



Good evening and welcome back to The County Ground for this League One fixture. Tonight's visitors are Hartlepool United and I would like to welcome Chris Turner, his staff, players, directors and supporters along for the game.

Well Saturday was certainly an entertaining encounter and thankfully one that we were able to take three points from. We needed the result given that a few of the teams around us picked up victories as well.

There were a lot of positives to come out of the game on Saturday. To come back from two goals down was pleasing and the players showed tremendous character – and patience – to work towards the home win. We started really well and could have been ahead inside the first five minutes with a few opportunities, and should have been awarded a goal when Michael Timlin's shot crossed the line and bounced back out.

The goals we did concede were poor but Scunthorpe are a quality side and are up in amongst the play-off pack for a reason. They have two quality strikers and they did cause us problems. Their first one was a bit fluky then the second one came through indecision on our part.

Scunthorpe then had two players sent off for two bookable offences and I wouldn't imagine there would be too many complaints about the dismissals. Scunthorpe could have had a man sent off in the first half for the tackle on Michael Timlin, who really took control of the midfield





on the day. Playing against ten and subsequently nine men was never going to be easy because you see teams pack players behind the ball. We just told the lads to be patient and keep up the tempo. Even at two-nil down we emphasised to the team that we needed to concentrate on getting the one goal, not three.

Patience was always going to the key and the players displayed a really controlled display in the last half hour and got their rewards. We kept the ball moving and tired them out. I am a big advocate of patience when you play football because you have to be patient before you can penetrate.

In terms of goals scored, it was good to see Michael Timlin get on the scoresheet and then Hal Robson-Kanu netted his first for the club which no doubt he will be pleased with. Lee Peacock returned to action and scored the fourth late on. He was in the right place at the right time and

took advantage of the opportunity. It was good to have him back and the more players we have fit and available for selection then the better it is for the club.

This evening we have another chance to go out and build on the work that we have been doing, although we still need to work on the defensive side of our game. We are now on a run and are clawing closer to those teams above us in the League One standings.

The confidence should be in the squad after the win on Saturday. Let's hope we can add to our points tally with another victory tonight.

Enjoy the game.














Saturday's visit of Scunthorpe United had it all. It was a good game to come back and win though!





ball on from a corner into the path of Gary Hooper who diverts the ball home from close range to open the scoring.


39 MIN Henry Lansbury nips in to score a welltaken second as he clips the ball into the box before firing through the legs of Brezovan from closerange.

It was a frenetic Saturday afternoon of action with six goals and two red cards at The County Ground as The Robins took all three points against Scunthorpe United.



The game started powerfully for Town who hit the bar early on through Michael Timlin. First half from Gary Hooper and Henry Lansbury saw the visitors go into the break two goals to the good.

The game changed in the second half with David Mirfin and Captain Cliff Byrne dismissed for the visitors with Swindon working patiently to make the most of their numerical advantage.

By the end of the encounter the goals were flowing with Michael Timlin and Hal Robson-Kanu getting Town back on level terms before an Andrew Wright own goal and Lee Peacock close range effort secured the victory.









Swindon town v hartlepool united







Chris TURNER

Director of Sport Chris Turner was confirmed as temporary boss until the end of the season recently after taking over following the departure of Danny Wilson in December.

Turner is in his second stint in the hotseat at Victoria Park having previously enjoyed a successful spell in charge between 1999 and 2002.

During that time he led the Club to three successive play-off campaigns in what was then Division Three and laid the foundations for the eventual promotion before being lured away to hometown team Sheffield Wednesday midway through the 2002/2003 campaign.

Turner had begun his playing days with the Owls in 1976 and played almost 100 games before moving on to Sunderland in 1978.

After seven years and 195 appearances at Roker Park, Turner attracted the attention of Manchester United and went on to play 65 times for the Red Devils before returning to Hillsborough in 1988 and helped them to League Cup glory in 1991, playing alongside current Swindon boss Danny Wilson.

Following his departure as manager of Wednesday in 2004, Turner had a short stint in charge at Stockport County before his return to Pools as Director of Sport in 2006.

most respected players in League One. Aggressive in the tackle and superb in the air, his reputation has continued to grow and

he's been the subject of transfer speculation on more than one occasion during his time at Pools.

Antony Sweeney

With competition fierce in the centre of the park, Sweeney found himself asked to operate on the right-wing or even at right-back on occasions last season. His non-stop running and limitless energy means he is just as likely to appear in his own box with a crucial tackle as he is in the opponents' area to score a goal.

Andy Monkhouse

Rune Lange



So often the thorn in Swindon's side, Joel Porter has hit eighteen goals already so far this term just one behind Town's frontline striker Simon Cox.

After missing the majority of the 2005/06 campaign with a knee injury, Porter suffered a similar fate the following season, featuring in only 26 games of the promotion year.

Porter began his career in Australia with spells at Croydon Kings, West Adelaide, Melbourne Knights and Sydney Olympic, before joining Hartlepool after trials with Wigan Athletic and Sunderland.

Having joined the Club late in 2003, the Aussie striker failed to settle quickly by his own admission but, after a rigorous pre-season, he showed the fans his true colours in the 2004/05 season establishing a prolific partnership with Adam Boyd.

His direct approach and positive running has made him a big hit with everyone at Pools and despite rumours he would leave last summer, the Club exercised an option in his contract to keep him at Victoria Park.




"It is very exciting," Lecsinel enthuses. "We both played in a small division in France and we are very happy to have signed for Swindon Town."

"The stadium is impressive even when it is empty. I played on the pitch here for the reserves against Swansea and really enjoyed my time. Making my home debut in the league will be special."








When the fixture computer selected the opening game of 2006/07 there would have been sighs of relief in Swindon that the long trip to Hartlepool was to take place on a summer Saturday, rather than a winter midweek night.


Both sides kicked off the new campaign with disappointment to put behind them. Town and 'Pool had dropped from League One the previous May and an immediate return was on everyone's mind.

In Dennis Wise we had a fresh young boss, while Pool's boss Danny Wilson, himself only in the hot seat since June, had replaced Martin Scott who had left the club in February.

Wise had been busy restructuring his squad and one of those new arrivals was to make an instant impression on his debut.

The game was two minutes old when Slovakian goalkeeper Peter

Diving to his right the giant stopper was equal to the effort, and then jumped to his feet to block the follow up.

After that let-off Lee Peacock just failed to make the most of a Jamie Vincent cross on four minutes, placing the ball wide of the right hand post, but the striker had signalled his intent. Seven minutes later it was Peacock who made the crucial opening, connecting with a Michael Pook corner to place his header past Dimi Konstantopoulos.

Next it was Brezovan's turn to shine again with a twisting close range save from Porter, then with three minutes of the half remaining Michael Nelson's powerful shot was turned away to keep Town's lead intact.

The travelling supporters would have felt the more relieved at half time but there was plenty of work to do to remain in command of the points.

Both Hartlepool substitute
Darren Williams and Porter hit
Town's woodwork in a four minute
spell, then on 72 minutes the
home supporters could have been
forgiven for thinking a break was
finally going to go their way.

Porter was again brought down in the penalty area, this time by Jack Smith, and referee Russell Booth pointed to the spot for the second time.




Town's youngsters ensured the seven hour round trip to Dartmouth was worthwhile as The Robins got back to winning ways with another league victory.

"He couldn't have picked a better time to come off the bench could he?" remarked Town boss Danny Wilson, speaking to the media about Lee Peacock's return to action after Saturday's 4-2 home win over Scunthorpe United.

Antony Sweeney, Ritchie Humphreys and loel Porter remain vital cogs in the Hartlepool side.

"I know quite a lot of the lads up at Hartlepool anyhow and they are one of the teams that I never really like playing against. They are a fantastic bunch of guys and are always well-organised. No matter what form you are in Hartlepool always have the capability to upset the books," said Peacock. "Over my career I have had some intense games against them. I played them in the play-off semifinals for Bristol City and also in the play-off final for Sheffield


Wednesday which was a great day."

Club Connections

Does a manager facing his former team have the same kind of impact that players do?

Swindon certainly seem to have suffered more than most from those who used to wear the red and white shirt coming back to haunt them recently, but I don't know if a manager can have the same impact.

One of the more recent examples of biting the hand that used to feed you, involved this afternoon's opponents Hartlepool. It was pretty obvious early on in Paul Sturrock's short reign at The County Ground that if he didn't rate you, you'd be out of The County Ground exit door pretty quickly (whatever did happen to Fola Onibuje?). Andy Monkhouse was one of those. Despite an impressive start to his Swindon career he picked up a hamstring injury, and wasn't fit when Sturrock arrived at the club.

Having examined his injury history (although I wonder how closely he did this, seeing as the stats he quoted seemed to change every time he talked about it), Sturrock decided Monkhouse wasn't for him and he was soon snapped up by a certain Danny Wilson at Hartlepool. There was a sense of grim inevitability when on his return, it was his header which found it's way past Phil Smith for the only goal of the game between the two promotion contenders at The County Ground.

Players have that immediate and obvious chance to show their former team exactly what they're missing, and perhaps why they made a mistake in letting them go. Whether it's the reflex save, fantastic last ditch tackle or the unstoppable shot, what can a manager do? Well they can certainly get their side up for the game, but once the action starts all

they can do is tinker with the tactics and hope they've got it right.

Perhaps the one big advantage they have is in knowing the strengths and weaknesses of their former staff. Having only left Hartlepool a couple of months ago, Danny Wilson should certainly know plenty about the men he coached for more than two seasons. He can tell the Swindon players all about who to watch out for at set pieces and any potential weak links.

But is that really much better than a particularly detailed scouting report? Every manager I've ever interviewed generally has nice things to say about the opposition, but then parrots some variation of: "...but it's not about them, it's about us. If we play well I'm confident we'll get the three points."


Well let's hope it can make a difference. We'll find out soon enough.

effort, but these days it is not just the pitch that is taken in to account. The authorities outside of the game also insist that the off pitch area both inside and outside the ground are in good enough condition not to cause danger to the public attending I believe even Arsenal suffered a postponement for that reason. In these days of safety first everything has to be risk assessed and whilst the world has moved on in this direction, I can still recall vividly matches in the past played virtually on rolled snow, with blue lines as pitch markings just to get the game on. Travelling to the game was probably even more hazardous in those days, but they still got played all the same. It's the same I guess with muddy pitches, but the improvement in the surfaces now compared to the '60's is so much better, especially here.

Hopefully snow won't have caused us problems tonight or indeed to those making the long trek from Hartlepool and we wish them all a good and safe trip, but of course still hope Town take the points and with Danny now in charge of the reverse fixture after our 3-3 draw earlier in the season, if we get in front hopefully we can go on and claim that win, we thought we may have achieved up there, when 3-0 up.






