



A NEW VARNEY ON THE HORIZON?

short-term | appointment of Dario Gradi as the club's caretaker manager has ignited hope into what has developed into a fairly large squad here at the Alexandra Stadium. A summer rebuild at the club saw eight new players arrive for a substantial amount of money and that is before you consider the wage contribution being invested for loan players such as Dennis Lawrence, Kenny Lunt, the disappointing Stuart Green and the unfortunately injured Jake Livermore. With the club rightly also handing professional contracts to a further six promising Academy graduates you can see why our squad numbers have once again gone over the 30 mark.

With such competition in place, the club hierarchy and supporters entered the season with great optimism, but after an encouraging start that saw famous wins over Championship clubs Barnsley and Bristol City in the Carling Cup, our inability to achieve results on a consistent basis ended Steve Holland's tenure at the club on the 18th November. In a results' driven business, our poor form

ultimately cost Holland his job. It is the first time Crewe had to take such action for 25 years, following such a successful era under Dario Gradi.

With the club needing some necessary time to appoint a successor to Holland, in his interim position Dario has not been afraid to make changes to the starting X1. Following a disappointing second half performance against Stockport County, Dario elected to shuffle his pack. In has come the tried and trusted Kenny Lunt on Ioan from Sheffield Wednesday and his calmness in possession and experience has already made a difference to our fairly young midfield.

Shaun Miller and Calvin Zola have both been given a chance to show that they can score enough goals to emulate the likes of Nicky Maynard and there was also a change in goal with Stuart Tomlinson replacing Steve Collis for the trip to the Walkers Stadium.

Whilst that change was expected, the introduction of Colin Daniel on the left wing did come as a major surprise. The former Eastwood Town forward has emerged as a real contender following a confidence boosting loan spell at Halifax Town. Alongside another of our former

youngsters Junior Brown, Daniel prospered at the Shay, scoring five goals during his month loan. That impressive tally included a superb hat-trick against Clitheroe.

He returned to Gresty Road full of confidence and promptly scored a brace against Stockport County in the Cheshire Premier Cup. The quality of his goals in that 3-2 win certainly registered with the club's coaching staff, but it took the appointment of Dario to finally give Daniel his opportunity.

He was the surprise inclusion for our recent trip to Leicester City and he certainly didn't look out of place on what was his senior debut for the club. His only other appearances came as a late substitute against Hartlepool United nearly a year ago to the day and a brief outing at Carlisle back in August.

Daniel himself has been surprised by his elevation into the first-team picture: "I was surprised when Dario told me I was going to be in the starting eleven for the Leicester City game. I didn't expect it all and I was a little bit nervous going into the game, but once I was out there I felt all right.

"I did better than I expected because I haven't played for a while and I was worried at my level of fitness over 90 minutes at this level, but I felt fine and did okay for my first game. I was just disappointed that we couldn't quite pick up a point for our efforts."

Now he has enjoyed a taste for it, Daniel is convinced that he can start to find the net on a regular basis. The 21-year-old has brimming confidence and self-belief and he is determined to be involved as much as possible during Crewe's fight against relegation.

"I will play wherever the manager wants me to play. I will just go out there and try and do my best for the team. I arrived here from Eastwood as a winger, but have played a few game upfront and I've enjoyed it.

"I know I can score some goals. If I get a one-against-one or a foot in the box I will score a goal.

Daniel adds: "It has been a really difficult time for the club but everyone has got to remain together. If we do and the fans get behind us then I think we can still get out of trouble."

And as for the man who discovered Daniel as a promising teenager in the non-league scene, Neil Baker feels there is even more to come from the pacy attacker.

"Like many young players, Colin can be inconsistent with his play but he has come here from non-league and has needed time to settle in and find his feet at a professional level.

"He's similar to Luke
Varney in that respect
and, if he ends up half as
good as him, we'll settle
for that. There is more to
come from him and he has
just got to continue to work
hard to improve his all-round
game, because he does have a
lot of good attributes and he can
certainly take a goal."

chance of miraculously escaping the drop, but belief in the dressing room remains strong.

Written off by the bookmakers as odds-on favourites to be the first club relegated, and nobody expecting us to mount another great escape, the pressure may has unleashed a new lease of life.

Billy explains: "Dario has taken over the caretaker role and seems to be enjoying it, and we are enjoying playing under him. From our point of view, we are still excited and looking forward to every game.

"I think the fans can see now that we are trying to play a bit better. That's not necessarily a different way but the confidence is a major part in football and I think we did start to lose that at the end of Steve's (Holland) reign. Dario has come in and given us a new lease of life and we're cracking on at the moment and hopefully it can carry on.

"We are pleased not to be conceding loads of goals in a game and having to score three or four to win a game. It is a start and hopefully we can keep that going. We have a lot of games coming up over Christmas and New Year and it's always a difficult time for all sides. We know we are the side that needs the points the most so it is up to ourselves to start winning again."

Everyone was left deflated by last weekend's 1-0 defeat at Cheltenham, especially after such an encouraging performance at the current league leaders Leicester City and that FA Cup victory at Carlisle. We genuinely thought we would go to Whaddon Road and kick-start our revival. The defeat has left us rooted to the bottom and clinging on by our fingernails to those above us.

"It was so disappointing to lose at Cheltenham, especially after we had played so well against Carlisle just a few days previous. It was a massive game for us and it seems as if that is the case every week now.



For the goal they got across us again at a corner and that needs changing there because it was too easy. I will have zonal marking because we lose our men far too easily.

We have got to show a lot better quality than that because if we don't then we will be relegated. The players here have got to be doing better and if not then we will have to go out and get better players."

Caretaker boss Dario Gradi annoyed his side lost to Cheltenham due to a lapse at a corner.





"Saturday was a big disappointment because we didn't think there was a lot of quality from both sides. They defended well, had more legs in midfield and had a little bit up front. The disruption at the beginning of the game didn't help us and to lose the game from a set piece was even more disappointing."

Assistant manager Neil Baker felt it was certainly a chance lost at Cheltenham last weekend.

There is a lot of quality at the club and 1 still think everyone can beat everyone on their day. We have said that for a few years now, but this season is as close as ever in terms of the teams. We won't change, we will still go out and try and win every game we play in. We have been creating chances lately and now we have to start taking them, because if we do it changes the whole game."

The on loan Kenny Lunt still believes that Crewe are capable of going on a sustained run of results.





"I spoke to Dario and the things he said to me got me going again. I did consider going out on loan before the deadline because I just want to play games, but nothing materialised and I've been pleased that Dario has given me a chance. I have just got to knuckle down and see where that takes me."

Midfielder Ben Rix was back in the first-team picture at Whaddon Road following James Bailey's early exit.



It has been our liteblood ever since Dario Gradi elected to become our manager in 1993 instead of possibly taking up a similar offer from Bristol Rovers. If we hadn't have gone down the Youth development route, firstly with a well-organised Centre of Excellence and then by obtaining FA Premier League status in 1998, then its visionary founder Dario Gradi wouldn't have persisted so diligently as he did in those troubled first ten years.

also fully understand why players have to move on. Without the money generated by transfer sales, we would have made a substantial loss for every season apart when ITV Digital kindly gave us a couple of million for screening Football League matches.

If you consider things to be bad now, you should have been around in 1983 when the board were electing not to include a sell-on clause for David Platt because we desperately needed the £200,000 on offer upfront. Times were desperate then because the club's overall existence was at stake. We could have dropped out of the Football League entirely and gone bankrupt.

That doomsday scenario was only averted due to the hard work of Dario, our former first team coach Steve Holland, Neil Baker and countless others, because the Crewe Alexandra production line has generated over £20 million for the club in transfer sales. No club our size comes anywhere near that

given that opportunity, they are automatically placed in the shop window. Dario and the club have always had our players' best interest at heart. That is why when Arsenal were sniffing around Dean Ashton when he was just 16, we rebuked the idea of him signing for the Londoners because we wanted him to play in our first-team.

Ashton needed the experience and our supporters, who appreciate what this club stands for, deserved to see the talented youngster play for Crewe Alexandra. Despite Ashton almost immediately hitting the headlines, we were able to see a future England centre-forward lead our forward line for the first four and half years of his professional career.

When he was ready to move on, we received close to £4 million rather than the £1 million being touted about by Arsenal at the time. It is imperative that clubs like Crewe fight their corner and prevent the larger clubs from pinching our

ACADEMY REMAINS FUNDAM CLUB'S SURV

The man from Milan would have been off and we would never have experienced going to places such as Maine Road, the Stadium of Light or The Riverside. To sell the players we have and to still reach and establish ourselves in the second tier of English football was a remarkable achievement. The 'proper' fans deserve enormous credit too, because they appreciate the importance of patience and support our kids when they are finding their feet in the team. They

amount of money and many lower league clubs have tried to copy our example, but haven't had the patience to see it through.

That is why when our new manager does arrive he will have to appreciate the importance of producing our own young starlets and be prepared to give them a run in our first-team. Our youngsters are primarily groomed to appear in our first-team and as soon as they are deemed good enough to be

better players on the cheap. It may also be the case with Max Clayton, who is an emerging talent in our Academy. Dario will not contemplate selling him because he wants him to play in our first-team in the future and improve our team.

Scrapping the Academy scheme to save £500,000 or so a season

just doesn't make sense to anyone. We have spent close to £800,000 this summer, bringing in outsiders and they have struggled to improve us as a collective unit. With us selling our latest Academy graduate Nicky Maynard in the summer, we had to bring in reinforcements but at the moment none of our strikers look like emulating the goals he or his former striker partner Luke Varney were getting over recent seasons.

You could even argue that the only plus points to pick out of such a disappointing season is the emergence of Academy youngsters Michael O'Connor, James Bailey more recently Stuart Tomlinson. Perhaps if we had been further up the league table, we could have seen the likes of Ashley Westwood, Josh Thompson, Luke Murphy and Chris Clements mark their debuts for the club. Instead they are having to move out on loan to gain regular football because it would be unfair to throw them into the team in our current predicament.

The Academy system only works in this country, if you are prepared to work hard at it and give youngsters their chance. We reinvest the money we earn from

transfer sales to improve our chances of finding the next one capable of bringing enough money in keep the club in

existence. With that comes its own pressure because the management have to find a player capable of fetching £1 million every two years.

Players as good as Maynard, Varney, Ashton, Vaughan, Hulse or whoever don't grow on trees. It takes a lot of hard work, to firstly find them and develop them into saleable assets.

As Dario himself said recently: "We rely on our good young players to finance the Academy. Nicky Maynard's sale finances the Academy for two years. That is the best way for us to raise money. But what I am saying to the other coaches is we have to do better with the other young players."


"I'd be surprised if we go away from the Academy model. The quality of kids we have here will make sure we don't fade into obscurity in the future.

"It is important that the boys stay with us and that they are not lured by the bigger clubs by promises and money. We have lost one or two boys, but we have not lost the bulk of our players and that is crucial to the survival of the club.

Dario added: "We have also got to improve as coaches to make our young players even better. If you look at someone like Luke Varney, if we had been able to bring him in at a younger age he could have become a Premiership player. It could have been the same with Rodney Jack, he had the technical ability, but just lacked the no-know you need to succeed in the game."

Crewe Alexandra Football Club may have struggled on the pitch ever since we sold Dean Ashton to Norwich, but we have still been able to produce some good young players and that blueprint has got to continue in the future. We cannot ill-afford to appoint a manager, who is only interested in improving his own CV and then elects to move on at any given opportunity if the right job comes along.


We need someone who will embrace the need for producing good young players, because if he ignores our own kids or elects to bring in players from outside the club it would be a disaster for the future of his club. Cannot see it happening though because everyone here realises the importance of running a successful Academy. Dario will be pushing them forward anyhow...


RONALDO'S 'COURAGE' MAKES HIM WORTHY WINNER

Portuguese winger Cristiano Ronaldo recently ioined his fellow countrymen Eusebio and Luis Figo as the winner of the prestigious Ballon d'Or award. There wasn't much doubt that the Manchester United player was the outstanding performer over the last twelve months, but winners from these shores have been few and far between. Sir Stanley Matthews was the recipient of the first ever award in 1956 after the France Football Writer Gabriel Hanot devised the idea to reward consistency and performance.

Ronaldo becomes only the fourth ever Manchester United player to win the Golden Ball, with the 'Holy Trinity' of Law, Best and Charlton all winning the award during the 1960s. Kevin Keegan actually won the award twice in the late 1970s but had to agree to a lucrative move to German side Hamburg to do so. The last British winner was actually Michael Owen in 2001 when his goals helped Liverpool win five trophies over the calendar year.

Other than that, the recipients have usually come from footballers plying their trade in either Italy or Spain. Before 2007 (when the Brazilian Kaka won it) the award was only open to European players playing at European clubs. That explains why the likes of Pele have never claimed the award as he spent his playing career in his native Brazil and over in the United States.

The ruling has now been altered to accommodate every nationality from every club, this in turn has increased the number of journalists permitted to vote. Of the 480 points on off, Ronaldo received an incredible 446, which made him a comfortable winner over Lionel Messi of Barcelona and Liverpool's Spanish striker Fernando Torres.



RONALDO collected the Ballon D'Or award in Paris this week.

After scoring 42 goals and helping his club to Premier League and Champions League success there was only one winner in Ronaldo. His consistent performances are the essence of what this trophy is there to represent and this particular award is seen to be even more prestigious than the FIFA World Player Of The Year, that Ronaldo is also expected to walk away with.

Ronaldo has certainly become more of a team player at Manchester United and he has erased the dramatic dives that plagued him earlier in his Old Trafford career. He is a positive role model to budding footballers, because although he wants to win, he also wants to entertain the crowds who pay good money to watch him. He is a superb trainer and is dedicated to improve his allround game. You only have to look at the improvement in his goal tally and his heading ability to see the


difference time spent on the training ground can make.


One of Ronaldo's great assets as a world-class performer is his 'courage'. Cynical defenders try to boot him up into the air to stop him, or cleverly try to block him off as he tries to take them on for pace, but he just dusts himself off and goes again. He knows he can hurt them with the ball and is never afraid to get on it and demonstrate his skill regardless of the hostility surrounding him. Opposition supporters' boo and jeer him because they fear his ability and what he can do to their team.

There are very few occasions, when a player like Ronaldo doesn't fancy it or he is kept totally quiet for 90 minutes. Great players always influence matches and usually save their best when the pressure is really on. That is what makes a true champion and love him or loathe him, Ronaldo is certainly that.







Sadly, the popular Christian Roberts was forced to retire due to a knee injury earlier in the season.

If not then the club's Assistant Manager David Byrne will take charge of the first-team again after being appointed caretaker boss on 14th November.

As a player, Byrne was a well-travelled winger, who represented a staggering 17 clubs either on loan or as permanent player. He began his early career a Gillingham and Millwall before eventually finishing his professional career at Albion Rovers, where he became a player coach.

He coached the Plymouth Argyle Youth team before briefly assisting Ian Atkins at Torquay in 2006. He moved to Swindon a year later to take charge of the Youth team. His former mentor Paul Strurrack later left to return to Plymouth and he took charge in a caretaker role. The arrival of Malpass saw Byrne promoted to the role of Assistant Manager.









1'M ONE FOR

windon Town may not have started this season as well as they would have liked but things could not be going any better for their leading goalscorer Simon Cox. The former Reading youngster is battling it out with Bristol Rovers' combative target man Rickie Lambert, the prolific Matty Fryatt of Leicester and Jermaine Beckford of Leeds for the League One Golden Boot, It looks like being an intriguing race for the accolade and whoever emerges as the winner will have to score close to 30 goals in all competitions to stand a chance.

Due to their patchy league form it's no exaggeration to suggest that Cox's prolific scoring rate has kept Swindon out of the relegation places this season. His fantastic form in October saw him awarded the PFA Player of the Month Award and his impressive goal tally of 16 thus far also includes two hat-trick's against Scunthorpe United and Hartlepool United. Not that Cox is looking for personal awards, he will be disappointed that Swindon are looking downwards at the clubs beneath them rather than the teams trying to secure a top six finish.

"My expectations have always been high. I have come here to score goals and take Swindon back into the Championship and for the club to stabilise themselves at that level. That remains very much my ambition and I always demand the best from myself and my team-mates in every match we play, ' says

"We are all disappointed not to be higher than we are in the league but I have been relatively pleased with the way things have gone for me in terms of goals. I am one for scoring goals. My record proves that and I always feel I will score goals when I play consistently."

Cox has certainly been amongst the goals again this season and his former club Reading may be cursing the day they allowed one of their local lads to walk away from the club. Cox's only involvement for his boyhood club came substitute in the Cola-Cola Championship, and domestic cup competitions. He never got a sustained run in the side under Steve Coppell and was loaned out to both Brentford and Northampton before agreeing a £200,000 switch to Swindon in January 2008, following a successful loan stint at the County Ground.



Cox explains: "I was a little bit disappointed to leave Reading because I had been there for eleven years and they were my boyhood club. I never really got a chance there and I knew I had to leave to benefit my career.

"I came to Swindon on loan last season and did well. scored 9 goals and felt good. but when I went back to Reading nothing had changed. No-one spoke to me about my future and I was a little deflated by that. If I'm honest, I just wanted to get back to Swindon and start playing again.

"I was glad to leave in the end and start to play regular firstteam football at Swindon. The Reading era is behind me now and now I'm looking forward to some good times ahead.

"I came here from a Premiership club and standards have remained high. I always demand the best from myself and the team and we know we should be doing better this season."

here is no more pleasing sight in football than to witness a winger taking on his opposite number. For me it doesn't happen enough in the modern game. In the past, the likes of George Best, Sir Stanley Matthews, Tom Finney, Stan Bowles, John Barnes and Chris Waddle had supporters flocking to Stadiums to see their full repertoire of tricks and flicks. A talented winger was normally the most entertaining and threatening player on the pitch.

Thankfully, the brilliance of Cristiano Ronaldo of Manchester United and Lionel Messi of Barcelona has restored coaches faith in having a creative wide man. Those two individuals alongside perhaps Kaka and a fit Ronaldinho are comfortably the finest players on the planet.

It doesn't matter what league you are in or whatever level you play at, everyone loves to see skill and adventure. This afternoon two former Watford team-mates Anthony McNamee and our own Joel Grant may go head-to-head for the first time. Both struggled to earn the trust of their former manager Aidy Boothroyd at Vicarage Road. It seems that Boothroyd placed his coaching philosophy more on workmanlike resilience rather relying on flamboyant, potential match winners. McNammee made just 34 league starts over his six years as a pro

at Watford and was

loaned out to both Barnet and Crewe Alexandra.

Crewe supporters will fondly remember McNamee's short spell at Gresty Road. He joined in late March 2007, and made five appearances for the club before returning to much of the same at Watford. He knew he would have to leave to finally secure regular firstteam football. In doing so, he has instantly put-to-bed the myth that he couldn't play the entire 90 minutes. At Watford, he had been brought on as a substitute an amazing 60 times. The diminutive winger has already featured in 41 games for the club since signing in January and has quickly become a popular figure with the Swindon fans.

Anthony said: "I'm enjoying it at Swindon. I signed a two-and-half year deal in January and my main aim when I came here was to play as many games as I could for the club.

"I never really established myself in the first-team at Watford, so I thought it was about time I had a change and a new challenge. I was pleased to be offered a chance by Swindon and now I want to help the club move up the league.

"We have had a difficult season, but there are a lot of good players here and we feel we have the ability to turn things around."

Swindon have endured a very similar season to that as Crewe Alexandra, although they are currently 11 points better off than us. Saying that Yeovil in 19th place are just a point behind both Swindon and Brighton. It is still awfully tight and if Swindon can win this afternoon they could see themselves move up at least three places. Despite making their own disappointing start to the season, McNamee says the spirit remains high in the Swindon camp.

"We haven't performed as well as we have liked and we should have picked up more points than we have done. We have drawn too many games for our liking and if we can change that in the second half of the season then we could be in with a chance of being close to the top six.

"We cannot see any reason why not because we were in contention for a large part of last season and finished the season strongly enough. There was a lot of optimism around the club going into the new season but for whatever reason it hasn't quite happened for us.

"The spirit in the dressing room is still good and the lads are great. The new players that have come in have settled in really well and we feel we will improve as a group over the second half of the season."





TOPICAL TALKING POINTS

ith just over a couple of weeks to go to the reopening of the transfer window, it has been noticeable that names have been appearing in the press as possible targets, either to or from the Premier League clubs. At West Ham United, it would appear that a reduction in the playing strength will definitely be taking place. Our former player, Dean Ashton is one of the names mentioned. Since his move from Norwich City to West Ham, his progress has been beset with various ups and downs.

After being selected as a member of the England squad, he was to sustain an injury during a training session prior to a game and had to withdraw. He has played in one full international game against Trinidad & Tobago, but whether he is able to win any more International call-ups will depend on how he recovers from his latest injury and then getting through a run of games to gain full fitness once more. One highlight for him was his appearance in the 2006 F.A Cup Final against Liverpool. He scored in that game but it was Liverpool who finally won after a penalty shootout.

Joe Kinnear, the present occupant as caretaker manager at Newcastle, will be staying on to the end of the season but another club in that area is seeking a new manager following the resignation of Roy Keane at Sunderland. It just goes to show how much stress us put on managers in the top flight.

The Carling Cup survivors from the quarter finals proved to be two from the Premier League and two from the Championship. Last years winners Tottenham Hotspur will be hoping to win for the second successive year. However, with Manchester United still in the running you can never discount them. From the Championship, Derby County left

it really late in their tie with Stoke City, it was a penalty in injury time that ended the hopes of the Potters.

The surprise team of the tournament as far has proved to be Burnley, their nail biting win in the penalty shootout against Chelsea then pitted them against Arsenal. The Gunners despite the tolent available to them from their reserve strength were beaten 2-0 by the Clarets. Should Burnley get through to the final, it would revive memories from past years and they would be guaranteed excellent support.

After the enforced delay through the Grays v Carlisle replay being halted through a floodlight failure, on Saturday the 29th November the Cumbrian side finally won through to give them the home tie against the Alex on the following Wednesday. With weather conditions proving something of a difficulty the second round tie did go ahead on it's scheduled date.

Some supporters may have been unaware that Crewe Alexandra had had to visit Brunton Park on three previous occasions in the F.A Cup. Firstly, in a 5th qualifying

round replay on the 8th December 1910, Crewe had triumphed 4-3 after extra time. Then, on the 1st December 1929 it was a second round game at Carlisle and on that occasion Carlisle won the game by a 4-2 victory.

There was then a long gap until the 16th November 1991, when a goal by Craig Hignett helped us to draw 1-1 at Brunton Park. In the replay the result was a 5-3 win for Crewe ofter extra time. Our latest 2-0 win up at Carlisle gave the team a boost, the two goals from Shaun Miller proving to be decisive.

When we go to the New Den at Millwall for the third round tie early in January it will be just over 60 years since we last played them in the F.A. Cup. That game took place at Gresty Road on the 11th December 1948 and, after a hard fought game, Crewe ran out narrow winners 3-2. The goals came from Mitcheson 2 and McCormack. Our reward that time was another home tie against Sunderland, could it be another good reward if we can triumph once more?

THE PAPER YOU CAN COUNT ON

AMONG MY SOUVENIRS

here are a great many items, which come to light concerning football in general and clubs in particular. Just how they came to light can be a story in themselves. Possibly some items could realise good prices should they find their way on to an auction list, by comparison, some have no relative value at all. At this juncture, it would be as well to admit that in many ways, I could be classed as a hoarder, but whatever bits and pieces come my way are never viewed on a monetary basis.

Take a look at your chequebook

and look at it's design, quite honestly they hardly deserve a second look. However, the copy of a cheque which was issued by Crewe Alexandra tells just part of a story. The design, although not necessarily appealing to everyone's taste of design, to me it is an example of what things used to look like at that particular point in our clubs history.

Sadly, none of those whose signatures are on the cheque are still alive. It reveals Neville Morrey, John McHugh and the then secretary of the club. Tom

Garnett. Tom later left Crewe Alexandra to take up a similar role at Doncaster Rovers.

We now turn to the connection with Accrington Stanley. In December 1960, Crewe Alexandra signed a player from Accrington Stanley – Terry Tighe. A wing half, he was born in Edinburgh and had joined Dunfermline before moving to Accrington Stanley. By the time he joined Crewe, he had played in over 100 league games for


Accrington and scored 20 goals. At that time, Accrington had signed a number of players from Scotland, their manager, Walter Galbraith had a good eye for a bargain.

Just two days after his signing, 17th December 1960, Terry made his Crewe Alexandra debut at Holker Street, Barrow, he returned at No.10, Crewe won 4-3, Alan Foster claiming a hat-trick and Billy Stark getting the other goal. Then, on Boxing Day 1960, Terry scored his first goal for Crewe in the 2-1 home win against Aldershot.

At this time it was an interesting period for Crewe Alexandra as, on scored for Crewe and finally won 2-1. The Chelsea line up included our former player Frank Blunstone and Jimmy Greaves.

Terry moved to Dunfermline and then to Accrington and Dave Mackay went to Spurs. Both were then in opposition for the Cup game and a bet was made that Terry would not score against Spurs, but Terry did score our only goal and so won the bet.





ith timing running out at Cheltenham Town last weekend and with two substitutes already been used following early head injuries to James Bailey and Calvin Zola, it would have been something of a morale boost for Anthony Elding that Dario Gradi elected to give him the chance to salvage something from such a vital game rather than use Joel Grant or Clayton Donaldson.

If we had been able to have converted a few more, then we could have been enjoying more points on the board than we currently have. That has been the case for much of the season and Elding is hoping his chance to start a game will not be too far off.

Firstly, Elds could be asked to make a similar impact to that he and Byron Moore did at Yeovil back in October when their introduction as substitutes sparked remarkable late fight back from 2-0 down. Elding was exceptional that night, laying on the then equaliser for Miller with a wonderful far post cross. When they both then started at Tranmere in the following game, the two wingers were pinned back in their own half trying to assist

the full-backs, and Elding resembled an isolated figure at Prenton Park.

If we can get the wingers around opposition penalty area in a more 4-3-3 formation, then the system could really suit Elding because he is a box predator, who has scored most of his goals in his career with instinct finishes. Elding is a striker, who thrives on a good service and in fairness when he has been in the team that has been few and far between. With Dario intent on having a go in attack, regardless of who we are playing, this could serve as a new lease of life for Elding.

Elding told the match day magazine: "It was good to be involved again. I've not played in a while so it was nice to get on although the result wasn't right for us. It was good on a personal note to have played a part.

"Of course, it is difficult with the formation at the moment

because there is really only one main striker position up for grabs. Having said that I have played in those roles before. At Stockport I played on the left and come in on the back stick and scored a few goals from there, so there is the possibility that I can play those roles if I'm asked. I am ready and just hoping to get a chance.

"As a professional I have to try to stay on top of my fitness and when I'm not involved, and that's what I try to do. I can only do what I can, and there are some points where I'm not involved so it is up to me to keep fit and stay positive."

Although you are always going to have direct 'rivals' for your place in any side, Elding has been a superb team-player, so much so

that in his caretaker role, Dario, has praised the player for the role he has played in the dressing room. With many young players in the side, Elding always is available for advice and a confidence boost.

Elding is also pleased to be working with the vastly experienced Gradi, although only for a short time.

Anthony said: "It is good working with Dario. He has different ideas different to managers that I have worked with before. It is a pleasure to work with him. He is such a big name in the game.

"All we can do is to remain positive, try and do the right things and hopefully they will come off and we'll get our share of the luck sooner rather than later.


"There is no way we are going to give up, we are professionals and we will go out there and fight. We are getting paid good money; the

A topic you might want to discuss is the increasing use by police of "Section 27" of the Violent Crime Reduction Act

2006, which provides the police with the power to issue a direction to an individual aged 16 years or over who is in a public place to leave a locality.

The direction will prohibit their return to that locality for a specified period not exceeding 48 hours. Whilst the aim of the new power is to minimise the likelihood of alcohol-related crime or disorder taking place, the Football Supporters' Federation (FSF) believe police forces across the country are using these powers to unfairly target football fans.

Recent incidents include over 80 Stoke fans being taken back to Stoke in a convoy of buses ahead of their fixture at Old Trafford, South Yorkshire Police using the Act to prevent Plymouth fans attending Argyle's Championship game with Doncaster Rovers last Saturday, and even Southend fans being served with the order ahead of their game at the Alex! If you've been served a Section 27 order, they want to hear about it simply by e-mail section27@fsf.org.uk.





1951 · catterick takes charae

Centre-forward Harry Catterick became Crewe Alexandra's player-manager in December 1951. Previously with Everton, he had taken time to learn from secretary Theo Kelly all about the administrative aspects of running a football club. He replaced Arthur Turner in charge at Gresty Road and made his debut in Crewe's 1-0 victory at Darlington. Scoring 11 goals in 25 Third Division (North) games, he remained player-boss until resigning in June 1953. He managed Rochdale before guiding Sheffield Wednesday to the Second Division title in 1958-59, then led Everton to two League Championship successes and FA Cup final glory.


1961 · tranmere hit for six

Frank Lord's hat-trick plus strikes by Billy Haydock, Jimmy Shepherd and an own goal gave Crewe Alexandra a thrilling 6-1 Fourth Division victory over Tranmere Rovers in front of 6,684 at Prenton Park on 9th December 1961: Brian Williamson, Jimmy McGill, Don Campbell, Stan Keery, Eric Barnes, Terry Tighe, Billy Haydock, Jimmy Shepherd, Frank Lord, Felix Reilly, Barry Wheatley. It was Crewe's biggest League win since the 5-0 demolition of Oldham Athletic in April 1959. Frank Lord netted another hat-trick in the following month's 3-1 victory at home to Southport and was top scorer with 30 goals that season.

1964 · harkın scores four

Four goals by Terry Harkin plus others from Peter Gowans and Peter Kane gave Crewe Alexandra an exciting 6-2 Fourth Division victory over Barrow in front of 3,995 at Gresty Road on Boxing Day 1964: Geoff Hickson, Dave Whelan, Peter Leigh, Stan Keery, Eric Barnes, Mick Gannon, Peter Gowans, Peter Kane, Johnny King, Terry Harkin, Barry Wheatley. It was the first occasion a Crewe player had scored four times in a League match since Frank Lord in the 5-1 victory at home to Darlington in October 1961. Ernie Tagg's side completed a Christmas double over Barrow with a 2-1 win at Holker Street the following day.

1979 · grobbelaar signed



Colourful goalkeeper Bruce Grobbelaar joined Crewe Alexandra from Vancouver Whitecaps in December 1979. Following a lengthy legal battle with Government departments to allow the South African to play League football, he made his Crewe debut in that month's 2-0 defeat at Wigan Athletic. He quickly became a favourite and wore comic masks prior to games, entertaining the young fans behind his goal. Making 24 League appearances for the Alex, he memorably scored a penalty in his final match at home to York City in May 1980. He had another spell with Vancouver Whitecaps before winning many honours with Liverpool.

Winger Tony Cliss moved from Fourth Division rivals Peterborough United to Crewe Alexandra in December 1982. Signing professional for Posh in August 1977, he had featured in their 1980-81 FA Cup run and reunited with his former manager Peter Morris at Gresty Road. He made his Crewe debut in that month's 1-1 draw at home to Torquay United, in the wake of the FA Cup first round defeat at non-League side Boston United. Destined to miss the entire 1985-86 campaign through injury, he scored 11 goals in 113 League outings for the Alex until forced to retire in May 1987 and was given a testimonial match.

1987 · post performance


Goals by Rob Edwards, David Platt, Vernon Allatt and Mick Halsall's own goal gave Crewe Alexandra an emphatic 4-0 Fourth Division victory over Peterborough United in front of 2,540 at London Road on 18th December 1987: Dean Greygoose, Wayne Goodison, Ian Macowat, Neil Morton, Peter Billing, Steve Wright, David Platt, Vernon Allatt, Roger Eli, Terry Milligan, Rob Edwards (Stuart Ritchie). It was Crewe's biggest away win since the 5-0 triumph at Hartlepool in October 1986. Dario Gradi's side also scored four goals at Colchester two months later but lost 1-0 in the return match at home to Peterborough.

1996 · crewe annihilate tigers

Strikes by Steve Garvey, Danny Murphy, Dele Adebola, Shaun Smith and Tony Brien's own goal gave Crewe Alexandra a stunning 5-1 FA Cup second round victory over Hull City in front of 3,756 at Boothferry Park on 7th December 1996: Jason Kearton, Billy Barr, Shaun Smith, Ashley Westwood (Peter Billing), Steve Macauley, Gareth Whalley, Mark Rivers (Dele Adebola), Robbie Savage, Jamie Moralee, Danny Murphy, Steve Garvey. It was Crewe's biggest away victory in the FA Cup since the 6-1 victory against Accrington Stanley in December 1992. The Alex lost 2-0 at Wimbledon in the third round replay.

2001 · pompey chimes silenced

Goals from Rob Hulse, Efe Sodje, Phil Charnock and Kenny Lunt gave struggling Crewe Alexandra a splendid 4-2 First Division victory over Portsmouth watched by 14,430 at Fratton Park on 8th December 2001: Clayton Ince, David Wright, Shaun Smith, Steve Foster, Efe Sodje, Phil Charnock, Rob Hulse, Kenny Lunt, Dean Ashton (Rodney Jack), Dave Brammer, Geoff Thomas. Crewe had won only one of their previous ten First Division games. Pompey were spearheaded by Peter Crouch, who scored their second goal. Crewe were held to a 1-1 draw in the return fixture and destined for relegation that season.


enough.

The club, like a collection of others clubs will be rushed into an appointment for the sake of it. Whoever replaces Holland at Gresty Road would have to work a miracle to get Crewe out of our current predicament. With just two League wins all season, we are odds on favourites for relegation to League Two.

Today's visitors Swindon Town are also on the lookout for a new manager after the dismissal of Maurice Malpass following their FA Cup exit to Histon. The Scot had been in charge at the County Ground for just ten months following his success at Motherwell.

With the window closing in late August and not reopening until the New Year, the newspaper editors need something to fill their pages.

Managers are being judged after every result, especially in the Premier League where the intensive pressure recently saw Roy Keane leave Sunderland. In fact, other than perhaps Sir Alex Ferguson, Harry Redknapp, Tony Pullis and Phil Brown, every manager in the Premier League is one defeat away from absolute disaster! The knives are currently being sharpened for Paul Ince at Blackburn Rovers, but it is still too early to judge the former Macclesfield and MK Dons boss at the top level. It is a great shame that we are losing ambitious British mangers before they have been given an opportunity to shuffle their feet under the tables at their new clubs.

He is a real unsung hero.

njuries have been and always will be part and parcel of football but the seriousness of them can differ greatly. A slight muscle strain may keep a player out for a few weeks or a broken leg between 4-6 months. Recently, the unfortunate Everton striker Ayegbeni Yakubu ruptured his Achilles tendon muscle and that has prematurely ended his season.

Even Yakubu's particularly nasty injury has been surpassed by that obtained by the Barnsley striker Iain Hume. The Canadian suffered a fractured skull after being cought with a solid elbow from Sheffield United's Chris Morgan. Due to Morgan's extra height over his opponent, he struck the top of his head and caused severe damage. It was so horrific that Hume's life was thought to be in danger once he returned to the dressing room. The player spent a worrying time in intensive care, needed brain surgery and a further 14 stitches following lengthy surgery.

If Morgan actually intended to harm Hume is debatable and only the player involved will truly know if he set himself to inflict such damage. Sadly, on the replay of the incident, the robust Morgan adjusts his feet to

securely plant himself in the ground before making solid contact with the top of Hume's head. He then heads the ball clear of

danger.

When a player is left fighting for his life, it puts football firmly into perspective and Hume was lucky. Morgan was only shown a yellow card following the incident and strangely escaped

any further punishment from the Football Association. The rules actually state that the FA cannot upgrade a yellow card to a red one and they didn't feel it necessary to charge the Sheffield United defender with a more severe charge.


When managers are being dragged in front of disciplinary panels for disagreeing with decisions made by match officials, or others being cautioned for taking their shirt off when celebrating a goal, it does make you wonder.

Morgan committed a life-threatening act that went way above the line of decency out on a football pitch. Morgan's whole game is based on his aggressive nature and his combative nature has seen him in trouble in the past but only he will know if he over-stepped the mark intentionally.

Hume suffered a broken bone in the skull and suffered severe bruising of the brain and damage to blood vessels. The condition becomes immensely serious if blood does not flow through to the brain, thus causing brain damage. Barnsley took no chances with their player and when he later complained of nausea after being discharged he immediately returned to hospital for further tests.

Thankfully, Hume will make a full recovery but it is unlikely he will play again this season. In hindsight, the really need to look at their disciplinary rocedure because these sort of incidents should not be threatening the lives of footballers or any other sportsman. The elbow is a footballers most potent weapon and it's usage needs to be outlawed completely.



Fash also went on to claim 2 caps for England.

He joined Millwall in 1984 and stayed there for two years before leaving for Plough Lane in 1986. He featured for the Lions 65 times overall and netted 19 goals.

LOOK OUT FOR... LEWIS GRABBAN

Graban is a promising young striker who signed as a professional

in 2006 with Crystal Palace, but is currently Millwall's top scorer at the age of 20. He joined Palace in the 2004/2005 season, and scored a very impressive 28 goals for the under 18's and reserve sides. He was rewarded with appearances against Walsall and Coventry in the Carling Cup, almost scoring against Walsall within a second of being on the pitch!

The youngster scored his first League goal against West Bromich Albion, who at the time were chasing promotion. He scored in the 94th minute to give Palace a 3-2 win.

Grabban signed for Millwall in January 2008 for £150,000, and a month later had scored his first goal against Part Vale in Millwall's 3-0 win. Days later and he followed that up with another, and then a third against Swansea in the opening minute of the game. This season he has netted some vital goals, including the winning goal over Hereford recently that at the time saw Millwall go level on points with Scunthorpe at the top of the League.
