





MANAGER STUART GRAY

Good afternoon and welcome to Sixfields for today's visit from Swindon Town.

In extending a warm welcome to Paul Sturrock and his team, we know that we are in for a very difficult match today. I am sure that Swindon will be full of confidence, and will be looking to build on last season's promotion winning campaign. Paul has strengthened his squad with some new faces over the summer, and I know we will have to be at our very best to record the result we all want this afternoon.

The start of a new season marks a fresh start, and we certainly want to improve on last season's home record. The home form in the first part of the season was not as good as it could have been, and as we kept stressing to the players throughout the pre-season games, this is our patch and we should not be fearful or too respectful of any team coming here. We will give them the respect they deserve, but we also need to make this a very difficult place to come to.

Pre-season is always a long 6 week programme and the lads trained very hard and got through a lot of physical work. I was very pleased with their attitude, their willingness to work and their general professionalism throughout the pre-season campaign. Results are not important during pre-season, but generally ours showed up well, and it is always better to win a game of football than lose it, friendly or not.

We don't have too many new faces to integrate into the squad so that has helped those who are new to settle in. I think all of the new signings have improved us and have given us different options. I think they will also cause the opposition problems when we go forward.

Danny Jackman is a full back who I know well and he likes to get forward, rather like Jason Crowe does on the right and I think you need width in any side. I am very pleased that the two full backs we have got will offer us that. Danny played a lot of games at his last 2 clubs and that shows he has made an impact and been a big influence at both Stockport and Gillingham. He was Player of the Year in his first season at Gillingham and I know they were very keen to keep him.

Colin Larkin is another player with a good pedigree. He began his career at Wolves and since then he has added a fair amount of experience despite still being relatively young. He has pace and he can move defences about. He enjoys going lowards goal, he will stretch play and open up gaps.

lan Henderson is a young player who played for England under 20s and has been on the verge of Norwich's first team for a few years. He can play up front or out wide on the flank and he has the pace and ability to fulfil either position. He is only in his early 20s but already he has made nearly 100 senior appearances at this level and in the Championship and he has the determination to do well.

Giles Coke has been working hard to overcome a knee injury and is progressing well. He is a young old fashioned box to box midfield player with two good feet and an excellent range of passing.

In Poul Hubertz we have added a physical presence to the forward line. Poul knows this league well having been with Millwall last season and I think he is a really good addition to our squad. He can hold the ball up well and he is a real presence for us up front.

Daniel Jones is a player I know all about having been at Wolves with Glenn Hoddle when we gave him his senior debut. He is a big, strong lad with a lot of pace and he will give us some power going forward. He can operate wide on either flank and that will add to our options. He played 8 games in the side that made it through to the Championship play offs last season and I know he made an impact in the opportunities he was given in a squad full of quality.

I have said it before, but as far as I am concerned, keeping Jason Crowe and Chris Doig at the club this summer was like adding two extra new signings to the squad. They are both very good players and it is fantastic for the club that they re-signed to stay here.

I hope we are in for a good atmosphere today. The first day of the season at any ground generates a special atmosphere and I am sure the same will apply here today. The Swindon fans haven't had too far to travel, and I am sure that with a good travelling support here at today's game, we are in for an enjoyable occasion.

We have a hectic start to the season, with the possibility of 18 games before the end of October. With that in mind, the hard work that the players have put in, not just in the last 6 weeks but in sticking to their summer training schedule, should hopefully pay dividends. You can't make any guarantees in football, all we can say is that the lads will be going out there giving their very best every week, and their chances of succeeding will be so much greater with your support right behind them. We have a very young side, a side full of players who are strong, fit and determined to do well, and your vocal support will be a big

CHANGES

A few things will be a little different this season;

SEASON TICKET BOOKS

Season ticket holders are required to bring their season ticket book to each game and tear the relevant match number off in the presence of the turnstile operator. The number required will be selected at random for each game and will be displayed on approach to each turnstile.

Collect these vouchers, and they could prove valuable for you as the season progresses. previous games should tickets be limited for future games.

MATCHDAY LOTTERY

VINCENT WANTS A FLYING START

Jamie Vincent insists Swindon can be a "surprise package" this season, claiming intense competition for places should inspire a League One play-off push.

Last season's stand-in skipper has been struck in pre-season by the scrap for a regular starting role he has on his hands.

Morecambe defender Chris Blackburn has become one of Paul Sturrock's defensive additions, following the arrival of former Plymouth man Hasney Aljofree.

With Jerel Ifil, Ady Williams, Andy Nicholas, Jack Smith and Sofienne Zaaboub also very much part of Sturrock's plans, the versatile Vincent knows the four defensive positions will be fiercely fought over.

New boys Craig Easton and Steve Adams have also joined the squad.

Vincent said: "People fighting for their places is only going to bring out the best in the team. From day one we are aware we have to prove our point and that hopefully will spur everyone on."

While the likes of Leeds United, Nottingham Forest and Oldham are being tipped by the experts as promotion favourites, Vincent is more than happy to stay under everyone's radar.

He points to the success of West Country rivals Yeovil Town as evidence League One novices don't have to struggle and is keen to do his talking out on the pitch.

He said: "We have to be looking at getting in the play-offs. I don't see why we can't anyway. Look at what Yeovil did last season. "There is no point in just aiming for mid-table mediocrity because then that is what you will get, at best.

"We will go out there believing we can win every game we play and come the end of the season why can't we get in the play-offs?

"It would be nice to be a bit of a surprise package in the league.

"We have the potential to do that. Winning promotion and then reaching the play-offs would be a great season for us all."

A quick-fire start to last season, six wins on the trot, instantly marked Town as promotion contenders and Vincent is looking for similar this time round.

"Of course we are all looking to start the season flying again," he said.

MEET THE BOSS: PAUL STURROCK



Paul Sturrock is the man in charge of Swindon Town. Sturrock is carving out an impressive CV as a manager following a glittering career as a player.

Sturrock arrived at Swindon having already achieved numerous successes as a manager - which includes winning the League One Play-Off final with Sheffield Wednesday.

A member of the successful Dundee United team of the early 80's, Sturrock picked up a league winners medal in 1983 and two league cup winners medals in 1979 and 1980. 'Luggy' as he was affectionately known, also appeared in the Uefa Cup final against Barcelona in 1987 where the Scottish side were defeated 2-1 on aggregate.

Born in Ellon, Aberdeenshire on October 10 1956, Sturrock was an integral part of United's success. He scored 171 goals in 576 appearances becoming United's best attacking player of all time and his skills put fear into the opposition. Sturrock was also a Scotland international star and if it wasn't for the presence of Kenny Dalglish, Frank McAvennie and Charlie Nicholas, he surely would have more caps and goals to his name.

After twenty years of dedicated service at Tannadice, he hung up his boots and began a coaching role. Four years later he finally made his first move into management by becoming the St. Johnstone manager and led the side to the first division title in 1997. When United came calling the following year the lure to manage his only other club was too hard to resist and he was back in charge at his spiritual home as manager of the Tangerines.

It was to be a short spell in charge at Tannadice - just two games into the 2000-01 season he resigned and left Scotland to begin life as a manager in

the Football League with Plymouth Argyle.

The Home Park fans quickly warmed to their new boss and he led the Pilgrims to the League Two title amassing 102 points and being named Nationwide Manager of the Year. In League One he guided them to eighth before a move to near neighbours Southampton. In three and a half years he instilled a style of play that would eventually lead Plymouth to the Championship which is where they continue to impress.

Sturrock took over at Southampton in March 2004 with his first Premiership game in charge resulting in an impressive 2-0 victory over Liverpool. However his time at St Mary's turned sour and after just 13 games in charge he left the Saints by mutual consent following a 3-2 win against Blackburn on August 24 2004.

The following month he took over as manager at Sheffield Wednesday and it was to be an impressive spell at Hillsborough. He was named manager of the month for November that season and soon lifted Wednesday from 14th to 4th in League One. The Owls made it into the play-offs and defeated Brentford in the semi-finals with Town's Lee Peacock amongst the goalscorers over the two legs. Hartlepool United were the opponents in the showpiece final at Cardiff and victory sent 40,000 fans into wild celebrations.

Swindon Town are no strangers to success and with the experienced manager at the helm, automatic promotion back to League One was secured thanks to a point on the last day of last season against Walsall.

PHIL SMITH

Phil joined Swindon in late July 2006 from Crawley Town. Smith had made 74 starts for Crawley Town during a two-year stay, which followed a year's spell at Margate where he made 35 starts. A dependable customer, Smith slotted into become the number one for the remainder of the 2006-7 season following Peter Brezovan's unfortunate injury. Smith was a revelation in between the sticks, which included saving a penalty at MK Dons on New Year's Day and being named the PFA Fans' Player of the Month for December 2006.

JACK SMITH

Jack signed from Watford in the summer of 2005 and he added youthful experience to the Town side. Due to the departure of Paul Robinson to West Bromwich Albion he was thrust into the first-team spotlight at Watford and coped admirably, registering two goals - the first of which a 'Goal of the Season' contender at Sheffield United in front of the Sky Sports cameras. He made 38 league starts for Town last season in a variety of positions including right back, left back and midfield. Last term he was in excellent form back at his preferred right-back position, also opening his goalscoring account for the club and has been a penalty taker on several occasions.

JAMIE VINCENT

Jamie Vincent arrived at the County Ground in the summer of 2006 hoping to make the left-back slot his own, and by the end of the campaign he had done far more than that. Made Captain following the injury to Ady Williams in February, Vincent also performed at centre-back and was a rock at the back throughout the campaign. Vincent began his football career as a trainee at Crystal Palace before making the switch to AFC Bournemouth, where he made over 100 appearances between 1996 and 1999. He then made a £500,000 switch to Huddersfield Town which was followed by an £800,000 deal which

saw him move to Portsmouth in 2001. Spells at Derby County and Millwall then followed.

MIGUEL COMMINGES

Signed in July 2007, Comminges first came to the attention of the Town boss during a scouting mission to France towards the end of last season. Born in Guadeloupe, France, the defender has previous experience with Amiens SC and then signed for Reims in 2003 and made a total of 74 appearances for the Second Division side. He has also represented the Guadeloupe national football team. Other French internationals from Guadeloupe include Pascal Chimbonda, Mikael Silvestre and Lilian Thuram.

HASNEY ALJOFREE

Experienced centre back who arrives at the County Ground with plenty of Coca-Cola Championship experience. Previous clubs include Bolton Wanderers, Dundee United and Plymouth Argyle, from where he signed for Swindon on a three-year deal in the summer of 2007.

CHRIS BLACKBURN

The 24-year old became the fourth central defender in Town's squad, with Hasney Aljofree, Jerel Ifil and Ady Williams also competing for the central berths. Chester-born Blackburn joined Morecambe in February 2004 on a short-term deal and eventually signed a new two-year contract to stay at Christie Park. After joining The Shrimps as a midfielder, he was then converted to a defender after an injury crisis. Over the course of the next season he shone in the backline, performing at right-back or centre back. During the 2005-6 campaign Blackburn's impressive performances caught the eye of the England National Game selectors and he was soon included in the England National Game line-up. Blackburn has also had spells with Northwich Victoria and following his return from holiday in India, has put pen to paper on a two-year deal with The Robins.

SWINDON TOWN

SOFIENE ZAABOUB

Versatile left-sided player at home in defence or midfield, Zaaboub was new manager Paul Sturrock's first signing as Town boss. Having joined initially on a short-term contract, he has since signed a new deal to keep him at Swindon for another 18 months. He made his debut as a substitute against Carlisle United in the FA Cup and was a trialist at Sturrock's former club Sheffield Wednesday. Previous clubs include FC Brussels, Modena and St. Etienne.

ADY WILLIAMS

Named on-field Captain by former manager Dennis Wise in July 2006, Ady Williams brought a wealth of league and international experience to the club. Signed from Coventry City, the former Welsh International boasts successful spells with Wolves and Reading on his CV - just the credentials that helped set Town on their way to League Two success. His leadership skills were there for all to see during the first half of last season and his determined attitude was at the


forefront of Town's promotion challenge. A knee injury sustained ogainst Hartlepool United in February developed into a serious setback, which saw the skipper undergo surgery that ruled him out of the remainder of the season. After a summer of rehabilitation, 'Willo' is now closing in on a return to full training.

CHRISTIAN ROBERTS

Cardiff-born striker who joined Town in October 2004 in a £50,000 switch from local rivals Bristol City. He is an aggressive runner and adds much needed pace to the Swindon frontline. Formerly with Exeter City where he scored 18 goals in 67 league starts for the Grecians from 2000 – 2002. 'Robbo' enjoyed a solid season during 2006-7, finishing as top scorer with 13 goals and will be lining up in midfield this term after several sparkling displays on the flanks.

LEE PEACOCK

Lee Peacock joined Swindon Town on 20th January 2006 on a free transfer from Sheffield Wednesday. The experienced front man started his career at Carlisle United as a trainee, but after scoring 11 goals in 52 appearances he made the switch to Mansfield Town in October 1997 for £75,000. It proved to be a productive spell with The Stags with 29 goals in 80 appearances attracting Manchester City who parted with £500,000 for his services. However, his time at Maine Road was not as successful as he would have liked due to injuries, but his next stop certainly was. A £600,000 move to Bristol City in August 2000 heralded the start of a successful four year spell at Ashton Gate. 54 goals in 131 league starts was the result of his stay with the Robins. Next up was Sheffield Wednesday, who he joined on a free transfer in the summer of 2004, on a free transfer. Peacock wasted no time in settling in at Town, scoring on his debut against AFC Bournemouth after coming off the bench in the 4-2 home win. However, he finished the season with just 11 starts to his name after a knee injury ruled him out of the final games of the campaign. After an end





of 2005/6 season operation to cure the problem, Peacock enjoyed a solid pre-season and capped his start to the campaign with the winner at Hartlepool United on August 5. He finished the season in the heart of midfield, scoring a number of vital strikes on the road to promotion. Having worked with Manager Paul Sturrock before at Sheffield Wednesday, 'Peacs' has now been moved into a central midfield role.

BARRY CORR

After impressing during a three-month loan spell Barry Corr put pen to paper on a new two-year contract in June 2006, signing on a free transfer from Sheffield Wednesday. The Irishman made his debut for the Town reserves against Bristol City on the same day he put pen to paper on the initial loan deal and netted on what was his first appearance in a Swindon shirt. Corr joined The Owls in April 2005 from Yorkshire rivals Leeds United after an initial trial spell with the Elland Road club. An industrious front man and with a 6'3 frame he certainly offers a physical presence in the strike force. He has also gained youth honours for the Republic of Ireland during his time with Leeds and had a loan spell with Bristol City earlier in the 2006-7 season. He made a goalscoring debut, hitting the second goal at Lincoln City on Sunday 25th March to earn a valuable win.

ANDY NICHOLAS

'Nicho' is now the club's longest serving player after joining from Liverpool in June 2003, where he came through the youth system but struggled to break into the first team. He was a regular in the Under 19's side at Anfield and won many plaudits with his performances at left back, which prompted Andy King to snap up the youngster. After working his way into the manager's starting line up with some hard work in training, he seized his chance to become a regular member of the side throughout the 2003/04 season and managed his first senior goal in a 4-2 win at Stockport in February. Despite making such a positive impression during the 2003-4 season, the 2004-5 campaign saw the defender struggle with injuries and he was unable to gain a regular starting berth, but impressed enough during the promotion run in to be awarded a

new one-year deal in the summer of 2007.

BLAIR STURROCK

Sturrock junior arrived at the County Ground in November 2006 to join up with Physio Dick Mackey for treatment following an injury which ruled him out of the latter stages of the 2005-6 campaign, when he was at Rochdale. The striker joined Dundee United as a trainee before spending time at Brechin on loan. Sturrock then had a three-year spell on the south coast with Plymouth Argyle making most of his appearances as a substitute. In 2004, Sturrock moved to Kidderminster, then onto Rochdale 9 months later where he hit six goals in fifteen starts. The Scottish striker netted three goals in seven starts during the promotion run in and signed a new two-year deal in July 2007.

ANDY CATON

A versatile player, 'Cates' joined Swindon Town as a first year scholar in June 2004 after spending some time with GLS Hellenic Premier Division side North Leigh where he was a prolific scorer. The son of the late Manchester City player Tommy, he came off the bench on the opening day of the 2003-4 season against Wrexham and scored to mark a fairytale start to his Swindon Town career. Since then he has continued his progression with the Under 18's side and reserves, as well as a number of first team appearances both as a left-winger and striker. Currently recovering from an ankle operation, he has been awarded a short-term contract until Christmas to prove his fitness.

CRAIG EASTON

Craig Easton arrived at the County
Ground in June 2007 and adds further
experience to the central midfield area.
The former Scotland Under 21
International arrives at The County
Ground with over 300 league
appearances under his belt. Easton,
28, started his career at Dundee
United where he came up through the
ranks to make 162 league starts
before departing in the summer of
2004. He then spent a year at
Livingston before joining Leyton Orient
in July 2005. In all he made 65 league
starts in two seasons for Martin Ling's
O's.

Joe Burnell has come through pre-season unscathed, having been out of action since the start of February, while should they be selected, Colin Larkin, Poul Hubertz, Danny Jones, Danny Jackman and Ian Henderson could all make their Northampton Town debuts today.

THE REFEREE

Born in May 1960, this afternoon's referee Mr Clive Penton from Sussex is one of the most experienced and respected on the National List. He started refereeing in 1986 in Brighton and progressed through the Isthmian League to become a Football League assistant referee in 1997. He was promoted to the Premier League list in 2000 and became a National List referee in 2001. Clive was an assistant referee in an FA cup semi-final game in 2000 and has also refereed the Isthmian League trophy final and the Sussex senior cup final. His last time with the Cobblers was a year ago when he took charge of our 1-0 win against Gillingham at the Priestfield Stadium, with Andy Kirk hitting the winner in the 23rd minute. The previous season he handled two of our games, both away from home. In November 2005 we lost 3-2 at Colchester in a Football League Trophy Southern Section match, Andy Kirk and Pedi Bojic neeting the Cobblers goals that night. Two months earlier came the 1-1 Friday Night draw with Wycombe Wanderers at Adams Park. David Hunt opened the scoring after 30 minutes before the home side levelled on the hour mark. His last visit to Sixfields came in August 2003 for the 1-0 win over Doncaster Rovers. with Lawrie Dudfield netting the winner in the 76th minute. The last Swindon match he handled was on New Year's Day when the Robins won 1-0 against Milton Keynes at the National Hockey Stadium thanks to a Lee Peacock goal. On Tuesday night he makes the long trip along the South coast from Sussex to handle the Carling Cup tie between Plymouth Argyle and Wycombe Wanderers.



Northampton Town continued their pre-season build up with a trip to Kettering Town. Mark Bunn was absent on compassionate leave, and he was replaced by Chris Dunn. Jason Crowe made his first start of the pre-season campaign, while Ian Henderson and Danny Jackman made their first starts for the club on UK soil.


The game kicked-off on a pleasantly sunny evening, with a healthy following of Cobblers supporters making the short journey to the A-Line Arena. In the early exchanges, Andy Kirk nearly opened the scoring in just the 2nd minute, finding space at the far post from a long Andy Holt throw, but his snap shot with his left foot from 12 yards flew over the bar. Just moments

later Kirk did have the ball in the back of the net, but unfortunately was adjudged to have strayed offside.

The hosts created a good chance of their own on 7 minutes after neat play down the left, and although Craig Westcarr connected well with his effort from the edge of the area, Mark Hughes threw himself in the way to make an excellent block. On 11 minutes Henderson was pulled back just outside the area and from the resulting free kick the defensive wall did it's job to deflect Bradley Johnson's attempt over the bar for a corner.

On 20 minutes, neat play from Andy Kirk and Sam Aiston released Ian Henderson, but his chip from the edge





of the area drifted over the bar. Andy Kirk went close again just 5 minutes later, running onto a well weighted through ball from Sam Aiston, but although his first time effort had the goalkeeper beaten, it went wide of the post.

Andy Holt out jumped everyone on the half hour mark from a Danny Jackman corner, but his looping header lacked a little bit of direction and went over the crossbar. Holt nearly gave the Cobblers the lead moments later in unusual circumstances, Liam Dolman hooked a ball over his head back into the box after a corner had been half cleared, Holt beat the goalkeeper in the air, but his header bounced higher than usual, and clipped the crossbar on the way over.

On the stroke of half-time, Andy Kirk travelled from the half way line, and in using Sam Aiston as a decoy, created space and drove in a low shot from 25 yards, but Cameron Belford in the Kettering goal pushed the ball round the post to ensure the score remained 0-0 at the break.

Neither side made any changes at the interval, but it took a few minutes for the match to find the flow of the first half. Ian Henderson thought he had given the Cobblers the lead on 51 minutes flicking the ball over the advancing goalkeeper having got on the end of a delicate Sam Aiston header into his path, but was foiled by the offside flag.

Moments later Bradley Johnson rattled the crossbar with a fierce free kick from 25 yards, and from the rebound Sam Aiston sent his half chance over the bar.

The Cobblers finally did have the lead on 57 minutes, Sam Aiston stood up an inviting cross to the far post which was powerfully met by the head of Andy Holt and sent into the net, giving him his 3rd goal in 3 pre-season matches.

As is almost now customary in preseason matches, a plethora of substitutions midway through the second half affected the flow of the remainder of the match.

Mark Hughes was required to head off his line in the last minute from Jean-Paul Marna as the Cobblers went on to record a 1-0 win, but more importantly enjoy good preparation as the preseason programme continued.

STUART GRAY SAID:

"We created some good chances but we perhaps lacked that little bit of belief and conviction at times. The most important touch you get on a football is the last one and in the first half at Kettering our last touch wasn't good enough. I said to the players at half-time that we needed to be a bit more positive and I think our performance did improve in the second half. We scored a good goal and its always nice to see something that you've worked on in training come off in a game."

It might only seem like five minutes ago that the 2006-07 ground to a halt at Doncaster Rovers but the reality of it is that it was three months ago.

Yes, believe it or not, a quarter of a year has passed since the curtains were drawn on what was a largely satisfactory return to the third tier of English football.

Objective number one was achieved – the club remained in Coco-Cola League One without too many scares, something that is the primary target for just about every club that ever gets promoted.

So what's the mission this year? What will Stuart Gray have handed out as the briefing to the players in the Sixfields dressing room?

Given the strength of the division, the glass half empty section of the support will feel that anything above and beyond what the side did last year will represent a giant achievement.

Certainly when you look at the spending power of teams like Nottingham Forest – who shelled out £1m for two players in the summer – and the ability of clubs like Leeds United to draw talent, it looks like a tough league.

Many don't expect Leeds to do anything this season, but I wouldn't mind betting they somehow manage to extract themselves from the dire straits in which they currently sail and soon start snapping up out-of-contract talent like it's going out of style.

The lure of playing at one of the true European football citadels will be a massive lure for professionals across the globe.

But what is Leeds' strength may also be their undoing – to coin a cliché so well-worn it is tattered, playing at Elland Road will be every team's cup final. Away from the division's 'big two', teams like Doncaster and Swansea have been throwing the cash about, although at the same time there has been something of a talent drain in league one.

It will certainly be a poorer place for the loss of people like Wes Houlahan and (as much as I hate to admit it) Billy Sharp, but the man whose absence is likely to be felt the most is Lee Trundle. Whenever the number 10 plays, controversy and conversation is never for away, whether it be about his silver boots, his weight, his latest hairstyle or his undoubted talent. Trundle will be sorely missed, and to think it could all have been so different had the Cobblers taken the option to buy him three years ago.

Fred Murray may or may not have signed for Leyton Orient by the time you read this, a transfer that should it go ahead will elicit a mixed response from this dark corner of the Sixfields press box.

Fred has probably been one of the most unfortunate players in the history of the club with his Achilles problems, and I'm sure many of you reading this will have written off the Irishman's chances of ever playing again.

That is not something Fred ever contemplated, and for that he deserves enormous praise. He is a model professional whose commitment to his chosen sport is unquestionable – if anyone deserves to stay in the game, it is Murray.

The only tinge of disappointment to this summer's revelations is that he now looks like resuming his career in a shirt that is not claret and white.

Finally, a quick note to say 'good luck' to all the amateur players across the town who are busy flogging themselves on park pitches in preparation of another season of Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning joy.

My own club Real Roochers are already firmly in the swing of things and if ever you're at a loose end on a Sunday morning feel free to come along to pitch seven of the Racecourse to check us out.

CLIFF HOLTON

Club Historian Frank Grande profiles some of the most popular players ever to wear the claret and white. This list has been chosen by Cobblers supporters.

Northampton Town had just been promoted to Division Three but just could not score goals.

Cliff Holton, a prolific scorer at Watford, was in dispute with his club because of his limited training sessions due to business commitments.

The Cobblers manager Dave Bowen and Holton were old team-mates at Arsenal so a transfer of Holton to Northampton Town seemed an obvious solution.

Not to the Watford fans or press though! Cliff had attained hero status by scoring 42 goals for them during the 1959-60 season. Once the press heard rumours of a move they camped outside the club and his business premises.

He escaped through a window and met up with Dave Bowen, agreeing terms. That evening the Cobblers coach picked their new player up as they made their way to Crystal Palace and he repaid them with a hat-trick. He became the first Cobbler to score three goals on his debut since Ted Bowen in 1928.

He also set another record at the time by being the top scorer for two different league clubs (Northampton and Watford), a record he shares with Wally Ardon (Nottingham Forest and Rotherham) and Jimmy Greaves (Chelsea and Tottenham).

Cliff had one of the most ferocious shots in football and admitted that he was lucky at Northampton to have players like Barry Lines who set so many of his goals up with pin point crosses.

Cliff had started life as a full back with Oxford City. Arsenal signed him and converted him to the position of striker. It was four years before he won a first team place but from then he never looked back.

He won a League Championship, an F.A.Cup runners up medal and represented London in the Inter Cities Fairs Cup match v Barcelona.

In all he made 216 appearances for Arsenal, netting 88 goals in all competitions. He also made 418 appearances for the reserve side netting 229 goals, all in an eleven year NORTHAMPTON TOWN CAREER

His goals assisted Palace to promotion in 1964 but injury caught up with him and as he moved around other London clubs his games became less and less until he retired in 1968.

In later years he became a corporate host at Watford after selling his businesses and liked nothing more than playing golf.

It was while playing his favourite pastime in Spain that he suffered a heart attack and died.

MOVING FORWARD TO THE NEXT LEVEL

Executive Director Tony Clarke writes;

In December of last year in the Millwall programme, I outlined our goals for the second half of the 2006/07 season. I am glad to say that we achieved all that we set out to achieve. Most importantly of course was to protect our League One status and I would like to pay tribute to the hard wark of Stuart Gray, Sammo and Jim Barron and of course the squad for turning our season around and giving us something to cheer about and to look forward to for the coming season.

But I also outlined in those programme notes the need for the club to continue to make progress off the field and to continue to close the gap between our income and expenditure as a business. Unseen by matchday visitors, our staff have undergone a tremendous amount of change over the last few months. We have had to say goodbye to some staff who have given years of loyal service to the club. For some of our staff their roles have changed, I myself have reduce my input from 5 days to 3 days per week. The changes were tough but necessary and I hope you can appreciate why they were made and work with and support our staff as they adapt to their new roles. We have also had to look very carefully at our pricing structure and at how we can raise additional income. I appreciate that no one likes to pay more for anything, but I firmly believe that everything we have done is in the best interests of the club. And it is now paying dividends.

Over the last 3 years we have reduced our annual losses season by season and we are now just under £1.5m a year better off than we were then. We still, as a company, lose money, but we continue to move in the right direction. We are now much more in control of our own destiny and we are now able to plan ahead to the day we can move the club even further forward. But as we have often said, we cannot make

the next big leap forward without addressing the need to both expand Sixfields and to improve the facilities that we have to offer to football fans and the wider community.

For this reason the Chairman and myself have been busy working with the new administration on Northampton Borough Council to find a way forward. As a councillor I accept that I have an interest in that progress both as an employee of the club and as an elected representative in the town. We can and we will find a way forward. We have entered into negotiations in the spirit of trying to accept the difficulties on all sides and by recognising that the club has its part to play in finding solutions to the planning problems that have beset the project to date. I hope very much that by the time I write my new year column in the programme that I will be reporting some real progress on our development ambitions. I believe that now, as the Football Club and as a business, that we have a team on the pitch and off that is fit for purpose and able to succeed at this level.

But who wants to stay at this level? Everything we do, every decision we





make, every effort made is to drive us forward even higher. We can in time, make Northampton Town Football Club a fit for purpose Championship club. We'll start with the favourites. Nottingham Forest are obvious choices but once again will be the team everyone wants to beat. Neil Lennon, Matt Lockwood and Kelvin Wilson will give them added bite but the pressure once more will be on Colin Calderwood who must be able to handle it. I think he will. They are top six certainties for me and I think after Play Off disappointment last time they will go up automatically.

Not as champions though, because I really like the look of Doncaster. Striker James Hayter has arrived from Bournemouth and will team up with the talented Paul Heffernan in attack which makes them strong. They have probably made the signing of the summer in League One by taking midfielder Richie Wellens from Oldham. Experienced goalkeeper Neil Sullivan has also been added to a strong looking squad which includes players of the calibre of Brian Stock and James Coppinger.

Luton will be there or thereabouts. The Hatters have signed Championship players in the form of Darren Currie, Paul Furlong, Paul Peschisolido, Don Hutchison and Chris Perry. Kevin Blackwell has a good reputation but they may lack cover in defence with Leon Barnett gone. Top six though.

Oldham did well last season and have also added experience. Chris Taylor is a winger who will get better and better and defender John Thompson from Forest is a decent signing.

Millwall are considered good bets after their end to the season but aren't my choice.



A real outside bet for me is Leyton Orient. They have signed some interesting types including Brentford's Stuart Nelson, Yeavil's Paul Terry, Doncaster's Sean Thornton and Luton's Adam Boyd. They'll miss Alexander's goals and Lockwood but Martin Ling has made some shrewd signings.

Carlisle could struggle without the goals from Karl Hawley but they seem a fairly stable club and seem a midtable side. As do Crewe who will struggle without Luke Varney, last season's best striker in League One. They will now rely on Nicky Maynard to score them goals. Gillingham and Yeovil seem to have had the most player upheaval and are hard to call.

Of the others it will be nice to see striker Rickie Lambert again (one of my favourite strikers at this level) with Bristol Rovers, Other notable summer signings include Jo Kuffour at Bournemouth and Nicky Forster to Brighton.

I see Cheltenham, Bournemouth, Bristol Rovers, Walsall and Port Vale strugaling this season. And Leeds's 15 point deduction will hit them hard. Before the



deduction, pundits felt they had a chance of winning the title. I wasn't so sure about that. They have lost most of their best players and starting on minus 15 I think they will really struggle to get away from the danger zone.

So what about Northampton Town? I reckon we can hope for a midtable finish with a hope of getting involved in the Play-Offs. Poul Hubertz (pictured) is an interesting acquisition and the loan signing of Daniel Jones helps. On paper, the Cobblers have a strong looking side but you wouldn't want them picking up too many injuries through the term.


COBBLERS WORK WITH NORTHAMPTONSHIRE ASSOCIATION OF YOUTH CLUBS



The pre-match build up suggested that this was to be an end of season game played out between two mid tables sides who had nothing to play for.

This could well have been the case but for an incident after just seven minutes that changed the game.

Mark Heeley of the Cobblers and Swindon defender Mike Graham both went up for the same ball. Jim Allan, the Swindon keeper, thought he could get in-between the two players to collect the ball but his error of judgement ended up with him injured in the penalty area as he was crushed between the two men while Steve Massey poked the ball into an empty net to give Northampton an early lead.

Prolonged treatment to Allan ended with him being supported off the field and taken straight to hospital. He was to spend the night there as specialist in the morning diagnosed bruised ribs.

Striker Andy Rowlands went in goal and Jimmy Quinn came as substitute to take his skipper's position up front. Rowlands was unlucky when he tried to save a 25 yard shot from Dave Syrett. He tried to catch the ball in his arms but it bounced off his chest and into the path of Northampton midfielder Peter Denyer who set Massey up for his second goal.

Before half time Jimmy Quinn gave the Robins hope as he brought the score back to 2-1, but during a seven minute second half spell the Cobblers put the game out of reach.

Syrett started the goal glut when he headed a Paul Saunders corner into the net after 68 minutes.

Two minutes later Billy Jeffrey wrong footed Leigh Barnard for number four. Five minutes after that defender Paul Batty allowed a Steve Massey shot to go through his legs. He agonisingly watched as the ball hit the post and rolled into the net.

It was Northampton's first win at the County Ground, Swindon against the Robins for 19 years. It was also the first time Northampton had scored five goals away from home since beating Romford 5-1 in the F.A. Cup in November 1960!







Both sides continued to make changes. before a moment of pre-season drama on 71 minutes. Keeper




STUART GRAY SAID:







10 YEARS AGO

The Cobblers went down 0-2 at home to Bournemouth with two well-taken goals from Jamie Vincent and Steve Fletcher, both goals coming in a six-minute spell. It was hard luck on a Cobblers side that saw David Brightwell, Carl Heggs, Ray Van Dullemen and David Seal make their debuts. Andy Woodman played his 100th league game for the club. Swindon beat Crewe 2-0. The scorers were Wayne Allison, later the subject of a £800,000 move to Huddersfield, and Steve Finney. Finney's goal came from the penalty spot.





The Cobblers started the season with a thrilling 3-2 victory over Gillingham at the Priestfield Stadium. Lawrie Osborne opened the scoring for the home side, with Steve Brown scoring the Cobblers equaliser on 22 minutes. Debutant Morrys Scott then netted just prior to half time to put the Cobblers ahead. Mark O'Connor brought the score back to 2-2 but player manager Phil Chard netted the winner in the dying moments, having come on as substitute ten minutes earlier. Five of the Cobblers side were youth or ex youth team players. Swindon's player manager Glenn Hoddle gave Swindon the best of starts, scoring the only goal in the win against Sunderland. Future Cobblers manager Colin Calderwood was in the Swindon team, while another future boss, John Gorman, was the Robins coach.

MANAGING TO SUCCEED

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles six leading Swindon Town managers



SAM ALLEN

Sam Allen gave Swindon Town outstanding service in various capacities. Previously a clerk in the GWR offices, he spent seven years as a Swindon director before becoming their secretary-manager in July 1902. He made several shrewd signings and guided Swindon to the Southern League championship in 1910-11 and 1913-14, also twice leading them to the FA Cup semi-finals. Taking Swindon into the Football League in 1920, he plotted further FA Cup runs and remained in charge of team affairs until becoming secretary only on the arrival of Ted Vizard in April 1933. He held that post until his death on New Year's Day 1946.

BERT HEAD

Bert Head plotted Swindon Town's 1962-63 promotion success. Signing professional for Torquay United in October 1936, the defender moved to Bury in February 1952 and was assistant-boss before becoming Swindon's manager in October 1955. He produced several fine players including Mike Summerbee, Ernie Hunt, Don Rogers and Rod Thomas before returning to Bury as manager in August 1965. Appointed Crystal Palace's boss in April 1966, he guided them to the top-flight for the first time in 1968-69 and had a spell as general manager. He was later manager and director at Bath City and died in February 2002.

DANNY WILLIAMS

Danny Williams guided Swindon Town to a promotion and League Cup 'double' in 1968-69. A former wing-half, he turned professional with hometown Rotherham in October 1942 and starred in their 1950-51 Third Division (North) title triumph. He made a club record 459 League appearances for the Millers before becoming trainercoach in July 1960, then was manager prior to taking charge of Swindon in August 1965. Leaving the County Ground in July 1969 to manage Sheffield Wednesday, he then managed Mansfield Town before rejoining Swindon as boss from March 1974 until May 1978. He now lives in Bournemouth.

LOU MACARI

Former Scotland international midfielder Lou Macari managed Swindon Town to the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He won all three major Scottish honours with Celtic before moving to Manchester United in January 1973, featuring in three FA Cup finals including their 1977 triumph. Joining Swindon as playerboss in July 1984, he also guided them to promotion in 1986-87 and Second Division play-offs in 1988-89. He left in July 1989 to manage West Ham and briefly Birmingham before leading Stoke City to the Second Division title in 1992-93. Rejoining Celtic as boss, he later managed Stoke again and Huddersfield Town.




GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle plotted Swindon Town's 1992-93 First Division playoff final triumph. Signing professional for Spurs in April 1975, he starred in their 1981 and 1982 FA Cup final successes and was a finalist again shortly before joining Monaco in June 1987. He helped win the French League title in 1987-88 and was appointed Swindon's player-boss in April 1991, scoring once in 64 League games while at the County Ground. Moving to Chelsea in a similar capacity in June 1993, he guided them to the 1994 FA Cup final and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.

STEVE McMAHON

Former England international midfielder Steve McMahon managed Swindon Town to the Second Division title in 1995-96. Initially with Everton, he joined Aston Villa in May 1983 and moved to Liverpool in September 1985. He starred as they won the League Championship three times and FA Cup in 1989, then reunited with Peter Reid at Manchester City. Appointed Swindon's player-boss in November 1994, he made 42 League appearances and remained in charge until September 1999. He managed Blackpool to promotion in 2000-01 as well as two LDV Vans Trophy final triumphs, since coaching Australian side Perth Glory.



Life as a sportswriter takes many twists and turns and only last week I completed an interview I never dreamed of having. I have chatted to Muhammad Ali, quizzed John McEnroe and discussed sport on air with Michael Parkinson – but I never reckoned to be given an audience by a dragon. And on top of that a dragon who does not speak – and, just for the record, does not breath fire.

Getting to meet Cobblers' mascot
Clarence the Dragon took some
negotiating. I tried phone calls, e-mails
and messages and finally the word
came back. "Be in the Carlsberg Cafe
at 1.15pm and you will be contacted."
I waited, and waited and finally came a
tap on the shoulder. A moment or two
more and I was ushered into the
presence of a remarkable character
with a fascinating tale to tell.

Just how we communicated I have sworn not to reveal but suffice to say an interpreter was found and all became clear. First I wanted to know just how Clarence has become such an important part of life at Sixfields, and an incredible story unfolded.

"When the excavation work was in full swing to create the stadium," passed on Clarence's aide, "A large egg was uncovered deep in the ground. Everyone was puzzled but finally Barry Stonhill, at that time the club chairman, decided to take it home. He kept it safe, but nothing happened. So it was taken to the Tesco bakery at Weston Favell to be hatched. Eventually the shell began to crack and out I came.

"Of course I was very tiny and had to be nursed carefully in my special den at the ground. But Dragons grow fast and while that was happening a remarkable thing happened. The club ran a competition asking children to draw what they saw as a mascot for the club and would you believe it one little girl handed in a picture that was just like me. It had to be the winner and was chosen from that competition in the Chronicle & Echo and Clarence's eventful career had begun.

"All of that was nearly ten years ago and I remember making my first appearance for a game against Arsenal in the old reserve division. I was very nervous but it was just a trial run and I made my League debut at a match with Wrexham. It was wonderful the way the children reacted to me from the start with no signs of fear, and

that is how it has been ever since."

Naturally I wanted to hear about Clarence's favourite adventures, his meetings with mascots from other clubs – some of whom have acquired bad reputations – and his appearances away from Sixfields.

He was happy to tell me how he appeared on television on the Ant & Dec Show and met Robbie Williams, how he saw the Queen at Pride Park, Derby County's new ground, and entertained at England Under-21 internationals, again at Pride Park. He is proud to recall the days he spent filming at the old Wembley Stadium for a special feature when insurance company Axa were sponsoring the FA Cup.

So what about his fellow-mascots? Has he clashed with Cyril the Swan from Swansea or Millwall's Lennie the Lion? Clarence has no big dramas to reveal but many memories.

"I have met Cyril several times particularly for the Mascot Grand National at Huntingdon Racecourse and he has been fine. I think we all get on pretty well really and the only problems I can remember have been with Peter Bunny from Peterborough. He can be a bit full of himself and step outside the Mascot Code of Conduct. And yes, there really is a Code of conduct and there is a special Mascot Book where you will find all of us.

"I reckon the most famous of us has to be H'Angus the Monkey from Hartlepool because he has made national headlines. He was actually voted in as Mayor of Hartlepool on a platform of 'Bananas for All'. It sounds a joke but I believe it led to a change in the system for local government elections.

"At times I think things can be taken too seriously – like times when mascots have been encouraged to fight each other – mock fights some of which got serious - but that is something I would not do. Here at Northampton the idea is to have fun and show the children how to act in a sporting way, win lose or draw.

"I think it works because Clarence has been popular, so much so that at one stage Clarence products were the biggest seller in the club shop. I have many wonderful memories of life at Sixfields – like gaining promotion, and



all the parties we have, especially around Christmas. What I like best is seeing the children up to 16 years old enjoying themselves.

"I often think that schools these days tend to take the competitive edge out of life while here we learn to demonstrate how to compete, take whatever comes and keep smiling.

"Of course some things stand out, like my wedding day when Bernie, the Saints' mascot was my best man, or the time I got arrested. I went to open a fete at Duston and was squirting water – some of it all over the village policeman. It was an accident, of course, but he put me in the back of the police van for a bit.

"I love all those extra things, such as going to schools and interacting with the children or opening fetes but it is always good to come home to Sixfields. People often ask how I came to be here and I do have an answer.

"My egg was laid in the days when there were bold, bad knights and dragons roamed the land. If I was born then I would probably have lived in Northampton Castle just down the road, but that is not there any more and those days are long gone.

"So, my egg was buried at Sixfields which is now my castle and when I'm not in going about keeping people happy I sleep in the custody cells the police have under the West Stand, with the door unlocked of course. I see my main task as protecting all the children and making sure that everyone has as much fun as possible. So, when you see me today just give me a smile and a wave – and enjoy your day!"

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENTS

Important announcements will be notified

to spectators via the public address system. Listen carefully to the announcement and be ready to respond to any instructions in a calm and controlled manner. Stewards and/or Police Officers will assist by directing spectators to the nearest exit where necessary. Please remain calm and keep gangways and exits clear.

PERSISTENT STANDING IN SEATED AREAS

Persistent standing in seated areas is dangerous, selfish and illegal.

DANGEROUS: All seated stadia have viewing areas that are purpose built for seated accommodation. The fact that they are designed for seating renders them unsafe for standing as the angle of the step is far steeper than that for standing accommodation.

SELFISH: Persistent standing in seated areas means that some supporters who may have purchased a ticket for a certain seat cannot see the game. Children, families, the elderly or any supporter who cannot stand for long periods is forced to stand or look at the back of a standing supporter in front. This behaviour is at best inconsiderate and at worst, selfish, and is no different to smoking in a non-smoking area.

ILLEGAL: Sixfields Stadium is allowed to operate through a number of safety certificates, all of which require the club to offer seated accommodation and to actively prohibit persistent standing in seated areas throughout the game. If this is breached, the authorities have the power to shut down part or all of Sixfields. Those who persistently stand in seated areas run the risk of robbing both themselves and all other supporters the chance to watch the Cobblers, and harming the club's financial position. The club understands that it is wholly unrealistic to expect supporters to remain seated at all times such as goals, key moments etc, but at all other times supporters should remain seated. NO SMOKING POLICY

In order for Northampton Town Football Club to comply with the Health Act 2006, the Board of Directors have made a policy decision which states that the Sixfields Stadium is a No Smoking Environment. This includes all rooms, the concourse, bars and the Stands. We would ask that all supporters, employees and visitors to the site comply with this policy. 



IN THE NEWS

Millwall boss Willie Donachie has been busy in the transfer market over the summer so far bringing in a quintet of new signings.

The Lions have spent £150,000 on Derby's Ryan Smith with the winger signing a two-year contract at the New Den.

The 20-year-old moved to Pride Park last summer, joining the Rams for an undisclosed fee from Arsenal - where he had failed to make a league appearance. He only started five league games for Derby last season, and had a six-game loan spell at Millwall in the spring.

Millwall have also signed left-back Andy Frampton from relegated Brentford for an undisclosed fee.

Frampton was one of the longest-serving players at Griffin Park, having arrived from Crystal Palace in October 2002, and made 164 appearances for the club.

Scott Barron has also moved to Millwall following his release by Ipswich Town. Barron, 21, who can play on the left side of defence or midfield, is a graduate of the academy at Portman Road and made 17 appearances for the Tractor Boys.

Earlier on in the summer Donachie made a double swoop to sign striker Gary Alexander and midfielder Danny Spiller.

Alexander, 27, opted to leave Leyton Orient at the end of his contract while, 26-year-old Spiller - who had been linked with a move to Charlton - rejected the offer of a new contract at Gillingham.

On the down side Millwall have lost Tony Craig, 22, to Championship side Crystal Palace.

Left-back Craig, a Lions youth team product who made his debut at the age of 16, has joined the Eagles for an undisclosed fee.

David Amoo has meanwhile left the Millwall academy to join Liverpool for an undisclosed fee.

Amoo, 16, was a prolific scorer for the South-East London club's youth team and his signature was highly sought after. The forward was close to a first team call up at Millwall with the youngster considered as one of the best prospects at the Lions academy.

* After being released by Millwall at the end of last season, left-back Jack Obersteller has signed a one-year deal with League Two side Wycombe Wanderers.


