




notes from the manager maurice MALPAS

Tonight we welcome Northampton Town to The County Ground. It is vital we get a win to get the monkey off our back.

On Saturday we faced Southend United at Roots Hall and I felt we were unlucky not to have come away with something from the game.

There were four changes to the side and we decided to shake things up a little. Hasney Aljofree had been missing for the previous two league games so it was good to have his experience back out on the field. He came through the reserve game against Cheltenham and it is important that we use his experience well. We moved lack Smith to a more familiar role at right-back which meant Yinka Casal coming back into the fold on the other side. Michael Pook had been doing well in reserve games and in training so deserved his opportunity on the first team stage. Jon-Paul McGovern also returned to the starting eleven on the right hand side of midfield.

The game didn't start that well as I felt we looked a little nervous, but things did improve and we settled into



the game. The nervousness in the performance disappeared and we pushed on. Overall I thought we put in a decent performance, a typical away day display which up until Saturday had been serving us well. At the moment things are not going our way but once we get a result we can build on it. The longer we go without a win, the harder the task becomes. I have belief in the players we have here and I am sure

we can turn things around. Attitude will be key tonight and if the players can step up their performance from Saturday and keep the desire there – I am sure we can win the game. We need to get the monkey off our back and three points tonight would be a welcome boost for everyone.

We have had Northampton watched a few times and they are a settled side so this will be another difficult game for us. They had a good win on Saturday so will come into the game with a bit of confidence. We will have to match them for their efforts and ability and try and get the result we need.

Tonight is the first of two games at home this week and it is important that we pick up six points – that is our aim. We need to get confidence back in the team and in the Club. Three points this evening would do just that.



Both games with Northampton last season ended in a one all draw, so hopefully we can go one better this time. If we can get into the lead then our concentration levels must be high enough to not just maintain the advantage, but build on it.

The key thing for us as a side at the moment is confidence. We have to have the belief that we can achieve and make The County Ground a fortress like it was last season. It can be done and if we can keep progressing then hopefully we can put a run of results together and start climbing the league.



Swindon Town players recently attended the launch of 'Not in My Neighbourhood Week'.

Craig Easton, Yinka Casal, Jamie Vincent, Simon Cox, Lilian Nalis and Hasney Aljofree were joined at the launch which saw a distinctive white doubledecker bus heading off to tour Swindon, illustrating how local agencies are working together with local people to make communities

safer, as part of 'Not in My Neighbourhood Week'. Residents, as well as people visiting and working in



Swindon, were offered the chance to climb aboard the bus during the week and meet key staff from the different agencies that make up Swindon's Community Safety Partnership (CSP). Including staff from: Wiltshire Fire and Rescue. Wiltshire Police, Wiltshire Probation Area, Swindon PCT and Swindon Borough Council. The aim of the bus tour was to reassure people by enabling them to find out how crime and anti-social behaviour is being tackled locally, and to raise

any specific concerns or needs they have and seek personal advice.


"The Club will be wholeheartedly getting behind the Week of Action and as a squad of players; we are keen to show our support."


ranks at The New Lawn in the summer after leaving The County Ground on a free transfer at the end of last season. He has scored two goals in fifteen league appearances so far this season.

With tonight's game against Northampton Town
Swindon's dedicated One Game,
One Community fixture, Kick It
Out spoke to Ronaldo about the importance of family, community and why your nationality should not affect the game.

Tell us about your home in Portugal?

I am from an island called Madeira, off the Portuguese mainland. It is a beautiful place and I am so proud to have come from there. I do miss home, my friends, the weather, the culture and the nice beaches but I am now comfortable living in Manchester.

Football is played by so many people from different backgrounds...

It is normal within most teams to have a mix of many different nationalities. This has helped me learn about different cultures and ways of life. It has also helped me learn about different ways of dealing with things. When I joined Sporting Lisbon I lived in a house with three team mates, two were from Guinea and one from Angola. This was the first time that I had mixed with people from a different background. They still remain great friends of mine today.

Many in the Portuguese community in England were worried about how you would be treated after the World Cup. How do you feel?

To begin with I found it really difficult, all I can say is that it is getting better and I hope that this will continue and in time it will get less and less. It is sad that when things don't go well, people need to find a scapegoat. There will always be rivalries amongst teams, both local and national, but I don't believe that it helps the game when people fight because of their nationality.

What would you have been if not a footballer?

I believe it was my destiny from the beginning to play football, although it is not easy to become a footballer.

When I was a child I did not have fancy toys, like a Playstation, my parents did not have the money, all I had was my football. Lots of great players like Maradona have come from poor backgrounds and had to learn their skill sand technical abilities on the street. This helped to make them the players they become.

How important have your family been to your career?

I owe them a lot. If I am happy at home, I am happy on the pitch.
When I joined Sporting I was only 11 and I used to cry every day because I missed home. I knew that if I worked really hard I could become the player I wanted to be.


04 TIMLIN'S BIRTHDAY SURPRISE!


Swindon Town midfielder Michael Timlin this week dropped in on the STFC Study Centre to deliver a birthday surprise.

Town supporter Lisa Coe, who works in the Study Centre, was celebrating her 19th Birthday on Thursday and received a birthday card signed by the entire first team squad. And it was hand delivered by her favourite player who posed with Lisa for a commemorative photo!









The 2002/03 season failed to yield significant improvement in front of goal for the front man, who amassed more cautions than goals. Ten yellow cards, one dismissal against Peterborough and four goals meant it was a disappointing term.

Departure followed from Wiltshire as Sabin raised a few eyebrows with a move along the M4 to Queen's Park Rangers. The highlight of Sabin's stay at Loftus Road was a last minute winner in the one-nil win at Grimsby Town in October. The striker was used sparingly from then on as Rangers utilised the likes of Tony Thorpe, Kevin Gallen and Paul Furlong.

A loan switch to Boston United arrived in March 2004 although he made just two starts for The Pilgrims, Whilst Swindon were enjoying success, heading towards the League One play-offs, life for the Frenchman was proving tough

in the Capital. A transfer deadline day move to Northampton Town followed and Sabin enjoyed his stay at Sixfields. He scored five goals in twelve appearances for The Cobblers before the season was out and hit nine goals in the 2004/05 campaign.

Sabin started the 2005/06 season and netted in the 3-0 home win over former club **OPR** in what was a promising start to the new campaign for Eric Sabin 22-01-1975

Northampton. However with one goal in his opening seven games, Northampton allowed the front man to join Oxford United on a free transfer in late August.

Sabin's eight goals in the remainder of the campaign was not enough to keep Oxford in the Football League. The drop into the Conference signalled the end of a steady career in the English game for the striker, who returned to France.





Frank Fielding



Northampton Town signed 20-year old Blackburn Rovers goalkeeper Frank Fielding on loan in September 2008. He was a regular between the posts for the Blackburn reserve side throughout the 2006/07

season and has made a number of appearances for England at Under 19 level. Spent time on loan at Wycombe Wanderers last season.

Jason Crowe

A utility player who can operate in midfield or defence, Crowe arrived at Sixfields from Grimsby Town under the Bosman ruling in the summer of 2005, having joined the Mariners in August 2003. The former Arsenal trainee is a former England Youth international, who cost Portsmouth £1-million as a 20-year-old.

Giles Coke

Northampton signed former
Mansfield Town midfielder
Giles Coke for a tribunal set fee
of £70,000 in the summer of
2007. Coke, who is an attacking
central midfielder, is regarded
as one of the most talented
creative midfielders outside
of the Premiership. An
excellent tackler, he is two
footed with an impressive
long range shot and
superb passing ability.

Liam Davis

Joined the Cobblers in the summer of 2008 after being released by Coventry City. He had joined the Sky Blues as a 16-year-old from Fulham's Academy. A predominately left-footed and extremely skiful winger, he made his Coventry debut in September 2005, aged 18, in the Championship against Hull City.

Mark Hughes

The former Everton defender made three appearances for The Toffees before joining Northampton in January 2007 for an undisclosed fee. A composed centre-half who is comfortable bringing the ball out of defence, Hughes is also a regular goalscorer from both


the penalty spot and in open play.

Danny Jackman

The former Gillingham defender joined under the Bosman ruling in the summer of 2007. The left back, who can also play left midfield, started his career with Aston Villa. He was named the Northampton Town Player of the Year in May 2008 at the end of his first season at Sixfields and signed an extension to his contract in July 2008.

Andy Holt

Signed for the Cobblers under the Bosman ruling after leaving Wrexham in the summer of 2006 and can play either at left-back or on the left of midfield. He joined Wrexham from Hull City in the summer of 2004 and in his first season at the Racecourse Ground he won every Player of the Year award available.



Adebayo AKINFENWA

Burly striker who could have been running out in Swindon colours this afternoon after coming close to a switch to The County Ground in the summer of 2007.

Held talks with former Swindon boss Paul Sturrock but after a medical assessment, Sturrock decided against signing the player who was recovering from injury. Eventually made a comeback with a short spell at Millwall before joining Northampton in January 2008.

The striker's career took off when he signed for Torquay United in July 2004. He scored 14 League One goals during the 2004/05 season but was unable to help the club avoid relegation to League Two. In July 2005, he moved to Swansea City after rejecting a new contract at Torquay, with Swansea paying £85,000 to secure his services. He scored the winning goal in the 2006 Football League Trophy final, in which Swansea beat Carlisle United 2-1.

Akinfenwa also helped Swansea reach the League One promotion play-off final in his first season. At the end of the 2006/2007 season, he rejected a new contract with Swansea and after recovering from injury, joined Millwall, where he spent two months.

After a successful end to the 2007/2008 season at Sixfields, he signed a new contract in the summer of 2008.

With two goals from his last three games, free-kick specialist Danny Jackman is hoping Northampton can continue their good form with another result at The County Ground.

Jackman was on target with a curling free-kick on Saturday as The Cobblers registered a three-nil home win over Yeovil Town. And the former Aston Villa trainee insists the Northampton camp is a great place to be at present.

"It's a happy dressing room at the minute and we were all pleased with the win on Saturday," explained the midfielder.

"We went 2-0 up early on but 2-0 is a tricky scoreline because

if Yeovil pull a goal back then it's a different game but we got a third goal and overall I think we put in a very professional all-round performance.

"We kept the ball well at times and even though we know that we can still do a lot better, some of our passing was excellent."

Northampton are now just four points off the play-off places and Jackman is well aware just how competitive the division is.

"It's a very tight league and if you can put a little run together then you can really move up the table.

"We've managed to win three on the bounce but we now need to keep that momentum going."

With Jackman set to continue in the heart of midfield for the visitors this evening, the 25-year old is expecting a tough test against The Robins.

"We've got two tough away games this week. Swindon have

been struggling a little bit at home but even so we know it will be a really tough game as they have some very good players.

"I think this is a club that is going places and if we can improve upon where we finished last season (9th) then that will be good steady progress.

He continued:
"The team is performing really well at the moment, I wasn't happy with my own form at the start of the season but hopefully if I can get a good run in the team I can keep improving as well.

"I do enjoy playing in centre midfield but left-back is my natural position. I'm just happy to play anywhere really though and the main thing is for me to just get a good extended run in the team."



With six appearances to his name in a Swindon shirt, **Yinka Casal** is looking forward to the challenge of securing a regular place in the Town side.

Casal has also been named as the Club's One Game, One Community ambassador as part of the nationwide Kick It Out week. The defender gives his views on settling into life at The County Ground and his experiences of racism in football.

How have the last few weeks been for you here at Swindon?

It has been ok. The results at home haven't been the greatest but hopefully we can put that right with a win against Northampton in front of our own fans. For me personally I have been trying to get fitter and get my place back in the team.

Tonight is our dedicated Kick It Out fixture, can you tell us about racism you have experienced, in or out of football?

Luckily enough I haven't really experienced any type of racism outside of football. One incident I do remember happened when I was 16-years old. I went to Italy with Fulham to play in a tournament and we got to the semi-finals. The game was played in a big stadium and we encountered quite a bit of racism with monkey chants made towards some of the black players in the team. It wasn't nice, but it doesn't affect me because I know people who do that are stupid. I just block it out.

How does it affect you?

When it does happen it leaves a sour taste in your mouth, but you just have to block it out. I try and concentrate on the game but some players just don't want to play after

encountering things like that. I am not going to let stupid people put me off my game though.

You have played in several different countries, how did they vary in terms of dealing with racism?

The United States was a fantastic experience and there were no problems with racism out there. There is tremendous diversity out there with so many ethnicities.

In Holland there weren't too many problems; although there may be still some instances of racism going on there.


How difficult was it to move to a foreign country as a young player?

The hardest thing was leaving my family behind. For me it was an exciting experience and as a young footballer from Britain, you don't usually get to travel around so early so I felt lucky to have had the opportunities I have had.

What would you say to young people who may be the victims of racism at school or in the streets?

Just block it out and ignore it which is easy for me to say, but you just have to do it. If it gets bad then tell your parents or your teachers. Racism should not be tolerated at any level.

Swindon Town v Northampton Town 22nd February 1902

So far this season this feature has concentrated on a classic encounter between the two sides in action on the day, but the games between ourselves and our friends from Northamptonshire make that a little difficult.

That's not because there haven't been some important and exciting clashes between Swindon and Northampton. It's that it's so difficult to choose just which game to concentrate on.

A quick glance at the record books shows a huge number of goals have been shared between the two sides over the years, starting all the way back in 1902. But I think we'll leave that one for the time being.

The pre-eminent season that the clubs have in common was 1962/63. By the end of that campaign the Cobblers had finished top of Division Three, we had finished one place behind, and both clubs were promoted to the Second Division. And that's as good a place to start as any.

While there was not too much to judge between the final positions, Swindon succumbed by three goals to two at home in August, then could only manage a 1-1 draw at the home of Northampton.

Some people might need reminding that both grounds were called the County Ground at the time.

But that's a tiny part of the Swindon/Northampton story. Since that first encounter back in 1902, today's away team have stuck four or more past Swindon on no fewer than 13 occasions.

There's been a 5-0 win in Northampton in 1905, a 6-0 in 1932, and a 5-1 win in Swindon as relatively recently as 1983.

But it's not all been one-way traffic.

Swindon seem to have the better of the statistics, by beating Northampton by the same margin 14 times over the same period, including two 5-0's in 1907 and 1924, a 6-1 in 1949 and a satisfying 6-2 victory in Northampton in 1968.

There have been a few games where honours have finished even, but on 1st March 1930, the two sides still shared six goals.

That's some strike record, and an indication that today match might not finish 0-0.

But going back to that game in the Southern League in 1902, the Cobblers got the better of the goal difference, winning the game in Northampton by no less than 8-0, so bringing the score to 14 each in the 'four goals or over' table.

There were no fewer than six different scorers, and Herbert Chapman was amongst the goals with a brace.

He moved from to club to club as an amateur making three appearances for us at the start of the 1900's, and took Northampton to the Southern League championship as manager. But football knows him best for leading Huddersfield to consecutive League titles in the 20's before moving on to more success at the helm of Arsenal.

Let battle commence.



Under 18's Manager Paul Bodin offered his views on the draw: "It is regionalised in the first few rounds which gives us the




chance to face local opposition.

during training and has also missed the last two youth team games. Town are hoping both players return to full fitness as soon as possible.





You played against Plymouth in pre-season for the first team. That must have given you confidence?



The Swindon Challenge >>>

Glenn explained that he'd been offered the manager's job at Swindon and that if he took it he wanted me to go along with him as his assistant.

We talked the whole thing over and I decided it would be a great chance for both of us. I now had the prospect of a whole new challenge waiting for me. I was approaching my 42nd birthday and the move couldn't have come at a better time. When I'd told Myra [his wife] about it, she was all for it, giving me the sort of encouragement she always had, but once again I knew it was going to mean another family upheaval, with me having to

live away from home initially.
Glenn and I were due to be in charge of our first Swindon game in a home match against Watford at the end of the week. Two days before, on a Thursday morning in early April, we made our way down to the club for the announcement about us taking over. On the way we stopped for a coffee and I bought a newspaper.

"Glenn, have you seen where Swindon are in the league?" I asked. "No," he said. "They're seventh from bottom!" I told him. He'd been so excited and keen to take the job that Glenn hadn't even realised we were going into a club with a relegation battle on its hands.

1993 And All That>>>

We couldn't have got off to a better start. In the second half it looked as though we were on course for the Premiership, but things can change so quickly during the course of a football match, as were to find to our cost.

Leicester somehow managed to score three goals in 11 minutes to change the complexion of the game. Brian Little was the Leicester manager at the

> time and he told me later that he couldn't believe how cool I seemed during a game which was such a seesaw affair. With six minutes to

go Steve White, who I'd sent on as a substitute for Craig Maskell, was fouled by the Leicester goalkeeper Kevin Poole, and we were awarded a penalty. If I'm honest I'd have to say that I wasn't really sure if it was a foul, but we got our spot kick and Paul Bodin stepped up to

score what proved to be the winner. As the final minutes ticked away I turned to around to see out physio, Kevin Morris, crying his eyes out. He had been at the club for years and was Swindon through and through. The emotion was just too much for him and he couldn't believe his team were actually going to get into the Premier League.



As I was about to leave Ray Hardman, the Swindon chairman, asked if he could have a word.

"John, I know Glenn is going," he said.
"But I want you to stay and be our new manager."

To say I was taken aback was an understatement. It was just something I'd never contemplated. I had to smile to myself as I drove home and remembered what I'd say to Glenn when we'd decided to leave and go to Chelsea.

"Glenn," I said, thinking about how difficult it would be for anyone coming in. "Whoever gets the job is going to be right in the sh*t." That person turned out to be me!

The First Win >>>

Luc Nijholt came sliding in for a tackle and was immediately shown a red







card by the referee. We were down to 10 men. Later in the first half we got a corner and Keith Scott, who I'd bought from Wycombe to try and get us a few goals, popped up at a corner and scored. The place went wild and somehow we managed to hold on to that lead for the rest of the game. It was like the Alamo at times, but we did it and as a result we got our first ever Premiership win. The fans celebrated as if we'd won the league and there was a real sense of relief.

Trouble At The Top>>>

The trouble with experienced players is that you also get opinions. For the Arsenal game I decided that I wanted to play with three at the back. When I told the lads what I was planning they didn't like it. I let myself by influenced by the team and I relented. The game turned out to be a disaster for us with Campbell scoring a hat-trick and Wrighty getting another. The players had gone out and done their thing, taking it upon themselves to try and play with an offside trap that had proved to be a disaster. I was annoyed with them and let the players know how I felt, but at the same time you can't afford things like that to fester at a club. The good thing was that 48 hours later we were in action again.

The Final Curtain >>>

After A 3-2 defeat against Bristol City I went to see my old friend Joe Jordan. Joe asked me how I managed to get Swindon playing the way we did. Our football had been great once again, but we'd ended up getting beat.

"Thanks very much for the compliment Joe," I said. "But I think I'll be out of a job tomorrow.

He thought I was being stupid but I knew the recent run we'd had was the sort of thing that can get the manager the sack. I had a funny feeling about it because usually win, lose or draw a few of the Swindon directors would pop their heads around the dressing room door, but against Bristol City they were conspicuous by their absence. Sure enough I later got a call asking me to go into the club the next day and I was told the board thought it was best that I leave. The club acted properly when it came to sorting out my contract I had with them and there was no animosity. As the saying goes, "the only thing certain in football management is the sack,".

Cobblers >>>

Colin [Calderwood] put my name forward to the Northampton Chairman, David

Cardoza as a possible replacement for him. The Northampton chairman had apparently always liked the way my teams played football and I promised him and the supporters that I was going to try and do the same for them.

We were great away, but just couldn't win our home games. We had defeat in 11 games on our travels and only one win in 11 home games. The last of those 11 home games came against Leyton Orient, who beat us 1-0 after we'd played really well. Orient were managed by my friend, Martin Ling, who had been one of my players at Swindon.

"I'm going to quit," I told him when he came into my office for a chat after the game.

"Don't be stupid John," he said. "You played really well and the home results will start to come."

But my decision had nothing do with the results at our Sixfields stadium, it was all to do with the way I felt about my life. I just didn't have the desire I'd had before. I

didn't have the desire i'd had before. I didn't want to carry on doing the job. The truth was I had lost the love of my life."



We will continue to work in improving the environment for fans coming to The County Ground. We are always willing to listen and consider ideas from fans for improvement to the fabric of the Stadium to help improve your enjoyment of your visit.






