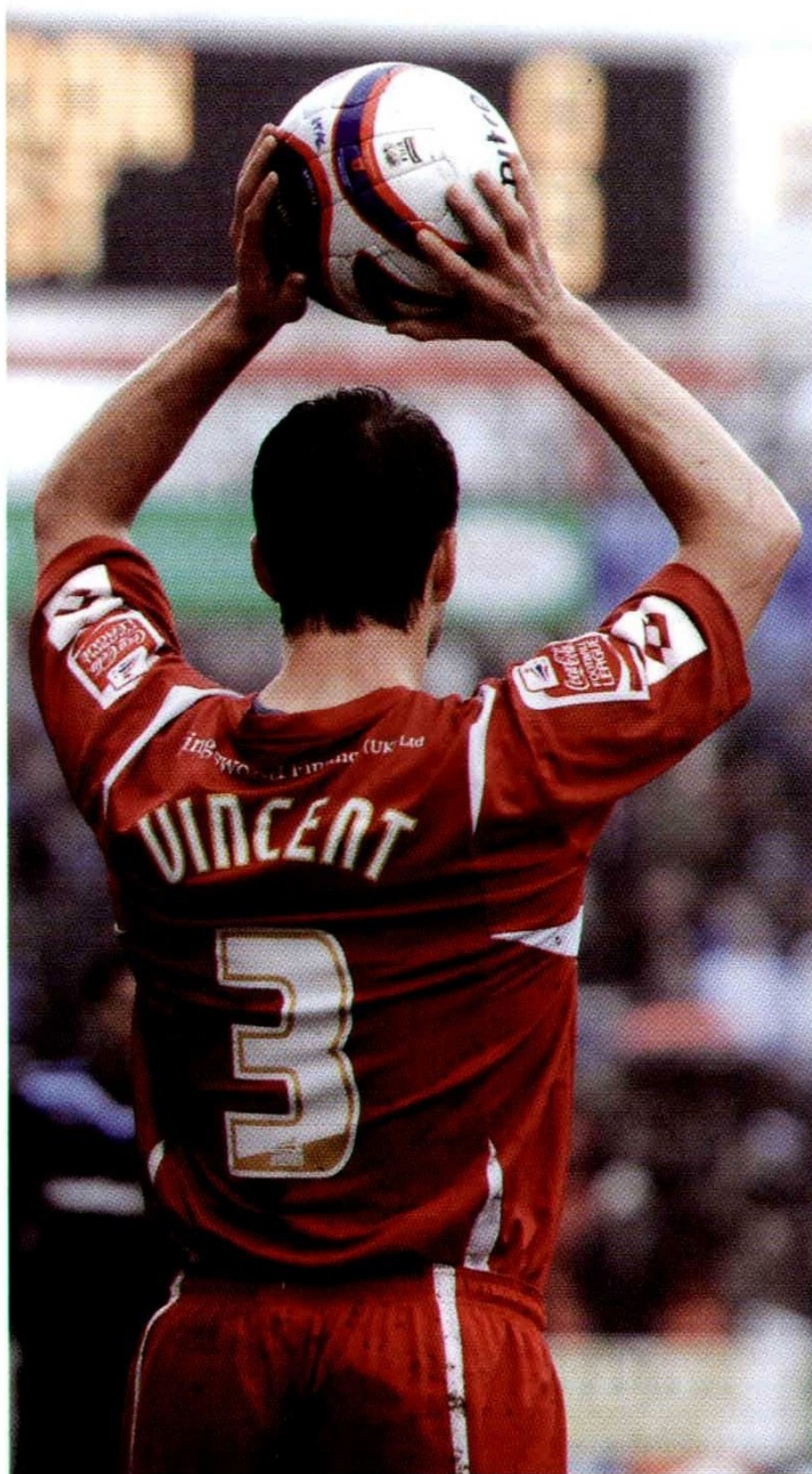

Today is a key game for us. We are back in front of our home crowd and after a win on Tuesday night; the players know they will have to put in another workmanlike performance to get a result today.

Today we welcome Northampton Town to The County Ground. David Byrne and I travelled to Sixfields last Friday night and watched Northampton play Brighton. The home side played very well and they will provide us with tough opposition today. However, this is a home game for us and we have to take the game

to them. Every game is difficult, home and away. It's not how well Northampton Town play that will determine how the game goes; it's how well Swindon Town play in front of our own fans. Paol Hubertz is a big player for them and Northampton do pass the ball well from the back, too. We have to make The County Ground a difficult place to come and if we can make a good start to the game then hopefully we can get the result we want.

Your support has been fantastic in recent weeks, both home and away. The atmosphere here for the Nottingham Forest game certainly added to the occasion. The fans I have spoken to just want to see us win and that's what we have to do, on a regular basis, here at The County Ground. We have to continue picking up points away from home. The win on Tuesday at Luton was a big boost and the three points were fantastic.

I have said all along that we need to give you something to shout about. I know the players will do everything in their power to kick-start your support from the terraces today.

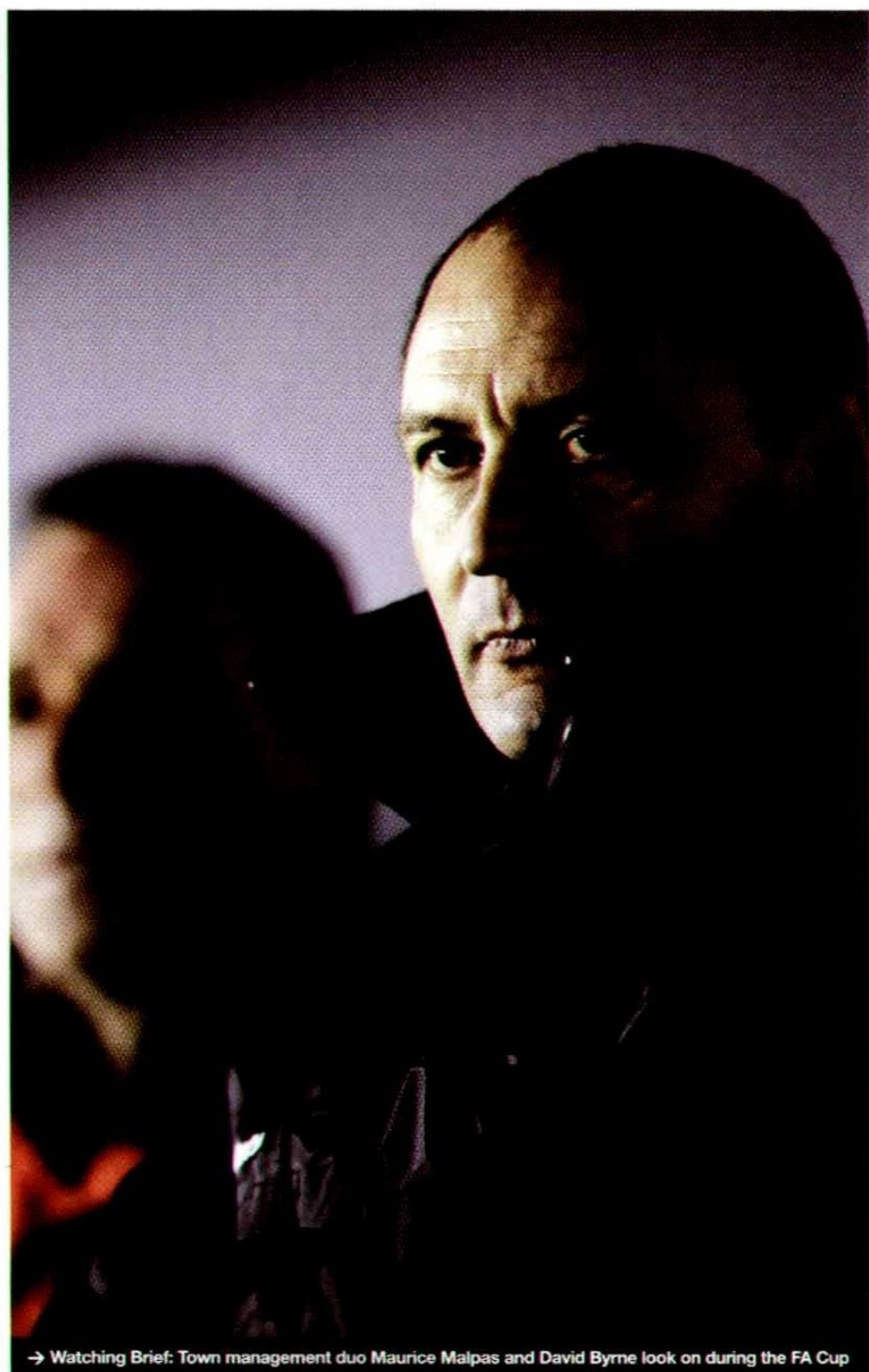

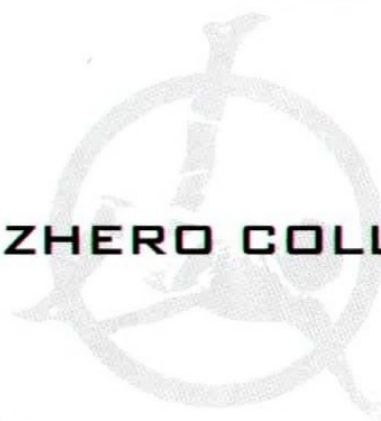

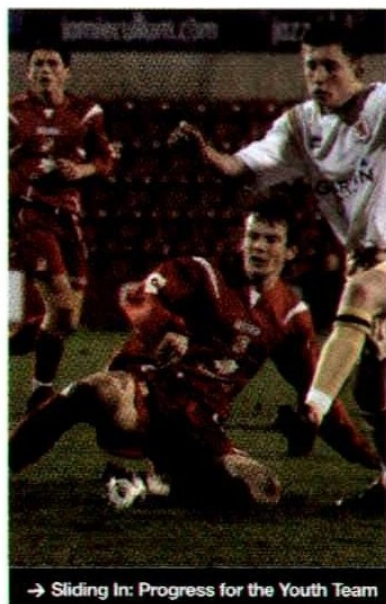

Enjoy today.



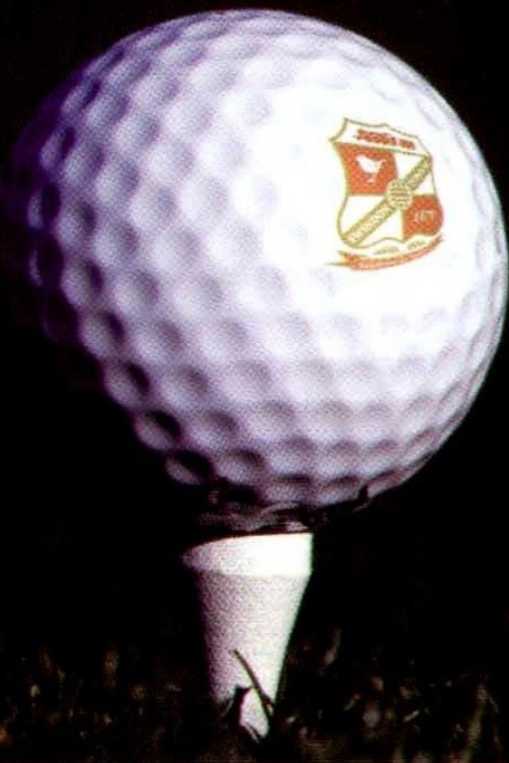

The Club would like to welcome local football team **Eldene Rangers** as well as the staff and pupils of the **Riverside Centre** to The County Ground this afternoon.

Eldene Rangers FC were founded in 2003 by Rob Nolan & Steve Street. Following enquiries from interested parents and children in the area a total of 54 players turned up for the first ever training session. Samba Goals were purchased with the help of a grant from the Football Foundation and the club was up & running. Currently they have 3 teams running – Under 12's, Under 10's & Under 7's. Their teams have progressed well over the years. 2006 saw the Under 10 A Team come runners up in the North Wilts & District League, Under 10 Central Division and the Under 10 B Team win the Swindon Town in the Community Mini World Cup Tournament at the County Ground on May 7th. Last season the current Under

10 Team got to the final of the FC Chippenham Youth Tournament and only lost narrowly on penalties. The club aims to encourage youngsters to enjoy football and not to pressure them unnecessarily. The club also likes to have a good relationship with the parents and people who help out with the running of the club. For further information please visit www.freewebs.com/erfcipaul/

The Riverside Centre, established in the summer of 2002, is part of EOTAS (Education Other Than at School), providing secondary education to children who are unable to attend mainstream school due to emotional and anxiety disabilities. Many of their children have had to deal with

various traumas – suicide/death of a parent, severe verbal or physical bullying/abuse, parents physical and mental health issues etc. Some children have missed months, or, indeed, years of school and, at Riverside, are given a chance to catch up on and complete their education and achieve up to 6 GCSEs. The majority of pupils go on to college and others to an apprenticeship or the workplace. Whilst the centre has strong support from the LEA, funds are always short and the staff often contribute to resources needed, as do several other organisations within the community. Today's visit has been made possible thanks to a donation from TrustSTFC, to whom the centre would like to say 'thank you'.

Both organisations are here today as part of the club's 'Fans Of The Future' initiative.

Swindon Town would like to offer the opportunity for other local youth football teams and schools to enjoy a day out at The County Ground at a discounted rate. In a repeat of last season's offer, STFC will make up to 300 tickets available for selected games, priced at just £1 per child and £10 per adult. 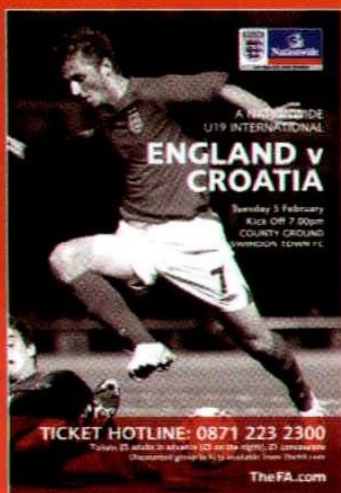

"It was an entertaining game played in the right spirit and we would like to thank the players, managers and parents for their efforts."

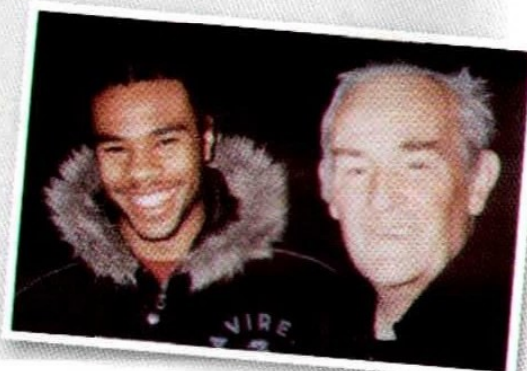

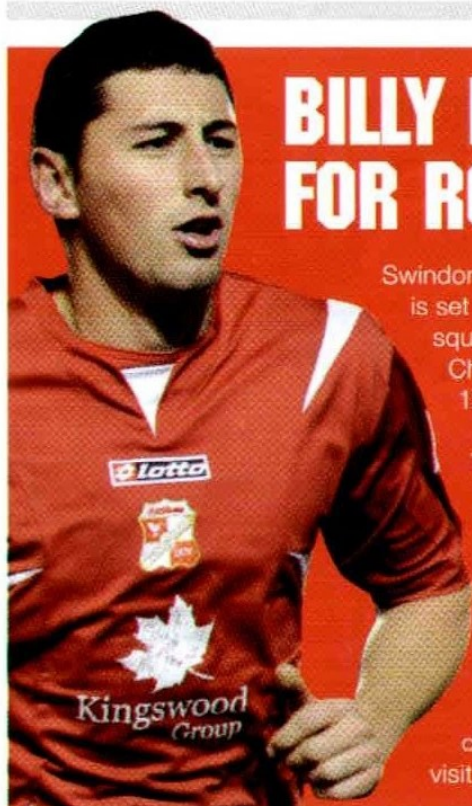

stuart gray

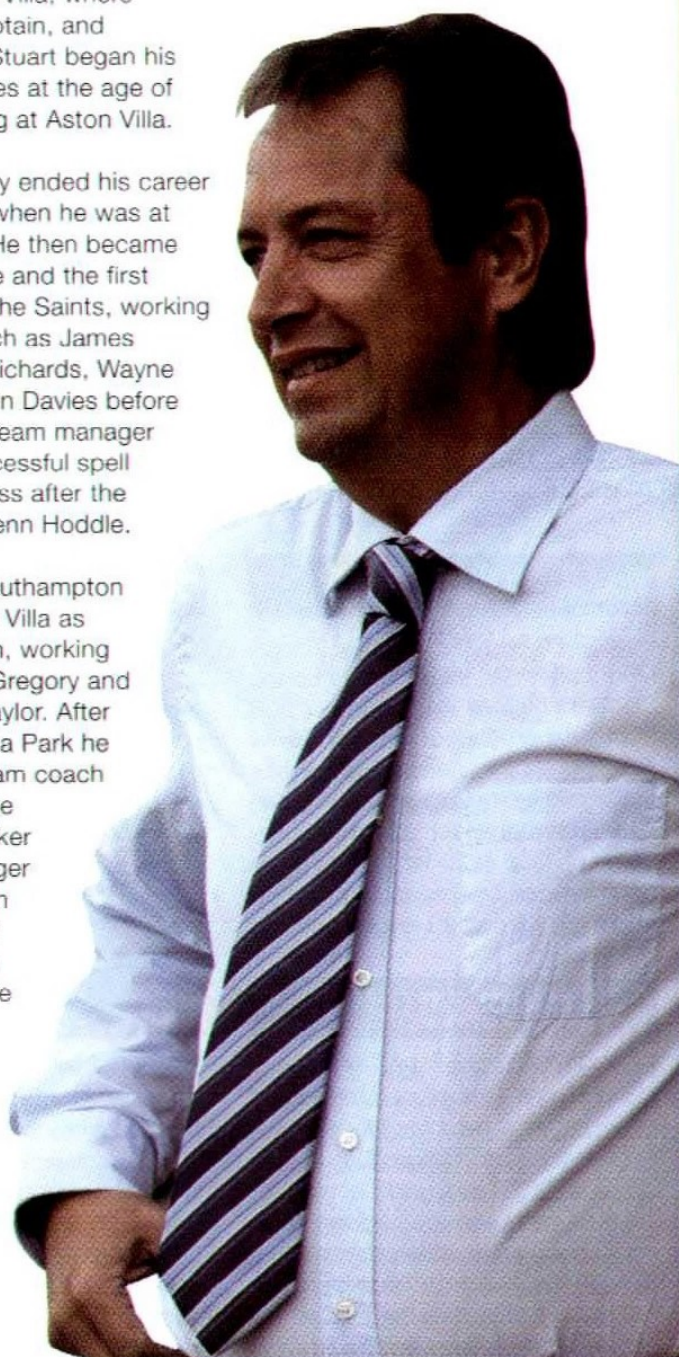
Northampton Town appointed former Southampton boss Stuart Gray as their new manager in January 2007.

In his playing career, Gray played for five clubs, as a midfielder and left-back including Nottingham Forest, Bolton Wanderers, Barnsley, Aston Villa, where he was club captain, and Southampton. Stuart began his coaching courses at the age of 27, while playing at Aston Villa.

An Achilles injury ended his career five years later when he was at Southampton. He then became both the reserve and the first team coach at the Saints, working with players such as James Beattie, Dean Richards, Wayne Bridge and Kevin Davies before becoming first team manager following a successful spell as caretaker boss after the departure of Glenn Hoddle.

After leaving Southampton he joined Aston Villa as first team coach, working with first John Gregory and then Graham Taylor. After two years at Villa Park he became first team coach at Crystal Palace and was caretaker assistant manager to Kit Symons in the season that saw Palace win promotion to the Premiership. He was then appointed first team coach at Wolves before becoming assistant manager after a spell as

caretaker manager. He achieved the UEFA A licence in 1992 and was awarded the Pro licence in 2003.

giles coke

Northampton Town signed former Mansfield Town midfielder Giles Coke for a fee decided by a tribunal in the summer of 2007. Coke, who is an attacking central midfielder, is regarded as one of the most talented creative midfielders outside of the Premiership. An excellent tackler, he is two footed with an impressive long-range shot and superb passing ability. At the age of 16, Coke began his football career as a youth team player at Queens Park Rangers, where he swiftly moved into the reserve team. However, he was not offered a professional contract at QPR, and was released. He moved to non-league Kingstonian. In the spring of 2005, Coke was spotted by Mansfield, and signed his first professional contract within weeks of being at the Nottinghamshire club. He also gave a dominant display during the narrow FA Cup defeat at Newcastle. His name had been linked with several Championship and Premiership clubs, including Southampton, Reading, Norwich, Watford and Wolves. However, Coke decided to remain at Mansfield for a further year signing a new one-year deal with Mansfield in the summer of 2006. He has rejected the offer of a new deal in 2007 to make the move to Sixfields. Although born and bred in London, England, Giles has both Ghanian and English ancestry allowing him to represent either nation at international level. He signed a two-year contract at Sixfields.

Paul 'Zippy' Bodin isn't a stranger to successful nights under The County Ground lights. A regular for seven years across two spells, the marauding left-back was privy to some of the most glorious evenings witnessed in SN1. Heck, such was his penalty-taking prowess (current squad take note) that he was often the cause of celebration, especially in 1992/93.

Yet while those days can't be taken away, they're in the past, and Paul Bodin's new role is all about the future. The 43-year-old is here to help oversee the next batch of young starlets and judging by the Under-18s' cup success on Tuesday night against Middlesbrough, he could have some serious talent at his disposal...

"It was a tremendous result. We've been quite good over the years in terms of cup results with the youth teams, and it looks like this squad will continue the tradition," beams a proud Bodin. "There is a good group of young players here and they handled the big-game situation very well [on Tuesday]. Middlesbrough boasts a number of internationals and our individual play was very good – it was a good all-round performance. Everyone played their part and there wasn't a weakness in our side."

Town regulars, especially those with children playing for the club's various age groups, will know Bodin has been in and around the club for several years. This latest opportunity, however, gives the former full-back the chance to be at the forefront of bringing back the glory days he remembers so well.

"I've been involved and people have seen me about the club a few times a week – it's been about 20 years at this club for me now. Even when I went to Bath I signed one or two loan players, so I've always had that connection. Now I'm here full-time I've had a lot of support from people. I've got a job to do and I'm here for the long term, there have been too many chops and changes

in the last five years. We want the 130 youngsters to be able to see the potential pyramid of success that could lay ahead."

The good news for Bodin is that his new employers share his vision. Andrew Fitton clearly sees the benefit of a successful youth system and Bodin's arrival, it's planned, will help bring through more Ben Tozers, not to sell on and make money, but to push for a place in Swindon's first team.

"The new regime, reading Andrew Fitton's comments, suggests that he likes home-grown players and that was one of the reasons why I came in," explains Bodin. "It's music to my ears. It's inevitable we'll have to sell one now and again and if the price is right, and it's right for the player, then that's fine. But to sell players in an effort to play the first team players' wages wasn't a good situation to be in and instead I want to see three or four players in the team. I'd like to see them play 40/50 games a season, too, maybe stay for a few seasons and establish themselves before moving up the ladder."

"Some players decide to leave and start at the bottom of the ladder at a top-flight club. Leigh Mills for example, at Tottenham, he went there as a 16 year old and found it difficult. He's 21/22 now and playing reserve football, but he should be pushing for a first team place. It's a shame. Maybe, if he stayed here for another year or two he might have established himself and gone for an even bigger fee? It's a tough predicament for players because they want to go to the top clubs, but now that the club doesn't have to sell we might see more players coming through. Lukas is another example. He could have stayed another season and become a prolific first-team player – instead he was playing reserve team football. He had a few first team outings as a substitute and has now joined Plymouth on loan. Hopefully he'll do well, but sometimes you get frustrated because you want them



to get that little bit more experience under their belt. It's all about finding the right timing."

The benefits Bodin brings to the role are obvious. He knows the area – he knows what it takes to succeed. Not only that, but he has managerial experience. The Welshman managed Bath City for three years, experience that could be vital.

"The roles are very similar. You're developing the players every week in both jobs. I also liked my players to play a certain way and that won't change – to get players to get their feet on the ball, pass it and create chances from good football. I like to play in a purist way, like how Ossie [Ardiles] and Glenn [Hoddle] liked to. Perhaps the only difference is that first team football is a bit more result-orientated – my job is to produce players for the first team manager. I'll still watch opposing teams and practice free-kicks, set your team out – it's just not as 'life or death' as first team football."

The influences of Messrs Ardiles and Hoddle on Bodin are clear, and anyone who watched the 2-0 victory over Middlesbrough in the week will see that he likes his teams to play in a similar style.

"Lou [Macari] was pivotal in bringing me here, and was very successful. The football changed when Ossie came, though. We were a pressure team under Lou and it worked, but under Ossie we went to another level," he says. "Glenn coached more and gave more thought to the opposition – Ossie would just

want us to play. If they scored four he'd be happy if we scored five! Glenn was more tactical – probably the best all-round manager I ever worked under."

Under Glenn, of course, came the 1992/93 season, of which Bodin was a pivotal player.

"I scored goals in four crucial 1-0 victories. Then there was the 6-4 win at Birmingham, 4-1 down with 20 minutes to go. And the way we played in the final... it was one of the best Wembley finals ever seen. It was like the Ossie days, 3-0 up and then three-all. I think the experience of 1990 helped us through – we'd had our time in the top-flight taken away and it was good to reach it after all. The fans deserved that. The play-off games were fantastic and there are probably better players than me that never got to play at Wembley – so I'm honoured to have been a part of it all. Even against Sunderland, we murdered them and won one-nil – they're proud moments and no one can take them away from you. I just hope we can recreate them!"

Recreating them will involve seeing more young players come through to challenge Maurice Malpas's first team regulars. Like Ben Tozer, or Lukas Jutkiewicz, for example. No mean feat, given the ratio of players that make it to the highest level. Tuesday night's win, however, saw some encouraging signs...

"To beat Middlesbrough, Barnsley – these academies spend millions of pounds and you can't underestimate just how big our achievement was. Just in terms of numbers of staff, Middlesbrough probably had eight here the other night!

"They have everything catered for, better facilities – but in saying that I'm hoping to give our boys the best coaching they can get and turn them into professionals. I give them the opportunities

and it's up to them to develop into players and well-rounded individuals. Professionalism and education are very important. It's about growing into men – not just about the football, but to produce people who can deal with life situations and represent this club on and off the pitch.

"To succeed you need an ability to overcome negative things, an ability to see things and make split decisions – their decision making has to be right and can players deal with problems under pressure," continues Paul. "Consistency is another thing, in front of the fans and the manager – not just in the FA Youth Cup but in every game, and in training, too. The FA Youth Cup does challenge players to perform on the main pitch and in front of the fans, maybe raises the expectations of them as well. When they do achieve that, like they did on Tuesday, then you wonder if this could be the team to go on and challenge the first team, you just don't know. We have 17 scholars and we're all in it together.

"It is very rewarding. When you've coached players and they play as well as they possibly can, you feel proud of them all. When you're a player you enjoy the feelings for yourself, but to get the best out of every player, it's a real achievement."

And while Bodin may have hung up his boots now he's crossed the white line for good, it might not be the last time we see the surname in the red shirt...

"My son's progressing well, he's been here since eight years of age – he'll be due a testimonial soon! He's got into the Welsh set up and won a few caps, so he's going in the right direction.

"Fingers crossed he'll have a chance to one day pull on the red shirt. It would be great for him having been born here to represent his local club..."

1 Paul McGregor

Began his career with Nottingham Forest as a trainee in 1991 and progressed through the ranks to make 30 appearances at first team level, although 23 of these came from the bench. After loan spells at Carlisle United and Preston North End, he completed a move to Plymouth Argyle in the summer of 1999. After two seasons at Home Park – which included 19 goals in 75 league starts – he left The Pilgrims to join Northampton Town. After two seasons at Sixfields he retired from the professional game. Lasted just one season with The Robins and after Brian Tinnion's departure, Heywood left in the summer of 2006 to join Brentford where he remains today and has now made 48 league appearances for The Bees.

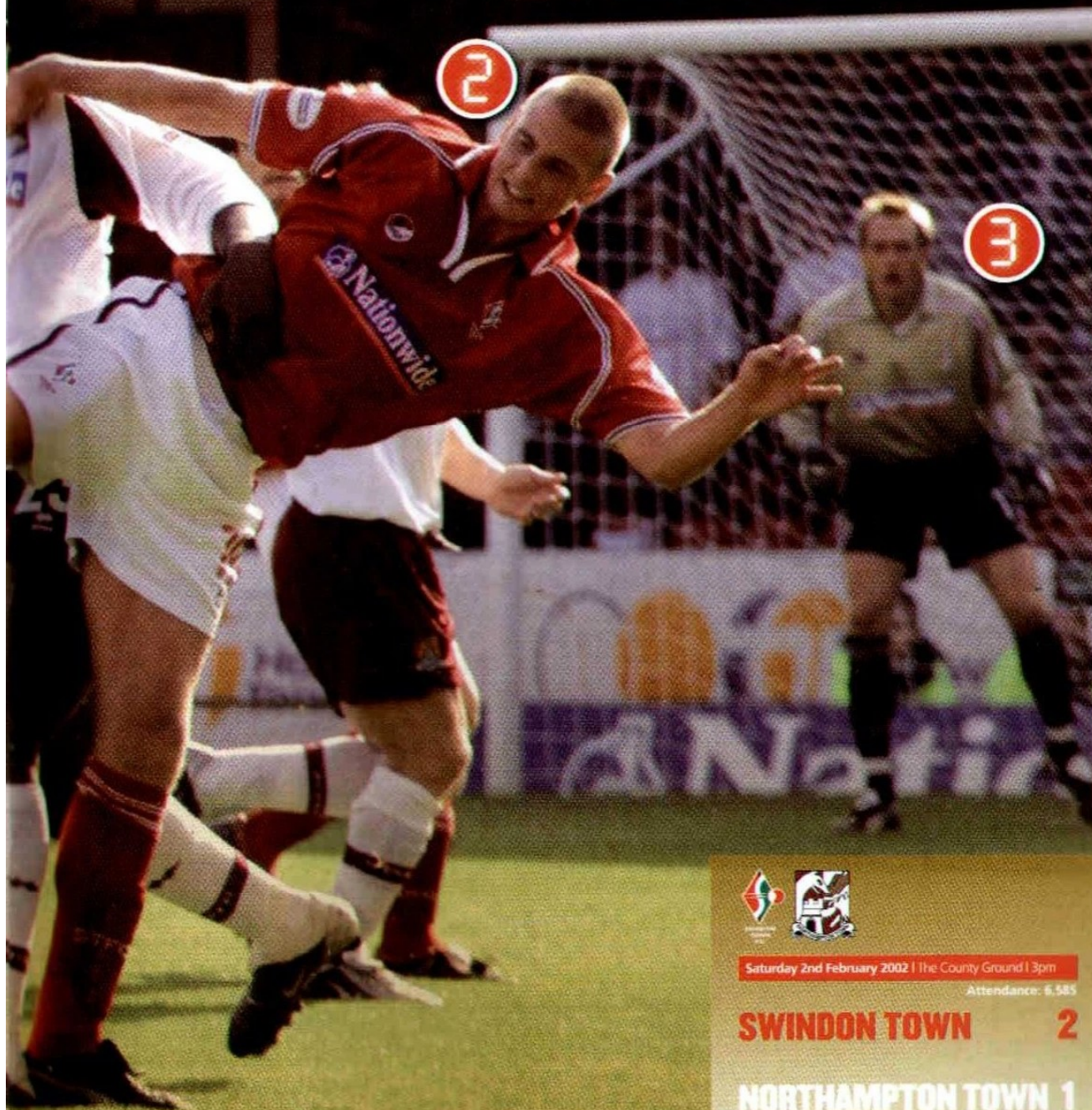
3 Bart Griemink

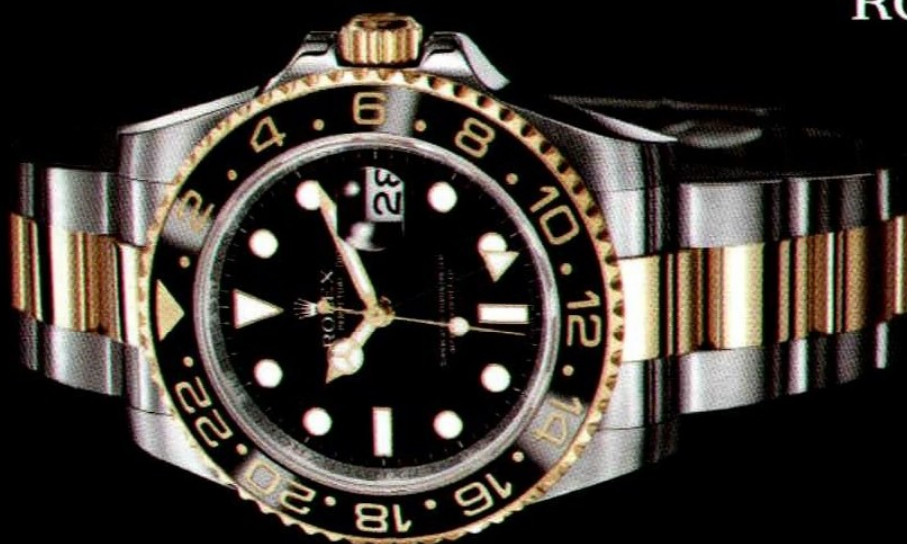

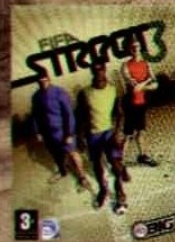

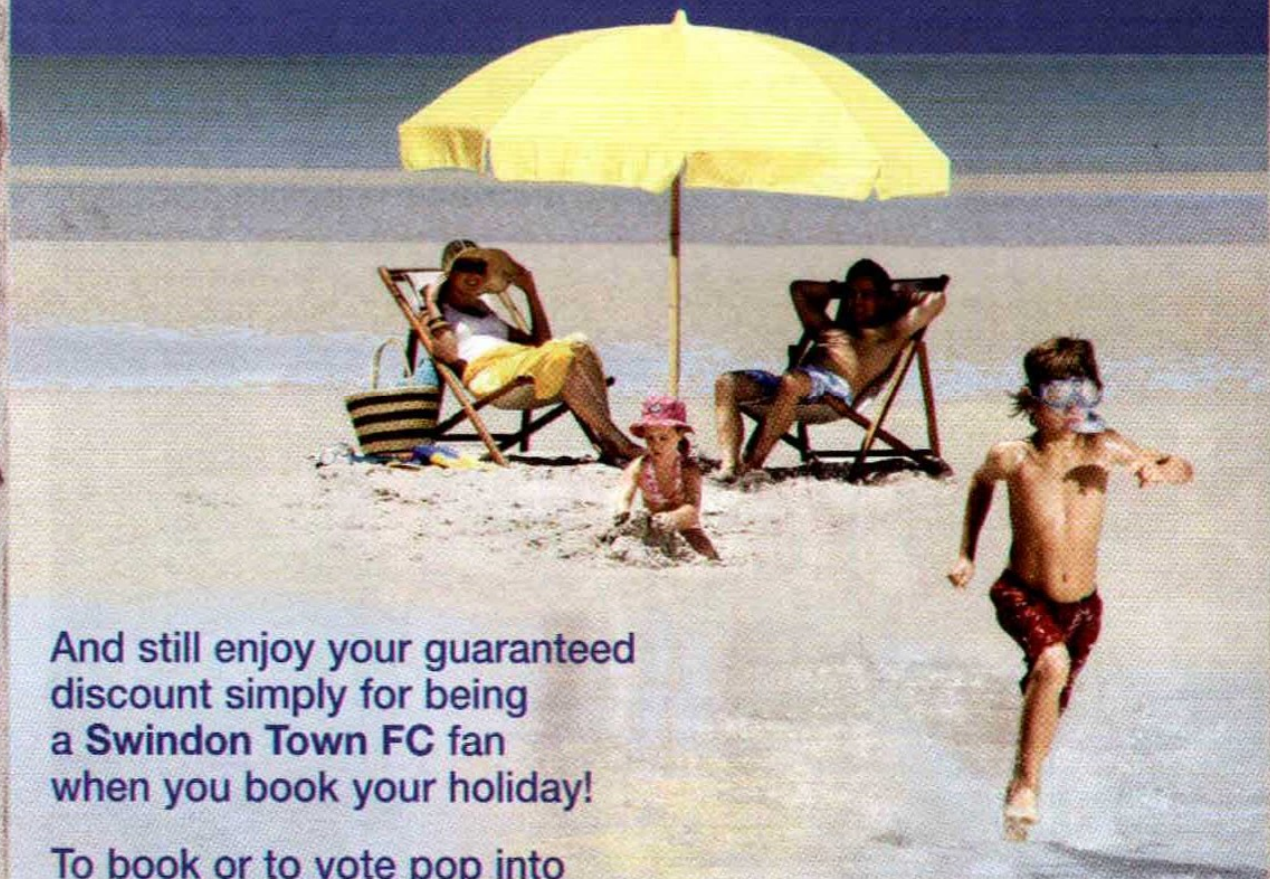
