



then there could be a good crowd up at Molineux too.





Carling Cup Second Round Draw →





The draw for the Carling Cup second round took place on Wednesday

evening and Town have been handed an away tie against Wolverhampton Wanderers which will take place on Tuesday 25th August.

Town's victory on Tuesday night was the first time in five years that The Robins had progressed into the second round of the competition.

Previous first round games had left a lot to be desired but the 4-1 win at MK Dons certainly set the record straight in emphatic style. The last first round win came back in August 2004 in front of a sparse 1,672 crowd at Rushden & Diamonds. Matt Hewlett's last-gasp effort from close range was enough to secure progress.
















Gordon Greer:

Captain's notes

uesday's performance was really encouraging against a side that were in the play-offs last year.

It was a great opening goal from J-P to set us on our way. He took it really well and it was a spectacular strike. After that Billy got up and running for the season with a couple of goals and as he was playing up top, he deserved them for a workmanlike performance as ever.

Today attentions turn back to the league and this is where we have to continue the good work. MK Dons will come here looking for three points, but we must keep our focus and not get too carried away with what happened on Tuesday. We were really hurting after Saturday and MK Dons will have felt the same after the midweek game. They will want a change of fortunes, but if we apply ourselves like we did against MK Dons on Tuesday then we shouldn't be too far way.

People in football always tell you when you are young that it's how you deal with defeat that is a true test of character. When I first came here from Doncaster I noticed how good it was. Hopefully we can get the ball down and play some attractive football on it.

The draw for the second round of the Carling Cup took place on Tuesday night and Wolves will be a good tie. I played there at the end of last season for Doncaster Rovers when Wolves were presented with the Championship trophy. Our cup tie will be a tough one, but as players we want to test ourselves against the best in the country and the Carling Cup will give us an opportunity to do that.





what were your impressions of the side in pre-season?

STEVE: Good in defence, good in midfield...


ANDY: I agree, a very solid make up, with an impressive spine. Despite Gillingham, I think we'll be harder to beat with the way he's [Danny Wilson] set the team up. We've got a really strong midfield.

DEAN: Having a strong midfield will make a nice change from previous seasons.

ANDY: Like everyone else, though, I do have concerns with our strike options...

STEVE: I was wondering if we'd see any more of Jan Klukowski, the trialist who scored two against Swindon Supermarine.

ANDY: I could score two goals against Supermarine...

STEVE: Well, he scored two for Carlisle last season as well. They really rated him.

DEAN: David Lucas has got a good mouth on him, which bodes well...

ANDY: We were talking about the goalkeeper situation earlier, and we were surprised we'd signed a third keeper, the young lad from Poland Jakub Jesionkowski.

STEVE: He's one for the future,

I reckon.

ANDY: That, or he's a businessdriven signing.

STEVE: Maybe, he's cost us nothing, he's very highly rated, he's 20, so that would fall into line with that theory.

DEAN: I don't think he's been brought in to replace either of the other two just yet. Phil Smith's still got another year on his contract...


ANDY: I like Phil Smith, too. He's always had a good relationship with

the fans, because we all appreciate how much he wants to be here. I thought he deserved his contract after a good end to the season, and he played well against West Brom in pre-season.

DEAN: He made some mistakes at the start of last season, which made me question whether he was good enough, but he did come back and finish the season really well.

STEVE: He did come back strongly, you're right.

DEAN: I'm really looking forward to seeing lescinel Jean-Francois this season.

ANDY: I've been really impressed with him this summer. He seems to have grown in stature and he played well in the friendlies.

DEAN: He looked great in the last game of the season away at Peterborough, too.

have you been impressed with Jonathan Douglas?

DEAN: We've only needed someone like him for the previous five seasons...

STEVE: And the rest!

ANDY: He reminds me of Craig Easton, in terms of the way he holds the ball up. He's a very similar player in that role, but obviously Craig fell away a bit last season.

DEAN: Douglas looks happy to break things up and give the ball to the more attacking players, which is what we need.

STEVE: I think it's difficult to judge people on pre-season alone, so I'm going to reserve my opinion.

DEAN: True, there were players who did well last summer who didn't progress during the season.

STEVE: Gordon Greer was the key capture of the summer for me, he's continued where he left off last season.

ANDY: Greer's excellent...

STEVE: He looked so solid against West Brom. He controls the defence and the players who play alongside him grow in stature as well. For example, Jerel's a different player alongside him. Morrison's commanding a bit more, too. He reads the game well.

ANDY: I agree. Greer is the foundation of that defence. I think Morrison and Ifil are both good players, but they do perform better when alongside him. Greer just gives everyone a bit of composure.

DEAN: I think it's important there is some consistency in the centre of defence this year. It was hard for Morrison, a young player learning his trade, having to play alongside different players each week.

STEVE: The thing is, defenders in the third division will always make mistakes. If they didn't, they'd be playing in the Premier League. You have to expect the odd mistake, that's just part of life at this level, and some of our fans don't appreciate that.

on the subject of younger players, what about Lloyd Macklin?

ANDY: I'm sure he'll grow and grow as a player. He has great potential...

DEAN: He needs a goal. He works so hard and you can see him giving everything. I think as soon as he gets that first goal you'll see him go...

STEVE: He's scored enough for the reserves, so he obviously knows where the goal is.

Billy Paynter?

STEVE: I think he's a really good player, but I don't think playing him on his own up front is going to get the best out of him.

DEAN: You need someone with rapid pace if you're going to play one up front, no offence to Billy!

ANDY: You know what you're getting from him. He works hard, he puts his shoulder in and gets about, and he brings others into play. He works so hard for the team, he often does the work of two players. Coxy was Coxy and he could get behind the defence, but Billy's not that kind of player.

STEVE: Coxy liked to come deep and get the ball last season, as did Billy. I think that was partly because they felt like they had to at times, but with the midfield we've got now, Paynter won't have to do that this season.

STEVE: I think we'll definitely see more goals from midfield and defence this season. And you can quote me on that!






ANDY: If we do go with one up front, then we need to have a player in the hole. I'm not sure who that player is, but maybe Anthony McNamee, Alan O'Brien or John Paul McGovern. Maybe Michael Timlin? He often used to sit a bit deeper, but with Douglas alongside him, he might be able to bomb forward a bit more...

DEAN: And let's not forget Easton. He was excellent in his first season and he can play coming in from the right.

STEVE: One thing's for sure, Wilson loves his quick wingers...

DEAN: You're right. It'll be O'Brien and McNamee on either wing, I think.

ANDY: Paul Sturrock liked his wingers as well, which is he why he bought McGovern...

DEAN: He was excellent against Bristol Rovers (April) last season.

ANDY: He made the second goal. He can be sublime at times, although I'm probably his biggest critic!

STEVE: My issue isn't with our wingers going forward, it's about being able to defend as well and get a foot in. You have to defend from the front.

DEAN: I thought McNamee really improved that side of his game in the second half of the season last year. But it depends on the formation; you can't ask them to defend if they're playing off a lone striker.

What have you made of Alan O'Brien?

DEAN: I'm glad we've got a rightsided winger, because I felt Hal Robson-Kanu made a big difference to us last year. In fact, I think he's part of the reason we stayed up. It meant we weren't doing everything through McNamee.

ANDY: The guy's lightning fast. He's so quick.

DEAN: And I think Wilson is the right man to develop him as a player.

ANDY: If anything, he's too rapid. I'm worried he'll be so quick he'll break forward and get ahead of the rest of the team!

STEVE: Hopefully he's got the delivery to match his pace, because we'll be lethal from set pieces. And you can guote me on that.

ANDY: I agree. I think the way we're set up, we'll be far more dangerous from set pieces. Last year they were our undoing defensively, but this year I think we'll be solid at the back, and more dangerous from them at the other end.

You all seem to like the Gaffer...

ANDY: Him and Fitton as a team, as a partnership, is great.

STEVE: He says the right things, he makes the right decisions; I never expected overnight success. Dean might have done...

DEAN: I wanted success by Christmas last season...

STEVE: ...but he came in and even before taking the team properly, when we played Leyton Orient on Boxing Day, we had a good reaction to his appointment and we won the game. Once he bedded in, there was a gradual improvement. Brighton away, Northampton away... good results and brilliant games.

DEAN: I think Wilson will show his true colours this season. I still think he's building his squad.

ANDY: And the relationship he has with the board is a good one. You don't get that very often. They're very open, which goes both ways. And he definitely has a striker up his sleeve...

STEVE: Even if it's a loan player, I'm not worried about the striker situation. He seems calm about it, which suggests he has a plan or two.

So, how are we going to start the season?

STEVE: I think we'll play with 11 players, and a few subs...


ANDY: Very funny! I think we'll be hard to break down, but that we won't score many goals. Lots of 1-0's...

DEAN: We'll beat MK Dons...
STEVE: Tight game, but we'll nick it.



Part of the backbone of the Dons' success since his arrival in August 2007, Frenchman Willy signed a contract extension in January 2009 that could keep him in Milton Keynes until 2011.

Born in Saint Claude, Guadeloupe in 1973, Willy's career started with Le Mans in France where he played with a young Didier Drogba.

He moved to these shores on a free transfer to join Millwall in 2000. After four years at the New Den, where he never really had the chance to shine, Gueret joined Swansea City and quickly installed himself as their number one.

He made 132 league appearances for the Swans before joining the Dons in the summer of 2007. It proved an inspired signing as the indomitable Frenchman went on to keep 24 clean sheets in 52 sterling appearances, without missing a league game.

LEWINGTON

The Club's captain, longest serving player and darling of the Cowshed, 'Lewie' has been the embodiment of MK Dons since the Club came into existence.

Such is his standing within the Club and influence both in the dressing room and out on the pitch, former manager Roberto Di Matteo had no hesitation in handing the 24-year-old the Club captaincy following Keith Andrews' departure to Blackburn Rovers in August 2008.

Born in Kingston,

Surrey and having graduated through the Dons Academy, 'Lewie' has been with the Club for 13 years and passed 250 appearances during the 2008/9 season.

Lewie is a hard-working left-back that has proved incredibly difficult to pass and is more than a little useful at the other end. He packs an almighty punch with his left peg from distance and delivers a deadly set-piece.

After earning a one-year contract following a trial period in the summer of 2007, Luke's promising performances in a number of positions saw him rewarded with a renewed contract a year later.



Chesterfield on July 1, 2008, He was Paul Ince's last signing before he moved to Blackburn Rovers.


He was a mainstay in the team during the 2008/9 season, bringing his own brand of drive and creativity to the midfield and chipping in with his fair share of goals too.

An energetic and busy playmaker, Peter came through the ranks at Glasgow Rangers, overcoming a serious knee injury in the process, but found first team opportunities difficult to come by at Ibrox.

He signed for Kilmarnock in 2004 and went on to make 75 appearances and score six goals in over three years with the Rugby Park club before making the break south of the border.

BEST REST THE

Former Plymouth defender Matthias Doumbe made his first appearance for MK Dons last weekend in the 0-0 home draw with Hartlepool United. Another Plymouth connection saw Jason Puncheon rejoin the Dons on loan from Home Park. A player wellknown to Town fans, Sol Davis, joined just before the season opener after plying his trade with Luton Town in recent years and made his debut in midweek, against Swindon. Other players to feature in midweek included penalty scorer and former Wycombe striker Jermaine Easter, midfielder Luke Chadwick and Stephen Gleeson. The visitors will be keen to avenge a Carling Cup defeat with victory this afternoon.



Paul Ince returned to stadiummk in July 2009 for his second spell in charge of the club after the departure of Roberto Di Matteo to join West Bromwich Albion.

In completing the deal, Ince was given the opportunity to return to the Club where he had, barely twelve months previously. secured unprecedented success.

He took charge of the Dons for the first time in July 2007 and immediately introduced a hugely-attractive brand of attacking football that brought the masses to stadiummk in the stadium's inaugural season. Led by an enormously talented group of players and driven on by Paul's inspirational style of management, the Dons romped to the League 2 title with a sizeable total on 97 points while equalling a 61-year-old Football League record of 18 away wins in a season.

But perhaps the most memorable moment of Ince's first reign came on the glorious March afternoon when he led a 33,000-strong MK Army on the Club's first visit to the home of English football. At Wembley, in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Final, Ince's Dons overcame Grimsby Town by two goals to nil to secure Club's first ever piece of silverware.

At the end of the 2007/8 season, Paul was lured away from stadiummk by the prospect of managing in the Premier League when Blackburn Rovers came calling.

After signing his first professional contract in 1997, he played 128 games for the Robins over five years before Joe Kinnear paid £60,000 to take him to Luton in 2002.

During his time with the Hatters, Davis became something of a cult hero with the Kenilworth Road faithful and was named Player of the Year following Luton's promotion from League 1 in 2005. Sol's place in the hearts of the Hatters fans was strengthened when he bounced back heroically from a life-threatening stroke suffered in October 2006 and returned to the Luton team a little more than two months later. He made 225 appearances for the Hatters during a seven-year spell.

The defender will wear the number 20 shirt this campaign and made his debut at left-back against Swindon in Tuesday's Carling Cup tie.

How and when did you join Swindon Town?

In the summer of 2000. I had been to college where I studied a green keeping course. At the time the groundsman was a guy called Mark Paynter, who was a friend of mine. He needed an assistant so suggested I come in and help out. However Mark left the club about six months later which is when Geoff Warren returned as Head Groundsman. I did two years as Assistant Groundsman to Geoff and when he left I was offered the main role. At the time I didn't feel quite ready for it so the Club used a contractor - Sportsturf. I spent a number of years working for them whilst also looking after the pitches at Aston Villa, Wolves and the training ground at London Wasps. That gave me a lot of experience dealing with different surfaces. The Swindon takeover went through in January 2008 and the new owners wanted a groundsman here just to concentrate on Swindon - so soon after I joined as the club's full-time Head Groundsman.

A CURADOVE

In a series of new articles we will be taking a look behind the scenes here at **Swindon Town Football Club** and find out more about 'the office' and beyond.

What does your role involve?

Taking sole care of the main pitch and in the future I may be looking to take care of the training ground.

Describe your average day?

At the moment there is a lot of cutting. I get in at about seven, prepare the mowers and get on with things. We are also fertilising every two to three weeks which in itself is a lot of work. There is always a lot going on and things change with the seasons.

How does your role change on a matchday?

If the weather is fine then the aim is to cut the pitch on the morning of the game and cut the surrounds of the surface to make sure the place is looking tidy. Then I set up the goals, mark out the pitch and walk over the playing surface to do the final checks.

After half-time and full-time myself and a few helpers go out onto the pitch to repair the divots and try and make the surface look presentable, which may involve – in time – cutting it again.

Most memorable moment at Swindon?

Personally being nominated for the League One Groundsman of the Year was a high point as the pitch was in the top three in the division. In terms of following the team, I was sat in the Town End when Danny Invincibile score THAT goal against Peterborough United so had a great view of it. The promotion under Paul Sturrock was an enjoyable time, to. You always remember promotions!

And your lowest point with the Club?

In the dark days a few years back. There was just no money about and I had to try and carry out the pitch renovation with zero budget. That basically involved putting a bit of seed down, it was very restrictive and a lot of effort went into trying to make the pitch the best that we could do with what was available – or not as the case was back then!


Other managerial changes see Roy Keane appointed at Sunderland in August 2006, a change that



Billy Paynter is replaced by Mark Marshall just before injury time and receives a deserved round of applause from the Swindon supporters behind the goal.






hree months ago I think you'd have got pretty long odds on Swindon starting the season with the squad list on the back of this programme.

On paper it's the kind of squad which has really got me excited about the new campaign.


I, along with most Town fans

SYNDROME GROUP


Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parentled support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.

The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities – football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 – 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

PHYSIOLOGICAL
DEMANDS OF
FOOTBALL

own Fitness and Conditioning Coach David Morrison offers fans an insight into the demands of playing professional football...

The level of fitness a player possesses can markedly affect the performance on the field of play. It is therefore essential for football players to possess a high level of fitness in order to be able to cope with the physical demands of a game and to allow for technical skills to be utilized throughout the ninety minutes of match play.

The physiological demands of football have been researched thoroughly in recent years, particularly with respect to the effects and implications of fatigue. Scientific studies have identified that at least 90% of the energy demands during the course of a game are met via aerobic (with the presence of oxygen) metabolism suggesting that the aerobic system is vital to football players.


Players can cover distances of up to 14 km during a game, while heart rate data during games has been extrapolated to estimate that players work at around 75-80% VO2max, a level thought to be close to the anaerobic threshold (point of lactate production), or the upper limit at which continuous exercise can be maintained without the accumulation of lactate. The physiological responses to this level of work-rate can elevate heart rates to 180-190 beats per minute which has been

estimated to be 80-90% of one's maximal heart rate. The importance of these values comes apparent when comparing football players VO2max values. Research has shown there to be a high correlation between a player's VO2max and the distance covered and the number of sprints attempted during a game.

Although such a small percentage of energy (10%) is provided by the anaerobic system (Bangsbo, 1994) its importance is significant because the timing of such efforts, with or without the ball, are crucial as their successful deployment may greatly affect the outcome of the game. Players generally cruise or sprint every 30 seconds and sprint all out only once every 90 seconds covering an average distance of 15 meters. In addition players complete on average of 15 tackles, 10 headers and 50 involvements with the ball. They change direction on 50 occasions, whilst sustaining forceful contractions to maintain balance and control of the ball against defensive pressure.

The significance of these values becomes apparent when planning a fitness training program so as to enable a player to maintain performance throughout the 90 minutes of a game and sustain a long season performing in approximately 40 games. While the physiological preparation of football players aims to maintain an optimal level of fitness over the course of a season, possible fluctuations in both volume and intensity of training can have obvious affects on fitness and performance.

Evidence does exist to suggest that players show significant reductions in fitness levels towards the end of the season due to the lack of opportunities throughout the season for specific fitness training.

Swindon Town's Under 18's travelled up to Everton last weekend for a pre-season warm-up game.



he Under 16's and Under 15's have been back in for nearly five weeks, due to the Milk Cup tournament and the players have looked sharp and ready to kick on with their development.


It is now a key time for these players with the Under 15's looking to push into the next age group and the Under 16's looking to earn a youth contract.
