a test than we've had recently, or will have in the next few weeks because at this stage of the season every single team in the league has something to play for, and that's no different with Exeter.


Finally I must say how great it was to see so many supporters turn out to follow us over the Easter Weekend, both at Elland Road and The County Ground.




From the Boardroom

elcome to The County
Ground for tonight's
League One fixture
against Exeter City FC.

We were like a courting couple when this current season was in its infancy, meeting on consecutive Tuesday evenings at St. James Park, so it is good to meet again but this time on home turf. Steve Perryman, Exeter City directors, management, players and supporters, it is our pleasure to open our gates to you this evening. It is also our pleasure to welcome the Sky Sports cameras.



































































Gordon Greer:





This is the fifth year the club have run such games, which not only offer fans a unique chance to play at The County Ground – but also the chance to score in front of the Town End in the famous red and white!


This year there are two 90-minute games, one open for players aged 16 – 30 years old and a veterans' game for players aged 30 and over.

he Robins make their first appearance of the season on TV this evening, with the Sky Sports cameras coming to The County Ground for the first time since September 2007.

West Country rivals Yeovil Town were the visitors that day and boy how things have changed since then.

The match against the Glovers was the first time Town fans set eyes on Jim Little and Best Holdings, the Portuguese consortium who came within a whisker of buying the club before a last-minute amendment forced the deal to collapse. Current Chairman Andrew Fitton then stepped in to

save the club, and the rest, as they say, is history.

On that occasion a single headed goal from veteran striker Lloyd Owusu settled a drab affair in front of just under 7,000 fans. Sky viewers will be hoping for a more entertaining encounter this evening.

The defeat to the Glovers further enhanced the common feeling among Town fans of a certain generation that as rule, the side do not perform particularly well on TV.

However, prior to the visit of Yeovil the team seemed to enjoy playing in front of the cameras, recording three wins in five appearances.


And the last time the club won

promotion came just weeks after a victorious appearance on Sky, as The Robins took all three points from a Sunday lunchtime clash at Lincoln City.

With the League One promotion campaign reaching its finale, no doubt each and every Swindon fan will be hoping it is a good omen. Among the goals for Town at Sincil Bank was debutant Barry Corr, now lining up in the red and white of this evening's visitors.

Looking back further through the TV records, Town made their live TV debut at Crystal Palace in a Southern Area semi-final of the now-defunct Zenith Data Systems Cup in 1990, with Eagles midfielder

The England international later moved to The County Ground on-loan and is not the Mr Gray all Sky viewers will be so used to, but the former manager of the Sierra Leone national side.

Two years later, the BBC came to The County Ground to screen a fifth-round FA Cup tie, with Alan Hansen the star of a now-infamous half-time show.

Town fans had to wait more than three years and 10 appearances before enjoying their first win on live TV, and Glenn Hoddle's side could not have picked a better time to break their duck.

ITV were in town as The Robins hosted Tranmere Rovers in the Division One play-offs, and Hoddle's lads were clearly unfazed by the presence of the cameras as they raced into an early lead, eventually running out 3-1 winners. The margin of victory was unassailable and Town sealed their spot in the final

And the cameras were also present at Wembley two weeks later as Town sealed their first ever promotion to the top flight. With the grand old stadium looking splendid in the May sunshine and packed to the rafters, ITV's Alan Parry described Town's incredible victory forget the sound of Craig Maskell's



A rare highlight as Iffy Onuora's Town suffered relegation from the third tier. On-loan midfielder Neale McDermott and striker Rory Fallon scored to cancel out an early Scott Murray penalty. The win was only the third of the season and ended a run of 12 games without a victory. With Town struggling at the foot of the League One table, Andy King had been replaced by Onoura before Fallon was sold to Swansea as The Robins slipped into League Two.



Town travelled to fellow promotion chasers Lincoln City, with young striker Lukas Jutkiewicz combining superbly with new signing Barry Corr in a new-look front two. Christian Roberts, Lee Peacock and Corr grabbed the goals as Town took all three points. The result was to prove key, with Town only just squeezing into the automatic promotion spots at the end of the campaign.

strike hitting the post and going in.

Every twist and turn of the 4-3 win will have been played over and over again by the 40,000 fans who set the video-recorder before setting off for Wembley, and the sight of Colin Calderwood walking up to the Royal Box is an iconic STFC image.

With the club's stock rising, Town basked in the national spot-light on numerous occasions over the next few years. Premiership clashes with Liverpool, Coventry and Sheffield Wednesday won John Gorman's side many fans and plaudits, but not too many points.

And a League Cup run the following campaign ensured the television viewers would not forget The Robins. With fellow Division One side Bolton the semi-final opponents, ITV screened the first leg live from SN1. Steve McMahon's side enjoyed the semi-final limelight and a Peter Thorne double secured a 2-1 advantage to take north. But unfortunately, despite a bright start at Burnden Park, Bolton overcame the deficit to end Town's dream of a second League Cup final.

As Sky's coverage of the Football League increased, Town featured regularly throughout the late nineties, including a 1-0 away win at Portsmouth under McMahon that saw Town go top of Division One in the autumn of 1997.

But for every golden TV moment, Swindon have also played the fallguy in some terrible TV dramas. Embarrassing home drubbings against lpswich and Cardiff were beamed into lounges across the country around the turn of the century.

And in Swindon's last terrestrial appearance, in 2002, The Robins provided Sunday lunchtime entertainment for the BBC's viewers. However, most Town fans would have been hiding behind the sofa as Andy King's side slipped to an FA Cup defeat at rivals Oxford United.

The last time Town challenged for promotion from League One, Sky screened a frustrating play-off semifinal first leg defeat from The County Ground before the ecstasy and agony of a rain-sodden Withdean Stadium was beamed across the country as Town crashed out of the play-offs to Brighton.

This evening, both sides will be desperate for the points, with Exeter scrapping for survival. Add to that two sides in good form under the guidance of managers with a reputation of playing the game the right way, and Football League fans could be in for a treat tonight.

With Town gunning for automatic promotion everyone at SN1 will be hoping the Sky cameras are not here in the middle of May for the play-offs this season. But hopefully we will not have to wait another two-and-a-half years for our next starring role, and with promotion a real possibility, The Robins could be appearing in a living room near you a whole lot more often next season.







Manager Steve McMahon started in midfield and Jan Aage Fjørtoft scored his last goal for the club before being sold to Middlesborough for a cut-price £1.3 million on deadline-day. Unfortunately the victory proved to be somewhat of a false dawn, and McMahon's side went on to suffer a second-consecutive relegation.





After a superb start to the campaign, Town travelled to Fratton Park to face a Portsmouth side including former Town favorites Fitzroy Simpson and Alan McLoughlin and a young Sammy Igoe. Young goalkeeper Steve Mildenhall made his first start for the club, keeping a rather painful clean sheet, and Scottish striker Chris Hay scored the only goal of the game as The Robins went top of the Division One table. It was to be the peak of a glum campaign however, as Steve McMahon's side went on a dreadful run of three wins in the final 26 league games, eventually finishing 18th.
















xeter City may still be in
a relegation battle, but an

has made them many people's
favourites to avoid the drop to
League Two.

The season began in disappointing fashion for the newly promoted Grecians, recording just two wins from their opening 10 games and looking little more than a relegation certainty.

An improved, yet indifferent run of form led them into the Christmas period, with Grecians fans being put through a rollercoaster of emotion through a contrast of heavy defeats at the hands of Huddersfield Town (4-0) and Walsall (3-0), and convincing wins over Stockport

County [3-1] and Brentford [3-0].

However, a woeful run of form took Tisdale's side through the Christmas and New Year period, registering just nine points from 15 games throughout December, January and February.

Tisdale remained confident however, that with his side often only going down by the odd goal during their dismal run, their luck would soon change and they would move out of the relegation zone that had housed them for so long.

And this belief has been rewarded with some excellent performances and results in recent weeks, not least home victories over play-off hopefuls Bristol Rovers and Colchester United.

Exeter were unbeaten throughout March, and as such go into this

evening's game outside the relegation zone – a position they will be hoping to cement with a result in front of the Sky Sports cameras tonight.

Midfielder Ryan Harley tops the goal scoring charts for the visitors with nine, while former Town striker Barry Corr will be hoping to build on his total of six against his old employers.

Town have faced The Grecians twice already this season, with both matches ending in 1-1 draws.

A last minute Stuart Fleetwood equaliser snatched a point for Exeter in League One in August, and Phil Smith's penalty saving heroics saw Town through to the second round of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy after extra-time.

Paul Jones initially joined Exeter City on loan from Leyton Orient in November 2004, making 23 league appearances before making the move permanent the following year.

Jones was formerly a member of former Exeter boss Alex Inglethorpe's youth team at Orient and progressed via the reserves to make a few substitute appearances on the bench for the Brisbane Road first team.

He made his Grecians debut as a substitute at Dagenham & Redbridge in December 2004 and saved a penalty. He was voted player of the round after the third round FA Cup tie at Manchester United in January 2005. An England National Game XI international, the stopper signed a new three-year deal with the club in January 2008. After missing the first half of the current campaign through injury, he returned to the line-up in December 2009.

GOLBOURNE

Scott Golbourne joined Exeter City from Reading in July 2009. The Bristol-born defender came through the youth system at Bristol City and made 14 appearances before moving to Reading in 2006 for an undisclosed six figure sum.

He has been capped for England at Under-17, Under-18 and Under-19 level and he won the Apprentice of the Year Award in March 2006. He made one Premier League start for the Royals in August 2007 before spending loan spells at Wycombe Wanderers, AFC Bournemouth and Oldham Athletic.

Golbourne was sent off in his cup debut for Exeter in the 5-0 defeat at back in August 2009

5-0 defeat at home to QPR back in August 2009. He has since established himself as a regular in the line-up although is yet to open his goalscoring account.

FRIEND

Barnstaple-born defender George Friend returned to Exeter City on loan from Wolverhampton Wanderers in March 2010 for the rest of the season.

Friend began his career with the Grecians as a youth team player, signing a two-year professional contract in March 2006 and can play left-back or in midfield. By season 2007-08 Friend had established himself as a regular in the Grecians first team and helped them win promotion back to the Football League following a play-off final victory over Cambridge United at Wembley.

After playing in Exeter's opening games of the 2008-09 season, he moved to Wolverhampton Wanderers in September 2008, signing a two-year deal, with the option of a third year, for an initial fee of £400,000.

STEWART

The experienced striker arrived on a free transfer from Yeovil Town in July 2008.

The frontman started his career with Bristol Rovers where he represented England Schoolboys. He made

171 full appearances
for Rovers, scoring a
total of 79 goals, before
transferring to Huddersfield
Town in July 1996 for a fee of


£1.2 million. There, he amassed an impressive 68 goals in 156 full appearances which prompted Ipswich Town to pay £2.3m for his services in February 2000. He went

on to make 81 appearances, scoring 37 goals before moving on to Sunderland for £3.25m. In 2005 Stewart moved to Bristol City

managing five goals in 18 starts for the club, as well as a short loan spell with Preston North End. This term Stewart has scored twice.

CORR



Irish-born striker Barry Corr will be well-known to Town fans after spending a two-season stay at The County Ground.

Corr started 36 matches for The Robins, scoring ten goals but was released in May 2009. He began his career at Leeds United as a trainee, but it was Sheffield Wednesday who gave him his first full professional contract in May 2005. After a loan spell at Bristol City, he joined Swindon on loan in March 2007 and 3 goals in 8 games helped fire Town to promotion from League Two.

An injury-ravaged 2008-09 season restricted him to 14 appearances last season. After a summer switch to Exeter, he has been regularly involved and has six goals and three red cards to his name so far this term.



PAUL TISDALE

Paul Tisdale was appointed manager of Exeter City in June 2006 and since then has become the most successful boss the Grecians have had in their history.

He led the team to the Conference Play off Final at Wembley in his first season (losing to Morecambe 2-1) and again in 2007-08 guiding the team back to the Football League following a 1-0 win against Cambridge United.

Last season he guided the team to automatic promotion to League One, thus achieving back to back promotions as Exeter finished as runners-up.

Tisdale began his playing career as a trainee at Southampton, before senior spells with Bristol City and Exeter City. After time playing in Finland and Greece he was handed a route into coaching thanks to a new programme at the University of Bath and he prolonged his playing career on a part-time basis at Yeovil Town. But a back injury eventually forced him to hang up his boots, paving the way for him to carve out a career in management.

He guided Team Bath to four promotions in seven seasons before signing a new two-year rolling contract with Exeter City in October 2008.



to win, and those games are against Exeter. I hope Swindon get promoted and back in the Championship.


Who do you keep in contact with from your time here?

How and when did you join Swindon Town?

I can still see Paul Bodin's penalty flying into the roof of the net at the far end now—though I thought he'd missed it to start with!

I also remember the 3-0 FA Cup Third Round defeat at Goodison Park at Everton in 1997, but for different reasons – mostly rubbish ones.

What features regularly appear on the club website?

In terms of regular features we've got Gordon Greer's Blog which goes up every Monday where he goes over the weekend's performance and the week ahead, Peter Shirtliff's Diary goes live on a Friday as a retrospective on the past week, Adam Johnson sends in a fan's perspective on the club every Wednesday, and BBC Wiltshire commentator Vic Morgan has just started sending in a weekly blog too, which is excellent.

We also do a comprehensive match preview before every game, and we'll get the pre-match and post-match views of Danny Wilson and a couple of players up before and after ever game as well so it's pretty allencompassing, as it should be.

What's the most satisfying part of your job?

Coming back into the office after a home win is always a pretty good feeling. It makes post-match interviews and write-ups



a lot more enjoyable to do, whereas if the game hasn't gone to plan (which luckily hasn't been the case for much of this season) it's not quite as satisfying!

How do you unwind away from the office?

I'm a half-useful cricketer and that's how I'll be passing my time during the summer when there are no Town games to cover.

If there's any sort of half-decent live music or comedy to be taken in around the area I'll probably go and have a look at that as well.



Town striker Colin Gordon opened the scoring just after the half-hour and the single goal still separated the two teams until 20 minutes to go. Then a certain Martin Ling struck his second goal of the season past Kenny Allen to equalise for the Devonshire side, and with the game in its last minute, player/manager Lou Macari hit our second of the match to give Town three points. 3,118 watched the event.

Five months later we travelled to St. James Park where Town supporters were made to sweat a little less. 19 minutes in Peter Coyne hit the opener, and eight minutes before half-time it was Gordon once more who opened up some breathing space.

Seven minutes before the end Chris Ramsey grabbed Town's third of the game to bring the West Country points back to Swindon.





Season outcome for both clubs

The six points that we earned against Exeter City that season were amongst the record-breaking 102 that Town grabbed that campaign. Unsurprisingly given the points total Town went up as champions, winning promotion with seven games to go against eventual second-placed Chester City, and clinching the championship four games from the end of the season with a draw at Mansfield.

17 club records were set throughout the season, including 32 League wins, just eight defeats, 14 consecutive home victories and six consecutive away triumphs.

Exeter though were to finish in 21st place, with Tony Kellow striking six penalties amongst his total of nine goals to finish top scorer. Martin Ling finished one goal behind.



ormer Crystal Palace and
Reading winger John Salako
was in the press box to watch
Town overcome Tranmere Rovers 3-0
on Monday, and the Sky Sports pundit
was impressed with the home side's
dominant showing.

Speaking shortly after the final whistle the 41-year-old agreed that, although the sides were evenly matched during the opening exchanges, Town's quality shone through as the match developed.

He said: "There was nothing to choose between the sides to start with, but it was a very comfortable win for Swindon in the end.

"Tranmere came and tried to play to their credit, but the own goal put the game right in Swindon's hands, and then Billy Paynter's penalty was game set and match really.

"The second half was all very comfortable, and although Tranmere huffed and puffed it could have been five or six really."

"It was all in second gear really, but it was never going to be 100mph and it didn't have to be.

"Six points from the Easter weekend games against Leeds and Tranmere is job done really and keeps Swindon in contention."

Salako went on to heap praise on a number of Town's star performers, adding that he believes Danny Wilson has built the nucleus of promotion challenging squad.

He said: "Jon Paul McGovern impressed me especially, as he looked very composed on the right hand side.

"Jonathan Douglas was excellent in midfield, and Alan Sheehan was also very good at left-back – he just looks so comfortable in possession which is great to have at this level.

"But Paynter and Austin are the main threat and they look a massive danger all the time

"Paynter looks very bright and Austin just runs and works hard and is a great

finisher, so it's not surprising that they've scored so many goals this season.


And in terms of the race for automatic promotion, Salako could not pick a winner from Town and their main rivals Leeds United, Millwall and Charlton Athletic.

aving made the move south from Anfield in early March, Liverpool loanee Stephen Darby has quickly become a regular fixture in the Town backline, deposing the previously ever-present Kevin Amankwaah at right-back.

And despite admitting to some initial reservations about the move – his first away from Merseyside – he is delighted with the progress of his Town career so far.

"I've enjoyed every minute of it since I came down here," he said.

"There were obviously mixed emotions about coming down here to start with, because I didn't really know what I was coming in to, so I was nervous and excited at the same time."

"Moving into a new environment is always going to make you feel like that, but I'm really pleased with how everything has gone down here and I'm just really enjoying my football."

At 21, Darby adds to the youthful atmosphere among the Town squad, but having the experience of the likes of Jon-Paul McGovern, Jonathan Douglas and Gordon Greer to draw upon is something he is thriving upon – with the latter proving a particularly influential figure.


was fantastic.







SWINDON DOWN'S (SYNDROME GROUP


Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parentled support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.

The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities – football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 – 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

FITNESS TESTING

he fitness-test battery takes into careful consideration several issues regarding exercise testing and the fitness components required to perform successfully during match play.

It is essential that performance on a test imitates the physical performance to the real event as a high correlation between both determines the validity of a test.

Validity refers to how well the test measures the component it was intended to measure. A test battery must be relevant to the athlete's sport (content validity) in that it must reflect the demands of the sport. Furthermore, each test should be specific to the demands of the sport by addressing the performance capabilities of the muscle groups and energy systems actually involved in the sport.

Before drawing a conclusion on the performance of field tests the reliability of the data must be considered. A reliable test will consistently provide the same information about a person if the ability of the subject being tested has not changed.

Football can be classified as an aerobic or endurance sport encompassing short periods of intense anaerobic activity throughout the ninety minutes of a game. The physiological demand of soccer requires players to be competent in several aspects of fitness. These include aerobic and anaerobic endurance, muscle strength, speed and agility.

These fitness aspects determine the tests prescribed here at Swindon which include the Yo-Yo Intermittent Endurance test (aerobic), anaerobic endurance repeated sprint test, 5 and 15 metre sprint test, one repetition maximum squat (leg strength) and a variation of the Agility T test incorporating left and right hand turns during forward sprinting.

Such fitness tests are prescribed prior to pre-season, the last week of pre-season training, midway through the season and at the end of the season.



"It was an emotional week for all the lads, none more so than the lads who didn't get offered a pro contract, but they played with spirit, determination


