





New terms for the 08/09 season tickets were announced last Thursday and the terms have been designed to bring football back home to The County Ground. The Board has taken this bold step in an endeavour to sign up 6,000 season ticket holders before August 1st 2008. We need your help to achieve this target.

The Board is acutely aware of how the cost of attending a football match has risen steadily over the years and in the current economic climate there is a need to be sensitive to these conditions and act accordingly. With the introduction of a Ω229 season ticket, football can once again

be enjoyed for less than £10 per match, something not seen since 1993, the last time the Robins were in the Premier League! In 1993 a litre of petrol cost 51p, the average house price was £67,875 and Indecent Proposal was a leading film! Nostalgia is not what it used to be!

Last week Bristol Rovers elected not to progress the ground share opportunity with Swindon Town. As a Board we felt that we had a duty to consult with the Swindon Borough Council, the police and the emergency services in relation to the approach from Bristol Rovers. In the final analysis we simply ran out of consulting time, before a decision had to be made. Disappointing to forsake the revenue opportunity and we will just have to work doubly hard next season to compensate.

And so it is time to rest the quill and close the ink well for this season but no season would be complete without a special thank you to everyone who has been associated with STFC these past eventful months. Staff, players, supporters, stewards and to everyone else who has played a part, thank you most sincerely, without you there would be nothing to cheer.

Enjoy your summer and the show will be back on the road before you can say Costa Tenor every match.

The programme came into existence in June 2004 and is managed by League Football

Education (LFE), a partnership organisation created between The Football League and The PFA.

LFE is keen to celebrate the success of Apprentices that have excelled educationally or in the workplace and have showed commitment to the programme so have introduced the Apprentice of the Month Award which runs throughout the academic year and in conjunction with PUMA.

The League Football Education March Apprentice of the month winner is Seanm Morrison a First Year Apprentice with Swindon Town who made his first team debut at Gillingham in April, at just 17-years old.

There was also an extensive buffet where players and management mixed with those supporters in attendance for what was an enjoyable evening at The County Ground.





kenny jackett


Having taken over the Lions hotseat in November 2007, Kenny Jackett has won 14 of his 35 games in charge to date.

Kenny Jackett, 45, enjoyed a successful playing career with Watford under Graham Taylor, being a member of the side that reached the FA Cup Final in 1984 and winning 31 caps for Wales.

Following early retirement through injury at the age of 28, Kenny held a number of coaching roles at the club before becoming head coach in 1996 with Taylor reverting to the role of Director of Football.

as manager and Jackett assisted him in leading Watford to consecutive promotions.

On Taylor's departure in 2001, Jackett also left to assist lan Holloway at QPR where he was involved in another promotion campaign. In April 2004 Kenny was appointed as manager of Swansea and guided them to promotion in his first full season when they finished third in Division Two.



Neil Harris

Neil returned to his beloved Milwall for a second time on Monday 8th January 2007 – nearly two years after leaving the club for Nottingham Forest.

'Chopper' first joined The Lions in a £30,000 deal from non-League Cambridge City prior to the transfer deadline in 1998. Barely two years later, Harris established himself as one of the most feared marksmen outside the Premiership, scoring 25 League goals in 1999/2000 (the first Millwall player since Teddy Sheringham in 1991 to do so), and attracting offers of over £1 million for his signature.

Instead of moving on, Neil signed a new improved four year deal with Millwall in May 2000, and netted a further 28 goals in 2000/2001, sharing the 'Golden Boot' with former Town striker Jamie Cureton as joint-top League goalscorer in Division Two (27).

Less than a week after signing yet another improved deal came the bombshell news that Neil had testicular cancer and following an operation he embarked on a course of radiotherapy treatment. He returned to action before Christmas and scored a sensational goal during The Lions 4-0 win at Watford on New Year's Day.

A former Liverpool triallist, Harris had been trailed by a number of League clubs, but it was Milwall's Senior Scout Bob Pearson who was most convinced of the striker's potential, which was revealed with 18 goals in his first full season, landing him the Player of the Year accolade in 1999/2000.

Having returned to The Den, Neil broke Teddy Sheringham's club record of 94 League goals and has now become the first Millwall play to net a century in League football.


Most memorable moment? The completion of the takeover. After what seemed like months of uncertainty everyone at the club was delighted with the news that the new owners had taken control.




Champions League Finalists Manchester United have enough goalkeepers to keep an army from passing, but it doesn't stop former Town loan stopper Tom Heaton from chasing the dream at Old Trafford...

Interview: Nick Judd







"There's certainly no lack of ambition. A lot of people my age share the same ambition - that drive to win things, it's a part of our pedigree - the thought of playing for Manchster United's first team is all I've ever wanted to do."


When goalkeeper Tom Heaton left Swindon Town at the end of his four-month loan period in November 2005, few people would have bet against him succeeding in achieving his dreams. The stopper had performed consistently well despite being thrown in at the deep end and playing behind a defence seemingly intent on keeping him as busy as possible. Even Andy King, Swindon's then manager who did a deal with his old mucker Sir Alex Ferguson to bring Heaton to The County Ground, believed the youngster had the necessary attributes to make it big.

"Tom Heaton is tremendous," admitted our former gaffer back in September 2005. "If I could offer 50 grand in the morning, I'd pay for him. He looks very strong, confident and you feel safe with him [in goal]."

Fraser Digby concurred. Town's legendary custodian, then goalkeeping coach and who also learned his trade at Old Trafford, could see how well the Premiership leaders had groomed one of their rising stars. "You can see he's been brought up the right way [at United]. He looks very sharp and focused in everything he does."

Town's fans even chanted 'England's number one' from the Town End following a strong of impressive performances. Sadly, King couldn't find the money to bring Heaton to Swindon on a permanent basis and he returned up the M6 to try his luck with his full-time employers.

Heaton is yet to appear in the



Reds' first team this season. The continued excellence of Edwin van der Saar is partly to blame; the Dutchman has been ever present and in fine form this season, while the emergence of Ben Foster, who missed the majority of this season through injury but impressed on loan at Watford last year, saw Heaton nudged down the pecking order. Then there's Polish stopper Tomasz Kuszczak... United haven't got to where they are today without boasting an impressive strength in depth.

Heaton would have been forgiven for thinking he had a campaign to look forward to following a promising pre-season. He'd received good feedback from his time at Town, played a prominent part for United's reserves towards the end of the year and was subsequently part of the squad that travelled to take part in the tour of Asia. With Foster ruled out with injury, it looked as though the youngster had one foot in the door.

"Training with the first team is a big factor; it brings your game on in leaps and bounds," said Heaton. "Travelling with the team to Asia [at the start of the season] was a fantastic experience for me, personally. I

managed to get 45 minutes under my belt in the final game, which was pleasing."

Sadly, the domestic tournament that Sir Alex Ferguson was hoping to blood Heaton saw United surprisingly knocked out at the first opportunity, United losing at home to Coventry City. With such a big squad at his disposal Ferguson was looking to use the Carling Cup as a breeding ground for his young stars to blossom, much like Arsene Wenger had with Arsenal's youth team in the past. Unfortunately they didn't get past the first hurdle, and Heaton returned to the reserves.

Still, Heaton remains confident that with a little bit of hard work he can still make an impact at the Theatre of Dreams.

"I just want to keep pushing forward and improve all aspects of my game. Ideally I would have liked to have gone out on loan to get some more experience, but the situation with Ben [Foster] being injured had given me a chance with the first team, which was fantastic.

"As a goalkeeper you have to be patient; everyone keeps telling me that anyway! It can be difficult



because once you've had a taste of things all you want to do is play. It's a pleasure to be working with the first team and I'm just focused on keeping my head down and working hard."

While Heaton remains confident, he admits the difference between representing the reserves and playing first-team football is substantial.

"The fact that you're playing for Manchester United, no matter what level, is something to be very proud of. But you can see in the quality of reserve-team football over the last couple of years that it hasn't been up to the standard it once was, which is a shame."

Some may argue the quality of football wasn't much better when Heaton joined Town in August 2005, the Robins experiencing a poor start to a campaign that culminated in a relegation battle they would later lose at the end of the season. Heaton, though, has his own reasons for Town's demise in 2005/06...

"It was Colin's fault," Heaton says of Colin Heath, who joined Swindon on loan at the same time from

United's youth ranks and scored once in 14 appearances before joining Chesterfield. "He was bad luck wherever he went!" Heath now plays non-league football, but United's hierarchy saw enough in Heaton's performances at Town to believe there was enough potential to help him realise his dream.

Heaton coped admirably with being thrown into the deep end. His league debut came in a crucial league game against Yeovil Town at The County Ground. He conceded a goal in the first 20 seconds, but later went on to save a penalty as Town won 4-2.

"I went there [to Swindon] to play and was prepared to fight for my place," he admits. "I had my chance and it was good fun, I felt I learned a lot on and off the field. We just didn't get the results..."

Heaton not only benefited from Digby's experience during his time at Town, but also that of Rhys Evans (returning today with Millwall), who was Town's no.1 until injury to Town's then Player of the Year opened the door for the Chester-born stopper.

"Rhys was struggling with injury when I went there, but he had a lot to say about the defence and how they played, which helped. Fraser did his apprenticeship at United and played for Swindon for many years, and so he was excellent, too."

Heaton also received constant monitoring from the Old Trafford staff during his Wiltshire stay.

Now, in waiting for his chance Heaton is hoping facing the best players in the world day in, day out will give him a decent grounding before he's finally given a chance to shine.


"Scholesy and Wazza [Wayne Rooney] are pretty fierce with their shooting," he laughs. "Another one is Dong [Fangzhuo]. When he catches the ball right, he absolutely smacks it!

Owen [Hargreaves] is another to watch out for – he can really strike a football. [Cristiano]

Ronaldo can get you with his trickery

And while Ronaldo continues to improve - the Portuguese winger scoring his 38th goal of the season against Arsenal two weeks ago - Heaton hopes he will be given the chance to try and make a name for himself at the other end of the field next season and beyond. Watch this space...

Brian Kilcline


Kilcline captained Coventry City in the 1987 FA Cup final at Wembley Stadium against Tottenham Hotspur. After being forced off injured in the game, the defender imped slowly up the famous Wembley step to receive the trophy for the first time in Coventry's history. After a brief stay with Olcham Athletic in 1991, "Killer" became Kevin Keegan's first signing as Newcastle United boss and was immediately installed as club captain. A popular figure with the St. James' Park faithful, Kilcline went on to make 32 league appearances for The Magpies. Kilcline joined Swindon in January 1994 for £90,000 afthough was unable to prevent the club's swift return to Division One. Remember those "Killer Kilcline" caps which were sold in the STFO Superstore? Now an active fundralser for a variety of charities.

Kasey Keller

Veteran keeper who now has 375 league starts to his name after an established career in English football. Joined Millwall from Portland in February 1992 and enjoyed a successful spell with The Lions, making 176 starts in just over four years. His performances for Millwall attracted the attentions of Leicester City who spent £900,000 to secure his services. During his time with The Foxes he litted the League Cup in 1997 and was a losing finalist in the same competition two years later. That summer, Keller departed for Spain, linking up with newly promoted outfit Real Vallencano. After two years with the Spanish club. Keller returned to England, this time linking up with Spurs on a free transfer. After battling for the number one spot. Keller played every minute for the club in the 2002/03 and 2003/04 seasons. Fell out of favour in the 2004/05 campaign with Paul Robinson claiming the number one spot. The popular stopper signed for Borussia Mönchengladbach in January 2005 and went on to play an important part in the side's season, helping save them from relegation from the Bundesliga. Joined Fulham in the summer of 2006 and after starting his career at Craven Cottage as back-up, is now number one.

Andy Thomson

Centreback who came up through the Town youth ranks to make 21 league starts for the club. After two years with The Robins he joined Portsmouth in December 1995 for a £75,000 fee. His spell on the South Coast was relatively successful as he made almost 100 league appearances before he was on the move again, joining Bristol Piovers in January 1999 for £50,000. A move to Wycombe Wanderers followed before a switch into non-league football in July 2004.






The Under Twelve's have also had as good season and meet Swindon Spitfires in the Wiltshire Country League Cup final.








After a reunion at Gillingham last weekend, 'Budgie' is looking forward to ending the 2007/08 season on a high with a victory over The Lions this afternoon.







"I have some great memories from my time with Millwall. Their supporters, like our own, demand 100% effort and if they can see that then they will stick with you."



I bet Millwall are a completely different club now from the one you left...

The one I left was a Championshipwinning side that made it into the promised land! That season (1986-87) was fantastic - I enjoyed all four of my years there - but that was the best. We were 10th or 12th at Christmas and then went on this incredible run. I played about 24 games that season, I missed about 18 games because of a tom thigh muscle, but Millwall is probably the club closest to my heart; the first result I look for. I remember some good encounters with Swindon, I think I even scored against them once, while playing for Watford!

What are your memories of the Old Den?

The supporters were always a 12th man. They got a lot of bad press, some undeservedly at times, but they were magnificent. I had a great rapport with them. Their fans aren't much unlike our fans here; if they can see you giving it 100 per cent they'll stick with you.

You didn't get many games after Millwall's promotion, what happened?

I stayed for a short period, but at the time there were a few players who weren't given an opportunity. I was in the first three or four squads; I travelled to places like Liverpool and Coventry, for example. Yet the players that got Millwall up for the first time in their history weren't given a go.

I would have loved to have stayed there. I went to Blackburn on loan and after three months I decided to join Plymouth. Three weeks later Jack Walker took over at Blackburn and Kenny Dalglish was manager! I have no regrets, though, because I had three good years at Argyle.

Gillingham last week, another of your former clubs...

Paul Scally's done a magnificent job there – it shows what can be done on a small fan base; they're a very small fan base and always will be. But a few fans came up to me and said 'hello' and remembered me from my time there. I was only there for a season and a bit, I scored three goals in about 30 games. It was my first club and I have fond memories of my time there.

How are you enjoying life as a coach?

It's brilliant. It took me a long time to get back in [into football], but Paul [Sturrock] brought me here and the first year was great - we're seeing some of the fruits of that year come through. Sean Morrison, Ben Joyce and Ben Tozer, of course, it's not about results at youth team level, but it's about bringing through firstteam players. Look at us compared to Plymouth, for example. They've won the under-18s league at a canter, but they haven't had any players progress to the first team. We're likely to finish second, maybe third, but we've sold two players for over £1million and another two are playing for the first team. It's about progression. Whether they play today or not, they've had a taste of it and we can build on that, maybe try and nurture a couple more through.

What sort of challenge will Millwall pose this afternoon?

I know Kenny Jackett, we played together at Watford and knowing Millwall as a club, they'll be here for three points. But we want to finish the season strongly, too. A good result means four games unbeaten and that's crucial ahead of next year.

How would you assess this season?

Good. People turn round and say we've only beaten the poor teams recently, but Yeovil went and beat Swansea! The reason we are where we are is because we've not been consistent enough. We have the ability - we showed that against Forest, Carlisle and Leeds - but we need to rectify the consistency next season, the boys know that; if we do, we won't be too far away. When I took over as manager, with Ady, we were close to closing down - so to achieve what we have done feels like a promotion. I don't think people realise how close we were to


shutting up shop.

Maurice has been saying he wants things ready for next year as early as possible, does that mean work starts as soon as this season finishes for you?

I'll have a holiday, you've got to, but work will start pretty much straight away, yes. I'll be on the phone as soon as the season finishes. Then I'm heading over to Norway; I have a friend managing out there, so I'll go and have a look at some players. I'm also going over to Ireland to have a good look at that league as well.

I read people talking about signing the likes of Sam Parkin – but players like that are on huge deals. You can't survive doing deals like that. We have a budget. Yes, we've been taken over, but it doesn't mean we'll spend what we can't afford; the reason Mr Fitton and the consortium members are successful businessmen is because they manage their money, and this club is no different.

Yet with the squad we've got, the backing we have and the possible additions we could make, it's a very exciting time to be a part of this football club – it's a great place to be.






