

too; so there were some impressive performances on show.





is beginning to take shape as the Board meets with STFC supporter groups, communicates more openly with fans via the official website and the press, whilst also embarking upon early conversations with the wider Swindon community. I very much hope, that whilst is may be small improvements, supporters are beginning to evidence some change and improvement. Patience remains a great virtue.



Second-year scholars Jake Hyde, Sam Morris and Callum Kennedy have been awarded professional





Walsall appointed Richard Money as Team Manager on May 3rd 2006. He commenced his duties forthwith, although Mark Kinsella took charge of team affairs for our final home League game of the 2005/06 campaign against Barnsley.

A man with impressive coaching credentials, together with a wealth of coaching and managerial experience, Money was chosen to mastermind a major promotion challenge to regain League One status at the first

attempt.

He made 450 appearances as a player, which included England Under-21 and 'B' International caps, a European Cup winners' medal with Liverpool under Bob Paisley, a first division Champions medal with Luton Town, as well as spells with Scunthorpe United, Fulham and Portsmouth.



He was appointed manager of one of Scandinavia's top clubs, AIK Stockholm, whom he helped secure fifth position in the League in 2003/04 and a place in the UEFA Cup. His managerial career continued with short spells at Swedish club, Vasteras, where he helped them avoid relegation, before the 2004/05 season saw him take over at Australian outfit, Newcastle Jets, guiding them to a play-off position before returning to these shores with The Saddlers.

The Saddlers signed exciting winger, Lee Holmes from Premier League outfit, Derby County on loan until the end of the season on January 11th 2008.

The 20 year-old, who skippered the England Under-19 team, is a player of tremendous skill and ability. He came through the Academy ranks at Derby County, where he was under the wing of current Saddlers' coach, Eric McManus, to make over 50 first-team appearances, the first of which came when he was just 15 years of age.

He spent the second half of the 2004/05 season on loan here at Swindon Town, where his performances earned him the Young Player of the Year award, before starting last term on loan at Bradford City.

An attack-minded left winger, he is looking forward to getting regular first-team football under his belt at the Banks's Stadium and working with the talented youngsters in our squad.

Made his debut for Walsall against The Robins at The Banks's Stadium in January 2008





ANTHONY GERRARD


Born: 6th February 1986

featured against Uruguay.

Born: 29th June 1988
After failing to make it at Aston
Villa as a 15 year-old, he joined his
local non-League club, Chelmsley
Town in the Midland Combination
whilst also studying to become a
qualified builder. His prowess in
front of goal alerted the attention
of The Saddlers who brought him
to the Banks's Stadium.

As for Barnsley midfielder Brian Howard, he's gone from local hero to the centre of national attention following his dramatic last-minute winner for Barnsley at Anfield in the FA Cup last weekend. For those who like to follow the fortunes of former Townies last week's cup exploits won't have come as a big a surprise. The former Town midfielder's stock has risen exponentially after a series of influential performances for the Tykes following his move away from The County Ground in 2005 – his display against the likes of Lucas and Xabi Alonso last week merely enhancing what has already become a tidy reputation.

A lot can happen in seven days.

With Anfield's clock ticking down with the all the menace of the Countdown timepiece Howard, Captain of Barnsley, crowned an impressive performance with a superb late strike from 20 yards to dump Rafa Bentitez's men out of the competition, silence the Kop and crush the hopes of all those with 'home win' on their betting sheet the land over (this writer included).

It was the stuff of legend, the chance few footballers outside (or inside, for that matter) of the Premiership get to experience – but for Brian Howard it was the culmination of hard work and a career growing momentum ever since he switched Swindon's Red for Barnsley's.

"My phone's been absolutely red hot for a few days, but any publicity is good publicity, I can't complain," he tells STFC. "I've got to make the most of it."

And why not? For Howard knows that football can deliver disappointment as quickly as success – Swindon Town was the "I look back on my time at Town with fond memories," he says of his two-year stay. Howard joined from Southampton on a free transfer in 2003/04 and made his debut in the 3-2 home defeat against Sheffield Wednesday. He left two seasons later after 83 appearances and 10 goals, with Town fans perhaps not seeing the best of the midfielder's services.

"I was always telling Kingy I wanted to play in the centre but he had a thing about me not being defensively minded enough. The gaffer at Barnsley recognised that and bought in a defensive player to play alongside me. It gives me the freedom to get forward and score goals and I was close to being top scorer last year. I'm top scorer this time around - so I'm playing to my strengths more. I think when I was out on the wing at Swindon I struggled to get into the game as much - I don't think Town fans saw the best of me.

"I obviously wasn't too happy about the way in which I left because I felt we had the nucleus of a very good team. But football's not always going to go your way. I'm still close with Sammy Igoe, Sammy Parkin, Grant Smith – I made some great friends there – so it's one of the highlights of my career."

Howard formed part of the side that came so agonisingly close to reaching the Play-Off final in 2004, Town giving away a last-minute equaliser in a rain-drenched Withdean Stadium before losing on penalties to Brighton. Yet despite the disappointment, Howard went on to make amends two years later when, after his switch to Barnsley, the Tykes won promotion to the Championship.

"Losing to Brighton was massively disappointing," he recalls of Town's defeat. "Losing that night



Howard has gone on from strength to strength, not only in becoming Barnsley's captain but also their most consistent performer.

"Getting promoted in my second season was good and it continued into my second year. I scored a lot of goals from midfield and started to get some good press. I was rewarded with a new deal by Barnsley in the summer and now I've got 11 goals from midfield this season. People who know their football know I've been playing well this season, and that I've been doing the business week in week out. It's nice when something like Liverpool happens Ito get a bit of national attention)."

It's done more than that.

Howard's face hasn't left the back pages of the national newspapers and with the Tykes drawn against Chelsea in the quarter-finals, the club where it all began for Howard, he gets the chance to try and do it all over again.

"It still hasn't really sunk in, the fact that we beat Liverpool at Anfield and that I scored the winner," he admits. "It's been one phone call after another and to



be honest I'm living the dream a bit at the moment.

"Our attitude [before the game] was that we were playing at Anfield in the last 16 of the FA Cup, and to just go out there and enjoy it. We were all keen to make sure the moment didn't pass us by – for a lot of us it was a first time at Anfield and it could be the last – so it was a one-off opportunity to prove we could play at a high level and cause a big upset.

"After we equalised our keeper made some incredible saves; I think we were all beginning to wonder if it was going to be our day. Our keeper had come in two days before the game in an emergency loan – he only trained once and he was on a laptop the night before trying to learn everyone's names!

"In the last 10 or 15 minutes we had three or four chances and before the goal, we should have had a definite penalty. When the goal goes in it's fairytale stuff. It's probably not the best goal I've scored, but it's certainly the one I've enjoyed the most. I had my family up so we had a few beers

in the house and watched Match of the Day about 20 times over!

> "I had a bit of time at Chelsea and I still know a few of the lads there. It's going to be another big game for us, but we've only last twice at home all season so there's no

reason why we can't do it again."

You can't help but feel pride for the player many predicted could go on to have a bright future. While some Town fans argued his weight would hinder his progress Howard has gone on to carve out a good career at a high standard, not that he'd ever forget his roots.

"Andy King gave me my first chance week in week out and I thoroughly enjoyed it. I remember the highlight at Town was the side going on a really good run in my first season. The experience kickstarted my career.

"I've not heard from Kingy for a long time," he continues. "It would be lovely to say hello. He was always going to run a pub [King had a spell as a landlord near Luton, before taking up a scouting post with Plymouth] or a second hard car lot when he was done in football (!) but he was great, a real character and I thought he did well on limited resources at Swindon. Had we gone up I think it would have been a great success for the club - but I hope he saw what happened last week and felt as proud as I did.


"I was surprised to see Town go down [in 2006]. I remember they got beat in the first game that season and they never recovered, but it was a shame to see so many friends on and off the pitch go through that. It's good to see things are on the up again and maybe one day I'll be back playing as an opponent, you never know. Promotion for them isn't out of the question."

Perhaps more immediate is the prospect of Howard playing international football. His goal at Liverpool has prompted Scotland manager George Burley into enquiring into whether or not he can represent them, despite having played schoolboy level for England.

"I've had a lot of calls about playing for Scotland. I would definitely be interested in representing them. The only sticking point is that I've played for England's Under-20s in the Toulon tournament and various qualifiers, so that might hold me back."

One thing's for sure, when it comes to domestic football the only thing likely to hold Howard back is himself, and with the opportunities last week's goal will inevitably give him, you know that that's not going to happen...

Big striker who has played at the highest level with Leicester City and once moved for £1.5 million. Spent the latter part of the 2005-6 season here at The County Ground after being drafted in on loan in the unsuccessful fight against the drop from League One. After leaving Swindon he returned to Peterborough United but was sent out for two loan spells during the 2006/07 season. The first of which was at Boston United before a successful stint with League Two Walsali. 'Benj' hit two goals in eight games to help Walsali to earn promotion straight back into League One. 
Chris Westwood

His dominant displays at the back earned him accolades throughout his stay with The Pools and after 244 league starts, he made the move to Walsall in the summer of 2005. In two years with The Saddlers he made 64 league starts and helped guide Money's men back into League One as Champions with a 1-1 draw at Swindon on the final day of the 2006/07 campaign. Walsall's promotion was not enough to keep him at The Banks's Stadium though. Big-spenders Peterborough United tempted Westwood to join the Posh ranks in May 2007.

Ashley Westwood

Joined Swindon on loan from Chester City in March 2007. Played a valuable part in the end of season run-in, adding experience to the backline in what was a crucial time of the campaign. Started the final game of the season against Walsall from the bench but was introduced into the action after just 19 minutes after an unfortunate injury to Jack Smith. Returned to Chester City after the end of his loan stint at The County Ground but was then loaned out to Port Vale in the summer of 2007. Featured against Swindon at Vale Park in October and enjoyed a win over his former side. After his loan spell expired at Port Vale, Westwood returned to The Saunders Honda Stadium to link up with Chester, before signing a permanent deal with Blue Square Premier side Stevenage Borough where he has now made six league starts.





Swindon Town's Youth Team were dumped out of the FA Youth Cup on Tuesday night with Under 18's manager Paul Bodin now looking for his troops to step up their efforts.

A footballing masterclass from Charlton had seen The Addicks cruise into an early 4-0 lead before Ben Joyce grabbed a consolation before the break on a bitterly cold evening in South East London

"The Valley was always going to be a tough place to come to. It was a real uphill struggle once the goals went in but to be fair we did pick up in the second half," explained Bodin.

"It's a harsh learning curve for the players. There are lads there who have recently signed pro contracts who have to look themselves in the mirror and step up their game."

Uchechi, involved heavily from the start, saw his overhead effort strike the bar five minutes later before Scott Wagstaff, the Charlton Captain, lobbed Scott for a third from the edge of the box. It was four on 25 minutes after another defensive mix-up. Scott did well to make the initial save but the ball only fell to Ben Godfrey who had the simple task of rolling the ball into the empty net.

Cast your mind back to the transfer deadline day of August 2007 when three players arrived through the County Ground doors. Jon-Paul McGovern was joined by strikers Simon Cox and Billy Paynter at Swindon and the midfielder has now made twentytwo league starts for Town. Cox and Paynter have happily grabbed the headlines with their goalscoring exploits, often due to the regular supply of quality service from the right flank. McGovern's duties have not been restricted to the right wing though. He has also filled in a central midfield role as well as roving behind the front two. Versatility, it seems, is something the Scotsman is happy to offer. "At the moment we have such a big squad so just to be in the starting eleven is great. If I have to do a job in a different position then so be it. If the manager wants me to change positions during a game then that's something I will do for the team. "I was brought up to be comfortable with the ball and that doesn't change wherever you are on the pitch. When the new manager came in he reiterated that to me. Whoever is on the ball is effectively in charge."

The 27-year old winger now has over 150 league appearances under his belt with a variety of footballing experiences to call upon. Having started his career at Celtic, the Glasgow-born wing-man has also spent time with Livingston as well as with both Sheffield clubs, Wednesday and United.

"Celtic was a fantastic time for me," he enthused. "In terms of a footballing education I don't think you could better it. In terms of minutes on the pitch then perhaps it does hold you back a little.

> "I didn't play too many games up there because there were so many quality players. My first

> > experience of league football was on loan at Sheffield United when I was about 21.

"There were some big games at Celtic though and it was a tremendous place to learn your trade. Shaun Maloney was just coming through when I was there and the likes of Stephen McManus and Liam Miller were there too."

Promotion via the Play-Offs is something McGovern knows all about. He was an ever-present for Sheffield Wednesday during the 2005/06 campaign, which ended with a Play-Off final win over Hartlepool United in front of almost 60,000 at The Millennium Stadium. A victory made even more memorable after scoring the opener just before the half-time whistle.

"I was involved a lot that season and the Play-Offs were different class. The coverage we received at the time was fantastic and the atmosphere around the club was unbelievable.

"Winning the Play-Offs with Wednesday is probably my best ever footballing experience."

Goal celebrations have been a hot topic of conversation in Wiltshire over the past few weeks. The 'Superman' show involving Hasney Aljofree and Billy Paynter against Cheltenham Town hit the national headlines. After scoring in the Play-Off final McGovern devised his own celebration, inspired by the film Any Given Sunday.

"Myself and Glenn Whelan were watching Any Given Sunday on the coach and thought it would be a good celebration to do. It's a shark-style celebration; but there is also another one from that film that we might see here at Swindon.

"I have spoken to Lee Peacock and we have couple of ideas for future celebration, but it will probably take some work on the training ground," he joked.

So having achieved promotion via the Play-Offs once in his career, do Swindon have what it takes to make it a double for the Scotsman?

"It's great that the fans are talking about it; but from a players point of view we have to start putting points on the board on a regular basis.

"We have probably underachieved in recent weeks. There have been a few draws recently where we could have nicked a win, but that's what we need to improve upon.

McGovern added: "At the moment we are not far away from the Play-Off's but it's up to us to make it happen."



"There's still a lot of points to play for and still lots up for grabs. That carrot there is massive. We have dropped a few points recently and we need to get back on track."

Swindon do like the big match atmosphere as wins over Nottingham Forest and Bristol Rovers suggest. Although with a near capacity crowd in Town, it should definitely be an afternoon to remember. Will we see a Swindon win?
