

They are capable of beating anyone in the division but at the same time we're on a good run of form at the moment and are going to take some holding down at home so I'm confident we can do well today.


Finally I have to mention how nice it is for us to be back at home on what is a quality surface here at The County Ground.

Town gear up for cycle challenge!

Swindon Town FC Director Jeremy Wray will join STFC staff to cycle 126 miles to Town's League One fixture at Brighton & Hove Albion next weekend.

Wray and the team will set off from The County Ground in the early hours of Friday 12th March and arrive at Brighton on Saturday 13th March, in time for the 3pm kick-off at The Withdean Stadium.

The cycle will be raising money for the Swindon Down's Syndrome Group who are the club's Charity of the Year for the 2009/10 season.

"This is a very worthwhile cause which I am particularly keen to support," said Wray.

"My daughter, Fayina, was born with Down's Syndrome last year in Swindon, so I have already seen at first hand the tremendous work that this charity does.

"I thought a bike ride to an away fixture would be a fun way to raise money and my aim is to arrive at The Withdean before Billy or Charlie score the first goal."

Nick Watkins (Chief Executive), Adam Wainwright (Marketing and Promotions Executive) and Chris Tanner (Media Manager) will make up the four-man team.

About Swindon Down's Syndrome Group

The Swindon Down's Syndrome Group is a parent led organisation run entirely by volunteers and is affiliated to the Down's Syndrome

Association. The money raised from this cycling feat will all be going towards Speech and Language Therapy.

The Swindon Primary Care Trust provides speech to each child approximately half an hour every term. This is not adequate enough for children with Down's Syndrome so the group decided to set up their own Speech and Language therapy groups. They now provide each child with an hour a week in a fun and relaxing environment. Communication skills affect every aspect of a child's life and can be particularly difficult for children with Down's Syndrome. Early help allows them to develop to their full potential and thus lead to ever increasing independence. This project alone costs the group approximately £17,000 per annum for which they have successfully achieved for nine years now.




From the Boardroom



Captain's notes

ood afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground for this afternoon's League One match against Bristol Rovers.

It will be a tough game for us because Rovers have had a couple of good wins recently against Charlton Athletic and Colchester United, but I'm confident that with the quality we've got in the side, and the run of form we're on at home at the moment we can go out and get a result today.

To their credit I think both teams did their best to play football on it, and in the end the pitch proved to be a bit of a leveller as neither side really did enough to win the game.

However we could have won it late on when Billy Paynter went down for what was a certain penalty in mine, and pretty much everyone else in the ground's opinion but the referee's!

The gaffer was angry afterwards as it had cost us three points, but overall I think we were all pleased with a point from what is a very difficult place to go.

We're expecting a decent sized crowd here today and it will be a pretty good atmosphere I hope. Derby games always produce that sort of thing and it's something you thrive on as a player.

As I said before Rovers are a good side who will take some beating, as they've shown in recent games.

They've got threats all over the pitch that we'll have to be wary of, but so have we and the confidence is high in the squad at the moment with the run of form we're on, so I'm confident we can put on a good performance today and come away with the right result.





hen Steve White was leading the line in Swindon red, derby day usually involved the visit of Oxford United.

These days, with the U's languishing in the Blue Square Premier, the two games against Bristol Rovers are the first to be circled in red at the beginning of the season. White, of course, knows both clubs very well. He spent eight years at Swindon and a further seven (in two spells) for Rovers. Who better then, to explain what it means to play in the derby than White, a man who may have a vested interest in this encounter in future seasons...


How do you see this one going, Steve?

Swindon are fifth, 13 games unbeaten, with eight wins in that run... so they're building a head of steam at exactly the right time. However, I remember watching

Rovers' 3-0 win earlier in the season at the Memorial Stadium. They won the game comfortably, but even then Swindon passed the ball around well – they just couldn't finish it off in the final third. Rovers were dominant, but three months down the line, Swindon are in the top five and even looking at finishing in the top two. That's not a bad position to be in – there are two months to go and it's all to play for.

You've played in countless derbies; does home advantage make a big difference?

I would say it's a big advantage.
I watched Rovers at home against
Stockport on Tuesday night and they won
1-0. They won on Saturday as well, which
is six points from two games. They're
now looking at an outside shot at the
play-offs themselves, and that's down to
their recent home form. Swindon's home
form has also been good, and they'll be
looking to keep that going. Good home
form is the basis of any successful side



Does home advantage bring additional pressure to win the game, though?


Not always, but I think the pressure is on Swindon on Saturday. Rovers are the outsiders to reach the play-offs and they'll be aware that Swindon need the points. Swindon have been excellent at The County Ground, but I think Rovers will give them a tough game. Jo Kuffour, the former Swindon lad, is in good form and Andy Williams alongside him has great pace. Paul Heffernan has come in on loan and he's a wise old head as well, so it's going to be a close game.

You've experienced several promotion pushes, how do you think the Swindon lads will be feeling in the position they're in and with the end of the season in sight?

Danny will benefit from having a mix of youth and experience in his squad at this stage of the year. The older heads will be key, but you need that youthfulness to have the fresh legs and cope with the number of games coming up. The two up front have struck up a great partnership for Danny as well, but for him - his biggest task is keeping everyone fit while keeping the squad on their toes, as well as maintaining a competition for places. There are 14 games to go and Danny will be looking to keep the players sharp in training with short and sharp drills, so they remain sharp on match day. You don't want players with heavy legs on the day of a game.

At the end of February, going into March and April, you want to be involved at the top of the table. I was lucky when I was here; in the five seasons I played for Swindon we were involved at the top end in four of them. We were in three play-off finals, three of which we won, in '87, '90 and '93, so it's a great feeling to be involved at that level. It's what you play for.

Swindon's situation at the

moment actually reminds me of the squad we had in the late 80's and early 90's, a combination of young and old, players between 25 and 29. We knew the game, we knew our colleagues and we knew how to prepare for a Saturday.

Does the build up to a derby differ from a usual game?

The game is whipped up in the build-up to the game a week in

advance. It's a spectacle, it's talked up... as a player you want to come out on top and have the advantage over your rivals. When I was a Town player, Oxford were the main rivals. Rovers weren't in the same league most of the time, but there is a huge expectation from the fans and the media when you play in those kind of games. You look forward to these matches. You know there'll be a big crowd and a good atmosphere and these are the ones you love playing in.



What's your favourite memory of playing in a derby match?

I played for a few clubs in a number of derbies. I played for Luton against Watford at a time when we had the edge over them in the 80's. I played in the Cardiff/ Swansea derby. Some people might say it feels better to score in a derby but as a striker, I think you're expected to score in every game, so it's no different.

Do you think players new to the area have a feeling for how much this game will mean to both sets of fans?


It doesn't matter where the Swindon players are from, they'll know all about the derby and what it means to everyone involved. The players are all in this together and they'll get swept up in it all the build up.

Can you pick a winner this afternoon?

This is a big game. Rovers are more than capable at this level. They will be a match for Swindon. Not only that, but the game is now as important for them as it is Swindon, because Rovers will feel they can sneak into the play-offs. Likewise, Swindon will feel the top two isn't beyond them. It's going to be a hard-fought game, and it could be a defining moment in either club's season.

I think they're a great thing for English football. It means that the teams down to halfway in the table are all involved until the end of the season. Just look at Rovers, they have been inconsistent but they have the chance to make an outside bid at finishing in the top six. That keeps all the teams interested; there's nothing worse than having nothing to play for at the end of a season.









espite being ten points adrift of sixth place, Bristol Rovers retain faint hopes of reaching the League One play-off places.

The Pirates started the season in scintillating form, winning seven of their opening 10 games – a run that included a 3-2 win over Southampton at St Mary's and propelled them into the automatic promotion places.

However, a 5-1 thrashing at the hands of Norwich City at Carrow Road on October 3rd was the catalyst for a run as dismal as the previous had been impressive, with Rovers tasting defeat on five consecutive occasions during that month.

It was from then on that The

Pirates' trademark inconsistency began, with Paul Trollope's side winning three and losing four of their next seven games and in the process drifting further away from the much sought after play-off spots.

Despite this, the period did include a 3-0 victory over Town on December 12th and it will have been the highlight for many Pirates fans who will be hoping their side can do the double over Danny Wilson's side this afternoon.

The turn of the year did little to alter the club's fortunes, with Rovers having picked up just 11 points from their nine games thus far in 2010 – losing 5-0 to Leyton Orient at The Matchroom Stadium in the process.

However recent results have given Pirates fans reason to be optimistic, with consecutive home wins over promotion chasers Charlton Athletic and Colchester United leading the side into today's game full of confidence.

Midfielder Chris Lines currently tops the goal scoring charts for Trollope's side with nine, with former Town striker Jo Kuffour close behind on eight.

Former Bristol City striker Paul Heffernan scored on his debut in the 2-1 win over Charlton earlier this month, and Trollope will be hopeful the on loan Doncaster Rovers front man can build on his impressive start in blue and white this afternoon.

Jeff Hughes signed for Rovers in the summer of 2008, having previously played for Lincoln City and Crystal Palace.



In July 2001, he signed a permanent deal which saw him remain with Grimsby for another three years. A first team regular throughout his time with the Mariners, Stuart made a total of 117 league appearances and scored 10 goals.

Campbell moved to The Memorial Stadium in the summer of 2004 and the holding midfielder also has 15 caps for Scotland at U-21 level to his name.

Midfielder Chris Lines signed his first pro contract in January 2006 and made his first team debut in the 2-1

win against Chester City that month.

Only the form shown by Craig Disley and Stuart Campbell denied him an extended run in the first team in 2006/07, though he proved to be more than capable of challenging for a regular place during a three match run in the side in March.

He was used as a substitute in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Final and was on the bench for the play-off final at Wembley.

The 2007/08 campaign saw Lines appear in 27 league games and he topped that last season, missing just one game as he established himself in the side. An accomplished midfielder, with a deceptive turn of pace, he distributes the ball well and has an eye for goal.

HEFFERNAN

Paul Heffernan joined Bristol Rovers on loan from Coca-Cola Championship side Doncaster Rovers in early February on a one-month loan deal.

The striker signed for Doncaster Rovers in 2005 for £125,000, after then manager Dave Penney signed the Irish striker from Bristol City.

The Dublin-born forward started his career in English football at Notts County back in 1999. Heffernan spent five years at County, where he made 109 appearances. Showing his quality in front of goal, he netted 27 times in those appearances, before he moved to Ashton Gate in 2004. Heffernan spent one season at Bristol City, making 29 appearances and scoring six times for the Robins.

Paul had a hugely impressive 2006/2007 campaign, becoming the Rovers' top scorer, despite spells absent through injury. Heffernan scored a pair of braces during the clash with Crewe Alexandra in the semi-final of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy - before scoring the second goal in the 3-2 victory that won the Rovers their first domestic cup in the club's history.

Heffernan has proven that he is also capable of scoring goals in the Coca-Cola Championship. In his first season in the second tier of English football, Heffernan netted 10 goals making him the Rovers' Golden Boot winner.



GAFFER PAUL TROLLOPE

Paul Trollope was named Bristol Rovers first team coach in November 2005, with responsibility for team training, selection and tactics.

After joining the club in the summer of 2004, the former Swindon player appeared in 30 league games during the 2004/05 campaign. An accomplished central midfield player, he enjoyed a long and successful career which also saw notable spells with Fulham and Derby County.

He has successfully completed his UEFA 'B' and UEFA 'A' coaching badges and took his Pro Licence course this summer.

He enjoyed unprecedented success in his first full season at the helm, when he guided his side to the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Final and play-off success at Wembley, and after last season's 16th place finish in League One, has guided Rovers to safety once again this term.

Trollope has now taken charge of 247 Bristol Rovers games with 95 wins, 91 draws and 61 defeats amongst them.


How many players in the Rovers squad do you know?



There have been some memorable matches in my time as a reporter. Swindon were 4-3 winners at Ashton Gate in 1987 en-route to promotion via the play-offs with Steve White, Jimmy Quinn (2) and Dave Bamber on the scoresheet.

We edged another seven-goalthriller at the start of the 1992/93 campaign, thanks to Shaun Taylor, Dave Mitchell (2) and a penalty from Paul Bodin. Ironically, the team that day only shows only one change from that which beat Leicester at Wembley nine months later - Ross MacLaren for Micky Hazard.

Those nine points were all earned away from The County Ground. In the equivalent fixture here since it was reestablished in 2006, the crowd usually runs into five figures and the Town have had three successive victories - let's hope history repeats itself this afternoon!

Manager Danny Wilson says there's no score to settle following defeat at The Memorial Stadium just before Christmas, 3-0, a desperately disappointing afternoon. Few significant changes in the starting line-up are likely, except perhaps the inclusion of Bolton Wanderers loanee Danny Ward.

I think more fans have commented recently about Ward's contribution than anyone else, not bad for a player originally signed as a striker although it's subsequently emerged that he has occupied the left-wing position earlier in his career. How much longer will he, Simon Ferry, Matt Ritchie and Alan Sheehan be here beyond May. I wonder if they will be here next season, perhaps in the Coca-Cola Championship?

Name: Sean Wood Job Title: Centre of Excellence, Technical Skills Coach Year Joined: August 2009

How and when did you join Swindon Town?

In September 2007 I began working as Under 9's coach at the Centre of Excellence. Last year every Football League club was awarded funding for a technical skills coach to work with children from six to twelve years of age within the Centre of Excellence. I was soon made aware that the role was coming up and after speaking to Centre of Excellence Manager Jeremy Newton, I was offered the job.

What does your role involve?

I coach in the Centre of Excellence with a specific focus on improving the basic technique of players from Under 7's through to Under 12's. This is not done just by simple drills, but it is achieved by putting the players in a game situation where they have to make quick decisions on all aspects of the game.

Describe your average day?

Jeremy Newton (Centre of Excellence Manager), Paul Bodin (Under 18's Manager) and David Byrne (Head of Player Development). Over breakfast we will discuss the day ahead before travelling up to the training ground with the youth team to assist Paul Bodin where I can. After training I head back to the stadium for lunch before spending the afternoon planning the evening's sessions and preparing equipment. Centre of Excellence training starts at 5pm and takes place at Greendown School during the winter months before switching to the training ground during the spring and summer. Centre of Excellence sessions range between one and two hours. Outside of Centre of Excellence training, I also train twice a week with Cirencester Town FC where I play part-time.

Working with the likes of Paul Bodin, Ian Howell and Jeremy Newton over my coaching career has really helped me and hopefully having these experienced role models around me will continue to help my development as a coach.

What is the most pleasing aspect of the job?

When you have coached a young player and then you



hear back from their Manager that they have taken that specific skill or understanding into a match situation. Seeing players progress through the Centre of Excellence is another pleasing part of the job. Hopefully in years to come some of the players that I have coached will make it as professionals at Swindon Town FC or continue to play football at the highest level they can.

In your opinion, who is technically the best player in world football?

I'd probably have to go for David Beckham. His range of passing and crossing ability is exemplary and his efforts in training shine through in matches. Hopefully his work ethic will help England to success this summer at the World Cup!

Paul Miller had equalised Horlock's fifth minute strike before half time, but Shaun Taylor restored our lead before Horlock piled on the ecstasy for the travelling Town

fans. The result left us top of the Division Two table on 20 points from the first eight matches. Rovers were mid-table, but to the satisfaction of both sets of supporters, Bristol City sat in the relegation zone, in danger of dropping into the basement league.

So to February 1996, and with ten minutes to go, a 12th minute Marcus Stewart strike still separated the two teams. Then Wayne Allison glanced home a Jason Drysdale free kick to equalise, before another quality ball from a Drysdale corner (perhaps we should have paid more attention to those rare moments of quality from the defender) resulted in a classic 'Ooh Shaun Taylor' header to clinch the game for Town in the 82nd minute.

Future Town defender Andy Gurney played in both matches for Rovers.


Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parentled support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.

The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities - football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 - 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

FLEXIBILITY AND PNF STRETCHING

lexibility is the range of motion possible around a specific joint or series of articulations. Flexibility is specific to a given joint or movement.

A person may not be able to

function normally if a joint lacks normal movement, thereby increasing the risk of injury. Individuals involved with physical activity that have poor flexibility risks exceeding the extensibility limits of the musculoskeletal unit.

One form of stretching though hardly recognised but regarded as the most effective form of flexibility training is Proprioceptive

Neuromuscular Facilitation (PNF). This type of flexibility exercise combines muscle contraction and relaxation with passive and partner-assisted stretching. For example, in the picture Jonathan Douglas has his foot in his hand while he's stretching his thigh. This looks like a normal passive static stretch; however, once the muscle is pulled just short of discomfort, the thigh muscles are contracted to generate force in an attempt to straighten the leg. The resistance, in this case the hand, stops the leg from straightening and held for 5-10 seconds. The idea is to relax and

then further stretch the thigh by pulling the heel of the foot closer to your bottom and applying resistance once again.

The mechanism for PNF stretching relies effectively on being able to

switch off protective muscle sensors. proprioceptor cells. Within muscle cells are muscle spindles that assess how fast and how far a particular muscle is being stretched. When activated this spindle produces a stretch reflex that results in the muscle contracting to prevent the joint from

overstretching. When the muscle is contracted (whilst in a stretched state) the tension generated by the contraction activates the golgi tendon organ (measures how much tension is being placed on a particular tendon: protects from over stretching). PNF stretching takes advantage of this muscle "vulnerability" by utilising the time immediately after the isometric contraction to train the receptor cells to the new (and hopefully) increased range of motion of the joint. This is what the passive stretch after the contraction achieves.



on the hour when he followed up a Bodin shot which the keeper could only block to the onrushing Broomfield who side footed home from six-yards into an empty net.


Cheltenham had an opportunity to reduce the arrears with a free-kick from the edge of the box and were unfortunate
