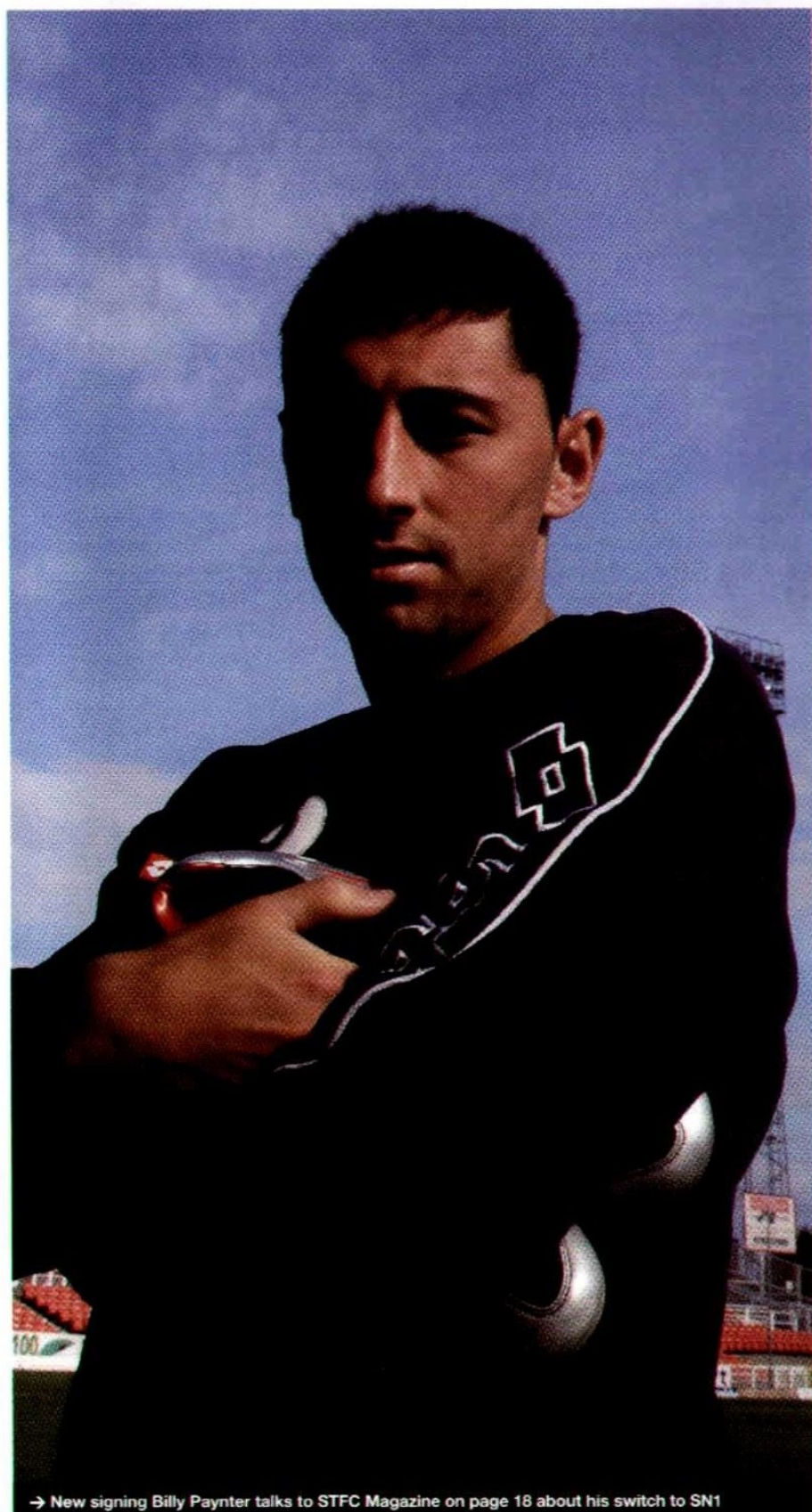

Tuesday's performance against Brentford was a pleasing one. We made eleven changes to the side and to come out with such an emphatic win was excellent. The challenge today is to get three more league points on the board.

Brentford didn't look a bad side at all on Tuesday night. With so many changes to our own team it was difficult to know how we would settle but as I said after the game, it was important that we had a look at the other players we have in the squad. We gave them the opportunity to show me what they can do and a lot of them came out of the game with credit. I thought we got stronger as the game went on and there were a lot of positives to come out of it.

Callum Kennedy and Ben Tozer got their opportunity at left and right full-back respectively. Ben has been involved before – against Bristol City in pre-season – and it was another chance for him to show us what he is all about. He has great potential and involving him in the first team will be beneficial on a number of counts. Callum didn't look out of place on what was his senior debut and set up the first goal for Arrieta with a pinpoint cross. In saying that there are points for all of our younger players to work on and we will continue to work hard on their development out on the training ground. Mauro Almeida played his first game for us and did a very professional job alongside Chris Blackburn in the heart of the defence. Peter Brezovan played in goal, although aside from the opening stages of the game didn't have a lot to do at all.

Speaking of Chris Blackburn, I must comment on his development since he joined us. We spotted the potential in him and took him on from Morecambe – who of course won the Conference

Play-Off final at Wembley last season so he has 'big match experience' under his belt. 'Blackie' has got better and better since joining us. Perhaps 'Sloop' has been a little hard on him at times, but that's what he is there for – to help the defence over the long-term. Having played a lot of his football in midfield earlier in his career, Chris is comfortable going forward as he showed on Tuesday night against Brentford and he took his goals really well – which makes him our top goalscorer! He has been working hard on his fitness levels in training and we were all delighted with the performance he put in.

On deadline day we made three signings as you are all aware and two of those players were included on Tuesday night. J-P showed us what he is all about and put quality balls into the box. His deliveries were excellent and he could be a real asset for this football club. The cross for 'Coxy's' goal was right on the money and I would have been very surprised to see him miss that one. Simon too looked sharp and it is nice to have the edge to the squad now. We have competition all over the park and I was also pleased with Kaid's efforts after he came on towards the end. There is know pressure on the players to perform and that's what we have been after.

Unfortunately we were without Billy Paynter on Tuesday night due to a complication with his paperwork and he could get an opportunity today. Andy Nicholas is still out with a heel injury and we are monitoring that

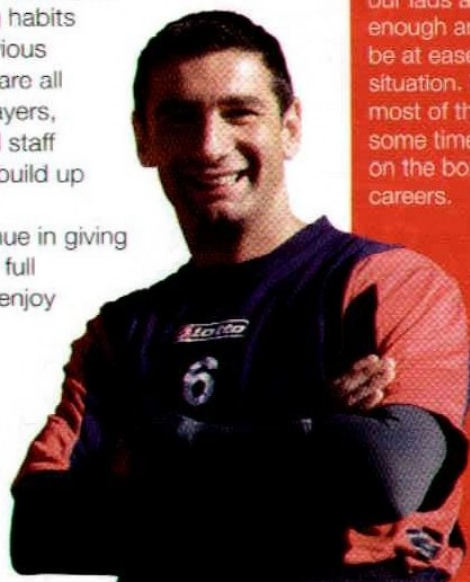
On Tuesday evening we played Brentford in the first round of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy.

Also it can mess your dietary requirements about. For example I personally like to eat breakfast at around 9'o clock on a "normal" match day (Saturday). Then just pick at a few sweets in the dressing room prior to kick off. To stick with the same routine of mine this would mean I would have to have breakfast at around 6 or 7'o clock! You then go down the road of how much sleep you are used to, so therefore have to adjust your sleeping habits from the previous night. These are all things the players, manager and staff tackle in the build up to a match. Please continue in giving the lads your full support and enjoy the game.

customer charter reviewed

The club has recently reviewed its Customer Charter. The club's promises for the 2006/7 season were:

1. To Continue with the Kick Racism Out of Football campaign.

This has continued, and we joined in with the KIO day vs Lincoln on Saturday 28th October last season and will do the same this season. From June 2002 through to June 2007 the club's FITC scheme employed an Ethnic Development Officer to work with ethnic groups. The funding recently expired but we have continued to work on various projects within the black and ethnic community.

2. To improve communication with our supporters.

A regular email is sent out to those supporters who have signed up to receive such information, sent out on average once every two weeks. All email queries sent into the club are responded to within two working days, with all letters responded to within ten days.

3. To improve on non-football related events to improve the role the Club has in the local community.

Our Football In The Community scheme work primarily with children, adults and teenagers, primarily working with children from the age of 3 to 15 years. This incorporates Tiny Tots, Mini Soccer, Soccer Centres, holiday courses, in-school and after school club coaching, disability coaching, birthday parties, Saturday Team Club packages, Twilight Football for disadvantaged teenagers. They also run a weekly session for adults with learning and physical disabilities. The scheme is currently

working with an average of c2000-2500 children a week. Our players also attend many community based events, such as fetes, open days and council run community days.

Our promises for this 2007/08 season will be:

1. To re-write and update the Customer Charter

This has taken place, the 2007-2008 Customer Charter is now available online, and on display at the STFC Superstore, Ticket Office and Main Reception

2. Fans of The Future

To further promote the 'Under 7s go free' season ticket and discounted ticket offer to local schools and football clubs. We will also host at least two family fun days – the first of which took place last Saturday. There is a dedicated 'Fans Of The Future' section on both our website and in the programme.

3. To Sign Up to the Kick It Out Race Equality Standards

The Standard is a framework document setting out a series of measures that supports the development of racial equality practices and policies within a club environment. Professional clubs are asked to work to a series of objectives that ensure equality in all areas of their operation – from stewarding, to the recruitment of administration staff and the development of young players. The document has been developed by Kick It Out, with the support of the FA Premier League, and from

source materials including Sporting Equal's Achieving Racial Equality: A Standard for Sport.

How do clubs achieve it?

The Standard has three levels of achievement - Preliminary, Intermediate and Advanced. Each club will begin by working towards the Preliminary Level followed by Intermediate and Advanced. There are three areas of activity that cover all areas of a clubs activity - Stadium and Outreach, Policy and Planning, and Administration and Management. Within each area a number of objectives need to be met.

What is the process?

To achieve each level of the Standard, our Development Officer will work with clubs to support them in gathering evidence that address each objective at that level. This is a facilitative process that ensures that every club is supported at every step. Once the evidence is compiled, the file is submitted for consideration by an independent Accreditation Panel.

What will be the impact?

The Racial Equality Standard is a tool that can support clubs in their journey towards racial equality and help build long-term foundations for sustainable club and community development. Football has the power to engage all communities and this document will encourage clubs to expand and extend existing partnerships.

LUGGY LAUNCHES 'COCA-COLA' TALENT FROM TRASH

Paul Sturrock has this week helped to launch 'Coca-Cola' Talent from Trash - an innovative programme that rewards Football League clubs and their fans for pledging to recycle more and raising household waste recycling levels in their communities. Fans can win up to £18,000 for (enter club nickname) to spend on youth development if they pledge to recycle more at www.talent-from-trash.com. One lucky fan of a Football League club will also win an extra £10,000 for their club and £5,000 for themselves by pledging their commitment online.

Entering the programme is easy. Fans can pledge once a day online. The number of pledges received each week will be counted and clubs will be rewarded with a corresponding level of prize money. Clubs will also win extra cash based on the recorded uplift of household waste recycling levels in their areas during the 12 weeks (versus the same period in 2006). All household waste materials are counted - glass, plastic, paper, aluminium, steel and cardboard.

When fans pledge to recycle they are entered into a free prize draw to win an extra £10,000 for their club and £5,000 for themselves. Plus, the fan who makes the most pledges at each club will win a 'money can't buy' prize from their club, for example, signed shirts.

As a minimum, participating clubs are guaranteed £3,400 to spend on youth development rising to £18,000 if the top targets are met. It's simple - pledge to recycle, recycle more, win cash for your club's youth development!

There are 13 clubs taking part in 'Coca-Cola' Talent from Trash: Accrington Stanley, Brentford, Burnley, Cardiff City, Coventry City, Huddersfield Town, Norwich City, Nottingham Forest, QPR, Southampton, Swansea City, Swindon Town and Wycombe Wanderers.

Chairman of the Football League, Lord Mawhinney said: "By pledging to recycle their household waste supporters will make a positive impact in a number of different ways. 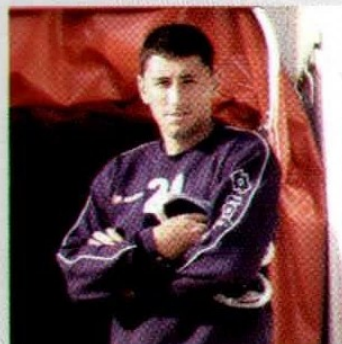
Club Captain, Ady Williams, commented: "It was a great idea and it certainly gets the youngsters interested not only in the competition but in the club.

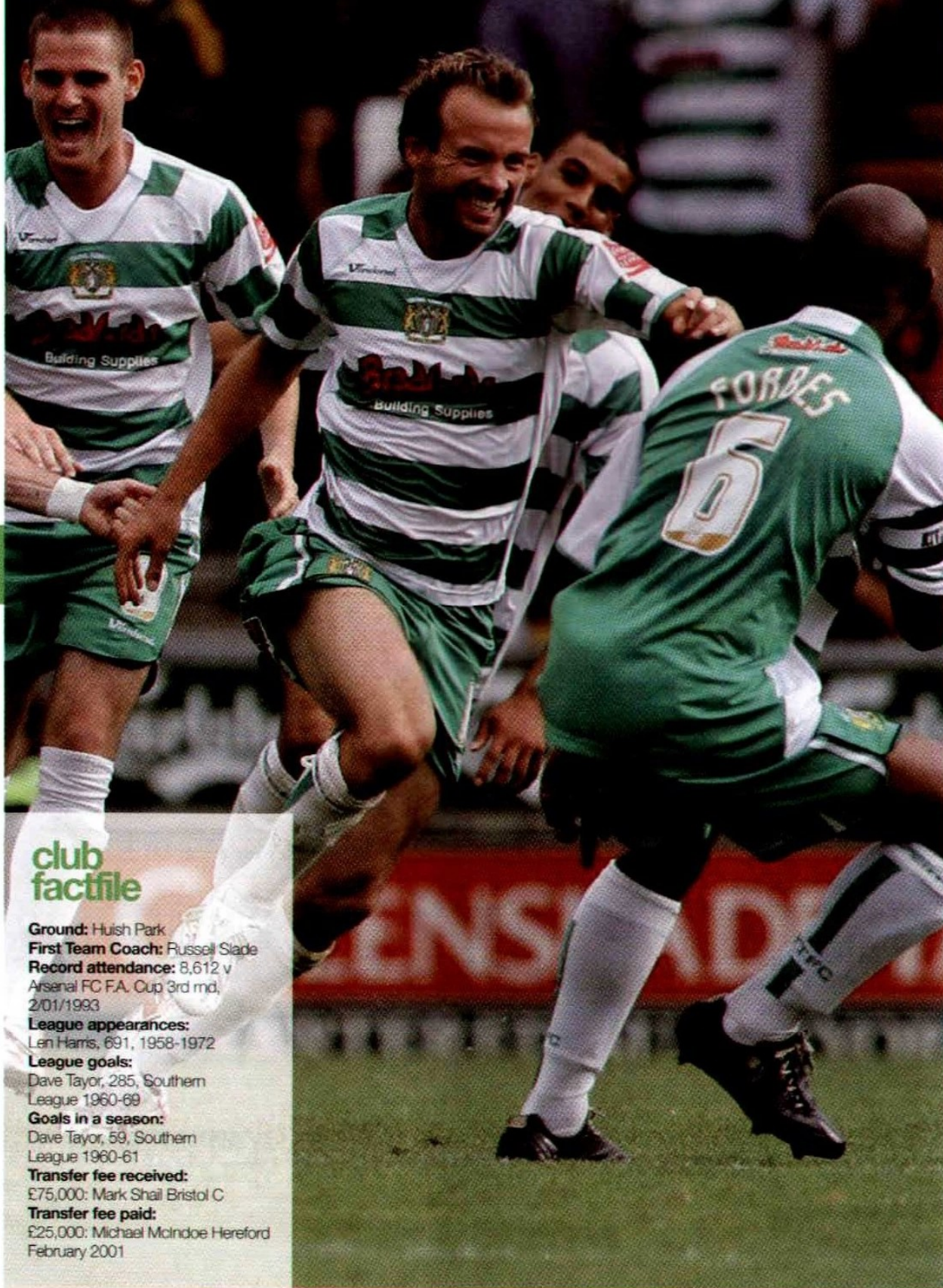

russell slade

Yeovil Town appointed Russell Slade first team manager on June 7th 2006, and to say the least, he has been a resounding success, taking the club to the League One play-off final at Wembley in his first season.

Russell Slade is a coach of some experience, who has enjoyed a number of notable achievements during what has generally been a successful managerial career.

Following temporary positions with Notts County and Sheffield United during the 1990's, Russell's first permanent post was with Scarborough. Under Russell Slade Scarborough played a total of 133 matches, winning 50, losing 42 and drawing 41, before he left for Grimsby in May 2004.

Russell arrived at Grimsby Town during a difficult period in their history. The club had just been relegated to League Two, and following the problems with the ITV Digital broadcasting deal they were also very strapped for cash. Whilst at Grimsby he saw his side play at total of 105 games. They won 41 of these, lost 34 and drew 30.

Arriving at Huish Park Russell Slade immediately set about the task of rebuilding the Glovers depleted squad, adding much quality players as Steve Mildenhall, Terrell Forbes, Chris Cohen and Wayne Gray.

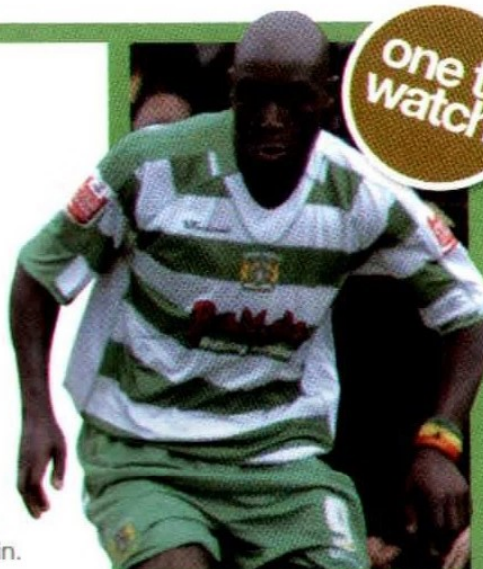
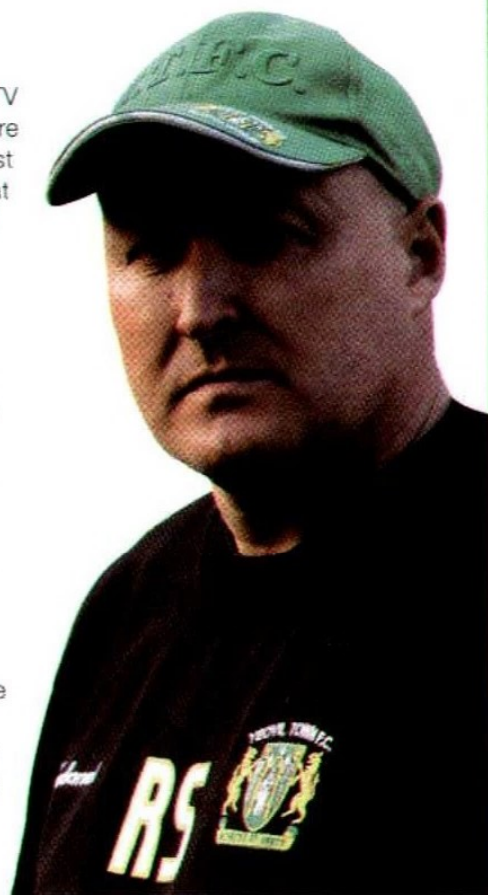
They soon gelled and moved up the table, to spend most of the season in the top six.

In the end they secured 5th in the league, and following an epic semi final battle with Nottingham Forest, which saw them beat the former Premiership club 5-2 at the City ground in the second leg, they went through to

Wembley on the back of an impressive 5-4 aggregate win.

They lost 2-0 to Blackpool in the final. It was a disappointment for everyone connected with the club, but having started the season as relegation favourites, it had been a resounding campaign.

Russell added well to his squad during the summer of 2007, and with players of the quality of Gary Dempsey, Lloyd Owusu and Marvin Williams recruited, the club should challenge strongly this season.



one to watch!

lloyd owusu

Born: 12th December 1976. The 6 foot 2 inch tall Ghanaian international signed a one-year deal with Yeovil Town in July 2007 and has already netted twice in four games this term. 30-year-old Owusu was top scorer at Griffin Park for most of the seasons he was Brentford and adds a much-needed presence to the forward line. Lloyd Owusu was born in Slough in 1976, and signed for his local club in 1997, going through their youth system and into first team football. He made nine appearances for Slough Town, scoring an impressive ten goals - a point that didn't go unnoticed by Brentford, who signed him up for his first spell at the club in July 1998 for a fee of £25,000. He really made his name with the Bees, going on to score 73 goals in 192 appearances, before joining Sheffield Wednesday on a free transfer in July 2002. He went on to make 58 appearances at Hillsborough, scoring 11 goals in a season and a half, before moving on to Reading in December 2003. He was with the Royals for just over 18 months, managing 47 appearances and scoring 11 goals. A dream move back to Griffin Park in June 2005 came about, where, despite some injury problems in his last season, he enjoyed another successful spell where he scored 14 goals in 48 appearances.

The 26-year old Manchester-born defender who started out with his hometown club. After three years as a trainee at Old Trafford switched to Sunderland in July 2004. Moved to Hull City the following summer and is currently on loan at Huish Park from the KC Stadium.

MATTHEW ROSE

Born: 24th September 1975.
Rose was signed in February to provide cover in defence and midfield and proved his value over the closing stages of the season. Subsequently signed a new one-year contract at the start of the 2007/2008 season and offers versatility to the squad and has already fulfilled a number of positions.

DARRYL KNIGHTS

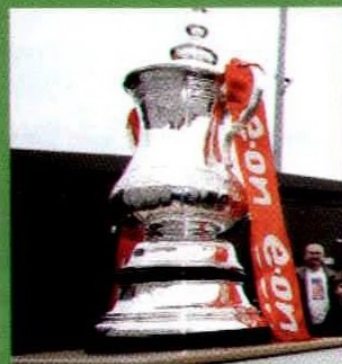
Born: 1st May 1988.

He made his Welsh debut in 1969 against France, gaining caps as a fullback and centre, and in 1972 finally settled into the fly half berth. His form earned him a place on the British Lions tour of South Africa in 1974, where he would reach new heights as the star of the tour, scoring 103 points. His 50 yard try in the 28-9 second test victory in Pretoria, ranks as one of the supreme examples of individual brilliance on a rugby pitch. He retired from international rugby in 1978.

Mention the name David Hay to many Town fans and some won't know who you're talking about. Mention Jan Aage Fjortoft and you'll find the same fans eulogising about one of Town's all-time greats. Yet without the former, the latter would never have come to SN1 in the first place...

David Hay was John Gorman's assistant manager following Glenn Hoddle's departure to Chelsea in the summer of 1992. Hay had worked with Fjortoft during a spell as Lillestrom's manager in the late 1980's and suggested to Gorman that his style of play, and value, could make Fjortoft an extremely agreeable acquisition for the Robins. As advice goes, it is right up there with Roy Keane's suggestion to Sir Alex Ferguson that United buy Cristiano Ronaldo.

Not that you would have agreed watching the Norwegian striker's contribution during the first quarter of the season. Starting on the opening day along with several new faces Fjortoft went 10 games without a goal. He worked hard, and for that Town fans took him into their hearts, but glaring misses like those against Aston Villa, where he diverted a goal-bound effort on to the post, saw the player and fans grow more and more frustrated with Town's increasingly precarious league position.

The club and player decided the best thing for all parties would

be to see him move back to Lillestrom on loan, a move heightened that was by Keith Scott's arrival from Wycombe, and subsequent winning goal against QPR. Then came Ipswich...

Keith Scott was injured the week before Town's FA Cup visit to Portman Road, causing Town to put the loan move on hold, and Fjortoft was gifted his first start for two months in a game that didn't carry the burden of league points. Finally, in match 23, his 13th start, goal number one in Town's colours...

"The most decisive moment was the goal at Ipswich," he recalls. "I was on the road to nowhere – I hadn't scored and for my career that was an important goal. My first goal at The County Ground came a week later against Spurs' Ian Walker – that was also special."

Like dominos his goals started falling week after week, seven days after Spurs he scored three in a game that saw the birth of his infamous goal celebration.

"The aeroplane was born at the County Ground against Coventry City, and followed me to Frankfurt," he says. "I saw an old lady do it after a first-half goal in the 3-1 win and it just carried on from there."

13 goals in 17 games couldn't prevent Town from falling through the top-flight trap door.

Neither could it prevent the continued slide a year later when Town failed to adapt to life back in the Championship. Despite Jan the man bagging nine goals in Town's first 11 games Town were on a downward spiral. Town masked their hideous league form with a run to the semi-finals of what was then the Coca-Cola Cup and reached the tournament's semi-final. Jan scored nine goals in 11 cup matches and his form started to the attentions of

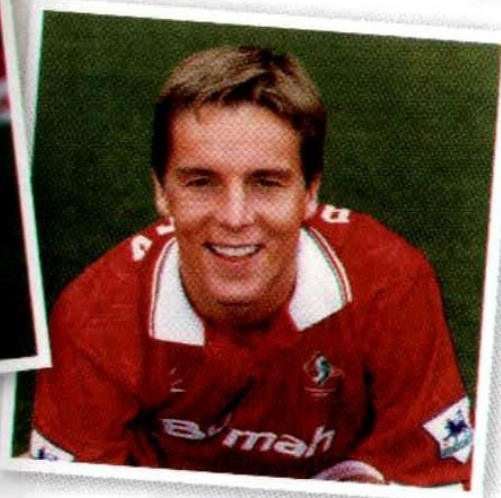


several Premier League clubs as transfer deadline day approached. This was the news Town fans had been dreading...

When Steve McMahon joined to take over from Gorman it was clear player and new manager were poles apart in their personality and beliefs, despite the Norwegian being the greatest hope the Scouser had of keeping his new club in the division. As Fjortoft kept scoring, so the number of rumours linking him with a move away from The County Ground kept increasing and in 1995, Middlesbrough got their man for a derisory £1.3 million. Fjortoft had scored 26 goals up until his move North, Town only scored six in their next eight games, cementing a second successive relegation. And while Town had made a handy profit on the striker, it was nowhere near what the fans expected for a striker of international calibre. Even Jimmy Greaves, who had earlier stated Town were too good to go down, suggested that Fjortoft was in the region of £3million.

Fjortoft went on to play in Germany and Norway after his Teeside sojourn, but it's clear that Swindon Town provided the platform for the most enjoyable days of his career.

"It's very special [coming to England]. When I came here in '93 from Vienna I was very excited. I had always loved English football and I still do. I watch it very closely even now. But I was at a few clubs in my career and Swindon was my first love – as the old saying goes you never forget your first love.

"I came here and I looked forward to playing in the Premiership. I got injured early on and I was so desperate to play, to show what I could do – even more so the longer the goal drought went on. I simply couldn't score. I had never had that situation in my life and I wasn't used to it – it was just so great when it all came together."

Great for Town's fans, too – who had a new hero following the departures of Dave Mitchell and Craig Maskell, one who had the potential to keep Town in the top-flight.

"I remember really enjoying playing with Nicky Summerbee, he was awesome – his crosses were superb and they were an integral part of my own success. My game didn't change when I came here, or when I moved on – in fact it still hasn't now – the muscles are a bit stiffer and the legs a bit older, but I never used to do that much running anyway!"

As well as Summerbee, when remembering his closest allies at The County Ground Fjortoft is complimentary of the manager that brought him to England.

"John Gorman means a lot to me, to all of us. The charity match was the first time I'd seen him since his wife died and it was good to see him. He's one of the nicest men I've met in football.

"But it was a close group of players, too. We conceded goals for fun and it wasn't fun losing, but we also scored a lot as well. I think we won a lot of hearts that season. Everyone mocked us for the amount of points we won, or didn't win – but I think when you look at a lot of teams since they've done worse than us. I think now I'm more pragmatic, it was good to at least play in that top division, Swindon were in the top-flight and there were great memories along with the disappointments.

"I always expect some players

go into coaching," he says of his teammates. "We had Glenn Hoddle at Swindon before I joined, then John Gorman, and people always wanted to play the game the right way – all of us. Most of the players from the 90s are coaches now in some capacity – it's normal. My advantage is I played in four different countries, so was influenced by each and every one."

These days Jan spends his time in the office, or the studio – his worldly experiences making him the ideal television pundit. Lillestrom's Chief Executive by day and Norway's equivalent of Jamie Redknapp on screen at night – he admits he doesn't miss the game itself, more the banter that goes hand in hand with everyday life as a footballer.

"I have one foot in every camp with the roles I have now and I don't miss playing. But I must be the only Chief Exec that trains with their team! I love being in the dressing room – that's what I miss. The bad jokes and the banter.

"I was lucky in my career in that I had no injuries – I didn't miss much action. You have to look after yourself before during and after your career and I had a few injuries at the end of mine. During my playing days I tried to enjoy it as much as I could – it's fun, to get paid to play football is ridiculous. We were very privileged and I tell my players that now. It's very important, perhaps more so in England because wages are inflating and transfers are high now – it's important not to forget why we play."

And Jan played to score goals. Nothing more, nothing less.

"I love scoring goals. That's what I say to my strikers at Lillestrom – you have to wake up every morning and want to score goals."

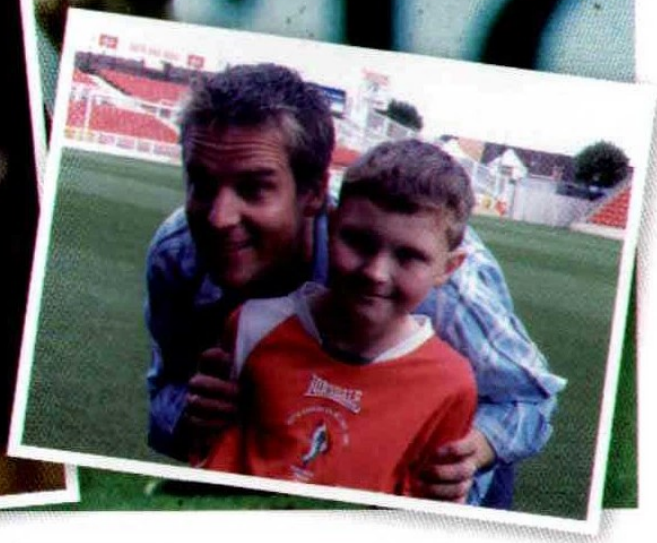
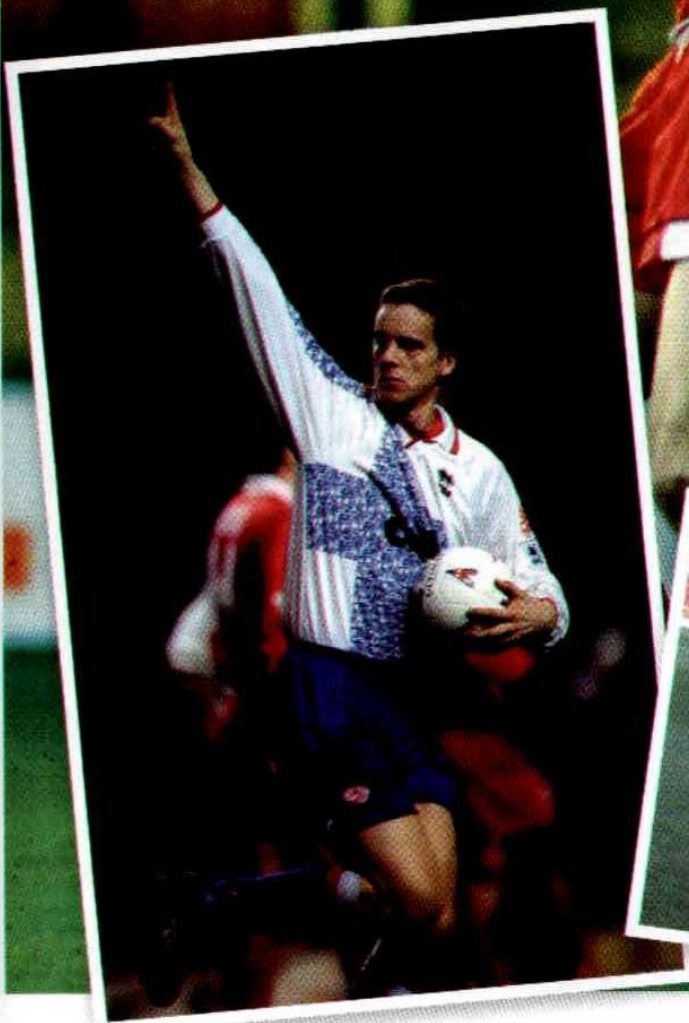
And with Town boasting four players looking to assume the two striking positions today, let's hope they woke up with the same burning desire...

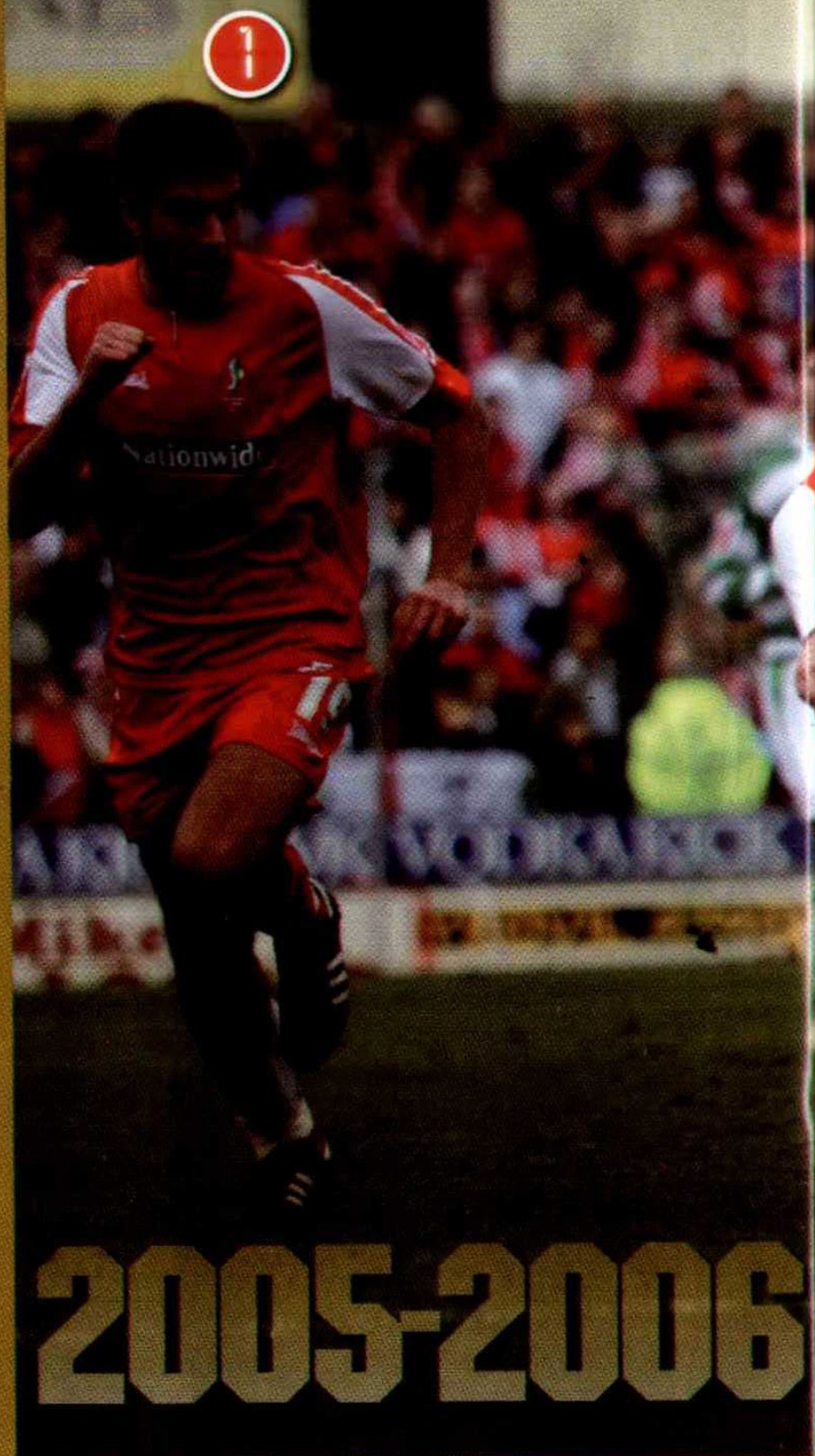
After a 24-goal haul during the 2006/07 campaign 'Curo' returned to his first club Norwich City in the summer and has scored two goals in three starts so far this term.

Illness, knee operations or family weddings... none of these trivial things stop loyal supporters such as Derek Elston or Lee Geary supporting their teams and the pair met up to swap notes before Town's opening 1-1 draw at Northampton Town.

Kingsthorpe based Derek was watching his 1,387th consecutive Swindon match – a sequence stretching back to December 1981, while Lee was taking in his 825th straight Cobblers match, having seen every one since the start of the 1992/93 season.

He said: "I grew up in Watford but when I was young we used to visit friends of my parents in a village a few miles from Swindon called Chiseldon and the attachment took off from there."

With Swindon promoted from League Two last season, Derek was scanning the fixture list and described the opening the new kick-off as 'the worst possible start'. "I get a lot of stick from the lads at work at Viper Motorsport Wiring Systems in Wellingborough," he said.

The last match Derek missed was a defeat by Bristol City and his understanding wife Christine, who drives him to a lot of the matches before going off shopping, said: "We won tickets for a steam train trip on the Leander but Derek wasn't sure whether to go. Since then he has missed his brother Keith's wedding for a Swindon match."

Derek added: "I have probably been to matches when I shouldn't have done, such as the time with my leg strapped up from knee to ankle after an operation." Lee, 43 said: "Going to so many consecutive matches wasn't something I set out to do at the start. People ask me how I know the figure but it's simple really... after a while I began to write them all down."

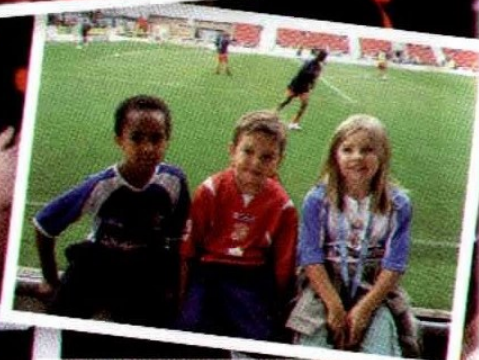

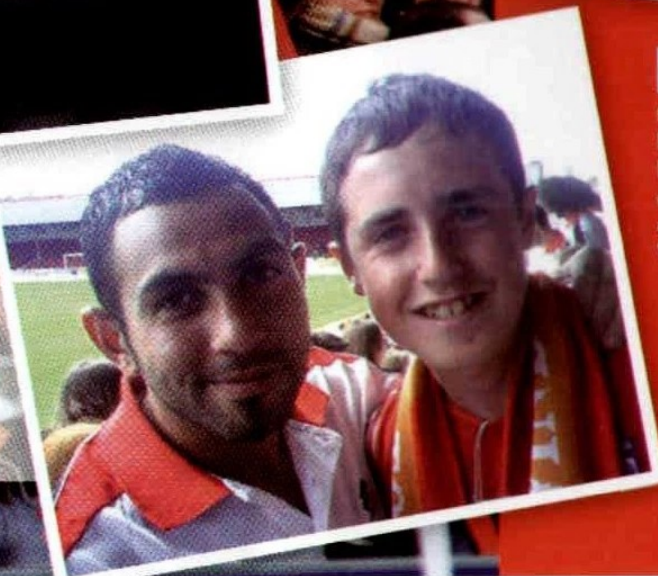

AFC Bournemouth are the next visitors to The County Ground on Saturday 22nd September and The Cherries have certainly have experience within their squad.

The most notable name amongst Kevin Bond's squad is former England winger Darren Anderton. The midfielder signed for The Cherries a year ago and has made a big impact. After starting his career at Portsmouth, Anderton made 53 league starts for Pompey before a switch to Spurs in June 1992 for £1.75 million and he went on to rack up over 300 appearances for the White Hart Lane side. Further spells at Birmingham and Wolves followed before his arrival at The Fitness First Stadium 12 months ago.

Anderton is not the only player with top-flight experience though as former Scotland International Paul Telfer was also recruited in the summer after spending two seasons with Scottish giants Celtic. His previous experience has also seen him represent Luton Town, Coventry City and Southampton.

A familiar name in the Cherries squad for Swindon fans will be Jo Osei-Kuffour. The diminutive front man joined The Robins on loan from Arsenal

in August 2001 and scored two goals in four games – including the last goal against Reading in a 3-1 win at The Madejski Stadium. The Reading side that day included no less than six Swindon players including Adie Viveash, Ady Williams, Darius Henderson, Sammy Igoe, Jamie Cureton and Adi Whitbread.

Bournemouth have made a mixed start to the campaign so far. An opening day goalless draw at Nottingham Forest was followed up by a narrow Carling Cup defeat at West Brom. A home defeat to Huddersfield was then followed by a first league win of the season which came at Doncaster Rovers thanks to goals from Max Gradel and Jo Kuffour. Another home setback followed at the hands of Port Vale before a midweek victory in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy against Walsall.

The last time the two sides met came at The County Ground in January 2006 and it was a game which saw Lee Peacock make his debut for the club – and score a 90th minute goal in an impressive 4-2 win. A similar result would send the Swindon faithful home happy once again.
