The Johnstone's Paint Trophy provides us with a real opportunity to make progress in a cup competition and it is something we will be taking seriously.

We made three new signings on Friday and this evening will give us a chance to see them in a Town shirt for the first time. Tonight's cup game could also distract us from our league form, so I will be thinking carefully about team selection although I hope to start the three new boys.

As a manager I don't put teams out to lose so we will want to win tonight's game and go as far as we can in this competition. There are lucrative financial returns for getting to the latter stages and we will be making a real effort. We still have the FA Cup to come and that will be another opportunity for us to pull a big team.

In terms of team play – coupled with the new signings – we still need players to understand our system. At the moment we have twelve or thirteen players who have been used on a regular basis but we need to increase that number so we have more players who are familiar – and confident – in the way we are trying to play the game so when we do have any injuries or suspensions then they are comfortable.

There were a lot of positives to take from Saturday's game. Our unbeaten record is still intact and it was great to see a midfielder on the scoresheet again. 'Pooky' worked hard and his goal came from a training ground move. We had been working on him coming around at the back post and he was in the right place and produced a decent finish. Michael's progression as a footballer

is on the up and Craig Easton was also fantastic in the first half. In goal Phil Smith didn't have much to do at all. He couldn't do a lot about the goal although he produced an excellent save right at the end that shows the quality of player he is because his concentration levels were excellent.

We have now played four league games and the squad is settling. We have done a lot of work since the start of the season to get to where we are and the competition for places should augur well for the months ahead. The eleven boys who go out on the pitch now should have an edge to them and hopefully tonight we will see the first signs of that. As a squad we are becoming harder to beat and if we can become more clinical at the other end then we will start winning games. We have been very wasteful in front of goal so far this season and we need to improve on that. Barry Corr is making progress and when we get him back fit the competition for places will hot up even further.

Enjoy tonight's game and let's hope we can put ourselves into the hat for round two with a win this evening.



terry butcher


Terry Butcher was born in Singapore in December 1958 but spent his childhood in Lowestoft.

He signed as a schoolboy for his local League club Ipswich Town in 1976 and made his League debut two years later. During his eight years at the Portman Road club he made 271 appearances collecting a UEFA Cup winners medal.

While at Ipswich he was given his International debut by former Brentford player Ron Greenwood against Australia in 1980. Two years later he was an integral member of England's World Cup squad in Spain.

He remained England's first choice centre back through the 1986 World Cup in Argentina and four years later in Italy. He made a total of 77 International appearances and together with

both Bobby Moore and Bobby Charlton, is second only to Peter Shilton in having



made the most World Cup appearances for England (14).

Meanwhile in 1986 he joined Glasgow Rangers and was there for four years making 127 appearances, captaining them to three League titles and two League Cup successes, before becoming Player/Manager at Coventry City in 1990. After 15 months there he took up a similar position at Sunderland.

Terry took a few years out from the game to purchase and manage a hotel before returning north of the border when signing as the youth team manager for Raith Rovers in 1997. He gained further experience with Dundee United and Motherwell before taking over as Manager of Motherwell in April 2002. He was there for four years collecting three Manager of the Month awards during that time.

He made a brief sortee to Sydney Australia to become their Head Coach in May 2006 but returned to Britain in March of this year, after just eight months, and took the temporary position of Assistant Manager to Scottish League One side Partick Thistle, from where he joined Brentford.

Terry Butcher became a footballing hero particularly in the eyes of England supporters when playing on after a challenge in the 1989 World Cup qualifying tie against Sweden which left his face and his entire kit swathed in blood. That defining moment epitomized his courage and his determination to succeed against the odds, attributes which will stand him in good stead with the challenge that lays ahead.



ricky shakes

One of two familiar faces to return to The County Ground this evening, Ricky Shakes got his Brentford career off to the perfect start on Saturday afternoon.

Having come on as a 69th minute substitute for Jose Mousinho, Shakes found himself with time and space inside the box to strike the winner four minutes before the final whistle. No moonwalk style celebrations that time, but it certainly capped an impressive start for the player who signed a permanent deal with The Bees on Friday afternoon.

After over 70 appearances for Swindon during a two-year spell, the winger was told that following promotion back into League One he may have found first team chances hard to come by at SN1 and the search began for a new club. Shakes featured prominently for Brentford during pre-season but was not signed by the Londoners until deadline day, putting pen to paper on a deal that will see him remain at Griffin Park until Christmas.

Matt Heywood could also feature this evening against his former club after playing his first game of the season on Saturday in the 2-1 away win over Bury.

MATT HEYWOOD



Born: 26th August 1979
Arrived at Griffin Park with the experience of 250 games through service with Swindon Town and Burnley, and latterly Bristol City from whom he joined Brentford at the start of last season. Played his first game of the campaign on Saturday, featuring in the 2-1 away victory at Bury.

BEN HAMER

Born: 20th November 1987
Ben progressed through the Reading Academy and signed as a professional last summer. He spent last season on loan at Crawley and joined Brentford on a one-month loan deal from the Royals at the start of August, making his debut against Mansfield Town.

BEN STAROSTA

Born: 7th January 1987
The Polish Under 20 International defender joined Brentford from Sheffield United on loan at the start of August, having just returned from the FIFA Under 20 World Cup in Canada where he was ever present for Poland. Also has loan experience with Tamworth.

KARLEIGH OSBORNE

Born: 19th March 1988
Karleigh, who has progressed through the ranks, made 24 appearances last season, and his ability to operate in a number of positions stands in him good stead for the future. The Southall-born defender stands at 6'2 and has started the season well for The Bees.

GRANT BASEY

Born: 30th November 1988
Powerful left-back Basey joined the Club initially on a one-month loan from Charlton Athletic having joined the South East London club as a scholar in 2005. London-born, the defender started the first four games of the season for The Bees although is yet to be involved at first team level with his parent club.



CHARLIE IDE



Born: 10th May 1988
Charlie made his League debut for the Club in August 2006 since when he went on to make a further 28 appearances last season. He has made tremendous progress and is expected to challenge strongly for a regular spot this term and has scored 7 goals in 30 league appearances.

ADRIAN PETTIGREW

Born: 12th November 1986
Chelsea's London born central defender joined The Bees on a one-month loan in time for the first game of the season. He spent time on loan at Wycombe Wanderers last season although was restricted to just one 45 minute stint against Bristol Rovers in March at Adams Park.



JOHN MOUSINHO



Born: 30th April 1986
On the back of a full contract John started to establish himself in the side last season after spending a loan spell with Woking during the 2005-06 campaign. Scored his first goal for Brentford on Saturday 25th August in a 2-1 home win over Barnet and has now made over 30 league starts for The Bees.

GLENN POOLE

Born: 3rd February 1981
Started his career in 1999 with Yeovil Town but it was with Dagenham & Redbridge that he chalked up plenty of goals and appearances. However it was from Grays that Brentford secured his services in early summer making him Terry Butcher's first signing as the new man in charge at Griffin Park.



SAMMY MOORE



Born: 7th September 1987.
Former Chelsea Youth Sammy joined The Bees initially on a one-month loan from Ipswich Town and scored on his debut pre-season against Reading. Started out as a trainee in the summer of 2006 and is yet to make a first team appearance for The Tractor Boys.

KEVIN O'CONNOR


Born: 24th February 1982

Two former Town players return to The County Ground this evening. Havign featured Ricky Shakes on page 9, we now look at the fortunes of Matt Heywood.




club connections

Chatham-born, Heywood began his career with Burnley and having come up through the ranks as a trainee made 11 league starts for The Clarets. Then Swindon manager Andy King spotted the potential and signed Heywood in January 2001 and he went on to make 176 league starts for The Robins before departing for Bristol City in the summer of 2005.

After one season and 25 appearances at Ashton Gate, he joined Brentford last summer and Heywood's experience and leadership qualities could play a key part in the Bees promotion charge this term.
