

Boardroom Briefing Directors' Update

"Following our two draws last week we are four points off the top six. With 14 matches remaining there are 42 points to play for and more than half of the division will still consider themselves contenders for promotion."

"Both Tranmere and Swindon Town are in similar positions in the current form table to those we occupy in the League One table. With 12 points from the last eight games we are ninth in the league and tenth on form. While these tables can sometimes be overly influenced by one or two results, they do show that just a small improvement in our form could make a massive difference at the end of the season. We have a lot of games coming up in March and the players must dig deep for the final section of the campaign.

Thankfully, our injury list appears to be decreasing. We were boosted by the return of lan Goodison for the Milton Keynes Dons fixture and Danny Coyne and Andy Taylor should be back in contention for today's match. We understand Chris Greenacre should be back in around a couple of weeks. Added options at this time of the season can only benefit the Club and the more players we have available and free from injury and suspension the better.

Nine years ago yesterday we played against in the League Cup Final at Wembley Stadium. Looking back it was an amazing achievement for a Club of our size and a wonderful occasion that will stay in the memory of all those Tranmere fans who attended the match. There are so many remarkable factors from the accomplishment that stand out. We defeated two Premier League teams - Coventry City and Middlesbrough - while also knocking West Ham and Sunderland out of the FA Cup on the way to the Quarter Finals against Newcastle which we played just seven days before our appearance at Wembley. At the time of the final we were 17th in Division One now the Championship and it is questionable whether or not any team in that position will ever repeat our achievement. We sold our allocation of 31,000 tickets which was a fantastic sight at Wembley. It was a very close match and we'll never know how we would have coped had we won and been in Europe the following season.

At the time of the final I had only been at Tranmere for a few months so it was hard to take the whole experience in. Just months earlier we had financial difficulties and had no choice but to sell both Kenny Irons and John McGreal and cut the wage bill. We then




went on two amazing cup runs which shows how football can surprise you, and that motivation and focus are every bit as important as money.

Finally, I hope you will join me in welcoming today's guests from Swindon Town Football Club their directors, staff and supporters and the match officials to Prenton Park. I hope to see you at our next home game against League One leaders Leicester City on Wednesday, 11 March, kick off 7.45pm. Please don't forget this fixture is on a Wednesday and not a Tuesday - as we had to move the game at the request of Merseyside Police because of the Liverpool v Real Madrid match on the Tuesday night."

"We put in good performances in the last two home games but unfortunately didn't get the break that we perhaps deserved."

"Peterborough were third in the division and MK Dons were second, and the results show we're not a million miles behind the teams in the top six. We worked hard, and if we keep that up results will go in our favour."

MK Dons

"Coming here, MK Dons had won ten away games, but they played everything long and tried to make things difficult for us. We made the wrong decisions in the final third and just lacked a bit of quality in the box. If we can get that then we'll turn the draws into wins. Since that game, the midweek results went very well for us. We now need to make the most of the situation with a good result today."

Run in

"We've got to be mentally strong over the next couple of months and we can't pick and chose when we play well. Whether we're playing a top side or one at the bottom, we need to approach the games in the same way. We have different types of games coming up and all the teams we're playing are fighting for points for different reasons. They're all tough games and if you don't have the right attitude you'll lose the game. If we're going to put any pressure on the top six sides, with five of the next seven games after today being away from home we have to start picking up points on our travels. If we keep working as hard as we have been the results will turn for us."

John Achterberg

"Danny Coyne's injury has meant John Achterberg has been in goal for us for the last few games and he has done really well. I feel sorry for him that we haven't managed to keep a clean sheet since he has been back in. He has made some great saves, especially against Peterborough. If Danny doesn't play today it would be great for him if we could win the game and keep a clean sheet."

Swindon

"Today I'd like to welcome Danny Wilson, his Swindon players, staff and supporters to Prenton Park. Danny knows the game inside out and I've had lots of tussles with him. He has his sides wound up, physically fit and good at closing people down. You can see how their results have improved since he has been there. They've been unfortunate in a couple of games of late, but they've got decent players in Cox, Paynter, Peacock and Ifil. But we're at home and the tempo will be set by us. Our home form has been magnificent and we know that if we play to the best of our ability we're more than a top six side at this level."

"The crowd will play a big part for us in the remainder of the season and if they can get behind us it will be a massive help. Enjoy the match."

Swindon Town

Almost seven months have passed since Rovers made the trip to Swindon Town for the season's opening game and there has been a fair amount of change at the County Ground in that time.

Maurice Malpas departed the manager's hot seat in November, with the experienced Danny Wilson taking his place.

Wilson has worked well in the transfer market, bringing in Gordon Greer from Doncaster Rovers along with Reading winger Hal Robson-Kanu, both of whom have impressed since their arrival in Wiltshire.

Meanwhile, striker Simon Cox continues to find the net on a regular basis, with his tally for the season now up to 19 and strike partner Billy Paynter also on his way to double figures.

On Tuesday night Swindon lost in controversial fashion, conceding a penalty in injury time from which Hartlepool secured a 1-0 win.

After the match a disappointed Wilson commented: "It didn't warrant a penalty and it should have been an indirect free-kick.

"Jerel's foot was up but there was nothing aggressive about it and I don't understand how it was a penalty.

"Hopefully those sorts of decisions will even themselves out over the season.

"We have been dealt a decision and you hope that the referee would get them correct.

"Overall we were disappointed with the result and there weren't many chances on either side

"There was a lot of huff and puff, although we threatened without really testing the keeper. It wasn't much of a spectacle but we stuck in their.

"We got a bit frustrated and we did lose our composure at times. Overall we were nothing like we were on Saturday against Scunthorpe United.

"There were positives though and I thought Gordon Greer was outstanding. We are putting a lot of weight on his shoulders at this moment in time but he enjoys that sort of pressure."

Today's game is the 58th time the two sides have met, with Swindon having won 22 of the previous meetings, Tranmere 20 and 15 ending as draws. On the opening day of this season the Robins defeated Rovers 3-1 at the County Ground, while goals from Steve Jennings and Chris Greenacre gave Tranmere a 2-1 win in last season's league meeting at Prenton Park.

Players

Peter Brezovan

A giant in goal at 6'7, Brezovan signed on a year's loan from Czech club FC Brno in the summer of 2006. Brezovan became a fans favourite after performing heroics on his competitive debut against Hartlepool United on the opening debut, saving two penalties from Porter and Humphreys to earn Town all three points.

He has since signed a two-year permanent deal to stay at SN1, having put pen to paper on his new contract in March 2007.

Phil Smith

Phil Smith joined Swindon in late July 2006 from Crawley Town. Smith had made 74 starts for Crawley Town during a two-year stay, which followed a year's spell at Margate where he made 35 starts. A dependable customer, Smith slotted into become the number one for the remainder of the 2006-7 season following Brezovan's unfortunate injury.

Jack Smith

Signed from Watford in the summer of 2005, Smith added youthful experience to the Town side.

In 2006-07 he was in excellent form 10 back at his preferred right-back position, also opening his goalscoring account for the club and has been a penalty taker on several occasions. He has been a regular in the side over the last four seasons.

Jamie Vincent

Jamie Vincent arrived at The County Ground in the summer of 2006 hoping to make the left-back slot his own, and by the end of the campaign he had done far more than just that. Made Captain following the injury to Ady Williams in February, Vincent also performed at centre-back and was a rock at the back throughout the campaign.

Hasney Aljofree

Experienced centreback who arrives at The County Ground with plenty of Coca-

Cola Championship experience. Previous clubs include Bolton Wanderers, Dundee United and Plymouth Argyle, from where he signed for Swindon on a three-year deal in the summer of 2007.

Jerel Ifil

Powerful defender Jerel Ifil joined Town in the summer of 2004 after enjoying three loan spells with Town previously from 2002-04.


Jerel became a fan's favourite during his brief stays in Wiltshire and signed on a permanent basis in June 2004, he has now exceeded 100 appearances for the club.

In 2006-7 Ifil enjoyed his best season to date in a Town shirt, benefiting from the experienced Ady Williams alongside him at the heart of the defence and he scored the opener against Walsall on the last day of the season, helping Town secure promotion.

Lee Peacock

Lee Peacock joined Swindon Town on 20th January 2006 on a free transfer from Sheffield Wednesday.

The experienced frontman started his career at Carlisle United as a trainee. but after scoring 11 goals in 52 appearances he made the switch to Mansfield Town in October 1997 for £75,000. It proved to be a productive spell with The Stags with 29 goals in 80 appearances attracting Manchester City who parted with £500,000 for his services. However, his time at Maine Road was not as successful as he



would have liked due to injuries, but his next stop certainly was.


A £600,000 move to Bristol City in August 2000 heralded the start of a successful four year spell at Ashton Gate. 54 goals in 131 league starts was the result of his stay with the Robins. Next up was Sheffield Wednesday, who he joined on a free transfer in the summer of 2004, on a free transfer.

Barry Corr

After impressing during a three-month loan spell last term, Barry Corr put pen to paper on a new two-year contract in June 2006, signing on a free transfer from Sheffield Wednesday.

The Irishman made his debut for the Town reserves against Bristol City on the same day he put pen to paper on the initial loan deal and netted on what was his first appearance in a Swindon

Corr joined The Owls in April 2005 from Yorkshire rivals Leeds United after an initial trial spell with the Elland Road



Blair Sturrock

Sturrock junior arrived at The County Ground in November 2006 to join up with Physio Dick Mackey for treatment following an injury which ruled him out of the latter stages of the 2005-6 campaign, when he was at Rochdale. The striker joined Dundee United as a trainee before spending time at Brechin on loan. Sturrock then had a three-year spell on the south coast with Plymouth Argyle making most of his appearances as a substitute. In 2004, Sturrock moved to Kidderminster, then onto Rochdale 9 months later where he hit six goals in fifteen starts.

Cralg Easton

Craig Easton arrived at The County Ground in June 2007 to add further experience to the central midfield area. The former Scotland Under 21 International joins up at The County Ground with over 300 league

appearances under his belt.
Easton, 28, started his career at
Dundee United where he came up
through the ranks to make 162 league
starts before departing in the summer of
2004.

He then spent a year at Livingston before joining Leyton Orient in July 2005.

Jon-Paul McGovern

Jon-Paul McGovern joined Swindon Town on Friday 31st August 2007, just hours before the close of the transfer window. A lively winger who can operate out wide or through the middle, McGovern's arrival was a major boost to Paul Sturrock who had been chasing the player for some time.

The 26-year old was a key cog in Paul Sturrock's Sheffield Wednesday side which won promotion to the Coca-Cola Championship and made over 60 appearances for The Owls during two seasons at Hillsborough.

Billy Paynter

Striker Billy Paynter signed for Swindon Town on Friday 31st August for an undisclosed fee from Southend United. The 23-year old striker was restricted to just five league starts at Roots Hall after signing a three-year contract with the Blues from then Championship rivals Hull City in August 2006.

The 6'0 striker has scored 60 career goals and made 200 league starts and adds much-needed firepower to the Swindon attack.

Simon Cox

Swindon Town manager Maurice Malpas completed the signing of Reading striker Simon Cox on deadline day, January 2008, signing a two and a half year deal at The County Ground.


Reading-born Cox joined his hometown club at the age of nine and progressed up through the academy ranks before making his senior debut against Luton Town in the Carling Cup in September 2005.

Cox spent time in League One, scoring three goals in six league starts for Northampton Town towards the end of the 2006/07 campaign.

He has scored more than 30 goals for the Robins.

Kevin Amankwaah

Right back Amankwaah began his career at Bristol City. He eventually left Ashton Gate in February 2005, when he signed for Yeovil Town, initially on loan and then on a permanent basis. Amankwaah signed for Swansea City in July 2006 for a fee of £250,000. He left to join Swindon Town in June 2008.



One To Watch - Hal Robson-Kanu

Reading winger Hal Robson-Kanu joined Swindon on loan earlier this year after previous spells in League One with Southend United.

Robson-Kanu made six starts for Steve Tilson's side in 2007-08 and scored three goals against Nottingham Forest, Huddersfield Town and Swansea City before returning to Reading. This season he made 15 appearances for the Shrimpers, including their 2-2 draw at Prenton Park.

An England youth international, Robson-Kanu has represented his country at under-19 level.

Lillan Nalis

French midfielder Lilian Nalis completed his move to League One side Swindon Town last summer.

The 36-year-old was released by Plymouth at the end of last season and moved to the County Ground as a free agent.

He impressed Robins boss Maurice Malpas during a trial period at the club, putting in eye-catching displays during friendly dates with Chippenham and Cardiff.

Michael Timlin

Swindon Town manager Maurice Malpas dipped into the transfer market with the addition of Michael Timlin in May 2008.

He started his Fulham career as a leftwinger but was converted to central midfield by Fulham's then Academy Director, Steve Kean

Following the permanent switch to Wiltshire, 'Timms' has relocated from his London base to Swindon and began the season alongside Lilian Nalis in midfield.


As a player, Danny Wilson won the League Cup with both Luton Town in 1988 and Sheffield Wednesday in 1991.

His equaliser for Luton against Arsenal with seven minutes remaining in the 1988 final is arguably the most famous match-saving goal in the club's history. He was also a runner-up in both domestic cup finals with Sheffield Wednesday in 1993. He also made 24 caps for Northern Ireland, scoring 1 goal.

After ending his career, Wilson managed Barnsley, Sheffield Wednesday, Bristol City, and Milton Keynes Dons, before being appointed manager of Hartlepool United in June 2006.

In the 2006-07 season, he guided Pools to second from top of League Two and promotion back to League One.

After leaving Hartlepool United earlier this season, he took over the reigns at Swindon Town.







Swindon Town. It wasn't too long ago that those two words would cause Tranmere fans to splutter with Indignation and demand the person who uttered them to apologise.

First, we were the unwitting victims of the fiasco in 1990 which saw Swindon punished for making illegal payments to their players and Tranmere were promoted just long enough for the players to spend their bonuses before being sent down again after an appeal. Then there was the floodlight failure at the County Ground a couple of years later when Rovers were winning something which didn't happen when the match was replayed. I should gloss over the playoff semi-final defeat when the season unravelled in the space of three minutes but younger Rovers fans need to know just how good we used to be and how close we were to making the bigtime.

Of course, Swindon went up to the Premier League and failed in spectacular fashion. I remember one of their supporters telling me before their final match of the season well, at least we won't concede 100 goals'. No-one had told Leeds that as they went out and hit five to complete the century.

Before they could recover, another relegation followed straight away and Swindon eventually became the first former Premier League club to drop into the old fourth division.

I do wonder if they really enjoyed being thumped every week in the top-flight and how much the experience damaged the club in the long-term? Such is the financial disparity in football now I think the Swindon scenario is in danger of being repeated much more often.


On the two previous occasions Tranmere were promoted I never had any doubts we would survive and that the players would be able to cope at the higher level. But now, even with a manager like Ronnie Moore who kept Rotherham so high for so long and knows what he's doing on a budget, I think it would be a good deal harder.

Clubs such as Crewe, Grimsby, Bury, Oxford and Port Vale used to be regular opponents in what is now the Championship but apart from Doncaster (generous owner) and Blackpool (had an excellent manager) are there any genuine smaller clubs left?

Charlton could be in League One next season and they're still thumbing through the parachute payments they received following relegation from the Premier League. Southampton and Norwich could also be making a return visit to the third tier and there's no guarantee Leeds United won't still be here either.

I think the Championship is now a far harsher environment than the one Tranmere vacated eight years ago. Clubs in huge stadia with proud histories are just happy to cling on to having a notional chance of making it back to the Premier League but privately may dread the prospect of being chewed up and spat out before rediscovering how the other half live.

Don't get me wrong, I'm desperate to see Rovers go up this season but just a bit concerned at what might happen, unless of course we find an ageing goalscorer on the continent of around a quarter of a million.....

Rare stadium visit to view cup challenge

Having taken time off from the usual first team excursions once again in 2008-09, the 'Tranmere alternatives' brought a rare trip to a revamped Moss Rose recently, the home of Macclesfield Town.

A withdrawal from the Cheshire Senior Cup by the Cheshire-based professional clubs meant a long-awaited return for the Cheshire Premier Cup competition, which would now welcome the Football League's 'newest' club, Macclesfield Town into the fold.

The competition, as previously mentioned, had been revived for the first time since 1981, when Tranmere Rovers were in fact the last winners, beating Chester 4-2 on penalties having drawn 2-2 in normal time.

The Premier Cup actually replaced the more notable Cheshire Bowl competition in 1968, with Rovers again running out overall winners following a 4-1 victory over Stockport County at Prenton Park.

The format over the next few seasons became rather erratic to say the least and in later years a group game system was put in place with the best club record deciding the overall winner.

Following the long break in seasons, this time around Crewe Alexandra proved to be the team to beat, having overcome Stockport County at Gresty Road winning 3-2, while walloping Chester City on their own turf 7-0.

With Rovers eventually losing to Macclesfield 1-3 in highly entertaining game, the Silkmen now take their place in the Final, scheduled to be played at Gresty Road before the close of the season.

This also means we have still yet to meet Macclesfield Town in a first team league fixture, leaving our previous meetings solely reserved for cup competitions.

Their small, yet tidy McAlpine Stand is in total contrast to the rest of the ground, but It's at this point then that having taken a good look around the Moss Rose venue, served a cup of tea at half time by first manager Keith Alexander at the bar, and viewed a small period of the second half from a glass box, that I realised that the immediate future for any stadia at our level may have already been seen on our first team travels this season.

Having now taken in three brand new stadiums with Rovers in 2008-09, the closest and latest venue to be constructed now lies with Leigh Genesis and their brand new Sports Village facility. It incorporates a capacity stadium to host both matches in the



Unibond Premier Division, Leigh Centurions Rugby league club, and eventually Manchester United Reserves.

Having suffered postponements due to the bad weather like much of the rest of us, Cammell Laird are due to visit for a rearranged league game on Tuesday 31" March, and with no Rovers fixture planned for that evening, you can probably guess what I'll be doing instead.

After the involving our match at Colchester's brand new Weston Homes Community Stadium, indication's away from the Club that we may be sharing a 10,000-capacity stadium with the Camels in the very near future is pure speculation.

But having taken note of stadium issues between league and nonleague clubs not only in Essex, but across the country, maybe you might not however be able to write off any possibilities of such an occurrence here on the Wirral.


Colchester's transition from the 'slumdog' surroundings of Layer Road to the pristine and luxurious facilities at their new ground have already proved to the lower league clubs that anything is possible - despite the standard four-similar-stands design that puts United's ground on a par with Shrewsbury Town, AFC Bournemouth but of course the opposite to that worse case scenario, Chester City's Deva Stadium.

MK Dons' Stadium MK was built with concerts and the like in mind as well as staging football, while Leicester City followed the same pattern, but these grounds are based on the assumption of looking to the future of much bigger crowds in the seasons to come.


Whether or not MK Dons achieve this can only be left to their immediate fate, but with Leicester already looking the most unlikely team in League One to slip up before May, their success may be sealed already despite a natural drop in attendances this season.

At the opposite ends of the scale, Millwall's plan to relocate to a smaller venue in order to reduce maintenance cost now seems to be common knowledge, while Rotherham United's uncontrollable plight of having to move to the Don Valley Stadium in order to secure the Clubs' existence also beckons another debate on where exactly football stadia is now heading.

Will it happen to us then? Watch this space I suppose...and a story I'd like to take up in a future programme.






"Not long to go, only 14 normal league matches left and the weather is starting to get warmer. I can tell it's getting a bit warmer when I go out into the back garden and I can hear the excited croaks of the frogs in our pond."

"I think we own the 'in place' when it comes to frog courting. It's really early this year, it's normally end of March but the grunts and groans started as soon as the ice melted. I think all the frogs for miles around come to our pond for a jump, so to speak. The pond looks like a sort of writhing stew with hundreds of frogs crawling all over each other. I bet they haven't got a clue who's the dads of the different clumps of frogspawn but it's not a bad life.

The species of frog we have in our pond is the southern wide mouthed green frog which brings me nicely onto injuries and Gareth Edds. Gareth missed a couple of days training this week with a sore shin. He took a kick a week or so ago and it started to swell up a bit and was bothering him walking. All we can do is make sure the player can do everything, especially things that should bother the injury, tell the player what we think, and then the player makes the decision. Only he can feel what he's feeling so only he can say yes or no. Sometimes the player is not quite right but the manager still wants him to play so he'll have a chat with him and they'll make a decision. I know you're probably questioning playing players who are not 100% but if players only played when they were 100% we would never be able to put a team out, half the team are always carrying small niggles. When you hear on the radio that any player in a team is doubtful for Saturday, do you really think that when he plays on the Saturday he's 100%? No chance. That's only the 4" serious half paragraph I've written in the past 350 programmes, good

So back to Goody and his ankle. Fortunately last week he didn't do any further damage to his ankle ligaments. Well, I don't think he did, I'm still waiting for him to answer me from when I pressed his ankle on Monday and asked him how it was. Talking of Monday, he came in with a Jason Lee 'pineapple on his head' hair do so, if he is playing today, look out for that one. We're going to leave it to the end of the week and see how he is, wait there, let me toss the coin...... Tails, he won't be right. Just to finish, I promised one of our newly contracted pro's, Ryan Fraughan, I'd give him a mention. He's been begging me all week to mention that he has hurt his little knee and that he's been a very brave boy and hasn't cried, since a few days after he did it. If you see him in the stand, he's the one who looks like he's been hit in the chin with a bazooka, give him a bit of a hug. Whatever you do, don't stare at his chin dimple, he gets really embarrassed."

Mark Bosnich completing the full 90 minutes and Liam O'Brien hitting the post with a free kick late on just two but ultimately Rovers missed out on a final against Manchester United at Wembley Stadium.

PRENTONIAN NOSTALGIA

With talk of the Central League, currently sponsored by totesport.com, becoming the centre of yet another reshuffle next season, we thought we'd take a look at the earliest and little known connection between Royers and the West Cheshire League, which now forms the stable base for amateur football across Wirral and the surrounding areas...

Rovers' reserve side had already been members of the Wirral District Association Football League competing for the first time at the start of the 1892 93 season. Shortly after Tranmere Rovers had moved to the current Prenton Park site in March 1912 and with the First Team having been promoted to Division One of the Lancashire Combination, the Reserve team was restored to duty and took its place within Division One of the West Cheshire League for the 1912-13 season.

They were now facing opposition such as New Brighton Tower Amateurs, Hoylake, Ellesmere Port, Wirral Railway and Chester's reserve team who had also joined the League for the very first time.

Also included were Wirral's current Unibond Premier League side Cammell Laird, and meetings between the two clubs were often feisty affairs to say the least, but none the less entertaining. The first league meeting was won by Lairds 1-0, but Rovers gained revenge in the return fixture at Prenton Park as the hosts ran out 4-2 winners.

Their opening match in the League though saw them entertain Wrexham Nomads at Prenton Park, and watched by around 1,500 spectators, they won by a single goal scored in the second half by Harry Fishwick.


On 25th January 1913 Rovers were forced however to stage their home fixture with Chester Reserves at Hoylake's ground as Prenton Park was closed by the league after 'crowd trouble' had ensued at the First Team's meeting with Heywood United on Christmas Day 1912.

At the close of the match, which saw Rovers narrowly defeated 3-4, the crowd broke the barrier cordons and 'attacked' the referee. Although the local press played down the events as 'mere-horseplay', committee members of the Lancashire Combination took a different view and ordered Rovers should have their ground closed down for a duration of two weeks.

On their return however on the first day of February, they defeated Cammell Laird in a replayed Wirral Senior Cup fixture 4-1, although this was also clouded in controversy after Lairds had disputed the original result of the match played in January.

With the lack of newspapers photographs, views on games were often reproduced through cartoons and illustrations, as shown here for a league match against New Brighton Tower Amatuers.






They were however not so quick to show such games as one against Ellesmere Port, heavy rain flooded the Prenton Park pitch and forced the abandonment of the match after just 25 minutes with the score at 0-0. Rovers then won the rearranged game 5-0. Their 6-0 victory over Egremont, again at home, was also abandoned after 75 minutes due to bad light, but this time the result stood.

The Tower Grounds at New Brighton hosted several Rovers away matches, against Wallasey Rovers, Harrowby and of course New Brighton Amateurs who were the remnants of the infamous New Brighton Tower FC who had controversially competed in the Football League, before their withdrawl at the turn of the century.

In their very first season, Rovers Reserves had completed a successful campaign finishing second in the table, two points behind the Wallasey-based side Harrowby. They had also entered both the Pyke Challenge Cup and the Wirral Senior Cup, and progressed to the semi-finals of the latter.

TRANMERE ROVERS RESERVE.

It is many years since the Rovers ran a reserve team, and the resuscitation is generally looked upon with favour by their large band of followers, who, as a result, will be guaranteed a match every Saturday instead of every alternate week as in recent years. That the idea has caught on cannot for a moment be doubted, and it now only remains for the team to strike a winning vein to ensure its absolute success. The local interest which is bound to accrue by the visits of West Cheshire League clubs to Prenton Park should be advantageous both to the League and the Rovers' club, and we wish the innovation all the success it deserves. The directors have been wise in their choice of a captain, and we congratulate them on the appointment of T. C. Blackwood to the position. "Tommy" is a splendid fellow and a good footballer; therefore his assistance should be of great value to the Rovers club. He did good work last sesson, both for the Rovers and the Northern Nomads, and he accompanied Mr. T. H. Jackson's party on their Continental tour. The duties of honorary secretary will be carried out by Mr. Bert Cooke, and here again we have a most enthusiaetic chap, one who not only knows a footbuller when es him, but a man who is always willing to do his share of the work connected with an organisation such as the Rovers. The Reserves will dress in green jerseys and white pants, and from the list of players at the command of the directorate .ue prospects are of the brightest. They will open the season at Prenton Park on Saturday next, September 7th, with the Wrexham Nomads as visitors. This is the club which has taken the place of Wrexham Res. in the League, and we hear that an exceptionally strong side of amateurs, including several Welsh internationals, has been got together.



They were only beaten in a replay by Hoylake 1-4, staged on Good Friday 1913 at Cammell Laird's Park Road North around in front of a record crowd of over 3,000.

Their second season saw them finish in fourth place having won 14 of their 26 games played, and competing alongside Cammell Laird and Chester Reserves once again, while both the Wirral Senior Cup and Pyke Challenge Cup competitions this time took them all the way to the Final. A 2-0 victory over Wirral Railway saw them lift the trophy, played at littkenhead Park Rugby Club's Upper Park ground.

They returned to the same venue three days later to then contest the Pyke Cup Final, but lost by a single goal in extra time to Garston Gasworks in front of nearly 6,000 spectators.

1913-14 also marked the first season match programmes were made available to supporters at Prenton Park. Costing just one penny, the editions were numbered by both issue and volume and usually between 12 and 16 pages long and were sold to spectators at both first team and reserve team games.

A 10-1 victory over Prescot Wireworks was one of many high scoring games during the 1914-15 season, which all helped lovers to replicate their final league placing of the previous cason.

However, the Great War had intervened and although a good majority of games during the season were played, the League was disbanded entirely due to many players being sent across the Channel to combat the hostilities with Germany. When football across the country resumed after the war, Rovers' reserve side then took a different path, as the First team were on the verge of transferring from the Central League to the Football League. The quality of opposition in the West Cheshire League was deemed unsuited to Rovers

ambitions at that time, but their association with the West Cheshire League was renewed once again in 1936, entering their newly formed 'A' team within a single division of 12 teams. Their membership ran through to 1939-40, when wartime conditions again intervened, before rejoining in 1947-48 and competing in Division One. Although Rovers were never crowned champions during their time, they continued competing up until 1960-61, when they resigned following an invitation to join the newly- structured Lancashire League.

A brief flirtation with the West Cheshire League resurfaced however in 1978-79, but was ruthlessly cut short midway through the 1980-81 season when Rovers were forced to withdraw` their 'A' team from the Second Division. Along with the Reserves who were also withdrawn from the Lancashire League, it all came amidst the early throws of the infamous financial crisis at the Club which would accelerate over the following seasons.

These days, the West Cheshire League remains a flourishing three-tier set up which combines the reserve sides of Marine, Cammell Laird and Vauxhall Motors alongside other renowned local amateur clubs such as Heswall, Poulton Victoria, Ashville and the re-formed New Brighton AFC which once provided regular Football League 'derby' opposition for Rovers between 1923 and 1951.

The League also operates a fully-fledged official website which now contains amongst other details, a full run down on the history of the West Cheshire League in its entirety, which can be found at www.west-cheshire.org.uk


Tony Pullein's background piece on Rovers commented that many observers reckoned our manager Johnny King, had the easiest job in football.

With the two across the Mersey riding high as usual and gates at Prenton Park averaging not much more than 4,000 that seemed, on the face of it, a strange theory. However Tony had obviously noted that Johnny had not been having any sleepless nights pondering on his team selection as he had amazingly been able to name the same line-up, including John James on the substitute's bench, for our first 24 league games of the season!

Not surprisingly the team spirit and understanding this had engendered had paid handsome dividends on the pitch and we travelled south for our New Year's holiday clash against Danny Williams' Robins in the second of two promotion places. Swindon themselves were comfortably in the top half of the table, but needed an exceptional run of form to get themselves close to the summit in those pre-play-off days,

The Superwhites' exciting blend of youth and experience had seen them see of Oxford, Sheffield Wednesday, and Portsmouth convincingly over the Christmas period. The latter two, incidentally were propping up the table! Ronnie Moore and Bobby Tynan had been amongst the goals as usual and another player who had enjoyed a rewarding Yuletide was winger, Steve Peplow, who featured in one of the few photographs in the programme, wearing Swindon Colours during the 1970-71 season which he spent on loan at The County Ground prior to moving to Nottingham Forest.

The action photos were from Town's 3-1 home win against Plymouth and in one of them, nineteen year old Chris Kamara was seen challenging in his usual genteel way for a high ball. He was also the subject of the player interview and explained how he had arrived at Swindon via Portsmouth having been born and bred in Middlesbrough. Reflecting his love of horseracing, Chris named Lester Piggot as his hero and the article concluded by predicting that one-day the promising young midfielder could become just as much a household name. As living-rooms across the country vibrate with his voice booming out of the television every Saturday afternoon, I think we can safely say the man amazingly described in the programme as "quiet and softly spoken" has fulfilled that promise although probably not in the way which it was expected! The Chairman's "Talk of the Town" lamented the fact that





Hartlepool United

It's a couple of weeks until Rovers are back on the road. When we do, on 3 March, it's a trek to the north east coast as we take on Hartlepool United. And, as ever, here's a few facts to tide you over.

- Hartlepool United was formed in 1908 as Hartlepools United. An amateur side, West Hartlepool Amateur FC had been founded some 27 years earlier.
- The naming of Hartlepools United, to represent the two boroughs of Hartlepool and West Hartlepool" went against popular opinion as there were doubts over professional sport. As a result, not all of the 2,000 £1 shares that were offered when the club was formed were taken up.
- Victoria Park, the club's home for the last 100 years, was originally home to West Hartlepool Rugby Club. When the rugby club folded, Hartlepools was formed and took over at the ground.
- Brian Clough cut his managerial teeth at Hartlepool. He was appointed manager in October 1965.
 The club became Hartlepool AFC in 1968 after the two boroughs were amalgamated.
- A temporary wooden stand was built at the end of the First World War after it was destroyed by bombs from a German Zeppelin. It came down in 1985!
- Hartlepool natives are known as "Monkey Hangers" after a monkey, washed up on the Hartlepool shoreline, was mistaken for a French spy and was hung. The club's mascot, HAngus The Monkey, plays on this moment in history.
- The second man to wear the H'Angus suit, Stuart Drummond, was voted as the borough's Mayor in 2001. He had campaigned in the suit at games and promised free bananas to all schoolchildren. After being elected he gave up the role of H'Angus. He was re-elected in 2005, doubling his vote in the process!
