I want to start by offering a note of thanks to the supporters who created such a fantastic atmosphere as we overcome a powerful Leeds side on Saturday.

You have been brilliant in your backing for us all season and the size of the crowd and the noise created by the Saints fans at the weekend gave us the platform to produce a brilliant first half display that should have seen us put the game to bed. We had too much movement, too many players causing problems to a Leeds side that I feel are the strongest in League One and they just couldn't handle us.

It was a big disappointment that we only managed to establish a mere one-goal advantage at half time and it meant we needed to produce a controlled performance in the second period as we were aware of the attacking threat they posed. We suppressed them well and the only disappointment was that we didn't make more of the breakaway opportunities when they were throwing men forward.

In the end, no one could argue that we deserved to win the game and the fine victory provides us with a great launch pad for our final twelve League One games, starting tonight against a Swindon Town side who have enjoyed an excellent season under the astute guidance of manager Danny Wilson.

Swindon arrive here on a high after they picked up a fine away win at the weekend and this fixture takes me back to the night when I was stood on the side of the pitch at the County Ground, watching a Southampton side getting outplayed by Swindon back in August.

I had a packed out stand full of expectant Southampton supporters to one side of me that night of me and the truth was the team I sent out for the fixture was not good enough to represent this great club.

Our lack of a pre-season and the fact the squad had lost so many good players led to a display that meant the 1-0 score line at Swindon flattered us more than them. We just weren't ready for action at that point and it showed at the County Ground and I'm sure they will appreciate we have improved substantially since then this evening.

On reflection, the ten point penalty we were trying to wipe out in those first few weeks became an even

more damaging penalty after we picked up just two points from our first five games. In essence, that meant we were 22 points behind the teams we are chasing in the top six now and it has proved to be a massive gap to try and overcome.

However, the players I inherited and the quality of those we have managed to bring in over the last few months means we are in a much stronger position and we can go into our final dozen league games with a genuine ambition of trying to win each and every one of them. It will be a tough task, but I firmly believe it is possible.

We could not have achieved our progress without the financial backing of Markus Liebherr and Nicola Cortese and the players who have worked so hard to get this team winning on a consistent basis and we now have a great base to build on for the future.

The aim for the next campaign will be to build a Championship side whatever division we are in and the only question mark hanging over this team now is whether they can produce match-winning displays away from home as well as here at St. Mary's.

There are still many things to improve at the club, with the development of the training ground due to start shortly and a review of our academy set-up also crucial for our future and it is important for us to be bold in these tough financial times as that will allow us to leap ahead of our rivals.

Everyone can see the shoots of recovery here at Southampton and hopefully we can give another glimpse of that with another home win here this evening.

It feels like every home game is producing our best performance of the season at the moment and hopefully we can continue that trend against Swindon Town tonight.

After the comprehensive five-goal wins against Walsall and Huddersfield in our previous two home fixtures, the manner of our 1-0 victory against promotion chasing Leeds on Saturday left us feeling as if this emerging Saints team had taken another big step forward. The task is clear for Chris Turner's Hartlepool as they enter the final furlongs of this League One season with their survival target in sight.

A lack of consistency has left Turner's men looking over their shoulders at the sides in the bottom four for much of this campaign, but recent wins against Carlisle and Southend have eased some of the pressure that has been building around Victoria Park.

"We have scored seven goals in our last two homes games and performances like that will give the fans a bit of belief," states Turner. "Some of our better performances have been on the road this season, but we will need to win our home games if we are to steer clear of the sides below us.

"This Hartlepool side have performed well in recent weeks against teams high up the table but we just haven't carried the luck you need at times and it means we have been creeping closer to the sides at the bottom end, but I believe we have the squad to get the points we need in the coming weeks."

Former Sheffield Wednesday boss Turner actually holds the title of Director of Sport at Victoria Park, but he has been in charge of first team matters

since the departure of Danny Wilson in December 2008 and his coaching experience will be vital to Hartlepool's survival bid.

He has come under fire from sections of the home support in recent weeks, but he insists he is ready to fight for the Hartlepool cause. "We have come through a tough run of fixtures against the likes of Leeds, Norwich, Huddersfield and Millwall, so we have been up against it in many ways, but we are now playing some of the teams around us and there is no doubt we need the points," he adds.

"I look at the league table and fully appreciate we are getting into a difficult position, but if we reproduce the performances we have put in against the better sides in League One over the last few weeks, that will be enough to get us the points we need against the teams with a little less quality.

"It's all about finding a level of consistency in the remaining games and picking up the points we need as quickly as possible. We will continue to work hard and I'm sure we will be fine."

Hartlepool are due to come to St. Mary's on Tuesday 23rd March, so make sure you are here to cheer on the Saints in what will be our final League One game before our big day out at Wembley.

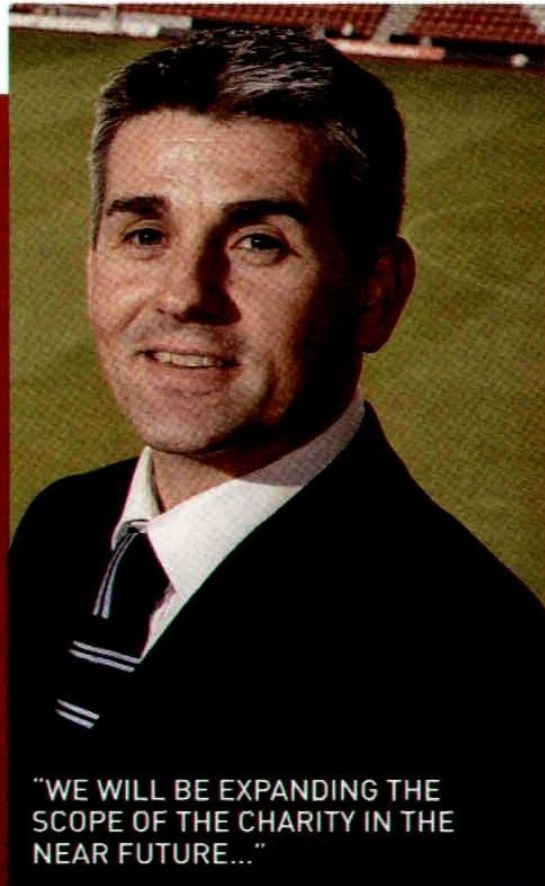

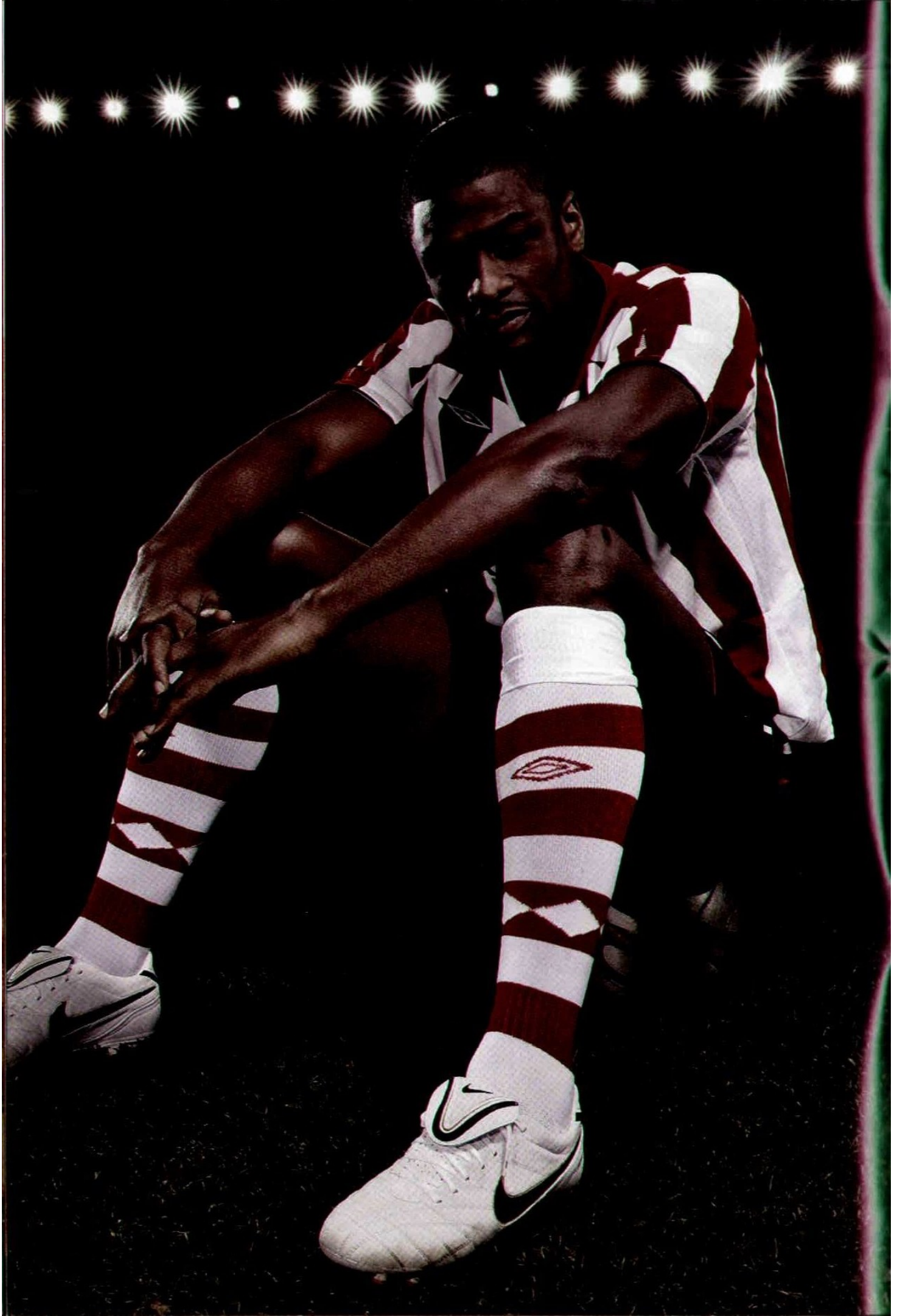

AN INTERVIEW WITH...

RADHI JAIDI

Radhi Jaidi has always regarded Southampton FC's St. Mary's Stadium as a happy hunting ground.

It was at the home of the Saints way back in 2004 that one of the great superstars of Tunisian football made a stunning introduction to the English game.

He'd just completed a move to Sam Allardyce's Bolton Wanderers and capped his debut with a towering performance at the heart of the Trotters defence.

So good was Jaidi's display in a 2-1 win for Bolton that he claimed the bottle of champagne for SKY TV's man of the match.

He hopes to be breaking open the champagne again this May in celebration of Saints clinching a place in the play-offs. The man who is making a big impression at the heart of the Saints defence admits it's a long shot, but he insists: "As long as it remains possible, we'll be going for it.

"We'll know much more after tonight's game with Swindon. Along with last Saturday's match with Leeds, this game is perhaps the most important of the season - one we must win to keep our play-off hopes alive."

Jaidi arrived in England as one of the true giants of African football - capped an extraordinary 105 times by Tunisia and backbone of his club Esperance Sportive's remarkable run of eight successive league title wins between 1997 and 2004. For good measure they weighed in with the African club champions trophy as well.

He captained his country, played in two World Cup finals for them [in Japan 2002 and Germany 2006]

and helped them win the African Nations Cup in 2004.

It explains perhaps why he was so late arriving in English football.

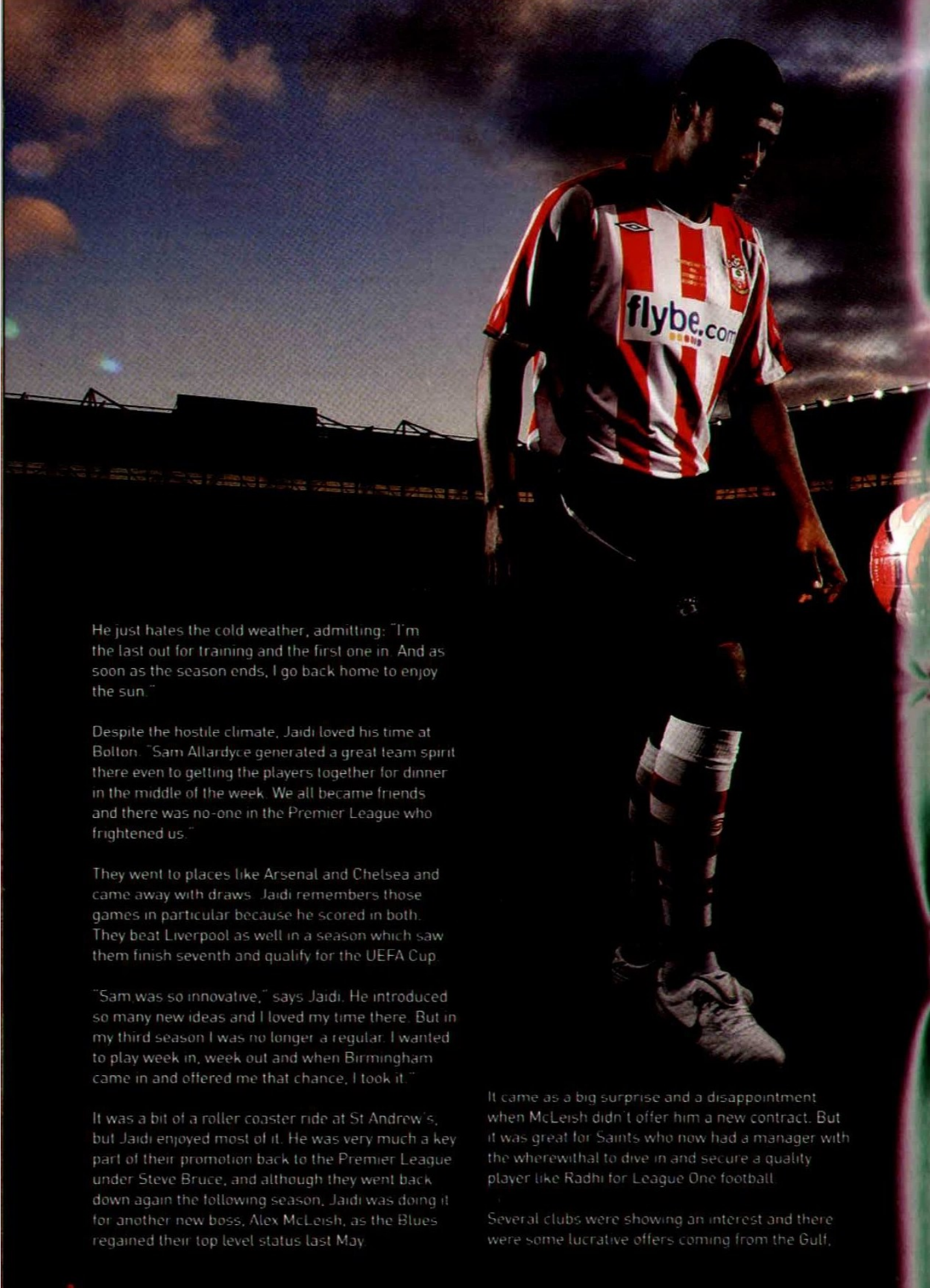
"I was enjoying myself so much in my homeland," he says. "But I had a dream of playing in England and might have arrived sooner. Two years before I joined Bolton, West Ham wanted me, but they got relegated from the Premiership, which was where I wanted to play, so I stayed at home and waited for another chance."

It came from Allardyce who was establishing a united nations of players at Pride Park, among them the sublimely talented Jay-Jay Okocha who went out of his way to help Jaidi acclimatize to life in England. "He was a great friend who helped me learn the language and made it easier for me to settle."

The football came easy but Jaidi says: "I had to learn a new mentality toward football, much different to what I'd been used to in Africa."

The climate proved a shock to the system, too, for big tough guy Jaidi. "I didn't mind playing because I could run and keep warm. But as soon as the final whistle went and I crossed that white line, I was the first into the hot shower."



He just hates the cold weather, admitting: "I'm the last out for training and the first one in. And as soon as the season ends, I go back home to enjoy the sun."

Despite the hostile climate, Jaishi loved his time at Bolton. "Sam Allardyce generated a great team spirit there even to getting the players together for dinner in the middle of the week. We all became friends and there was no-one in the Premier League who frightened us."


They went to places like Arsenal and Chelsea and came away with draws. Jaishi remembers those games in particular because he scored in both. They beat Liverpool as well in a season which saw them finish seventh and qualify for the UEFA Cup.

"Sam was so innovative," says Jaishi. He introduced so many new ideas and I loved my time there. But in my third season I was no longer a regular. I wanted to play week in, week out and when Birmingham came in and offered me that chance, I took it."

It was a bit of a roller coaster ride at St Andrew's, but Jaishi enjoyed most of it. He was very much a key part of their promotion back to the Premier League under Steve Bruce, and although they went back down again the following season, Jaishi was doing it for another new boss, Alex McLeish, as the Blues regained their top level status last May.

It came as a big surprise and a disappointment when McLeish didn't offer him a new contract. But it was great for Saints who now had a manager with the wherewithal to dive in and secure a quality player like Radhi for League One football.

Several clubs were showing an interest and there were some lucrative offers coming from the Gulf.



but Jaidi points out: "I wanted to stay and continue playing in England and was immediately impressed by the Southampton set up. I have no regrets about moving here."

"The new club owner here quickly put down a strong base for the manager to go out and find some quality players. The reason the side has blended together so quickly is because Alan Pardew has brought in quality players. We talk, we have meetings and everyone understands what is expected."

"Now it is quite clear we shouldn't be in this league. We should be higher."

Jaidi's initial move to Southampton was delayed by problems in renewing his work permit, but the minute the giant centre-half arrived on the scene, he plugged what had been a major weakness in the team for quite some time.

Now his partnership in the middle of defence with the Portuguese Under-21 international José Fonte is one of the strong points of the side. Jaidi smiles:

"Me and José get along just fine. There are many complementary things about our partnership."

Radhi, described by his old Bolton manager Allardyce as one of the greater headers of the ball in the game, was born to play at centre half. When he was only ten he was snapped up by Gabes, a third division club in the Tunisian League. And the Tunis-born Jaidi was little of over 15 when they gave him his debut.

A year on he was at Esperence and on the threshold of a career which brought legendary status to a man who has now, voluntarily, given up international football so that he can put his heart and soul into club matters at Southampton where he's on a two-year contract.

"Right now I feel I have some good years in me left," he says. His long term ambitions after hopefully lifting Southampton back on to higher ground, are to coach. "That" he says, "is something I'm hoping to learn here in England."

Right now he's enjoying the warmer climes of Southampton to the likes of Bolton and is planning to move his wife and two children (a girl aged seven and a boy aged three) down to the South Coast soon.

But he admits: "It's still not that warm. I don't think you'll ever catch me in the sea!"

THE HISTORY: Swindon started out in the Southern League at the back end of the 19th century and enjoyed some success as an amateur club before joining the Football League in 1920, beating Luton 9-1 in their first game as a Third Division club.

Their finest hour came in 1969 as they lifted the League Cup with a famous win against mighty Arsenal in the Final and they so nearly made it into the top flight of the English game under the management of Ossie Ardiles in 1990, only for financial irregularities to see them blocked from taking their place in the big time. They belatedly enjoyed one season in the Premier League after promotion via the play-offs in 1993.

RECENT FORM: Danny Wilson's promotion charge appeared to be firmly on track until a dip in form in the last fortnight, with a draw at Leyton Orient followed up by a morale sapping 4-0 home thumping at the hands of Bristol Rovers 10 days ago. Their 2-1 defeat against MK Dons last Tuesday did little to lift spirits.

It would be a shame for Swindon if their promotion hopes floundered at this late stage of the season as they have defied the odds to maintain a push for a top six finish throughout the campaign. Their fine record on home soil has compensated for some frailties on the road, but they remain in the play-off mix with 11 games to go.



HOME COMFORTS: Swindon's County Ground was opened in 1896 and has been home to the Robins ever since, with so many memories housed in a venue that currently has a capacity of around 15,000 spectators.

A record attendance of 32,000 crowd was recorded for an FA Cup tie against Arsenal in 1972 and there are plans in place to redevelop the stadium to ensure it keeps pace with the standards expected in the modern game.



GLEN HODDLE

FORMER GREATS: Glenn Hoddle added a touch of high profile flair to Swindon when he started out his management career at the County Ground in 1991 and he lifted the club from a precarious position on and off the pitch to Premier League promotion in 1993. Hoddle left to take over as Chelsea manager prior to Swindon's solitary season in the top flight.

Among Swindon's legendary players, Don Rogers is assured of place in the club's folklore after his match winning display in the 1969 League Cup Final win, when his two goals were crucial in seeing off Arsenal.

DID YOU KNOW: Swindon played Manchester United in the 1911 Charity Shield match at Stamford Bridge, with some profits from the game donated to the survivors of the Titanic disaster.



INTERVIEW

DANNY WILSON

Swindon manager Danny Wilson has challenged his players to prove they have what it takes to successfully finish off their promotion push in the remaining weeks of this League One season.

An alarming dip in form has undermined the highly promising position the Robins found themselves in a few weeks ago and Wilson admits he is ready to make changes to his team unless he sees an improvement in their performance levels.

"We've had some great performances as a team this season, but we have let our standards drop a little in the last few weeks and that is a disappointment," he said after last Tuesday's 2-1 defeat against the MK Dons did little to placate the Swindon manager following on from his side's 4-0 home defeat against Bristol Rovers a few days before.

"When you don't perform as a team the opposition generally takes advantage and our task is to get back to what we do best. All of us are in this together and there is no point in picking out individuals who may have made mistakes in recent games and point the finger at them.

"The goals we have been giving away have been too soft and that is something we have to eradicate, but I'm sure the lads will work hard to do that because the attitude of the lads here has been first class all season.

"We have a squad of players here who are chomping at the bit to play and these lads will have to take their chances if we decide to make a few changes. Unfortunately, the players I brought in for the MK Dons game did not take their chance, but we have to keep our eyes on the big picture and the reality is we are still in a decent position in the table."

Swindon's promotion hopes are likely to be defined by their next three or four games, with this fixture at St. Mary's Stadium being followed up by clashes with League One promotion favourites Norwich and Leeds.

WHEN YOU DON'T PERFORM AS A TEAM THE OPPOSITION GENERALLY TAKES ADVANTAGE...

It's a run of games that could send a shiver down the spine of Robins boss Wilson, yet he hopes his players are inspired by the challenge. "We are in the middle of a daunting run of fixtures, but we have to look at it as something that excites us," adds the former Sheffield Wednesday manager.

"All you can do is take it one game at a time and see where you are from week to week and we have to make sure we are ready for the obstacles that will be put in front of us over the next few weeks.

"Southampton are a real force at St. Mary's these days and we will need to be at our best against Norwich and Leeds, but we have to go looking for wins at this stage of the season and this team have proved they are capable of matching anyone in League One if we are at our best."

Danny Wilson's calming influence on the touchline is bound to be of benefit to his players as the final chapters of the League One promotion story are penned. Whatever happens from here, this season should be hailed as a triumph for Swindon Town.



SIX PACK

STAR TURN – BILLY PAYNTER BORN: 13.07.84

Swindon's leading marksman will need to keep his fine scoring run going in the final two months of the campaign if the Robins are to break into the top six as his recent dip in form coincided with his loss of form in front of goal.

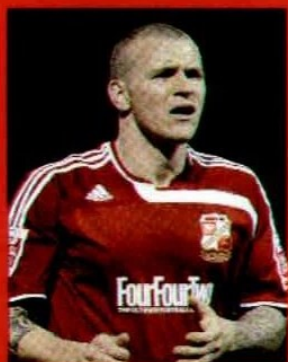
Having already crashed through the 20-goal barrier this season, this former Port Vale, Hull and Southend striker joined Swindon in the summer of 2007 and has led the line well in the years since.



YOUNG GUN – CHARLIE AUSTIN BORN: 05.07.89

This youngster has been creating plenty of headlines at Swindon this season, with his goal scoring performances sparking rumours that several clubs in the leagues above are tracking his progress.

Austin has proved to be a big hit since his summer move from Poole Town, where he had scored a glut of goals that sparked a race for his signature. Danny Wilson will be hoping his rising star can maintain his form for the rest of this season.



PLAY MAKER – JON-PAUL MCGOVERN BORN: 03.10.80

A lively winger who can operate out wide or in a more central role, he is one of the creators in chief in this Swindon side.

Born in Glasgow, he started his career with Celtic before moving south to MK Dons and then Sheffield Wednesday. McGovern will be looking to add a few more goals to his tally before this season is out, with his early efforts against MK Dons and Oldham now something of a distant memory.

WILD CARD – VINCENT PERICARD

BORN: 03.10.82

Pericard played five games for the Saints during a loan spell here in 2008 and he will be keen to make his mark as he returns to the south coast tonight. He certainly has a point to prove after failing to make the most of his first start for Swindon at MK Dons last Tuesday night.

This Cameroon-born striker lists Juventus, Portsmouth and Stoke among his former clubs and since joining Swindon in January, he has been employed as a regular super-sub for boss Danny Wilson.



ONE TO WATCH – SIMON FERRY BORN: 11.01.88

On loan from Celtic for the season, Ferry has benefitted from the first team exposure at Swindon and the expectation is that he will develop into a full Scottish international in the years to come.

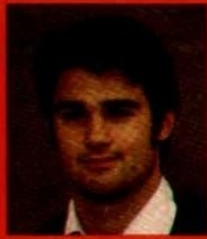
This talented performer has got his name on the score sheet against Tranmere and Stockport this season and boss Wilson is clearly pleased with his contribution. "Simon needed to get some games under his belt because he wasn't playing for Celtic and we have been delighted with what he has given us," says the Robins manager.

LEADING MARKSMAN



Former Southampton striker **PAUL RIDEOUT** was twice Swindon Town's leading marksman. He was Swindon's youngest League player at 16 years 107 days old against Hull City in November 1980 and netted 38 goals in 95 League games for this evening's opponents prior to joining Aston Villa in June 1983.

Moving to Saints from Bari for £350,000 in July 1988, the England U-21 international scored 19 times in 75 First Division outings while at the Dell and had a loan spell back at Swindon before being sold to Notts County for £250,000 in September 1991.

IRISH INTERNATIONAL

Republic of Ireland international midfielder **ALAN MCLOUGHLIN** played for both Swindon Town and Southampton. Following Lou Macari from Manchester United to the County Ground in August 1986, he helped Swindon win promotion in 1986-87, then qualify for the Second Division play-offs in consecutive seasons. He netted 19 goals in 106 League games for this evening's visitors prior to joining Saints for £1,000,000 in December 1990. Scoring once in 24 League outings while at The Dell, he was sold to Portsmouth for £400,000 in February 1992.

ENGLAND INTERNATIONAL

England international central defender **NEIL RUDDOCK** played for both Southampton and Swindon Town. Moving to The Dell from Millwall for £250,000 in February 1989, he appeared for Saints in the 1992 ZDS Cup final and scored nine goals in 107 League games before rejoining Tottenham Hotspur for £750,000 in July 1992.

He joined Swindon from Crystal Palace in August 2001 and netted once in 15 League outings for this evening's opponents. Fellow England internationals Tim Flowers and Mark Walters also played for both clubs, while Glenn Hoddle managed both.



CUP HERO

Ex-Swindon Town midfielder **GLENN COCKERILL** skipped Southampton to the 1992 ZDS Cup final. Moving to Swindon from Lincoln City for £110,000 in December 1979, he scored once in 26 League games for this evening's opponents before rejoining Lincoln for £40,000 in

August 1981. He was Chris Nicholl's first signing at £225,000 in October 1985, starring as Saints were semi-finalists in the FA Cup in 1985-86 and Littlewoods Cup in 1986-87. Netting 32 goals in 287 League outings while at The Dell, he moved to Leyton Orient in December 1993



RECORD TRANSFER

Former Swindon Town winger **TOMMY JENKINS** was once Southampton's most expensive signing. Moving to The Dell from Reading for a then club record £60,000 in December 1969, he was an influential figure as Saints qualified for the UEFA Cup in 1970-71 and netted four goals in 84 First Division outings prior to joining Swindon in November 1972. He was unable to prevent them from being relegated in 1973-74, scoring four times in 100 League games while at the County Ground before reuniting with Jimmy Gabriel at Seattle Sounders in March 1976.

WEMBLEY WINNER



One-time Swindon Town left-back **DAVID PEACH** featured in Southampton's 1976 FA Cup final triumph. The England U-21 international was Lawrie McMenemy's first signing at £50,000 from Gillingham in January 1974. Also starring in Saints' 1977-78 promotion campaign, he was a League Cup finalist in 1979 and netted 34 goals in 224 League games before sold to Swindon for £150,000 in March 1980. He scored twice in 53 League outings prior to joining Orient in March 1982. Former Swindon midfielder Paul Gilchrist also played in Saints' 1976 FA Cup final success.

From Cameroon by Timothy Fisher

I'm on the stands again and it feels good – but not as good as it should.

That's because the stands in question are 3000 miles from St Mary's, in Cameroon's national stadium, and the match against Gabon is a dual-qualifier: for the World Cup and the African Cup of Nations. It's at times like these that my thoughts turn to home. I was born in Africa and arrived in the UK by ship, first setting foot on English soil at Southampton Docks. I settled in Whitchurch in 2004 and soon linked up with fellow-Southampton supporter Geoff Knappett who, now I am back in Africa, keeps me updated with news from the terraces - and stands, even.

It may be 32°C in the stadium but that is not going to stop me wearing my (now ancient) Southampton scarf. The Cameroonians around me understand because Cameroon is football mad and, from Roger Milla to Samuel Eto'o, Cameroon has made its mark on the English, and world, football stages. Discovering what team you support is always an early question when getting to know people here and the answer 'Southampton' leads to mentions of Le Tissier and Beattie, even if the current squad, seldom seen on TV here, is more of a mystery. Close followers of Cameroon's international players remember Lucien Mettomo's brief and undistinguished stint at Southampton in 2007.

Recently, football entered my professional life, too. Issa Hayatou, head of the Cameroon equivalent of the FA, is a Vice-President of FIFA. So the England 2018 World Cup Bid Team came out earlier this season, seeking his support. I hosted an official lunch for them and it occurred to me that I was surrounded by the great and good of the FA. Well, my club was still smarting from having its 10 points deducted and I couldn't pass up the opportunity to ask for those points back (unsuccessfully obviously – I can't work miracles). I think the comment was "they need to sort themselves out." Looking at the club now, I reckon they might just have managed that. It's a good time to be a Saints supporter, wherever you are in the world.



The European diplomatic corps squad lines up, in its Euro-colours and with the Republic of Cameroon-European Friendship Trophy, for a famous 2-1 victory over Cameroon's Ministry of External Relations. Its multi-national membership includes (1) Gonzalo, the Spanish captain; (2) Tim Fisher; (3) French midfielder – nicknamed Zidane, with good reason; (4) goalkeeper, on-loan from Cameroon; and (5) the Russian contingent.

I also discovered that Southampton had put St. Mary's forward as a possible World Cup venue – although a late bid from a League One club already in the FA's bad books was never likely to be accepted. Still, a big bit of me knows we will be back in the Premiership long before 2018 and – who knows? – they might yet need another stadium.

Meanwhile, I'm desperately trying to keep 28 March free, so that I can watch the JPT Final. Having failed to get back to the UK for the occasion – the club may be owned by a Swiss businessman, but that doesn't mean Swiss Air is offering free flights to the Final; and my Arsenal-supporting boss just doesn't understand why I need the leave – I've had to make alternative plans. Thunderstorms permitting, I will get some friends round for a few beers, light up the BBQ, set up the TV and projector and screen the match in our garden.

We may not be there at Wembley but we will be with you in spirit.

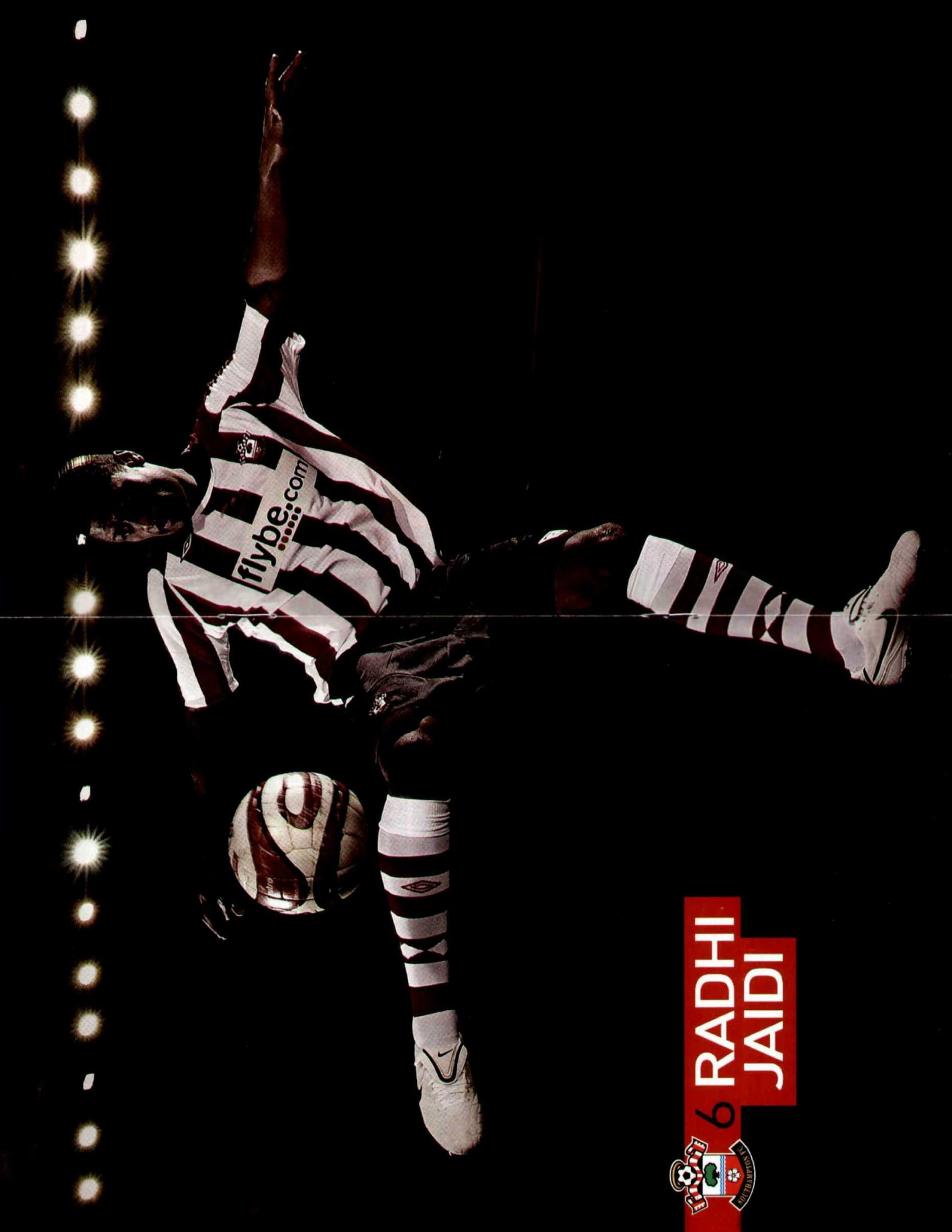

WATCHING BRIEF



Mainly on the Plain

Amid all the tributes, two weeks ago, to Michael Foot, I especially enjoyed the one from a former director of Plymouth Argyle.

He revealed that when Argyle decided to give a 90th birthday present to their longstanding supporter, they registered him with the Football League as a player, allocated him No.90 and included him, throughout the 2003-04 season, in the squad listed in the programme.

How inventive! And what very pleasant reading compared with all the depressing accounts of club directors finding inventive ways of juggling mind-boggling debts. It also reminded us that MPs can be genuine football fans, not just pretending an association so as to advance their street cred'.

Just as Foot stuck with Plymouth, his home-town club, long after he'd been elected for a Welsh constituency, there were other members of the 1945 intake of MPs who famously did the same. Like Harold Wilson, elected to a Liverpool seat but continuing to support his native Huddersfield; and Ian Mikardo, the member for Reading, who writes in his autobiography of pub-meetings of the London section of the Portsmouth Football Supporters' Club - faithful to his upbringing in Portsea.

Not that I knock MPs who switch their loyalties to their constituency team. Some of them become dedicated fans - none more so, surely, than Grimsby MP, Anthony Crosland, who, when Foreign Secretary, had Henry Kissinger's 707 diverted from Heathrow to Lincolnshire, one Saturday morning, so as not to miss Grimsby Town v Gillingham. Even if they don't like football, MPs are, by definition, duty-bound to take an interest in their local club, as with every other business on their block. When we Saints historians put forward Ted Bates for his MBE - which was easy, as we could cite the accolades, at the end of **DELL DIAMOND**, from the game's great and good

Channon - four clubs interested

The local *Gazette* reports how Ted Bates snatched the 15 year-old Channon from Swindon's grasp.

- we had to attach it to the recommendation that already existed, we discovered, in the name of Test MP, Alan Whitehead.

When Alastair Campbell and I were rounding up MPs to contribute to a collection of fans' stories we were assembling for charity, we never approached any members from these parts. But I discovered that Denis Carter, living in Potterne, was a Saints fan and invited him to the launch, where it was fun to watch the contributing members, Gordon Brown included, queuing for the signature of our star guest: Sir Stanley Matthews.

Denis had become Lord Carter of Devizes, a town that you might consider Swindon territory. But Mick Channon - born and bred not far from there and who came within a whisker of signing for Swindon - always describes Salisbury Plain as part of the Saints' natural hinterland. My dad's youngest sister, living on the southern edge of the Plain, married into a family from Warminster. Nearer to Swindon and Bristol than to Southampton, they were nevertheless Saints' fans.

However much you view 'genuine' fans as those who stick to their home-town club - be they MPs or mere mortals - there are plenty of geographical grey areas. Put it this way: born and brought up in Salisbury, I didn't need a Boundary Commission to tell me that my loyalties should be not with the only League club in my county, but with those Saints across the border.

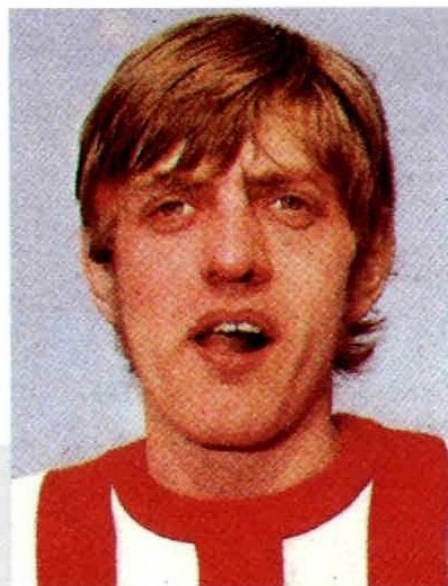

Jinsky – Tommy Jenkins

Tommy Jenkins arrived at The Dell from Reading in December 1969. He departed for Swindon Town in November 1972, after 95 appearances. A winger who could, and did, play on either flank; he could, and did, beat the best defenders the First Division could provide.



He did so with speed, with clever footwork, or both. He astounded teammates, opponents, journalists and spectators alike. So much so, it's something of an injustice that the young Cristiano Ronaldo was never compared unfavourably to him.

He cost Ted Bates £60,000. Although Tommy had just seven months experience in Division Three football (he'd been with Southern League Margate up to the summer of '69) he settled in quickly; proving adept at pulling defences wide and creating space for Ron Davies, Mick Channon and Terry Paine to do their worst.

On the last Tuesday evening of August 1970; at Upton Park; 'Jinsky', as his teammates called him, scored his first goal for Saints, inspiring this purple passage from the Echo's Brian Hayward:

Jenkins ... took possession of the ball just inside the Saints' half, a position that West Ham must surely have regarded as harmless. But nothing was further from the truth.

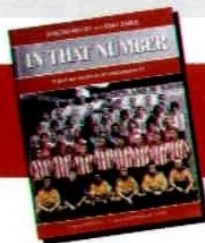
With uncanny control, as if the ball was attached to his boot, Jenkins tricked four men in a bewildering run which left Billy Bonds, Peter Bennett, Alan Stephenson and Bobby Moore [yes, that Bobby Moore] stranded in his wake.

By this time Jenkins had penetrated the West Ham penalty area, and from his left-foot shot the ball seemed simply to burst through Peter Grotier before settling snugly in the back of the net.

Brian Moore of the Times lauded the man and the goal: 'If he stays in the game another 20 years he will never score a better one.' Honest? Yes! Even the Hammers' fans applauded it.

Naturally, Dellites looked forward to more of the same and ... never quite got it. Jinsky threatened much, but his final ball, on the rare occasions he delivered one, was erratic. More often than not he held the ball – interminably – baffling defenders as Davies & co loitered in and around the penalty-box wondering if it was worth the wait. One wag even suggested erecting bus shelters on The Dell's penalty spots.

In November 1972 Bert Head, who had just flogged the inimitable Don Rogers to Crystal Palace, took Tommy to the County Ground for a handsome £50,000. Only Robins' fans will know if they got their money's worth.

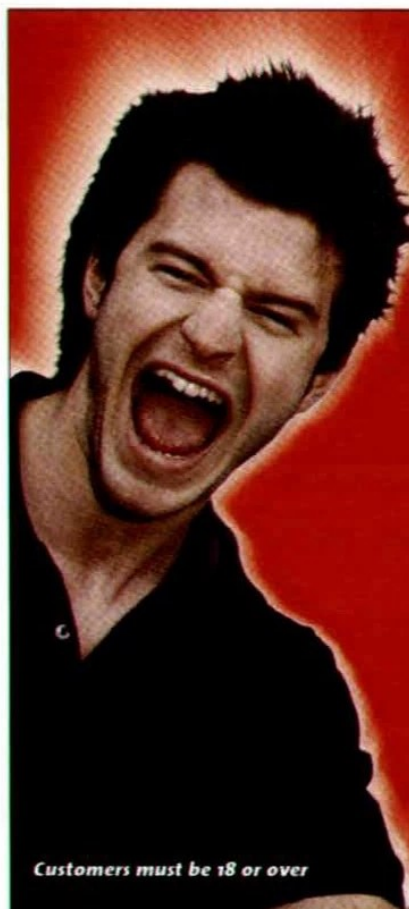

Emergency Procedures

Important announcements will be notified to spectators by means of the public address system.

- The announcement will be preceded by a loud warning signal.
- Listen carefully to the announcement and be ready to respond in a calm and controlled manner.
- Stewards and/or police officers will assist by directing spectators to the nearest safe exit where necessary.
- Please remain calm and keep gangways and exits clear.

Standing in seated areas

The current legislation is very clear. Persistent standing in seated areas is in breach of the Ground Regulations which are required under the Safety Certificate that allows the Club to operate St. Mary's Stadium.

GROUND REGULATION 13 STATES:

Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress. Persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground.

Ground Regulations, including Regulation 13 are posted by each turnstile and ticket holders have made an undertaking to observe this and all other ground regulations when purchasing their tickets.

The reasons for the outlawing of standing in seated areas are clear:

- It is not safe and can lead to a "domino" effect as seat backs provide insufficient support to prevent fans toppling forward.
- It interferes with the enjoyment of other fans who may want to sit down during the game.

The Club recognises that supporters may stand at exciting times of the match but that at all other times, supporters should sit.

The legislation is very clear, so is the view of the regulatory authorities. In the same way that individual drivers cannot opt out of speed restrictions because they do not agree with them, individual fans cannot opt out of legislation (such as that on standing) which relates to football stadia because they believe that legislation to be a departure from tradition.

The authorities have also made it clear that this legislation has now been in place for several years and that supporters have had ample time to adjust their behaviour.

Please observe the Ground Regulations and comply with stewards' requests. We all have a duty to keep St. Mary's Stadium operating within the current legal requirements.

- The use of foul and abusive language (including racial abuse) is in breach of Ground Regulation 9 & 10.
- Smoking is not permitted in the stadium.
- Please leave the stadium and surrounding area quietly after the match.

We remind fans it is a criminal offence to throw any object towards the pitch, track or spectator areas. This could cause serious injury and could also lead to disciplinary action against the Club. We will not tolerate this sort of behaviour and will have no hesitation in banning any supporter found guilty of this.

STADIUM:MK



All you need to know for Saints' League 1 game against MK Dons at the stadium:mk on Saturday 20th March 2009.



BY CAR:

You should probably note that Milton Keynes is based on the American grid pattern, so if you haven't experienced driving on such a system before you are in for an eye-opening experience!



Leave the M1 at junction 13 and take the second exit (A421) which runs parallel with the M1 for a mile before bending left. After 3 miles as you approach a roundabout on the edge of the city take the second exit, this is called H9 Groveway, stay on this road going straight over 4 roundabouts, you will now approach the roundabout over the A5, and the stadium is in front of you slightly to the left, take the second exit. The entrance to the stadium is first left at the traffic lights.

PARKING:

There are 2,000 parking spaces at the stadium priced at £5.00. Don't waste time looking for on-street parking as it basically doesn't exist in Milton Keynes, certainly not in the area of the stadium. There are dozens and dozens of complexes and mini-retail parks scattered throughout the town, some of which are in the vicinity of the stadium. All have a parking provision and are generally free, however, you should probably pop in and buy a chocolate bar to validate the fact you are a "customer" and not just using the car park free of charge whilst you pop off to the footy. . .

BY TRAIN:

The nearest station is Bletchley which is around about two miles away from the stadium. The Club operate a bus service from the station, commencing at 1pm. The cost is £1 each way. Otherwise there is a taxi rank outside the station, or you can embark on the 35-40 minute walk to the stadium. The station is served by trains from London Euston & Birmingham New Street.

PUBS:

Not the sort of trip to get excited about if you enjoy the traditional pre-match beverage, unless an Asda café tickles your fancy. The nearest (in fact only) pub is around 15 minutes away, and by all accounts "The Beacon" isn't much to write home about. There are mixed messages regarding the on-site hotel bar "Red Dot Bar", it appears you may be able to sneak in, but only if you aren't in colours.

TRAVEL CLUB

Coach travel will also be available priced at **£17.50** per person and with a departure time of 10.30am from **St Mary's**, with collections en-route from **Eastleigh** and **Winchester**.

THE STADIUM ITSELF:

After four years at the rather embarrassing National Hockey Stadium, Dons have now moved to a new purpose built stadium on the outskirts of Milton Keynes. At a cost of around £50m, the 22,000 all seated stadium certainly looks a quality one and offers something a little different to other identi-kit stadia. It was in fact designed by the same people as Wembley Stadium (and with MK Dons having an average attendance of around 10,000 there will even be the obligatory 20,000 empty seats!)

Saints' travelling fans will be housed in the North East corner of the stadium, which can accommodate up to 3,000. Those fans who made the trip to MK for the JPT Area Final will know that the facilities are extremely good, offering unrestricted views of the pitch from extra wide and extra comfy seats.

LAST TIME AT STADIUM:MK :

Saints last visit to stadium:MK came just two months ago as the teams squared up in the first leg of the Area Final of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. Michail Antonio's fine strike after 26 minutes was enough to give Saints a vital aggregate lead going into the second leg, despite the late sending off of Morgan Schneiderlin.

The Dons' form has fallen away slightly in recent weeks, something that many may put down to Alan Pardew's side! If recording a resounding 4-1 aggregate victory over Paul Ince's men in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy wasn't enough to dent their play-off ambitions, the signing of Jason Puncheon who was on loan at the Dons at the time, has certainly had an effect. Ince's side have stuttered since, losing out to Carlisle, Millwall and Yeovil, essentially writing off any play-off hopes.

PREDICTION:

Having already returned victorious from the wilderness that is Milton Keynes once this season, Saints will be hoping to go one better than that 1-0 score line. Goals seem to be flowing from everywhere at the moment, and as long as Saints convert the inevitable chances they will create then there is no reason not to expect three valuable points.
