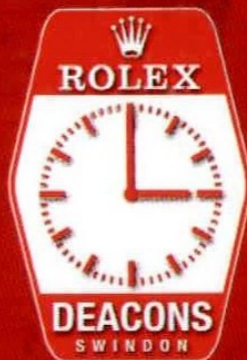

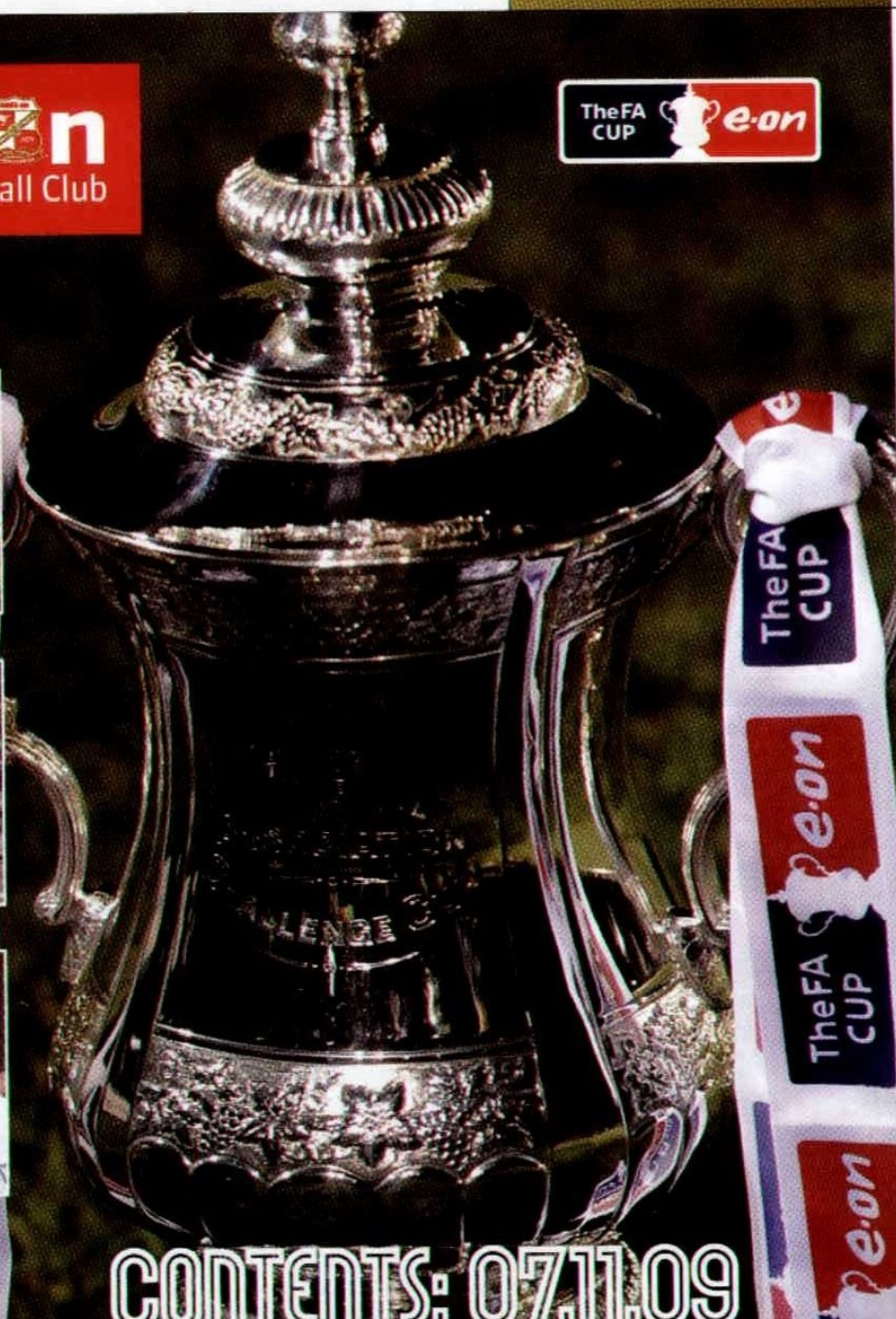

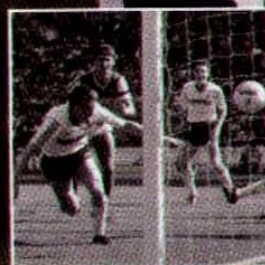

the gaffer

Good afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground for this FA Cup first round tie against Woking. Today I would like to welcome Graham Baker, his staff, players and directors and supporters along for the game.

The FA Cup is always an exciting competition and the first round draw has paired us with a side located not too far away from us in Wiltshire, Woking FC. We have had a few reports on them since the draw was made and we do have an understanding of how we think they will want to play. They are doing well in the league and are sitting in a nice position in the table. Their confidence should be quite high and it is a big game for them and I'm sure they will rise to the occasion. They will want to come and enjoy the game and have nothing to lose, that's for sure. We understand what we need to do to win the game and we will have to be at our best like we were against Tranmere. We will respect them but getting through is the priority.

In terms of selection we will be without Charlie Austin and Alex Revell. Charlie played for Poole in the qualifying rounds whilst we do not have permission for Alex to play as he is currently on loan with us from Southend United. Lee Peacock has come off the bench in the last few games and is getting more game time under his belt.

We have been really pleased with Billy Paynter's return to form in the

past few weeks both in the reserves and in the first team. He did well up at Tranmere last weekend and took both of his goals very well and was unlucky not to have come away from Prenton Park with a hat-trick. He was fantastic last weekend and took on board all of the things that we asked him to do. He has shown a tremendous attitude right the way through, even when he was out of the side. Hopefully he can continue that good form this afternoon.

The Tranmere game last weekend was a testing one, especially in the opening stages when we didn't really deal with the balls into our box. However we came through that period and got the first goal - which was critically important. We could have had five or six as the game went on and if there was any criticism of the team on the day it's that we weren't clinical enough in our finishing.

The bottom line today is that we want to get through the tie and that's the most important thing in cup football. We are not even thinking about a replay because we want to get through at home, but we are planning are getting through at the first attempt - but we know it won't be easy.

Enjoy the game.

Tom Berry, Loughborough, asked:

We've been drawn at home to a non league team, how difficult is it to face non league opposition in the FA Cup?

DW: What you do get from non-league sides is bundles and bundles of enthusiasm, and that can unsettle the opposition. If we can play anything like we're capable of, I'd like to think we can get through the tie.

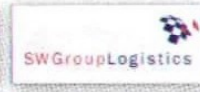

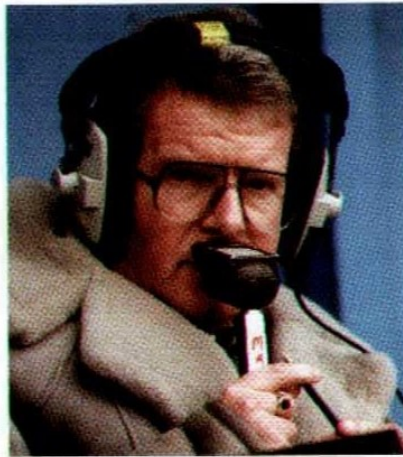

I hope that you are sitting comfortably for this double feast of cup-tie football, all in the space of four days.

It is my very great pleasure to welcome our guests from both Woking FC and Norwich City for these two-cup tie fixtures, the FA Cup and the Johnstones Paint Trophy respectively. Given the very short interval between the two fixtures, we have decided in the name of expediency, economy and the environment, to produce one programme to cover both games. Novel some may say but we do attempt to be creative at Swindon Town FC.

Three weeks have passed since we entertained Hartlepool United here, that was not a good day at the office and then we went on the road to Norwich City and then to Tranmere Rovers last Saturday. The 1 - 0 loss at Norwich was disappointing, but the performance much improved and the 4 - 1 win at Tranmere helped restore normal service and long may this continue. Unfortunately, due to international call ups, Leeds United have successfully applied to the Football League and had the 14th November fixture postponed. This is bitterly disappointing but we have no recourse to appeal and have to accept the decision. At the time of writing there is no new date for the fixture but keep a weather eye on the STFC website.

Since the last time that we were all together at the County Ground, the AGM has taken place with about 50 shareholders in attendance. AGM's are always useful events for shareholders to ask questions, raise concerns or request more detail. At this year's AGM a number



of shareholders expressed interest in reading the biographies of those consortium members, whom they have had little opportunity to meet. Consequently, I am taking this opportunity to meet that request.

SIR MARTYN ARBIB

Sir Martyn Arbib DL founded investment management business, Perpetual plc, in 1973 and remained Chairman until the company was sold to AMVESCAP (now Invesco) in December 2000. Sir Martyn is Chairman of the River & Rowing Museum in Henley on Thames, of which he is the main benefactor, and was Co-Chairman of the Henley Festival for Music and the Arts 1994-2003. He is trustee of the Arbib Foundation, a registered charity, which has recently sponsored the creation of the Langley Academy, a secondary school in Slough, Berkshire.

JEREMY WRAY

Jeremy is currently Chief Investment Officer of hedge fund Management Company Gracchi Capital Management LLP. Prior to that he spent the last nine years

as Chief Investment Officer of two privately owned investment companies specialising in traded option strategies and financial futures trading, having previously spent several years trading on his own account. Prior to that he worked as an equity analyst and then in equity sales at ANZ Bank. Before entering the city, he read law at Pembroke College, Oxford.

ANDREW BLACK

Andrew is one of the co-founders of Betfair, the highly successful internet betting exchange.

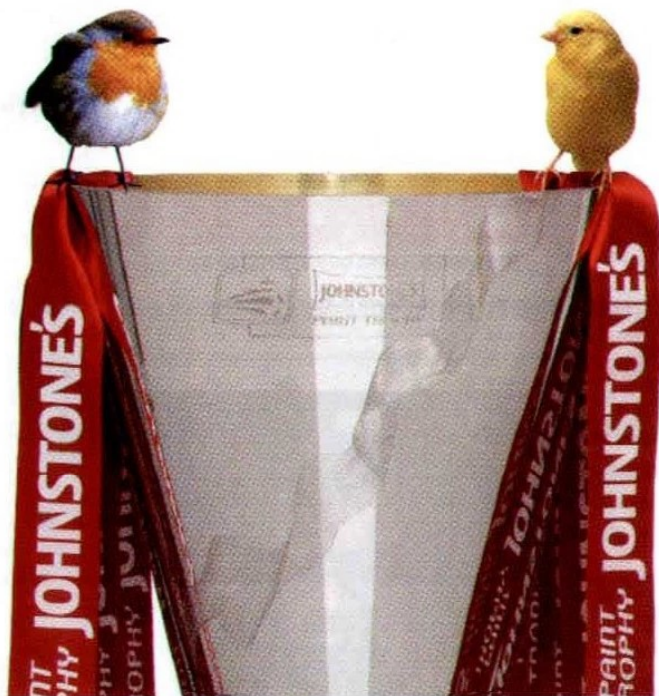

We take a break from League One action for the visit of Woking in the FA Cup First Round. Woking will come here with nothing to lose and we will have to be on our mettle to make sure we put in a professional performance.

Last weekend we travelled up to Tranmere Rovers and secured three points with a great performance from the boys. I thought we thoroughly deserved the win and the game was played at a terrific tempo. Defensively we were tested inside the first twenty minutes but coped well with the pressure we were put under by a determined Tranmere side. David Lucas had a few saves to make and Tranmere really came at us during the opening stages. Thankfully we controlled the game from then on and looked a handful every time we went forward, and it was great to see Billy get a couple on his return to the side. It was also a nice change for Simon Ferry and 'Macca'

to get on the score sheet, especially as they both scored with their weaker foot, which is not something we often see.

Going forward there was a lot more of a spark than there has been in recent games. The link between the front men and the midfield lads should serve as testament to that. It is something that we have been working hard on in training and it was great to see it pay off with four goals. In truth it could have been a lot more.

Tranmere started with Michael Ricketts up front and he was a bit of a handful. The manager had touched on the fact that he's played for England before the game, and international call-ups never happen by fluke, so we knew we had a big threat to deal with. He is a good size and caused us a few problems early on, but I think once we started to settle into the game after that first 20 minute spell we dealt with him pretty well. However, from a defensive point

of view it was disappointing to concede the goal in the way that we did, as they won the header from the throw-in and we missed the second ball in the box, which allowed their player to nip in and score which was a shame.

Today we face Woking in the FA Cup first round and we will go into the game as favourites, but it's important that we don't take anything for granted. There are no easy games and we certainly not underestimate Woking because they will be raring to go.

An FA Cup run would be fantastic for the club and hopefully a win today can set us off on the way. During my time with Kilmarnock I was fortunate enough to reach the final of the CIS Insurance Cup and that was a great experience. I hope that this FA Cup campaign can be a special one for all involved at The County Ground.

FA Cup Flashback

Swindon Town had already disposed of Cambridge United and Cardiff City when The Robins faced Woking on Saturday 6th January 1996. Woking had beaten Barnet at home 2-1 after drawing 2-2, then repeated the feat against Enfield to set up a County Ground visit.

The match saw Town run out winners by two goals to nil. A 17th minute opener from Wayne Allison steadied the nerves against the Vauxhall Conference side and Paul Bodin netted the second nine minutes from time with a deceptive long-range effort which floated into the net from the left. A crowd of 10,322 watched the event.

Town went on to account for Oldham before a 1-1 draw with Southampton in the fifth round took the tie back to the Dell where the home side claimed a 2-0 win. Town had come out of the hat first in all five rounds.

Swindon finished the 1995/96 season as Champions of Division Two, Woking finished second in the Conference behind Stevenage Borough.

Fraser **DIGBY** →

Popular goalkeeper who joined Town initially on loan from Manchester United in 1986. Played over 500 games before departing for Crystal Palace in 1998. Now retired from the professional game, Fraser works for Sports Solutions GB as Business Development Manager.

Mark **SEAGRAVES** →

A Steve McMahon signing, centre back Mark joined from Bolton Wanderers in 1995 in return for £100,000, departing for Barrow in 1998. After retiring from playing he held coaching roles at Wigan Athletic and Derby County, both working under Paul Jewell.

Paul **BODIN** →

Signed from Newport County in March 1988, left-back Paul played

Mark ROBINSON →

At £600,000, Mark was Town's record signing when he arrived from Newcastle in 1995. Spent seven seasons, predominantly at right-back before taking the short trip to Chippenham Town in 2002. Now works in the property trade.

Kevin HORLOCK →

The midfielder came in from West Ham United on a free transfer in 1992 and impressed with his strong running and touch. £1.5m took him to Manchester City in January 1997. Still our record fee for a departing player, he subsequently returned to West Ham and moved again to Ipswich in 2004. Made 32 appearances for Northern Ireland and the 36-year old still plays football - for Needham Market FC for whom he has made 19 appearances for this term.

Wayne O'SULLIVAN →

Coming through the trainee ranks, Cypriot-born Wayne was a useful utility midfielder who played over 100 games for Town before moving on to Cardiff City in 1997. In the summer of 2000 he moved to Australia,



Paul ALLEN →

Competitive midfielder with three England Under-21 caps, Paul signed from Southampton on a free in 1995 and departed for Bristol City in January 1997. After retiring from football he went onto work for the PFA.



of 2000 he moved to Australia, continuing his playing career with spells at Parramatta Power, Northern Spirit, Geylang United and more recently Central Coast Mariners. He recently graduated from Sydney University with a masters degree in education, specialising in coaching.

SUBSTITUTES

Peter THORNE →

The frontman caught the eye when he left Blackburn for Swindon in 1995 for £225,000. Scored 32 goals in just over 90 appearances before £300,000 took him to Stoke City in 1997. Cardiff paid £1.7m for his services in 2001. Now at League Two club Bradford City where he finished as top scorer on 17 goals last season.

Steve MCMAHON →

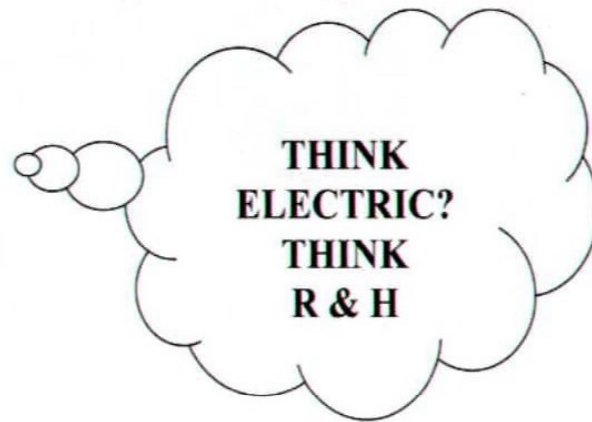
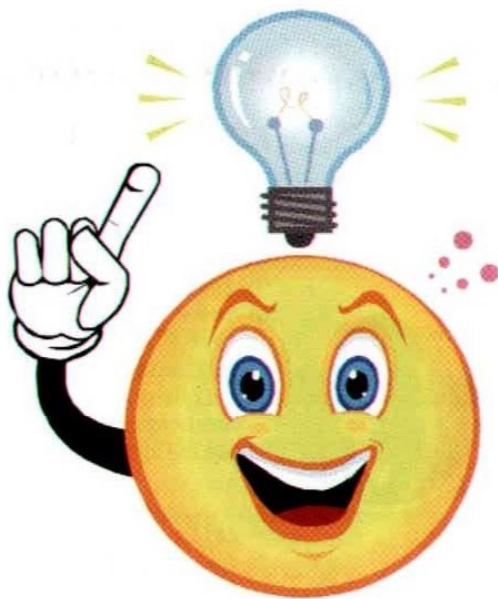

A-Z

AH, BLESS

When Ernie Hunt took to the field for Town's 3-2 home defeat against Walsall in the First Round in November 1959, he became the youngest Red to play in the FA Cup. Aged 16 years and 242 days, he beat Don Rogers by 153 days. Don was 17 when he started Town's 2-0 win away at Yeovil a year later. Hunt was on the scoresheet.

BANANA SKINS

Danny Wilson branded today's game a 'potential banana skin' when the draw was made, and Town fans won't need reminding of the side's recent record against non-league opposition. Histon knocked us out last season with a 1-0 win, contributing to the end of Maurice Malpas' tenure, while Stevenage made the headlines with a 2-1 win here at The County Ground in round three in 1998 (see G).

'CAN WE PLAY YOU EVERY WEEK?'

Swindon boast a 100 per cent record against 18 teams in the FA Cup, including Manchester United and Gillingham. We're unbeaten against a further five teams, including Brentford, who we've knocked out in three of our four encounters.

DANNY BOY

Town boss Danny Wilson has experienced FA Cup final day once before. Wilson was part of the Sheffield Wednesday team that lost in a replay against Arsenal in 1993. It was the third meeting between the two sides in five weeks. The Gunners had beaten the Owls in the League Cup final before the two came face-to-face in a league match two weeks before the FA Cup final showdown. Wilson missed the first game, a 1-1 draw, but returned for the replay, in which Arsenal defender Andy Linighan won it for the Londoners in extra-time. As a Manager, Wilson took Barnsley to the quarter-finals in 1997/98. The Tykes beat Manchester United in the Fifth Round after a replay, but couldn't negotiate their way past Newcastle in the last sixteen.

EXTRA-TIME

It hasn't always been unlucky for Town, but the Reds have been forced into extra-time 13 times. Of these, Town have gone on to win on seven occasions. The most recent, against Barnet at Underhill in January 2008, saw the Robins level after a Billy Paynter strike. You'll have to read 'P' to find out the outcome...

FIFTY-EIGHT PER CENT...

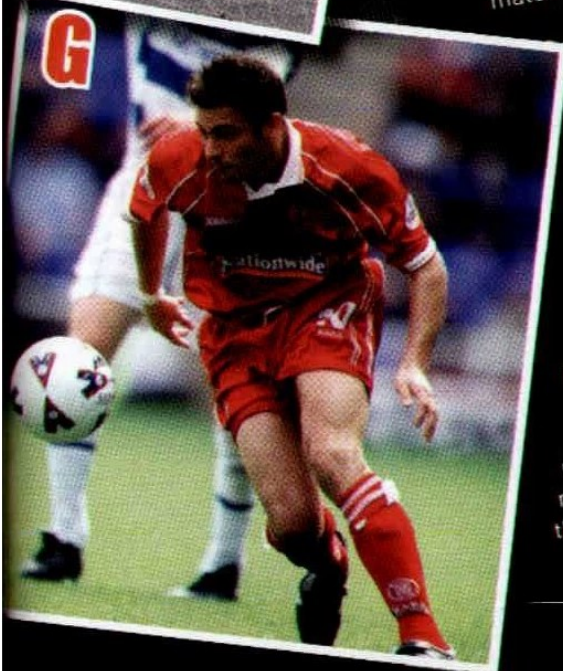
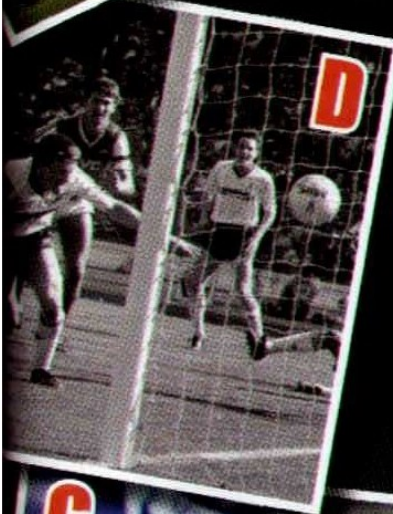
...is the total percentage of Swindon's FA Cup ties won. That's 161 wins in 325 matches. Our goal difference is +179. Let's hope another win, and more goals follow today.

GRAZIOLI

For three years, his name was sung from these very terraces, but while on loan at Stevenage from Peterborough, Giuliano was our tormentor in chief. 'Graz' scored the winner for The Boro at our expense in 1998, one of seven goals he scored during his loan spell. Before that, Graz had enjoyed a glorious run of six goals in five games for Woking. He is one of 13 players to have represented both clubs, with Martin Williams, Tom Jones and Charlie Griffin among them.

HELLO AGAIN

Swindon have faced West Ham United nine times in the FA Cup, more than any other club. We've won two and drawn four. The most resounding win came in 1911/12, a 4-0 victory that helped Town on their way to the semis for a second time (see L).



FA CUP A-Z

IPSWICH TOWN

In 1981, Town officials decided to celebrate the club's centenary by inviting FA Cup holders Ipswich Town to play in a friendly at The County Ground. 5,011 fans turned out to watch the Tractor Boys win by two goals to nil. The visitors made up for beating us by presenting the Swindon board with a horse as a gift.

JIMMY QUINN

Jimmy was 40 years and 23 days old when he pulled on the shirt as Town faced Charlton Athletic in round three in December 1999. Quinn lined up alongside Iffy Onoura in attack, but Ty Gooden scored Town's consolation in a 2-1 defeat in south London.

KANCHELISKIS

Ian Culverhouse became the quickest player to be sent off in the FA Cup when he handled Andrei Kanchelskis' shot at Goodison Park in January 1997. The former Norwich defender attempted to stop the Russian's effort on the goal line after just 52 seconds and was subsequently dismissed. Kanchelskis scored from the resulting penalty and Everton won the tie 3-0, with Town finishing the tie with nine men!

LAST HURDLE

Town have reached the semi-finals twice. In 1909/10, Town scored 96 goals in the league, but in the cup the Reds knocked out Crystal Palace, Burnley, Tottenham and Manchester City before meeting Newcastle United in the semis at White Hart Lane. With the game goalless, Town hit the post before the Barcodes scored two in quick succession. At the end of the season, Town were invited to compete for

the Dubonnet Cup in Paris along with Barnsley, the other losing semi-finalists.

Town won 2-1. Barnsley got their own back two years later when Town made the semis for the second time in three years. The Reds had beaten Sutton Junction, Notts County, West Ham and Everton, and after wasting another golden chance in the replay (following a 0-0 draw), this time Archie Brown missing from the penalty spot, Barnsley scored the winner in the second half.

MAIN MAN

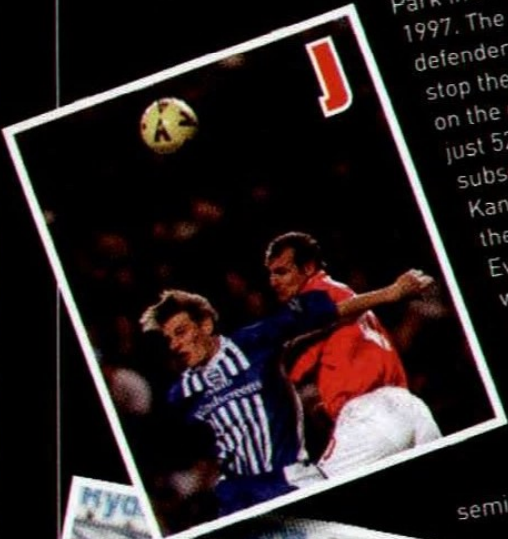
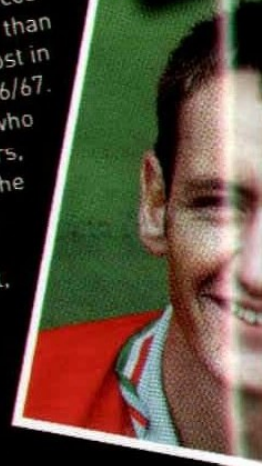
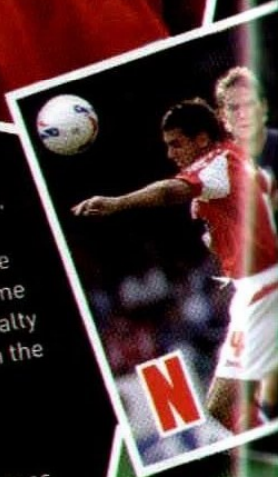
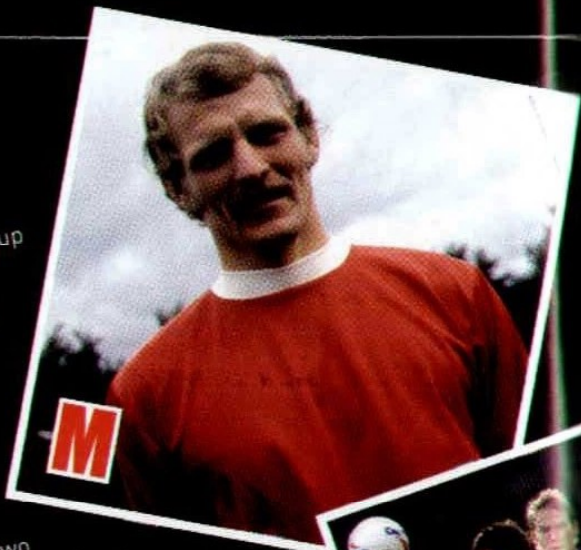
John Trollope made 61 appearances for Town in the competition, more than any other Swindon player. The most in any one season was eight, in 1966/67. Town drew 3-3 with West Ham, who boasted three World Cup winners, at Upton Park, before winning the replay 3-1. Nottingham Forest eventually knocked the Reds out, albeit at the third attempt, in the Fifth Round.

NICKY NICOLAU

If selected today, Nicky Nicolau could face his former employers for the first time since joining Woking. The attacking left-back joined the Cards in late September 2009. He signed for Swindon in 2005 from Southend and had a loan spell at Hereford United. He left to join Barnet in 2006.

ONE, TWO, THREE

There have been 24 Swindon hat-tricks in the FA Cup. Jimmy Pugh, who played for the Reds between 1902 and 1905, scored four, while (slightly) younger fans may remember the most recent: Howard Pritchard and Andy Rowland both bagged three apiece in a 7-0 thumping of Aldershot Town in 1983.



PENALTY SHOOT-OUT

Ah yes, our solitary penalty shoot-out in the competition. Sadly, we failed to score a single goal as Barnet romped to a 2-0 win.

QUALITY & QUANTITY

Harold Fleming is widely regarded as the greatest striker to wear the shirt, so it comes as no surprise to find him our top goalscorer in the FA Cup. He scored 19 in 13 seasons, six of which came en route to the semi-finals in 1911/12 (see L). Sadly, Barnsley identified him as Town's main threat and dished out enough rough treatment to see him miss the replay.

ROY EVANS

The former boss boasts the only 100 per cent record as Town boss in the FA Cup, although he only oversaw two games. Town beat Hartlepool and Hereford in 2001/02 under Evans' watchful eye. Paul Sturrock won three games in four, while Ken Beamish and Bobby Smith boast a 70 per cent win ratio in the competition. Danny Williams, with 69 per cent, and Fred Ford and Andy King, both 67 per cent, follow closely behind.

SUPER SUB

With two goals as a substitute, Steve Cowe has scored more from the bench than any other Town player in the competition. He got them in one go, too. With Town coasting against Gateshead in the second round in 2000, he hit two goals in the last 10 minutes to add some gloss to a routine performance by Andy King's side.

THOMAS, H

The inside left played just five games for the Robins, but he made his first and last appearances in the FA Cup. Amazingly, both were against the same side, Watford Rovers. The first, a 1-0 win, came in October 1986. The second, a 3-0 rout followed three years later.

UNBEATEN

Forty-four players boast a 100 per cent winning record playing for Swindon in the FA Cup. Many of those have played one game, but 16 have played two or more. Will Mantell (1893-1895) and

Steve McMahon (1994-1998) have both represented Town four times without losing.

VIDEO NASTY

Town's performance against Oxford United in 2002 was shown live on BBC One and was more x-rated than X-factor, but the narrow defeat against Aston Villa in 1992 was more memorable. Glenn Hoddle's men played good football, with only superior finishing - including a fierce shot from Steve Froggatt - settling the fifth round encounter in 1992.

'WE WANT 11!'

The saying goes that there are no easy games anymore, but that wasn't the case in the 1920s. Town put 10 past Farnham United Breweries in 1925/26 in the first round in what remains the club's record win in the FA Cup. Frank Richardson scored four of his 10 in just four cup matches.

X-RATED

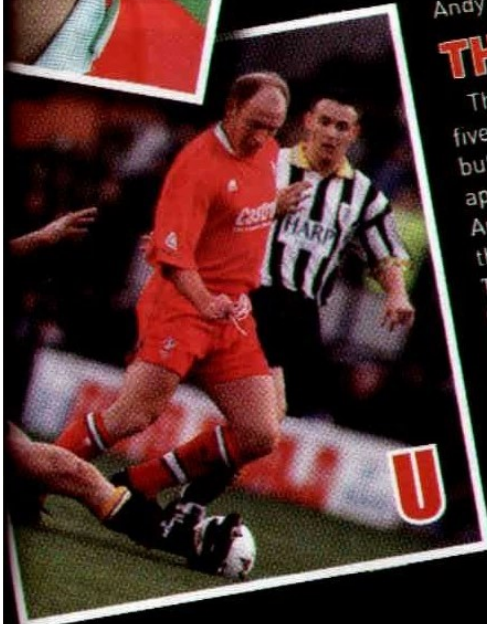
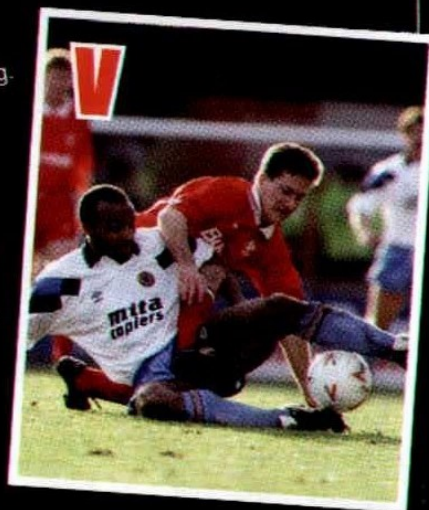
Thankfully, we're never likely to see a pounding like the one dished out by Manchester City in 1930. Town had beaten Manchester United in the third round at Old Trafford and held City to a 1-1 draw at home. However, in front of 46,082, the Reds went awol. Bobby Marshall scored five for the home side in a 10-1, while Town's Harry Morris scored our solitary effort.

'YOU'VE ONLY COME TO WATCH THE TOWN'

In 1972, 31,668 fans squeezed in to see the Robins take on Arsenal in the first round. Swindon lost 2-0.

'ZZZZZZZZ'

In 1951/52 Town played nine matches in the FA Cup, despite only reaching the fifth round. After seeing off Bedford in round one, draws were the trend as it took three matches to knock out Torquay. Town won 3-1 in a second replay. It two attempts to edge past both Cardiff and Stoke City, too.

Relegated from the Blue Square Premier last term, Woking have made a solid start to life in the Blue Square South table and are currently fourth in the division.

A win last weekend would have lifted Woking up to third place in the division above Thurrock but a point was taken in a scrappy affair. Goalkeeper Ross Warner won the Man of the Match award, after a string of fine saves. New loan signing from Reading, Mitchell Bryant could have won the game for The Cards but spurned a late effort in front of a 1,417 crowd.

Woking have scored 14 goals in 8 away games so far this term and Giuseppe Sole leads the goalscoring

charts with nine goals. Sole is a graduate of the Woking academy and was the club's leading scorer during the 2008/09 campaign. After spending time with Ebbsfleet United last term, he is now back with Woking and seems to be firing on all cylinders.

There are plenty of links between the two clubs – midfielder Nicky Nicolau is now a regular amongst the Woking ranks after joining in the summer and spent one-season at The County Ground as well as having spells with Arsenal and Southend United. Former Town loanees Martin Williams, Kevin James and Alex Rhodes have all had spells with The Cards with former striker Guiliano Grazioli perhaps the most well-known player to have

represented both sides.

There has only been one previous encounter between the two clubs – which took place in January 1996 here at The County Ground in front of 10,322 in the FA Cup third round. Goals from Paul Bodin, now of course Town Under 18's Manager, and Wayne Allison proved enough to secure a safe passage into the fourth round stage. Geoff Chapple was Manager at Woking on their last visit to Swindon and he will be at The County Ground to see his club in action.

Financially the FA Cup has lucrative rewards and both Swindon and Woking will have their eyes set on the £18,000 prize fund for winning this first round tie.

WARNER

Goalkeeper Ross Warner is another success story of the Academy set-up, making his first team debut, aged 17, as a substitute early in the 2007-08 season. Subsequent remarkably assured performances led to some 20 first team appearances in that campaign. He had to watch from the sidelines for most of last season but has now regained his first team place and kept a clean sheet in Woking's FA Cup fourth qualifying round win over Hendon.

HAND

Signed for the Cards in September 2009 from Chelmsford City. Started his career at Watford, making over 40 appearances while also having loan spells with Oxford United, Livingston, Peterborough (twice), Huddersfield Town and Northampton. Joined Chester City in summer 2006, making over 40 appearances, before

moving to Lincoln City a year later. Made 19 appearances for the Imps and also had another loan spell at Oxford United. Transferred to Ebbsfleet in summer 2008, joining Chelmsford City towards the end of last season.

BOARDMAN

Imposing central defender and Captain who returned to Kingfield in June 2009, four years after he left to join Rochdale. Started his career as a trainee at Crystal Palace, joining Woking on loan in March 2001. After a brief loan period at Margate, returned to Kingfield for a second loan spell, eventually



signing permanently in March 2002. Went on to make 166 league and cup appearances for the Cards and was selected for the England semi-professional side. Joined the Dale in May 2005, notching up 25 appearances. Signed for Dagenham and Redbridge in January 2007, making 36 appearances.

NICOLAU

Nicky Nicolau is an attacking left-back who knows all about The County Ground after a one season stay in Wiltshire.

Nicolau was with Arsenal as a youngster, being part of their 2003 FA Youth Cup-winning side, before going on loan to Southend United and then joining them permanently, making over 30 appearances. Signed for Town in 2005 and had a loan spell at Hereford United. Joined Barnet in summer 2006 and went on to make over 70 appearances for the Bees before being released at the end of last season.

ARTER



the previous season. Joined the Addicks as a trainee in July 2007 and subsequently also had a loan spell at Staines Town. Made debut for Charlton aged 17 in a League Cup game. Has represented Republic of Ireland at U17 and U19 level. He has a reputation as a flair player and is comfortable on either foot.

Harry Arter signed from Charlton Athletic in June 2009, having impressed Jimmy Dack during a loan spell at Welling United

GIUSEPPE



Signed from the Woking Academy, aged 18, in the summer of 2006, Giuseppe had been a prolific scorer in youth football. Also appeared for

Basingstoke Town in a loan spell, notching several goals. He burst onto the Conference scene, scoring his first league goal in August 2006 against Morecambe at Kingfield and went from strength to strength, with some sensational free-kicks particularly catching the eye. His form earned him selection for the England C Team. Was the Cards' top scorer in 2007/08. In January 2009 joined Ebbsfleet United on loan till the end of the season. Re-signed for Woking in the summer.

BEST OF THE REST

Ricky Anane is an attacking right-back who joined in the summer following a successful trial period. Formerly with Bury, he also spent time on loan at Fleetwood Town. Tom Hutchinson is a central defender who has experience with Sutton United, Fulham and Dundee and remains a popular figure in the Woking camp. Joe McNerney is another academy graduate who has played in defence, midfield and attack. He made his league debut at Altrincham in February and was handed a one-year deal in the summer. A strong left-footed defender, Aswad Thomas joined the Cards from Charlton Athletic in June 2009 in a deal which also brought Harry Arter to the club. Midfielder Mark Ricketts has an FA Trophy winner's medal - collected during his time with Ebbsfleet United and spent five years with Charlton Athletic. Striker Delano Sam-Yorke started in the last round against Hendon and will be eager to make his mark at The County Ground.

GAFFER GRAHAM BAKER

Graham Baker made his debut for his home-town club, Southampton, aged 18 in November 1977, scoring in the opening minute, and went on to make 113 appearances, scoring 22 goals, before being sold to Manchester City in the 1982 close season. During his time at Southampton he was also capped twice at England U21 level. He spent five seasons at Maine Road, notching up 117 appearances and scoring 19 goals, before returning to the Dell in 1987 for another three-year stint there, which saw a further 60 appearances and 11 more goals plus a brief loan spell at Aldershot Town. Graham finished his playing career at Fulham, making 10 appearances in the following two seasons.

Subsequently, Graham did some part-time coaching with Carshalton Athletic, becoming number two to Graham Roberts in a championship-winning season, and then coaching for four years at Fulham. In 2005 Glenn Cockerill, a team mate from his second spell at Southampton, asked him to take on the 'community' role at Kingfield and, subsequently becoming Director of Youth Football. Graham has presided over a huge expansion of the successful Youth Academy scheme at Kingfield, producing a number of first-team players.

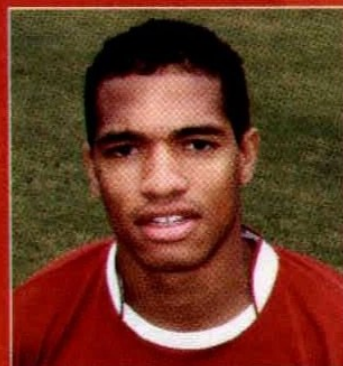

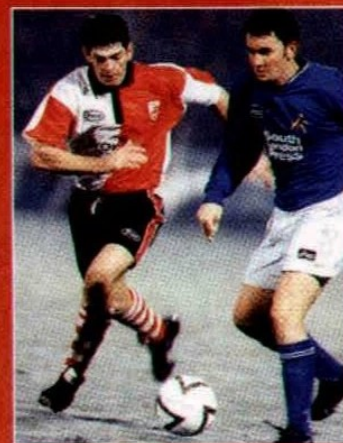

CLUB CONNECTIONS

THEY PLAYED FOR US BOTH

Whether it's 'Graz' sneaking in with a last-minute winner or Tom Jones performing in the midfield, supporters of both Swindon Town and Woking will have memories of the players on this page. We take a look at those players with the most prominent connections with the two teams.

GLENN COCKERILL

Midfielder who played 26 games for Swindon after joining from Lincoln City in 1979 and spent two seasons with before departing for Lincoln City. Cockerill made his name during an eight-year stint with Southampton and spent five years as Manager at Woking after taking up the role in 2002.

GIULIANO GRAZIOLI

Scored 18 goals in 78 league starts for Swindon and was a popular figure here at The County Ground after joining from Peterborough United in 1999. He scored 6 goals in only 5 starts for Woking during a loan spell from London Road in 1996.

CHARLIE GRIFFIN

Now a member of the playing ranks at Stevenage Borough, Charlie Griffin was brought to Swindon by former boss Jimmy Quinn from Chippenham Town in February 1999 for a £10,000 fee. Griffin spent time with Woking on loan whilst at The County Ground and 2 goals in 3 appearances was enough to tempt The Cards into a permanent move for the striker after leaving The Robins.

KEVIN JAMES

One of four loanees to join Swindon in March 2007 to try and kick-start Paul Sturrock's promotion bid, Kevin James made just two appearances for The Robins. He made his debut off the bench in the

televised 3-2 away win at Lincoln City before another outing as a substitute at Bristol Rovers. In all he played only 28 minutes of football with Swindon before returning to Nottingham Forest. He joined Woking in the summer of 2007 - making 19 appearances before switching to Crawley.

TOM JONES

Joined Town in 1988 from Aberdeen and went onto to enjoy a solid spell with The Robins, scoring 12 goals in 168 league appearances for Swindon before departing for Reading in the summer of 1992. Spent time with Woking during the 1996/97 season and has since been involved in Management with Swindon Supermarine, Busan I'Park and Armenia. Tom returned to The County Ground earlier this season as a guest in the Sponsor's Suite.

ALEX RHODES

Joined Swindon in October 2006 and made four appearances for The Robins all off the bench, but he failed to score during his time at The County Ground before returning to Brentford. Earlier this year he scored once in 3 starts for Woking whilst on loan from League Two Rotherham United. Rhodes now plays for Oxford United.

JAMIE PITMAN

One of Town's young guns, Trowbridge-born Pitman progressed through the youth ranks before making three first team appearances between 1994 and 1996 alongside the likes of Ben Worrell and Ty Gooden. Joined Hereford United in February 1996 before signing for Woking in May 2000 - making 53 league appearances for The Cards before returning to Hereford two years later.

the Championship's top scorer with Colchester United in 2006-07. He top-scored with 14 goals on his return season at Carrow Road in 2007-08 but found opportunities and goals harder to come by last season and was loaned to Barnsley in mid-season. Jamie will certainly be looking to hit the back of the net for City on a regular basis again in 2009-10.

Striker **Grant Holt** was Bryan Gunn's fourth signing of the day on July 24, 2009, joining from League Two side Shrewsbury Town on a three-year deal with a one-year option. Holt topped the League Two goalscoring charts in the 2008-09 season, scoring 28 goals for the Shrews.

The Carlisle-born player began his career on the non-league scene with Worthing before first tasting league football with Halifax Town in 1999. After leaving the Shay he dipped back into non-league with Barrow before his goals took him to Sheffield Wednesday in 2003. It was with Rochdale that he really came to prominence and his 34 league goals from 75 league outings between 2004 and 2006 won him a host of admirers. A £300,000 move to Nottingham Forest followed in January 2006. He scored 17 goals in his first full season at the City Ground as Forest made it to the League One play-offs. Holt also figured in Forest's promotion campaign the following season. He made a club record £170,000 move to Shrewsbury in the summer of 2008 and his 28 goals played a major part in the Shrews progressing to the League Two Play-off Final where they lost 1-0 to Gillingham at Wembley.

Holt bagged his first, second and third City goals in the 4-0 away win over Yeovil Town, in the first round of the Carling Cup - his second match for City in August 2009.

if Town are to progress to the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Area Semi-Final stage then the likes of Gordon Greer and Scott Cuthbert will have to keep a close handle on the Norwich frontline. With 12-goal striker Grant Holt and former Town man Jamie Cureton amongst the Canaries' ranks - there could be an interesting battle for cup supremacy ahead.

Cureton is currently in his second spell with the Canaries having begun his career at Carrow Road in the early 1990s. His appetite for the game and eye for goal soon saw him progress through the youth and reserve teams before making his first team debut back in 1994.

A very popular player during his early career with Norwich - a number of fans were disappointed to see him join Bristol Rovers in search of regular first team football in 1996. From then on it has been a case of 'have boots, will travel' as Jamie carved out a fine career in the business of scoring goals.

Well-known to Swindon fans after a one-season stay in Wiltshire during the 2005-06 season, Cureton netted seven goals in twenty-two league starts for The Robins, including both goals in a 2-0 triumph over Chesterfield in March 2006 - which proved to be his last goals in Town colours.

He returned to Carrow Road in the summer of 2007 after an excellent season as

GAFFER
PAUL LAMBERT

Paul Lambert was appointed Norwich City manager on Tuesday, August 18, succeeding Bryan Gunn. The former Scotland captain arrived from fellow League One club Colchester United, having taken the reins at the Community Stadium in October 2008. He guided the U's to a mid-table finish last season and left Colchester top of the table this. Previously in charge of Wycombe Wanderers for two years, leading them to a historic League Cup semi-final appearance in January 2007. His first managerial appointment was north of the border with Scottish Premier League side Livingston in June 2005.

The 40-year-old former midfielder began his playing career with St. Mirren before moving to Motherwell in 1993, before moving abroad to join Borussia Dortmund three years later. The Scottish international midfielder made history with the German side when they defeated Italian giants Juventus 3-1 in the UEFA Champions League final in Munich, in 1997.

After one season in Germany, Lambert returned to Scotland with Celtic where he went on to win four Scottish Premier League titles, two Scottish Cups and two CIS Insurance Cups, as well as captaining the side to the 2003 UEFA Cup Final - which ended in a 3-2 defeat to Portuguese side Porto after extra-time. Lambert spent eight years as a key figure at Celtic Park before moving into management with Livingston.

Bryan Gunn and chipped in with two goals following Gunn's immediate appointment as manager.

LAPPIN



Former Scotland Under-21 international Simon Lappin joined Norwich City from St Mirren in the 2007 January transfer window. Signed by Peter Grant, Lappin was swiftly installed in the first team at Carrow Road and marked his debut with a man of the match award following City's 2-1 win over Leeds United in February 2007.

Able to operate on the left side of midfield, left-back and also in a central midfield role, he became a key component of the Norwich team under Grant and his ability to deliver the ball accurately from set plays became a regular feature of City's play.

Although the playmaker featured in City's first three games under new boss Glenn Roeder, he was subsequently banished from the first team scene following City's 3-0 defeat at Plymouth in November 2007. In search of first team football, he took in a loan spell at Motherwell at the end of 2007-08 and eventually returned to the Norwich first team under Bryan Gunn for City's match at Birmingham City in March 2009.

BEST OF THE REST

Adam Dury, currently the club's longest-serving player, brings a wealth of experience to the City squad and soon made the left-back slot his own after joining in 2001. Danish defender Jens Berthel Askou joined in the summer from top Turkish side Kasimpasa and he made 57 appearances during two seasons in Turkey. George Francomb featured against Town in the recent League One clash at Carrow Road which was only his third appearance for the club. Darel Russell is now a regular in the side and joined Norwich from Stoke City two years ago.

NELSON

Central defender Michael Nelson became the Club's third summer signing after agreeing to join City from Hartlepool United on a two-year contract. With his contract due to expire at the end of June 2009 he cut short his honeymoon to sign for the Canaries and link up with his new teammates as at July 1. A no-nonsense defender, Michael was strongly recommended to the Club by assistant manager Ian Butterworth who worked with Michael alongside current Town boss Danny Wilson during his time on the coaching staff at Hartlepool.

During his six-year spell at Victoria Park the 29-year-old had forged an excellent reputation on the League One circuit and Norwich had to overcome competition from other League One and Championship clubs to secure his services.

HOO LAHAN

A creative midfielder with excellent close control and dribbling skills, City fans were understandably delighted when Wes Hoolahan agreed to join the Canaries in the summer of 2008. Signed from Blackpool by Glenn Roeder, Hoolahan had made a lasting impression on the Carrow Road faithful with a number of classy displays against Norwich in recent seasons. He starred in the 2006-07 FA Cup replay at Carrow Road as City edged passed Blackpool 3-2 and was a constant menace a season later when Blackpool won 2-1 at Carrow Road in the Championship. Injury ruled him out of City's final seven league games of last season which was a particular blow as he appeared to be in fine form under the management of

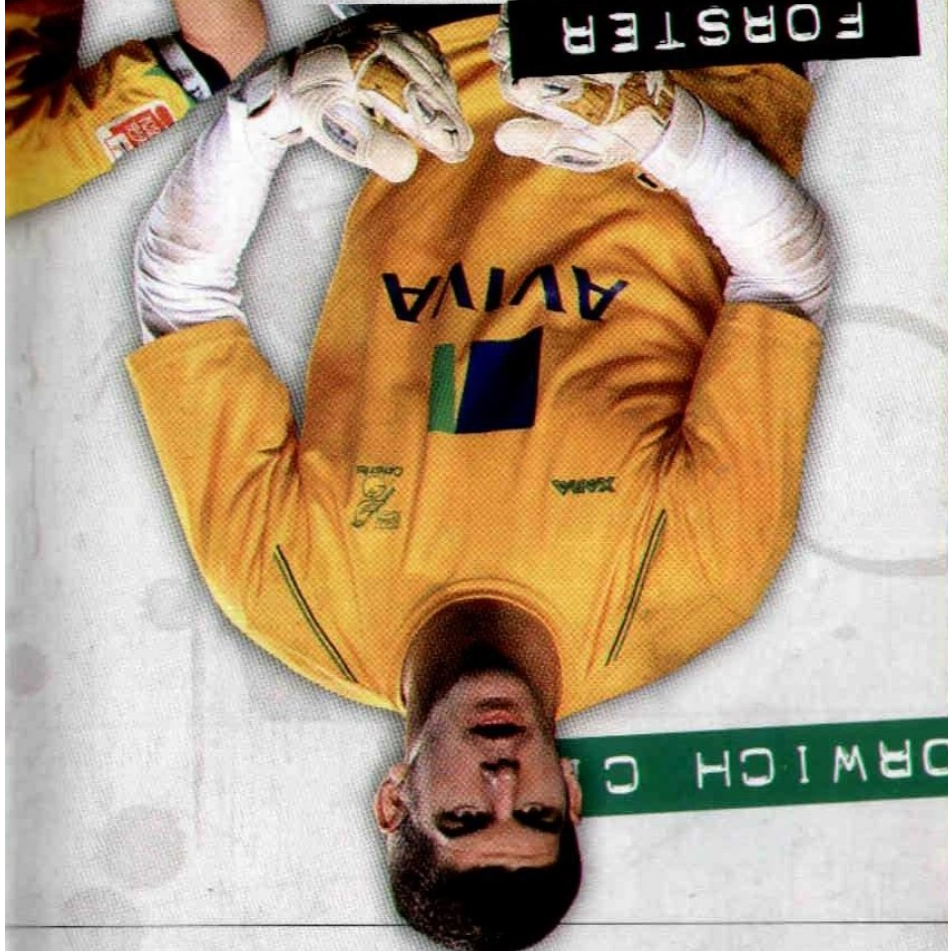

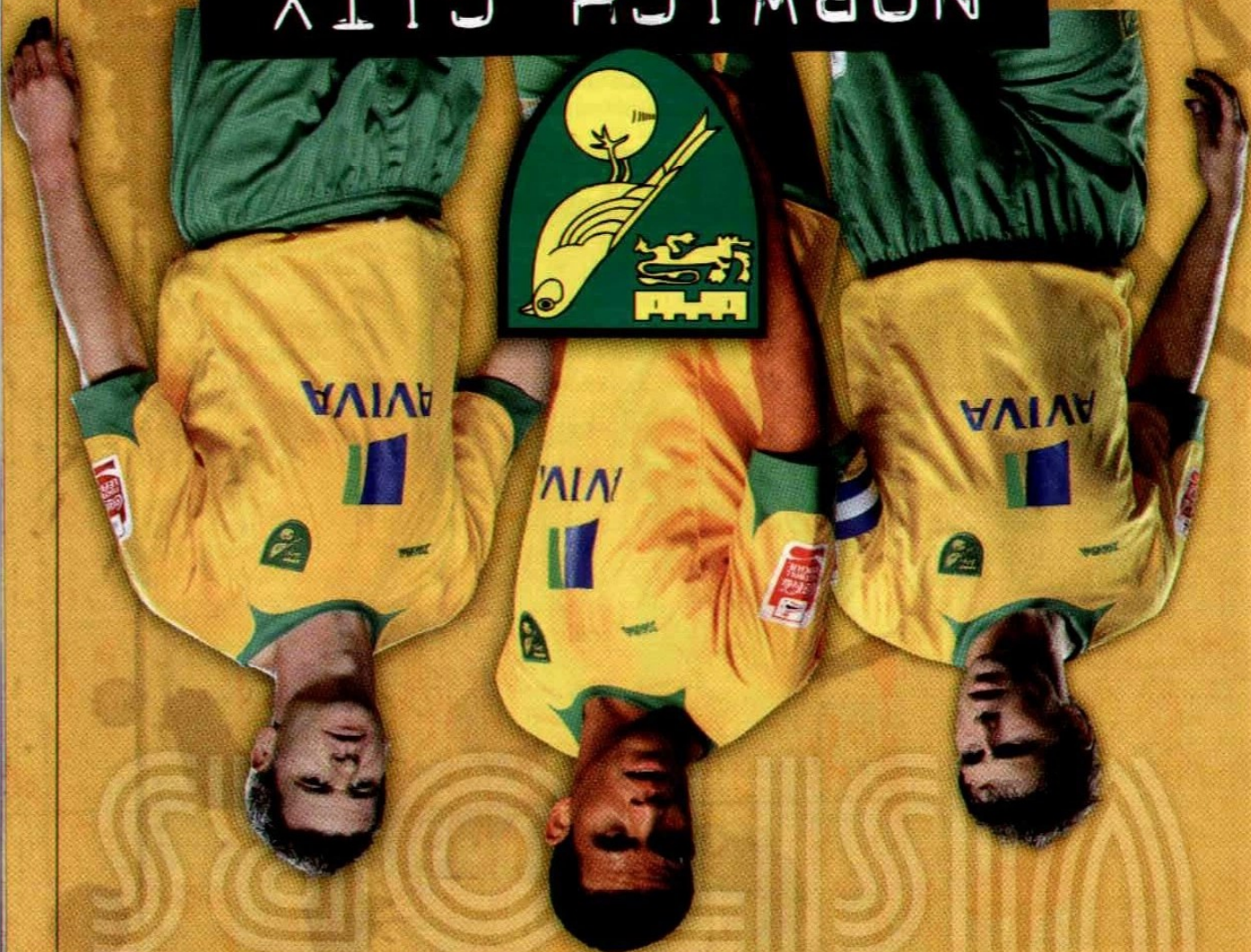

The magic of the FA Cup! My first memory of Swindon Town in this competition is January 1976, a 2-2 third round draw with Tooting & Mitcham here at The County Ground.

The team included the likes of Jim Barron, Kenny Stroud, Wilf Dixon & Trevor Anderson. I wrote a piece for the "Daily Express Young Reporter of the Year" competition. It didn't win but earned a commendation, perhaps a taste of the career to come! The Town went on to lose the replay 2-1 against their non-league opponents.

It's Blue Square South Woking this weekend, a team we beat in the same competition 13 years ago. I think my radio commentary for the first goal went something like "Bodin crosses...it's gone in" (a bit like Anthony McAnee in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy at Exeter recently). Wayne Allison added a second. It was the campaign in which we went on to lose to Southampton in the fifth round. Our record progress in the modern era is a place in the last eight in 1970, losing a quarter-final tie to eventual runners-up Leeds.

In contrast, 12 months ago, it was Historon's victory which marked the beginning of the end for manager Maurice Maipas. Giant-killing for the Town has been at a premium recently.

The last time we accounted for a team from the top flight in this most famous of tournaments was January 1988, a 2-0 third-round replay triumph at Norwich after a goalless home game. It was the era of the likes of Nicky Hammond, Tim Parkin, Bobby Barnes & Keiron O'Regan!



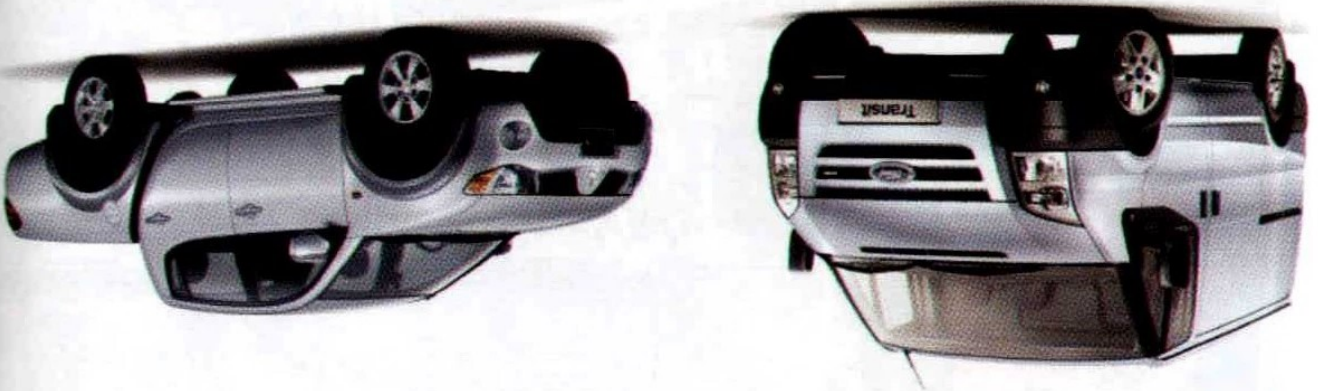

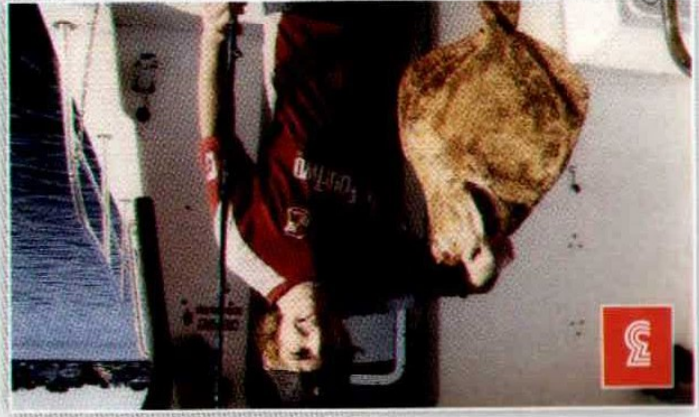

READY FOR ACTION



TONIGHT'S MATCH WITH NORWICH CITY SEES THE LONG AWAITED RETURN OF TOWN MIDFIELDER JONATHAN DOUGLAS TO FIRST TEAM ACTION.

The Irishman has been suspended for four games following his red card in the now infamous 1-1 home draw with Millwall, but is available for selection again after a frustrating month on the sidelines.

Town have clearly missed the midfielder's presence in recent weeks, and Douglas admits it has been equally frustrating serving a ban which he feels was harshly imposed upon him.

"I don't like watching football when I should be involved in it, so it has

been hard," he said.

"I was disappointed to go for that tackle (against Millwall). If anything

it was only yellow card, so to get sent off for it was a real shock to me.

"Then to get an extra game after we had appealed it was

disappointing, but it's just one of those things really. It didn't work out

so we just got to get on with it."

In a modern climate that sees an increasing suppression of

the physical side of the game, a combative midfielder of Douglas' ilk

could be considered a dying breed - but the 27-year-old is not about to

change the way he plays.

He said: "If the opportunity comes to make a tackle like that again I'll

make it because that's part and parcel of my game.

"Obviously nowadays you can't come off the ground in a tackle, so

you've just got to go careful.

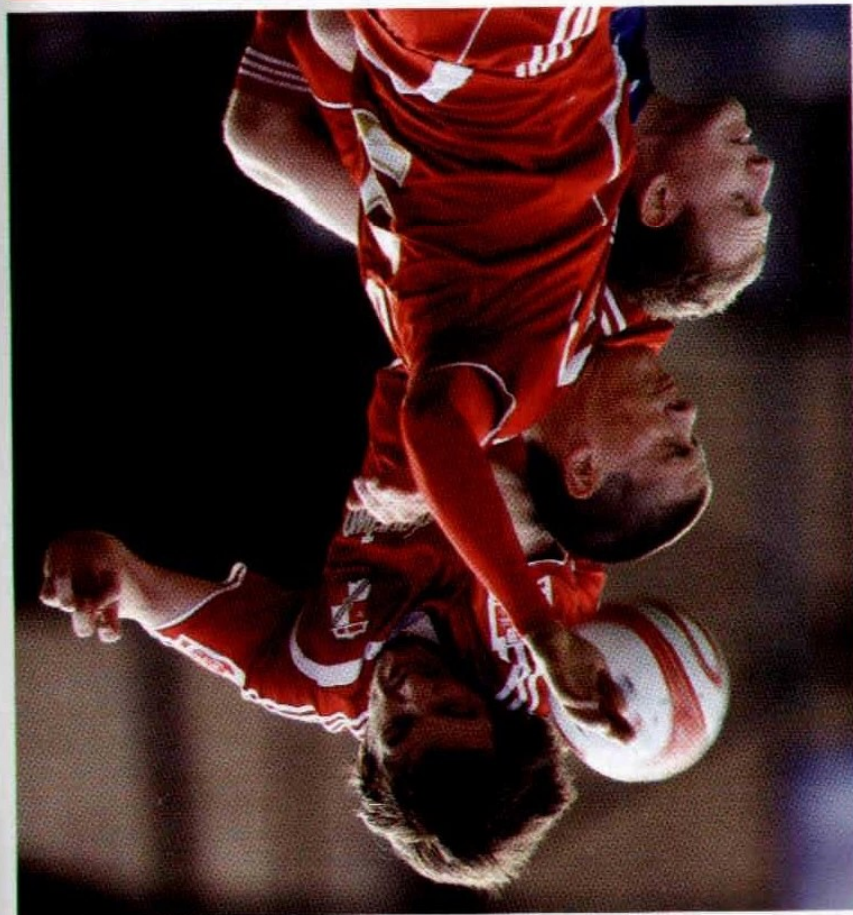
"But I don't necessarily feel as if I have to rein myself in, as I wouldn't

classify myself as being a dirty, malicious player.

"I try to play football in a fair way, and I thought that ball was there to be

won but just mistimed it. But again, to be sent off for it was very harsh."

Four weeks out of action is an unpleasant prospect for any professional footballer, but Douglas has used the time off both to maintain his fitness and to spend some quality time away from the game.



"I was disappointed to go for that tackle (against Millwall). If anything it was only yellow card, so to get sent off for it was a real shock to me."

He said: "The lads have had a couple of away matches so I've stayed down

here with my family.

"We've had my parents and a few other family members over from

Ireland, and they haven't seen my little daughter in a while, so it's been nice for

them to catch up my wife and I."

He continued: "I've had a few days off on the weekends, but during the week

I've been training as hard as ever. I've joined in with the normal

training, and then once that's finished I do a bit more running with Dave

(Morrison) the fitness coach. I've been working away with Dave and he's been pushing me hard but it's

been going well, so I should be fit and ready to go again."

A victory in tonight's Johnstone's Paint Trophy clash would leave

Town just three wins from a trip to Wembley, and Douglas believes that

is incentive enough for the side to perform in front of The County Ground

faithful this evening.

He said: "We go into it looking to win the game, and it doesn't matter how

we do it, as long as we get through to the next round.

"It represents a good chance for us to get to Wembley so we'll be going

into it looking to get through from the word go."

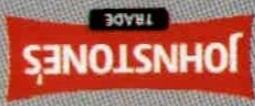

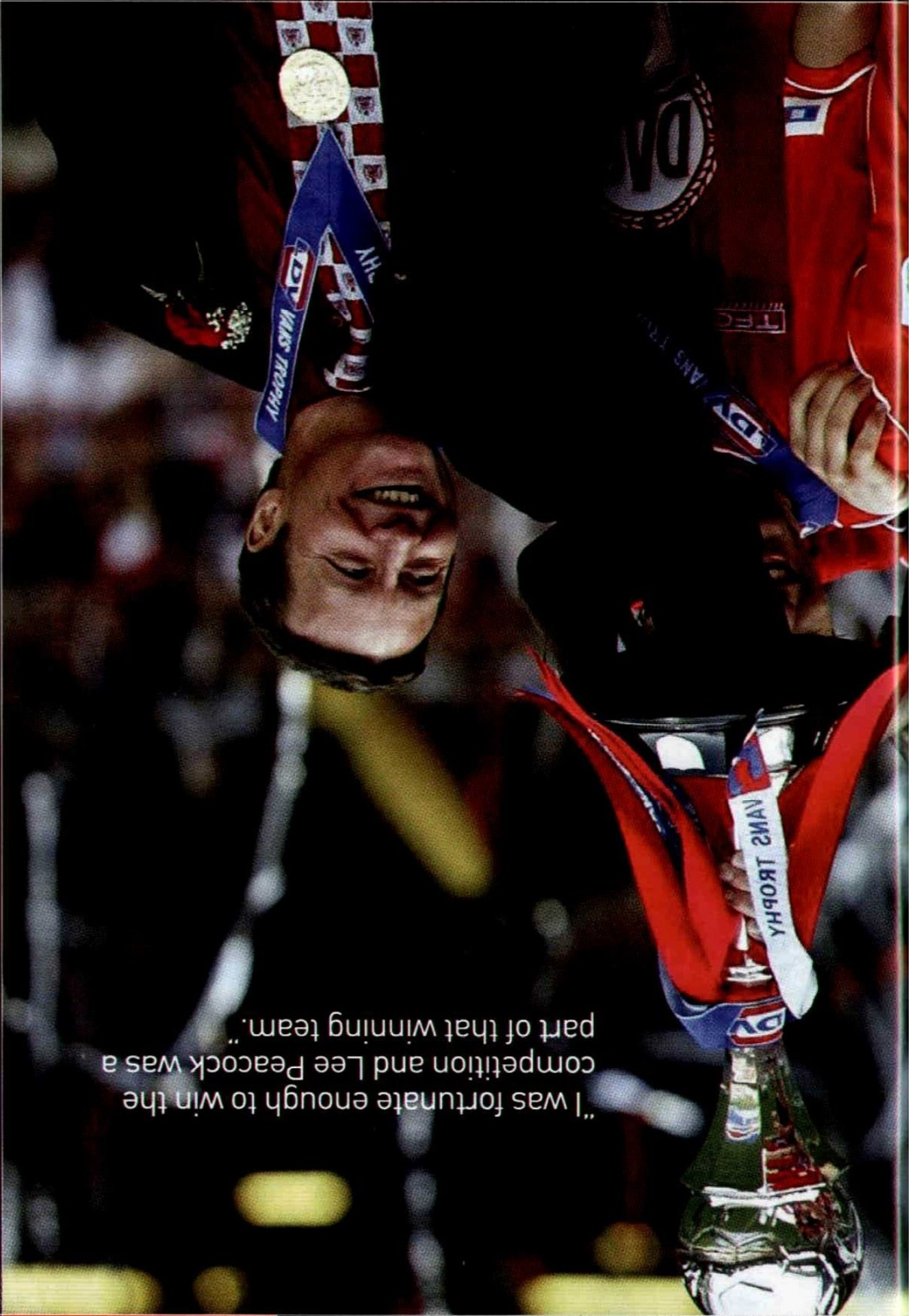
