The players' fitness levels are very good so it's just a matter of getting the little bit of fatigue out of their legs ready for today's game.


They've had some tough games in recent weeks, not least the Leeds and Southend games, and so it didn't really take too much managing last week until we started to prepare for the game today.

The former Poole Town hitman has bagged 10 goals in 11 starts for Town so far season, and following his explosive start has pledged his long-term future to the club.


Austin, 20, has scored seven goals in six home League One appearances at The County Ground





Thank you Jeremy for handing back my 'bald' point pen and thank you also for your kind and entertaining Boardroom notes that you wrote for the Leeds United fixture.

I did in fact invite Jeremy to pen the notes for today's Charlton Athletic game but he declined, saying he did not want it to become addictive!

This afternoon we throw open the gates of The County Ground to Phil Parkinson, his team, the Addicks' Directors, their guests and supporters, extending to them all a very warm welcome to Swindon Town FC.

It was just over ten nights ago that we opened every single gate at The County Ground when we entertained the mighty Leeds United and 14,500 supporters who were in attendance witnessed a truly excellent game of football and a terrific win for the Robins. The County Ground rocked that evening and we can only hope it will rock again this afternoon and for the rest of the season. The crowd that evening expanded so as to fill every available seat and we were sold out long before kick off. What a wonderful atmosphere you created and what a great place The County Ground is when it is full. Through your support and that of Leeds United, we were able to raise £7,500 for the Haiti disaster fund. Thank you.

One sad event marred an otherwise memorable evening. On returning to his car after the final whistle, Mr Peter Stephens suffered a heart attack and despite the immediate attention of our paramedic team and the air ambulance, he died a few days later in the Great Western Hospital. January and I am sure that you will join the Board and management, in extending to Lee Peacock and Hasney Aljofree the very best of good wishes as they look reignite their playing careers, Lee with Grimsby Town and Hasney with Oldham Athletic.

Finally, the long overdue refurbishment of the STFC Ticket Office is scheduled to take place between Thursday 11th February and Monday 15th February and the ticket office will be closed during this time reopening at 1pm on 15th February. 


It was a little bit frustrating, but these things happen and we've just got to get on with it and we're looking forward to the next game against Charlton today.

Oldham were busy again, this time securing a move for Millwall striker Jason


Price. The Welshman has been everpresent for the Lions but has only scored one league goal. His last game for Millwall was against... Oldham.




That man David Prutton does join Colchester as expected following his release from Leeds, but only until the end of the season. Short contracts are the name of the game in these troubled times, it seems.





CHARLTON ATHLETIC

Having been relegated from The Championship last season, Charlton Athletic were many people's favourites to return to the second tier of English football automatically.

However, having won their opening five fixtures of the League One season, 10 draws from 28 games have left The Addicks five points adrift of second placed Leeds United and in need of victories in order to sustain their automatic promotion push.

It was an impressive start to the season for Phil Parkinson's side, winning their first five games and remaining unbeaten in nine. This served to cement their credentials at the top of the table during the early stages of this term.

They suffered their first defeat at the hands of Colchester United in late September, and then enjoyed decent runs of form either side of a shock 1-0 FA Cup Third round defeat at the hands of Northwich Victoria.

It was over the Christmas period that Parkinson's side began to really lose ground on their automatic promotion rivals, as three consecutive draws against Millwall (4-4), Town (2-2) and Brentford (1-1) saw The Addicks drop into the dreaded third position, which they have held ever since.

Consecutive wins then followed for Charlton, as they overcame both Wycombe Wanderers and Hartlepool United by two goals to one and seemed to have regained that winning formula.

However, a televised 1-0 home defeat to South London rivals Leyton Orient then followed last Monday, before a disappointing 1-1 draw against Tranmere Rovers last weekend, again at The Valley.

Despite these disappointing recent showings, The Addicks are still fancied by many to return to The Championship, and will pose a serious threat to Town's mean backline this afternoon.

Phil Parkinson has a strong squad to choose from, including teenage sensation Jonjo Shelvey, captain Nicky Bailey and 12-goal former Town striker Deon Burton, all of whom will be keen for a swift return to form at The County Ground.



ELLIOT

Charlton's undisputed number one by the end of last season, Elliot was one of the few success stories of the 2008/09 campaign.

A boyhood Charlton fan, who watched from the Covered End as a six-year-old when Colin Walsh crowned the return to The Valley in 1992, Elliot enjoys a special relationship with supporters, and was invited for a trial after writing a letter to all the clubs in the south of the country.

Born in Greenwich, Elliot's league career began on loan at Notts County in early 2005 when a red card saw him plunged into action from the bench, and his penalty-saving prowess was regularly on show as he helped Accrington Stanley seal a return to The Football League in 2006, winning the player of the season accolade in the process.

RICHARDSON

Charlton's second signing of the summer, right-back Richardson arrived at The Valley having skippered Leeds United last term.

The defender was previously the longest-serving player on the books

at Elland Road, and played 173 times in seven seasons, making his debut in a UEFA Cup tie in November 2002.

Solid and mobile, and keen to forage forward at every possible opportunity, Richardson, like fellow new signing Miguel Llera, saw last season end in League One play-off semi-final agony.

He featured 23 times in the league in 2008/09 and Simon Grayson was the seventh manager he had played under in his seven years as a first-teamer.

First introduced to the Lilywhites side as a substitute against Hapoel Tel Aviv under Terry Venables, Rotherham-born Richardson played in the Premier League after two loan spells at Stoke City earlier in his career.



SODJE



Charlton completed the signing of former loan man and free agent Sam Sodje on Tuesday, September 1st.

The Greenwich-born defender, whose contract with Reading expired in June, admitted he was delighted to be returning to The Valley for a second spell after enjoying a long-term loan stint with the Addicks during the 2007/08 season.

The Nigeria international, noted for his aerial ability, started his career at Stevenage Borough before a switch to Margate at the beginning of the 2002/03 season.

Two years later he was on the move, signing for Brentford - now in League One - on a free transfer. After two seasons with the Bees, Sodje was snapped up by Reading but made just two starts before he was loaned to West

Bromwich Albion and then the Addicks.

MOONEY

Charlton re-signed Reading striker Mooney on a 28-day loan on Thursday, January 14th, a deal that was soon extended until the end of the season.

Mooney had spent three months with the Addicks from October to late December, scoring two goals in 11 appearances and forming an exciting partnership with Deon Burton in attack.

Born in Dublin, Mooney joined Shamrock Rovers as a youngster, making his first-team debut as a substitute against Longford Town in April 2004. After nine strikes in 40 appearances, Mooney moved on to Longford, where he bagged 19 goals.

Despite speculation linking him with a host of English sides, Mooney chose to remain in Ireland with Cork City, breaking a club record with 11 goals in six games and also notching on his European debut in a UEFA Cup draw with FC Haka.

BURTON

A hat-trick scorer on the final day of 2008/09, experienced striker Burton has 12 goals to his name so far this term.

That took his tally to five goals in 23 outings following his arrival from Sheffield Wednesday late last year, initially on loan until last year's January transfer window opened.

The Valley represents an 11th port of call for the much-travelled star, who passed 400 career league matches in 2008/09. Indeed, this is his 16th season as a professional after coming through the ranks at Portsmouth, and more than half of his appearances came for Derby County and Sheffield Wednesday.

The 60-cap Jamaica international has had loan spells at Cardiff City, Stoke City, Barnsley, Walsall and Swindon Town, plus stints at Brentford and Rotherham United.

GAFFER

PHIL PARKINSON

Initially lined up as a potential replacement for Alan Curbishley in the summer of 2006, Parkinson finally became the Valley manager in November 2008.

He was installed as caretaker boss when Alan Pardew left the club by mutual consent following a 5-2 home defeat against Sheffield United, and was handed the job on a full-time basis on the final day of 2008.

Back in May 2006, Parkinson's former club, Colchester United, denied him permission to talk to the Addicks, and the Chorley-born 42-year-old instead moved to Hull City.

After a short spell at the KC Stadium, he was appointed as assistant to Pardew in January 2007. The pair had worked together previously, when Parkinson was Pardew's captain during a glittering career at Reading.

After eight games in caretaker charge, Parkinson was finally named Charlton's 19th permanent manager, and although he was unable to stave off relegation, the Addicks lost just one of their final eight games in 2008/09.



Swindon Town Assistant Manager Peter Shirliff knows more than most about today's visitors, Charlton Athletic. The 48-year old made over 100 appearances for The Addicks after signing from Sheffield Wednesday in 1986.

Your time at Charlton was certainly eventful wasn't it?

The play-offs were different in those days. The team that finished fourth played against one of three teams from the division below. We played Leeds in the final to stay in the division. We beat them 1-0 at home and lost 1-0 away so we went to a third game decider which meant extra time and penalties then.

I scored two goals and that ensured Charlton stayed in the top flight. We left it a bit late but it was important that Charlton stayed up because they had only been promoted the season before. It was a harsh format in those days. It is

much better where it is about teams getting into the top flight rather than trying to stay in it.

How do you look back on your playing days?

I feel I had a pretty decent career over 18 years in which there were highs and lows. I enjoyed promotion under Jack Charlton and then Howard Wilkinson while at Wednesday and then when I came back the second time I had success with Ron Atkinson. So, in all, I had three promotions with Wednesday and one promotion with Barnsley.

And what was the highlight of your career?

The high has to be the League Cup Final triumph in 1991 when we beat Manchester United 1-0 at Wembley. It was a terrific season because we got promoted that season and winning the cup was the icing on the cake.





NICKY BaILEY

STAR MAN

Tough-tackling Bailey was a rare highlight for Charlton during the disappointing 2008/09 season, finishing the campaign - his first with the Addicks - as the club's top scorer with 13 goals.

His tally, coupled with a never-say-die attitude and all-action displays, led to the flame-haired midfielder deservedly being named Charlton's player of the year.

It's a title Bailey is becoming used to winning, having scooped Southend United's equivalent accolade in 2007/08 and Barnet's in 2005/06, when he also won the Bees' young player gong.

After being released by Fulham as a youngster, Bailey was snapped up by non-League Sutton United, hitting 31 goals in two seasons to catch the eye of Barnet, who paid just £10,000 for his services.

Bailey helped Barnet into The Football League in 2005 and earned international recognition for the England C side, but after three seasons at Underhill, he departed for Roots Hall in a £175,000 switch.

Charlton signed Bailey in mid-August in a package that could reach £750,000, and the Hammersmith-born ace, who prospered on the left flank following Phil Parkinson's appointment, took just four games to net his first goal, a sign of things to come.

Defoe went close several times before slicing left-footed into the top corner but in first-half stoppage time Luciano Becchio forced home a rebound to level.


Defoe had a goal ruled out for offside but soon flicked in at the near post following a David Bentley cross.




Funniest moment...



What are your best memories from working at STFC?



Match Background

Town and the Addicks were to face each other four times though 1994/95, and while much happened in the six months between the League fixtures there was little to choose between the results.

We were fourth in Division Two when we lost to a solitary David Whyte strike at the Valley in September, and towards the end of March, Kim Grant did the same to secure all three points for Charlton at The County Ground. By then we had plummeted to 22nd and Steve McMahon had replaced John Gorman as manager.

But also in September, we surrendered by a 3-1 home score in the first leg of a Coca Cola Cup match to gift Charlton the initiative. Six days later, a hat trick from Jan Aage Fjortoft and a helpful own-goal from one-time Town loan

goalkeeper Andy Petterson gave us an unlikely 5-4 aggregate victory. Former Town player Garry Nelson played in all four matches between the sides that season.



Everton defeat Manchester United by a goal to nil to take the FA Cup. The Toffee's goal scoring hero is ex-Town striker Paul Rideout.

Ex-Town boss Glenn Hoddle, now in charge at Chelsea, signs 32 year-old Dutch star Ruud Gullit from Sampdoria on a free transfer in May.



Kevin Amankwaah's career has been hindered by serious injury and lack of form at regular intervals throughout, but now, as Town's only ever-present this season, the right-back is enjoying a welcome run of form.

Signed by Maurice Malpas at the beginning of the 2008/2009 season, Kevin Amankwaah arrived at The County Ground hoping to kick-start his career following a difficult period at Swansea City.

However, a disruptive season at SN1, in which more injury problems and lack of form saw Amankwaah struggle to establish himself during Malpas' ill-fated reign, meant that it looked like being another stop-start affair for the right-back.

And the 27-year-old admits he feared the worst as his Town career got off to a familiarly stuttering start.

"I started thinking it was just going to be the same old thing really," he said.

"For a lot of last year I was just in and out of the team, so it was frustrating to say the least.

"All I wanted was a settled run in the team but I couldn't really do that what with a mixture of bad form or injuries."

Despite Amankwaah's truncated progress for the majority of last term, the arrival of Danny Wilson at the turn of 2009 marked something of a turning point in his Town career, as he began to cement a place in a team that gradually pulled clear of relegation trouble.

Having worked under Wilson for what he cites as one of the most fruitful periods of his career at Bristol City, Amankwaah admits the manager has been a factor in his increasingly impressive form over the last year.

"He was important in me getting back in the team last year, and has been a big influence on my career without a doubt," he said.

"Right through from my Bristol City days when he brought me through as a young player, to my time at Swindon now he has been

great with me.

"I know what he's about, he knows what I'm about and I think he knows, as a manager, how to get the best out of me.

"And I think I'm proving that with the way I've been playing so far this season."

Amankwaah continued to highlight the influence of Wilson, adding that the manager's trademark style of passing football has fuelled his desire to make inroads into opposition defences, as well as protecting his own.

"He always encourages me to get forward and he knows that I can play as well, which for me is brilliant and I'm just really enjoying my football here now," he said.

"I've played every game so far this season so I must be doing something right!

"Danny Wilson obviously sees it that way so I really can't complain at the moment."

Amankwaah has been one component of a settled and rock solid backline so far this season, alongside

fellow permanent fixtures Scott Cuthbert and Gordon Greer.

And with left-back the only position to have been rotated - between Leccinel Jean-Francois, Callum Kennedy and Alan Sheehan - Amankwaah admits this consistency is something both he and the defensive unit have benefited greatly from.

He said: "It's obviously been nice to have the same players to play alongside every week because we know each other's games pretty well by now.

"Even Leccy and Alan Sheehan have done really well when either of them have played at left-back, so it's

been great.

"It's nice for us all to have a nice long run in the team, because you start to get the hang of how your team mates play, and getting confident in your own game, so long may it continue."

Amankwaah added that, in centre backs Scott Cuthbert and Gordon Greer, Town boast two top quality defenders, his partnership with whom continues to thrive.

"I've learnt a lot from Gordy because he has been there or thereabouts throughout his career, and Scotty's been having a great season so far, so it's been great to play alongside him," he said.

"Scotty and Gordy are up there with some of the best, because they just work so well together.

"I can see it by playing next to them and they can only get better."

And with Town currently sitting in fifth place in League One, handily placed for a promotion push, Amankwaah was adamant that, having seen all the division has to offer, anything less than a play-off finish

would be a failure.

"At the moment I think that if we drop below the play-offs it will be a massive disappointment, and we'll only have ourselves to blame," he said.

"We're just looking upwards and not behind us, and hopefully if we keep this unbeaten run going then we can keep in touch with the teams at the top.

"We've come up against everyone now, and we feel that we're just as good, if not better than a lot of the teams that are above us at the moment so it would be our own fault if we didn't get in the play-offs or better."

Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parent-led support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. CONTROLLING THE INTENSITY OF TRAINING
BY MEANS OF THE HEART RATE MONITOR

DICK'S DIARY

A heart rate monitor used properly while training is a great tool to non-invasively find out how hard the players are working. A heart rate monitor helps take the guesswork out of training quality in comparison to only using perceived effort to gauge your training intensity.

Heart rate monitors have developed greatly over the years and real time heart rate systems have been developed. Through a chest monitor, heart rate data is transferred by means of a bluetooth transmitter box onto a laptop Computer while the players are actually training. The system we use here at Swindon is the Polar Team 2. This system can record up to 30 players during one session covering a distance of up to 150 metres away from the transmitter box. We can see in the picture Billy Paynter being monitored during pre-season training. The computer screen shows that Billy's heart reads in the high 80% of his maximum heart rate (MHR), which would suggest he's performing a high intensity interval session.

Each and every players training zones determined by maximum heart rate [aerobic, anaerobic and speed] are very individual and needs to be



determined before using a heart rate monitor so as to gain the full benefits of that training session. Your maximum heart rate is the highest heart rate you can achieve and is completely specific to you and is not trainable. Your Anaerobic Threshold (AT) is also specific to each individual, but is trainable. Your AT is the point at which lactic acid production is greater than its clearance. Training at intensities above AT, will cause fatigue to set in quickly. So training at this point or just below will improve an individual's AT and will allow performance to continue for longer periods without the collection of lactic acid. This occurs from 65-95% of one's maximum heart rate depending on the individual's fitness level.

A professional football players AT is usually found around 90-95% MHR. For this reason, training for short (3-4 minute) periods, the players are expected to maintain this MHR range throughout the session. During speed endurance training (30-60 seconds) the players are required to near 100% of their MHR's. The Polar Team 2 also shows when players are fully recovered, this is very important during such training sessions. During this type of training, players should repeat the next bout of exercise before they are fully recovered, so as they fatigue, which makes the next 100%MHR effort harder to perform.

There are several ways to find ones MHR: one being 220 minus your age. Formulas using age and resting heart rates are only predictions and aren't that accurate. Here at Swindon, the players are put through a couple of fitness tests. The players are required to run until exhaustion while their heart rates are being recorded. This is the most accurate way, though not the most popular among the players!
