
Ryan Ainscow, Swindon asked:

If money were no object and you could sign any player from the Premier League on loan in the January transfer window, who would it be and why?



William 'Billy' Hill →




From the Boardroom

just carried on going.


LYNSEY: I've been following Town for over 16 years. Scary thought! It started off as a family thing, my Dad would take my brother and me.

CHARLOTTE: My first Town game was the Wembley play-off final in 1993. My dad took me and my sister up on a coach with Goatacre Cricket Club.


Were there many girls watching football when you were at school?

Do you find you mainly watch football with men, or do your mates watch Town, too?


LUCINDA: Most are male, although there are a few women in the group! I've brought friends along on a few occasions and they've always really enjoyed it, but it's not a regular thing. I know quite a few girls that go and I think more will come along in the future. In fact, I'm bringing a friend to Brentford away, so watch this space!

LYNSEY: I've tried over the years to get mates to go, but they're not really interested. They think I'm a bit mental sometimes. Luckily I've made mates,

male and female, through going to watch town.

CHARLOTTE: Same here, the only girls I know that like football are the girls I have met through supporting Town.

You obviously know your stuff when it comes to talking football, but do you find people can be patronising, because you're female?

LYNSEY: People can be patronising, but I find that once they know I'm a Swindon supporter they do tend to shut up! I think lower league fans are seen as more genuine. Normally I have conversations about football with other Town fans and they're never patronising.

CHARLOTTE: I think because I come across as quite girlie when people first meet me, then can be a bit shocked if they get me on the subject of football. I've probably been patronised and not even noticed!

LUCINDA: The people that you meet soon realise that you're not here because you've been dragged along, but because you want to be. You occasionally get the odd patronising comment from an away fan, but more often than not, it's pretty easy to put them in their place!

Do you feel the football experience is still mainly dominated by blokes?

CHARLOTTE: That's just the way it is - It doesn't really bother me and I hope that's the way it stays.

LYNSEY: There's nothing wrong with it.

CHARLOTTE: There are probably guys reading this now thinking 'What do they know?'

LUCINDA: I think it will always be a male culture and perhaps that's what puts more women off going? It's a shame, as it can be equally enjoyable for women as well, but I guess that's just the way it is.

CHARLOTTE: You get guys who think women only come to watch the 'hot blokes in shorts' and I guess to a certain extent there are girls out there like that, but not all of us!

Have you ever felt intimidated at a game?

LUCINDA: Not that I can

remember, although Gillingham away a few years back wasn't the nicest of experiences and I won't be going back. I guess there can be a minority that try and cause trouble, however most of the time. I've never had a problem.

LYNSEY: Only time I've felt intimidated at a game was Cardiff at home in the FA Cup in 1996. It was terrifying outside the ground afterwards.

CHARLOTTE: Once, years ago-I remember Millwall fans jumping over the turnstiles and invading our stand-that was scary! Also, that game when the Rovers fans starting ripping out the seats... I didn't like the way the atmosphere changed that night.

And I have to ask, have any of the players ever caught your eye?!

LUCINDA: I guess you can't ask us ladies a few questions about football without throwing that one in!

LYNSEY: If Charlotte doesn't mention Peter Thorne as one of the fittest players we've had I'll be most upset!

CHARLOTTE: Oh my god, I used to be so in love with Peter Thorne. I used to wait outside the ground every Saturday so I could watch him pull up in his car and have my photo taken with him. LUCINDA: There have been a few good looking players over time but I guess Lee Peacock has his place, as does Rory Fallon.

What have you made of the season so far? Highlights/lowlights?

LUCINDA: I didn't go to Gillingham away; I'm glad I didn't! The highlight has been that we've looked stronger ever since.

LYNSEY: I did go to Gillingham, but the response away at MK Dons was great and the Southampton game excellent. If the players go out and work really hard and give it everything [like they did against Southampton] then I'm happy. I felt so proud watching them that night. It's the sort of night fans live for. I just hope they can keep it up!



CHARLOTTE: The Southampton game was great, you're right, and the new kit; it's the best we've had for years!

Which players/team performances have impressed you?

LUCINDA: I think JP McGovern has been fantastic. His work rate and commitment have been excellent and he has earned his place in the side.

LYNSEY: Billy Paynter, for me. He's got a hard job, but he's trying his hardest.

Jonathan Douglas is a big-game player. He likes to get stuck in and be aggressive... we've needed a player like him in the middle for ages.

CHARLOTTE: I personally thought Lucas was immense against Southampton. He seems unflappable – he's really impressed me.

LUCINDA: Morrison has also stepped up to the first team and taken his chance. I think he will grow to become a superb centre back with Greer alongside him.

Any areas you feel we still need strengthening?

CHARLOTTE: Strikers?! LYNSEY: Striker please!

LUCINDA: I know we've got Tope from Bolton, but it's not a long-term solution. Support up front is a must and although we have now signed Hutchinson and Revell - we probably need some permanent additions.

The atmosphere against Southampton was pretty good, what would you do to ensure it's like that every week?

CHARLOTTE: Free beer and hot cheerleaders! In failing that, keep the good football coming and people will come back.

LYNSEY: If the team play like they did against Southampton, then there'll be a good atmosphere. Unfortunately it seems that the players have to perform before the crowd get behind them.

LUCINDA: The crowd will always become more enthusiastic when we are playing bigger teams and that's the way its always been. I'm a firm believer that the atmosphere will improve when the crowd have something to cheer about on the pitch, although its evident good support raises the team, catch 22 if you like! To improve the atmosphere you have to increase the fan base and to do that I'd probably offer more ticket deals to get people into the ground.

We play Colchester today, who have started the season well. Do they, or any other team scare you in the division?

LYNSEY: All the clubs in the league scare me! We could lose to any of them, but we could beat them all as well.

CHARLOTTE: I think in this league you can expect any results against any teams. Colchester's opening day result [they beat Norwich 7-1] may have been just as much a fluke as ours!

LYNSEY: The obvious favourites are Leeds, Charlton and Huddersfield.

LUCINDA: I agree, I think
Huddersfield will be one of the
biggest tests this year, since
they have spent a lot of money
strengthening their squad. I also
think Millwall have a good side
capable of getting out of this
division.

Where do you think we'll finish this season?

LUCINDA: I think we could finish around eighth, but lady luck would need to be on our side to finish higher. It would be a distinct improvement on last year and give us good ground to build on to push for the play-offs next season.

LYNSEY: It depends which
Swindon team comes out every
Saturday. If we play like we did
at Gills we'll go down, but if the
team who won at MK Dons and
Southampton turn up, we'll be
play-off contenders. I'd settle for
midtable and a couple of cup runs.
We've had so much happen in the
last few years, a nice restful quiet
season would suit me fine!

LUCINDA: I'd love to be more optimistic and say top six, but I don't think we are quite there yet.

CHARLOTTE: Part of the fun of being a Town fan is you never know what will happen next...

Manager was launched in mid-August after Paul Lambert chose to depart The Weston Homes Community Stadium to join League One rivals Norwich City. Lambert had seen his Colchester side put seven goals past The Canaries on the opening day – perhaps enough to raise a few eyebrows in the Carrow Road Boardroom.

Former Watford boss Aidy
Boothroyd has been tasked with
continuing the good work done
by Lambert after accepting the
Manager's role. Boothroyd, who was
out of work for ten months following
his departure from Watford, is eager
to make his mark with The U's and
believes that the U's are the perfect
fit for him.

"When you enjoy a lovely relationship

with people, like I had at Watford, and you have some success - which was down to a lot of people and not just me - what happens is, you kind of fall in love with a club," he said when appearing on Col U Live on Dream 100 recently.

Boothroyd continued: "Somebody very senior said to me when I left to make sure that when I came back, I made the right decision and pick the right club. It's like getting divorced. You don't want to get the wrong woman on the rebound, the guy added. As daft as that sounds, I think he's absolutely right."

Town fans will hope Danny Wilson can guide The Robins to three points this afternoon, bringing an early end to the Boothroyd honeymoon period.





O'Toole took his place in the starting line-up at Southampton last weekend and will hope to impress again this afternoon. The midfielder also spent a nine-game loan spell with Coca-Cola Championship side Sheffield United last term.

BEST OF

Former Chelsea defender Pat Baldwin has made almost 200 league appearances for The U's since joining the ranks in August 2002. Marc Tierney joined Colchester from Shrewsbury Town in January following a successful loan spell and the Bury-born defender adds experience to the backline. 6'3 defender Magnus Okuonghae had sampled life with five non-league clubs before breaking into the professional ranks in the summer, whilst fellow summer addition David Fox can list Manchester United amongst his own former employers. Simon Hackney was a January signing from Carlisle United and the midfielder scored in the Carling Cup defeat by Leyton Orient in August. Former Cheltenham Town forward Ashley Vincent returns to familiar territory this afternoon and scored against Town at Whaddon Road in August 2007.



Boothroyd joins the U's in what is his second managerial post, following his successful spell in charge of Watford.

He arrived at the Hornets following successful coaching spells at the U's East Anglian neighbours Peterborough United and Norwich City.

After two years at Carrow Road, he was appointed as Youth Development Officer and Technical Director at West Brom, before later joining Leeds United as a first team coach.

A year later, he joined up with Watford, where he was appointed as manager in March 2005 at the age of 34.

At the start of the 2005/6 season, Aidy said that his aim was to get the Hornets promoted to the Premier League. Nine months later, the team had made the playoffs and faced his former club Leeds United in the Play-Off Final.

Whilst life in the Premiership was to prove tough for the Hornets, the team did manage to reach the FA Cup semi-finals before they were eventually defeated by Manchester United.

Back in the Championship, Watford got off to a flying start in 2007/8, sitting nine points clear after twelve games. They eventually finished in the play-offs again, but lost to Premiership bound Hull City in the semi-finals.

His spell at Watford came to a close after 176 games on November 3rd 2008 and, after ten months out of work, he returns to employment to take over a U's side in good shape after the first month of the season.

How and when did you join Swindon Town?

I joined when Colin Todd was
Manager here. Malcolm Crosby, who
I had worked with up at Sunderland,
was a part of the coaching team
and I was then asked if I would
like the job. It came as a bit of a
shock because I was going to be Kit
Manager in addition to running the
hostel where youth team players
used to stay, but when I arrived I got
the washing too - three jobs piled
into one!

How difficult was the transition from player to working behind the scenes?

I had five years as goalkeeping coach at Sunderland before joining Swindon and looked after the kit up there too. When I joined Swindon it was just a case of getting back into the routine. It's great to still be in football, because there aren't many coaching jobs around and it's my luck that I'm still involved in the game.

What does your role at Swindon involve?

It's about making sure Swindon
Town teams have the right kit for
every game and training session. It's
not just the first team. As well as
thirty professionals there is the youth
team and the Centre of Excellence. I
don't do all the washing, but there is
a lot to do. For example, some days
there are double training sessions for
both the first team and youth team so
it gets busy. If the first team are off,
there are still the injured players who
need kit for training.

Tell us about your average home matchday?

I'll get to the stadium for around ten o'clock and finish off any washing that's left over from Friday training. The first team kit will already be out in the changing room as I do that on Friday afternoon, so on Saturday I make sure the youth team kit is prepared ahead of their games. Then it's doing final checks for the first team players and staff kit ahead of the game.

What are the current squad like to work with?



We have always had a good squad here and whilst we have underachieved in the past, the results have picked up this season and it's been going well.

The players do have some strange requests though. Some of them don't like having feet in their socks so my Wife, Sue, had to cut them off and sew them up again to make them look presentable. Some players wear Skins underneath their match shirts and I also look after their shin pads too.

Most memorable moment at Swindon?

When I picked up an award from the players at the Staff Christmas party last year. That was a great moment.

Colchester attempted a reply in January, and Manager Jim Smith was understandably disappointed when the game was abandoned through



Potential FA Cup glory came in a


trip to West Ham United where we grabbed an impressive draw, but the replay brought elimination by the First Division side.





Home Pride

As Scotland prepared to take on Holland in midweek for a World Cup Qualifier at Hampden Park, Town defender **Scott Cuthbert** was gearing up for today's home clash with Colchester United.

he 22-year old has settled well into life as a Robin after what was a gruelling start to his Town career.

A surprise inclusion in the starting line-up for the season opener at Gillingham, Cuthbert and his teammates were on the receiving end of an unwanted thrashing. After missing out on a starting berth in the following four games – he returned to the line-up for the Carling Cup clash at Wolves and hasn't looked back since.

The Scot is immensely proud of his roots and recalls the warm welcome he received from his fellow countrymen upon arriving in SN1 for the first time. With four Scottish-born players in the most recent starting line-up, the Scots' roots are deepening.

"It's great isn't it?" smiled Cuthbert. "I remember when I arrived at the club there were a few of the Scottish boys in the dressing room who made me feel welcome. Lee Peacock is Scottish too. He doesn't have much of an accent but he still counts as a Scot! Simon Ferry came in the other week and he's a great character – on and off the pitch. His performances have been different class."

Town fans know all about the tenacity a Scottish player can bring to a side. Colin Calderwood, Scott Leitch and Duncan Shearer

all serve as recent examples of former Swindon players who were not afraid to put a shift in. Cuthbert, who made 29 appearances on loan at St. Mirren last term, will do his best to follow suit.

"All Scottish players work tremendously hard and a work ethic is engrained in us. If you watch the national team in action at Hampden Park they really get into the oppositions faces. Scottish footballers will always work hard and that's something that will never change."

The defender already has experience on the international stage and Captained the Scotland Under-20 side at the 2007 World Cup in Canada. After a move to Swindon in the summer, he still harbours ambition of progress at international level.

"I was lucky enough to play through the age-groups and Captain a lot of those sides. The next step from the 'B' side is to make it into the full national side. I have said before that I don't think I'm ready for the full side yet, but maybe in a few years.

"I'm only 22 but hopefully when the next 'B' squad is named I'll be there or thereabouts. If I can impress in those games then who knows? A lad I played with coming through the age-groups, Graham Dorrens, has just won a call-up so it can be done."

Cuthbert was part of the Town side which kept a fourth clean sheet of

the season with a 1-0 win at Yeovil Town last weekend. Last term The Robins were guilty of conceding a plethora of late goals, but there are significant signs of improvement this term.

"Lesser teams might have crumbled at the end," Cuthbert explained. "We took the lead quite early against Yeovil and managed to defend well right throughout the ninety minutes. Yeovil didn't really have any clear cut chances. We defended well from front to back and big Dave had a quiet afternoon in goal."

Town fans at the last home game with Southend United will have witnessed Cuthbert's first goal in Swindon colours. The defender is now eager to build on recent performances with another three points against The U's.

"I can't imagine that I'll be scoring again so soon, but haver say never! It was great to get a goal against Southend hexause I usually only get one a season so to score on my home league debut was fantastic.

"Colchester have just charged their manager and will be keen to impress him, but if we can get a result against them than we will be going in the right direction and that means the up six."

Should Town achieve a top six slot at the end of the campaign, then full international honours may not be too far behind for Swindon's number two. "All Scottish players work tremendously hard and a work ethic is engrained in us."



Edinburgh is a great city and the people are fantastic. I liked the area and had some really good friends up there. There were plenty of places to go on days off and always different things going on."


Before Hibs you were with Newcastle... how was that?



n my programme notes for last year's home game with Colchester, I was slightly (OK, very slightly) lamenting the passing of the U's crumbling old home, Layer Road, and looking forward to my first visit to The (deep breath) Weston Homes Community Stadium.

Having now been there, I'm not sure that I shouldn't have been looking at things the other way around.

It's not that the stadium is particularly bad; although bleak would be a fair enough description, at least on the rainy, windswept night we visited there at the back end of last season. Nondescript is probably the best word I could use, and that's a real shame. Four separate, rather grey looking stands (at least from the outside), right on the A12 but it still takes ages to find and surrounded by the most pot-holed car park this side of the non-league.

I'm not having a pop at Colchester or their fans, as games between the teams have been pretty enjoyable in recent years (although it'd be nice to see some defending this afternoon, after that game in Essex last season!). But with the future of Swindon's own ground redevelopment likely to rear its head again in the coming months, I hope it's something of a cautionary tale.

I've been banging on about a new ground for the Town for a long time now, but it's such a once in a generation opportunity to set Swindon up for the next few years

that I don't think I could bear to see it wasted. I'd love to see somewhere that actively attracts fans to want to come and watch, somewhere that makes a real statement. Swindon as a Town is so lacking in signature buildings that a stand which combines bottom line economics with a sense of style could be a real boost to both the club and the Town.

So whether you like the curves of the Galpharm, the multipurpose use of the Matchroom, the ambition of stadiumMK (but one that's actually finished, please) or the all-encompassing bowls favoured by so many clubs recently, I really don't mind. It just needs to be a bit, you know, special.













SYNDROME GROUP


Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parentled support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.

The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities – football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 – 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

COMPLIMENTARY STRENGTH/

POWER TRAINING TO DEVELOP SPEED

ighlighted in the last home game programme notes were simple procedures to follow when trying to develop speed and power development whilst on the training field.


Today, we are are going to take a quick look at complimentary exercises performed in the gym to develop these respective fitness aspects as research suggests that speed and agility training alone will result in a plateau or deterioration in performance.

To supplement these training methods to continuously improve performance, the power of the working muscles must be continuously increased. This can be achieved by stimulating the neuromuscular system with strength/power training to increase the recruitment of the fast twitch muscle fibres. The aim of strength and power training is to increase the performance of a muscle to a higher level that cannot be attained during specific football training.

Maximal strength can be defined as the result of force producing muscles performing maximally during a single voluntary effort. Maximal strength is normally expressed as one repetition maximum (1RM) during a single movement (in this case to develop speed, we are looking at the half squat exercise).

Neuromuscular adaptations through strength training, exercises should be performed using few repetitions (←6reps) executing 2 - 6 sets, with high loads [85-95% 1RM] performed slowly through the entire movement phase. Power is the ability to produce as much force as possible in the shortest possible time. Therefore, to improve power, the squat exercise should be performed slowly during the downward phase, incorporating high velocity movement during the upward phase, lifting approximately 75-80% 1RM, again using few reps (3-5) per set. Research has found improvements in 10, 20 and 30metre sprint times using these complimentary training techniques among professional football players over a 6-8 week period.

Though these training techniques sound easy to perform, due to the heavy loads that are been lifted and the correct squatting techniques required to see improvements, these exercises should be performed under the supervision of a trained instructor.






would like to start by thanking Club Doctor, John Elliman, who took on the role of Club Physiotherapist for the last home game with Southend United.



John is a very able Club Doctor who is particularly useful with more serious injuries on the pitch, so I had no problem in recommending him to fill the breach.

Alan O'Brien has a hamstring problem and has been doing some rehabilitation work this week. He has been jogging and rowing, to try and get some more work through his leg. Alan has a grade two hamstring injury which is a considerable problem, because he is such a quick player. Speed is a large part of his game so it will be three weeks, at least, before he makes a return and you can't beat twenty-one days for a grade two injury such as his.

Scott Cuthbert didn't train on Tuesday as a precaution. He made one or two tremendous blocks at Yeovil last weekend and one of those produced a little bleed on the inside of his knee. He then took a small knock on it again in training, so we thought it best for him not to train on Tuesday but he should be fine for today's game.

We regard every supporter as part as the Swindon Town family and there are many who deserve mention but today I am including the first part of a feature on Derek Elston as he moves towards a unique event of 1500 CONSECUTIVE matches watching the Town, a milestone to be reached at the next home game against Wycombe. Derek is a Supporters Club member and lives in Northampton - which makes the run even more remarkable with every home game almost like an away game for him! Here is a little more about Derek's time supporting the Town.

An interview with Derek Elston

What is the first Town game you recall?

It was an away fixture at Brisbane Road against Leyton Orient. The game was towards the end of the season and was a not very enthralling and ended in a 0-0 draw.

ow close have you come to missing a game?

I was due to go into hospital for a cartilage operation on December 15th 2007, Town were at home to Brighton. I rearranged the appointment and they sent me a new date for the procedure. The new date came through as Tuesday 4th December, the same day as Carlisle away! I decided to try for another cancellation but was informed that I would have to wait indefinitely. I was out of work at the time and needed to get the operation carried out so that I could get myself back to work. I was not happy! My wife then made the fatal

mistake of volunteering to drive me to Carlisle should I be discharged in time. We agreed a cut off time of 2.30pm and when I had not gone down to the theatre at 10.00am I was resigned to missing the match.

I went down to Theatre at 10.45am and came round on the ward at midday. My first question to the nurse, when can I go home? I was informed that I had to drink, eat something and keep it down, get up and walk and use the toilet before I would be considered for discharge. I secured my release at 1,45pm and rang home then collected and chauffeured to Carlisle and back by my super heroine, but I was also informed that this would be a one off never to be repeated gig! She had already dropped me at the hospital at 6.00am completed a days work and still had to start at 6.00am the next day!
