notes from the manager maurice MALPAS


It is important that we get two wins from two games after a great victory against Northampton on Tuesday night.

Throughout the night there was a positive atmosphere around the place and we have to try and take that into today's game.

If we can get on a run of results then the confidence will be flowing through the Club again.

Michael Timlin played at leftback in midweek and that was something we spoke about with him in the days leading up to the game. He slotted in there for a short while at Southend after we brought Anthony McNamee off the bench. I thought Timms did well; he talks well for a young lad and he used the ball well too. It improved our use of the ball out of defence and we used that to our advantage.

Anthony McNamee also returned to the side against Northampton and although he had quite a quiet night, he is one of our main assets. Opposition teams are aware of that because he can cause a lot of problems. He is difficult to play against and as the game went on, he got more of the ball. Hopefully we will see him in full flow this afternoon.



I thought some of our buildup play on Tuesday night was excellent. If Lee Peacock had scored when he hit the bar then that goal would have been talked about for months. There was some great passing between

the side. The movement was excellent and I think the crowd enjoyed watching what was a decent game.

Oldham are here this afternoon and they have plenty of

The away game didn't go quite as well as we let a two-goal lead slip, but Lee Peacock scored on that occasion as well. Let's hope he can find the net today.

The main priority this afternoon is three points. Tuesday was a good performance and we got the result we needed, but that is behind us now. Our focus is now on beating Oldham and if our supporters can get behind the team as they did in midweek – we will have every chance.




The front man was recently asked to sign 139 footballs as a gesture of goodwill to the Town fans who made the long trip to Hartlepool United.


A player who fans may not automatically associate with a wide midfield role, but Timlin started his Fulham career as a left-winger before being converted to central midfield by

Fulham's then Academy Director, Steve Kean.

The switch paid remarkable dividends for the player as he made rapid through the Academy's ranks and on to the international stage with the Republic of Ireland. He initially arrived at Swindon on loan in November 2006 and went on to make 24 appearances as The Robins went on to win promotion from League Two.

'Timms' returned to Swindon in March 2008 in a loan deal until the end of the season. He played ten league games, scoring once in the 6-0 home win over Port Vale in April before making the permanent switch to Wiltshire in the summer.

Timlin has been deployed on the left of a four-man midfield to good effect during Town's recent away displays, with a stifling role at MK Dons perhaps the most memorable





Lancashire-born striker who has added experience to the Latics line-up following a loan switch from Preston North End.



Returned to action and played his part in the promotion season of 2000/01 with victory in the play-off final.


Southampton was the next port of call with a £1.75 million move in December 2001. Made an appearance in the 2003 FA Cup final. Arsenal went on to win the final with Robert Pires scoring the winner.

First team opportunities in the topflight were hard to come by at St. Mary's and Ormerod was forced to look elsewhere for more regular first team action. He was loaned out to Leeds United and Wigan Athletic although did make more appearances following Southampton's relegation to the Coca-Cola Championship.

A free transfer switch to Preston North End followed in January 2006. A broken leg during the play-off semi-final against Leeds United in May 2006 was another setback, although the striker returned to action in October of the same year.

He joined Nottingham Forest on loan in March 2008 and scored two goals in thirteen appearances for The Reds. Had not made a first team appearance for Preston this term and joined Oldham on loan in mid October. Made his debut off the bench in last weekend's home draw with Leicester City.





HANDSOF EXPERIENCE

Veteran goalkeeper Mark Crossley is hoping Oldham can return to winning ways at The County Ground after defeat in midweek, despite having the lion's share of possession at The Memorial Stadium.

The 39-year old stopper made his 50th appearance for The Latics at Bristol Rovers, although defeat has not been a regular occurrence for highflying Oldham this term.

"The lads are pretty upbeat because it is only the second game of the season we have lost," he said. "We had about 65% of the possession and we certainly made enough chances in the game. I could have done better for the first goal and conceded through a set-piece for the second."

Away days are nothing new for Crossley who at 39-years old, has clocked up thousands of miles on team coaches. Despite the hours on the road, it's part and parcel of life as a professional footballer.

"It can be a bit of a nightmare, but I don't mind it," said the former Wales International.
"Finances at League One level mean you can't stay away all the time. We travelled down to Bristol on the day of the game in midweek, but with a Saturday kick-off this weekend we will travel down the day before.

"I never get bored of hotel food, it's free!" he joked. "I have done it for a while now and I really don't mind the overnight stays at all."

Crossley spent thirteen years at Nottingham Forest, ten of them alongside former Swindon player Ian Woan who is now with Premier League outfit Portsmouth

as Under 18's manager. And Crossley is also keen to follow the former winger into the coaching game.

"Woany was a pretty sensible bloke and an excellent player," recalled Crossley. "He has gone on to do well in the game and is now coaching at Pompey. I am pleased to see him doing well.

"I am going down the same route and am up to my UEFA 'A' License now. Coaching is something I want to get into when I have finished playing; it's the next step for me."

The stopper, who scored for Sheffield Wednesday on loan during the 2006/07 season, believes the mixture of youth and experience could be a key factor as the Latics bid for League One success this season.

"There is a lot of experience in the squad but the energy the young players put in is there for all to see. You play how you train and things have been going the right way this season.

He added: "If I wasn't enjoying it I wouldn't still be playing. It is great to see the young lads

here doing well and the

The Irishman has been a regular off the bench over recent games, including the midweek win over Northampton. Swindon sat down with the front man after training earlier this week and got his views ahead of Oldham's visit to The County Ground.

Well you must be delighted to be back in the squad on a regular basis?

It has been a long time coming but I have played twenty or thirty minutes in the last few games and yes, it has been great to be involved again. Things are difficult at the moment and we don't want to be down the bottom of the division and hopefully we can climb the table by getting a few results.

You have certainly worked hard to get back to full fitness though...

It wasn't easy - the physio room is a horrible place to be as a player at any club. Although it was tough getting back to fitness, the work had to be done because it lays the foundations for a return to the first team squad. I am fit now and hopefully I will be starting games soon.

How much confidence have you taken from the reserve games?

I think I have played eight reserve games and scored nine goals so it has gone well. It's a decent record although reserve team football isn't the same standard as first team games. I feel fit and playing


ninety minutes for the reserve team, regularly, has put me in good stead.


Coming into a game at a late stage is difficult for some. How do you find it?

Can you pick up the fans' thoughts when you are warming up and does that add to the tension?



Swindon Town v Oldham Athletic, Premier League 18th August 1993

It had been a long summer. Back in May 1993, Town had won the right to compete in the Premiership, and every passing day had heightened supporters' expectations for the coming season.

Town kicked off the new campaign at Sheffield United, and while John Moncur opened Town's Premiership goal scoring account, the 3-1 defeat at Bramall Lane hadn't been the fanfare that we wanted to herald our arrival.

But four days later on Wednesday 18th August 1993, Oldham Athletic travelled to Swindon for the historic, first ever top-flight football match to take place at The County Ground. Now was the time to perform in front of our own home crowd for the first time since winning promotion at Wembley.

Athletic had gone up as champions of Division Two in 1991 and in the ensuing two seasons had flirted with the drop zone with a sixth from bottom, then a fourth from bottom finish.

Town's defence was weakened

by the absence of Paul Bodin, and the forward line's potency lessened by injury to Steve White. But those taking the field that day included recent heroes Shaun Taylor and Craig Maskell, Nicky Summerbee, Ling, Fraser Digby and John Moncur.

Final Score: Swindon Town 0 Oldham Athletic 1

All names that would push for a place in anyone's greatest Town line-up.

For the away side, U-21 England keeper Paul Gerrard lined up between the posts. Neil Pointon, a £600,000 signing was at leftback, and waspish midfielder Nick Henry was along side Mike Milligan, now in his second spell at Boundary Park with a £1m move to Everton in between. Future Athletic boss Andy Ritchie was named amongst the substitutes.

An early flurry of Oldham enthusiasm put Town on the back foot as Joe Royle's side looked to put the new boys in their place, but halftime came and went without a goal for either side.

Ian Aage Fjortoft, on his home debut, failed to test Gerrard effectively, driving a shot wide of the post, and it would be 1994 before our new £500,000 Norwegian international

would find the net.

With the game entering its last 20 minutes Oldham upped the pressure, resulting in referee Dermott Gallagher dishing out three yellow cards in the space of ten minutes, before Oldham midfielder and Scottish international Paul Bernard broke our hearts at the death.

Gunnar Halle, a Norwegian international team mate of Fiortoft, fired over an 89th minute right wing cross, and Bernard headed the ball past Digby to steal all three points.

Fewer than 12,000 people attended our very first home Premiership match, surely a disappointing turnout for such a momentous occasion, and a statistic that puts the lie to the oft-believed statement that our matches that year were all sellouts. The County Ground at the time was listed as being able to hold in excess of 18,000.

If anyone needed any reminding, we finished bottom of the Premiership table, while Oldham finished just one place higher but a pretty huge ten points better off. Not that that really mattered much I suppose. The net result was still Football League action again for both clubs.



The 1980's have a lot to answer for. Howard's Way, shell suits, Chernobyl... Football was suffering, too. English sides weren't allowed in Europe, shorts resembled hot pants and Oxford United were in

the top-flight.

Still, it wasn't all bad. For Swindon, it was a decade of more ups than downs as the side enjoyed a meteoric rise up the footballing pyramid under **Lou Macari**

and later, Ossie Ardiles. In 1986/87 the Robins had to play competitive games on Astroturf for the first time. Consecutive games, too, firstly at Luton, then at Boundary Park four days later.

Oldham's visit this afternoon is a good opportunity to recall the heady days of fast football, grazed knees and ridiculously high bouncing balls synonymous with synthetic surfaces...

"QPR was the worst of the lot," says Fraser Digby of the pitch at Loftus Road. Thankfully Town never had to visit, but 'Diggers' wasn't so lucky, and he played there while representing Manchester United's youth academy. "It was basically concrete with plastic mounted on the top, the ball bounced about 200ft in the air if you hit a long clearance. If you hit it on the floor it just sped on. It was the first one I ever played on."

It wasn't just playing on the pitch you had to worry about, either. Those of us who regularly douse the knees with

Vaseline while playing five-aside football know all too well it can hurt when you go down. A lot.

"The burns were quite substantial," Digby laughs. "I wore long johns, tracksuits

bottoms, padding on the knees and elbows - you'd wear as much as you could. Sometimes it would

feel like you were wearing more than an American footballer!

"Yet you wouldn't worry about getting hurt. You'd tend to hurl yourself about and worry about it afterwards. It was worse for the defenders. If they went in for a challenge and were wearing shorts they'd come up with half their skin missing. You'd definitely see less sliding tackles...' Luton were first up for Town on a Tuesday night. Wins against

Later's Mick Har

County, Chelsea and Norwich City ensured a trip to Kenilworth Road for the Simod Cup semi-final, a game Town lost in extra time in front of 10,027.

"Mick Harford played up front," remembers Digby. "Luton's pitch was nice, playing on that was better than playing on proper turf. The difference was that Luton's pitch came years after QPR's, so it was much more advanced. You take the pitches now and they're like fake grass, you don't even get burnt on it – it's a fantastic replica, even replicating the bounce of a ball on grass."

"We were pretty used to playing on astro as we used to train at Greendown School," adds Paul Bodin. "If you were a technical player then there weren't too many problems with playing on that type of pitch.

I certainly wouldn't have wanted to play for a club who played on a plastic pitch regularly, though, as your knees would take a real hammering.

"Luton was my Swindon debut,"
Zippy continues. "We went up to
Bisham Abbey and stayed there for
a few days before the game to get
used to the playing surface. It was
an exciting time with Lou Macari in
charge. The Simod Cup provided us
with a chance to go to Wembley, but
we lost 3-1 on the night to a very good
Luton side."



Ninety-six hours later and Town had to pick themselves up following the Luton defeat and look to get back to winning ways at Boundary Park against Oldham, a team the Robins had beaten 2-0 at The County Ground earlier in the season. The trip to Lancashire followed backto-back league defeats, away at Shrewsbury and at home to Millwall. Despite Town's poor form the Reds found themselves 1-0 up at the break thanks to Jimmy Quinn's 11th strike of the season. Oldham equalised four minutes after the restart before Paul Bodin, a left midfielder in those days playing in front of Phil King

- gave Town the advantage once more. "It was on a sloping



support for the players and it was great to hear the Town chants ringing around the stands.




Oldham and is a great asset to have in the side.
