the gaffer

Welcome back to The County Ground for this evening's match against Oldham Athletic, which will hopefully see us bounce back from Saturday's last minute disappointment.

It was hugely frustrating for everyone after the Charlton game because I felt we'd done enough to win it, and maybe even to get a second goal, which definitely would have killed it off.

We played some great stuff at times, but unfortunately we just couldn't get

90 minutes, which hopefully we can do tonight.

The most important thing we take from Saturday is how well we played throughout the game, because I thought we looked good for large parts of the game, and controlled it during certain periods.

We played very well against a top team on Saturday, so hopefully we can take that sort of form into the match tonight.

But just because Oldham are struggling this season, it doesn't mean

that second goal which would have given us a cushion, and we probably over stretched ourselves in search of it, which ultimately cost us two points on the day.

I think we were searching for that second goal too much, and ended up putting people in offensive positions that they shouldn't have been in, which allowed Charlton to get in behind us which they did to great effect in the end.

The late goals we've been conceding recently are really costing us at the moment, and it's a problem we need to address quickly because we can't afford to keep throwing away points in the final minutes of games.

People have asked me what I put it down to, and it's simply concentration. Defensively I thought we did very well on Saturday, but when you look at the score line then it doesn't look like we have because we've conceded.

It was just one header that's come back, and they've got in behind us to score - which is going to happen if you don't concentrate for the whole match against a quality side.

So we have to be able to keep switched on, and defend for the full

tonight's match will be any easier than the last, because they will be scrapping for their lives.

They had great win against Tranmere Rovers at the weekend, which was a crucial three points for them so they will be full of confidence going into tonight.

So I am expecting another tough test this evening, because you just don't get easy games in this league, but I'm confident that if we continue to play like we did against Charlton at the weekend then we will continue to pick up points.

And finally, even though Saturday's result will have felt like a defeat for some, it is important that everyone remembers the run we are on at home at the moment, and hopefully that will breed confidence in the players which will translate into a good performance tonight.

Enjoy the game.

TALK OF THE TOWN:

THE BIG D

This time last year **Charlie Austin** was playing part-time football and working with his dad. We caught up with his family to discuss their lad's meteoric rise... →

Q You guys must feel pretty proud of what Charlie has achieved in such a short space of time?

KA: We're very proud parents.

FA: It's all happened so quickly but he's worked hard for it, so he deserves it. He's exceeded our expectations. To get into the team as quickly as he has... when he signed initially we thought he might get the chance to play in the first team after Christmas. But he's been given his opportunity and he's got his goals. We just can't believe it!

Q You're regulars at The County Ground do you go to all the games?

KA: Every game.

FA: Every game without fail.

OA: Even when he was at Poole Town we went every week.

KA: My brother and his son Robert usually come as well, so we travel in numbers!

FA: His sister comes to midweek games as well, so it's all good fun. We've been doing it since he was very young.

KA: I'd say since he was about

eight years old.

OA: You did a lot for him when he was younger, Karen.

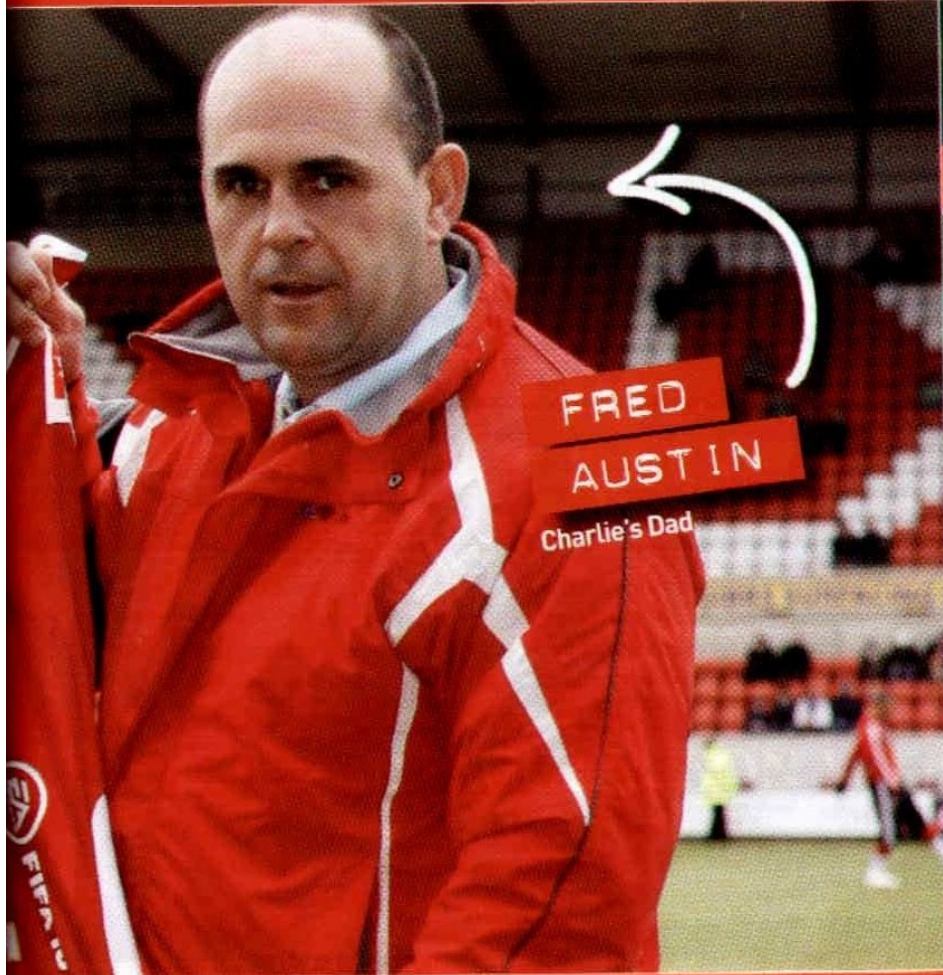
KA: We went to all the games back then, plus there was training during the week when he was at Reading.

FA: We must have racked up some miles over the years, but it's paid off.

KA: It's a dream come true.

Q Are you pleased he ended up at Swindon Town?

OA: When he was down at Poole we assumed he'd sign for Bournemouth. Obviously they were

hit by a transfer embargo and he was a bit down in the dumps when the move didn't go through, so we were all over the moon when Swindon came in for him.

FA: Especially as we know the area. I used to live in Hungerford and used to come and watch Swindon, so it's great. All his mates are Season Ticket holders here too.

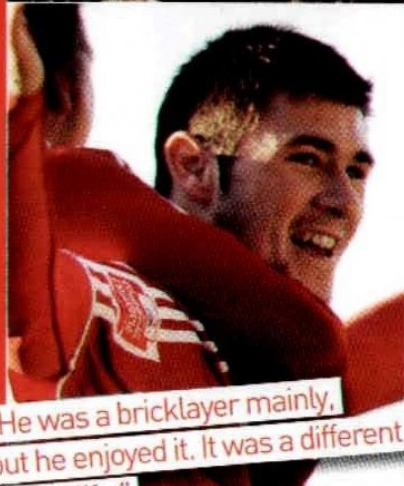
Q So, just to clear it up, Charlie is a Swindon fan?

FA: [laughs] Swindon and Liverpool!

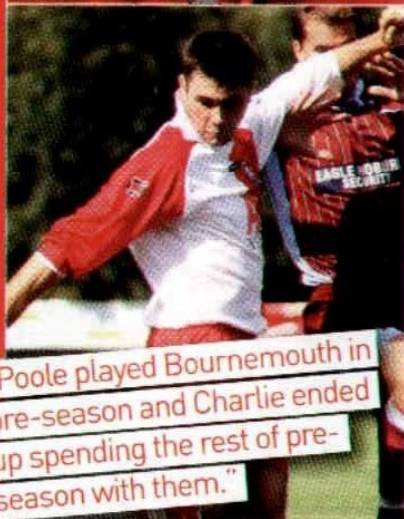
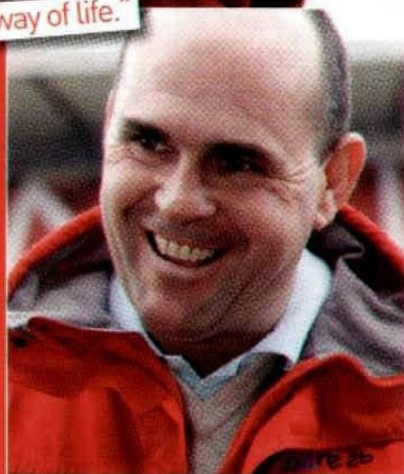
Q Some fans might assume we plucked Charlie from Poole last summer, but he's been on the club's radar for some

time hasn't he? Tell us about his ongoing relationship with the club...

FA: He was at Swindon when he was seven. He was at the School of Excellence playing under Clive Maguire [STFC FITC]. It was around that time he was a mascot for Hungerford veterans at Wembley, so I'm sure Andrew Fitton knew him from an early age as well through his involvement with Hungerford. He came back here when he was 15 when Iffy Onoura was manager. Unfortunately Charlie had problems with his knees - he had a cartilage operation on one of them. Iffy said to give him a ring as soon as he was fit to play again, but Iffy then left the club.

Q He's had other disappointments hasn't he? He started his career on Reading's books but was released: was he disappointed then, and did you have to pick him up after that experience?

FA: He was a bit down for about a year. He started playing football with his mates again, and then he got back into football playing for Kintbury Rangers. He scored a lot of goals for them.

OA: He's always scored goals. He's got a real gift.

FA: And then he went to Hungerford. We then moved down to Poole and he joined them.

Q Andrew Fitton was involved at Hungerford, so did you have an inkling Swindon would be interested again when you heard he was involved at The County Ground as part of the new board?

FA: There was talk of interest when Maurice Malpas was here. I think he was interested in bringing Charlie and Jamie Gosling [Charlie's old team-mate] to the club for pre-season, but nothing happened. We kept asking Charlie if the club had contacted him and he kept saying they hadn't. When we moved to Poole he started playing for them. He had a trial at Bournemouth and they said they'd keep an eye on him. Poole played Bournemouth in pre-season and Charlie ended up spending the rest of pre-season with them.

Q So, had it not been for their transfer embargo, Charlie would be a Bournemouth player?

FA: I think so, yes.

OA: I remember the club told us on a Friday that they'd sign him on the Monday just as soon as the embargo was lifted. We went back on the Monday, then the Tuesday, and they said it was still in place. They gave us our word they'd sign him as soon as it was lifted, but he said, 'no'.

FA: He came back to work with me for a while and then he had a call out of the blue from Swindon, which is when he came here for a week's trial. He scored in his first reserve game at Swansea and signed a week later.

Q So what was he like as a kid?
KA: He was playing as soon as he was walking. He had a

sponge ball he'd kick about.

OA: He was always hyper as well. He loved his football.

Q At what stage did you think he had ability?

FA: When he was younger he was very good. Then he got to about 10 or 11 and he didn't grow. All the other lads shot up and he stayed where he was.

OA: It wasn't until he was 16 that he started to catch up. More recently, I think the labouring work has done him some good. He started building himself up and getting stronger. He's probably still growing now.

FA: The club have recently given him a programme to work on his body strength. He's just started working on that in the gym in the afternoons.

Q When he worked with you, was he frustrated he hadn't made it at that stage?

FA: He was a hard worker. He was up every morning at half five. He'd do a hard day's work and then go for a pint with his mates. He was a bricklayer mainly, but he enjoyed it. It was a different way of life.

OA: I think it helped him as well; it gave him a good grounding. He started putting more effort into his football at that time. Luckily he was playing for a really good Poole side and I think he got a real taste back for wanting to succeed in football.

Q How is he dealing with his new found popularity?

FA: He doesn't say a lot about all that to be honest. I think everything was a bit strange to start with. Training with professional players, talking to the media... It's funny; when he started here he would clean his own boots after training because that's what he was used to. Then one of the young players told him he didn't have to do that anymore. I think the youth team goalkeeper cleans them now, but at first he was happy just doing it himself. Having his kit laid out for him...

KA: I used to clean his boots and his kit! I don't miss doing that!

OA: He talks to us about the games, but not the other stuff. I think he's taking it in his stride. We're just so pleased with what he's achieved.

Q And you?

FA: A lot of people talk to us about him, especially on the building sites. The talk is all football and Charlie now. One of my surveyors is a huge Swindon fan and he loves talking about the club and what Charlie's doing.

OA: I was brought up here and know the area well. We know a lot of people around here and we feel proud to be able to talk about Charlie's achievements.

FA: It's when you read about it him in the paper or online, he's obviously had a lot of coverage recently, it's then you realise how quickly things have changed. I find it quite frightening.

Q Don't forget the Facebook group!

FA: We all know about that as well! I don't think he pays too much attention to the websites.

KA: No.

FA: He reads the papers, but we just try and keep his feet on the ground.

OA: He's a nice lad. He was a very level-headed lad, even at Poole [when scoring all those goals]. Now he has some stability in his life hopefully we'll see the best of him. He has to keep doing it, but I know he'll always try his best.

Q How do you feel when his name's called out as the team line-up is announced, or after he scores?

KA: It's very surreal.

FA: It's great!

OA: It's quite emotional actually.

KA: And we tape the Football League Show and anything that shows the goals.

Q What do you think the coaching staff here has done for Charlie's game?

FA: They get on well and have a good rapport. But I think that's the biggest surprise, how well Charlie's adapted to this level.

OA: It's not just Danny [Wilson], he says the players have been a great help to him.

FA: Especially Billy [Paynter]...

OA: But all of them. He says they all made him feel welcome. It would have been easy for the players to wonder who this kid was, but there was no needle or anything. Charlie's always had a rapport with the managers he's played with, so I think he does the right things.

Q Are you pleased Charlie has signed the extension to his contract?

FA: Yes, that was a big thing for us. When he first came here we knew he'd still be here at Christmas, but beyond that we just didn't know. He could have gone on loan. But the contract gives him security and he can now concentrate on playing football.

Q Do you still watch Poole?

OA: Now and again, but we haven't seen them for ages. We can only make it when Swindon aren't playing and Poole have had a lot of games called off.

KA: I think they were all wearing their Poole Town scarves, but thankfully they play in red and white as well.

KA: ...that's my favourite.

OA: It was a great finish.

FA: And because it was a full house here and the emotion of it...

Q Are you hoping his rise will continue to the extent that you guys can retire?!

FA: We're just happy with him doing what he's doing.

KA: He's always wanted it, so it's just good to see him living his dream.

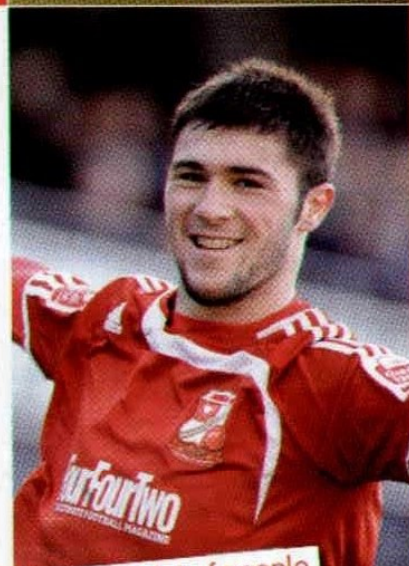
FA: He says every day feels like a new day to him and he loves it. We try and keep on at him as well. We keep telling him that he's got to keep working hard every day.

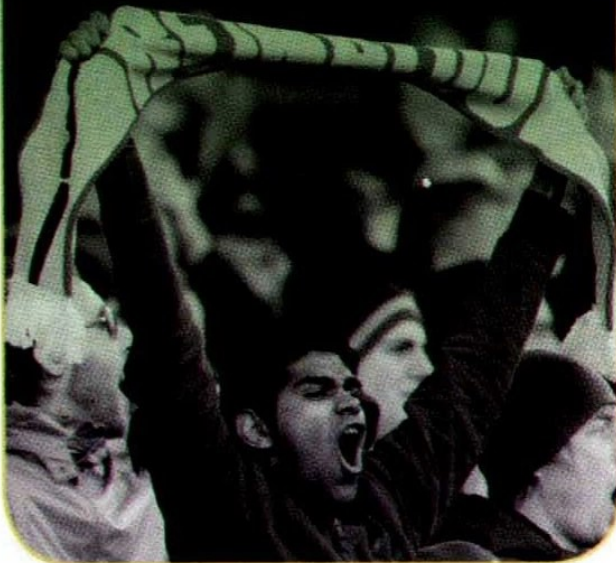

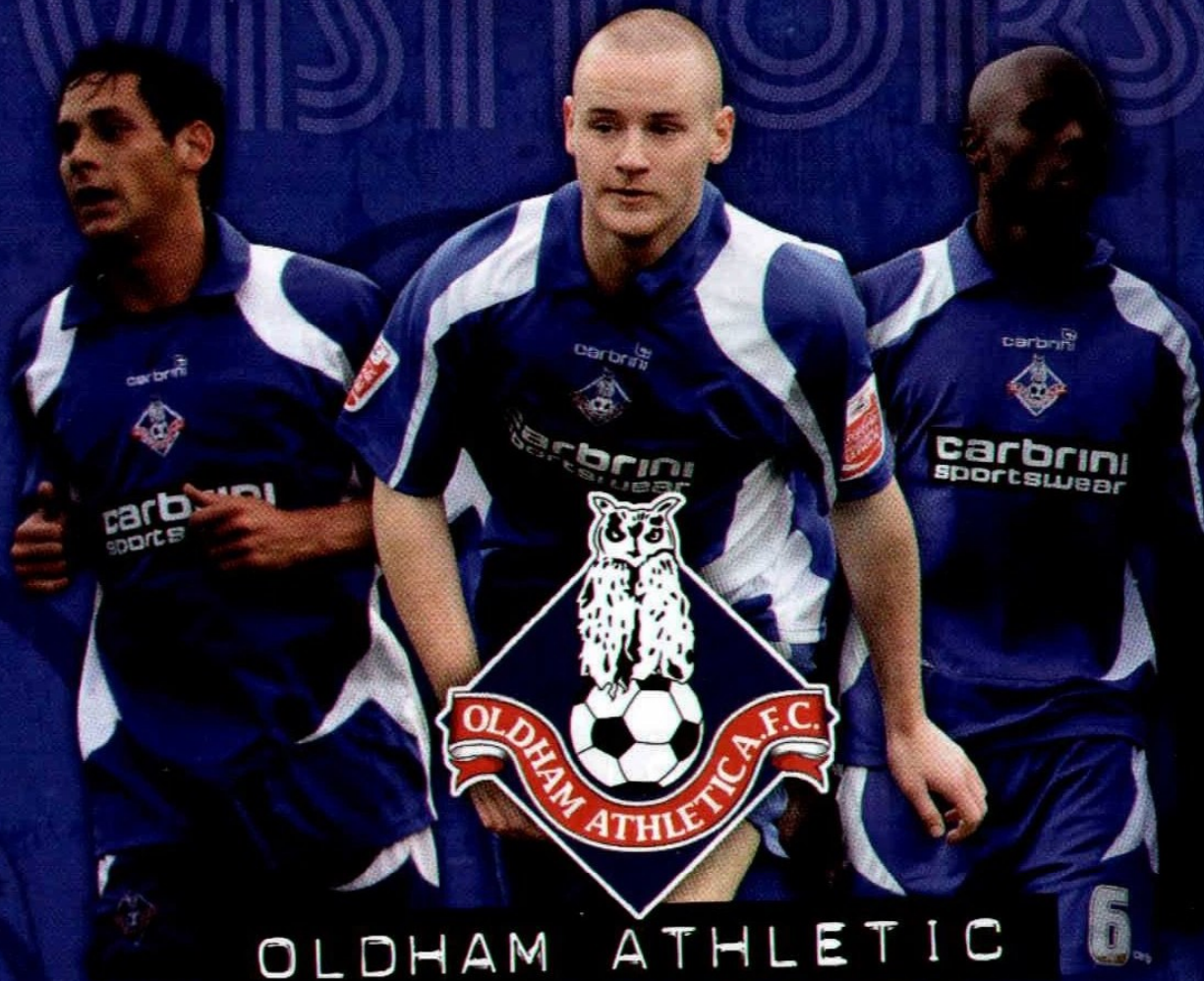

OLDHAM ATHLETIC

Season 2009/2010 has been a largely forgettable one thus far for Oldham Athletic, languishing as they do two points adrift of safety in the League One relegation places.

The campaign got off to a similarly uninspiring start, with Dave Penney's side registering just six points from their opening seven matches, picking up just one victory in the process: a 2-1 win over Leyton Orient in August.

The Latics moved to sign current Town left-back Alan Sheehan on loan in September, and results took an almost instant turn for their better. Having made his debut in the 1-0 defeat to Bristol Rovers at The Memorial Stadium, Sheehan went on to feature in Oldham's best run of form this season, which saw them

claim 14 points from eight League One matches.

This run included impressive wins over MK Dons (2-1) and Brighton & Hove Albion (2-0), as well as a creditable 0-0 away draw against promotion chasing Charlton Athletic, and saw Penney's team storm the top half of the table.

However, a torrid run of form in both November and December saw The Latics plunged into the depths of relegation trouble, having only tasted victory once during that period, with a 2-0 triumph over Exeter City on December 12th.

The turn of the year has done little to change their fortunes, with two defeats and a draw against Hartlepool United, Millwall and

Tranmere Rovers respectively, and with a plethora of re-arranged fixtures making for a hectic schedule over the coming weeks, Penney's side will be hopeful of starting to gain some ground on the sides above them this evening.

Goals have been particularly hard to come by for the visitors, with striker Pawel Abbott top scorer with seven, followed by Keigan Parker and defender Reuben Hazell who have netted just twice apiece.

Penney moved quickly to bolster his squad during the January transfer window, bringing in striker Jason Price and former Town defender Hasney Aljofree, and he will be hoping both can make an immediate impact at The County Ground tonight.

The stopper stands at 6' 3" and commands his area both with his stature and vocally.

Luton-born and bred, he made 81 appearances for the Hatters, 89 League appearances in total including the eight-game spell spent on loan at Gillingham in 2006-2007. He pulled off a string of magnificent saves to win Luton the JPT final at Wembley but following the Hatters relegation into the Blue Square Premier he was allowed to leave by mutual agreement.

Brill had a nervy start to his campaign at Boundary Park but now showing his true colours as an excellent all round goalkeeper.

PARKER

Keigan Parker signed for The Latics last summer on a two-year deal from Huddersfield Town. Parker started his career with



Scottish club St. Johnstone where he gained caps for the Scotland U-21 team.

After 6 seasons he joined Blackpool on a free transfer. Parker was the first signing made by then Blackpool manager, Colin Hendry. With Blackpool, Parker found some consistency chalking up over 100 league appearances for the Seasiders. Parker finished the 2006-2007 season as the club's second-top scorer with 16-goals in all competitions. Surprisingly he was then allowed to join Huddersfield Town on a two-year contract.

Unable reproduce the spectacular form that took Blackpool up he was allowed to join Hartlepool United on loan before moving to Boundary Park.

The Latics Club Captain found himself in the unusual position of being out of contract and released at the end of last season following Latics missing out on a play-off position.

He was re-instated at Boundary Park by new manager Dave Penney during the summer on his arrival in the managerial hot-seat. Captain of the side, he is a giant of a man both on and off the field. His presence on the park can sometimes intimidate younger players.

Gregan's career commenced at Darlington before moving on to play for Preston North End, West Brom and Leeds United before joining The Latics in the winter of 2006 originally on loan from the Yorkshire club. He is also very strong in the air and on the deck; his leadership qualities mean he is very much the experienced pro in the ranks.

PRICE

The rangy striker joined The Latics on loan from Millwall on transfer deadline day last week.

The much-travelled front man is in his second spell with Millwall having spent a period on loan at The Den towards the end of the 2008/9 campaign.

An injury picked up during the Play-Off semi-final first leg against Leeds at The Den deprived him of a second consecutive Play-Off final appearance, having been on the winning side for Doncaster against Leeds the previous year where he

featured against Town midfielder Jonathan Douglas.

Price signed for Millwall on a permanent basis during the close-season having been released by the Yorkshire club. Born in Pontypridd, Price joined Swansea City from non-league side Aberaman in 1995. After spells with Brentford, Tranmere and Hull City he joined Doncaster in 2006, helping them win promotion to the Championship.

TAYLOR

A player well-known to Town fans, Chris Taylor will hope to enjoy a better 90 minutes than on previous visits to The County Ground. The winger has been on the losing side twice with The Latics conceding five and failing to score over their last two visits to SN1.

The winger joined The Latics as a schoolboy and progressed through the ranks to virtually the first name on the teamsheet. He has already clocked up 150 first team games for Athletic (20 goals) at the age of only 22 years.

Oldham have already turned down six figure offers for the talented wide man. Very much an entertainer, the club believe he has a great future in front of him which has been restricted by injury – although he is now back amongst the starting side.

Taylor's last goal this term came from the spot in the 2-2 draw at home to Colchester United at the end of November at Boundary Park.

GAFFER DAVE PENNEY

Dave Penney, born in Wakefield, Yorkshire, on the 17th of August 1964, had a fine playing career before eventually trying his hand at management.

In 2002 Penney hung up his boots to pursue a career in management and he remained at Doncaster taking the managerial job on a full-time basis. After a well-placed finish in his first season, Penney guided Doncaster back into the Football League with victory in the play-off final in the 2002-03 season.

Their stay in Division Two wasn't long though as he managed Doncaster to the Division Two title. Penney left Rovers on 30 August 2006 as he felt he had taken the club as far as he could. He was then appointed manager of Darlington on 30 October 2006.

Darlington just failed to win promotion from League 2 losing out to Rochdale in the play-offs and again in the 2008-9 season. The Quakers were on course for the play-offs before Darlington ran into financial trouble.

On 30 April 2009, Penney resigned from Darlington and was appointed as manager of Oldham Athletic following on from John Sheridan. He will now hope movement in the January transfer window can help lift The Latics away from the League One danger-zone.

Digby, then a youngster at Manchester United, joined the ranks at Boundary Park to gain a taste of life on the first team stage. We caught up with the Sheffield-born stopper for a catch-up ahead of tonight's game.

What do you remember of your time with Oldham? How did the move come about?

Joe Royle was the manager of Oldham at the time and he was going into the Christmas period with only Andy Goram fit. He spoke with Ron Atkinson who was the Manchester United manager at the time and asked if I could go for a month as cover.

My first game was Leeds United away, unfortunately I can't remember the score. I really enjoyed my time there as there was a really good set of lads and I have a lot of time for Joe Royle and Willie Donachie, who was his assistant

Oldham were the first ever Premier League visitors to Swindon Town too weren't they? What do you remember of that night?

John Gorman when he collapsed to his knees in front of the dug-outs when Oldham scored. It was almost the last kick of the game and although it wasn't funny at the time but you had to see it to believe it, it was funny!

You play a lot of masters football these days... where have you been on your travels over the past twelve months or so?

I played in the North West Masters in the summer for Manchester United. We then went out to Asia and played in Vietnam & Kuala Lumpur. I also played with a PFA team in the Hong Kong sevens in May of last year as well as several visits to Ireland to play eleven a side matches with Manchester United old boys again.

I have just received confirmation of United & Liverpool going to play a masters event in Canada next month. As you can see I probably travel the world more now than when I was playing full time.

Have you been following Town's fortunes of late?

Yes, although unfortunately I don't get chance to get to many games as I have two sons playing football and one who plays rugby so I don't get a lot of spare time. It's great to see the Town on the up again, Danny is developing a good team with some excellent individuals.

This is obviously having a great effect on the Town especially seeing a full house like you had against Leeds recently. There's nothing better than a noisy County Ground and the lads served up a perfect performance and result.

Finally, what sort of wash-bag have you got!?

In three years with Preston he made only 20 appearances and spent two loan spells at Bury.

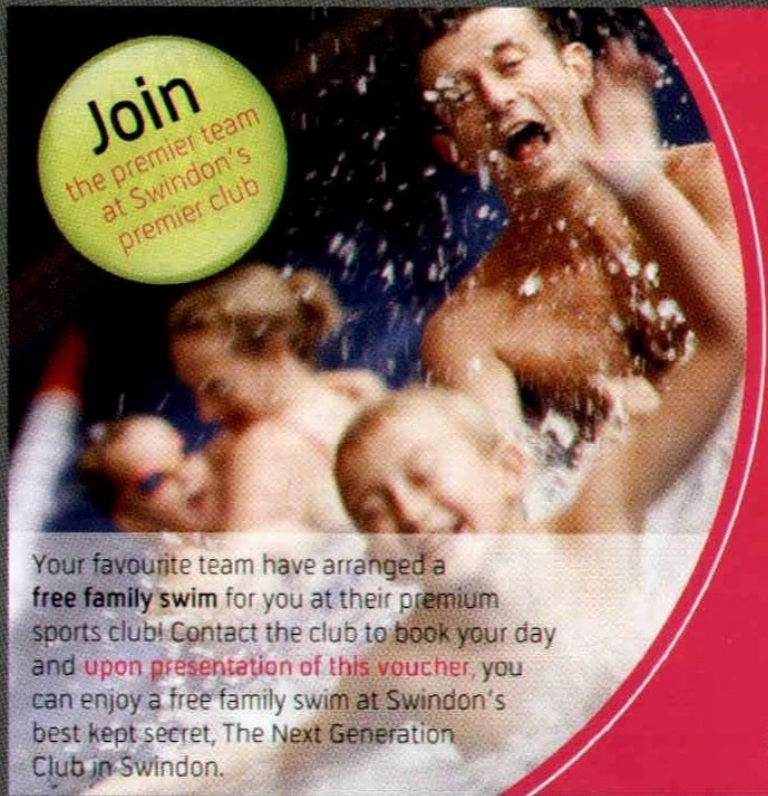

even sing your name now.

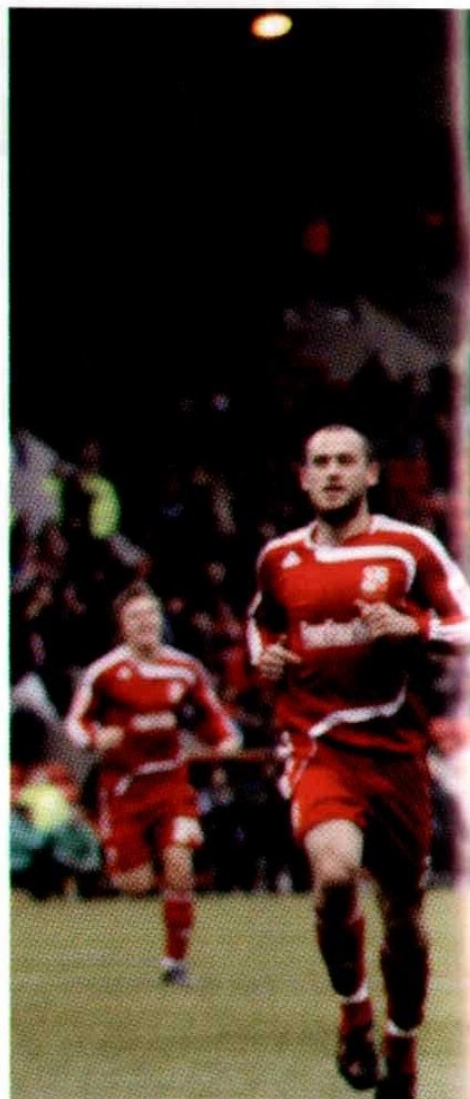

How and when did you join Swindon Town?

I saw the job advertised on the club website, but it was only ten minutes before the deadline for application closed. I managed to send in my CV and soon had an email back saying that my application would be accepted. After meeting the team and a few interviews, I had the job!

What does your role at Swindon involve?

As Events Coordinator I organised a variety of club-related events. My main role includes selling the main function rooms for private parties and meeting companies to discuss functions for charity events, team building or social events. Another part of my role is to come up with bespoke events for the club such as Q&A sessions with the players, sporting dinners, golf days and quiz nights. Once a date for an in-house event has been agreed – I work closely with other areas of the club including the box office, catering, design and media departments to see the event through.

What are your earliest memories of supporting STFC?

Probably being hit in the face by a football whilst sitting in the Town End whilst trying to eat a hot dog! I also remember celebrating the promotion at the end of the 1989/90 season – followed closely by the heartache.

What are the Conferencing facilities like these days at The County Ground?

The Conferencing facilities at The County Ground underwent a full refurbishment programme some 24 months ago. Since then, the club has improved its reputation as an ideal conferencing venue and I believe STFC has been something of a hidden secret when it comes to conferencing.

The club can host meetings from as little as four delegates to up to 300 – and with rates from as little as £14 per day delegate (including lunch), we are now receiving excellent feedback from our clients both regular and new.

What has been your most memorable moment at Swindon?

December was a very busy month and although I didn't get much sleep; it was very rewarding.

There was a Christmas Quiz with 280 people taking part as well as an internal awards night which went down very well.

Later in the month there was a Christmas Panto for the school children of Swindon and also a Christmas party for the Swindon Young Carers which was held in conjunction with BNY Mellon which was fantastic.

The Senior Citizen Christmas lunch went down a storm and there was also a Christmas Carol Service at Christ Church.

Tell us about what events are planned for the future?

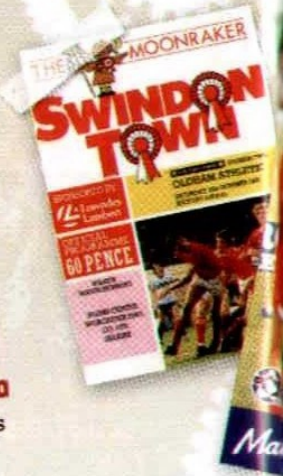

Match Background

With Town kicking off their first ever Premiership season, fingers were crossed for a successful outcome. A 3-1 away defeat at Sheffield United on the opening day was followed by the visit of Oldham four days later, for The County Ground's inaugural top-flight fixture.

A cruel late Paul Bernard goal in the last minute was enough to deny John Gorman's men any reward after two matches of the season.

The reverse fixture in December saw another defeat for Town as Andy Mutch's strike was insufficient to outnumber the two scored by Holden and Redmond.

in the top division with an away defeat at Sheffield United. Days later the County Ground host its first ever Premiership game as Oldham Athletic visit Wiltshire.

Manchester United legend Sir Matt Busby dies in January at the age of 84.

In Scotland a season of turmoil at Celtic Park sees Liam Brady, Lou Macari, and Tommy Burns all handed the reins as manager.

Future Town boss Roy Evans succeeds Graeme Souness as manager of Liverpool, and in May Manchester United midfielder Bryan Robson leaves to become player-manager of Middlesbrough.

Tottenham Hotspur complain of 'an unprecedented punishment' when they are found guilty of paying players illegal loans. They are fined £1.5 million, deducted six points and barred from the FA Cup for a year. The punishment will be severely cut at appeal.

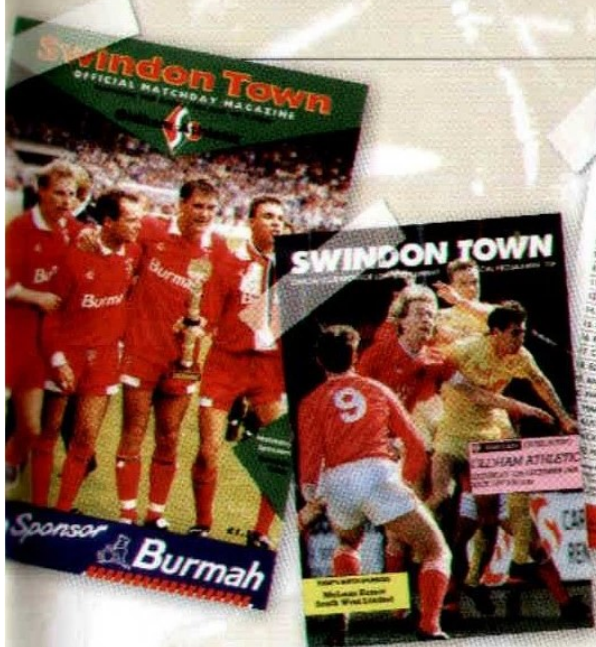

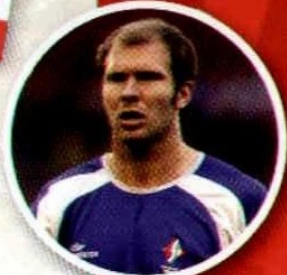

The campaign had included conceding an embarrassing San Marino goal after just eight seconds, and culminated in a 2-0 defeat against Holland in Rotterdam. Taylor is appointed manager of Wolves in April.

Brazil clinch the 1994 World Cup in America, beating Italy on penalties after a 0-0 draw. The tournament is marred when Colombian defender Andres Escobar is shot dead on his return home. Escobar unluckily, and ultimately tragically, scored the own goal that handed the USA the victory which eliminated Colombia.



The World That Season

Boris Yeltsin suspends the Russian parliament in September, resulting in Parliament retaliating by swearing in Alexander Rutkoi as President.

Troops loyal to Yeltsin surround the parliament building. Yeltsin eventually surrenders in October.

Film releases of the year include Quentin Tarantino's 'Pulp Fiction', Frank Darabont's interpretation of Stephen King's book 'The Shawshank Redemption' and Mike Newell's 'Four Weddings and a Funeral'. Newell still seems to find time to play up front for Blackburn Rovers.

Kurt Cobain, lead singer of Seattle grunge band Nirvana kills himself with a shotgun in April.

Season outcome for both clubs

The defeat to Oldham was sadly to become a familiar feeling to Town fans. Six draws produced six points over the first 15 fixtures as we waited until 24th November to record our first win with a 1-0 County Ground win over QPR.

Never off the bottom of the table, we dropped back into Division One in May, with Leeds United rubbing salt into the wound with a 5-0 win at the County Ground on the last day. The heavy

defeat saw Town concede 100 goals over the course of the campaign and finish on 30 points.

Striker Jan Aage Fjortoft had struggled to open his goal scoring account, but finished the season as top scorer on 13 goals in total.

Oldham however fared only slightly better, finishing one place higher at 21st, albeit ten points better off.

The drop awaited both sides.

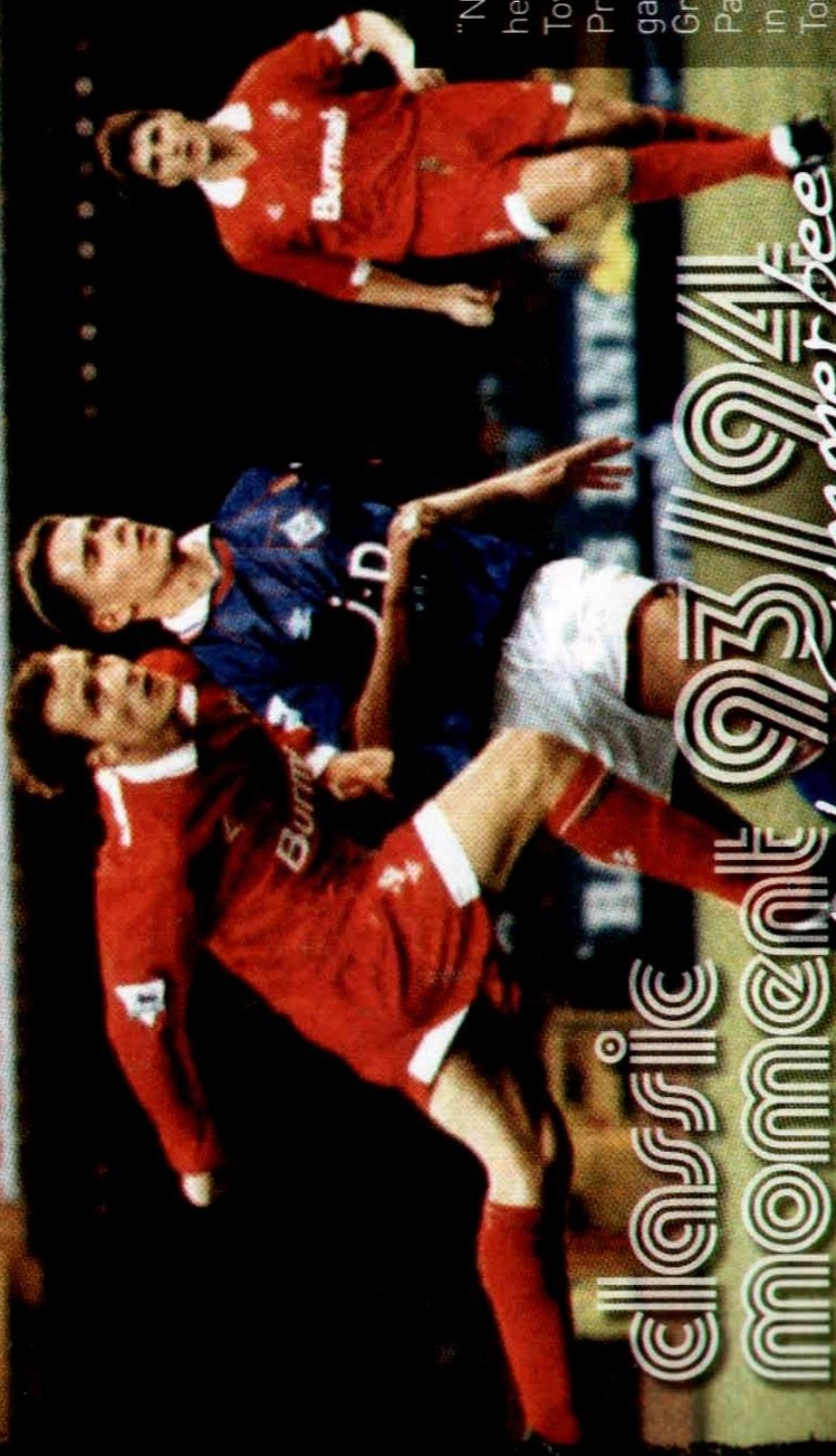

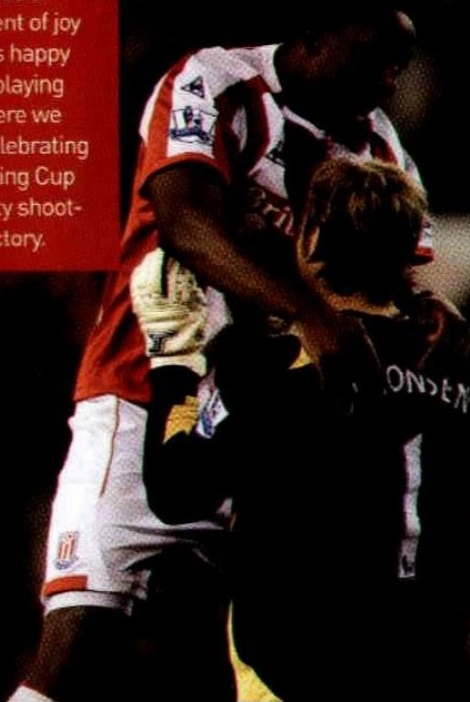

The Irishman looked to have cemented a place in what was a settled, play-off chasing side, until he went down in agony under little or no challenge during the 3-1 home win over Gillingham on January 16th.

The diagnosis was a Grade 2 hamstring tear, which was expected to keep Sheehan out for at least six to eight weeks.

time and I really started to feel part of the side, so hopefully I can get back in the side when I'm over this and get back to the form I was in before."

And the left-back is pleased with his rehabilitation thus far, maintaining a degree of cautious optimism as to when any potential return could take place.

"It's coming on really well, and I'm happy with the way it's going," he said.

"The quote was six weeks but it's going ok at the moment so hopefully it might not take quite that long.

"The thing is with hamstrings you don't want to rush them, because one

It was a desperately disappointing turn of events for the 23-year-old, who admits he was gutted to have sustained the injury just as his Town career seemed to be flourishing.

"When I went down I was absolutely raging, because I knew it wasn't good," he said.

"I felt like I was just starting to show what I was all about and then that comes along and stops it which was really annoying.

"But these things happen and I've had to pick myself up since then and just get on with it."

Despite his obvious frustration at picking up the injury, Sheehan has remained optimistic about his situation, choosing to focus on his initial impact on the side, rather than his time out of it.

"I was really pleased with the way it went after I got here," he said.

"I played a good eight games before the injury and I was looking forward to helping the team push up the table for a while after, which made the injury even more disappointing when it came.

"But you've got to stay positive with stuff like this because these things can get better quicker than you think, and I'll be back out there again soon anyway.

"We went on a good run in that

extra tweak and you're done so I've just got to be patient, but I'm back running with Dick (Mackey) now, and things are going well."

With his initial loan deal expiring in January of this year, Sheehan's living arrangements were far from permanent, but having extended his contract until the end of the season and moved into his own house, he is hopeful a more settled feeling off the pitch will have a positive effect on his form on it.

He said: "I was living with Jonathan Douglas for about a month which was very good, and then with Alan O'Brien for a few days.

"Dougie made me feel very welcome when I first came down here, as has everyone to be fair which was great.

"Obviously I was very grateful for that but I wanted to get somewhere a bit more permanent, especially when I found out I was going to be here until the end of the season.

"So it was good to move into my own place because now I feel a bit more settled and hopefully that'll help me on the pitch when I get back fit."

Sheehan added that, despite his hamstring setback, his time at SN1 has been hugely enjoyable, with The County Ground dressing becoming a place in which he now feels more than comfortable.

"I am really enjoying it here although obviously the injury has put a bit of a dampener on it for the time being," he said.



"But I was happy with the way things were going before that so hopefully I can get back to it as soon as possible.

"I feel nice and settled amongst the squad here now which really helps.

"It's a great bunch of lads and everyone's enjoying themselves on the pitch which makes a massive difference as well.

"I just want to get back fit as soon as possible, get back in the side and help us keep moving up the table."



Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parent-led support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.

The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities - football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 - 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

THE IMPORTANCE OF HYDRATION,
FUELLING AND RE-FUELLING

During exercise, staying hydrated is critical to achieving a strong performance. As you compete, you sweat and the moisture evaporates from your skin, a cooling effect takes place, but fluid lost as sweat needs to be replaced. Too little fluid during exercise can lead to dehydration, while too much can result in over hydration. Both conditions impair your ability to exercise.

During exercise, as muscle glycogen stores start to run dry, glucose from the bloodstream is tapped as a fuel source. Glycogen in the liver is then gradually broken down to help maintain your blood glucose level. But, eventually, liver glycogen stores also get depleted, and blood glucose can't be maintained. At this point, fatigue sets in, and your ability to perform falls off dramatically. Fortunately, research clearly shows that refuelling during exercise can delay the onset of fatigue and extend endurance.

Prior and During Exercise

The players use both water and Powerade seen in the picture to maintain their hydration levels. Also in the picture is a sachet (PSP22 Energy) which is used prior and for some during exercise. This is mixed with water and provides an abundance of carbohydrates (47grams) to the working muscles and liver.

Players also use the GO Gel and Smart 1 products; you may have seen players on the side line during games taking these products. The GO Gel is similar to the PSP22 product, having very high

carbohydrate content. Each handy palm size GO Gel sachet contains 25g of isotonic carbohydrate energy that's enough energy for 20 to 30 minutes of exercise, and because it's isotonic, it will still deliver energy without the need for extra water.

The Smart 1 also has high carb content but has the added stimulus of caffeine. Caffeine is one of the most widely used stimulants in the world, acting as a stimulant on the central nervous system. The common explanation to why endurance is improved with caffeine is that muscle glycogen is spared. Studies suggest that glycogen sparing may occur as a result of caffeine's ability to increase fat availability for energy.

Post Exercise

The inability to adequately replace glycogen stores used up during a workout will compromise performance in subsequent sessions. Post exercise, the first hour is the most important to re-fuel, during this period the body is at its most efficient in absorbing and re-synthesising its energy stores. The optimal post-recovery nutrition would be a drink consisting of carbohydrates and protein. The optimal form of carbohydrate for the recovery drink is glucose and glucose polymers [several glucose molecules], such as maltodextrin. The ideal protein is a protein hydrolysate, such as whey hydrolysate. The protein should also contain all of the essential amino acids, and in particular leucine. The players are provided with PAS recovery drink which contains these products as soon as they walk off the pitch.

Alan Sheehan is now in his fourth week of rehabilitation and is making good progress. He has been running at half-pace, 'enjoying' daily sessions of strengthening work and swimming up to 20 lengths a day at The Nuffield. At the moment he is exactly where he should be given his degree of injury. He too was in the club on Saturday morning and joined Vincent Pericard in doing some running work on the pitch.

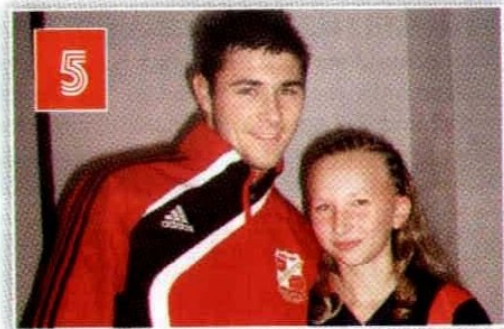
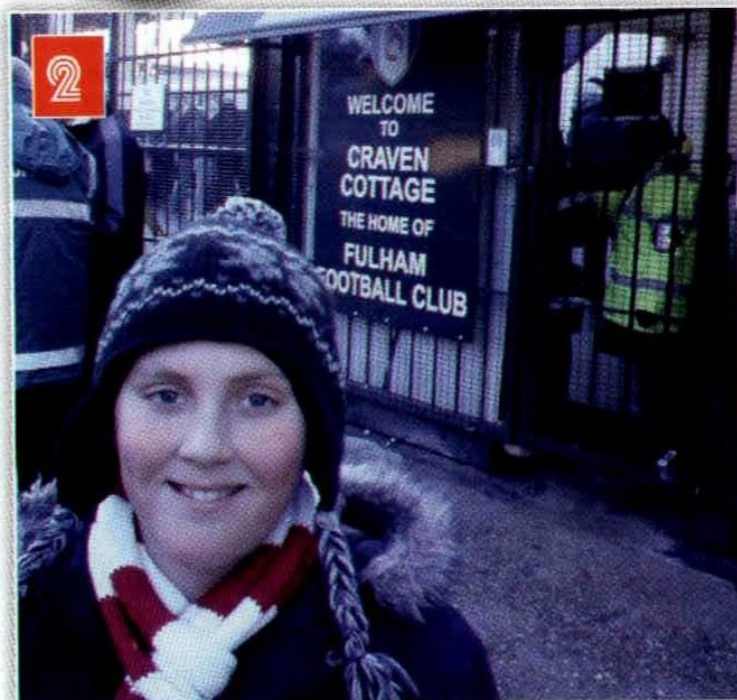

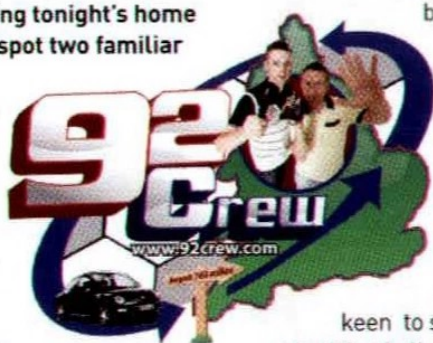
Fans attending tonight's home game may spot two familiar faces at football grounds this season..
