




This has been established to replace the Achieve by Unity Fans Partnership which has been running for two years now.



The Doncaster-born player, who had joined Yeovil in the summer of 2008, made 46 appearances for Yeovil scoring five goals including the third goal in the recent 3-3 draw with Leyton Orient at Huish Park.

His departure came as a surprise to some fans but the wheels were already in motion behind the scenes.

"I had a call from my agent saying that he'd had some interest from Millwall and asking if I'd be interested.

"I said that I would be; after all they're a big club and had a good season last year," said Danny.

"I had a phone call from the manager saying that they'd agreed a deal which was in both clubs' interest and it all went from there.

"I travelled down on the Tuesday morning and signed in the transfer window."

Danny moved down to Yeovil when he joined the Glovers and admits it will be a real culture shock to join the Lions.

"I'll be looking for a place on the outskirts of London as I don't really want to be in the hustle and bustle of London.

"I think Millwall train away from London so living outside shouldn't be a problem," he confirmed.

He then looked back on his time with Yeovil. His highlight? "I'd say the two goals against Crewe was a great personal moment for me," he said recalling the day when his brace put the Glovers two up before Crewe came back and almost snatched a point.

So Danny leaves with the best wishes of supporters ringing in his ears.

Is there any message he has for the fans left behind? "Yes. I'd like to thank them all for their support for me, they've been brilliant to me and I really appreciate that.

"I loved playing for Yeovil, it was a great experience and I loved my time there."

Everyone at Yeovil Town Football Club would like to wish Danny the best of luck with his new club and we look forward to seeing him again for the visit of Millwall on Tuesday 13 April.

"So hopefully now that will continue, and we can keep the results coming."


And looking to the rest of the season, Lindsey knows that there are a number of strong teams that have to be beaten if the Glovers are to realise their promotion dream.



RAIG Alcock has vivid memories of the last time he played against Swindon Town, a match which came at the end of a tumultuous week for the Glovers.

Alcock lined up at right-back against the Robins at the County Ground last December and scored his first ever goal for Yeovil with a tenth-minute header.

That goal put the visitors 1-0 up and prompted a huge outpouring of emotion as the game came just days after midfielder Darren Way was involved in a road accident.

Alcock recalled: "It was a really big week for the club, especially because Darren had been in the accident and we were all so worried about him.

"It was so important that we won the game for him and also because we knew a win would lift us out of the relegation zone over Christmas.

"I scored the first goal and it was a brilliant feeling to score for the first time in such a big game as well.

"We all celebrated the goal together and signalled that we were all thinking of Darren as well so it was quite

After Alcock and Lee Peltier - with his first goal for the club - put Yeovil 2-0 ahead, Swindon fought back to level just after half time.

But an own goal from Jerel Ifil sealed victory for Yeovil and took them out of the bottom four in League 1. Alcock headed in from a corner that day and his presence in the penalty area seemed to surprise the home defenders.

The right-back added: "That was actually the first game that the gaffer let me go up for corners and I scored straight away.

"It's probably the advantage I have of being guite small; it lets me sneak into the area unnoticed.

"Since then I haven't gone forward that much but this season the new manager has started to let me go up for corners again so hopefully I can start adding to my tally.

"Sometimes it's a choice between me and Terrell Forbes and he hasn't ever scored so I get the nod.

"But I actually think Terrell might break his duck at some stage this season because he keeps pushing forward and seems to think he's our version of William Gallas!"

Alcock captained the Yeovil team during Stefan Stam's recent absence through injury, a promotion he admits took him by surprise.

When Stam limped out of the draw with Exeter last month, the armband eventually found its way to the 21year-old. And he kept it for the subsequent league games while Stam

recovered from a hamstring strain.

Alcock said: "I really wasn't expecting it when I was given the armband at Exeter because there were other players with a lot more experience than me.

"I was delighted to be made captain though, it's a really big honour and I relish that sort of responsibility.

"I know Terrell Forbes was captain at the end of last season and I thought he might do it again when Stamy wasn't available.

"But on the Friday before the Leyton Orient game the gaffer told me I'd be captain again and it's nice to feel valued and be told you're doing ok.

"When I started my career, my first aim was to establish a place in the first team and one day it was an ambition to captain this club.

Alcock started 25 league games for Yeovil last season, competing with Peltier and then Danny Hutchins for the right-back spot.

He looked set to start this campaign as Town's first choice in the position, but was then sidelined by a groin injury in pre-season.


"It was a bad time to get injured because I'd had a good pre-season and I think I would have started the first game," added Alcock. "I wanted to hit the ground running but then I had a setback and I had to be patient. "I WAS DELIGHTED TO BE MADE CAPTAIN THOUGH, IT'S A REALLY BIG HONOUR AND I RELISH THAT SORT OF RESPONSIBILITY."

"I just had to make sure that I made the most of my chance when it came along and hopefully I've done that in recent matches."

As well as taking on the captaincy in recent weeks, Alcock has suddenly become one of the Glovers' more senior players despite his relative inexperience.

With on-loan teenagers Alex Mc-



Carthy, Steven Caulker, Ryan Mason and Jon Obika all appearing regularly, Alcock is no longer one of the team's youngsters.

"All of those young lads are destined to go on and have long and successful careers," said Alcock.

"Having them at the club has been a real breath of fresh air and you can tell they have come from Premier League clubs.

"They're all quality players and have done really well for us. It's been a change for me to not be one of the younger lads all of a sudden."

Swindon were tipped as potential play-off contenders before the start of the season but saw that optimism crushed by an opening day hammering at Gillingham. Since then Danny Wilson's men have embarked on a four-match unbeaten run to climb to eighth spot in League 1.

And Alcock knows Yeovil face a tough test this afternoon against a side that some fans consider to be local rivals.

"It will feel a bit like a derby because we're in the same area of the country and I know it's a game the fans look forward to," said the Truro-born full-back.

"They're one of a number of clubs in this division who will be looking to make the play-offs.

"But this league is so unpredictable and anyone can beat anyone and we go into every game believing we can win."

On to Tuesday night and the performance fell below the standards that I know Terry and Nathan are trying to instil into the players.


As a result, we suffered another disappointing first round exit in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy, a competition in which we'd hoped to do well this season.

The above words by the popular author have a special significance and topicality in the light of recent events at Ashton Gate. There is no doubt that Crystal Palace scored a perfectly good goal. Nevertheless the match officials disallowed it for whatever reason, and both teams must abide by refereeing decisions or anarchy would result.

Today we welcome all players, officials and supporters of Swindon Town to Somerset. Our visitors have had a somewhat mixed start to the season.

An unexpected opening day defeat surprised many, as did the tremendous Carling Cup battle with Wolves which resulted in Swindon being on the wrong end of the dreaded penalty shoot out. Today, however, is a local derby and we can be sure of a testing time.

Since my last notes I have seen two games. At Exeter we were slow starters but made amends in the second half.

Ryan Mason's spectacular equaliser was one of the best goals I have seen us score in recent years.



In regards to my time at Yeovil I will look back fondly especially with friendships I formed, with playing and backroom staff.


I signed because Russell Slade phoned me the day after I got released from Oldham and although I had options to continue to play up north I decided to move everyone down south (with a little opposition from the wife).

TABLE-topping Charlton Athletic manager Phil Parkinson hailed a consistent team as the reason behind his side's best start to a season in the club's history

The boss saw his side maintain their 100% record with a 4-0 win at struggling Tranmere Rovers last weekend and admitted he focuses each training session on trying not to get players injured.

The Addicks, who travel to Brentford today, have started with the same eleven for all their five matches this season.

Parkinson said: "It's great after what we've been through over the last couple of years. It's nice to have a positive mark on the club's history, but we're not getting carried away.

"We spoke about the record to the lads before the match and we told them they had a chance of making history, it feels good."

Tranmere manager John Barnes told his players to start believing in themselves accusing them of being a squad which "does not think it is good enough."

The ex-Liverpool legend said: "I think the players have the belief when they play against the so-called lesser teams.

"But, I don't think we do when we play against the big teams and we have to get it."

Fellow Anfield star Gary Ablett described bottom club Southampton as one of the division's best sides after seeing his Stockport County team earn a 1-1 draw last Saturday.

County earned a point courtesy of a Carl Baker penalty awarded for handball in injury time at the end of the match, infuriating Saints' boss Alan Pardew whose side took the lead through a Ricky Lambert spot-kick – also awarded for handball.

Ablett said: "The referee has seen them both as handball and given the penalties, but I'd rather focus on what a good side Southampton are.

"They won't be in the position they're in now for long if they continue to play like that."

"I think there's a lot more to come in certain areas of the pitch but you can't fault the players for what they have done."




The 19-year-old opened his account in last weekend's 2-1

The man pushed aside to make way for Lucas was last year's No.1 **PHIL SMITH**. The 29-year-old made his name in Non-League with Folkestone, Dover, Margate and Crawley before signing for the Robins in 2006.

He has since made 71 league appearances, although none yet this term. Youngster **JAKUB JE-SIONKOWSKI**, 20, is also in the ranks, but has yet to make his debut.

DEFENDERS

NEW signing SCOTT CUTHBERT, plucked from Scottish giants Celtic in the summer, started the season on the bench but an impressive performance against Wolves and a goal against Southend last weekend means the 22-year-old is likely to keep his place at centre-back today.

Alongside him, expect to see skipper GORDON GREER, the former Kilmarnock and Doncaster stopper. Greer, 28, enjoyed a 19-game loan spell at the County Ground last term and his performances played a large part in Swindon's late surge up the table. A BOX-TO-BOX midfielder who can also play on either wing or even as a full-back. JONATHAN DOUGLAS hasn't missed a minute of Swindon's season so far.

The tough-tackling 27-year-old joined the Robins in the summer after four years and over 150 appearances at Leeds. Released from Elland Road after a contract dispute, he also has eight caps for Ireland.

Right winger JON-PAUL McGOV-ERN is another of Danny Wilson's automatic picks. The pacey wideman, who can also operate through the middle, made his name during Sheff Wed's 2005/06 promotion campaign and had one season at MK Dons before joining the Robins in 2007.

He began his career at Celtic, so should have much in common with new midfielder SIMON FERRY.

The 21-year-old joined on loan from the Hoops last week and went straight into the side for last weekend's 2-1 win over Southend.


However, an excellent run-in secured a 15th-place finish and Wilson has carried that form into the 2009/10 campaign.

As a midfielder with the likes of Chesterfield, Brighton, Luton and Sheff Wed, he made more than 600 League appearances and notched over 100 goals.

But it was as the manager who led Barnsley to the top-flight for the first time in their 110-year history that he really shot to fame.

Barnsley's stay lasted just one year and since then, Wilson has gone on to manage Sheffield Wednesday, Bristol City and MK Dons. In 2006-07 he led Hartlepool to promotion from League 2 but was acrimoniously sacked in December 2008





This is his first taste of competitive football after missing almost three years with a succession of injuries.

Before his arrival, MICHAEL TIMLIN had been the man at the heart of the Swindon midfield. Formerly with Fulham,

where he began life as a left winger, the 24-year-old playmaker made 38 appearances last season, captaining the side on several occasions.

On the left, **ANTHONY McNAMEE** has been an ever-present this season. Short in stature but big on pace, the 26-year-old was a big part of the Watford side that won promotion to the Premiership under Adie Boothroyd in 2006 and went on to play seven times in the top flight.

Several man of the match performances have ensured he is a big favourite at the County Ground.

AON KNOMS DID

The 24-year-old joined from Hibernian in the summer and has one start and one sub appearance to his name so far. MARK MARSHALL, 23,

is also an option out wide, but has only featured from the bench so far this season.

FORWARDS

FOLLOWING the departure of 35-goal top scorer Simon Cox and a long-term back injury to **LEE**

PEACOCK, BILLY PAYNTER was left as the only recognised striker at the club.

But the 25-year-old former Port Vale man has stepped up to the plate, scoring three times to add to the 11 in 42 starts he hit last term.

Wilson has finally moved to shore up his paper-thin attack though. BEN

SWINDON TOWN



HUTCHINSON arrived from Celtic last week and partnered Paynter against Southend.

The 21-year-old, who started his career with Middlesbrough and scored one goal in eight Premiership appearances, is highly rated at the Scottish club, for whom he has started five games.

And another loan star is speedy striker **TOPE OBADEYI**, who made his debut as a 56th-minute sub against Southend and hit the winner just 23 minutes later.

The Birmingham-born 19-year-old is on a month's loan from Premier League Bolton and already has three Trotters appearances to his name.

The only other man in contention is home-grown 20-year-old **LLOYD MACKLIN**, who can play as either a winger or a striker and became the youngest player ever to represent Swindon when he came on as a substitute against Brentford in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in 2007.

WHAT HAS BEEN YOUR BEST MEMORY WATCHING SWINDON TOWN?

THE play-off final against Leicester City in 1993. That match was amazing; watching Paul Bodin hit that penalty was the best feeling I had experienced at that tender age.

After leading 3-0, Leicester bringing it back to 3-3 was devastating. There was a real sense of justice between the fans after our demotion from the Premiership due to financial irregularities.

AND YOUR WORST MEMORY?

BRIGHTON away in the play off semi-final in 2004. That was without doubt the lowest point of my football fan life.

We were by far the best team over the two legs. We arrived at Brighton quite early and literally stood in the rain for eight hours. Soaked, cold and beaten on penalties.

I will never forget the yell of Rory Fallon when he hit our goal in the 97th minute.

To let in a last minute soft goal was a nightmare; I still dislike Adam Virgo now.

HOW HAS THE SEASON GONE SO FAR?

WE started the season with a 5-0 defeat at Gillingham and now we are just off the play-off positions. I don't suppose I can complain really.

HAVE THINGS BEEN MUCH DIFFERENT SINCE THE MONEY TROU-BLES ENDED?

OFF the pitch yes, we are now a very professionally run club.

Not as much money has been invested into the playing squad as perhaps some people expected and we seem to have gone backwards a little in that respect over the past couple of seasons.

However, we now have a very good manager in Danny Wilson and have attracted some very good players like Jonathan Douglas to the club over the summer, so we seem to now have a little more pulling power than in the past.

WHAT WAS YOUR SOLITARY SEASON IN THE TOP FLIGHT LIKE?

THE Premiership days were fun, pure and simple. We lost a number of key players and our manager after our promotion to the Premiership therefore relegation was inevitable.

But still I must say I enjoyed every single game. We may have got beaten 5-0 but still how often did you see players like Ian Wright at the town!

"We obviously talk a lot about football and about goalkeeping so hopefully we can help each other improve over the course of the season."

McCarthy has yet to make his Reading debut but had first team experience from a series of loan spells last season.

He added: "Wimbledon were my first club and it was a blow when they moved to Milton Keynes. I was still at school and couldn't really move up there so I went to Wycombe instead." But McCarthy's progress at Adams Park was such that he soon became a wanted commodity and Reading paid a fee to the Chairboys to bring him to the Madejski.

He said: "I've had a great time at Reading and the club have been really good to me, especially the goalkeeping coach Sal Bibbo."

But McCarthy has also quickly established a good relationship with Yeovil's goalkeeping coach, the former Middlesbrough stopper Ben Roberts.

He said: "Ben's been brilliant and is really good to work with. I know he's played at the top level and played in an FA Cup Final and that experience is invaluable."







That squad will be slashed from 30 players to 21 next week, but another goal or two for the Glovers will leave Obika with a good chance of travelling to Egypt at the end of the month.

The striker's Spurs teammate Ryan Mason is also

on standby for the England Under-19 international against Russia in Shrewsbury on Tuesday.

The three youngsters have been in excellent form since representing Yeovil and thoroughly deserve their call-ups.

SEASON 1907/08

IN Part three of the new series "The Yeovil Town Files, we look back at the season when one of the most famous names in English football was

S season 1907/08 came around, changes were again afoot at Yeovil Casuals.

The previous season had not been a great one as the first team had finished a disappointing tenth of twelve teams in the Wiltshire League only three points off the bottom of the table.

The reserve team had also flattered to deceive and had ended the season seventh of eight in the Yeovil & District League ahead only of St Ivels. Alterations were needed and the summer saw them made.

The first thing on the agenda at the annual general meeting was to switch leagues again, leaving the Wiltshire League and rejoining the Somerset Senior League.

A team was also entered into the Dorset League so the

team, who had the English Cup and Junior Cup to go for, were going to have a busy season ahead.

The big news at the AGM was yet to come though. Mr. YOU KNOW? Bond, secretary of the club

and an ex-player to boot, announced that Yeovil Dixie Dean was born, Dean Casuals were no longer in existence and that the new season would see them play under a new name, Yeovil Town Football Club.

The changes in league and name injected new optimism into the club and surrounding areas. Petters United were still going well so the new Yeovil Town team were going to have competition again from very close to home.

New league, new name, what next? A new kit, 'that's what. The team looked very smart in their shirts with a green body and white edging as they took to the field for their first friendly

against Upton Park FC from East London.

Petters United were preparing for the new season as Yeovil & District League champions and looked equally stylish in their amber and black kit.

Yeovil were now ready to unveil their secret weapon on the division and what a weapon it was.

Back in the previous April, a striker by the name of Fred Hayward (nicknamed Johnny) had made his debut in a 1-2 defeat against Warminster but what was to follow was nothing short of incredible.

Hayward played up front with Harold Lodge and the pair were to terrorise defences all season long at league and county level.

The East Londoners won the friendly 4-3 with Lodge scoring twice and he scored again in the first Dorset League match in a 3-3 draw.

Hayward netted in that game too and, after three games without a goal, set off on a scoring run that may never be beaten. Defeats to Street (league) and Branksome Gas (cup) were followed by a 2-0 victory over Bruton where again Lodge netted. Then Hayward started.

The team suddenly found a free scoring burst from somewhere scoring seven against Wells City, six against Bruton and

putting five past RGA Weymouth.


Hayward notched eleven goals in seven games including a hat-trick and a four-timer too before taking a breather.

He then came back with an astonishing sixteen goals in eight games taking the match ball home a further three times. With such a prolific striker, Yeovil Town should have been miles clear at the top but a leaky defence constantly conceding goals wasn't helping.

The first local derby between Yeovil Town's reserve team and Petters United was in November and saw the Town triumph in front of more than 400 spectators.

The two sides met again in the Junior Cup drawing three apiece but when the referee didn't turn up to officiate the replay, a friendly was played instead which angered the crowd who "kicked the ball into the road".

December brought scandal to the club. The secretary Ernest Sercombe had taken a spell of leave and in



his absence, team captain
Maughan played three players
under assumed names in a 2-3
defeat to RGA Weymouth.

The Dorset FA clamped down on the Town fining them two guineas, deducting two points and banning Maughan for two weeks.

January came and the first team were top of the Somerset Senior League and going well. The team remained unbeaten in 1908 until 7th March when they crashed 3-8 to Weymouth in a Dorset League game.

The team recovered quickly however and responded by beating Frome Town in the semi-final of the League Cup in front of more than 1,000 supporters before losing 3-5 to Paulton Rovers in the final (after the first game ended 2-2).

The final attracted a whopping 3,000 fans to Wells City's ground and even witnessed a Hayward missed spot kick.


The closing stages of the season saw Hayward go on his third scoring spree of the campaign netting thirteen times in ten games.

Results were still inconsistent though and the team won two games 6-0 either side of a 0-7 defeat to Weymouth Whiteheads albeit a weakened team played in the Dorset game.

And so the season ended. The first team missed out on the Somerset League by a solitary point to champions Frome but had scored a hundred goals in total.

Johnny Hayward struck 41 times while strike partner Harold Lodge achieved 25 goals. The reserve team had silverware to celebrate when they pinched the Yeovil & District League title from Stoke-under Ham by a point and received their medals and trophy after a celebratory match against a "Rest of the League" team.

Financially the club were blooming with more than £24 in the bank which pleased the team's officials and led them to declare season 1907-08 "one of the most successful ever".

The healthy bank balance was raided to the tune of £2 in order to give the grandstand at Pen Mill a makeover. All was well on the good ship Yeovil and hopes were high of a great season to follow.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

GLYN BROOM

Date of Birth: November 17, 1955 Yeovil appearances: 66 Yeovil goals: 1

DEFENSIVE football in the seventies had a lot in common with what happens in the game these days. Teams often paired a big, cumbersome centre half with a ball-playing, cultured partner; the latter of the two sweeping up if his mate hadn't won the ball.

These were sweepers and Yeovil had the perfectly named man to fill the role. Glyn Broom joined Yeovil from Bath City after he was signed by Barry Lloyd.

He had enjoyed four years at

Twerton Park after, in turn, joining them from Swindon Town. His career at the County Ground was spent on the fringe of the first team appearing mainly in Football Combination matches for the reserves. This, as Glyn explained, gave him a good grounding in his career.

"I had five years at Swindon," he recalls "and came up against a lot of great players on their way back from injury for instance.

"The hardest opponent I ever faced was Peter Osgood when we played Southampton Reserves so it gave me an insight on dealing with the top strikers."

Glyn's proudest moment in football was the game we featured in a recent issue of 'The Glovers', the FA Cup tie with Norwich City in 1979/80.

It's worth repeating his comment when I asked him what it was like facing up to the likes of Justin Fashanu and Kevin Reeves.

"I soon realised that they had a pair of legs and a backside, same as anyone else really". You can't argue with his logic there.

In his time at Huish, Glyn played

with two partners in the back four. Jess Payne was one and Jimmy Harmison was the other.

"Jimmy came down from the north east and we bonded straight away" he states.

"Jimmy would go and win the ball but if he didn't for some reason, I'd sweep up after him. Broom by name, broom by nature!"

Glyn joined Yeovil after a measure of success at Bath City. The Twerton Park outfit had decent players of the likes of Colin Tavener, Richard Bourne and Paul Gover and even thirty plus years on, he remains friendly with some of them.

Yeovil Town also took on Kim Book and Nigel Ryan and they have a

reunion with Glyn and the others every eighteen months to mull over their views on football.

In those days, players had a career outside of football and this was to impact on Glyn's spell with Yeovil.

He worked for the ambulance service while at Huish but the travelling and the working hours weren't really conducive to keep both things going so he reluctantly left the club.

He's still in the same line of work now though he's progressed to the role of a paramedic tutor and a clinical team leader.

This allows him to enjoy his hobbies of five-a-side football and golf along with bringing up his beautiful family (partner Louise and children Amy, Jessica and Sam, his four-year-old son currently being built up with some fine roast dinners) at his home near Bath,


Glyn Broom was a top quality centre-half who could play a bit, was brave and gave twelve years good service to his three clubs. No one can brush those facts under the carpet!






