the gaffer

Good afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground for this League One fixture. Today I would like to welcome Peter Taylor, his staff, players and directors and supporters along for the game.

On the injury front we are hopeful that Gordon Greer will be able to return to the side for this afternoon's game. He trained with the rest of the squad on Thursday and he has contributed well this season. It was a bit of a blow to miss him last week but we will see how he gets on. The defensive record this season has been quite healthy but we do need to improve in the goalscoring stakes. After last season we knew the defensive side of our game needed attention and things have improved in that area. It's about belief, the players need to get into the mindset of winning games but we can't forget what we need to do going forward as well. We need to get that fine balance, but we are not being considered as a team that just grinds results out. We are creating the chances – we just need to put them away.

Billy Paynter took his tally to four for the season with a penalty at Walsall last weekend, but he could easily be sitting here with eight or nine. That might be more satisfying for him but the important thing is that we keep creating the chances for the strikers to work with. We can't afford any complacency and we want to keep driving the players on. To add more goals to the side we need to have a bit

more composure in front of goal and we have been working hard with the players on that.

Our fans can now come to games with an air of expectancy and in my opinion with the squad that we are now assembling; our supporters are entitled to do that. When teams come to The County Ground we expect to beat them and if we do everything that we are capable of then there is no reason why we shouldn't be putting a winning run together at home.

Wycombe are in Town today and knowing Peter Taylor as I do, they won't be coming here with ten men behind the ball. He is an ambitious Manager and they will want to play the game in the right way – but their current position in the league may make things a bit more difficult. He may change one or two things around but we will see what happens this afternoon. Wycombe have done very well over the past few years and will be looking for a performance this afternoon.

Once again thank you for your excellent backing at Walsall last weekend. It is much appreciated and let's hope for a home victory this afternoon to repay that support.

Wiltshire Soldiers Meet Hollywood Hardman In Helmand →

Wiltshire soldiers serving in Afghanistan who are also ardent Swindon Town Football Club fans had an unexpected moral boost when a Hollywood star paid them a visit.

The four from 600 Signal Troop, 10 Signal Regiment, Corsham, who are deployed on a communications project across Helmand met actor Ray Winstone while having their breakfast.

"The meeting was by chance and Ray was incredibly friendly and supportive of those of us deployed out here," said WO2 Paul Hughes. "He was happy to be pictured with the Swindon Town flag as he remembers their victory over Arsenal in the 1969 Cup Final, who are London rivals of his favourite team West Ham United. He particularly remembered Town legend Don Rogers."

Known for his tough screen roles Ray Winstone was so moved by the sacrifices made by British Armed

Forces this summer that he flew to Camp Bastion in the aftermath of one of the toughest summers British troops have ever experienced in Helmand province.

"I just want to come here, as a representative of the UK public, to thank the boys and girls," he said. "Everything here is done to support those on the front line. It's like you would imagine Colchester was like in Roman times; one team running a small city in the desert, young British boys and girls, alongside the Yanks, building a future for the Afghans.

"I'm always impressed by how all the units work together, everyone from the chefs and the posties to the infantry lads out at the FOBs [Forward Operating Bases]."

Paul and his three colleagues hope to be back to Wiltshire in December when they can once again take to the stands of The County Ground to cheer on Swindon Town.

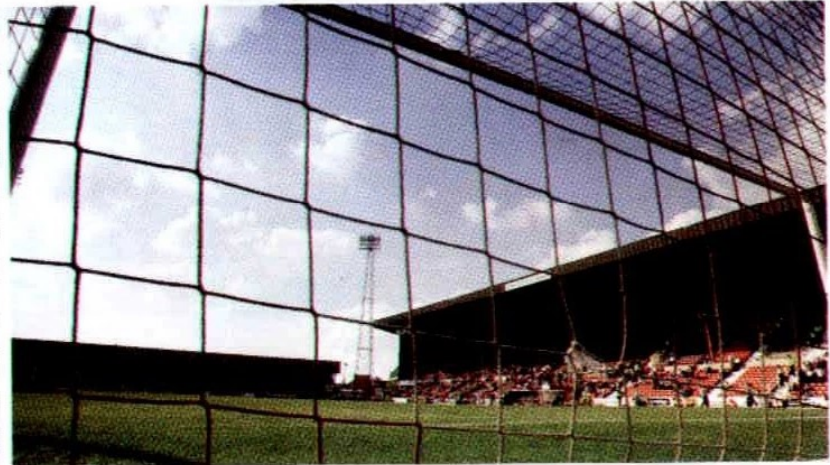
From the Boardroom

some valuable game time under their belts. Training has been good, so we are looking forward to the game this afternoon.

When I was at Blackburn I spent a month on loan at Stockport County in April 2003 and made my debut for them against Wycombe. I came off the bench and scored in a 4-1 win at Adams Park and played a few more games for Stockport before returning to Blackburn – and joined Kilmarnock that summer. Hopefully that

could serve as an omen – it would be nice to open my account for the season today.

Being back at home is important and hopefully we can put on a better performance and register all three points. Our home form has been quite solid so far this season but after consecutive draws we need to get back onto the winning trail with three points to try and get us back amongst the play-off places.

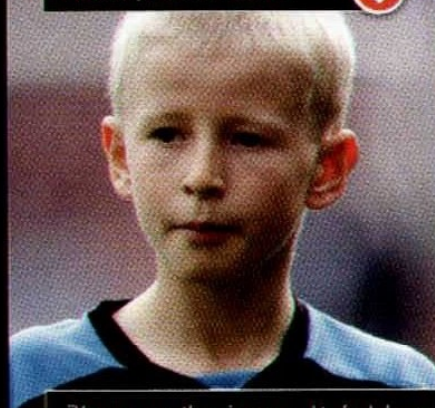
"Our fans were tremendous and I'd like to thank them for their support again. They are like the extra man sometimes and it was great to hear them in full voice up at Walsall."

TALK OF THE TOWN:

THE BIG DEBATE

Over the last few weeks The Big Debate has seen various sets of supporters offer their views on all things STFC. Now members of the club's **Chairman's Suite** have their say... →

Q How long have you been a fan, and why Swindon?

MATTHEW: My first game was in 1984, against Colchester, so I've been watching them for 25 years so far! Supporting a local side was important to me and I live half way between Oxford and Swindon. It was not a hard decision!

DAVE: I have been a Swindon supporter for over 12 years. Having been a lifelong Port Vale fan, I was only able to watch them now and again, so I've enjoyed having the opportunity to watch Swindon and see football regularly again. Now I am a very fervent STFC fan.

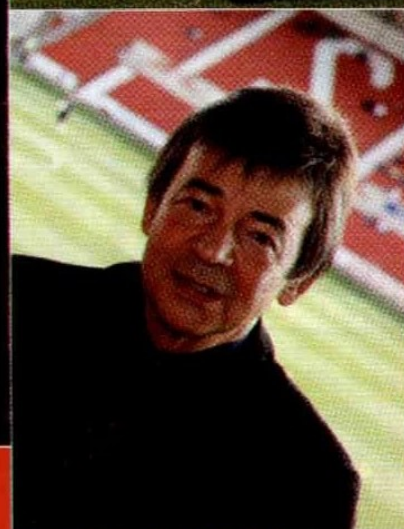
JOHN: I became a committed supporter in 1986 when as MD of

PHH (now Arval) we sponsored the team's small fleet of cars. I had to keep an eye on the condition of the cars and football came as a bonus.

Q We're seventh in the table and on the fringe of the play-off spots. What are your thoughts on the season so far?

MATTHEW: I feel it is absolutely

paramount that Billy [Paynter] has some permanent support up front, while Danny has worked very hard in the midfield. I think we are a much stronger, organised outfit than last season.

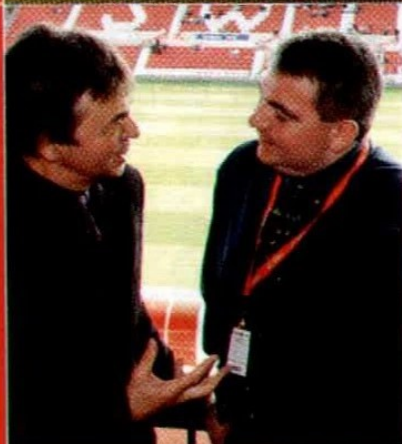
DAVE: The 5-0 drubbing in the first game of the season seemed to act as a wake-up call and we have made good progress since – not losing at home is a great boost. The Southampton game was a real confidence builder.

JOHN: After the opening match shocker, it's been encouraging if not yet inspiring to see the team

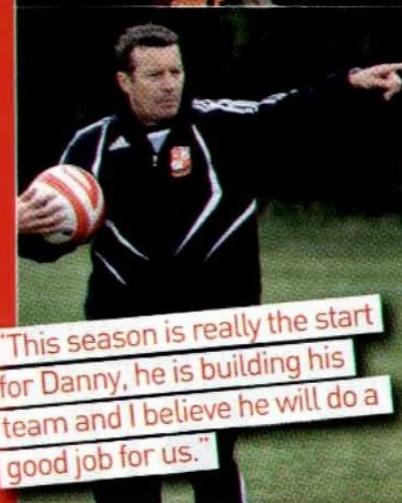
grinding out results from a more disciplined defence than we've seen in previous seasons. Not yet convincing, but promising.

Q Are you happy with the way the team is playing and the players Danny has brought in?

MATTHEW: With regards to the new lads Danny has brought in, it is obvious that he is building from the back and I feel he has done his homework on why and who he has got to fill the roles that perhaps we were weak in last season.

DAVE: Overall team performances have been sound and we have seen some great football in patches. The team needs a little longer to gel now, especially with so many new players in the squad. David Lucas and Jonathan Douglas seem excellent prospects. Loan signings are much more difficult to assess.

JOHN: Sitting in the top 10 it's hard not to be happy at this stage. We still lack consistency in our width of play and albeit much improved passing game, but the potential for steady improvement from a settled and balanced side is evident. Ferry, Revell and Cuthbert are the new rising stars, for me.

Q What are your expectations for the rest of the season?

MATTHEW: Consistency, reliability and not leaking goals after 80 minutes, so concentration and fitness are in there as well.

DAVE: I don't think we should get too carried away this early with a new squad - but the feeling at the club is much more positive and confident, if that continues I think we have a strong enough squad now to hold our own even against the stronger opposition.

JOHN: Consolidate defensive strength and reliability at the back, develop midfield playmakers, and build a striking partnership with in-depth support to win more games with better goal margins.

Q Wycombe today, we've had some great games with them down the years - any that spring to mind?

MATTHEW: Tommy Mooney! That's all I have to say about that!

DAVE: There have been some tight well-contested battles with Wycombe...

JOHN: I can't remember any, but that's probably a function of age rather than match quality!

Q How would you assess Danny Wilson's tenure so far?

MATTHEW: Methodical. Danny is someone who demands respect from his players, he is very tactically minded and someone who does his homework not only on our players, but also the opposition.

DAVE: He had a difficult start to his Swindon management career, but he did his job, in spite of some nervous times and kept us up. This season is really the start for Danny, he is building his team and I believe he will do a good job for us, he inspires the players and the fans, some recent incumbents of this post have done neither.

JOHN: Clearly a 'cerebral' manager who looks to be building strength in depth. He seems to have the ability to switch a game strategy to counter different opposition tactics. Also a nice guy who likes Jamie's [Jamie Cullum, John's son] music, so gets my vote!

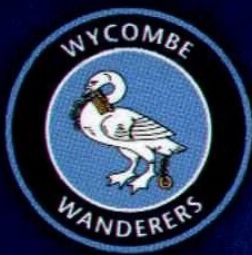

SHEARER

The Glasgow-born goalkeeper began his career north of the border and even scored a last-minute equaliser for Albion Rovers whilst playing at Hampden Park in 2003. After spending time on trial at Glasgow Celtic, 'Shears' moved to Coventry for a nominal fee before signing for Bristol Rovers.

He was a virtual ever-present for the Pirates before the arrival of new keeper Steve Phillips saw Shearer moved on loan to Shrewsbury, where he starred in their charge to the play-offs, and his excellent form earned him a move to Adams Park in 2007.

The Glaswegian started the 2007/08 season as the first-choice keeper, but broke his ankle in training in September and was ruled out for the rest of the campaign.

The experienced glovesman returned to take the 'number one' spot for the start of the 2008/09 season, keeping an impressive 13 clean sheets before injury struck.

MONCUR

Moncur became Peter Taylor's first signing of the 2009 January transfer window and has been contracted with the club until June 2010, following his free transfer from top flight Fulham.

The 21-year-old right-back, who can also play centre-half, played for Arsenal as a youngster, before joining the academy at Craven Cottage at the age of 16.

TJ never made a senior appearance for the West London club, but has spent seven of the last 12 months on-loan at Wycombe's League Two rivals Bradford City over two spells, making 25 appearances for the Bantams in all competitions.

Taylor admitted that he had been



tracking the promising defender for some time, and the Blues boss will be hoping that Moncur can provide the side with more defensive depth, and he has made four starts this term.

ZEBROSKI

Zebroski began his Football League career with Plymouth Argyle before moving to Millwall in 2006, but found his best form in the Blue Square Premier whilst on loan with Oxford and Torquay.

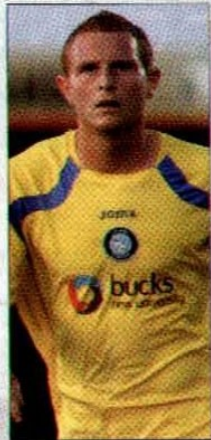
It was with the Gulls that the pacy forward scored 19 times in one season, and this attracted the attention of Peter Taylor who brought him to Adams Park for £20,000.

The Swindon-born front man immediately established himself in the first-team, and soon became one of the side's top scorers, before picking up an injury in the FA Cup at Eastwood Town.

The young forward had to shake off a hamstring problem upon his return but was able to take part in the final two games of the season, ending the season with seven goals to his name.

He joined the Blues on loan with a view to a permanent deal in February 2009, after becoming some-what of a cult hero at non-league Weymouth where he scored 24 goals in 86 games.

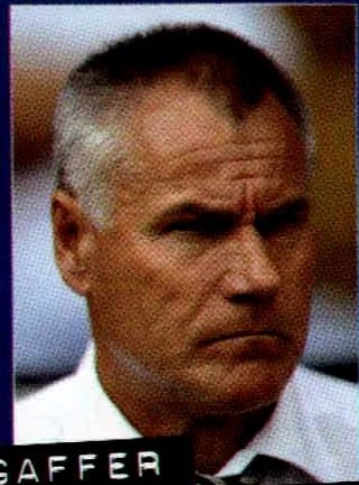
Stuart made his Wanderers debut live on Sky Sports in the goalless draw with Rotherham United, though injury restricted the Reading born forward to just eight appearances towards the end of the 2008/09 campaign.

GAFFER PETER TAYLOR

Peter Taylor was appointed manager of Wycombe Wanderers on 29th May 2008 after a career in football spanning almost forty years, in which time he has won four promotions as a manager and been involved with the international set-up in both playing and coaching capacities.

He gained promotion in his first season with the Chairboys, leading them to the third tier of English football despite a dramatic last day defeat to Notts County at Adams Park.

Taylor began his managerial career with Southend United in 1993 before spells with Gillingham, Leicester City, Brighton & Hove Albion and Hull City - where he managed a certain striker by the name of Billy Paynter. He then had a sixty-game spell with Crystal Palace before departing in October 2007.

He has also had two spells in charge of the England Under-21 side and also had one game in charge of England as caretaker boss - a 1-0 defeat against Italy in November 2000.

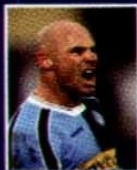
After joining the Wanderers Taylor was an instant hit, guiding the Blues to a third place finish in League Two and firing the club to their first ever automatic promotion.

Swindon Town take on Wycombe Wanderers at The County Ground this afternoon and with plenty of connections between the two clubs, we take a closer look at a selection of players who have represented The Robins and The Chairboys.

An inspired signing by former Town boss Andy King, Tommy Mooney helped fire The Robins to the 2003/04 Play-Offs with a 20-goal haul during the campaign. He enjoyed a fruitful two-year spell at Wycombe, which included a run to the semi-finals of the League Cup. He joined UD Marbella in the summer of 2008, but has since retired. Sam Parkin was given a rousing reception by those Swindon fans at Walsall last weekend with the front man coming off the bench to play half an hour against The Robins.

Fola Onibuje joined Swindon during Dennis Wise's tenure as boss but scored two goals during the first part of the 2006/07 season before

stints with Brentford and Wycombe that same season. He is now with Woking, playing alongside former Town midfielder Nicky Nicolau. Striker John Sutton is now plying his trade in Scotland at Motherwell, where Lucas Jutkiewicz is on loan from Everton. Sutton made just one appearance for Swindon – replacing Eric Sabin for the final twenty-five minutes of a League One clash against Crewe Alexandra in December 2002.

How and when did you join Swindon Town?

I was looking for something extra to do and after seeing an advertisement. I began working here as a matchday steward. After a few weeks of doing that I ended up working matchdays in the car park before the former Stadium Manager here, Ron Topp, asked for assistance with some building work here at the club. He had some part-time work so I joined the maintenance team. Before Swindon I spent 27 years with Cloverleaf as shift manager for various departments.

You must have seen a few changes here, what's been the most challenging?

Every job is a challenge. The rearrangement of the seats in the Don Rogers Stand was a lot of work last summer and pleasing to get done. In the summer the away end seats in The Arkell's Stand were all removed, broken down, painted and then replaced which was another hefty task.

What does your role at Swindon Town involve?

There is always something to do whether it's picking up litter, fixing a seat or mending a bit of plumbing. There is variety in the role that's for sure. Our aim is to come in each day and have the stadium closer to being ready for matchday. We all know our different jobs and it works well.

Tell us about your average matchday? What matchday incidents have the more bizarre incidents been over the years?

One of the most bizarre ones was when a disabled chap had a flat battery on his mobile buggy. We managed to get him to his seat to watch the game, but pushing a chair without the wheels turning wasn't easy. After the match we had to do the whole thing in reverse - which is one of the strangest things I've ever had to do. Different things crop up during the season, whether it's a gate that's jammed, a bulb blowing or a switch that won't work. There are rigorous pre-match checks in place but these things have a habit of happening once the gates are open on a matchday!



What has been your most pleasing achievement and your most memorable moment at Swindon?

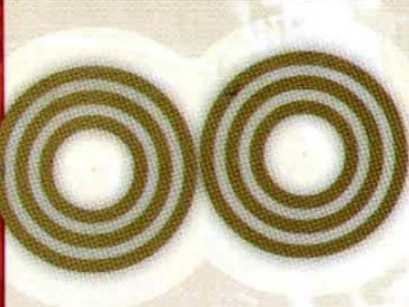
Joining the club on a full-time basis - I'm not getting any younger and to be offered the chance to join Swindon Town FC on a full-time basis was pleasing. To be doing something day to day that I really enjoy is satisfaction alone.

Match Background

The two teams had only met three times before, but it looked as though we were trying to make up for lost time in 2000/01. Promoted to the League in 1993, Wycombe Wanderers visited Swindon for a Division Two fixture in November, when a last gasp **Alan Reeves** goal secured Town a draw, overturning **Andy Rammell's** ninth minute opener. That left Town 22nd in the table and the Chairboys eighth.

Come January and Town had enjoyed a little respite from what was becoming a difficult season by charging to the southern area quarter-finals of the LDV Vans Trophy. Wycombe were the visitors, when two goals inside the first quarter of an hour gave Town the lead. **Steve Brown** pulled one back for

the visitors but it was Swindon who progressed to the semi-final where they were eliminated by Southend.

But three matches from the end of the season, our trip to Wycombe ended in a goalless draw, leaving Town in 19th place and deep in relegation trouble.

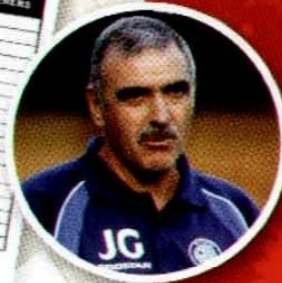

Season Outcome For Both Clubs

For Town, the campaign had started with Colin Todd in charge, but concluded with Andy King at the helm, and the season came to a breathless close. Danny Invincible gave us a priceless win over Peterborough in the 90th minute of the last home match of the season, and despite losing at Stoke the following week, Bristol Rovers' inability to take advantage of games in hand saw

Town survive at Rovers' expense.

Lawrie Sanchez, manager of Wycombe, led his side to 13th in the table, but the football world was captivated by his side's performance in the FA Cup. Accounting for Harrow Borough, Millwall and Grimsby, a 2-1 home win over Wolves was followed by victory over fellow First Division Wimbledon on penalties.

An astonishing 2-1 away win at Premiership Leicester, secured by unlikely goal-scoring hero Roy Essandoh gave the Chairboys a semi final against Liverpool at Villa Park. Sadly, an 88th minute goal from Keith Ryan was not enough to over take goals from Emile Heskey and Robbie Fowler as Sanchez's side failed to complete what would have been a fairy tale.

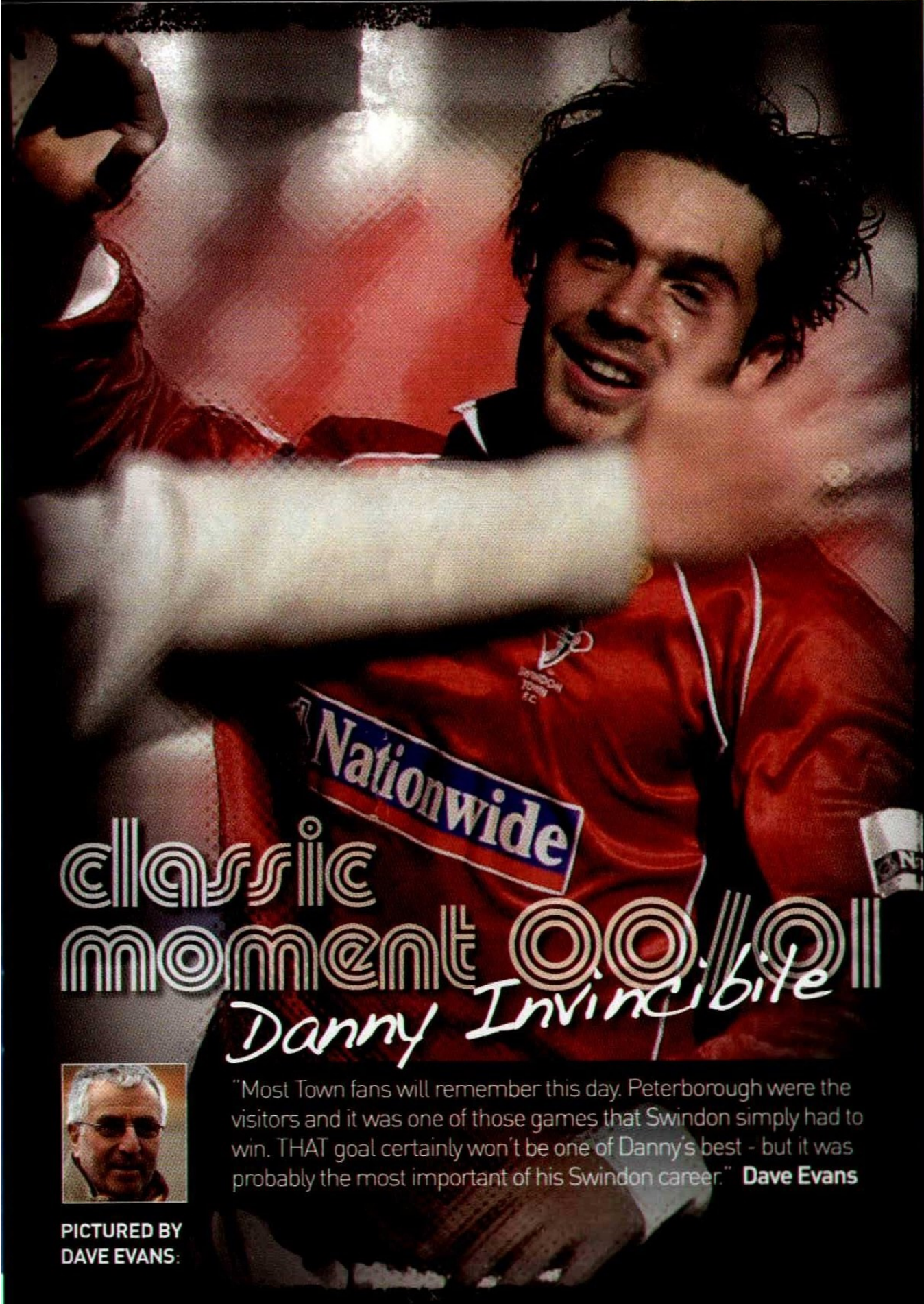

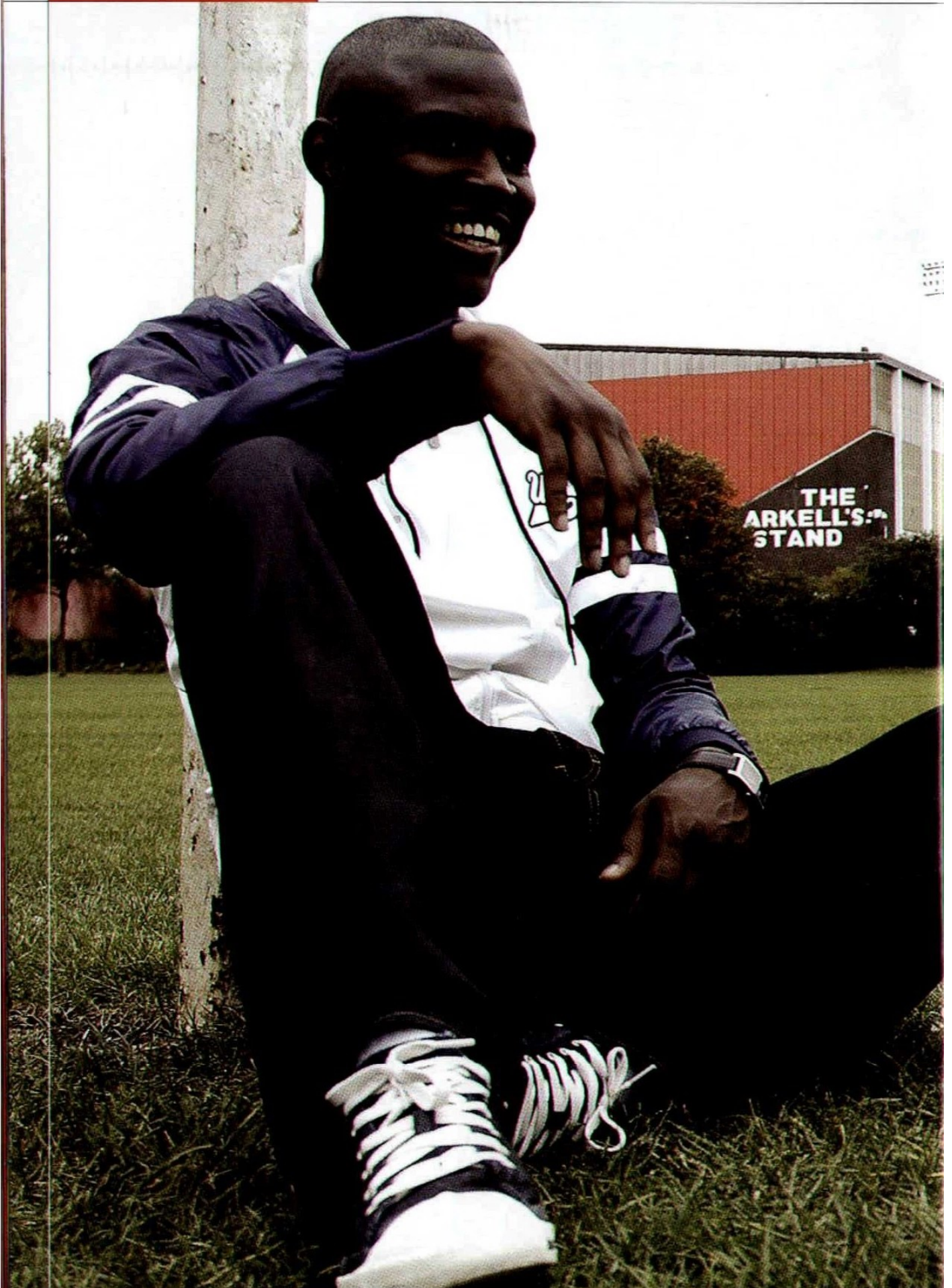

DREAM CATCHER

LECSINEL-JEAN FRANCOIS IS RELISHING THE CHALLENGE OF PLAYING IN LEAGUE ONE AS HE CONTINUES TO PURSUE HIS DREAM OF CARVING OUT A SUCCESSFUL CAREER AS A PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALLER.

The 22-year old left-back has come a long way since taking part in a reserve game back in January on a trial basis.

The defender was joined in the line-up on the night by Hamdi Razak, with both players both practically unheard of in English football. Razak went onto fire in a hat-trick whilst Jean-Francois had to contend with Guillem Bauzá in the Swansea frontline.

Both Town trialists were handed short-term deals until the end of the season although Razak was released at the end of the campaign. After impressing towards the end of the season with impressive displays off the bench and a solid afternoon's work on the final day at Peterborough - Danny Wilson had seen enough to offer the left-sider an extended stay in Wiltshire.

Despite being only 22, Jean-Francois had tried his luck with

four clubs - in addition to a trial with Aberdeen last summer - before joining the ranks at The County Ground. Persistence, it seems, pays off.

"I changed teams quite a lot and only stayed with each side for one or two years. It was a good experience for me and I enjoyed everywhere I played," said Town's number nineteen, speaking from the home dugout after training on Tuesday afternoon.

"My first professional contract came at Falkirk and I went over there from France. I had been training regularly with my club in France at the time but wasn't getting the opportunity of playing games. That's when I decided to look for a move and so I joined Falkirk.

"The SPL was a good experience but because I was so young - only eighteen; I didn't really settle. I missed my family and my country after six months so moved back to France. That's

an experience which really helped me, because here at Swindon I am really settled now. I am twenty-two years old and can support myself."

Jean-Francois will celebrate his 23rd birthday next Friday - twenty four hours before The Robins travel to Brentford in League One. Whilst many young footballers these days may dream of joining the likes of Chelsea and Tottenham Hotspur a little further along the M4, the Town left-back is wholeheartedly committed to making the most of his own shot at football stardom.

"I used to dream of being a professional footballer and now I have my big chance. I want to make the most of what I have here and try to progress, maybe from League One to the Coca-Cola Championship.

"I will do my best every day to keep my place and show the Gaffer that he has a good reason to play me."

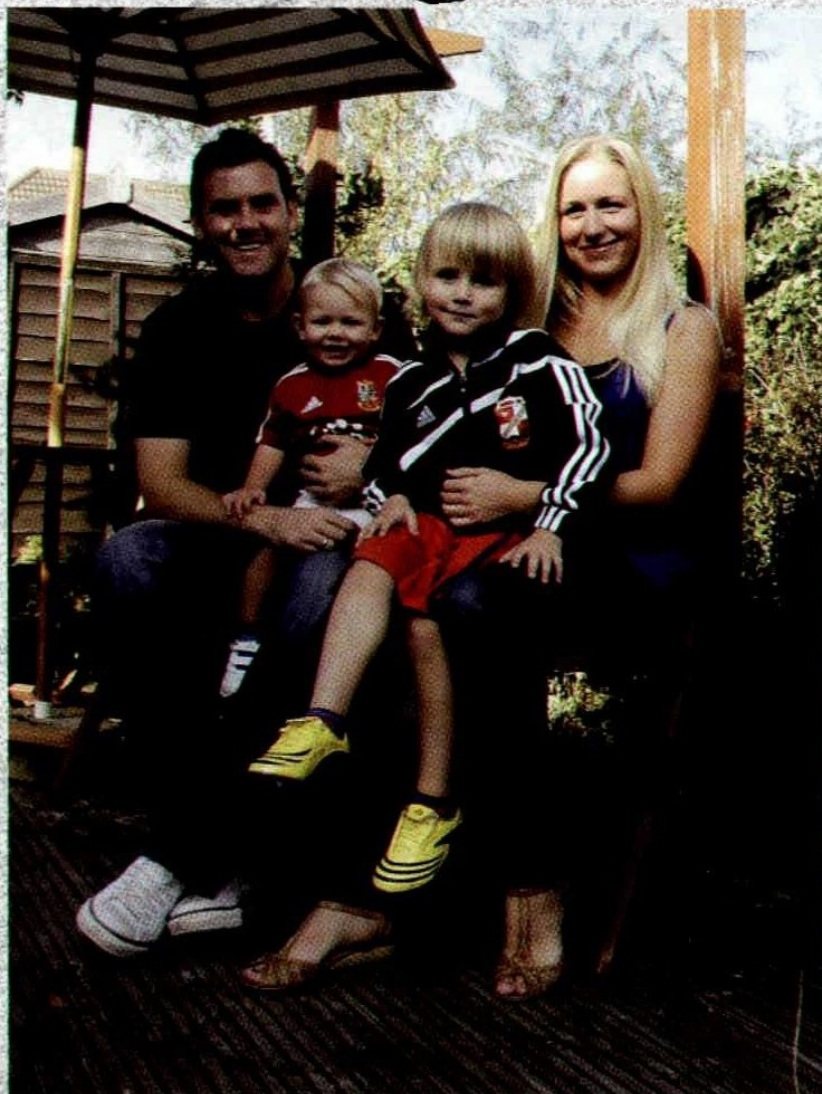


On Wednesday I went down to Somerset with my family and we had a good look around a few of the

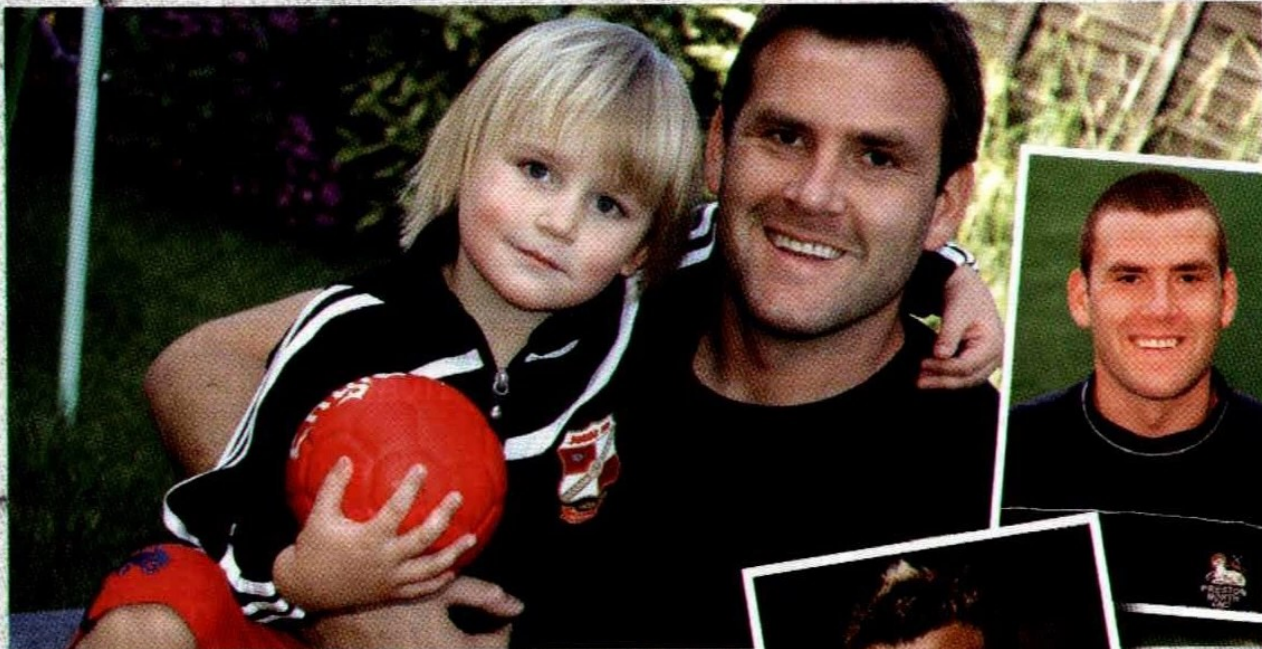
You spent a large part of your career with Preston North End, quite a nice place to live!

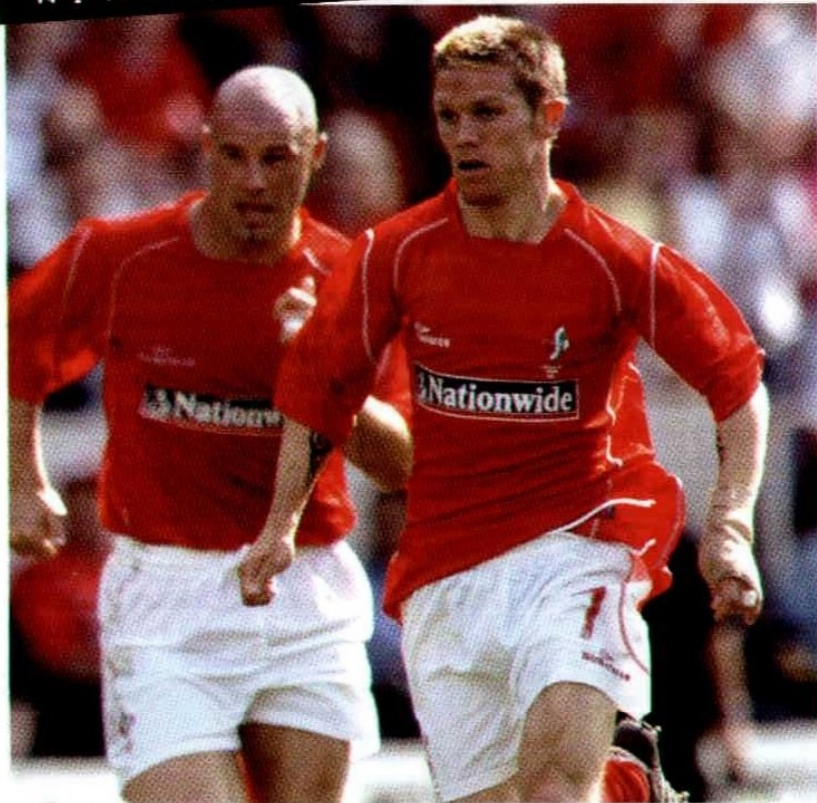
Whether its Eduardo's "dive" which wasn't, or Adebayor's antics against his former Arsenal teammates, footballers behaviour on the pitch has been under the microscope in recent weeks.

Like it or not, they all get well paid and part of the responsibility that comes with that is to act as some kind of role model.

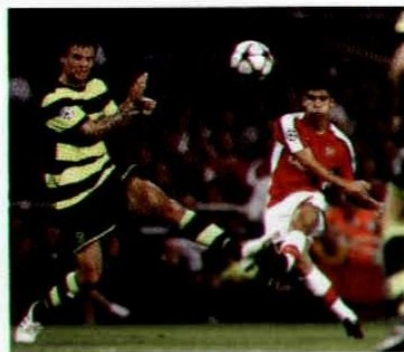
I don't expect (or want) them to live completely perfect, blameless lives. In fact some of the over-reaction in the national press has been sanctimonious, at best, as many of those writers will no doubt have celebrated dodgy decisions in favour of their teams. But surely asking footballers to put a bit of thought into their actions isn't asking too much, is it?

Swindon's players aren't subject to the same level of scrutiny as their Premier League counterparts, and maybe I'm just being rose tinted about this, but I can't think of a Town player who's been involved in anything quite as bad in recent times. Simon Cox putting his finger over his mouth in front of the Bristol Rovers fans having scored the winner at the Memorial Stadium in 2008 probably wasn't ideal, but he certainly didn't run the length of the pitch to goad them.

The worst example I can think of during my time in Wiltshire came at Blackpool in January 2004, when Sammy Igoe admitted to me in a post-match interview that he feigned injury after being tackled by Ritchie Wellens, in order to get him

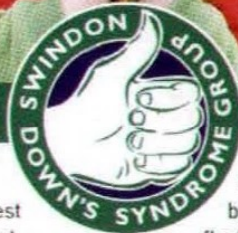


sent off. He shouldn't have done it, especially as the challenge by Wellens was bad enough for a second yellow anyway, but Igoe was just trying to make sure Swindon got the decision.

Part of me admired him for actually being honest enough to say what most people in the ground thought. Most of me though wondered whether he was trying to get banned! In the end he received an £800 pound fine from the FA. If this had happened in the Premier League, I wonder if the punishment would have been the same?

Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parent-led support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities - football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 - 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

COMPLEX TRAINING FOR SPEED DEVELOPMENT

In the previous home game programme, we spoke briefly about developing speed/power using the half squat exercise lifting approximately 75% of one's 1 repetition maximum.

Today I'm going to elucidate another exercise performed in the gymnasium, which is currently being performed by some of our players at the moment, which is known as Complex training. Complex training is a workout comprising of a resistance exercise followed by a matched plyometric exercise e.g. squats followed by squat jumps. Trying to keep the plyometric exercise specific to the game, goal keepers perform more exercises comprising of vertical movements and jumps, where as outfield players perform jump lunges and diagonal lunges through horizontal patterns.

Scientifically, Complex Training

involves the phenomenon of postactivation potentiation, the idea that the first exercise (heavy weights) boosts the number of muscle fibers used in the second exercise (explosive plyometric), thereby enhancing strength and power. The precise mechanism at work isn't entirely known, but a few theories exist. One based on the nervous system maintains that the first exercise ramps up the nerves that stimulate the muscle fibers to contract, causing faster and more synchronous nerve firing, which results in greater power and strength in those fibers. Simply put, the resistance work gets the nervous system in to full action so that more Type IIb fast twitch muscle fibres fire. Fast-twitch muscle fibre holds the key to increased dynamic sports performance, since these fibres can contract 2-3 times faster than their slow twitch counterparts are.

It's been a positive week for the walking wounded with progress made on a number of fronts.

Alan O'Brien has completed a week of intensive rehabilitation at Lilleshall where he has made considerable progress in his efforts to shake off a nasty hamstring strain. **Gordon Greer** trained on Thursday and is hopeful of a return to action this afternoon.



Hasney Aljofree is now concentrating on the final part of his comeback after knee surgery with lots of functional football-related work. Training took place at The County Ground one day last week and we took the opportunity to do some pro-perception work, which involved passing drills and quick-feet. If he continues in the positive vein we enjoy at the moment, then it could be days rather than weeks before his return to training.
