



THE GAFFER

PAUL LAMBERT TALKS TO ALAN PARRY

There's a wonderful photograph in the boardroom here at Adams Park of Wycombe Wanderers walking out alongside Liverpool in the semi final of the F.A. Cup at Villa Park a few years ago.

It's the perfect reminder of this club's proud history in a competition that is often called the greatest knock out tournament in the world. So, although promotion from League Two is obviously our main priority, you can rest assured that we'll be going all out to beat Swindon today and progress as far as we can in this season's F.A.Cup.

Our fantastic run to the semi finals of the Carling Cup whetted everyone's appetite for big games like this and the disappointment of going out in the first round of this season's competition makes today's game even more important.

Swindon will be tough opposition, they're a league above us and going well at the moment and they'll bring plenty of supporters to Adams Park for what's virtually a local derby. There's no question that we are the underdogs today.

However, I'm pleased with our own current form as we've just played the top two teams in League Two and should have beaten them both. We dominated the second half of the games against Chester and M.K.Dons and it proves that we have nothing to fear in our division.

Strange as it may seem, when the referee sent off a second M.K.Dons player in last week's game I think it made our task more difficult. Their only option then was to put every player behind the ball and we couldn't find a way through despite all our possession. We still managed to create several excellent chances and if our finishing had been better, we would have won the game comfortably.

On that subject, Jermaine
Easter's move to Plymouth
Argyle has left us short of
strikers. Our only recognised
front players are Scott McGleish,
John Sutton and Reuben Reid
and we're approaching that time
of the season when injuries and
suspensions can hit hard.

I do have the option of playing Sergio Torres or Matty Bloomfield in a more advanced role, but the situation is far from ideal. We simply don't have the money to spend in the transfer market so I might have to look at bringing in another striker on loan.

I'm delighted that McGleish and Sutton have struck up a great understanding so quickly. They are the classic 'big man, small man' partnership although Scotty at 5'9" jumps higher than most six footers – his timing is superb.

Scotty is a natural goalscorer while John is superb at winning headers and holding the ball up with his back to goal and he's now starting to find the net himself. We also have Reuben who's looked lively every time he's come off the subs bench and has been excellent in the

Many supporters have asked me when Tommy Doherty will be back in the first team squad and my reply is that we'll have to be patient. He missed out on preseason training at Q.P.R. when he went down with appendicitis and he's still a few weeks short of fitness.

Tommy is anxious to get back in shape as quickly as possible and that can often lead to minor injuries. He picked up a calf strain recently, but he's now back in training and having special, one-on-one sessions with our fitness coach Terry Evans. He needs to get a couple of reserve games under his belt and I don't think he'll be ready for first team action till December.

Finally, returning to today's game, Swindon are managed by my fellow Scot Paul Sturrock who I first came across twenty years ago when we played against each other in the final of the Scottish Cup. I was only seventeen at the time and it was my first season at St.Mirren while Paul played for Dundee United.

We were massive underdogs because Dundee United had just finished third in the Scottish League behind Rangers and Celtic and they had a great team at that time. St.Mirren had done brilliantly just to reach the final.

But underdogs often have their day in cup competitions and so it proved when we beat them 1-0 in front of over 52,000 spectators at Hampden Park. On that same afternoon, Coventry beat Tottenham in the F.A.Cup Final at Wembley and I don't think many people correctly forecast the results of those two finals!

MANAGED BEFORE

FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS PROFILES SIX LEADING MANAGERS FROM TODAY'S VISITORS

BERT HEAD

Bert Head plotted Swindon Town's 1962-63 promotion success. Signing professional for Torquay United in October 1936, the defender moved to Bury in February 1952 and was assistant-boss before becoming Swindon's manager in October 1955. He produced several fine players including Mike Summerbee, Ernie Hunt, Don Rogers and Rod Thomas before returning to Bury as manager in August 1965. Appointed Crystal Palace's boss in April 1966, he guided them to the top-flight for the first time in 1968-69 and had a spell as general manager. He was later manager and director at Bath City and died in February 2002.

LOU MACARI

Former Scotland international midfielder Lou Macari managed Swindon Town to the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He won all three major Scottish honours with Celtic before moving to Manchester United in January 1973, featuring in three FA Cup finals including their 1977 triumph. Joining Swindon as player-boss in July 1984, he also guided them to promotion in 1986-87 and Second Division play-offs in 1988-89. He left in July 1989 to manage West Ham and briefly Birmingham before leading Stoke City to the Second Division title in 1992-93. Rejoining Celtic as boss, he later managed Stoke again and Huddersfield Town.

OSSIE ARDILES

Former Argentina international midfielder Ossie Ardiles was unlucky not to lead Swindon Town to the top-flight in 1989-90. Together with Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made headlines with his transfer from Huracan to Spurs in July 1978. He helped them win the FA Cup in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to OPR in May 1988. Appointed Swindon's boss in July 1989, he plotted their 1989-90 Second Division play-off final success but they were denied promotion due to an illegal payments scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United in March 1991, then managed West Brom and Spurs before coaching overseas.

GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle plotted Swindon Town's 1992-93 First Division play-off final triumph. Signing professional for Spurs in April 1975, he starred in their 1981 and 1982 FA Cup final successes and was a finalist again shortly before joining Monaco in June 1987. He helped win the French League title in 1987-88 and was appointed Swindon's player-boss in April 1991. scoring once in 64 League games while at the County Ground. Moving to Chelsea in a similar capacity in June 1993, he guided them to the 1994 FA Cup final and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.

STEVE McMAHON

Former England international midfielder Steve McMahon managed Swindon Town to the Second Division title in 1995-96. Initially with Everton, he joined Aston Villa in May 1983 and moved to Liverpool in September 1985. He starred as they won the League Championship three times and FA Cup in 1989, then reunited with Peter Reid at Manchester City. Appointed Swindon's player-boss in November 1994. he made 42 League appearances and remained in charge until September 1999. He managed Blackpool to promotion in 2000-01 as well as two LDV Vans Trophy final triumphs, since coaching Australian side Perth Glory.

ANDY KING

Former England U-21 midfielder Andy King managed Swindon Town to the Second Division play-offs in 2003-04. Signing professional for Luton Town in July 1974, he joined Everton in April 1976 and appeared in the 1977 League Cup final. He moved to OPR in September 1980, then West Brom a year later and rejoined Everton in August 1982. After spells at Wolves, Luton again and Aldershot, he became Mansfield Town's boss in November 1993. He was assistant-boss at Grimsby and Swindon, where he was appointed manager from November 2000 until August 2001, then again between January 2002 and September 2005.



THE PUNDIT

MATT CECIL REPORTS ON TODAY'S VISITORS

The draw for the first round of the FA Cup threw up a number of different reactions from Wanderers fans when the Blues were paired with League One side Swindon Town at Adams Park. Some were simply pleased to be drawn at home for the sixth season in succession, others were pleased to avoid a potential banana skin at the likes of Horsham or Chasetown. But it's fair to say that, after being paired with the Robins for the seventh time in cup competitions entering the league, the majority of Blues fans would have responded to the draw with three small words: 'Not Swindon again!'

Mind you, judging by the Wanderers' impressive record in those meetings, it's probably the Swindon faithful who are least looking forward to today's clash. Only once have they come out on top in cup ties against the Blues, while the Wanderers can boast about a cup hat-trick in recent years against the Wiltshire club. defeating them in all three cup competitions within four years.

But as Paul Lambert correctly stated when the draw was made. past encounters have little bearing on today's clash, as the Blues face a tough challenge against Paul Sturrock's men who are hovering just outside the playoffs in their first season back in League One. And although Sturrock may choose to rest some of his first team stars in favour of giving his fringe players a chance to shine, the quality throughout the Swindon squad means the Blues have a tough challenge regardless of who plays today.

The Robins were boosted by the return to fitness of star keeper Peter Brezovan this summer, after a broken arm ruled him out of the majority of last season following

an outstanding start to the campaign, but he faces a fight for the number one jersey with Phil Smith, who excelled in Brezovan's place last term. Both keepers. however, are highly dependable and form part of a very strong defensive unit.

Along the back four, Sturrock has a wide choice of players to select from, with the likes of Jamie Vincent, Andy Nicholas, Jack Smith and Miguel Comminges contesting the full-back positions. The heart of the defence, though, is fans' favourite Jerel Ifil, who has made over 100 appearances at centre-back for the Robins. Tony Adams tried to bring Ifil to the Blues in 2004 and it's not difficult to see why he rated the 6'1" defender so highly. Alongside him this afternoon could be Chris Blackburn, Sam Collins or Hasney Aljofree, all of whom have plenty of experience in the Football League.

In midfield, the Robins are a huge threat from the wings, with Jon-Paul McGovern and Sofiene Zaaboub creating plenty of chances for the strikers. Lee Peacock has been converted into a midfield role having spent much of his career as a striker, and he could line up alongside Craig Easton, Steve Adams or Michael Pook in a likely four-man midfield in today's match.

Up front, on-loan Reading striker Simon Cox seems to be picking up many plaudits having scored six goals so far this season, while Billy Paynter is more than useful at playing the target man role for the Robins. They also have the option of selecting Christian Roberts, who has appeared many times against the Blues and always causes problems with his pace and sharp-shooting, while Blair Sturrock followed his father

Paul to the County Ground having previously worked together at Plymouth.

The Blues have fallen at the first hurdle of both other cup competitions this season so let's not make it an unwanted hat-trick this afternoon. A repeat of 2003's 4-1 cup victory over the Robins would do just nicely!

Manager: Paul Sturrock

Known as 'Luggy' after the Scottish word for 'ears', Paul Sturrock moved into management with St Johnstone in 1993 after a playing career which saw him score over 100 goals for Dundee United and Scotland. Five years later, he moved into the hotseat at Dundee United, having been a popular choice amongst the fans after his excellent playing career. A move to Plymouth Argyle followed in 2000, where he led them to the Division Three title with a club record of 102 points before guiding them to the top of the Second Division. He was then appointed manager at Southampton but left after six unhappy months, and moved to Hillsborough where he led Sheffield Wednesday into the Championship. After a poor start to the 2006-07 season, he parted company with the Owls and took the helm at Swindon, leading them to promotion in his first season.

Phil Smith - Goalkeeper

Phil joined Swindon in late July 2006 from Crawley Town where he was number one for two seasons. He came in for the injured Brezovan for the remainder of 2006-07 and was outstanding. He has made the number one shirt his own and continued to show good form this season.

Peter Brezovan -Goalkeeper

Jack Smith - Defender



made over 100 appearances. A
£500,000 transfer to

Chris Blackburn -Defender

Chris originally joined
Morecambe on a short-term deal
in February 2004 and ended up
signing a two year contract. He
initially joined as a midfielder but
was converted to a defender
after an injury crisis at Christie
Park. Since then he has never

looked back, his performances won him a call up for the England semi-pro side. He signed a two year deal for the Robins in the summer.

Sofiene Zaaboub -Midfield

Versatile left sided midfielder who can play in defence, he was Paul Sturrock's first signing as Town boss. He joined initially on a short-term deal but has recently signed a new 18 month contract.

Ady Williams - Defender

Signed from Coventry City, the former Welsh International boasts successful spells with Wolves and Reading. His leadership skills have been there for all to see during Town's road to promotion last season. Currently on the way back from a long term injury.



Jerel Ifil - Defender

This powerful defender joined Town in the summer of 2004 after serving three loan spells with the Robins. Jerel became a fans favourite between 2002-04 and finally signed on a permanent basis. He has now exceeded over 100 appearances for the club.

Andy Nicholas - Defender

Nicho is the longest serving player at the County Ground

after joining from Liverpool in June 2003. He was a regular in the Anfield U19 side and won many plaudits for his performances at left back. Andy King moved to sign him and has endured a frustrating time recently with injuries.

Jon-Paul McGovern . Midfield

McGovern joined Swindon just hours before the close of the transfer window at the end of August 2007. A lively winger who can also operate through the middle, he was a boost to Sturrock's squad as the manager had been chasing him for some time. Jon-Paul was a key performer in the Sheffield Wednesday side that won promotion to the Coca-Cola Championship



Christian Roberts -Midfield/Striker

The Cardiff born striker joined the Robins in October 2004 in a £50,000 switch from local rivals Bristol City. He is aggressive with pace and adds strength to the Swindon front line. Formerly with Exeter City where he scored 18 goals in 67 league starts for the Grecians over two seasons. He finished last season as the Robins top scorer with 13 goals to his credit.



Lee Peacock -Midfield/Striker

Lee joined Swindon during the transfer window of 2006 on a free from Sheffield Wednesday. The experienced front man started his career at Carlisle United as a trainee, he then switched to Mansfield Town in October 1997 for £75,000. After scoring 29 goals in 80 appearances Manchester City signed him for £500,000. His time at Maine Road was dogged with injuries so a £600,000 move to Bristol City was made in August 2000. This heralded a successful four year spell with 54 goals in 131 appearances, he joined Sheffield Wednesday on a free in the summer of 2004 where he worked with Paul Sturrock.

Craig Easton - Midfield

Craig arrived at Swindon in June 2007 and adds further experience to the midfield area. Another player who started at Dundee United where he came through the ranks to make 162 appearances. He then spent a year at Livingston before joining Leyton Orient where he made 65 starts in two seasons.

Steve Adams - Midfield

Steve was signed at the start of this season after impressing in

pre-season. A former Pilgrims player he made 131 appearances for his home town club before switching to Sheffield Wednesday. After leaving Hillsborough Adams took up Paul Sturrock's offer to link up with again.

Blair Sturrock - Striker

The manager's son arrived at the County Ground in November 2006 from Rochdale.

He began with Dundee United as a trainee before spending time at Brechin City on loan. He then spent three years at Plymouth Argyle before moving to Kidderminster and then Rochdale. The Scottish striker scored three goals in seven starts during the promotion campaign and signed a new twoyear deal in July 2007.

Billy Paynter - Striker

Billy joined Swindon in August for an undisclosed fee from Southend United. Paynter began with Port Vale where he scored 30 goals in 119 league starts. He has an impressive strike rate wherever he has been and will add real fire power to the Robins attack.

Simon Cox - Stinker

Simon has been signed on a six month loan deal from Premiership Reading. He is a young 20 year old striker with a great future and signed for his home town side at the age of nine. He has progressed through the ranks at Reading and Steve Coppell gave him his senior debut against Luton Town in the Carling Cup in September 2005.





MEMORY LANE

ALAN HUTCHINSON CATCHES UP WITH A PAST HERO

TY GOODEN WINGER

THE BEGINNING

Ty came to the Wanderers from Arsenal after being released by the North London club in the summer of 1991. Ty was a very talented left sided player and but for one Steve Guppy would have claimed a place in the team. During his first season at Adams Park Ty played in the Bob Lord Trophy competition and scored in the 3-1 opening round win at Merthyr Tydfil. That season the Blues beat Runcorn in a two legged final to take the Trophy. In total Ty made 20 appearances for the club and scored just the one goal before moving to Premiership Swindon Town in 1993 when offered terms by John Gorman.

FROM A BLUE TO A

It was here that his career took off and he became the player everyone at Wycombe knew he could be. He played in the final three Premiership games for County before making 16 appearances the following season in Division One. The season after that was when he established himself as a regular in the side led by Steve McMahon. Ty remained at the County Ground for just over six seasons making a total of 174 appearances and scoring 15 goals. Ty became the first player to sign for another club at the start of the new Millennium when he joined Gillingham in January 2000. He was also joined at the Gills by former Robins team-mate, Iffy Onoura, who also played for the Blues. After three seasons at Priestfield he retired from professional football and took a year out. He finally ended his career in February 2005 playing nonleague for home town club Canvey Island.

TY RECALLS

Taking a step back to those early years Ty recalls, "It was a sad day when I left Wycombe but I was not fit enough at the time and I knew the manager would move me on. We played Swindon in a pre-season friendly at the start of 1993-94 season and I took the chance to have a word with John Gorman. He said I could train with the squad and if I proved myself he would take me on for three months. It went well and I signed a contract and stayed for six seasons. When Steve McMahon took over as manager in November 1994 | broke into the team on a regular basis. Looking back on my time at Swindon it was great, we had a good group of players and there were some good times to remember. I finally retired in February 2005 after playing at Hereford for Canvey Island in the Conference. In August of 2005 the family moved to France and we started our own business running a fishing lake. It is situated in North West France near Le Mans, we are in the village of Hambers. When we were preparing to launch the business I called Steve Guppy as I knew he was a keen fisherman and he came over. Initially it was just for a couple of days but he stayed a week and helped clear the lake, dredge part of it, take out all the small fish and restock it with carp. The fact I kept reminding him he kept me out of the team at Wycombe possibly gave him a guilt complex.

However, we have grown really close since then and I see him at least once a month when he comes over to relax and fish.

Living in France I have not been able to keep in touch with many of the lads from my playing days but I did speak to Keith Scott recently. He asked me to play in a charity match being staged at Rod Stewart's ground at the end of October. It turned out to be a really good event and the former Wycombe team played really well, we won 2-0 and I was fortunate enough to score. It was great seeing everyone again and we certainly played as if it were yesterday. Looking at the line up it was a great Wanderers side. Paul Hyde in goal, Stuart Cash and Andy Robinson full backs, Jason Cousins and Matt Crossley in the centre, Steve Thompson - superb as ever, Simon Stapleton, Keith Ryan and myself in midfield with Scotty and Mark West, he scored the second, up front brilliant".

O'NEILL REGRET

Ty was signed for the Wanderers by Martin O'Neill and the Ulsterman always believed Ty had the ability to succeed. He later said that one regret he always had was he allowed Ty to go but the form of Steve Guppy rather dictated his decision and he did not want to hold Ty back.

We were very grateful to have A licensed coaches Keith Styles and Peter Wright present at the event.


You must understand that this is a massive step not just for those coaches that attended - but for Wycombe Wanderers as a football club.





Bradford defeated Chester 2-1 last Tuesday to end their sequence of eight games without a victory. The result ended Chester's 7 match unbeaten run. The attendance of 13,211 was Bradford's 'lowest' of the season, making their average 13,532. The 2,628 attendance for Darlington's 2-0 win over Shrewsbury was a record low at the Darlington arena.

Dons' World Cup bid

With four wins from five matches, M K Dons boss Paul Ince was predictably named L2 manager of the month for October. Meanwhile Chairman Pete Winkelman is hoping the FA will consider their stadium as a potential venue for England's 2018 World Cup bid. In 18 months time, Stadium MK will meet a basic FIFA requirement that grounds should seat at least 30,000 spectators. Later this month the club hosts an England Under-21 match.

FIRST ROUND HIGHLIGHTS

This is our 41st appearance in the First Round Proper of the F. A. Cup, of which we have won 19 and lost 21 to date. This is the 25th time that we have been drawn at home. As a Football League side we have only been drawn away three times out of fifteen.

Of course, as a non-League side we used the have to go through the qualifying rounds and it wasn't until the 1932/33 season that we reached this stage for the first time. We were drawn away to Gillingham, then in the Football League Division Three South, and gave a good account of ourselves in gaining a 1-1 draw. Dick Braisher scored with fifteen minutes left after the Gills had led at half-time. The replay at Loakes Park was on the following Wednesday afternoon (no floodlights in those days) and Dickie Cox put through his own goal to give the visitors a first minute lead. Bill Brown and a Braisher penalty then put us in front before we ran out of steam to eventually lose 4-2. Our line-up for both games was: Kipping, Crump, Cox, Rance, Badrick, Greenwell, Varney, C. Simmons, Brown, Braisher, Britnell.

We then had to wait until1955/56 before reaching this round again, losing 3-1 at home to Burton Albion. Our first win came in 1959/60 by 4-2 at home to Wisbech Town. We then lost at Fourth Division Watford in the second round by 5-1 (my first ever away match). As a non-league side we were never very lucky in the draw regarding playing Football League teams and only met this

sort of opposition six times out of 26 appearances. In 1973/74 we beat League opponents for the first time when two Steve Perrin goals and one from Dylan Evans saw off Fourth Division Newport County by 3-1 at Loakes Park. On the other side of the coin, as a Football League side we have lost to non-league opponents once. That was in 1997/98 when Basingstoke visited Adams Park. Although two John Cornforth goals (one a penalty) seemed to have given us a comfortable passage through to the second round, they staged a late rally to earn a replay. Again the game finished 2-2 with Steve McGavin scoring twice. We then lost the penalty shoot-out.

In 2000/01 we drew Harrow
Borough at home and little did we
know that our easy 3-0 win was the
start of a journey that was to
provide us with so many incredible
memories as we reached the Semifinals. Whatever happens today it
would be too much to think we
could repeat that feat but, after last
season's Carling Cup campaign,
who would bet against it! Anyway, it
would be good to reach at least the
third round with the chance of a big
pay-day against one of the top
dogs.


