142 days, much of which was spent during the close season signing nine new players. Chequebook waving like that deserved somewhat more commitment than the 17 matches that Todd offered in return for spending the money of then chairman Terry relegation place, he moved on to spiritual home Derby County to assist Jim Smith on a wave of apathy.

He replaced Jim Quinn, Andy King, and he did very little in between. Sacked by Bradford City last month.

TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR

There's no discernable reason why Swindon and Spurs should share so many names, but there's a huge list of players and managers who have spent time at both White Hart Lane and The County Ground.

Perhaps the name that springs most readily to mind is a man who made himself a legend in both N17 and SN1, a certain Mr G. Hoddle. Leading us to the Premiership, although then taking the door labelled Jumpingship, Glenn played 377 times in the League for Spurs before making 64 for Swindon. He'd arrived in town to replace someone else who had huge Spurs experience. Ossie Ardiles had been responsible for shaping Town's style away from the more direct manner favoured by Lou Macari and preparing it for the coming of his ex-Tottenham midfield team mate.

Before either of them, Les Allen, a member of Bill Nicholson's famous push-and-run double winning team of a 1961 had been installed as manager here at The County Ground back in 1972, and he had superseded another member of that side Dave MacKay who had a less than successful spell as Swindon player/boss at the beginning of the decade.

With only on-the-pitch duties to

perform, the clubs have shared Tony Galvin, Mickey Hazard, the colossal Colin Calderwood, the less so Shaun Close, David Kerslake, John Moncur... the list just goes on and on.

Back in January 1980, Spurs travelled to Wiltshire and returned with a 0-0 draw in the FA Cup round four. There were almost 26,000 crammed to watch us take on the Londoners. a crowd that raised less than £56,000. Today, a crowd like that might well net Town £400,000. That would be useful again.

Tottenham went through to the fifth round by two goals to one, but not before a Ray McHale penalty had scared the life out of them.

TROLLOPE, JOHN

No historical series about Swindon Town would be completed without mention of the mercurial John. As everyone will know, he formed part of



the youngest ever fullback pairing in the Football League when he partnered Terry Wollen at the back in the early sixties. He made his debut at 17 years and 68 days old, He beat Portsmouth's Jimmy Dickinson's, one-club appearance record of 764 in October 1980.

TREACY. RAY

Dublin born striker Ray Treacy started as an apprentice at First Division West Bromwich Albion and signed as a professional in June 1964, then after five first team appearances he dropped a division to join Charlton Athletic in February 1968.



A near miss at promotion to the First in 1968/69 was as good as it got for Charlton around that time. Successive bottom three finishes concluded with relegation to the Third Division in 1972, and after almost 150 League appearances for Athletic, Ray was signed for Swindon by Dave MacKay. The £35,000 fee doubled the club record, set for the man he replaced, Arthur Horsfield.

Treacy went on to be ever present to the end of his first season, and his 13 League strikes during 1972/73 left him top scorer for the season.

The following season commenced with Treacy the established number nine, but just three goals to October brought trouble. Les Allen had already replaced MacKay as manager in November 1972, and the lack of goals were eventually to contribute to his dismissal and Town's relegation.

Peter Eastoe was signed on loan from Wolves, and when he scored both Town's goals in a 2-2 home draw with Carlisle the writing was on the wall. Making one last appearance in a 4-1 defeat at Sunderland, Ray signed for Bobby Charlton's Preston in a £30,000 deal in December 1973. We finished bottom of Division Two a few months later and Preston joined us in relegation to the Third.

August 1976 took Ray back to where it all started, when he rejoined West Brom in Division One. Albion were to finish 7th that season and Ray made a run of 19 consecutive appearances between September and February, scoring six goals. But these were exciting times for the Baggies and when he lost the number eight shirt it was no shame to do so to the emerging Laurie Cunningham.

At the end of the season, Ray moved back to his native Ireland when he signed for Shamrock Royers.

Treacy missed just one first team game during his stay at Swindon, making 54 consecutive League appearances, claiming 42 caps for the Republic of Ireland.

Initially taking current Republic of Ireland custodian Shay Given on Ioan, it became clear that Rovers would have a bigger, long-term plan for Given than to allow him to become a permanent member of the County Ground staff. Below him in the pecking order at Ewood Park was Melbourne-born Frank Talia, and after another Ioan spell it was he who joined McMahon's men in Division Two.

Frank never took to the first team field for Blackburn but had made 14 appearances on loan at Hartlepool. The Australian Under-20 keeper was an instant success as Town claimed the Division Two championship in his first season and he played on 16 occasions as he shared appearances with Digby.

By the start of 1998/99, Digby had departed to Crystal Palace and after Jimmy Glass joined from Bournemouth in March, he and Talia were to fight for the shirt throughout 1999/2000. Toward the end of that campaign Bart Griemink arrived on loan from Peterborough and over the summer of 2000 the deal was made permanent.

The progress shown by Steve Mildenhall increased competition for places and Talia was allowed to leave that same summer after over 100 outings for Town.

Spells at Wolves and Reading didn't produce a game, but in between, Frank was to make starts for Antwerp and Sheffield United. In August 2002 Frank joined the staff at Wycombe Wanderers where he ousted long-standing keeper Martin Taylor, but injury has decimated his season this term.



GROUND DESCRIPTION

At one side of the ground is the John Smiths Stand, which is the tallest stand and is two tiered and covered. However this stand only runs half the length of the pitch, straddling the half way line. Opposite is the old Main Stand, which is small covered all seated stand and has a large number of supporting pillars running across the front of it. Part of this stand dates back to 1901, possibly making it the oldest surviving stand in League football. Both ends are small covered affairs. Home fans are located in the Pontoon Stand at one end, away fans at the opposite end in the Osmond Stand. The corner between this stand and the Main Stand is also filed, as the stands are joined at this point. For big games the Club increases the capacity of the ground by 500 by installing blocks of temporary seating in the open corners of the ground.

WHAT CAN TOWN FANS EXPECT?

Away fans are located in the Osmond Stand, at one end of the ground, where 2,200 supporters can be accommodated. One downside of this stand is that there are a number of supporting pillars which could impede your view of the game. Blundell Park is a rather small ground and sometimes gets over-criticized by some visiting fans. But there is normally always a passionate crowd, which contributes to a good atmosphere. Remember though to wrap up warm as the weather differs somewhat from the warmer climes of Wiltshire. It can be a biting wind coming off the North Seal


WHERE TO DRINK?

The unofficial away fans pub is the Leaking Boot (formerly Darley's hotel) which is halfway between Cleethorpes and Blundell Park on the north side of Grimsby Road. To get there head down the A180 and drive past the ground. It's about 400 yards further up the road on the left. It is a large pub and car park and allows in children. The Fish & Chips in Cleethorpes are legendary and there are some good outlets located near to the ground. Josh's fish and chip shop near the Leaking Boot comes recommended.

GETTING THERE

By Road: The ground is on the A180 which runs between Grimsby & Cleethorpes. Cleethorpes is well signposted from Grimsby town centre. There is no car park at the ground, therefore only street parking. As you drive along the A180 towards the ground, the home end appears first, then after the McDonalds is the away end. From there, continue towards Cleethorpes and try any of the side streets to the left or preferably the right and you should find a parking spot okay.

By Rail: Cleethorpes railway station is about a mile from the ground and takes 15 minutes to walk to the ground. As you come out of the station turn left and walk along the sea front. Just keep going and you will see the ground on your left.


