The players are enjoying their football at the moment and can't wait for the next game to come along. We will remain confident, committed and strong as a group and do all that we can to finish as high as possible.





I think it is incredible that, on a Tuesday night in January, 147 supporters made it down to Yeovil. After so many games over the festive period, that really is a great effort.


The weather at Huish Park was terrible and for the first 30 minutes or so, they must have wondered what they had let themselves in for.

### GOOD DAY FOR THE FA CUP

I thought that last Saturday was a very good day for the FA Cup.

There have been recent comments that the competition was losing its interest amongst supporters, and one of the main reasons for this was the lack of shock results that bring a lot of romance to the competition.

Last Saturday changed all that. Results like those achieved by Oldham Athletic, Huddersfield Town and Havant & Waterlooville made it a great day for the FA Cup.

Well done also to Chasetown for their magnificent run and all the publicity that it has brought to the area.

With so many Premier League clubs falling at the third round stage, it raises the real possibility that a club outside the 'big four' can get to the final or even win the competition and that too would be very good news for the FA Cup.

As far as we were concerned, although it would have been nice to have won at the first attempt, it was still good to be involved in the fourth round draw on Monday. We look forward to Tuesday's replay at Millwall with cautious optimism that we can finish off The Lions in their own Den.

I said before the fourth round draw was made that it would be good to be paired with one of the big Midland clubs because that would give us a bigger incentive in the replay than Millwall.

While Coventry City may not have been the first choice for many of our supporters, it would be an attractive tie. A local derby, played in a superb new stadium, which we have not played at before, and these days we give ourselves a chance of winning whoever the opposition.

Let us not get ahead of ourselves, however. We need to beat Millwall first. If we do that, the tie at the Ricoh Arena will take place on Saturday, January 26th and ticket arrangements will be announced via www.saddlers.co.uk and the local press. Any replay would take place at the Banks's Stadium on Tuesday, February 5th (kick-off 7.45pm).

### LIVERPOOL RIGHT TO SAY 'NO'

It was something of a cheek for the Administrator of Luton Town to ask Liverpool to forgo their share of the gate receipts for last Sunday's televised FA Cup tie at Kenilworth Road.

No-one wants to see Luton Town, or any other club, go under, but clubs, like we have done, need to survive through living within their means.

Liverpool were correct to refuse the request. They may be a big club with huge resources, but they also have big overheads and why should they be asked to subsidise a club that has fallen into difficulties through mismanagement?

Our stance here at Walsall FC is that clubs who 'chase the dream', and as a result of living beyond their means hit financial difficulties, have to face up to their responsibilities and shouldn't expect other clubs to bail them out.

It is unfair on those clubs like ourselves who try to live within their means.

Taking this theme further, I feel very uncomfortable about clubs who have come out of Administration, having paid off their creditors a few pence in the pound to cover outstanding debts, then start splashing out on substantial transfer fees.

It is morally wrong and gives football a bad name.


"It has certainly helped to bring the best out of me and the aim is to maintain those high standards and push on.

"We don't want to get too carried away, but a place in the play-offs or beyond is certainly not out of the question if we keep working hard and believing in ourselves."



### FORMER WALSALL PLAYER PASSES AWAY

FORMER Walsall player, Harold Peace sadly passed away recently at the age of 84.

A player of great speed and skill, he served The Saddlers between 1944 and 1946, where he turned out alongside the likes of future England goalkeeper, Bert Williams and the legendary, Gilbert Alsop.

The diminutive front-man, who was a popular figure amongst the Walsall fans of the time and earned the nickname 'Nipper', had to retire from the professional game upon leaving Fellows Park due to a knee injury.


He went on to serve Hednesford Town before returning to his home-town club, Darlaston Town.

A humble and gentle man, he was living locally in Willenhall with wife Nora at the time of his death.

His funeral takes place this coming Monday at All Saints Church in Darlaston, commencing at 1.45pm.



"Both sides tended to cancel each other out at the start of the second period, but we managed to increase our lead through Rory Curtis.



### BYFIELD HELPING ROBINS FLY HIGH

HAVING joined Bristol City earlier in the season, former Saddlers'

striker, Darren Byfield has played his part in helping The Robins mount a promotion challenge.

Despite failing to establish a regular starting place in Gary Johnson's side so far, the 31 year-old's early goal in the 2-1 New Year's Day victory over Coventry City was his eighth of the campaign.

"If I show the right attitude and continue to score goals, I will keep my place in the side," he said. "I've done well when coming off the substitutes' bench on a number of occasions this season, but you don't really want the tag of 'supersub'.

"Obviously if I am on the bench and come on to help the team get three points, I will be delighted, but I want to be playing regularly.

"There is healthy competition in the squad and that can only be a good thing. We've all found ourselves out of the side at some point and it helps to keep you on your toes.

"We're all fighting to get in and if we are fighting and doing well, it means that the team is doing well."

Birmingham-born Byfield joined The Saddlers in the summer of 2000 after failing to make the break-through at Aston Villa. During his time at Villa Park he was loaned out to a number of clubs in order to gain valuable experience, but it was at Bescot Stadium where he really came to prominence.

He scored 11 goals during his first season at the club as we secured an immediate return into what is now known as The Championship, with his 109th-minute strike against Reading clinching promotion at the Millennium Stadium in that never-to-be-forgotten play-off Final.

The goal immediately gave him a place in Walsall FC



folklore and he went on to notch a further six strikes for the club at the higher level before a transfer deadline day switch to Rotherham United in March 2002.

His performances for The Millers prompted a move to Sunderland just under two years later where he hit five goals in 17 outings - most of which came off the bench.

His next port of call was Gillingham before going on to serve Millwall last season where he hit an impressive tally of 16 goals.

CARL ROBINSON: Welsh International midfielder who joined Walsall on loan from Portsmouth in July 2002, scoring once in 11 League outings while at Bescot Stadium. He moved to Sunderland in March 2004 and helped them win The Championship title in 2004-05, since playing for Norwich City and Toronto FC.


DAVE ROBINSON: Former Birmingham City central defender who helped Walsall reach the FA Cup fifth round in 1974-75, netting three goals in 165 third division games prior to joining Tamworth in July 1977 and also managed Oldbury United. He now works for West Midlands Hire, living in Sutton Coldfield.

JOHN ROBINSON: Irish wing-half who was a Wolves reserve prior to joining Walsall in March 1947. He made his League debut in that month's 2-2 draw at Port Vale, playing five third division (south) games before being released in May 1948. Later living and working in Wolverhampton, he died in October 1981.


MARVIN ROBINSON: Ex-England Schoolboy striker who played for Derby, Chesterfield, Notts County and Rushden & Diamonds before joining Walsall in December 2004. He netted four goals in ten League games, moving to Stockport in March 2005, then playing for Lincoln, Macclesfield, Oxford United and Cambridge United on loan. Currently out long-term injured having been involved in a car crash late last year.

SIMON ROBINSON: Midfielder who joined Walsall from Alvechurch in December 1991 and made his solitary League appearance as a substitute in the following month's 0-0 draw at home to Cardiff City. He moved to Halesowen Town in January 1994, then played for Worthing, Wealdstone and Worthing again.

DARREN ROGERS: Skilful, overlapping left-back who overcame a cruciate ligament injury to make 58 League appearances for Walsall prior to joining Stevenage Borough in October 1997. He suffered further injury soon afterwards and was released but subsequently revived his career with Evesham United.



### THE STORY OF OUR SUCCESS

THOUGH we had beaten Mansfield Town 4-1 and Hartlepool 2-1 in the first two rounds of the FA Cup, there was little to suggest that we could seriously trouble our third round opponents, Arsenal, who were on their way to the first of three successive Division One Championships.

Our League for was not particularly good and in our previous four games we had lost 5-0 at Stockport, drawn the return game 0-0, achieved another goalless draw at Hull and had been held to a 1-1

home draw by Barnsley.

Our prospects did not seem to be helped either by an injury to skipper, Sammy Langford, who had been an ever-present up to that point. Sadly, he did not play League football again, rounding off his career with Dudley Town.

Manager, Bill Slade had moved Jack Bennett back from midfield to defence where he had previous experience from his days with Birmingham City and Blackburn Rovers. Arsenal meanwhile were without England defender, Eddie Hapgood and manager, Herbert Chapman also made changes in midfield and attack with Norman Sidley and Billy Warnes being tried out. However, with stalwarts like Alex James and Cliff Bastin in their side this was not expected to make any real difference.

How wrong such thoughts were. Nearer the truth was the dream of one of our directors, Harry Lake, who a few days before had 'seen'

Sid Bird took over as captain and won the toss, choosing to kick 'down the slope' towards the Laundry End. Away we went in blue and white striped shirts borrowed from Coventry City and though the gate of 11,149 was lower than expected (increased prices seemed to have taken their toll), they were soon soaring as our right-winger, Billy Coward threatened the visitors' goal in the opening minutes.

Shortly afterwards Arsenal goalkeeper, Frank Moss appeared to

handle outside his area as we launched another attack. Referee, Arthur Taylor did not see it that way, though, and in all fairness, he didn't penalise some of our defenders' tackles about which winger, Cliff Bastin complained about in his book which was published over a

Bastin did get in at least one powerful shot in the opening exchanges that our goalkeeper, Joe Cunningham brilliantly saved, but

we had our fair share of the early play.

Could we stay the pace after a pulsating first half that ended goalless? The answer soon came. With just 14 minutes gone in the second period we forced a corner on the right. Visiting defender, George Male mis-kicked Freddie Lee's flag-kick and so Lee was given another opportunity to deliver.

This time our wingers' kick reached the head of Gilbert Alsop who made no mistake in front of the Hilary Street end. Alsop was having a fine game and a few minutes later he bore down on goal again. Although goalkeeper, Moss cleared on this occasion, young defender, Tommy Black reacted to what he felt to be Alsop's unduly robust

He kicked out as the ball was cleared and Alsop went down. Chris Ball squared up to Black and mayhem reigned for the next minute or so. Referee Taylor managed to restore order and awarded The Saddlers a penalty.

In what was only his third game for us since arriving from Coventry, Bill Sheppard stepped up to drive the ball low and hard into

the back of the net.

Once again hats and programmes were flung into the air in celebration and the roar continued almost non-stop for the remainder

Cunningham made another great save from Bastin and kept out a fierce drive from Black who was trying to make amends for his earlier error. We continued to have our fair share of the play with Ball hitting

It had just turned ten past four (the kick-off was 2.30 in those prefloodlight days) when the final whistle sounded. Those fans inside the ground and the many that had gathered outside celebrated and rushed to tell everyone the fantastic news. In those days there was no television and radio results did not come on air until 6.20pm.

Just a few days later we beat Mansfield Town 8-1 in the League game that has been rearranged because of this FA Cup tie. A fortnight later, 52,085 were at Maine Road to see us take on Manchester City in the fourth round, but there was to be no repeat of our heroics as we went down by four goals to nil.

We did, however, lose only four more League games and ended the season in fifth place in the old Division Three (North).

### SIPPORTERS RECOLECTIONS



I WAS ten years of age at the time and used to attend matches with friends of the family who looked after the refreshment kiosk near the Laundry End.

For this particularly game they refused to take me because of the larger-thannormal crowd that was expected and they couldn't guarantee my safety, as they would be working.

Instead I positioned myself on the grass bank behind the Laundry End. There were supporters on the railway track waiting for the opportunity to try and sneak in. It was very dangerous but people just couldn't afford the admission fee.

I can recall the noise that went up when the goals went in and the joy on the faces of everyone after the game.

### **KEN GREENWELL (86)**

I WAS just eight years of age at the time and went to the game with my friend, Ray Perry and his dad. It was one of the first matches that I had attended and I was extremely excited in the build-up.

We positioned ourselves on the half-way line as Ray and I were pushed down to the front so that we could see properly. There were lots of youngsters at the game and more girls than usual. In fact, my future wife, Irene, attended the game with her father. I didn't know her then but 12 years later we were married and later discovered that we had both been at the game!

I don't recall too much about the actual match but when we scored the crowd surged forward and I ended up on the running track around the pitch and had to be helped back over the wall!

There was such a roar at the final whistle and we stayed behind for around half-an-hour to celebrate with the other supporters. I am glad to have been a part of it.

### **ROBERT NEWTON (84)**

I WAS 11 at the time. I went to the game with my dad who was a staunch supporter and had been so most of his life. He even used to go to away games.

My dad was only 5'2" tall and I recall that he took along a block to stand on so he could see the game properly. We stood near the Laundry End and I went to the front with the other kids.

We rattled the boards at the front so much that the noise scared the Arsenal players. We never stopped making noise all game and my hands were sore at the end!

We left pretty sharpish at the final whistle and walked home to Darlaston. My brother went to celebrate in Walsall Town Centre where the butcher was giving out free meat in Walsall Market.

My dad was tee-total so he didn't have a drink to celebrate but I can still see the smile on his face to this day!

Gilbert Alsop was my favourite player and I was fortunate to meet him on a number of occasions over the years.

### TED MUNFORD (85)

AT THE time of the game I was 17 years of age and actually a West Bromwich Albion supporter!

People used to go and see all the local games in those days and I was keen to see what was a big match for the area, particularly as Arsenal had numerous International players in their side.

Unfortunately I couldn't afford the admission fee so had to be content with watching the events unfold from the Wallows Lane bridge.

I can seem to remember an Arsenal player falling over the wall around the perimeter of the pitch and into the crowd.

Even today, at the age of 91, I take a keen interest in all local clubs.

### **ALBERT HARRIS (91)**

I WAS 12 years of age at the time and although I followed the club, I couldn't afford to attend the Arsenal game.

Instead I went to the old picture house in Station Street where the final score was displayed on the screen and everyone cheered!

I have followed the club home and away since the 1930s and despite moving around the world during the war I have always kept a keen interest and attended matches whenever possible. I am still-coming along to matches today and take great pleasure out of seeing the team performing well under Richard Money.

MR. GODWIN (87)

IT WAS only the second game that I had been to and watched from my brother-in-law's shoulders.

I can still vividly recall the Walsall lineup from that day and Arsenal had a few players that I had heard of.

We thoroughly deserved our victory and I have never seen so many hats thrown into the air at the final whistle.

### FRANK HUGHES (86)

I WAS born in Hilary Street, right next to the ground, and was nine years of age at the time of the match.

My friends and I knew that something special was happening and had heard of the likes of Gilbert Alsop and Cliff Bastin, so four or five of us went along to the match and managed to get in.

I had never seen such a crowd and whilst it is fair to say that we didn't pay too much attention to what was happening on the pitch, I started following the club regularly after that and have been a supporter ever since.

After the game I can recall following some of the players back to Pleck. They were obviously in very high spirits and had toasted their victory with the odd beer or

Apart from a time away in the Royal Navy during the war, I have followed the club closely both home and away over the years and still have a season-ticket.

The club has played a big part in my life and I have many happy memories of past matches and former players.

### **GEORGE THOMAS BATES (83)**

I RECALL that the club put the admission prices up for the game and as a result, the unemployed in the area couldn't afford it so they stood outside and were let in for free at half-time to swell the crowd, as the ground was only about half-full in the first

Our penalty came about following a blatant and cynical foul that sparked an angry reaction amongst the Walsall players and crowd. It certainly added a 'needle' to the game after that with retribution in the minds of the Walsall players.

Arsenal brought with them a drake as mascot and at the end of the game it was caught and most probably ended up on someone's dinner table!

The Walsall players were carried home shoulder high later in the evening after celebrating their fantastic victory.

**RONALD ADEY (90)** 

JOE CUNNIGHAM: Our 6'1" goalkeeper was a Scotsman who had previously played for Aberdeen, Newport County and Queens Park Rangers before joining us in the previous summer. He played in 53 successive games before linking up with



York City early in the following season. Later playing for Dartford where he shared in another giant-killing act as they beat Cardiff City 3-0 in the FA Cup first round in November 1935.

JACK BENNETT: Hailing from Nottingham, he had reserve

team experience with Birmingham City and Blackburn Rovers prior to joining The Saddlers in the summer of 1932. His early games for us came in midfield, but from the Arsenal game onwards, he played on the right flank of defence. He staved with



us until the summer of 1938, totalling 210 games before ending his playing career with Wellington and Long Eaton.

SID BIRD: Our skipper and left-flank defender played non-League football in the north-east before joining Fulham in 1928. He came to us in the summer of 1932 and was ever-present in the next two seasons, totalling 97 games before returning north to play for Spennymoor and Brandwood.



GEORGE LESLIE: A strong central defender who was a native of Slough. He also arrived at the club in the summer of 1932 and totalled 97 games over the next three seasons, though laid low by injury in his latter career with The Saddlers



JOHNNY REED: Provided a powerful presence on the right side of midfield, he was another north-easterner before settling in the Midlands and playing just once for Wolves in 1930/31. He came to us in the latter part of 1931/32 and played



mainly on the left flank of midfield before moving over to

the right just three months prior to the Arsenal game. He had a full-blooded reputation and, in fact, was sent off in the next round of the FA Cup. He totalled 141 appearances for us before injury ended his career when he was still in his 20s. He later scouted for us during Ron Jukes' time as Chief Scout of the club.

HARRY SALT: He had League experience with Brighton, Queens Park Rangers. Crystal Palace and Brentford before joining the influx of new players to arrive at Fellows Park in the summer of 1932. He played in the opening games of the



new season but was battling away in the reserves when the call came for him to replace Jack Bennett in midfield as the latter moved into defence. He held his place for a few more games and then lost it to new signing. George Wiles. He later played for Yeovil and worked as a school caretaker. Though he only played ten first-team games for The Saddlers, one of them was the most famous in our history.


BILLY COWARD: A right-winger who was born in Windsor and played for his hometown club before breaking into League football with Queens Park Rangers in 1927. He was yet another new arrival in the summer of 1932 and played regularly



in his one-and-only season with us, scoring eight goals in 39 games. He then moved on to Yeovil Town and then Bath City.

CHRIS BALL: He was born in Leek and played for Coventry City, Bristol Rovers and Bristol City before joining The Saddlers in February 1932. Wearing the number eight shirt, he played a mainly midfield role and in only his fifth game for the club was

sent off once more against Crewe - and



by the same referee, a certain H. N. Mee! In between he had a prominent part to play in the victory over Arsenal. Totalling 122 outings and 23 goals by the time he moved on in 1935, he later served Colwyn Bay, Cradley Heath and Brierley Hill.

## TEN HEROES

GILBERT ALSOP: Hailing from the West Country, he played for Bath City and Coventry City before joining us in October 1931 and scoring on his debut against Doncaster Rovers. He got 15 goals by the end of that first season and was on 13 by the time of the Arsenal game. Going on to




notch 29 goals in 1932/33, 40 in 1933/34 and an amazing 48 in 1934/35. Early the following season he moved to West Bromwich Albion, but he had very little opportunity at The Hawthorns and moved on to Ipswich in May 1937, where he helped them gain a Football League place in the summer of 1938. Our fans were delighted when he returned to Fellows Park in November 1938 and though we had to apply for re-election in that first season back, he scored 29 times in 34 games, scoring 16 goals in five games at one stage, including four hat-tricks. He was equally prolific during war-time games both for us and a number of other clubs. His tally was 61 goals in 101 games and by the time he retired from League football in 1947, his tally for The Saddlers was an incredible 169 goals in 222 League and Cup games. He was player-coach of our third-team for a time and then played for FH Lloyds where he was employed as the goals continued to flow. Later he served us as groundsman and attended games right up until his death in 1992. Standing at just 5'9", he was a handful for any defence and his service to the club is being marked today with the unveiling of Executive Box 1 as The Gilbert Alsop Box.

BILL SHEPPARD: A County Durham lad, he played for Crook Town before signing for Liverpool in 1925. He moved on to Watford without breaking into the first-team at Anfield, but started to score regularly and this continued during spells with Queens Park Rangers and Coventry (

with Queens Park Rangers and Coventry City. He had been with us only a month when he played such a dramatic part in the win over Arsenal. He found the net regularly for us in 1933/34 then moved on to Chester City only to come almost straight back to us and continued scoring. Five of his 29 goals in 82 games for The Saddlers were from the penalty spot - the first of them against Arsenal. He left us in 1935 and later played for Tunbridge Wells Rangers and we were saddened to hear of his death in 1950 at the age of just 43.

FREDDY LEE: He was born in Yardley and played for Yardley White Star before joining

Coventry City in 1930. He then joined the influx of players who arrived at Fellows Park in the summer of 1932 and scored on his debut against Hull City. Netting in the first two rounds of the FA Cup against

BILL SLADE (Manager): He was born in Walsall in 1898

and had served Coventry City as director and acting manager before succeeding Peter O'Rourke as our boss in February 1932. Within months he had signed Joe Cunningham, Sid Bird, Jack Bennett, George Leslie, Johnny Reed, Harry Salt, Billy Coward, Chris Ball and Freddy Lee.



all of whom were destined to play against Arsenal. He led us to fifth place in Division Three (North) in 1932/33 and 1933/34, but as his signings started to drift away, he was replaced by Andy Wilson in October 1934, just 18 months after the Arsenal win. But what an achievement it was!

HARRY WAIT (Trainer): Joining us from Darlaston in

1923 aged 31, he proceeded to miss only four games over the course of the next six seasons. A talented goalkeeper, he later became trainer of the club (the old word for physio) and was on the trainers' bench for that game against Arsenal. In 1935/36 he played five more games in goal for The

Saddlers at the age of 44 and on one remarkable occasion played in our first-team whilst his son (also Harry) turned out for our reserves. He later served us as groundsman until 1960 and lived in Wallows Lane right up until his death in 1975. We are pleased to have his son, Bert, here today as a guest of the club.

### SUPPORTERS RECOLLECTIONS...

I WAS certainly at Fellows Park on the day of the game, but unfortunately, as you will see, I don't have any personal recollections of the match.

My father was a lifelong supporter of The Saddlers and made sure that he obtained his Arsenal ticket early because a full house of over 20,000 was expected.

Because of the anticipated crush, my mother stayed at home with a neighbour whose husband was also at the match but as they had no radio, television or telephone, they had no way of finding out what was happening.

Therefore they decided to walk to the ground from our house in Pleck and arrived to find out from the man on the gate that Walsall had just scored their second goal! He also told them that there was no danger of a crush as the gate was half of what they expected and so let them in for free.

Where do I fit in to all of this? Well, my mother was six months pregnant at the time and I wasn't born until three months later but I have always been able to say truthfully that I was at the match, even though I didn't see any of it!

I still have my father's original programme and fondly remember one story that he always recounted.

An Arsenal supporter was standing next to him (there was no segregation in those days) and this man was obviously confident of a big win for his team. So much so that he had brought along a cribbage board and pegs to make sure that he didn't lose count of the number of goals they scored!

50 years later we beat Arsenal 2-1 at Highbury in the Milk Cup - a game which I do remember seeing! I started watching the club regularly at the start of the 1937/38 season, when I was just four years old, so this is my 70th year of watching Walsall.

I am pleased to say that my son and grandson also have season-tickets and have been regulars at matches from an early age like myself, even though they both live in the wilds of Shropshire!

MALCOLM H. GILBERT

I have my late father, Donald to thank (!) for my lifelong obsession with Walsall FC ever since we made the short journey from the Yew Tree Estate (which technically is over the border in WBA territory) to see an FA Cup game in 1966. Was it down to the fact that The Saddlers were in sparkling form or was it because as a country we were still bathing in an after glow of being crowned World Champions? I will leave you to decide.

In the event, Walsall won 2-0 against St. Neots Town, with Colin Taylor and Alan Baker on the scoresheet. It did not matter that we had scraped home against a non-League outfit, or that Frank Gregg had missed a penalty, I had the bug and I am still afflicted. I have a season-ticket to prove it.

In terms of the Arsenal game, dad related how the prices of both admission and the Matchday Programme had been jacked up to double in the light of the quality of the opposition. Looking at the gate it is obvious that Fellows Park was only half full so the ploy to get extra revenue must have backfired. Not surprising really when you consider the state of the economy at the time.

Nevertheless a young Donald went to the game (paying a double schoolchild entrance fee) and bought a programme (which he subsequently lost - worst fortune!). If the price increase smacks of modern day commercialism then to illustrate a more homely side of the era, it was decided that both sides would change colours. Walsall had to loan Coventry City's blue kit for the occasion!

I think that the events of the game are well chronicled. What is not so easily gauged is the impact of the result. Apparently the BBC radio announcer for the first and only time in broadcasting history stopped reading the football results to confirm a second time the correct score. As for my dad, his school (Edward Shelley High in The Pleck) granted a days holiday the following Monday, possibly because the excitement caused would prevent the schoolboys concentrating on their studies.

### SADDLERS SENT TO COVENTRY... FOR NEW SUITS

POWER-house wing-half, Jack Reed gave excellent service to the club over the course of five years.

He played a significant role in our FA Cup victory over Arsenal. "The family recall my grandfather commenting on the state of the Fellows Park pitch for that game," said Reed's granddaughter, Pam Pedley. "It was extremely muddy and Arsenal just weren't used to playing on a surface like that.



"He also used to tell the story of how a radio show broadcast on the evening prior to the game said that Arsenal would slaughter Walsall 12-0 and this certainly fired up the players who listened to it.

"At the time he lived in Palfrey and as he walked to the Arsenal game, supporters were offering him cigarettes and chatting away excitedly. He used to walk to and from all home games, as did many of the players at the time.

"After the win, the team were taken to Coventry and were all bought new suits as a reward for their fantastic achievement."

Reed's performances for The Saddlers alerted the attention of a number of top-flight clubs, but injury brought about his premature retirement from the game in 1936.

### SILENT EXIT FOR GUNNERS

WALSALL FC Historian, Geoff Allman sadly wasn't at the game, but over the years he has spoken to a number of people who were involved in that historic event. "I will always remember Harry Wait, our trainer at the time, telling me how embarrassed he was at the tatty old bench that the Arsenal trainer, Tom Whittaker, had to sit on," recalled Allman. "Whittaker's response was that 'if it's good enough for you Harry, it's good enough for me'.

"Wait also recalled that Cliff Bastin had a powerful shot in the opening minutes which Joey Cunningham managed to punch clear, had it gone in he was sure that a goal spree would have followed.

"I have been told by a number of players that after the match, the Arsenal manager, Herbert Chapman, shook hands with each of the Walsall players before ordering the team coach to be backed right up to the entrance as his players and staff were ushered on board, heads bowed, to make their silent exit."



## BLACK GRAPES AND DARTS THE ORDER OF THE DAY FOR ARSENAL STARS

HARRY Wait was a fine clubman who spent 37 years with Walsall FC, firstly as a player, then as trainer and finally as groundsman.

It is amazing to note that the talented goalkeeper didn't actually arrive at Fellows Park until he was 31 years of age!

He was trainer on the day that Arsenal came to town and his ten year-old son. Bert, sat on the bench beside his dad for the famous game. "Pathe News had a camera crew at the game and set up in the centre circle to film the players running out onto the pitch," recalled Bert. "I can be seen on the pictures standing next to the bench.

"I had a permanent place on the bench as it was my job to retrieve the ball when it was kicked over into Orgill's Laundry.

"I was fortunate enough to be taken into the Arsenal dressing room before the game and it was quite daunting being in the presence of so many big-name players.

"To relax they had drawn a circle on the whitewashed wooden wall of the dressing room with a target in the middle and were throwing darts at it.

"In the build-up to the game, the Arsenal trainer asked my dad where he could get some black grapes from. He was told of a fruit and veg shop in The Pleck and I was given the task of showing him the way and helping him carry back the black grapes.

"The Arsenal players then ate the grapes just before they went out for the game.

"It was such a big occasion for the club and holds so many special memories for me."

### DAVID BYRNE & ADY WILLIAMS – Caretaker Managers

DAVID Byrne and Ady Williams took joint caretaker control of the club following the departure of Paul Sturrock in November 2007.

As a player, Byrne served a whole host of clubs, including a brief loan spell with The Saddlers in February 1994.

His coaching career began at Albion Rovers where he was appointed player-coach in 1996.

He then took on the role of youth team manager at Plymouth Argyle before eventually taking up a similar position at Swindon Town via a brief spell with Torquay United

Former Welsh International Williams has been an influential figure at the club since his arrival in August 2006.

He served home-town club, Reading with great distinction whilst also turning out for Wolves, Coventry



### Six of the Best

Football historian Leigh Edwards profiless six leading Swindon Town managers...

### SAM ALLEN

Sam Allen gave Swindon Town outstanding service in various capacities. Previously a clerk in the GWR offices, he spent seven years as a Swindon director before becoming their secretary-manager in July 1902. He made several shrewd signings and guided Swindon to the Southern League Championship in 1910-11 and 1913-14, also twice leading them to the FA Cup semi-finals. Taking Swindon into The Football League in 1920, he plotted further FA Cup runs and remained in charge of team affairs until becoming secretary only on the arrival of Ted Vizard in April 1933. He held that post until his death on New Year's Day 1946.

### BERT HEAD

Bert Head plotted Swindon Town's 1962-63 promotion success. Signing professional for Torquay United in October 1936, the defender moved to Bury in February 1952 and was assistant-boss before becoming Swindon's manager in October 1955. He produced several fine players including Mike Summerbee, Ernie Hunt, Don Rogers and Rod Thomas before returning to Bury as manager in August 1965. Appointed Crystal Palace's boss in April 1966, he guided them to the top-flight for the first time in 1968-69 and had a spell as general manager. He was later manager and director at Bath City and died in February 2002.

### **DANNY WILLIAMS**

Danny Williams guided Swindon Town to a promotion and League Cup 'double' in 1968-69. A former wing-half, he turned professional with hometown Rotherham in October 1942 and starred in their 1950-51 third division (north) title triumph. He made a club record 459 League appearances for The Millers before becoming trainer-coach in July 1960, then was manager prior to taking charge of Swindon in August 1965. Leaving the County Ground in July 1969 to manage Sheffield Wednesday, he then managed Mansfield Town before rejoining Swindon as boss from March 1974 until May 1978. He now lives in Bournemouth.

### LOU MACARI

Former Scotland International midfielder Lou Macari managed Swindon Town to the fourth division title in 1985-86. He won all three major Scotlish honours with Celtic before moving to Manchester United in January 1973, featuring in three FA Cup finals including their 1977 triumph. Joining Swindon as player-boss in July 1984, he also guided them to promotion in 1986-87 and second division play-offs in 1988-89. He left in July 1989 to manage West Ham and briefly Birmingham before leading Stoke City to the second division title in 1992-93. Rejoining Celtic as boss, he later managed Stoke again and Huddersfield Town.

### **GLENN HODDLE**

Ex-England International midfielder Glenn Hoddle plotted Swindon Town's 1992-93 first division play-off Final triumph. Signing professional for Spurs in April 1975, he starred in their 1981 and 1982 FA Cup Final successes and was a finalist again shortly before joining Monaco in June 1987. He helped win the French League title in 1987-88 and was appointed Swindon's player-boss in April 1991, scoring once in 64 League games while at the County Ground. Moving to Chelsea in a similar capacity in June 1993, he guided them to the 1994 FA Cup Final and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.

### PAUL STURROCK

Former Scotland International striker Paul Sturrock guided Swindon Town to promotion in 2006-07. A legend at Dundee United, he starred as they won the Scotlish Premier title in 1982-83, Scotlish League Cup twice and were Scotlish Cup finalists four times. He became their coach in June 1989, was St Johnstone's boss and rejoined Dundee United as manager in September 1998. Taking charge of Plymouth in October 2000, he plotted two promotion campaigns, then managed Southampton. He led Sheffield Wednesday to promotion in 2004-05, then was Swindon's boss for a year until rejoining Plymouth in November 2007.

### VINCENT:

SWINDON Town defender, Jamie Vincent is delighted with the way things are panning out at the Wiltshire club. "This is only my second season at Swindon, but it feels like we have achieved a lot in the face of quite a bit of turmoil," he said. "In my time here I've already played under two permanent managers, soon to be three [Maurice Malpas is expected to be confirmed as Swindon's new manager shortly], but the club has still made steady progress. Getting promoted last year was a real achievement and, despite a few set-backs this term, we're certain we can establish ourselves at this level."

The left-sided full-back is looking forward to former Scotland International, Maurice Malpas taking charge and also has been impressed with the caretaker work of former Saddlers' loanee,

David Byrne and Ady Williams. "David and Ady have really carried on from where Paul Sturrock left off," he admitted. "It was disappointing to lose Paul to Plymouth but we could understand his motivation. Now we have a new manager coming in, who looks to have a clear vision of what he wants and expects.

"I'm sure he'll be a success here and the players are all looking forward to working with him."

The festive period is always a busy time for football clubs and their players, but it has been a particularly exciting time for Vincent. "It's been non-stop football for the last fortnight, a period where we've only been able to do the minimum of training as the games are coming on a regular basis. Added to that, my wife gave birth to our third child early in the New Year so it's been a very hectic time all round!"

Adjusting to League One has been a challenge, but one the 32 year-old has relished. "It seems more teams in this League are trying to pass the ball rather than play a physical game. And as that is the way we like to play, I think we've adapted quite well to this level of football."

Indeed Vincent respects Walsall as a side that also likes to pass the ball around and has fond memories of both playing for and against The Saddlers. "Last season we had two great results against Walsall. We performed really well away, and I think we surprised a






# BRITTAIN HOPING TO MAKE BIG IMPRESSION

# iot seat

lan Crichton profiles the former Walsall players who went on to carve out a career for themselves in management

# JOHN SMITH

JOHN Smith was born in London in 1939 and he was a product of the West Ham youth system. He made 136 appearances for the club between 1956 and 1960, playing right-half and inside right and scored 23 goals to help The Hammers win promotion from Division Two.

His performances were sufficient to attract the interest of the legendary Bill Nicholson but Tottenham Hotspur were a team full of stars and Smith found it difficult to establish himself in a side that was virtually unchanged, as they became the first team in the 20th Century to achieve The Double.

Although he went on to be capped for England at Under-23 level, he was limited to only 21 outings for Spurs in four years and he jumped at the chance to join Jimmy Hill at Coventry City in 1964.

Smith gave class to a side who were gradually working their way through the Leagues and his form during the

early part of 1964-65 was outstanding until injury struck and, although he recovered, he played only a few more games before returning to London with Leyton Orient.

He played one season at Brisbane Road before signing for Torquay in 1966 and went on to have a successful two years in Devon before joining Swindon for a bargain £7,000.

Smith turned out to be the final piece in the jigsaw that saw the Wiltshire club clinch promotion to the second division, win the Anglo Italian tournament and, best of all, sensationally defeat Arsenal in the 1969 League Cup Final.

He played in every match in that cup campaign and scored three goals, including two in the semi-final matches against Burnley.

This was probably the happiest time of his career and he reluctantly left the club in June 1971 to join The Saddlers.

We offered him the job of player-coach with a view to eventually succeeding Bill Moore as manager. He missed only one of the opening 14 games of the 1971-72 campaign and scored a goal in the 3-2 defeat at Plymouth before deciding it was time to bring his playing career to a end.

His coaching skills soon came to the fore, however, and The Saddlers made a superb start to the 1972-73 season and were looking good for promotion when Moore resigned in October after an apparent disagreement with Smith over a substitution. The bubble had truly burst and with the future looking bleak both on and off-the-pitch, Smith lasted just six months in the hot-seat before being sacked in March 1973.

He later joined Dundalk but soon turned his back on professional football and at the time of his death, at the tragically young age of 49, he was working as a Steward in a Social Club in London.



# Little Doys

Andy Van Hagen and Greg Shilton look at the players who have emerged through the Walsall ranks to make it in the professional game...

BRIAN Caswell was born in Wednesbury in February 1956, and attended Wood Green High School, just around the corner from Fellows Park.

He joined The Saddlers in June 1971 and just over two years later he signed

professional forms.

Caswell had already shown his early promise, as he had already made his senior debut for the club against Chesterfield in April 1973. He was signed initially as a full-back by manager, Ronnie Allen, and he made that position his own during his time at the club, but he was also well known for his versatility, due to his ability to slot into midfield.

In his first full season, 1973-74, Caswell made 15 appearances for Walsall, and he had to wait until the following season to open his goalscoring account for the team. That came in a 2-0 home win over Bournemouth. The team were in Division Three and

finished eighth in the table, their highest finish

for nine years.

He was beginning to make an impression on the first-team and became a fans' favourite for his no-nonsense midfield displays.

It was during the 1976-77 season that Caswell had his best term as a Walsall player. Making the number three shirt his own under Doug Fraser, he made 41 appearances in all competitions, and was voted Player of the Season by the fans. He also bagged two goals against Peterborough United and Sheffield Wednesday.

His efforts were, however, tarnished by a poor campaign overall, with Walsall struggling to finish in 15th place in the division.

The 1977-78 season proved to be one of highs and lows for Caswell. He scored three

goals for the team, netting against Plymouth Argyle, Peterborough United and Portsmouth, and he also played in the 4-1 defeat by Arsenal at Highbury in the FA Cup fifth round. However, he broke his ankle during September and missed two months of the campaign as Colin Harrison and Henry Newton deputised.

Walsall went on to finish sixth in Division Three and with Alan Buckley surpassing

the 100 goals mark, things were looking hopeful.

The optimism of the previous season quickly evaporated as the team made a poor start to 1978-79, and although Caswell made 45 appearances and scored a goal against Hull City, the team slumped to 22nd place and were relegated to Division Four.

This was all forgotten about during the following campaign as Buckley returned as manager and led the team to promotion and runners-up spot with Caswell making the number 11 shirt his own and netting six goals, the most prolific of his Walsall career.

Caswell continued to be a stalwart in the team and was also part of the famous Milk Cup squad of 1983-84.

He was transferred to Doncaster Rovers in August 1985, in a move which disappointed many. During his time at the Fellows Park he had amassed 458 senior appearances and netted 19 goals. Billy Bremner had made him a top target and paid £19,000 to secure his services.

After playing only 15 games and scoring twice, Bremner left Doncaster to manage Leeds United and promptly took Caswell with him for double the money that Walsall had received. It was a move that ultimately led his career into a downturn, as he spent much of his time at Elland Road on the injury table, making only ten senior appearances for the Whites.

A loan spell at Wolverhampton Wanderers in 1987 proved to be the last football of Caswell's career and he announced his retirement as a player in the summer of that


year.

He has since taken up a coaching role in the game, and joined the staff of Birmingham City in 1990. He has also coached at both Northampton Town and Shrewsbury Town, from whom he was released in 2002 as a youth coach.
