# THE BIG ID

With a combined 70 years experience of playing and coaching in and around Swindon, we caught up with four members of the successful Swindon Town Football in the Community Trust... →

**Q** What was your first involvement with Swindon Town Football Club?

**LS:** I came up through the Centre of Excellence to play for the Youth Team and after being released, I joined the Football in the Community department.

**CM:** After several years as a social worker, I joined the FITC

scheme in 1995.

**SH:** My first involvement with the club, aside from being a fan, was in 1993 when I spent five years working alongside Leigh Barnard. Now I manage the Soccer Centres.

**JH:** I joined the club in 1990 as a player at Under 14's level and played for the youth team and reserves before being released. I played for a

few non-league clubs such as Bath City and Forest Green Rovers and joined the staff here in the mid-nineties.

**Q** How strong is your current working relationship with STFC?

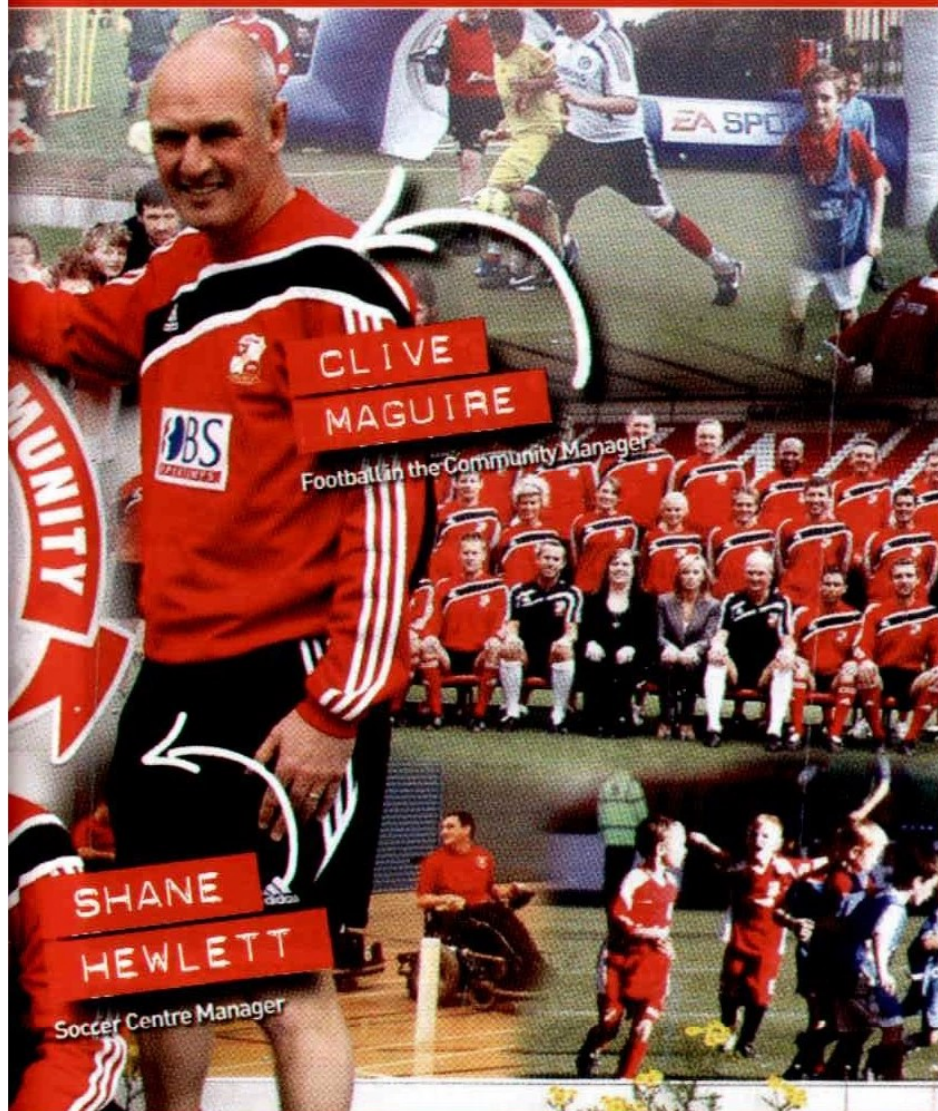
**CM:** It's as good as it has been in my time here; there is a lot more cohesion

between Football in the Community and the Football Club – which is fantastic. The regular meetings we have with Nick Watkins (Chief Executive) are a key part of that.

**SH:** A lot of joint initiatives have been put on over the last few seasons. Examples of this have been the Armed Forces Day against Bristol Rovers, the Race to 6K Season Ticket campaign and Education Weeks.

**JH:** The club has a real community focus and that's important for us as a department as well as the football club itself.

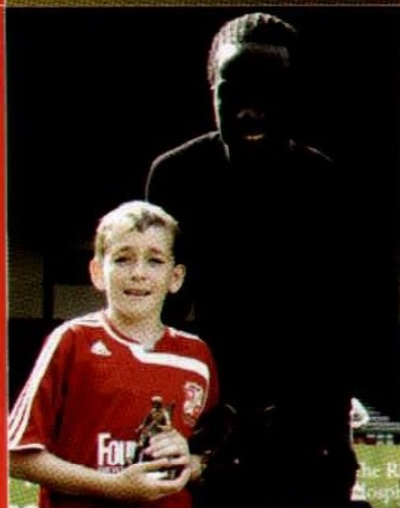
**Q** Have you seen a rise in the number of children wearing Town shirts whilst being coached by STFC Football in the Community?

**LS:** Definitely... a lot of the kids attending our courses now have Town shirts. A few years ago you wouldn't have seen too many around but now even kids in the Mini Soccer age-groups have little Mini Kits!

**JH:** Over the last few years there has been a noticeable increase.

**LS:** This season is the best kit we have had in recent years which encourages people to buy it. →

**CM:** These days you see kids walking around with 'Austin' and 'Paynter' on their backs rather than the Chelsea or Manchester United shirts we used to see.

**Q** How much competition is there around in terms of other organisations running coaching courses for children? Do Premier League clubs try and encourage Swindon youngsters on their own courses?

**MA:** We do have competition, that's true. For example Arsenal, Reading and Tottenham Hotspur all come and run an occasional holiday course in the area. Manchester United bring their roadshow to Town sometimes too.

**SH:** It's down to the quality of the coaching, parents know what their children get when they come to STFC Football in the Community. Other clubs run roadshows, but this is our Town and we are proud of it.

**JH:** Another important factor is the ratio of children to coaches. Other organisations, not necessarily linked to clubs, do run holiday courses and they have one coach per 25 to 30 kids. On our courses we have two coaches per 16 children. That's a big reason why our courses have been so successful.

**Q** What are the other differences between the STFC Football in the Community Holiday Courses and those of 'the rivals'?

**CM:** Children attending our courses are often Town Season Ticket Holders along with their family so there is a real family atmosphere.

**JH:** Our holiday coaching courses include visits to The County Ground and a ground tour. Children arrive at the club, meet members of the first team squad during the coaching weeks and have a really good experience. Other Premier League centres may feature their manager or a player on a promotional flyer, but that's as close as the children may get to meeting their heroes.

**Q** Who have been the best player ambassadors you have worked with during your time at Swindon Town Football

in the Community?

**LS:** Lilian Nalis was just fantastic...

**SH:** Lilian. He went into Red Oaks as part of an education week and spent time teaching the children French, which was superb.

**JH:** Sammy Parkin was excellent

**CM:** Sam Parkin was good, Stefani Miglioranza was superb when he was here, too.

**JH:** Craig Easton is the best there is at the moment. He is the player ambassador for the scheme at the moment and he actually asks us to get involved which is great to hear.

**CM:** Michael Pook was really good for us as well.

**JH:** The nice thing about 'Pooky' is that he actually attended one of our courses as a kid and we saw him progress right through the youth system to the first team.

**Q** How have things changed over the past ten years for you?

**CM:** The changes have been huge. We are always looking to improve. We now have nine full-time staff and 60 part-time coaches. The development has been colossal.

**JH:** We had 85 children on our first ever holiday course, which was Whitsun in 1996. Now we are coaching 2,000 children per week across the different projects that are being run. Things are a lot more diverse now. We are coaching children from three-years old and running schemes for 75-year olds!

**Q** Can you explain a bit more about the Extra-Time project?

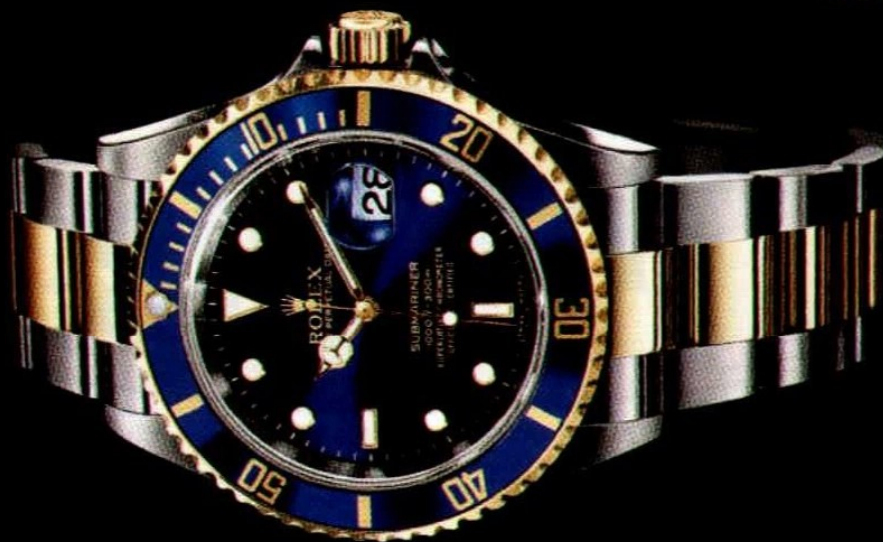
**JH:** It's a weekly activity session for over 60's. A lot of feedback we got from those that take part was that once you 'finish exercise' at 45-years old or so there isn't a lot else to get involved with. The Extra-Time scheme offers people the chance to come back into a group environment and have a good time.

**LS:** I did a cricket session a few weeks back and it was great. We did a little warm-up and then had a match... the participants are competitive but it is a social event as well as sport.

group too and this week we brought the two groups together for the first time with ballroom dancing! It was like a school disco situation again with plenty of enjoyment and laughter. That's all part of our community scheme which is really special.

### **Q** What are your proudest moments of working with STFC Football in the Community?

**CM:** The Zambia trip was phenomenal but I am also proud, with my social work background, of the work we do with the disabled. The various disability projects we run are going really well.

**LS:** Week on week working with the youngsters in the Tiny Tots scheme is great and it's fantastic to see their progression. I was also fortunate to go on the Zambia trip and that was a real eye-opener.

**SH:** The Armed Forces Day is probably my proudest moment. It was a real team effort from everyone involved at the club and it raised a lot of money for excellent charities. Our girls programme is also going really well and has come a long way in a short space of time.

**JH:** When I started we were working from a maintenance shed underneath one of the stands without windows! Now we have a good-sized community scheme which is diverse and is delivered to over 2,000 children per week.

### **Q** How close are the Football in the Community links with the club's Centre of Excellence?

**JH:** In an audit carried out last year, around 75% of the children within the STFC Centre of Excellence had at one stage had some involvement with STFC Football in the Community.

**SH:** There are pathways for children to progress and Jeremy Newton and other members of the Centre of Excellence staff often come out to watch sessions. We offer structured coaching sessions, although the youth set-up at the club are aware of the players we have coming through.

### **Q** STFC Football in the Community helps promote the club and awareness of

### the matches too doesn't it?

**SH:** Helping create fans for the future is just as important as developing players for the future.

**LS:** It's great to be able to walk around the ground on a matchday and see children and teenagers who have attended courses but are now regular supporters.

**JH:** The Under-10's going free scheme has been a real success and for an Adult to be able to bring two or three kids along to the game for £20 then that represents tremendous value for money.

**CM:** It's really noticeable when we run courses and we have games on during that period, you see families at the ground and that aspect has really picked up over the last few years.

### **Q** What are the aims of STFC Football in the Community for the future?

**CM:** To keep improving because to be the best at what we do is a real motivating factor. The likes of Charlton Athletic and Norwich City have huge schemes, but for a club of Swindon's size - we do well and there are some great lads that work with us.

**JH:** Our long-term aim is to have our own facility. To have an indoor community centre at The County Ground as part of the redevelopment would really enhance what we do. When the weather is bad there is a significant impact on our coaching courses - a community football hub for the Town would be fantastic.

### **Q** Where do you think the season will end?

**LS:** Hopefully Wembley with a Play-Off victory. I think Huddersfield will beat Millwall and we will beat Charlton to get to the final.

**CM:** I'd take Leeds United in the Play-Off final; that would be a fantastic finish to the season.

**SH:** I'm with 'Sharpys' on this, I think we will have Charlton in the semi's and I think we can beat them. Huddersfield could beat Millwall over two legs and I think we could come out on top in the final.

**JH:** I'll say the Play-Offs and I think we will beat Millwall in the final.

**A**s had Walsall – the last visitors to The County Ground – Brentford have little more than pride to play for going into today's clash.

The Bees currently sit in 10th position in League One, but having not tasted defeat in 11 games, will provide a stiff test for Danny Wilson's side this afternoon.

Having been promoted as League Two Champions last season, a comfortable mid-table finish will be considered an excellent achievement for manager Andy Scott.

The season started with much promise for Brentford, as they went unbeaten in their first five games – a run which included an impressive

2-1 win over recently confirmed Champions Norwich City.

However, just two wins from the following 13 games brought Bees fans back down to earth with a bump, and illustrated to Scott just how tough League One is.

It has been an undeniably successful season for the Bees however, and they will be hoping to end it on a high and take some momentum into the next campaign – starting with a win today.

Charlie MacDonald tops the goal scoring charts for today's visitors, with 16 to his name so far, with Myles Weston and veteran Carl Cort not far behind on 10 and seven respectively.

The last meeting between the sides ended in a 3-2 victory for Town, courtesy of former loanees Alex Revell (2) and Ben Hutchinson.

## SZCZESNY

The 6' 5" goalkeeper is on a season-long loan from Arsenal and has international experience, having made his full International debut for Poland against Canada.

Wojciech says he is ready for the Arsenal first team – and you wouldn't bet against him achieving his goal sooner rather than later.

The young Pole spent almost six months on the sidelines after breaking both arms in an unfortunate training ground incident in October 2008. Now he is back in action and back to his best in Brentford colours.

Arsène Wenger is clearly a fan. He named the keeper on the bench for the final game of last term against Stoke, took him to the pre-season training camp in Austria and handed him a squad number for the 2009/10 campaign.

Wojciech signed professional terms at Emirates Stadium in the summer of 2007 and he had a very early taste of top-flight football when he appeared for his former club, Legia Warsaw when he was just 15.

Authoritative, quick off his line and blessed with fine reflexes, the Pole has every chance of emulating his father, Maciej, who kept goal for his country.

## FOSTER

25-year old defender Danny Foster is a former England Under-18 international and was signed from Dagenham & Redbridge during the summer.

Foster was joined by Dagenham teammates Ben Strevens and Sam Saunders in making the

move to Griffin Park and all three players have been regulars in Brentford colours this term.

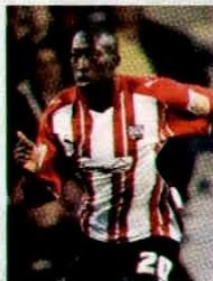
Formerly a youth player with Tottenham Hotspur, Foster moved to Dagenham & Redbridge in 2004 and played almost 200 games for the Essex club before joining Brentford in the summer of 2009.

He has been a regular at the back for The Bees and has been a part of the backline which kept clean sheets in the recent games against Huddersfield Town and Bristol Rovers.





## DIAGOURAGA



Toumani Diagouraga is on a season-long loan from Peterborough United and has been a regular performer for The Bees this term.

The Paris-born midfielder joined the Watford Academy and signed professional forms in November 2004 aged 16. He made his first team debut in a League Cup victory against Wolves a year later.

Former Swindon boss Iffy Onuora secured his services in March 2006 although despite eight appearances during his County Ground loan spell, he was unable to prevent The Robins from slipping into League Two.

After returning to Vicarage Road, Diagouraga was loaned to Rotherham United in January 2007 before a season-long loan at Hereford United during the 2007/08 campaign prior to joining the Edgar Street outfit on a permanent basis in July 2008.

An impressive campaign with Hereford was enough to attract the attentions of Peterborough, for whom he signed in June 2009 on a four-year contract.

## OSBORNE

A product of The Bees youth system the 22-year old defender contributed an important three goals last season and is now an experienced and established member of the squad.

Osborne plays principally at centre-back, though he is also a capable right-back and he made his debut against Hull in May 2005 at the age of just 17, having been an unused substitute earlier in the season when he was only 16.

He captained the team on several

occasions during the 2007/08 in the absence of former Swindon defender Matt Heywood and Kevin O'Connor.

The defender scored his first goal for Brentford in a 1-0 win at Shrewsbury Town in January 2008 and spent a one-month loan spell with Oxford United in September 2008. A second temporary spell was to follow, this time with Eastbourne Borough in November 2008.

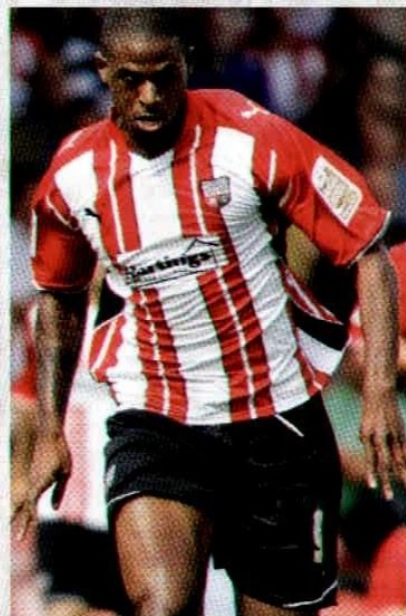
## CORT

32-year old striker Carl Cort joined Brentford in August 2009 and scored his first goal for The Bees against Swindon in October.

Born in London and of Guyanese descent, the striker began his career with Wimbledon as a teenager. After 16 goals in 54 starts for Wimbledon he joined Newcastle United with Bobby Robson paying £7 million for his services.

He is one of eight English players who have made a £7 million transfer and never played for England, the others being Dean Richards, Kevin Davies, Nigel Reo-Coker, Curtis Davies, Anton Ferdinand, Adam Johnson and Chris Smalling.

Cort also has stints at Wolverhampton Wanderers, Leicester City and Norwich City to his name and spent time with Spanish club UD Marbella, who were then playing in the Segunda División B.



## GAFFER ANDY SCOTT

Andy Scott started his professional career when Sheffield United signed him from Sutton United in 1992.

He signed for Brentford as a player for £75,000 in November 1997 and went on to make 136 appearances for the Club scoring 35 goals and being an integral part of The Bees Third Division Championship winning side the following season.

In the 2000/01 season having scored 13 goals in 22 appearances in January he was surprisingly sold to Oxford United fully recouping the initial outlet of £75,000.

He moved on to Leyton Orient in March 2004 and played 50 games before having to retire from the game when diagnosed with the life threatening heart disorder hypertrophic cardiomyopathy.

He took up a coaching role at Brisbane Road and went on to become The O's youth team manager before being named as assistant manager at Brentford in May 2007.

He became Brentford's caretaker manager in December 2007 and was appointed as manager in January 2008. He was named at BBC London's "Manager of the Year" for 2008.

He led Brentford to promotion as Champions from League Two in his first full season as manager in 2008/2009.

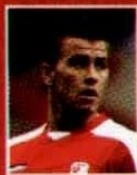

### How do you look back on your time at Brentford?

It was a really enjoyable time. We were always challenging and during my time there we won the League, got to the play-off final at The Millennium Stadium and got to the final of the LDV Vans Trophy.

When I first joined Brentford they were under the stewardship of Mr Noades and everything was geared up for success there. It was a really good club with a really friendly atmosphere around the place. The coaching staff were excellent, with Terry Bullivant, Ray Lewington, Wally Downes and Brian Sparrow all involved at the time.

### Andy Scott has done well since taking over as Brentford Manager hasn't he?

'Scotty' was a player when I joined Brentford and as a tall, gangly lad he made a decent left-winger! He has done very well and I am pleased they have continued to do well after winning League 2 last year. He does a lot of homework on players and I wish him every success because he is a really good lad.

### Unfortunately injury limited your opportunities at Swindon, but you still managed some cracking goals didn't you?

Yeah, it started well at Swindon

and I did really enjoy my time there. Unfortunately I picked up an injury which has plagued me ever since to tell you the truth - it's still not 100% right. We started the season with Dennis Wise and Gus Poyet and made a fantastic start to the season and the campaign ended in promotion.

### Where did you go after leaving Swindon?

I went up to Bradford City for a season and things were going okay but there was a clause in my contract which was about to kick in and things went downhill pretty quickly from there. I then had a short spell at Oxford United but I did not enjoy my time there at all.

However, it was during that time that a friend put me in touch with a sports massage course and I signed up. From January last year I spent about eight months going to college and picked up a number of diplomas in sports massage and physiology.

### How did you end up at Meadow Lane?

One of my old coaches from Nottingham Forest, Ian McParland, was on the coaching staff at Notts County at the start of the season and I joined the club in September. It has been a bit of a rollercoaster this season but the League title has put the icing on the cake.

Brentford came calling in the summer of 2008 and he made an immediate impact at Griffin Park, scoring twice on his debut against Grimsby Town in League Two. The George's, McLeod and Francis were on the score sheet for the Bees, but Town's Bob Edwards equalled the feat on his own to record a 2-2 festive draw in front of a crowd of 12,500.

24 hours later and after a quick dash along the A4, the two sides met again on Boxing Day in a 2:15 kick-off when again the points were shared.

Brentford fielded an unchanged side but Ray Sampson replaced goal-scorer Bob Edwards for Town.

This time Andy Micklewright was the successful Town man while George Francis completed a double in front of goal inside 24 hours.

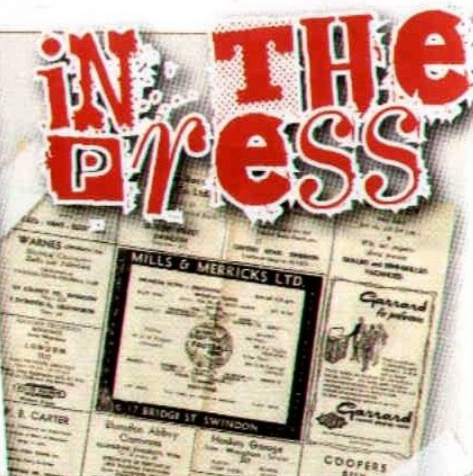

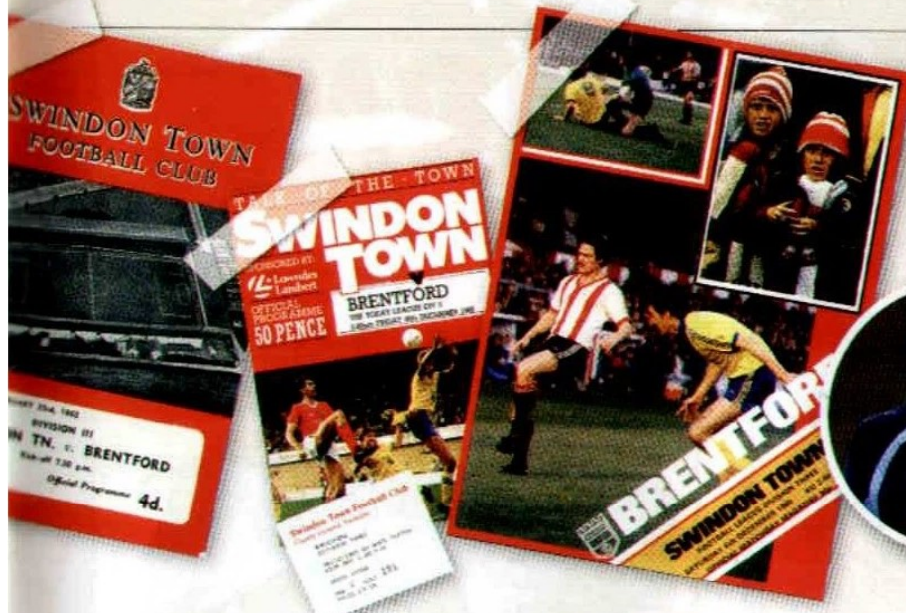

Middlesbrough striker Brian Clough becomes the Second Division's top goal scorer with 42 goals. It is the third season that he has averaged a goal a game. Meanwhile Chelsea's **Jimmy Greaves** finishes First Division leading scorer with 33 goals.

In April, England and Wolves captain Billy Wright becomes the world's first footballer to win 100 caps for his country.

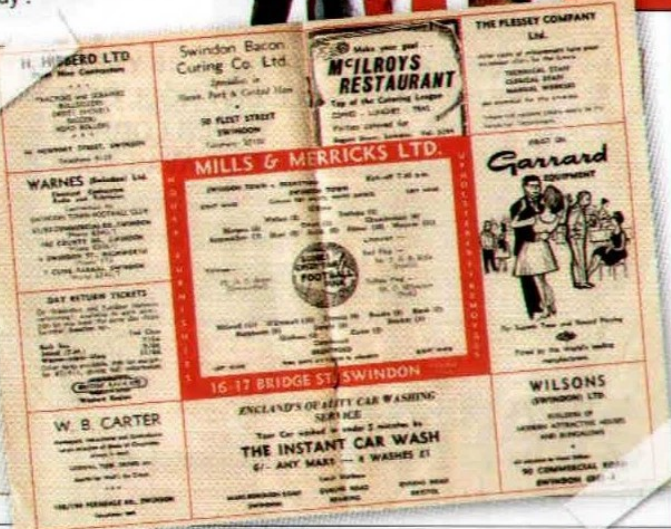

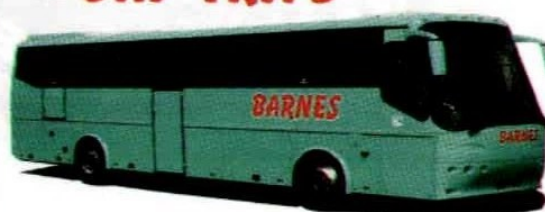

# The W FOR W

**Danny Wilson** has presided over one of the most successful seasons at The County Ground in recent years, but far from dwelling on the past, the manager is keen to look ahead to what will be a pulsating climax to the campaign.

**L**ast weekend's disappointing 2-2 draw at Wycombe Wanderers may have seriously dented Town's automatic promotion hopes, but there is no doubt that Season 2009/2010 has been one to remember for the club's supporters.

This success is due in no small part to the contribution of manager Danny Wilson, who has turned his side from relegation strugglers this time last season, into genuine promotion contenders in the closing stages of this term.

However, Wilson is keen to re-

off from my point of view because people will always criticise us, and we've always been happy to go under the radar.

"We've never played in fear of any team irrespective of reputation, and consequently we've got some great results this year, which is a credit to the players."

Much has been made of the position that Town could have been occupying had points not been dropped through an agonising series of late equalisers before Christmas, against the likes of Wycombe Wanderers, Southend United and Exeter City.

However, Wilson insists there is no mileage in mulling over 'what might have been', preferring to take the positives from these results and focus on what is to come.

"If you look at the defeats we've had, you can see that they haven't been bad performances at all," he said.

"We regularly look back at the goals we've conceded this year, and I have

to say we can't find one goal that we've given away when under real pressure.

"We've always conceded when concentration has been lapsing and we've been on top of the game, had a lot of football and there's been one turnover of

direct the praise for this achievement in the direction of his small, tightly knit squad, who have excelled in a hugely competitive league containing many teams fancied to succeed ahead of them.

"To reproduce the form they have done on a regular basis and get the results they have done is outstanding, and you really have to take your hat off to the players," he said.

"They've shown immense character and psychological strength this year against some very good sides.

As such, and despite the mathematical possibility that his side could still be promoted automatically, the manager is already considering going into what would be the third play-off campaign of his managerial career, insisting that his side can thrive on the 'underdog' label they would undoubtedly be handed.

He said: "Should it come to the play-offs, the main thing from our point of view is that there's no pressure on us at all, other than the pressure that we'll put on ourselves."

"It is a mixture of nervousness and excitement going into it really. We'll have three games to get promoted. We want to get to the final and we want to win the final, it's as simple as that."

"When you look at the five teams that could still be in the play-offs, we're by far the outsiders. No-one

However, he is confident that their energy and enthusiasm, coupled with the play-off experience of the likes of David Lucas, J-P McGovern and Jonathan Douglas will serve the side as well as it has done all season.

"Some of these lads here are very young boys, and it's not easy for them at this stage of the season because they've never had this sort of pressure to deal with before," he said.

"When you look at how far Charlie [Austin] has come, it really is the story of the season. 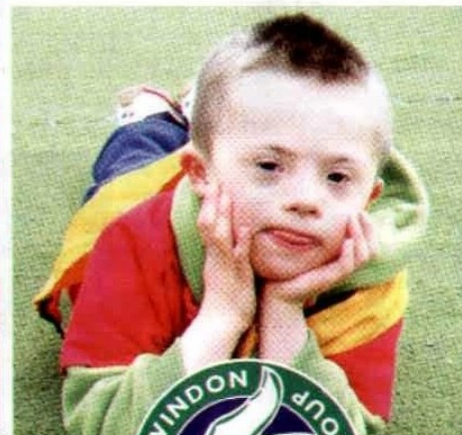
"All we can do is win today and see what happens," he admitted.

## SYNDROME GROUP

Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parent-led support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.

The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities - football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 - 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

# The backroom team: **Dick & Dave**

## PLAY-OFF PLANNING

**A**fter joining Swindon Town in the summer of 2008, Fitness and Conditioning coach David Morrison has already seen a lot during his relatively short tenure in post.

Morrison arrived at Swindon after a successful playing career which saw him represent the likes of Leyton Orient and Peterborough United before a four-year stay at Bohemians in Ireland.

Now tasked with looking after the fitness, diet and strength of all professional and youth team players at The County Ground, the 35-year old spoke to Swindon about what has been a busy 2009/10 campaign.

**How enjoyable has the season been for you personally? It's been quite a contrast to the last one hasn't it!**

The contrast between last season and the current one is huge. This time last year we were fighting for survival whereas this time round we are fighting for points to go up automatically. This just highlights the dedication and qualities of the management and the scouting network at the club.

**What have been the most memorable and funniest moments of the season?**

The most memorable has to be the away game at Southampton. The players gave an awesome performance that night. We had to make the odd change of personnel before and during the game due to injuries, and those who slotted in played extremely well. The performance was also matched by the 2,000 travelling fans who sang their hearts out for the entire 90 minutes.

For me the funniest moment happened last season. Each player is given a water bottle for training which they have to use each day for hygiene purposes. Players who don't bring their bottle or are seen using somebody else's is fined. Travelling

up North to a game we stopped at Middlesbrough's training ground. Having joined in the session I was gasping for a drink so took a sly gulp out of somebody's bottle and thought nothing more of it. Only to be collared by J-P and 'Eastie' at dinner, asking me if I had used somebody's water bottle, which I denied, not realising Chris Tanner, the club's Media Manager, had been taking photographs of the training session and had caught me on camera, which cost me £10!

**How much rest will the players be given over the summer and what impact would the play-offs have on those rest periods?**

At the moment we have three different scenarios to plan for. There's the Play-off's which could finish on either the 18th or 29th May. If we go up automatically, the players will return at the end of June.

It is vital that players get enough rest during the holiday period so as to recover from the previous season, therefore reducing the chances of over training and burn-out early into the coming season. However, it is also vital that the players get enough training time under their belts so as to prepare him for the coming season. From a physiological point of view, physical fitness aspects aren't lost significantly over a 4-5 week period.

**What plans do you have for the summer?**

Firstly, it has to be a holiday! Last year the family and I went to the North East coast of Mallorca (C'an Pica Fort) which was beautiful. So in early June we are heading back there, which will be great as I can spend the entire time with my two daughters. On the return I'm sure the Wife has plenty of jobs for me to do around the house and garden, so that will keep me quite busy.

**S**windon Town FC and STFC Football in the Community firmly believe that education and football play a vital role in developing young people.

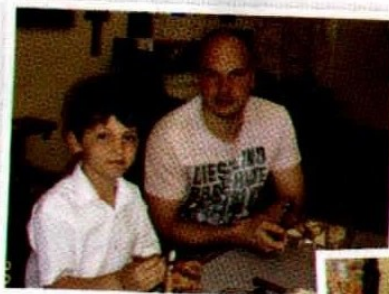

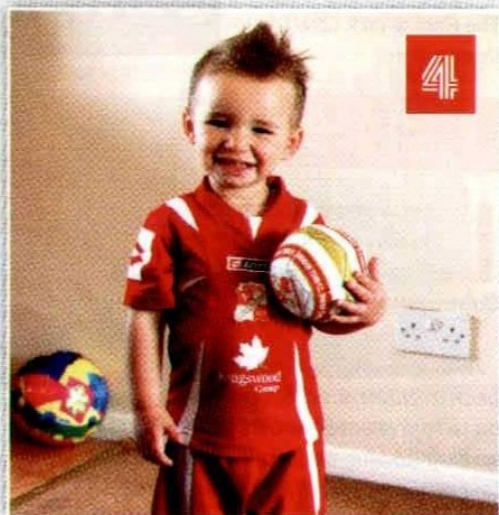

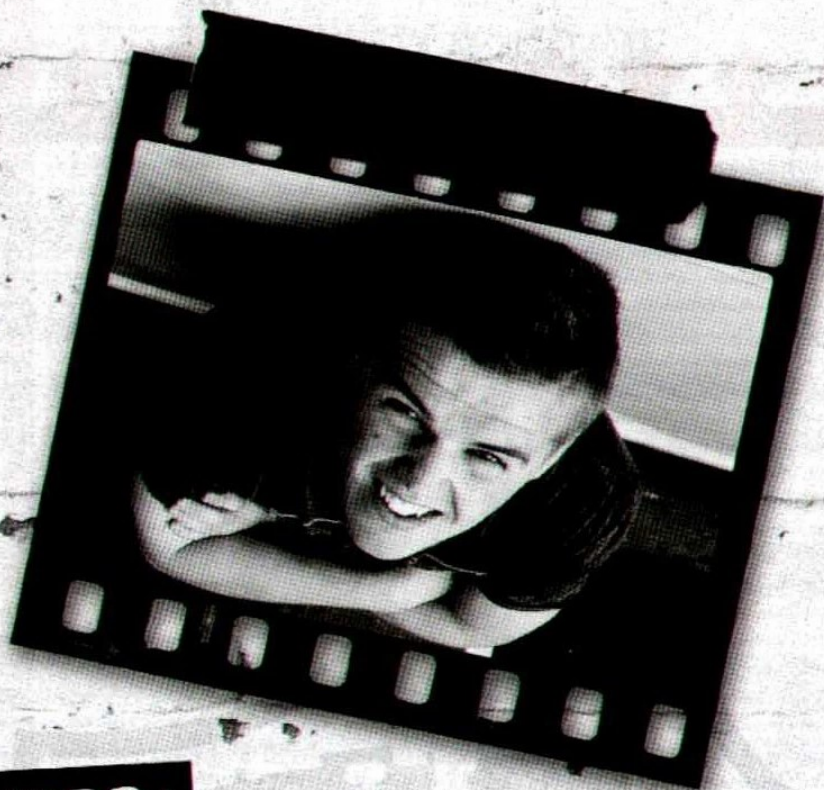

#### Who is the **LAST** person you would want to be stuck in a lift with?

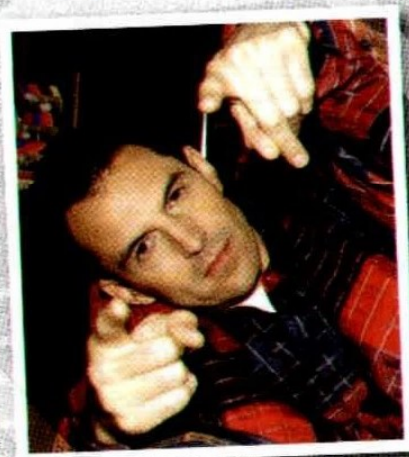
I'd say Billy Paynter because he takes the mick out of me all the time saying I have a big head.
