Good Evening and welcome to this Carling Cup First Round tie against Charlton Athletic.

The Carling Cup has the potential to be a money-spinner for the club and we all know there is an opportunity here. League points are the important thing but the Carling Cup could be a nice distraction for us and if we do well in a few rounds, then who knows where we could end up.

On Saturday we opened our own league season with a point at Northampton Town. Away from home, a point is what you look for on the opening day of the season. There were chances at both ends and overall I was happy enough with the performance that we put in.

We started the game very well in my opinion and we got crosses into the box early. The first real Northampton attack resulted in a goal and in all fairness it was a great finish from Andy Kirk. We got ourselves back into the game with the penalty and came out of the first half all-square. The ball seemed to bounce quite low and perhaps that caught their defender unawares. It bounced up to his arm and it was a penalty and Christian tucked it away nicely. In the second half we came out and hit the post although Northampton hit the bar too, so there were chances at both ends. There is a lot of work still to do on the training ground and we need to get more crosses into the box and make sure that we keep up the work-rate.

Anybody who watched the game at Northampton will have noted that there are areas to our game that we need to strengthen and I would like to do that sooner rather than later. We need to add competition to the squad and we suffered a few injuries on Saturday at Sixfields.

Tonight we take on a Charlton side who opened the Championship season with a home draw against Scunthorpe United. They have had a fantastic pre-season and this could be a baptism of fire for us. Alan Pardew still has plenty of Premiership

players at his disposal but from our point of view, we will have a go. Madjid Bougherra is a player who I signed during my time at Sheffield Wednesday and I am sure he is looking forward to the game.

I will be making changes for tonight and Peter Brezovan will start in goal. I decided before the Northampton game that the two keepers would get a game each in the opening two games of the season, which will give me a chance to see them both in battle conditions before we take on Luton Town this weekend. Craig Easton will also start and there maybe changes up front too because again, we need to see people in action as early as possible. Lee Peacock hasn't done much training so I have a decision to make there too. Do I keep him for Saturday or give him another game to get him sharper ahead of the weekend? Decisions, decisions.





Good evening and I would like to take this opportunity to welcome the Players, Officials and Supporters from our visitors Charlton Athletic for tonight's Carling Cup First Round tie.

This kit has been commissioned to deal with potential colour clashes in League One such as the one we would encounter with our Whaddon Road neighbours. We will be making a limited number of replica kits available before the end of November 2007. We hope you like them.



an instant hit



ADAMS OUT TO IMPRESS


Having put pen to paper on a permanent six-month deal at The County Ground, midfielder Steve Adams is looking forward to a regular run of games over the coming weeks.

Swindon Town's Football in the Community Week Two Summer Course closed with two first team players taking time out to hand over the medals to the children.





He may not have been able to retrieve what looked to be an impossible situation and keep the Addicks in the top-flight last season, but few would argue that under Alan Pardew, Charlton looked a different team.

Few could have imagined in May 2006, when ex-Valley boss Alan Curbishley was departing SE7, that within seven months he would be at Upton Park and that then West Ham United manager Pardew would have moved to Chariton.

And with a promotion from the Championship already on his CV, via the play-offs in 2005, Pardew has all the credentials to return Charlton to Premiership at the first time of asking.

Replaced by Curbishley at Upton Park, it was actually the same man, alongside Steve Gritt, who signed midfielder Pardew as a player for the Addicks on a free transfer in November 1991.

Formerly of Crystal Palace - - he started his career in non-League football with Whyteleafe, Epsom & Euell, Corinthian Casuals, Dulwich Hamlet and Yeovil Town, combining playing with work as a glazier. A member of the England semi-professional squad, Pardew moved to Selhurst Park when Palace paid Yeovil \$\sigma_7,500\$ for the 25-year-old and the defensive midfielder went on to amass more than 150 games for the Eagles.

Encouraged to get further forward at The Valley, Pardew finished top scorer with 10 goals in 1992/93 and he bettered that tally by one the following season, ending his Charlton career in July 1995 with 27 goals and 124 games under his belt.

A brief loan spell with Tottenham Hotspur preceded a two-year stint with Barnet, but his first official appointment as a coach came at Reading in June 1997 under former Charlton player, Terry Bullivant, and he would be caretaker-manager for the Royals for one game in March 1998 after Bullivant's resignation.

When Tommy Burns took over Pardew moved to old club Hamlet in September 1999, but he was back in caretaker charge of Reading when Burns was sacked the same month and soon given the job permanently.

With Reading he reached the Second Division play-off final in 2001, only for an extra-time defeat to Walsall, but automatic promotion followed 12 months later and the Royals then reached the play-offs again in the club's first season in the First Division.

West Ham came calling in September 2003, and he took the Hammers to the First Division play-off final in his first season only to be defeated by lain Dowie's Crystal Palace - a loss avenged in May 2005 when Preston North End were beaten in the playoff final to ensure



Born: March 2nd, 1979, in Sheffield. Signed a three-year contract at The Valley in the summer. Now 28, Weaver started his career with Mansfield Town, but moved to Manchester City in 1998. After 173 league starts for City he joins Charlton with the task of helping the Addicks win promotion back to the Premiership.

yassin moutaouakil

Born: July 18th, 1986, in Nice, France. The Addicks paid Chateauroux 600,000 Euros (around £400,000) in mid-June to bring him to The Valley and the early indications is that it could prove a shrewd piece of business. The youngster arrives as a replacement for Luke Young, who departed for Middlesbrough.

JOSE SEMEDO

Born: January 11th, 1985, in Setubal, Portugal. A Portuguese central defender who arrived at The Valley in June, adding to the young multinational stock within the club following the signing of fellow defender, Frenchman Yassin Moutaouakil and Danish winger Martin Christensen. Previous clubs include Cagliari and Sporting Clube de Portugal, Casa Pia and CD Feirense.

PATRICK McCARTHY

Born: May 31st, 1983, in Dublin, Ireland. Alan Pardew's second capture of the summer after joining from Championship rivals Leicester City. Pardew splashed out £650,000 to lure the defender from the Walkers Stadium in early June, continuing a progressive theme of recruiting hungry young players. Has also spent time on loan at Notts County and Boston Utd.

DARREN AMBROSE

Born: February 29th, 1984, in Harlow. A versatile midfielder with a wealth of natural ability Ambrose will be striving to make a significant impact in his third season at The Valley. For the day job lan Robertson is the BBC Rugby Correspondent covering both Radio and TV in the evening he is a very amusing, entertaining and highly articulate after-dinner speaker. His rugby career ended with a bad knee injury at the age of 25 but by that time he had won "Blues" at both Aberdeen University and Cambridge University, had played for London Scottish and the Barbarians and had won 8 international caps for Scotland, he was vice-captain of Scotland, he was vice-captain of Scotland. His joined the BBC as a rugby commentation in 1972 and has covered almost all major matches all over the world for the past 20 years. A profife writer he is author or co-author of over 20 books inchaling several best sellers.

Phil Bennett's wizardry entertained crowds throughout the seventies. His mercurial skills included a devastating sidesting and swerve. His unique hunched running style proved deceptive and the had an uncanny ability to unlook detences with his twinkling feet. He made his Welsh debut in 1969 against France gaining caps as a fullback and centre, and in 1972 finally settled into the try half berth. His form earned him a place on the British Lons tour of South Africa in 1974, where he would reach now heights as the star of the tour, scoring 103 points. His 50 yard try in the 28-9 second test victory in Pretone, ranks as one of the supremy examples of individual brilliance on a rugbly pitch. He retired from international rugby in 1978.





Every now and again a club signs a player that really excites. These are the players that make you sit on the edge of your seat, that make the cost of the ticket worthwhile. A player that every time he gets the ball, you think something exciting could happen, your feet shuffle in anticipation – for a split moment the dourness of the game is illuminated by the prospect of a flash of genius. Think Lee Holmes, Jimmy Davis and James Milner in recent years, Danny Invincibile before them.

Think back to the late 1990's and you'll find that Town were surprisingly blessed with a large number of such players. Surprising, because we languished in the nether regions of the Championship under Steve McMahon, and later Jimmy Quinn. Yet Town enjoyed substantial attacking options that Paul Sturrock would love to have at his disposal right now, Mark Walters, Philippe Cuervo (more on him in these pages later this season - watch this space) and 'Super Ty' Gooden, these were players that could and would often take players on with a combination of pace, trickery and guile. And then there was George Ndah... Signed from Crystal Palace this was a signing of real substance, a player of the highest calibre. You know when you spend half a million quid you're getting a player with the potential to lift your club out of the doldrums - and in 1997 Town were still a club with a bit of money to


spend and intent on returning to the top flight following promotion from what is now League One.

Ndah was reluctant to leave Palace. Having been given his opportunity in league football having been plucked from Dulwich Hamlet, and being a London boy, a move West was more enforced. Loan spells at Bournemouth and Gillingham had accompanied 101 performances for the Eagles – but by the time he joined Town in 1997 the Robins faithful were well aware about what he had to offer.

"I felt quite sad leaving Crystal Palace," admits George, who's more than happy to remember what he describes as some of the best times of his career. "I remember not really wanting to leave because the club had given me my breakthrough – I was grateful for that and I wanted to repay that with some success. Yet like Swindon they were struggling for money at the time, and so I was sold on."

He was an instant crowd favourite. Strong, with a towering presence and the agility of a cheetah – he had everything needed to be a successful winger or attacking player behind the front two (they call it the fantasista in Italy). This Eagle landed at The County Ground in November in the 1996/97 season and made an immediate impact, scoring in a 2-1 win at home to Middlesbrough.

"Steve McMahon gave me a good chance at Swindon and for that I will always be grateful. Regular football at a high level for the first time, I always wanted to repay the amount of money he paid for me but I felt I never did injuries were always in the way and to be honest the team we had - we didn't achieve what we should have done. Look at Ty, Philippe and so on - we had an excellent side and I never felt we justified ourselves, to either manager [McMahon or Quinnl."

"It was a good move for me in the end, though. I got off to a flying start against Middlesbrough and never really looked back," he remembers. "That was one of my best memories, but my favourite goal was one I scored for Wolves against Newcastle in the cup. To play the top sides and make an impact, it was good, you know?" The move to Wolves was greeted with derision by many Town fans - it came following two years of Ndah's services and was made to help balance the books. Like Duncan Shearer before him it was a move to a competitor that was greeted with derision. Still, Townies wished Ndah all the best, he had offered us an entertaining brand of football and he would continue it at Molineaux, helping the Midlanders back into the top flight. A crowd favourite from the start, no one begrudged him the opportunity to move on.

"Wolves was a good time for me, despite the injuries," he continues. "We played some good football – we had some good players and being a part of that promotion [in 2003] was amazing. For the fans up there it was such a big thing – to go up to the Premiership was always the aim and for us as players to achieve that over a season was fantastic."

Sadly injuries took their toll and at just 26 George had to retire. Injuries had been his Achilles heel – in 1999 he had to turn down an international call up from Nigaria.

Yet far from be despondent at what might have been, and many Town fans felt he deserved a longer run in the top flight, he remains grateful for what

I feel very fortunate, and football has even given me the career I'm in now – I've been lucky to be in this game for five minutes and already I look after some Championship and Premiership players. I would never be in this situation that if I wasn't in football."

These days George remains in the game in the sports management business – and a few of his former teammates aren't too far away...

"Phillipe [Cuervo] is an agent in France – I do some work through him now and I speak to him. His English is still limited


- but as a cockney I speak quickly for him, which suits him! Frank Talia as well, I still speak to him and Iffy at Gillingham - we're all still tied together. You make close bonds in football and they don't break. I was particularly close to Iffy and I'm still close friends with him now. I always thought he'd become a manager - he was very intelligent and knew the game. I was never that way inclined, to go into coaching - I always said that when I was done playing that was it - but what I do now, I love it; it keeps me involved with the game.

"What I do now is I run my own Sports management company - I'm now looking after a lot of the boys, their contracts and their finances. It means I'm still involved indirectly with football, so I'm very happy with what I'm doing. "When I was retiring a friend of mine, a financial advisor who used to claim the boys' tax back, he asked me to help his company meet more footballers. I got on well with him and he just wanted a bit of help. That wasn't really me, but as the year went on more and more players were asking me for advice about their contracts - friends of mine, and the young lads at Wolves in particular - and I thought 'well, I might as well do this'. Another friend approached me about helping his firm manager more players, and he gave me a stake in

the company. I took him up on his offer - and I now look after contracts. finances - I even look into some marketing for the lads. We've got a job lot of players and to me it's not work. I speak to the boys day to day - there

are a lot of people looking to exploit footballers and I keep my boys away from all of that."





A fans favourite, 'Wally' joined Swindon Town in July 1996 and went on to play 126 games for the club, scoring 28 goals along the way.

After retiring from the game in 2002, he joined Coventry Preparatory School as a Saturday morning football coach for the 4-11 year-olds in February 2003; before becoming a member of staff in January 2006. He is also Head Coach of the Under 14s at Aston Villa's academy and also heavily involved with groups aiming to eliminate racism in football.

He still plays in the Sky Sports masters football competitions for Rangers where his dazzling displays are one of the highlights of the tournament. He is also one of three honorary members of the Rangers Supporters Trust.

He departed for Wolverhampton Wanderers in October 1999 and is featured in tonight's edition of STFC Magazine.



Luton Town are the visitors to SN1 this weekend for what is the first home league game of the new 2007/08 Cola-Cola League One season.

Relegated from the Coca-Cola Championship last term, Kevin Blackwell is the man who will be leading the Hatters' promotion charge this time around. Blackwell has made a number of astute signings during the summer months with a plethora of experienced players arriving at Kenilworth Road.

At the back, Chris Perry spent last season at Championship Play-Off finalists West Bromich Albion and the defender signed a 2-year contract with The Hatters during the summer. After starting out with Wimbledon in the 1993-94 season – the same campaign as Town enjoyed a one-year stay in the Premiership – Perry then had stints with Spurs and Charlton Athletic.

Don Hutchinson (pictured right) was released by Coventry City at the end of the last campaign and he too will add vital experience to the ranks. Used mainly off the bench last term (he made 3 league starts and 11 appearances from the bench) the former Scotland midfielder began his career at Liverpool before spells with West Ham United, Sheffield United and Everton.

Strikers Paul Peschisolido and Paul Furlong arrived in the summer and are perhaps the clearest indication that Luton mean business this term. With a combined haul of 277 strikes from 689 league starts the much-travelled duo will be charged with firing The Hatters to League One success.

Former Swindon Town pair Sol Davis and Sam Parkin will also hope to feature against their old employers this Saturday. Parkin has battled back from injury to force his way into the first team reckoning, although Davis may not feature after being placed on the transfer list.

Luton opened their own League One season against Hartlepool United on Saturday and registered a 2-1 victory. Goals from Darren Currie and Alan Goodhall secured the points to hand Blackwell's men an opening day win. Sam Parkin came off the bench as a 68th minute substitute, replacing Paul Furlong, perhaps the clearest indication that 'Super Sam' could make a return to The County Ground this weekend.
