

If promotion aspirations can be put to one side briefly, the club are delighted to announce that the youth team have won their league and we have all the coverage and reaction from that brilliant achievement.


Not only that but our feature interview is with Lions chairman John G. Berylson who talks about his love for Millwall and why it has been a challenge he has relished since taking over the





The players are made aware of working hard to form a bond with their fans and we know this is done by always giving of their best and playing well.


This bond will need to be there today as we all need to pull together to achieve our goal of getting the three points.

will certainly be exciting.



SWINDON TOWN

Every season, there always seems to be one team that comes from nowhere to either sneak a Play-Off place or win promotion. Leicester City and Blackpool are both fulfilling the role of 'surprise package' in the Championship, Aldershot have come from nowhere to sit in the League Two Play-Off places and Birmingham City, with a bit more luck, could have been dreaming of Europe next season. In League One, you need look no further than Swindon Town.

A 15th place finish last season and the introduction of big clubs like Charlton, Norwich and Southampton meant that not many expected anything from The Robins, as manager Danny Wilson admits. "I think we are the surprise of this divison. The fact that there are so many quality squads in this division meant that I don't think we were in that category of promotion contenders, so I would say we are something of a surprise package."

Indeed, Town held the poison chalice that is second place in early April only to then lose it after a 3-0 defeat to Colchester United. "We had it for one week and lost!" recalls Wilson. "But if we manage to take it come the end of the season that would be excellent and I certainly won't be complaining! It's a difficult one to put your finger on why teams can't seem to hold on to second place. Obviously it does come with a little bit more added pressure when you are in that position with so many games to hang on to it."

The Robins are one of a number of clubs you could say are a 'Championship club in League One', having graced the Premiership not so long ago. Wilson remains confident that that fact won't distract them from what needs to be done first. "Obviously when you take over you look at all aspects of the football club and certainly when you look at the history and the background of the club you could say that yes Swindon are potentially a Championship club, but there is a lot of work still do to on and off the field to make that

a reality. There are aspects of the club that need improving if we want to go up and sustain our status as a Championship side and as I said, there is a lot of work still to do in that regard, we're not there yet by any stretch of the imagination. But we will keep knocking on the door until we get that opportunity."

Today will prove a fitting end to what has been a season of ups and downs for both clubs and there will be more than one anxious glance at the Leeds game throughout the 90 minutes. Wilson though has enjoyed the competitiveness of League One. "It has been very entertaining this year. There are some quality teams in there, big clubs with big players and it has gone all the way to the wire in determining certain clubs' futures. Where most people were thinking two or three sides would walk away with the top two places, it has not been the case. I have to say that Norwich have done brilliantly to get themselves in a promotion position and then become Champions so quickly because I thought it would go down to the last few games to be honest. But the rest have been about right I think. There are a lot of quality sides and no one has really run away with it and that has made it very exciting.

The gap between the Championship and League One is dwindling and not because of a lack of talent but because there is more of it coming through. From non-league right through to the Championship there is a bit more quality breaking through.


That has been what has helped the likes of Leicester and Scunthorpe stay up. They have added a bit more to their squads because it's a tough league and they have had to. But it gives us all hope that if we are fortunate enough to go up, we are capable of staying there.

If anyone would have offered this scenario at the beginning of the season, particularly after the 5-0 defeat on the opening day, we would have snatched their hand off. We are going into this game as underdogs and we aim to enjoy it. We have enjoyed ourselves so far and have put in a lot of hard work over this season. There is an opportunity to go into the last game of the campaign with something to play for so it will be a fantastic day for everybody."

If Swindon are to be promoted today Wilson is well aware they face a stiff battle this afternoon. He has locked swords with The Lions on more than one occasion over his career so is in a good position to know what to expect. "I know what everyone has known for years and years and years. Millwall are a fully determined, well organised team under Kenny Jackett. There will be a very vociferous crowd and it will be a very tough place to come and play as it always is. Millwall's expectation levels have always been high which might help us to relax a little bit because sometimes it can be a bit of a hindrance. But we know what we will face and I'm sure it will be a very tough test for us."



After helping Swindon Town avoid relegation at the end of the 2008/9 season, Scottish defender **Gordon Greer** has been a key component in The Robins' rise to the Play-Off spots.






Having made his move from Doncaster Rovers permanent in the summer, Greer was handed the captain's armband by Danny Wilson and was charged with leading Swindon up the table to compete in the upper echelons of League One. Not many outside of the County Ground believed Town could match the likes of Charlton, Leeds and Norwich, yet here they sit comfortably in the Play-Off places - not that Greer is surprised. "Considering the season that we had last year you could definitely say we are dark horses." he admits. "We just about avoided relegation and I think a lot of people tipped us to be down there again. No one has expected us to do as well as we have done. But within the dressing room and the club behind the scenes, we felt we could to do something this year so we are pleased with our form."

Greer's side have come a long way since an opening day thumping at the hands of newly-promoted Gillingham. But, just like Norwich, it proved a catalyst for a surge up the table, with The Robins gaining a measure of revenge over The Gills with a 3-1 win along the way. "It was a bad day for us. We didn't play well at all. But the team we put out today is totally different to the one that faced Gillingham that day. We have earned a few 1-0 wins away and had some impressive results against Leeds and Southampton. I don't know why we seem get so many one nils. We do our best in every game and whatever is put in front of us we just try to go out there and win the match."

Swindon have been one of a handful of sides, along with Millwall, who have found holding on to second spot easier said than done this term but Greer is adamant that it's not just second spot that has afflicted teams this season. "I think it is the whole league







is like that to be honest. It is a really tough division where anyone can beat anyone. In my spell here last year when I was on loan, Swindon - who were down the bottom - were going to top sides and giving them a game. We drew one each with Leicester for example. I just think that anyone can take points off anyone in this league. We drew with Exeter 1-1 recently who are down the bottom so the quality is there in every team, which makes every game difficult."

However, what does make life a little easier is having strikers in red hot form and in **Billy Paynter** and **Charlie Austin**, Swindon boast not one but two of the leading strikers in the division. Whilst headlines continue to be written about former bricklayer Austin's meteoric rise to prominence from Poole Town, it is perhaps the emergence of a rejuvenated Paynter that might please manager Wilson most.

A promising talent at Port Vale, Paynter's career stalled during spells at Hull City and Southend United. But this season, Swindon's faith in him has reaped rewards and he has 28 goals to his name so far. Centre back Greer is just happy to have both of them in the side. "I'm delighted for them. Since Charlie came into the team and forged the partnership with Billy they have scored bags of goals together. It's been great for the players who are




out there with them because thanks to their goals, we have been gaining good results. I'm not sure why they clicked so quickly. From day one they worked really hard together. It is great for the rest of us when you see your front two working hard for the team and getting goals as a reward."

Behind the front two are players who know League One inside out and Greer is well aware of the impact the likes of David Lucas, Craig Easton and Kevin Amankwaah, amongst others, have had. "As I said, it is a tough league to get out of so you need players who have competed in this division for a few seasons. We have the likes of Jon-Paul McGovern, Michael Timlin and Jonathan Douglas who have all played at this level as well for a number of years.

We have also had a number of loan players and it is good to see some talented youngsters here. Simon Ferry has done well in midfield whilst Danny Ward has scored some goals and Alan Sheehan has performed brilliantly all season. He has played in this league and higher so he has been a good player to have around. The manager has used the loan market to good effect but then so do most teams at this level to boost their squads."

Greer is one of a number of Scottish players at Swindon and that has helped him. He in turn has been required to assist another Scot settle





in alongside him at centre back. "It's good to have **Scott Cuthbert** at the back with me. We are actually from the same area of Glasgow and he went to school with my younger brother. Scotty has done really well since he arrived from Celtic. We have a good partnership going as well. There are about five Scots in the squad and of course the banter flies around. But it's great and it's a good club to be at. Hopefully we can keep

going, stay together and stay focused for 90 more minutes."

Whatever the outcome of today's game, Greer knows that it is another obstacle in the way of what Swindon are trying to achieve. And if October's clash at the County Ground is anything to go by, it could be an interesting one. "That one was a bit heated! We had Jonathan Douglas sent off early on and you had a man sent off as well. It was a tough game and I think a point

overall was a fair result. It wasn't a great football match and hopefully we can come down and do well against you this afternoon.

All season, whatever has been put in front of us we have tackled head on and we have done our best in every game. We take each one as it comes, I know that's an old cliché, but all week we have concentrated on Millwall. Hopefully it will be a good game with two great sides going for the win."


JACKETT'S JUDGEMENT



When John Berylson was asked recently what had enticed a successful American businessman who already had sporting interests Stateside to throw in his lot, and his money, with a London based football club in the third tier of the English league, he replied: "I've been asked that question numerous times, and I'm not sure I ever come up with the same answer twice." >>

Looking back now, you sense that he genuinely cannot quite recall what motivated him to become involved with Millwall. Certainly the sense of adventure, his sporting fanaticism, and his relish for a challenge were factors. What he did not envisage back in 2006 was that The Lions of SE16 would become a passion that would become entrenched in his heart and soul, and indeed that of several members of his family.

"I first invested in the club back in November of 2006," he recalls. "At that time things were not looking all that bright on or off the pitch.


In the January of 2007 we brought in Neil Harris, Chris Hackett and Dave Brammer I believe, and under Willie Donachie we pulled clear of relegation and actually finished the season quite well.

My first game, though, was at home to Leyton Orient, when Gary Alexander scored for them in a 5-2 defeat for Millwall. I remember saying to a couple of friends who were with me, This team looks valueless and is no fun to watch."

I remember at the EGM in March 2007, Nick Hart from the Lions Trust asked me that question about why an American who knew nothing about English football was taking over the club. My answer on that occasion, which still holds true, was 'You should be happy that I'm here, because for me losing sucks, and I'm determined that we're going to make Millwall successful.

The pledge I made to the fans, who obviously didn't know me and were understandably suspicious, was that I would leave the club, whenever that is, in a healthier state than it was when I arrived. Three years on, we have made significant progress towards that and we have plans to keep moving in the right direction.

That run of good form towards the end of 2006/7 earned Willie the right to try to get the team competing at the top end of the league the following season. »











enquiries@alltypepumps.com www.alltypepumps.com Our expectations were that we could reasonably become a top 10 if not a top six outfit that next year, but sadly we made a poor start, and after a 4-0 defeat at Carlisle the decision was made to part company with Willie and seek another manager.

For myself, I was still very much on a learning curve in terms of managers, players and the game in general, but with the board we drew up a shortlist of likely candidates, assessed their strengths and weaknesses, looked at their track records, and it immediately became apparent to me that Kenny Jackett should be our number one target.

It took a number of phone calls to Kenny to persuade him to meet with me to discuss the job. The fact that there had been a bit of a revolving door at Millwall with chairmen and managers over the previous years meant that I had to convince him of my commitment and vision for this club. Once that meeting took place a deal was done within a couple of hours.

My first year or so at Millwall was hard going. I couldn't just enjoy the football because so much of my time was taken up protecting the club and myself financially.

The difficulties we had with certain shareholders have been well documented and have still to be fully resolved, but we have moved forward as a company and at the same time, the team under Kenny has improved significantly.

Finishing in 17th spot after taking over a struggling team in the November of 2007 was a fine achievement by Kenny, and that summer we sat down and thought, 'right how can we do better.'

We strengthened the squad by bringing in the likes of David Forde, Tony Craig, Gary Alexander and Jimmy Abdou, and the goal we set ourselves was to reach the Play-Offs.

At one stage it looked like we might be capable of doing even better than that, but we suffered one or two key injuries, notably to Paul Robinson, and eventually finished fifth and went into the Play-Offs on the back of some patchy form. »

Beating Leeds in the semi-finals was a great effort, but at Wembley in the final we made one or two mistakes and in the end Scunthorpe beat us for the third time. I took the view that if you've been beaten three times by a team over the season that makes them better than you. Should we find ourselves in the Play-Offs this time I take comfort from the fact that we won't face Wycombe and have nothing to fear from anyone else!

I believe we did suffer a bit of a hangover from that Wembley defeat. That combined with some more injury problems early on this season meant we started more slowly than we expected.

However, I knew many things were now right about this club, Kenny, the management team, the players, and indeed my own knowledge had become significantly greater.

The decision making process in terms of the players and the team has become streamlined and effective with Kenny and Andy Ambler taking the lead supported by myself along with the board.


I felt the turning points of the season were the draw at Charlton before Christmas and then the win at home to Bristol Rovers at the end of December. We were still some 20 points behind Leeds, but I was confident then that we would reach the Play-Offs and predicted the season would come down to the last game. It looks like I was right.

Back at the start of my time here, I expected us to lose, and celebrated draws as if they were wins.

That has changed now. I expect us to win every game. I expected us to win at Leeds. I expected us to beat Norwich at home, after which their directors told me we were by far the strongest team they had played.

Having seen all the other sides in this league there is currently nothing I would change about our team. Whether we are promoted automatically or have to face the Play-Offs, we are good enough and have the basis of a team that could compete in the Championship."

So what of the future for Millwall and football in general?



"The game in this country still has serious issues that need to be resolved. English football must put its financial house in order, and in my opinion adopt a version of what happens in the States and elsewhere so that the free spending without thought is stopped. We need to regulate how much clubs can spend and how much players can earn.

The good news for Millwall fans is that we do not have a penny of debt owed to any bank. We are not under threat from anyone.

All the debt is with the shareholders and the majority of that is with me. I have not taken a penny of interest out of the company and all the security of the club and The Den is mine.

A Crystal Palace situation will not happen to us.

Going forward, we have already signed up the majority of our core players on new or extended contracts and if promoted we would bring in perhaps three key additions. If we remain in League One we might still

add to the squad.

I am superstitious so I am not going to make predictions about what might happen if we get into the Championship.

What I will say, though, is that we will continue to make sustainable progress. Our ambition will not end there, but we will not risk the stability of the club by reckless spending. We will build a strong squad which ultimately will enable us to challenge at the top end of that division."

So is the chairmanship and enjoyable experience for John these days?

"I'm having a great time now. I like a great deal about this club, the management, players, coaches, staff, and especially the fans.

Millwall now has quite a following in the States, particularly in Boston, and I'm looking forward to seeing that grow in the coming years.

"But most of all what I'm looking forward to is seeing this club becoming more successful and winning more football matches."

Goals from Colin Rawson and Joe Tyrrell gave Millwall a 2-1 Third Division (South) victory over struggling Swindon Town in front of 3,209 at The Den on Boxing Day 1956.

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS traces what happened to both teams:





WHATEVER HAPPENED TO MILLWALL'S TEAM?

BILL LLOYD: Young goalkeeper who was a key figure as Millwall beat Newcastle in the 1956/7 FA Cup fourth round, making 74 League appearances before joining Canterbury City in July 1958. Bill became player-coach of Manurewa in New Zealand, before becoming a landscape gardener and he now lives in Beckenham in retirement.

ALEX JARDINE: Scottish right-back who was ever-present as Miltwall were Third Division (South) runners-up in 1952/3, then again in 1954/5. He helped beat Newcastle in the 1956/7 FA Cup fourth round and netted 25 goals in 302 League games until May 1958. Alex worked in the local docks until his death in June 1978.

JOHN SMITH: Ex-England Youth left-back who helped Millwall beat Newcastle in the 1956/7 FA Cup fourth round, scoring once in 64 Third Division (South) outings while at The Den prior to joining Guildford City in July 1958. John later worked in the building trade and now lives in Wickford, Essex, in retirement.

GEORGE VEITCH: Popular right-half who starred as Millwall defeated Newcastle in the 1956/7 FA Cup fourth round, making 93 Third Division (North) appearances before moving to Dartford in July 1958. He worked for General Foods in Banbury for 21 years and died in Carlton, near Leyburn, in February 2000.

RAY BRAND: Centre-half who helped beat Newcastle in the 1956/7 FA Cup fourth round and netted eight goals in 150 League games before joining Southend in August 1961, then Hastings. Later Southend's youth manager, Ray managed Grays Athletic and spent 27 years as chief education officer in SE Essex, settling in Hadleigh.

COLIN RAWSON: Tough-tackling left-half who was ever-present for Millwall in 1956/7 and scored five goals in 159 League outings prior to joining Torquay United in July 1959. Helping them win promotion in 1959/0, Colin later played for Taunton Town. He then settled in Sutton-in-Ashfield, before his death in April 2009.

GEORGE HAZLETT: Scottish winger who netted ten goals in 131 Third Division (South) games for Millwall before joining Guildford City in July 1958. Later with Bexleyheath & Welling, he became a football coach at local schools and then an education welfare officer in Dulwich. George now lives in Orpington in retirement.

JOHN SHEPHERD: Leading marksman who scored 63 times in 149 Third Division (South) games for Millwall prior to joining Brighton in June 1958. Later with Gillingham, Ashford Town, Margate, Tunbridge Wells and Southwick's player-boss, John assisted Brighton's youth team and worked at Southwick Leisure Centre.

DENIS PACEY: Centre-forward who helped Millwall beat Newcastle in the 1956/7 FA Cup fourth round, netting 37 goals in 133 League games before joining Aldershot in September 1958. He later played for Yeovil Town and Dartford, before becoming a baggage handler at Heathrow Airport. Denis died in Addlestone in September 2009.

JOE TYRRELL: Inside-left who featured in Millwall's 1956/7 FA Cup run and netted 18 goals in 37 Third Division (South) outings prior to joining Bournemouth in June 1957. Joe moved to Folkestone in August 1959, helping them win promotion in 1959/60. He then managed a cash 'n' carry store and still lives in Folkestone.

GORDON PULLEY: Young winger who scored nine goals in 60 League games for Millwall before joining Gillingham in May 1958. He helped win the Fourth Division title in 1963/4, then played for Peterborough United, Chelmsford City, Ramsgate, Folkestone, Canterbury and Sheppey United. Gordon now lives in Chatham.

WHATEVER HAPPENED TO SWINDON'S TEAM?

RAY CHANDLER: Goalkeeper who understudied Sam Burton and played 35 League games prior to joining Cambridge United in July 1959, then Wisbech Town, Bridgwater, Paulton Rovers, Welton Rovers and Odd Down. Settling in Bath, Ray worked for Clarks, then Stothert & Pitt and at St Martin's Hospital until retirement.

GEORGE HUNT: Long-serving rightback who missed just one match in 1952/3 and 1954/5, making 304 Third Division (South) appearances for hometown club Swindon before retiring in May 1958. He helped out with coaching at the County Ground, then worked on the railways until his death from lung cancer in August 1987.

GERRY DEAR: Teenage left-back who made his League debut in the featured match and played four Third Division (South) games prior to joining Gloucester City. Later with Devizes, Gerry became a regional manager during 25 years with Lombard Banking, then ran his own asset leasing company and now lives in Newbury.

JIMMY CROSS: Reliable right-half who missed just three matches in 1953/4 and helped Swindon reach the FA Cup fourth round in 1955/6, netting five goals in 154 Third Division (South) games before moving to Headington United (now Oxford United) in July 1958. Jimmy remained local until his death in December 1999.

VINCE JACK: Big centre-half who contested a first-team slot with Garth Hudson and made 26 League appearances while at the County Ground prior to joining Accrington Stanley in July 1959. Later with Gravesend & Northfleet, Vince then emigrated to Australia and resided in Gosford, NSW, until his death in September 2006.

GORDON PEMBERY: Experienced left-half who scored twice in 37 Third Division (South) outings for Swindon before moving to Headington United in July 1957. He took in further spells at Merthyr Tydfil and Nuneaton Borough, before running a fruiterers and newsagents in Swindon. Gordon has recently celebrated his diamond wedding anniversary.

JOHN RICHARDS: Versatile outsideright who netted 36 goals in 105
League games prior to joining
Norwich City in December 1959. He moved to Aldershot in October 1960, then Corby Town and Stevenage.
Later, John was the personnel director of Thorn EMI, before becoming a self-employed consultant. He died in Harlow in December 2001.

ALAN GIBBS: Young inside-right who contested a first-team slot with Andy Micklewright and scored five times in 16 League outings before moving to

Headington United in July 1957. Alan later played for Cheltenham Town and worked in the insurance industry, remaining in Swindon until June 2004 when he moved to Spain.

MAURICE OWEN: Long-serving centre-forward who helped Swindon twice reach the FA Cup fifth round. He topped their goalscoring charts on six occasions and netted 150 times in 555 League games before retiring in May 1963. Maurice then joined The Robins' coaching staff before settling back in his native Abingdon. He died in July 2000.

BOB EDWARDS: Inside-left who was Swindon's leading marksman in 1956/7 and netted 65 goals in 173 League outings prior to joining Norwich City in December 1959. He moved to Northampton Town in March 1961, then had spells with King's Lynn and Boston Town. Bob now lives in Grimston, Norfolk, in retirement.

ARNOLD D'ARCY: Outside-left who helped Swindon win promotion in 1962/3 and scored 29 times in 223 League outings before moving to Cheltenham Town in July 1964. Later playing for Gravesend & Northfleet, Arnold was a painter and decorator with Peter Chamberlain in Swindon for 36 years and now lives in Southmoor.

ROBINS by Dave Sullivan ROUTED



Amongst our oldest adversaries are Swindon Town, one of the founder members of the Southern League back in 1894. It was during that initial season of 1894/5 that Millwall thumped The Robins 9-0, but today I will concentrate on two other routs of The Robins by The Lions at The Den.


It was at the conclusion of the 1895/6 campaign, in which Millwall claimed their second Southern League title, that The Lions finished in fine style, trouncing a luckless Swindon side, who once again found themselves on the end of another nine-goal drubbing. They did, however, manage to breach Millwall's defence on one occasion this time around.

The score at the break saw The Lions up 2-1, but there was no indication of what was to come. The Swindon defence had coped reasonably well against the Millwall forwards after Charlie Leatherbarrow had given Millwall the lead on 10 minutes.


Almost immediately, however, Swindon were back on level terms when Jimmy Hayward equalised, but The Lions regained the advantage through skipper Alf Geddes.

And so it stood at half-time, with the crowd oblivious to the feast of goals they were about to witness. An explosive start to the second period saw Leatherbarrow complete his hattrick with two quick goals to make it 4-1.

The catalyst for Swindon's downfall was the free-spirited outside-right Mickey Whelan, whose exceptional performance saw him help himself to a well-deserved goal. Millwall's

flowing football showed a touch of arrogance as they secured a fifth, when the elegant Whelan netted following a corner.

Swindon's shattered and beleaguered defence were found wanting again as Joe Gettins registered the second hat-trick of the game to make it 8-1, before Geddes added a ninth.

Mickey's 'Man-of-the-Match'
performance was highlighted at
the end of the game when the fans
swarmed onto the pitch to bear him
aloft back to the dressing room, and
no wonder as five of his excellent
centres had led to Millwall goals.

Eighty-four years later, The Robins visited The Den in early March 1980 to face an inconsistent Millwall in a season that had been full of Jekyll and Hyde performances from The Lions. After losing 1-0 at Mansfield in the previous game, Millwall now needed to win their next two

home fixtures against Swindon and Sheffield United to put them back in the promotion race.


The encounter with Town saw Millwall set about the visitors as they launched a barrage of non-stop attacking football to win by six goals to two. Just like Mickey Whelan all those years before, it was another outside-right, Tony Towner, who inspired his team to success, and in doing so, gave Swindon's left-back David Peach a torrid evening.


Tiger's' threat began as early as the 10th minute when his excellent cross found the head of Tony Tagg to open the scoring. Swindon had a great opportunity to draw level when Mel Blyth handled in the area 13 minutes later. However, Blyth was mightily relieved to see his former Palace team mate John Jackson save Ray McHale's spot-kick. The miss was to prove very costly for the visitors and in the 22nd minute Bobby Shinton

cashed in on Billy Tucker's error to lob home The Lions' second.

But Swindon rallied, and within a minute they reduced the arrears when Jackson missed a Derek Mayes cross to allow Andy Rowland to hook home his 22nd goal of the season. Millwall's response was instant and effectively put the match out of Swindon's reach. Tiger's' effort on 37 minutes went under goalkeeper Jimmy Allan's dive and a minute later Shinton was on hand to head home Johnny Lyons' deep cross for a 4-1 interval lead.

A foul on Tony Kinsella allowed Lyons to exquisitely curl in a free-kick beyond Allan for Millwall's fifth after 62 minutes, before Swindon got their second through a John Sitton owngoal in the 71st minute. Millwall's sixth arrived when a short-corner routine found Shinton in space to supply the centre for Lyons to tap home from close-range.

Millwall's U18s were crowned Football League Youth Alliance South East Conference champions following a comprehensive 3-0 success at rivals Southend United.


Scott Fitzgerald's charges pipped Brighton & HA for the title, and will be aiming to sign off the season in style with an away win at Wycombe Wanderers today.



The visitors took the lead on 27 minutes, though with a fine lob by George Porter from an Elliott Omuzusi flick on.


Connor McLaren then cleared off the line from Omuzusi and Harry Baker fired just wide as The O's looked for a second.

ZAMPA'S LONDON MARATHON - MISSION COMPLETE!

Post Marathon Report

"The aches and pains are all gone now, but the memory of two weeks ago will last forever. I finished the London Marathon 2010 in 5 hrs and 17 mins. Unfortunately I didn't set the record for the fastest marathon as a mascot of 4 hrs 30 mins, but I'm still very proud and happy with my achievement. I did beat Stamford The Lion and other mascots by over an hour as well!

It was extremely tough, much harder than my training prepared me for, and I got a bad stitch early on and had it for the whole route, making breathing even more difficult - I think I drank too much water. The highlight of the race was the last 100 metres, which I danced.

Overall, it was an amazing experience and the support was incredible from Millwall and non-Millwall fans alike, especially through Deptford, Surrey Quays, Jamaica Road onto Tooley Street, Canary Wharf and Embankment. It was a very disorientating run, and even though I was in pain most of the way, I'd consider it again! There were people everywhere, which did make it uncomfortable at times, nearly overwhelming. At one stage we had to stop in Greenwich because of the crowds! I got interviewed by the BBC going around Canary Wharf, which was a bit funny, as when the interviewer asked how I was doing, I told him 'I'm dying!'

The messages of support on Facebook have been fantastic, so please keep following me on there and adding any photos you have of me."

Final Fundraising

"We raised just under £11,000 which is an amazing effort, so thanks to all of you for your generous donations. Neil Harris donated £1,300 from his testimonial fund, and the Baker



family in Box 9 donated £1,000. We raised over £2,500 from the sale of the special blue/white wristbands, and another £1,000 from the bucket collection at the Leyton Orient game. Young Tom Hodges and his school mates raised £872 and another young fan, Jonathan Hatchman, raised £200. 

Under Dean's stewardship, our Sports Development Team of Jason Henley, Paul Wycherley and Alex Zurita have gone from strength to strength. Our schools coaching programme is now delivering around 70 sessions in 25 local schools each term and is

helping over 1,000 children weekly to access a range of sports and activities that provide them with the opportunity to develop their skills, improve their health, and support their learning. Our holiday programmes continue to grow, with more than 150 young people attending Soccer Schools and Multi-Sports Camps every day of the school holiday periods, whilst there is an ever increasing demand for our Cubz Kickers programme, which is









aimed at toddlers aged 3 to 6 years. Since Kay's departure, Dean has also overseen coach education alongside Education Officer Dan McLoone, and this programme has flourished with over 500 people achieving an accredited coaching qualification during the year.

The Millwall Anti Racism Trust has also enjoyed a successful year, establishing the 'International League' that has given adults from a range of ethnicities and backgrounds the opportunity to take part in regular competitive 11-a-side football fixtures throughout the season. In addition, the Trust Development Manager, Marc Elliot has worked closely with Community Sports Coach Dan Cheshire to expand the delivery of activities for children and adults with special needs through the Every Player Counts programme, which has reached more than 500 users during the year. The programme has developed specialist activities for people with Autism, and will be expanding further to include football

activities for wheelchair users and the blind and partially sighted over the next year.


Our Social Inclusion programmes also continue to go from strength to strength: with young people attending the Millwall Kickz project being recognised in the national Kickz Awards ceremony held at Wembley Stadium in October. We have received local recognition for the Millwall Street Pro programme that takes place at seven venues in Southwark each Friday evening, completing a 10th year of funding for the Positive Futures programme in Lewisham, a range of other programmes that include weekly football activities targeting men aged 35 and older, and mother and daughter exercise sessions. In all, the Social Inclusion Team - Richard White, Peter Dacres and Kelly Handley - oversee more than 80 hours of free to access activities for adults and young people across Lewisham and Southwark every week.


In addition to this, the Lions Centre

hosts activities for more than 1000 users each week, and the Scheme is entering an exciting period with many new programmes coming on board for the next year which will highlight further the importance of the work we do within our local community. These include programmes to support unemployed young people who aren't in education or training, offender management programmes, an anti-knife crime campaign, a community development initiative in central Lewisham and activities for older people.

Since 1985, with the support of the club and other partners, the Community Scheme has been helping the people of Lewisham and Southwark to develop their potential, and I am extremely proud to be at the helm of such a prestigious organisation as we move into our Silver Anniversary year and begin to lay the groundwork for the next 25 years of success. Here's to the future.




